CHAPTER : I  
INTRODUCTION.

**1.1    LOCATION:**

The district of Sangli is a part of the famous Deccan plateau. It lies between  $16^{\circ} 45'$  and  $17^{\circ} 33'$  North latitude and  $73^{\circ} 42'$  and  $75^{\circ} 40'$  East longitude. It is bounded on the east by the district of Bijapur in Karnatak State, on the West by the Ratnagiri district, on the South by the districts of Kolhapur and Belgaum and on the North by the districts of Satara and Sholapur.

**1.2    TOPOGRAPHY (i) SOIL:**

The soils of varied texture and structure are met with in Sangli district. The soil in the district varies from the deep black in the river valleys to shallow murmad red or grey in the hilly areas.

1.3    The soil in the western part of the district, comprising area from the tahsil of Shirala is formed from red laterite mixed with hard murum due to the hilly nature of the zone.

1.4    The central portion of the district which covers areas of Walwa, Tasgaon(Part) and Miraj(Part) tahsils has deep black soils capable of yielding bumper Kharif crops. These soils which are highly retentive of moisture also grow Rabi Jowar, Wheat and Gram. They are also good for irrigated crops like sugarcane, turmeric, chillies etc. This central portion is thus the rich agricultural tract of the district.

1.5    The hilly tract comprising parts of Khanapur, Tasgaon and Miraj tahsils grows Jowar and Bajri, while the eastern zone comprising areas of Jath, Atpadi and Kavathe Mahankal tahsils with a very low rainfall and poor grey soils, is a well known scarcity tract.

### 1.6 (ii) RIVERS:

The Krishna and the Warna are the principal rivers of the District. The Yerla, the Morna, the Manganga, the Nanni, the Agrani and the Bor are the other small rivers flowing through this district. During rainy season the flood waters entail much soil erosion, while during the dry part, they resume a slender course. These rivers go dry in summer season.

### 1.7 (iii) HILL RANGES:

There are two main systems of hills. The Sahyadri range and its off-shoots, and the off-shoots of Mahadev range. The Sahyadri system includes the main range of the Sahyadri which forms the western boundary of the district. One of the spurs of the Mahadev range known as Mahimangad-Panhala spur stretches up to Khanapur. At Khanapur it splits in two branches, one branch passes 32 km. in the south till it ends in the <sup>old</sup> Panhala Fort, 24 km. from Athani road Railway station. The other branch stretches south-east to Belur about 8 km. south west of Jath. It forms the water-parting between the valley of the Yerla, a tributary of the Krishna on the right and the valley of the Man, a tributary of the Bhima on the left.

### 1.8 PAINFALL:

The rains start sometime in the middle of June and last till the end of September in the district. Major portion of rainfall in the district is received between July and September. During the first half of monsoon, most of the days are cloudy with drizzling rains, whereas during the latter half it rains ~~bit~~ a bit heavily.

1.9 Rainfall is the heaviest in the regions of Sahyadri. Western portion of Shirala tahsil on an average gets rainfall over 2,000 mm. in a year. The central and eastern portions receive annual rainfall measuring about 750 mm. The north eastern portion receives the lowest rainfall in the district averaging about 500 mm. in a year.

1.10 The fact finding committee appointed by the Govt. of Bombay in 1960 had reported that the rainfall in this area is not dependable and the area is likely to be affected by scarcity conditions once in six years. The fact finding committee appointed by the Govt. of Maharashtra in 1973 has also recognised this fact. As per the report of this committee six tahsils of this district fall in the broad drought zone. These tahsils are Atpadi, Khanapur (Khanapur and Vita circles), Tasgaon (Savalaj and Visapur circles), Jath, Kavath, Nahankal and Miraj (Malgaon circle).

1.11 Although Sangli district was one of the nine severely scarcity affected districts of Maharashtra State in the year 1972-73, there were no scarcity or akin to scarcity conditions in this district particularly in the year 1973-74.

1.12 MINERALS :

There are no important mineral deposits except building stones, clay and limestones. The limestone is associated with trap formation and the quality is not uniform. Good clay for bricks and tiles is found on the banks of the rivers.

### 1.13 FOREST

The total area under forests in this district according to the Statistician Forest Department was 43172 hectares in 1973-74. The forest area formed hardly 5.6 percent of the geographical area of this district.

