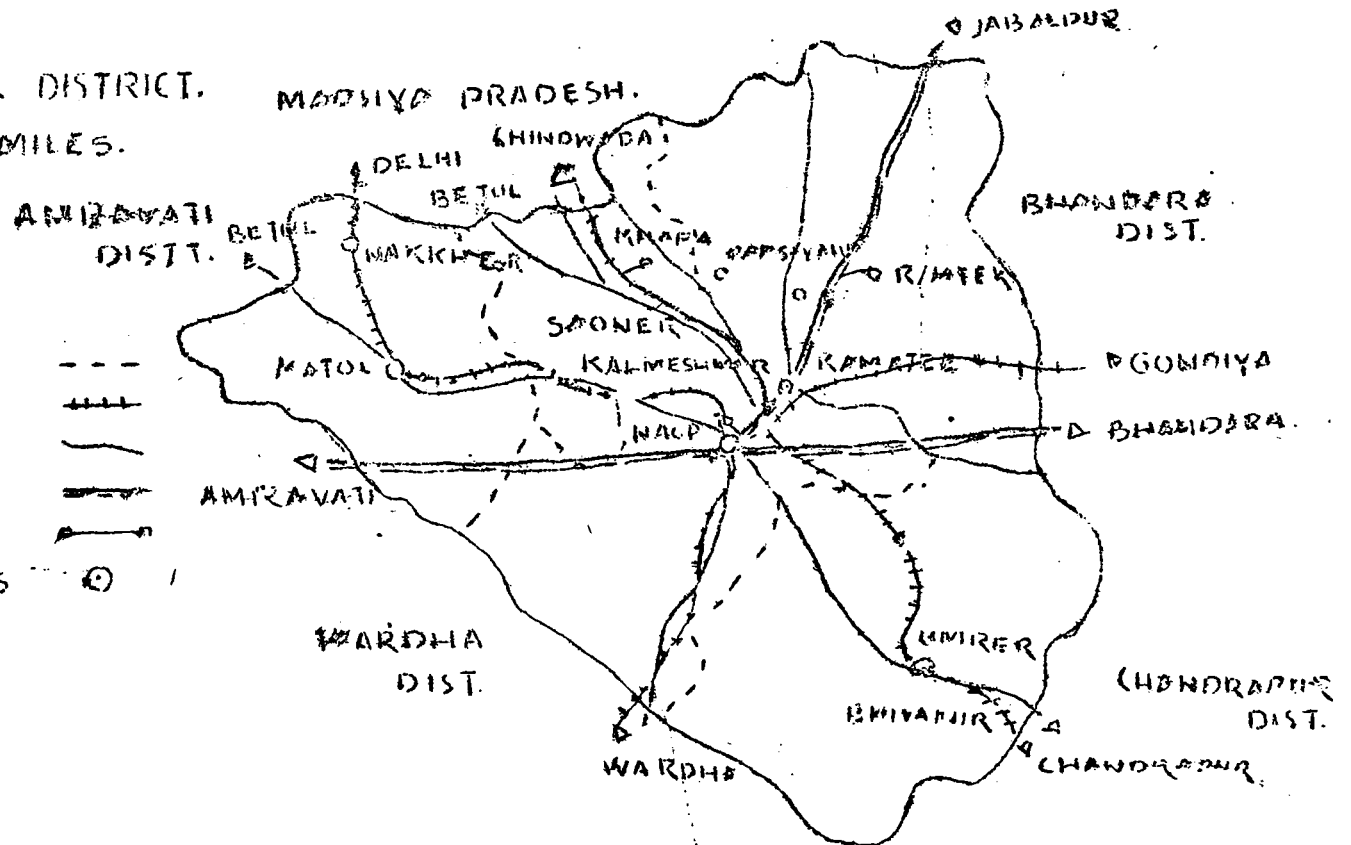

C H A P T E R - 1
I N T R O D U C T I O N

1.1 Introduction and Location :-

Nagpur district was one of the Districts of Ex-Madhya Pradesh till the reorganisation of States in 1956 when along-with the other seven districts of Vidarbha region, it formed a part of the bilingual state of Bombay. The State of Maharashtra came into existence in 1960, with Nagpur District as one of its twenty six districts. Nagpur district is one of the important district of the four C.P. districts. The headquarters of the district is at Nagpur which was the capital of Ex-Madhya Pradesh state and now enjoys the status of the second capital of Maharashtra State.

This district lies between $20^{\circ}35'$ and $21^{\circ}44'$ North Latitudes and $78^{\circ}15'$ and $79^{\circ}40'$ East Longitudes and it is triangular in shape.

1.2 Boundaries :-

This district is bounded on the north by the Chhindwada and Seoni districts of the Madhya Pradesh, on the East by Bhandara, on the South and West by Chandrapur and Wardha districts respectively, with a small strip on the north-west by the Amraoti district of Maharashtra State.

The area of the district is 9930 square Kilo Metres (3,834,) forming 3.34 percent of the total area of Maharashtra up-to 1969-70 when 10 villages measuring an area of 4,094 hectares or 24.56 Kilometres is transferred to Bhandara district.

The Population of the district according to 1961 Census is 15,12,807 forming 3.62 percent of the total Population of the Maharashtra. According to 1971 Census the population of the district is 19,42,638 forming 3.85 percent of the total population of the Maharashtra.

1.3 Administrative Set Up:-

For administrative convenience the district is divided into 5 Sub-divisions or Taluka Viz. Nagpur, Ramtek, Umred, Katol and Saoner. The Collector is the head of the district administration and in so far as the need and exigencies of the district administration are concerned, he is expected to supervise the working of other departments also. He is also district Magistrate. The Collector, being incharge of the district, is entrusted with the duties regarding general administration, law and order, Land Revenue and Civil Supplies. He is also assigned with the work of watching the progress of Five Year Plan Scheme implemented in the district under State and Local Sectors. He has also to look after the work of Collection of Small Savings and Family Planning, the most important subjects of the present day with the Co-operation of various departments and elected bodies in the district.

The Collector is assisted by Resident Deputy Collector and Deputy Collectors attached to the Collectorate in the working of Revenue administration. A Sub-Divisional Officer of a rank of Deputy Collector is put in charge of every Sub-Division. A Tahsildar (Mamlatdar) is incharge of every Taluka Office.

Each Tahsil is sub-divided into 4 to 5 revenue circles and revenue circles are further divided into Patwari Halakas for administrative convenience. There are in all 21 Revenue Circles and 373 Patwari Halakas in 5 Tahsils of Nagpur District.

The District and Sessions Judge, Nagpur is the head of the Judicial Department in the district. The judiciary is entirely separated from the executive. The separation of the Judiciary from the executive has been brought about in the district in 1959. The District and Sessions Judge is assisted by one Assistant and Additional Sessions Judge and two Extra-Assistant and Additional Sessions Judges. They have jurisdiction over the entire revenue district.

Besides Judicial and Revenue administration, there are district and divisional Officers of other departments with different administrative set up. Nagpur city, being the divisional Head Quarters of one of the four Revenue divisions of Maharashtra State, has an office of Divisional Commissioner acting as a co-ordinating agency in between Divisional Offices, Zilla Parishads and the State Government.

1.4 Police :-

The Nagpur city, being one of the biggest cities and second Capital of the State, has got a Commissioner of Police to look after the functions such as maintenance of Law and Order, Security to Life and Property of Citizens, to obtain intelligence concerning the Commission of cognizable offences, enforcement of Police regulations for preventing breach of peace etc.

