TABLE No. 3

The Maharashtra State is the third biggest State in the Indian Union, both in respect of area and population.

For administrative purposes the State is divided into four divisions and twenty-six districts. They are :

- (I) Bombay Division : (1) Greater Bombay, (2) Thana (3) Kolaba, (4) Ratnagiri, (5) Nasik, (6) Dhulia, (7) Jalgaon.
- (II) Poona Division : (1) Ahmednagar, (2) Poona, (3) Satara (4) Sangli, (5) Kolhapur, (6) Sholapur.
- (III) Aurangabad Division : (1) Aurangabad, (2) Parbhani, (3) Bhir, (4) Osmanabad, (5) Nanded.
- (IV) Nagpur Division : (1) Buldhana, (2) Akola, (3) Amravati, (4) Yeotmal, (5) Wardha, (6) Nagpur, (7) Bhandara, (8) Chandrapur.

The 26 districts have 235 talukas. There are 289 towns in the State. Besides there are 17 cities having a population of over one lakh.

The strength of the Maharashtra Legislative Assembly is 271 out of which one is a nominated member. The strength of the Legislative Council is 78.

The State elects 19 members to the Rajya Sabha and 45 to the Lok Sabha.

The Congress (R) is the ruling party in the State, with 222 members in the house of 271.