### 1.14 AREA AND DEMOGRAPHY :

The district has an area of 8563.0 sq. km and population of 15,39,820 as per population census 1971. Out of this 2.86 lakh persons(18.63 percent) were in urban areas and 12.53 lakh persons(81.37 percent) were in rural areas as compared to 31.17 percent urban and 68.83 percent rural population for the State.

1.15 The decennial increase of population compared to 1961 was 25.12 percent in total population, 49.09 percent in urban areas and 20.67 percent in rural areas. The following table will give tahsilwise position in this respect.

**(I) DISTRICT ADMINISTRATION :**

**(i) State Govt. Administration.**

1.16 The Collector of the district is in charge of General Administration, Law and Order, Treasury, Land Revenue and Khadi Civil Supplies etc. He is assisted by a Resident Dy. Collector and two Dy. Collectors who hold charge of the two Revenue Divisions and have their headquarters at Sangli and Miraj. For each of the eight tahsils a tahsildar is in charge of the respective tahsil.

**(II) LOCAL BODIES:**

1.17 Under the Maharashtra Zilla Parishad and Panchayat Samitis Act of 1962 the Zilla Parishad and eight panchayat samitis have been established in the district with a view to promoting and securing participation by the people in the developmental works by decentralisation of powers and functions.

1.18 At the Block (tahsil) level, the Panchayat Samiti consists of all elected and co-opted councillors from the area of the Block and a Chairman of a co-operative society conducting the business of purchase or sale of agricultural produce in the area of the Block as an associate member and a chairman of a co-operative society conducting the business in agriculture in the area of the Block as a co-opted member. Sarpanchas elected by members of village panchayats are also elected members of the panchayat samiti. Their number is at the rate of two for each electoral division in the area of the block.

1.19 The towns of Sangli, Miraj, Islampur, Ashta, Tasgaon and Vita are under the Municipal Administration, while the newly declared urban area of Madhavnagar is a non-municipal town. The areas under the jurisdiction of the Zilla Parishad and Panchayat Samiti correspond to the district and tahsil boundaries except in the case of Municipal towns. The Sangli Zilla Parishad covers 96.7 percent of district area and 81.95 percent of the total population of the district.

(III) PUBLIC BODIES ADMINISTRATION:

1.20 For rapid development of an area, the services of the State Transport and State Electricity Board are of vital interest. The office of the Divisional Controller State Transport Division Sangli is functioning at Sangli for the Sangli district. The offices of the Superintending Engineer and Executive Engineer of Maharashtra State Electricity Board are also located at Sangli. One more office of the Executive Engineer, of Maharashtra State Electricity Board is opened at Islampur, very recently. The branch office of the Life Insurance Corporation is functioning in Sangli and Tasgaon under its divisional office at Satara.

CHAPTER-II  
EXPLANATORY NOTE.

PURPOSE AND SCOPE :

2.1 In this Abstract, comprehensive statistics are presented so as to provide necessary basic data for further studies in the Socio-Economic aspects of the Sangli district. Wherever possible, taluk-wise position on different topics for the year 1973-74 is given in the Abstract.

2.2 The source of the data is shown at the end of each table. Besides, notes explaining the major limitations, if any, in the table are also given at the end of the concerned table.

2.3 In the following paras, the concepts of certain terms, sources and limitations etc. of the statistics presented in this Abstract are given.

DISTRICT AT A GLANCE :

2.4 The table gives some general particulars about the Sangli district and Maharashtra State. Against each item, mention of the reference period is made. The data on location, population, area, no. of villages, towns, total workers and non-workers, literacy are presented in this table along with other important information pertaining to agriculture, industry, animal husbandry, electricity, co-operation, education, transport and communication etc.

1. AREA AND POPULATION :

2.5 Final figures of 1971 population census are presented in this section in respect of area, houses, population, density of population, population variation, population breakup into urban and rural, villages and towns according to population ranges,

total number of workers and non-workers. The data in respect of distribution of population according to age-group and religion and S.C./S.T. data are also presented as per 1971 census population.

2.6 For any place to be recognised as an urban area(town) for the 1971 census, it was to have a municipal corporation or an area under a municipal council or a cantonment or a civil line. If it did not have any of these urban local bodies to administer its affairs, the following empirical tests were applied (a) a minimum population of 5,000(estimated for 1971); (b) a density of not less than 400 per km<sup>2</sup> (1,000 per sq. mile) ; (c) 75 percent of the male working population pursuing occupations falling outside agriculture; (d) the place should have, according to the Director of Census - Operations of the State, a few pronounced urban characteristics and amenities.