In addition to above there are offices of Superintendent of Police for Rural areas, and city, Superintendent of Railway Police and Commandant of Police Force(Reserve). There were 3 Deputy Superintendents of Police. 4 Assistant Commissioners of Police, 2 Superintendents of Police 2 Asstt. Superintendent of Police, 3 Deputy Superintendents of Police and 39 Inspectors of Police in Nagpur District during the year 1972-73.

There is also a Police Constables Training School at Nagpur which caters to the training of unarmed constabulary of the districts in the Nagpur Range. It functions on regional basis and is in charge of a Superintendent of the rank of the Deputy Superintendent of Police. He is assisted by the necessary staff of Instructors.

Zilla Parishad :- With a view to promote democratic decentralisation and to secure greater participation of the people in the developmental activities, a district level body known as "Zilla Parishad" constituted with concillors, chosen by election from electoral divisions with 44 concillors is functioning in the district since 1st of May-1962. There are 13 Panchayat Samities at Block Level and the Chairman of 6 Panchayat Samities are the ex-officio members of the Zilla Parishad. Chairman of 5 Federal Co-operative Societies are also working as the associate members. The nominated members and the associated members have no right of voting while the ex-officio members and co-opted members have full rights of the elected members. The women members are co-opted and 10 more members are nominated by Zilla Parishad.

The area under the jurisdiction of the Zilla Parishad is the entire district area, excluding Cantonment, and Nagpur Corporation area. The area under the Jurisdiction of a Panchayat Samiti corresponds to the Block area.

The work of the Zilla Parishad is carried out through 7 subject committees viz. Standing Committee, Agricultural Committee, Work Committee, and Health Committee, Co-operation Committee Finance Committee, Education Committee. The Chief Executive Officer is the Head of the administrative Machinery in Zilla Parishad. He has been vested with full administrative powers for executing the provisions of the Zilla Parishad Act. He is assisted by officers of various departments. The Finance Branch of the Zilla Parishad is controlled by the Chief Accounts and Finance Officer generally taken on deputation from the Accounts and Treasuries Department and this branch works on the lines of the Finance Department of the State Government

1.4 Area and the Territorial Changes:-

The population figures for 1971 Census which are available show that the population of the district has been increased to 19,42,688 of which 10,55,357 is in Urban areas and 8,87,331 in rural areas. There are 10,10,911 males and 9,31,777 females. The percentage increase in population of 1971 census over 1961 census is 28.68 percent. According to 1971 census Population, the District ranks first in Vidarbha region and eleventh in the Maharashtra State. The total number of workers is 6,39,276 of which 3,45,319 are Agriculture cultivators and Agricultural Labourers, as per the figures of 1971 Census. The percentage of workers in the district to the total population is 35.48.

1.5 Topography:-

The district has an average elevation between 274.56 and 505 metres (900 and 1,000 Feet) above sea level and its relief features are characterised, by and large, by the residual hill ranges of the Satpudas and their detached members enclosing, between them undulating black soil valleys. Much of the topography is typically one of the Deccan Trap having flat-topped and terraced features, Low ~~butressed~~ side and isolated Knolls. Eastwards and north-eastwards, the landscape Change in an interesting manner due to the change in the underlying rocks. The rocks of Gondwana Series are not only important because of their Coal and manganese deposits, but in their surface expression they present a low rolling topography within a poor soil cover and vegetation.

The greater part of the district is an undulating plateau with a variation in height between 652.70 metres (2,140 feet) above sea level on the upland ridges in the north and about 274.50 metres (900 feet) near the Kanhanan river. This plateau surface of the district falls into three district drainage basins. In the North, the upland ranges are an extension of the Satpuda ranges, they are narrow in the west but widen to a breadth of about 19 Kms. (12 miles) towards the east. Immediately south of these upland ranges, stretches the Ambagad Hills, the western extremity of which lies in the Nagpur district. The historic temple of Ramtek is situated on a spur of this range signifying the Hill of Rama also known formerly as "Sundergiri" Vermilion Mount "Tapogiri" (Hill of Penance.) These isolated hills or knolls attain no great altitude.

1.6 Hills, Rivers and Soils :-

The main system of hills is the Satpuda and its offshoots. The northern range of hills extends along the whole border, being pierced only in two places where the Kanhan and the Pench rivers have broken through. On the west, it consists merely of the Outlying foothills of the Satpudas, the plateau proper lying behind them in Chhindwada. But from the Kanhan to the Pench, it is the major range of the Satpudas themselves which dominates the landscape, and the ascent of the Khamarpani Plateau is made in Nagpur. Along this length the hills are well wooded and picturesque and there is some striking scenery on the Pench river. The old Gond fort of Bhiwagad stands on this range. Government managed forests in this district mainly belong to these hills between the Kanhan and the Bhwanthari.

A few miles to the south of the main Satpuda range are two minor lines of hills to the west lie between Bhivagad and Parashioni terminating in the peak of Tekadi 508.34 metres (1,669 feet) of the Pench are the mansar hills, both these and the western range being now denuded of trees, and after a gap of a few miles, come the well-known Ramtek hills, rising to 427 metres (1,400 feet) at Ramtek proper. Timely measures by the Government have helped retaining the wooded character of this range.

Minor Hills :- The second main hill tract extends along the south-east of the district from Khargad on the Wardha river, where there are some fine waterfalls, to the junction of Wardha and Chandrapur with Nagpur. They separate the valley of the Kar, from that the Jam up to Kondhali and further south-east from watershed between the latter river and the Bor, Near Bori, they become the Kauras Plateau and here terminate to afford a passage for the Wardha river, continuing afterwards southwards and dividing the valley of the Nand from the Wainganga Plain. West of the Wunna the range is mostly well covered with picturesque valleys and ravines, among which are narrow strips of rich well - irrigated land of great fertility. But to the east towards Umred the range has lower levels and is uninteresting. It consists of low bare hills which are grass-covered and boulder strewn, except where, overlooking the Nand-valley, some excellent teak is grown.

The third main range runs north northwards through the Katol Tahsil from Kondhali to Kelod, separating the Wardha and Wainganga Valleys. The highest peak of it is at Pilkapar.

River:-

The Wardha and the Wainganga are the main rivers of the district. The Wardha flows along the part of the Western border and controls the drainage system of the Western part of the district. The principal tributaries of the Wardha are the Bor, the Munna, the Jam and the Kar. The Bor rises in the hills near Bazargaon and rushes down a winding and rocky Channel between Kondhali unlands and the Kauras Plateau passing into the Wardha to join the Wunna. Its narrow valley is very fertile and the high well-wooded cliffs on either sides render it a wild and beautiful spot in the whole of the district.

The Wunna rises near the hill of Mahadagad in the Pilkapar range and flows along the northern base of the Kauras plateau past Hingna and Bori, where it is crossed by the Central railway. It leaves the district at Ashta. The small Krishna river joins it at Bori.

The Jam rises among the hills south of Kondhali and flowing northwards into the centre of the Katol Tahsil takes a westernly turn past Katol and joins the Wardha at Jalalkheda. The Kar rises in the same range, but flows directly south-west, separating the Wardha and Nagpur districts till it joins the Wardha river at Khargad, the trijunction point of the two district with Berar. The Nand flows across a small strip in the south of the district and joins the Wunna beyond the border of Wardha.

The Wainganga flows along the part of eastern border and controls the drainage system of the eastern and central portions of the district. It forms the district boundry with Bhandara district for some distance.