2.7 As far as a worker and non-worker is concerned, a person is classified as worker if (a) in case of seasonal work like cultivation, livestock, dairying, household industry, etc.; he has worked in the current or last working season for the greater part of the season (b) in the case of regular employment in any trade, profession, service, business or commerce, he was employed during any of the fifteen days preceding the day of the enumerator's visit to the household.

2.8 A person who was working but was absent from his work during the fifteen days preceding the day on which he was enumerated or even exceeding the period of fifteen days due to illness or other causes has been treated as a worker. A person who had been offered work but had not actually joined has been treated as a non-worker.

2.9 The 1971 census stipulated that a person primarily engaged in household duties or those who were students and helped in the family economic activity, but not on full-time scale, should be treated as non-workers in respect of their main activity.

## 2. CLIMATE

2.10 The table no.8 gives monthly normal rainfall, number of rainy days and actual rainfall of 9 rainguage stations viz. - Atpadi, Vita, Shirala, Islampur, Tasgaon, Jath, Kavathe Mahankal, Miraj and Sangli in the Sangli district. The figures of normal rainfall are worked out by the Indian Meteorological Department on the basis of actual rainfall for the periods ranging from a minimum of five years to a maximum of eighty years. As regards rainy days, a day is treated as a rainy day, if during the 24 hours the rainguage recorded a minimum of 2.5 mm. of rainfall.

2.11 The table no.9 gives the maximum and minimum temperatures of Sangli station. The data as supplied by Indian Meterological Department is exhibited in this table.

## 3. AGRICULTURE:

2.12 Under this section data regarding land utilisation, area under different crops, irrigated area, yield rate and production, minor, medium and major irrigation projects and famine and scarcity condition etc. are presented.

2.13 The table no.10 gives tahsilwise figures of land utilisation under the standard heads of utilisation. Against each tahsil, the break up of the total geographical area according to different types of land used is shown. The changes in the geographical area over years are mainly due to the progress of cadastral surveys. The area according to the village papers is

Calculated from the village returns prepared by the village officials for revenue purposes. There are differences between the figures of total area according to the Surveyor General and according to the village paper because the latter is calculated by totalling up village returns while the former is calculated in blocks. Under 'forests' area includes all actually forested area or lands classed or administered as forest under any legal enactment dealing with forests whether state owned or private. If any portion of such land is not actually wooded but put to some agricultural use, that portion is included under the appropriate heading of cultivated or uncultivated land. Land put to non-agricultural uses stands for all lands occupied by buildings, roads and railways, etc. and other lands put to uses other than agricultural. Barren and unculturable land covers all barren and unculturable land like mountains, deserts etc. Land which can not be brought under cultivation unless at a high cost, is classed as unculturable, whether such land is in isolated blocks or within cultivated holdings. Permanent pastures and other grazing lands cover all grazing lands. Village common grazing lands and grazing lands within forest areas are included under this head. Under "miscellaneous tree crops and groves not included in the net area sown", is included all cultivable land which is not included under net area sown but is put to some agricultural use. Lands under casurina trees, thatching grass, bamboo bushes and other trees for fuel etc. which are not included under 'Orchards' are classed under this category. Culturable waste includes all lands available for -

Cultivation whether not taken up for cultivation or taken up for cultivation once but not cultivated during the current year and last five years or more, in succession. Such lands may be either fallow or covered with shrubs. Current fallows comprise cropped area which is kept fallow during the current year. If any seedling area is not cropped again in the same year, it is also treated as current fallow. Other fallow land includes all lands which were taken up for cultivation but are temporarily out of cultivation for a period of not less than one year and not more than five years. The net area sown consists of net area sown with crops and orchards, area sown more than once being counted only once. The gross cropped area represents the sum total of area under all crops. The difference between the total cropped area and net area sown is accounted for by the area sown more than once on the same land during the same year with the same or different crops.

2.14 The table no.12 presents the outturn and average yield per hectare of principal crops in the district. The estimates of outturn are based partly on the results of crop-cutting surveys and partly on "anawari" method. The table no.16 gives the information on number of minor irrigation works completed and allied information regarding irrigation in Sangli district. The table no.17 gives the information on area commanded, irrigation potential, irrigated area and other items in connection with major and medium irrigation works in Sangli district. The table no.19 presents the figures of Agricultural implements enumerated in the 11th Livestock Census, 1972. The table no.20 gives the data about famine and scarcity <sup>hit</sup> area while table no.21 exhibits the history of famine and scarcity during the preceding years.

4. ANIMAL HUSBANDRY AND FORESTS:

2.15 Under this section data regarding Livestock, Veterinary statistics, Livestock mortality, slaughter houses and animals slaughtered, forest area and major and minor forest products are presented.

2.16 The table no.22 gives the number of various types of livestock, poultry etc. as enumerated at the time of 1972 Livestock Census. In this census, all the livestock was enumerated by house to house enquiry. Particular care was taken to enumerate livestock in slaughter houses, stray animals and animals in transit. The table no.25 shows the information regarding slaughter houses and animals slaughtered in the recognised slaughter houses in the district. The information regarding animals slaughtered in non-recognised slaughter houses and those slaughtered by butchers in rural areas is not available. The table no.26 (A) gives figures of area under forest in the ~~xix~~ district. The forest area figures in this table are different from the figures in the table on land utilisation. The concepts of classifying areas by the two departments are different.

5. EMPLOYMENT, INDUSTRY, MINING AND ELECTRICITY:

2.17 The statistics regarding factories and factory workers, employment exchange activities, consumption of electricity, and electrification of towns and villages are shown under this - section.

2.18 In this section, statistics regarding employment in industries is given. The table no.27 gives average daily employment and mandays worked in the factories which have submitted prescribed return under the Act. The table no.28 throws light on

another important aspect of factory employment. The classification of factories according to working strength is denoted. The table no.29 gives the classification of factories according to no.of days worked during the year. Table no.30 is designed to depict the position of registered factories as collected in the Annual Survey of Industries. In this table data regarding no, of factories, their employment and their financial position is presented. Table no.31,32 and 33 give data about registrations, vacancies notified, placement made; occupational distribution of registration and placement; and industrywise employment respectively. The table no.34 gives information regarding consumption of electricity in the district. The table no.35 gives progress of electrification in the district. The table includes villages and towns(alongwith their 1971-census population) which are electrified by the Maharashtra State Electricity Board and Private electric agencies viz. (1) Jubilee Electric Works, Sangli (2) the Co-op. electric supply society ltd. Vita (3) the Tasgaon Electricity General Co-op. society ltd. Tasgaon(4) Miraj Electricity Supply co. ltd.Miraj (5) Madhavnagar electric supply company.

#### 6. CO-OPERATION:

2.19 This section depicts the major activities of co-operative movement such as categorywise organisation of societies, activities of co-operative Banks, Primary Agril.credit societies, marketing societies, other co-operative societies of different types, Agril.Produce Market Committees and money lending activity in the district.

2.20 The main functions of Agril. credit societies are to help members by way of providing short and medium term loans for meeting their agricultural necessities like improved seeds, fertilizers, Agril. improved implements etc. The help is also extended in the matters of storage, transportation and sales of the Agril. produce.

2.21 The agricultural non-credit societies look after the work of better farming by way of educating the agriculturists in the adoption of improved agricultural practices, crop protection etc. The societies also undertake educational, economical, cultural and house building activities so as to uplift the standard of living of the agriculturists.

2.22 The main function of the Urban Banks, urban credit cooperative societies and salary earners co-operative societies is to promote the qualities of economy, and co-operation amongst the members and also to make them industrious. They also augment the saving habits of the people by way of making the banking facilities easily available. They give loans to the members on the securities like gold, immovable property, Govt. securities, commercial goods etc. They also provide loans to the Artisans and small traders.

2.23 The main functions of Non-Agril. Non exi credit societies are to run printing presses, to provide electricity to members and consumers for domestic, industrial and agricultural purposes, to run Montessories, Primary schools and educational institutions for educational spread and things of the kind.

7. MEDICAL AND PUBLIC HEALTH:

2.24 This section includes five tables containing the data regarding medical facilities available through public and public aided bodies, births and deaths, infant deaths, deaths due to principal causes, vaccination and cholera innoculations and family planning. The statistics on medical facilities do not cover the facilities available through private institutions run by individuals or associations.