The Kanhan and Pench are the most important tributaries of the Wainganga, both of which flow, from the Satpuda range in the Chhindwada district and meet near Kamptee, where they are also joined by the Kolar. The Kanhan, entering the district near Borgaon, takes a south easterly course past Khapa to Kamptee, where it receives the Pench and Kolar. In its subsequent course, it makes the boundary of Ramtek tahsil and after receiving the Nagari river near the hills of Bhivakund, finally empties itself into the Wainganga. The Kanhan river provides drinking water to Nagpur city.

The Kolar rises in the north-east corner of the Katol tahsil and after passing through the rocky part of Lohagad in Pilkapar range, emerges into the fertile plain of Saoner and separates Nagpur from Ramtek tahsil until its place as boundary river is taken by the Kanhan. Its bed is generally rocky. At Patansawangi, it receives the Chandrabhaga, which brings in the drainage of Kalmeshwar Plain.

The other rivers of some importance are the Bawanthari, the Sur and the Gaotala Sand, which draing the easter half of Ramtek tahsil. The Sur is remarkable for its shallowness but its fertile properties produce sugarcane and garden crops.

Irrigation Projects:- There were 6 (six) medium irrigation projects, of which 4 were completed and 2 were incomplete in Nagpur District as on 30th June 1972. Total estimated cost of the Projects is Rs. 444.00 Lakhs and gross commanded area is 57,313 hectares. An area of 19562 hectares will be irrigated by all these projects after these are fully completed.

A Pench Irrigation Project is being constructed in Ramtek Tahsil of Nagpur District at the cost of 36.00/crores. The Pench Multi-purpose Project comprises of two parts viz. (i) construction of storage dam at Totaldoh which includes of a power House at the dam site and would be storing water mostly for irrigation purposes and (ii) construction of pick-up weir at Kamptee-Kheori with erection of gate over the Kamptee Kheori weir alone can store enough water after erecting gates over it to ensure a water supply of 100 M.g.d. i.e. 50 M.g.d. for super Thermal Station and 50 M.G.D. for water supply to Nagpur city. The water stored in the storage dam at Totaladoh would be let out in the river and picked up at the pick-up-weir at Kamptee Kheri from where irrigation canals as well as water supply canal would take off. The project will be a boon to Nagpur district for its rapid economic and industrial growth.

Power Generation:- At present the power station at Khaperkheda some 15 Kilometres away from Nagpur city has got an installed capacity of 120 M.W.H. in addition to this there are power generation stations of Paras, Ballarsha, Bhusawal, Bldari and Nasik. The power generated at these power stations will not be sufficient for the ever increasing future need of Maharashtra State. Specially the demand for power in Vidarbha is going to be much more. Therefore, a Thermal Power Station having an installed capacity of 1000 Mg. is being established at Koradi near Khaparkheda. The work of the schemes has advanced to a great extent and the first generator at Koradi power station may possibly be commissioned up to 1973-74. After completion of this project, there will be no dearth of power in this district and region and a rapid industrialisation of the district can be achieved.

Soils :- The main soils of the district are Kali (Medium deep black cotton), Morand (Comparatively light deep brown in colour) and Bardi (Red Gravel with boulders.)

Medium deep black soil is found around Kalmeshwar, and Saoner in the Wardha Valley and in the Nagpur and Kamptee Plains. The principal Soil of the District is known as Morand. It is very suitable for cotton and Jowar and is found in almost all the talukas. In the Part of Rautek taluka especially in the valley of the Sur river. The morand soil is of very light colour, the regular rice land in the easter part of the district. Bardi is found on the summits and slopes of hills, principally in the Katol tahsil.

1.7 Climate, Temperature and Rainfall :-

Climate :- The climate of the district is characterised by a hot summer, well distributed rainfall and dryness except in rainy season. The winter seasons sets in from December to February and is followed by the hot season from March to May. The south-west monsoon season is from June to September while the period October- November constitutes the post Monsoon.

Temperature :- The cold weather commence from November and it lasts till February. December is usually the coldest month with the mean daily minimum temperature at 14°C . (57.2°F). In the wake of western disturbances the district is sometimes affected by cold waves when the minimum temperature drops down to 4°C . (39°F). Temperature begins to rise daily maximum temperature at 42.7°C (108.0°F). Nights are comparatively cooler in summer season. The on set of the south west monsoon at about the second week of June brings welcome relief from the heat with a considerable drop in temperature. The temperature shows slight increase in October and there after begins to fall.

Except during the Monsoon season when the humidities are high, the weather is generally dry. The humidities go-down to 20% or less in summer season.

Rain fall:- The district gets rainfall from south-west monsoons originating from the Arabian Sea. The average annual rainfall throughout the district amounts to 1016 mm. (40 1/2 ") and 1143 mm (45"), due to the hills and forest tracts in these areas. Rain season usually starts in early June and lasts upto October. Occasional showers also not common. In the severe hot season, the light showers are sometimes followed by severe dust storms. The rainfall during June to September constitutes about 90 percent of the annual total rainfall. The variation in the annual rainfall from year to year is not very large, though the agricultural season is affected from year to year due to vagaries of monsoons. The heaviest rainfall in 24 hours recorded in the district was 330.20 Mms. (13 inches) at Umred on 14th August, 1953. The year 1969-70 was the year of plenty of rainfall.

Famine:- The district has recently suffered on account of shortage of rains after 1947. The Fact Finding Committee, appointed by the Government of Bombay in 1960 has pointed that the district is free from the famine and scarcity conditions. However during 1972-73 many villages in the district had conditions akin to scarcity because of untimely and short rainfall.

✓ 1.9 Nagpur City:- The city of Nagpur and its suburban extensions which now almost reached upto the industrial nucleus of Kanhan from the nerve centre not only of the district but also of Vidarbha. Originally, a vantage point of defence, Nagpur grew into an urban centre under the Bhonsales of the Maratha confederacy with the formation of the Central Provinces under the British regime the town acquired a new importance, as the administrative capital. Its growth coincided with the economic development of the surrounding region abounding in cotton crop. As in the case of large cities, Nagpur developed a complex structure based on administrative, economic and social forces, which finds expression in its urban and suburban areas. It draws a greater strength from the new industrialisation and rightly compete with Bombay and Poona in its economic and Social growth.

CHAPTER -IIExplanatory notes on the scope and limitations of the statistical data presented in the Part-II Statistical Abstract

I. Purpose:- The abstract part of this publication gives exhaustive Statistical data on important Socio-Economic indicators of development. Tables on almost all important topics are presented in this part so that the publication could serve as a reference book. Talukawise data have been displayed as far as possible for inter taluka comparison. In most of the tables, data for 1972-73 have been indicated with data for 1971-72 and 1972-73 could not be presented, the same for the latest years, for which they were available, have been shown. In case of 'Livestock and Census of Government employees, however, the data for latest Census have been presented. The population data have been shown for 1971 Census and also provisional figures for 1971 census on certain items. All the data are collected from the State and Central Government Offices, local bodies and other relevant agencies. The footnotes below each table indicate the source from which the data have been collected.

II- District at a Glance :-

This table presents a birds eye-view of the Socio-Economic conditions of development in Nagpur District and Nagpur division, under different heads, such as area, population, agriculture, animal husbandry, education, transport and other miscellaneous Statistics. Reference year of data is also indicated in each Table.

III - Contents, Scope and Limitation:-

The Statistical tables presented in the District Statistical Abstract are grouped into 13 parts. The contents of the tables and the scope and limitations of the data displayed under each group are explained below.

(1) Area and Population :-

In all 7 tables i.e. table Nos. 1 to 7 are included in this section. Data with provisional figures for 1971 census are also indicated in table No. 1 to 7.

Table No.1 :- This indicates area, No. of Houses and population according to 1971 census, in Rural and Urban areas of Nagpur District. Total area figures of the district as on 1st July, 1971 are as supplied by the Surveyor General of India. Also the area figures of Urban areas are as supplied by Municipal Corporations or Councils. A town or an urban area is defined as a place which has 'A' Municipality, a Cantonment or Civil lines or 2(1). A population of 5000 or over and ... (II) At least 3/4 or more of male workers are engaged in non-agricultural pursuits. The area figures in table No.1 have given in Sq.Km. One Sq.Km. is equal to 0.386 square miles.

Table No.2:- It indicates decadal variations in population since 1951. The table No.3 gives classification of inhabited villages according to different population ranges. The term village i.e. (Rural area) used in the table denotes a statutorily recognised Village having well defined boundry and separate land records, Hamlet, wadies, or padas have therefore not been shown as separate village.

Table No. 4:- This gives talukawise classification of Towns according to population ranges in 1971 census in Nagpur district.

Table No.5:- It gives No. of workers and non-workers in Rural and Urban areas of the district according to 1971 census, and their classification according to Standarded Livelihood classes. The population according to livelihood classes is classified under rural and Urban classification.

Table No.6: The table No.6 gives distribution of population according to (A) Age group (B) Mother Tongue and (C) Religion separately for Rural and Urban areas and for district as a whole according to 1971 Census. Here "Mother Tongue" is defined as a language spoken by the persons 'Mother' or the person in his childhood or mainly spoken in the House. Dialects, have been included in the main languages on the basis of Giersious classification.

Table No.7:- It gives talukawise details of total population of scheduled castes and scheduled Tribes in Rural and Urban areas with the Population of Males and Females, under above mentioned Categories according to 1971 Census in Nagpur District.

1) Scheduled Tribes:- No caste is notified as Scheduled Tribe in Nagpur District.

Climate :- Only two tables are included under this section pertaining to rainfall and temperature at the selected centres in Nagpur District.

Table No.8:- Gives monthly rainfall and number of rainy days in each month at the selected centres for the years 1972. The data are collected through Revenue agency. A day is treated as 'Rainy-Day' if during the 24 hours, the rainuage recorded a minimum of 2.5 M.M. of rainfall. Annual rainfall for each centre is also indicated in the table "Normal Rainfall" is the average rainfall over a period ranging from fifty to eighty years.

Table No. 9:- Table No. 9 gives monthwise, maximum minimum and also annual temperature as recorded at selected centres for the year 1972. The data are supplied by the Government of India's Regional Meteorological Centre at Nagpur. The maximum and minimum temperature denotes the Maximum and Minimum temperature on any day during the month.

3. Agriculture :- In all 12 tables i.e. table Nos. 10 to 21 are included in this section.

The table No. 10 indicates talukawise figures of land utilisation under the standard heads of Land uses for the years 1970-71 and 1971-72. Against each taluka, the breakup of the total geographical area according to different types of land uses is shown. Major constituents of the Geographical area are forests, land put to non-agricultural uses, barren and uncultivable land, cultivable wastes permanent pastures, land under miscellaneous tree crops not included in area sown, current fallows, other fallows and lastly net area sown. Under 'Forests' are included all actually forest areas of land classed or administered as forests under any legal enactment dealing with forests whether state owned or private. If any portion of such land is not actually wooded but put to some agricultural use, that portion is included under the appropriate heading of cultivated or uncultivated land as the case may be. Land put to non-agricultural uses, stands for all lands, occupied by buildings, roads and Railways or under water e.g. rivers and canals and other lands put to uses other than agriculture. Barren and uncultivable land covers all barren and uncultivable land like mountains, deserts etc. Land which cannot be brought under cultivation unless at a high cost, is classed as 'Barren and uncultivable Land, whether such land is in isolated or within cultivated holdings.

Culturable waste includes all land available for cultivation whether not taken up for cultivation or taken up for cultivation once, but not cultivated during the current year and last five years or more in succession. Such lands may be either fallows or covered with shrubs and jungles which are not put to any use. They may be assessed or not assessed and may lie in blocks or within cultivated holdings.

'Permanent Pastures' and other grazing lands cover all grazing lands, whether they are Permanent Pastures and meadows or not. Village common and grazing lands within forest areas are included under this head 'Land Under Miscellaneous tree crops etc.', not included in the net area sown, are included in cultivable land, which is not included under net area sown but is put to some agricultural use. Land under casuriba tree, thatching grass, bamboo bushes and other groves used for fuel etc. which are not included under 'Orchards' are classed under the category 'Current fallows' comprise cultivable areas, which are kept fallow during the current year. 'Other fallow' land includes all lands which were taken up for cultivation, but are temporarily out of cultivation for a period of not less than one year and more than five years. The 'net area sown' consists of net area sown which crops and orchardss area sown more than once being counted only once. The gross cropped area represents the sub total of area/crops. The difference between the total of gross cropped area and net area sown is accounted for by the area sown more than once during the same year with the same or different crops.

Table No. 11:- Shows the area under different crops in each taluka. It gives break up of the total gross cropped area according to Major group of food and non-food crops.

Table No. 12:- Gives yield per hectare and outturn of principal crops in the district.

Table No. 13:- depicts the picture of talukawise area irrigated by different sources where as table No. 14 shows an area irrigated under different crops in each taluka. Table No. 15 shows the talukawise number of irrigation wells in the district. A quinquennial census of irrigation wells takes place after every five years. For any intermediate years they village officers are instructed to note the number of new irrigated wells constructed or old wells which have gone out of use and thus bring up-to-date the earlier census figures of number of wells. The minor irrigation works are shown in table No. 16.

Table No. 17:- gives the information on Major and Medium Projects in this district. Both completed and incomplete projects have been covered in this table. Position in this table is as it was on 30th June 1972. The cost of Medium irrigation project ranges between R.20 Lakhs to Rs.5 Crores, where as that of a Major irrigation Project, it is Rs. 5 crores and above.

Table No. 18 :- deals with monthly agricultural wage rates in 1972. This data is collected fortnightly throughout the year from three selected Rural Centres in Nagpur District. viz.(1)Mouda. (2)Kuhi and (3) Dhapewada.

Table No. 19:- deals with Agricultural implements in each Taluka. The implements are Wooden and Iron Ploughs, Carts, Sugarcane Crushers operated with power and Bullocks, Oil Engines with pumps for irrigation purpose, Electric Pumps for the irrigation purpose, Tractors and Oil Ghannis(Less than 5 Kg and above 5 Kg.) according to 1972 census.

Table No.20:- deals with Famine Scarcity and akin to scarcity data in the district for the year 1972-73.

Table No. 12:- indicates the position of precarious and other scarcity areas according to the history of scarcity in the district.

4) Animal Husbandry and Forest:-

a) Animal Husbandry :- In all 7 tables i.e. table Nos. 22 to 26 - C are included in this section.

Table No. 22:- Gives talukawise number of various types of livestock and poultry as enumerated in the district in the livestock census, 1972. The Census is conducted throughout the country on a uniform basis of concepts and methods of enumeration one in 5 years. During the Livestock Census Operations the Livestock and poultry were enumerated by house to house/particular care was taken to enumerate enumerated Livestock in slaughter houses, stray animals and animals in transit. Sex and age groupwise classification of the livestock is also indicated in the table.

The Table Nos. 23, 24 and 25 gives talukawise veterinary Statistics, disease wise Live stock mortality and No. of slaughter houses and animals slaughter in them for the year 1972-73.

B- Forest :- The table No.26 (A) gives details of area in different types of forests during the year 1972-73. Data regarding forests under the control of the State Government's Forest Department and those under the control of the State Government's Revenue Department are shown separately. The areas under forests are classified according to legal status into reserved forests protected forests and unclassified forests. The legal status refers to the classification of forests under the Indian Forests Act XVI of 1927. In reserved forests are those that are reserved

Reserved forests are those that are intended mainly for timber production, where in the rights of grazing and cultivation is allowed. In protected forests, the restrictions are not so rigid. Right of grazing or cultivation is allowed, but certain limitations and restrictions are imposed. The unclassified forest refers to the inaccessible forest or unoccupied waste. The forests which are taken by Government from local bodies or private individuals for management or lease basis are called 'leased forests'. There is no classification of ex-proprietary forests as such but in Nagpur division, some private lands containing valuable forest are taken over by Government under section 29 of the Indian Forests Act, 1927 which are not yet classified as per tripartite classification and they are termed as ex-proprietary. The forest area shown in the Table No. 26(A) may not tally with the area under forest shown in Table No. 10. The two sets of figures differ due to the following reasons.

- (i) In the Indian Forest Statistics Returns, the whole area including non-wooden area under the control of Forest Department is taken as area under forest, while in Agricultural Statistics, it is classified according to its actual utilisation.
- (ii) The Forest Department returns are meant to serve a definite administrative purpose and indicate the ownership of the forest areas and the actual utilisation of these areas is not so important from the point of view of Forest Department, as it is in the land utilisation Statistics under Agricultural Statistics.
- (iii) The Forest Department returns relate to financial year and Agricultural Statistics relate to the Agricultural year.

Table No. 30. Deals with the Annual

carried out by the Bureau of Economics and Statistics
Bombay, annually.

Table No. 31 :- Shows the employment
Exchange statistics for 1972-73.

Table No. 32 :- Gives occupational distri-
bution of total registrations and placements in the
employment exchange for the year: 1972-73 according
to Standard National Classification. Table No. 33
gives the volume of employment in different indus-
tries as on 31st March 1973.

The table No. 34 and 35
present the results of the census of Government
employees as on 1st July 1966, conducted by the
Bureau of Economics and Statistics, Bombay. The data
presented in these tables are restricted to the Class
I, II, III and IV employees.

The distribution of the employees according to monthly pay and emolument ranges is shown in table No. 34.

Table No. 36:- Gives the figures of Consumption of Electricity during 1972-73 and Table No. 37 gives progress of electrification of Towns and Villages and Population covered in the district during last decade.

6- Co-operation :- In all 8 tables i.e. table Nos. 38 to 45 are included in this section.

Table No. 38 gives the no. of Co-operative credit and non-credit societies of different types during the year 1972-73 as on 30th June 1973 in Nagpur District.

Table No. 39:- Presents data of central Co-operative Banks, Urban Banks in the District.

Table No. 40 Gives taluka-wise number of Primary agricultural societies, their membership, share capital, Reserve and other funds, working capital, Loans advanced recovered, loans outstanding and overdues and percentage of recovery to total loan advanced for the year 1972-73. Working Capital' includes paid up share capital, deposits, reserved and other funds and borrowings, Loans Outstanding includes outstanding in respect of loans, cash credit and over-drafts and the amount of outstanding bills purchased or discounted. 'Overdues' refer to amount of instalments which were due for collection but which were not actually collected and for the repayment of which no extension has been granted by a competent authority.

The Table No. 41 :- Presents the No. of Societies, their membership, share capital, working Capital and operation respectively for each type of Co-operative Societies.

Separate figures of loans advanced to traders and non-traders have been furnished in the table. The transactions of money lending in the state are regulated under the provisions of Bombay Money lenders Act, 1946. According to the Act, no money lender shall carry on the business of money lending except in accordance with the terms and conditions of such licence.

7. Medical and public Health :- In all 5 tables i.e. table Nos.46 to 50 are included in this section.

Table no.46 given in this section indicates number of hospitals, dispensaries, maternity homes and medical facilities available through public and public aided bodies in this Distt. with the number of Health Centres and Primary Health Centres, Doctors, Nurses, Vaidyas, Beds and total number of indoor and outdoor patients treated as well for the year 1972. The table does include all the Central Government Medical Institutions and also other private institutions engaged in providing medical facilities. Private clinics run by Private bodies or individuals are however not included in the table.

Table No.47 gives vital statistics such as number of registered births and deaths in this district. Sexwise classification of births, deaths and infant deaths for 1972 is also given talukwise in the district inclusive of the vital statistics.

Table No.48:- gives No. of deaths due to important causes in Nagpur District during 1972. Table No.49 gives talukwise statistics of vaccination and revaccination for small pox and cholera inoculation during 1972.

Table No.50:- Indicates number of sterilisation operations done under Vacectomy and Tubectomy with number of I.U.C.D. insertions performed during the year 1972-73 and Family Planning Centres in the District.

8. Education :- In all 7 tables i.e. Table Nos. 51 to 57 are included in this section.

The data in table Nos.51, 52 and 53 are according to provisional figures of 1971 Census.

Table No.51:- gives sexwise number of literate and percentage of literacy separately for rural and Urban areas of this district according to 1971 Population Census. As per 1971 Census definition a person was classified as a literate if he was able to read or write a simple letter in any language.

Table No.52:- and 53 presents sex-wise and educational levelwise statistics in rural and urban areas respectively of Nagpur district, according to 1971 Census.

Table No.54:- gives information regarding number of educational institutions according to types for the latest available years i.e. 1971-72 and 1972-73. Sexwise enrolment and number of trained and untrained teacher in these institutions is also indicated in this table. The classification of institutions according to 'Type' is slightly different from stage of education. There were at present many Secondary Schools, which also impart education in Primary course. Nevertheless, the entire enrolment of students included under 'Secondary' education. Primary institutions provided deucation for standards I to IV standards I to VII/VIII or less, and teach the curriculum approved by the Education Department. The Secondary institutions coach students for Standard VIII to X to XI standards with or without lower standards. Higher education is education after passing Secondary School Certificate Examination, which leads to a Degreed Examination.

Table No. 55:- presents data on the number of beneficiaries among backward classes such as scheduled caste, scheduled-tribes and other backward classes for the year 1971-72 and 1972-73. Beneficiaries for this table are persons who are getting educational concessions of either type such as scholarships, freeships etc.

Table No.56:- gives number of beneficiaries and financial concession granted to the Economically backward class in respect of Primary Secondary and Higher Institutions in the District during the years 1971-73 and 1972-73.

Table No.57:- gives data regarding recurring and Non-Recurring expenditure under Normal, and Plan heads by different agencies viz. Zilla Parishad, Municipal Councils, Corporations, Cantonment Boards etc, during the year 1971-72 and 1972-73 in this District.

The railway length is measured between the first and last stations within the district boundary. The figures of length of each type of route are therefore, approximate and not accurate.

Table No. 59:- gives road length according to different categories and surfacewise for the roads of Zilla Parishad and Building Communication Department as on 31/3/1973.

Table No. 60:- gives the motor vehicles in operation in Nagpur Division as on 31st March 1973.

The table No. 61 deals with operational Statistics of Nationalised Road Transport in Nagpur division as on 31st March, 1973. For this table, the S.T. Division comprises of (1) Nagpur (2) Wardha (3) Bhandara (4) Chandrapur Districts of Nagpur Region.

Table No. 62 presents the results of the traffic census on important roads conducted in Buildings and Communication Deptt. Govt. of Maharashtra. Data on the number of vehicles is according to categories and location of count-post, Type of surface carriage way, No. of light Medium and heavy motor vehicles and total traffic intensity in towns per 24 hours are also indicated in the table based on 1970 traffic Census.

Table No. 63:- relates to communication system No. of Post Offices, telegraph offices No. of letter Boxes, Telephone numbers, Radio Licences renewed during the years 1961-62, 1965-66, 1970-71, and 1972-73.

Table No. 64:- relates to Rural Broad Casting statistics as on 31st March 1973 in Nagpur District.

10 Local Bodies :- In all 4 tables i.e. tables Nos. 65 to 68 are included in this section.

Table Nos.65 to 68 give abstract of income and expenditure of local bodies such as Village Panchayats, Zilla Parishad and Municipalities for the financial years 1965-66, 1966-69, 1969-70, 1970-71, 1971-72 and 1972-73. The number of Village Panchayats includes number of independent Village Panchayats as well as group Village Panchayats.

11. Plan and Community Development:- In all 5 tables i.e. Table Nos. 69 to 73 are included in this section.

12.Prices :- Only 3 tables i.e. table Nos. 74, 75 and 76 are included in this section.

Table No. 74 gives monthly average wholesale prices of certain agricultural Commodities at regulated markets during the years 1972 in Nagpur District.

Table No.75:- gives Monthly average retail prices of various Commodities at District Head Quarters during the years 1972-73 in Nagpur District.

The average prices under each commodity are shown from the month of January to December for the year 1972 alongwith units and varieties of Commodities for which prices have been quoted. The data are regularly collected by District Statistical Office, every week on Friday by visiting the selected shops. The average prices of each commodities for the year is also shown in the table. As the information collected for the given commodities is restricted to only one quotation and that too only from one shop at District Head Quarters, the average price for individual commodity cannot be said to be fully representative. But the data may prove useful as a broad indicator of the changing trend in retail prices over the period of time.

Table No.76:- gives consumer price index number (revised series) for working class of Nagpur Centre published by the office of the Commissioner of Labour, Bombay. Monthwise data for the years 1971-72 and 1972-73 commencing from April and also averages for the years 1971-72 and 1972-73 have been given in this table. The base year for calculating price Index (New series) is 1960. The Index numbers of wholesale prices are issued by the Economic Advisor to the Government of India. The base year for the same is 1952-53. The method of Construction of the index is given in the Appendix to Index Numbers of wholesale prices in India revised series (1956) issued by the office of the Economic Advisor to Government of India. The equivalent of old Index numbers can be obtained by multiplying the new index by 5.22 as Multiplier.

13- Miscellaneous :- In all 12 tables i.e. table Nos. 77 to 88 are included in this section.

Table No.77:- gives the position of Police Force in Nagpur District during the year 1972.

Table No. 78 is for crime Statistics giving classification of offences under cognizable crimes and Non-cognizable crimes with the details of No. of offences, persons tried. Persons convicted and person's acquitted under above categories during the year 1972 in Nagpur District.

Table No.79:- gives statistics regarding work disposed off in civil and criminal courts in Nagpur District during the year 1972. The cases decided by the District Magistrate, and Executive Magistrates are not included in this table.

CHAPTER -III

This chapter deals with the stage of development in respect of different indicators during 1971-72 as compared to the stage of development during 1960-61. Wherever the position during 1960-61 is not available, the data during the year nearer to 1960-61 has been utilised for the purpose of comparison. The talukawise position has been depicted wherever possible and in case it is not possible, district position has been shown. The data on Agricultural Statistics have been presented for the year 1971-72.

Indicator No. 1 :- Percentage of Gross Sown area to net area.

The following table indicates the talukawise comparative percentage of gross sown area to net sown area during the year 1960-61 and 1971-72.

The percentage of gross sown area to net sown area increased during 1971-72 to 102.77 as compared to 101.43 during the year 1960-61. The increase is also noted during the year 1971-72 as compared to the previous year also when the percentage of gross sown area to net sown area was 102.53. The increase is noticed in all the tahsils except in Katol tahsil.

Indicator No. 2:- Productivity of Agricultural Crops.

Timely and sufficient rainfall or assured irrigation are the necessary prerequisites for good crops. The year 1960-61 was quite good and had brought in bumper crops. The agricultural year of 1971-72 proved to be Normal rains in this district. Comparative figures of outturn of crops in Metric tonnes during 1960-61 and 1971-72 and the percentage increase(+) or decrease(-) of outturn during 1971-72 over 1960-61 has been given in the following table.

The above table shows that though out turn of Rice, Gram, Ground nut and cotton, has increased during 1971-72 as compared to 1960-61, overall out turn of total cereals, and total pulses has decreased resulting in a decrease of 41.2 into out turn of total food grains. The outturn of Ground-nut has shown an increase of 83.3 during 1971-72 over 1960-61.

In general, the overall production of crops during 1971-72 was found to be less than the production of crops during 1960-61.

Indicator No. 3:- Gross Value of Agricultural Products.

As the farm harvest prices of various commodities are not available, the indicator has not been worked out.

Indicator No. 4:- Percentage of Irrigated area :-

The talukawase percentage of net irrigated area to net area sown and the percentage of gross cropped area to net cropped area during the years 1960-61 and 1971-72 in this district has been indicated in the following table.

The percentage of net irrigated area to net area sown in Nagpur District was 5.17 during 1960-61 which is increased to 7.48 during 1971-72. Low percentage of net irrigated area to area sown indicates that the irrigation facilities are very meagre in the district and needs to be improved. The percentage of net irrigated area to net sown area has slightly increased during 1971-72 as compared to the figures of previous year for the district as a whole. There was slight increase in percentage of net irrigated area to net area sown in all the talukas during 1971-72 as compared to 1960-61. The increase was larger in Katol, Nagpur and Saoner tahsils than the remaining tahsils.

The percentage of gross irrigated area to net irrigated area in the district has increased to 102.77 during 1971-72 over 1960-61 when it was 102.00

Indicator No. 5:- Change of crop Pattern.

The types of cropping patterns followed bifurcate the district in two parts. The first part comprises of Katol and Saoner tahsils and part of Nagpur tahsil where mainly Kharif Jowar and Cotton crops are grown. The other part consists of Ramtek and Umred tahsils and part of Nagpur taluka where paddy, rabi-jowar, wheat and linseed crops are predominantly grown.

The table below shows the percentage of food and non-food crops to gross cropped area in each taluka during the years 1960-61 and 1971-72.

During 1960-61 the area under food crops was approximately four times the areas under non-food crops in the district. The areas under food crops during 1971-72 shown decrease as compared to the area under food crops during 1960-61 in all talukas of the district. Reverse is the case with the area under non-food crops. The change is due to tendency of cultivators to grow more cash crops.

Under food crops, areas under oranges, chillies and vegetables have been increased as these are cash crops. Areas under chillies, oil seeds have also increased under non-food crops. These are also cash crops. The decrease in areas under food crops during the year 1971-72 over 1960-61 was mainly due to the increasing tendency on the part of the cultivators to cultivate cash crops in general. This can be proved from the fact that the area under non-food crops is increased in Katol and Ramtek Tahsils. Katol and Saoner where cotton is grown more than 26 % while it is limited to 6 % in the Tahsil of Ramtek and Umred where Paddy is the main crop. This can be proved from the fact that the area under non-food crops in the Tahsils of Katol, Nagpur and Saoner and part of Nagpur Tahsil where paddy is the main crop. The area under food crops was therefore approximately three times, the area under food & non crops during 1971-72 in this district.

It is seen that during the year 1960-61 almost all irrigated area was under food crops except 2.44 percent of it which was under irrigated non-food crops. The area under irrigated food crops in 1971-72 decreased slightly to 93.77 percent, while the area under non-food crops increased to 6.23 percent as compared with corresponding figures for 1960-61. The increase was greatest in Saoner tahils while it was lowest in Ramtek Tahsil.

Indicator No. 6: Increase in Agricultural Credit

and Outstanding dues.

Agricultural credit is the backbone of the Co-operative movement even though its scope has been enlarged to marketing, processing, Industry, Labour etc. There were 1959 Co-operative Societies in Nagpur district during the year 1972-73 out of which 636 were agricultural credit societies.

The agricultural credit facilities given by the agricultural credit societies play a vital role and a way to bring rapid development in the rural economy. The following table shows the position of loans advanced and outstandings of loan during 1961-62 and 1972-73 in Nagpur District.

The percentage increase in the amount of loan advanced during 1972-73 over the corresponding amounts of loans advanced during 1961-62 worked out 456.8. On an average Rs.0.67 lakhs were advanced by each of the Agricultural credit Societies during 1972-73 while the loans advanced per member works out to Rs. 493.

The percentage increase in loans outstanding during 1972-73 over 1971-72 works out to 266.6. On an average Rs.0.61 lakhs were outstanding per Agril.Credit Society during the year 1972-73.

The increase in average wage rates of males and females is 55.9 and 47.4 percent respectively. The average wage rates in all the three centres have been increased during 1972 as compared to average wage rates during 1963.

The practice of ~~in~~ utilising the services of carpentres, Blacismiths, Cobblers and Heardsmen for all the whole year on annual payment in kind called 'Baluta'. At the time of harvesting it is still followed in the centres selected from this district. The daily cash wage rates of these categories of persons were, therefore, not available.

It is noticed that the livestock population per hectare of cultivable land has increased in all the tahsils during 1971-72 over 1960-61 except in Umred tahsil. The livestock population per hectare of cultivable land was highest in Umred and Ramtek talukas during 1960-61 and in 1971-72 it was lowest in Katol and Nagpur talukas during the years 1960-61 and in 1971-72 Katol and Umred respectively. It indicates that the cultivable land in Umred tahsil has increased more in 1960-61.

Poultry per person was highest in Umred taluka in 1972 and lowest in Nagpur taluka. It was less in Nagpur taluka due to sizable population of Nagpur city. The consumption of electricity has more than double during 1972-73 as compared to during 1961-62. The number of villages electrified increased from 216 during 1960-61 to 892 at the end of the year 1972-73. The percentage of villages electrified to total number of inhabited villages in the district works out to 54.89. There is still much scope for the progress to be made in rural electrification. ~~The~~ To fulfil this need of the district, as well as the demand from this region, one more thermal power station with generating capacity of 1080 MWH is being set up at Koradi and the work of this project has made considerable progress during the year under review.

The above data shows that prices of all commodities have been considerably increased during the period from 1963 to 1972. Out of the 22 commodities the percentage increase in prices is more than 100 in the case of 9 commodities i.e. Rice, Jowar, Gramdal, Sugar, Arhar, Groundnut Oil, Charcoal Brass, and Pan. The percentage increase between 60 to 100 percent is in case of 10 more commodities i.e. Wheat, Gur, Vanaspati dalda, Goat Meat, Eggs, Dry Chillies, Potatoes, Tea leaf, Bidi and Dhoti increase between 30 to 59 percent is in case of remaining 7 commodities viz. Kerosene oil, washing soap and Supari.

C H A P T E R- IV .Progress of Plan Scheme during 1972-73.

The basic goal of Planning is improvement in the living conditions of the people. The stable and progressive economy could only satisfy the requirement of rapid development. Planning pays good result if all conditions remain unchanged. Unfortunately the economy of the Maharashtra State has been affected by three successive scarcity years. Development of the State can be judged from the increase in per capita income. In order to increase per capita income, growth rate of gross national product should be faster than the rate of increase of population.

The Government of India has given high priority by giving more weightage to the programme of Family Planning out of necessity for checking the rapid birth rate. The experts of the planning have pointed out the fact that achievements and the developments of the Planning have been curbed due to constant growth of Population. It is, therefore, essential to check up the growth of population and to arrange proper exploitation of the resources for increase in production and set up the tempo of economic activities in general and industrial development in particular to the maximum possible extent. In the present circumstances the planning Organisation has to plan the economic activities based on resources and not on requirements. It is, therefore, seen that in the present planning, all the schemes have been introduced on the priority of necessity and urgency, turning with the resources available. State Government has decided, looking to the need of the day, that the planning should be framed at district level according to the requirements of district with a view of balanced development.

The progress achieved under plan Schemes during the year 1972-73 in Nagpur District has been reviewed in the following paragraphs.

In all, 139 schemes have been implemented in Nagpur District during 1972-73 as District Level Schemes. Total Financial Outlay of Annual Plan 1972-73 for Nagpur District is Rs.332.34 Lakhs on District Level Schemes. Out of which Rs. 225.55 lakhs were for State Sector Schemes and Rs. 106.79 lakhs were for Local Sector Schemes.

The percentage of financial outlay on State Sector and Local Sector Plan Schemes was 67.87 and 32.13 respectively. The Budget outlay shown in the above table is as per Annual Progress Reports 72-73. The total expenditure during 1972-73 on all the plan Schemes stood at Rs. 354.05 lakhs.

The percentage of expenditure to budget out-lay works out to 106 percent. No regular budget provision was made for the schemes under the head 'Power'. The Maharashtra State Electricity Board, Bombay spent Rs. 63.87 lakhs on the Schemes of rural electrification in Nagpur District during 1972-73. The percentage of expenditure to the budget out-lay under (Agricultural Programme, Co-operation and Community Development, and Mining and Industry was 120, 112, & 95 respectively.

Agricultural Programme:- This head of development included important sub-heads of plans such as, Soil Conservation, Minor Irrigation, Agricultural production etc. The budget provision, actual expenditure and percentage of expenditure to budget provision under different sub-heads of development are given in the following table.

Agriculture in the State

greatly depends upon nature. The underground and flow irrigation potential being limited, nearly 75 percent of the cultivated land comes under dry farming methods. In Nagpur district gross cropped area was 5, 58,170 hectares out of this only 34,602 hectares was irrigated during 1969-70 which comes to 6.19 percent. To bring maximum land under irrigation the Government of Maharashtra has introduced various methods of irrigation i.e. Irrigation from wells, Tube wells, Lift Irrigation and irrigation tank the irrigation tanks have been classified according to the expenditure under construction of Minor irrigation tanks means construction work up to Rs.25 lakhs and an irrigation capacity up to 250 acres or 101 hectares. The medium Irrigation projects are those which are in the range of cost above Rs.25 lakhs to Rs. 5 crores. The projects costing more than Rs.5 crores, comes under Major Irrigation Projects. The major irrigation projects are implemented as State Level Schemes, The medium irrigation projects are implemented as divisional level, while the minor irrigation projects are implemented as district level schemes. Development of District Level Plan schemes is narrated in the following paragraphs of the Chapter.

Under the sub-head Agril.

Production there were eight schemes in this district. Out of the eight schemes five schemes were under local sector and the same were implemented by the Zilla Parishad, Nagpur and the remaining three schemes were under the State Sector. These three schemes were under the State Sector and were being implemented through the Divisional Soil Conservation Office and District Deputy Registrar for co-operative Societies, Nagpur.

Budget provision for these 8 schemes was Rs.10.96 lakhs (Rs.0.25 lakhs under State sector and Rs.10.71 lakhs under local sector) against which an expenditure is of Rs.10.94 lakhs. In State sector Rs.13000 have been spent for establishment of Seed farm and Rs. 2000 as subsidy to Municipal Councils for transportation of Town compost against the Budget provision of Rs.2000. Target of handling of town compost was 62000 tonnes against which achievement is 25,5000 tonnes only. In local sector an area of 1,12,231 of Hectors has been brought under intensive cultivation against the target of 1,05,902 Hectares. The scheme of Construction of one Agril.School building at Sawangi was in Progress. 10 demonstration of multi-crop production have been undertaken by the Zilla Parishad and an amount of Rs,2.00 lakhs was spent of Multi crop demonstrations. The programme of Horticultural Development was undertaken by the Zilla Parishad and an amount of Rs.2.00 lakhs was spent during the year under review. An amount of Rs.5.36 lakhs was provided for 'Integrated area development Schemes' for small holders against which an expenditure of Rs.5.35 lakhs has been booked. The amount spent was financial aid for construction of 13 community wells, purchase and development of land (2480 Hectares) and purchase of milk animals i.e. sheep 1650.

Minor Irrigation:- Budget provisions of Rs. 23.39 lakhs were allotted for the schemes under local sector and Rs.43.49 lakhs for the schemes under state sector. In local sector an expenditure of Rs.23.35 lakhs, and Rs.42.02 in state sector has been incurred.

sector was as below :-

Budget provision of Rs. 43.94 lakhs was made for the schemes under state sector for the purpose of development of irrigation resources. The expenditure actually incurred was 42.02 lakhs. The physical achievement under state sector was subsidy on construction of New Wells 366 and installation of 176 pump sets. The work of 17 Minor irrigation tanks was in progress during the year, and the work of 5 minor irrigation tanks was completed by the year 19-72-73.

Soil Conservation is one of the most important programme in modern Agril. Development. Levelling of land by Contour Bunding, Afforestation for Soil Conservation and Reclamation of Land have been done under this programme. To retain the productivity of land and to control the Soil erosion the State Government provided an amount of Rs. 19.39 lakhs. The during 1972-73, against which an expenditure of Rs. 43.29 has been incurred. An area of 17,150 Hectares was to be bunded under the Schemes of "Bunding" and the target to cover an area under schemes of Terracing of Land for Paddy crop, was not fixed. Against this targets the achievements are 7658 hectares and 649 hectares respectively. The Divisional Forest Officer is the implementing authority for the scheme viz. "Afforestation for Soil Conservation". Under this scheme an area of 50 Hectares has been brought under afforestation. Under this programme, to retain the productivity

Under the Town Milk supply schemes, 21,000 litres of milk has been distributed against the given target of 23,830 litres by the Nagpur Town Milk Schemes. 6. 20 hectares of land has been brought under plantation of General Utility Timber.

Co-operation and Community Development:-

The expenditure incurred per head of development was Rs. 7.74 lakhs. Under this sub-head co-operation no financial assistance to Market Committees could be advanced, as these co-operative societies did not fulfil the criteria for grant of financial assistance.

Irrigation and Power:-

The schemes of rural electrifications has been implemented under this sub-head by the Maharashtra State Electricity Board. The expenditure incurred on this scheme was from the two resources, one from the State Government and another Agril.refinance corporation. The expenditure under the rural Electrification scheme is Rs.63.87 lakhs against budget provision of Rs. 39.00 lakhs. 138 villages were electrified and connections to 4520 electric pumps were given according to the reports during the year under review.

Industry and Mining:-

An amount of Rs.23.30 lakhs has been spent against budget provision of Rs. 24.39 lakhs.

Transport and Communication:-

Five schemes were implemented under this sub-head during 72-73. An expenditure of Rs.18.28 lakhs was incurred during 72-73 against the budget provision of Rs.18.59 lakhs. District Roads, Roads in Hilly and Forest area, Village Approach Roads and Roads of Economic Importance were taken for constructions during the year. The special addition in this year was the programme of rural employment Guarantee scheme which was linked with other plan schemes.

Social services:- Rs.114.97 lakhs have been spent during the year 1972-73 under the head "Social Services". The following table gives the break up of expenditure under the head according to different sub-heads of development.

General Education:- In general education 75 teachers were continued under the scheme of Normal Expansion of Primary Schools during this year. The stress was given on primary education. Forty five schools were assisted under the scheme of Development and expansion of Non-Government Secondary Schools in Vidarbha 10700 students have been benefited under the scheme of education concession to students of Economically backward class people. Concessions were given to 1850 children of primary school teachers. 17 new rooms were constructed during this year. Under the scheme of strengthening of inspecting staff for inspection of schools, 4 ADIS were appointed. 6 additional sections of High schools and middle schools were opened. 5 teachers were appointed, 325 teachers were trained under the scheme of basic training to Pre-Primary Teachers, and 171 under elementary teachers training.

No loan was granted to Voluntary Societies for construction of school buildings during the year.

Technical Education:- Two schemes pertaining to this sub-head on establishment of new polytechnic and expansion of existing polytechnic were implemented under the sub-head "Technical Education" during the year 1972-73.

Medical and Nursing:- Schemes regarding installation of Kidney unit in the Medical College Hospital, Nagpur and development of mental Hospital in Nagpur have been implemented during the year 1972-73 in Nagpur District.

Water supply and Drainage:- The budget provision for the schemes under sub-head was Rs.31.52 lakhs. 6 water supply schemes for urban areas and 19 Rural drinking water supply schemes were in progress at the beginning of 1972-73.

18 New wells under Rural water supply scheme have been constructed during the year. Total expenditure under this sub-head was Rs.42.66 lakhs out of which Rs.35.36 lakhs under State Sector and Rs. 7.30 lakhs under local sector has been incurred.

Housing:- Budget provision of Rs. 48.89 lakhs was year marked for 5 housing schemes with intention to provide accommodation on rented basis and hired purchases basis to the Industrial workers, Low Income Group, Middle Income Group, Economically weaker sections and also for land acquisition and development schemes. An amount of Rs. 13.70 has been spent on these schemes. The construction work of houses under these schemes was in progress.

Welfare of Backward Classes:-

Exemption from payment of tuition fees, examination fees, award of scholarships had been given to 2713 scheduled caste, scheduled tribe and other backward class students under this sub-head during 1972-73 in Nagpur District. Rs.0.03 lakhs have been spent for loan cum subsidy to the cottage industries and professions, under which 30 societies were benefitted during the year. 20 irrigation wells were constructed and 20 houses were constructed for schedule caste and schedule tribes.

Under this sub-head during the year 1972-73, expenditure incurred was Rs. 1.01 lakhs.

Labour and Labour Welfare:- One scheme for craftsman training was implemented under this sub-head.

Rural Broad Casting:- 75 Radio sets were installed during this year in Nagpur District as against the target of 75 radio sets to be installed. The achievement is cent percent.

Centrally sponsored schemes:- In addition to above schemes 6 centrally sponsored schemes were also implemented in the district during 1972-73. The budget provision for these schemes was Rs.33.05 lakhs and expenditure incurred was Rs. 29.82 lakhs which is 90.3 percent of the budget.

The schemes include, applied Nutrition programme, Grant of tuition fees, examination fees to students of Vimukta Jatis under welfare of Backward Classes, District Roads from Central Government Fund and two schemes viz. Family Planning and Malaria Eradication of public Health Department.