8. EDUCATION:

2.25 There are five tables under this section which enumerate the data regarding sexwise literacy, educational institutions alongwith their strength, educational concessions to Backward class and Economically Backward class students and expenditure on Primary Education in this district. The no. of educational institutions relate to the academic year ending June while the no.of pupils is as on 31st March.

9. TRANSPORT AND COMMUNICATION :

2.26 In this section, statistical information relating to various modes of transport is given. The table no.56 gives information on length of railway route in the district. There are three gauges viz. Broad, meter and narrow gauge in this district. Rail length in this district has been calculated by referring to Railway time table and the district map showing rail routes therein. In table no.57 figures of road length as at the end of the reference year is shown. Roads maintained by municipal authorities are given seperately. The table no.58 presents data about motor vehicles in the Kolhapur Region. The data is presented

for both Kolhapur and Sangli districts as separate figures for Sangli district are not available. The table no.59 relates to Nationalised Road Transport. A separate S.T. Division opened at the fag end of the year 1969-70 is functioning for this district as full fledged division. The Divisional Controller, Maharashtra State Road Transport Corporation, Sangli Division, Sangli has supplied the information for Sangli district. In table no.60 the data of traffic census is given. The table no. 61 gives information about post office, telephones and radio licences etc. The table no.62 gives statistics on rural broadcasting in this district.

10. LOCAL BODIES:

2.27 Statistics regarding village panchayats, municipalities and Zilla Parishad are shown in this section. The table no.63 presents material on income and expenditure of Village Panchayats, Zilla Parishad and Municipalities. It is a summary table of table nos. 64,65 A,B,C and 66. In table no.64 the break up of the information on income and expenditure of Village panchayats is given. This break-up is in two way. On the one hand the information for V.P. under each Panchayat Samiti is given separately and on the other hand, total income and expenditure is further divided into major heads such as income from taxes, fees, donations, contributions and expenditure on administration, public works, sanitation etc. The table no.65(A) and 65(C) give particulars of income and expenditure of Sangli Zilla Parishad. The receipts are sub-divided into self raised resources, Govt. grants and debt section. Table no.65(B) shows purposewise details of grant. The expenditure is likewise divided into many sub-heads of development. The table no.66 gives information

on income and expenditure on different sub-heads in respect of Municipalities. Under income, information is separately shown under grants, taxes and other income. Under expenditure, further break-up into general administration, public safety, public works etc. is shown.

11. PLAN AND COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT :

- 2.28 Statistics regarding expenditure and achievement under Annual Plan, Community Development Programme etc. are given. The table no.67 gives plan expenditure under different development sub-heads in Sangli district. In table no.68 the details regarding important physical achievements during 1973-74 are shown.
- 2.29 The table no.69 shows the position of Community Development Programme in the district. The information regarding no. of blocks of Community Project Administration pattern in each stage, the population covered etc. is given. Each C.P.A. pattern Block covers an area having 66,000 population. The table no.70 gives information about the expenditure incurred according to stages for the period upto 31-3-1974 and also for the year 1973-74. The table no.71 gives information on important physical achievements on selected items in all the blocks in Sangli district.

**12. PRICES :**

2.30 The table no.72 gives monthly averages of wholesale prices of Agricultural commodities transacted in regulated markets. The district average for each variety and for each month is also given.

2.31 The table no.73 gives the monthly average retail - prices of important commodities at Sangli Headquarter during 1973. As the information collected for the few given commodities is restricted to only one cputation and that also from only one shop in the district headquarter, the average shown for individual commodities cannot be said to be fully representative, but the data may prove useful as broad indicator of the trend in changes in retail prices over the period of time. The table no.74 gives consumer price index number for working class of Sholapur and Poona centres for the year - 1973-74. For the calculation of Index, the years 1960 and 1961 are taken as base years. for Sholapur and Poona centres, respectively.

**14. MISCELLANEOUS :**

2.32 In this section, statistics regarding miscellaneous subjects like police force, crime statistics, banks, joint stock companies, insurance, small savings, cinema theatres, land revenue collection exclusive of Local Fund Cess, Printing - presses, <sup>news</sup> papers and periodicals, is presented.

2.33 Moreover, important indicators in the fields of development such as agriculture, livestock, industry, education, health etc. are indicated for the years 1950-51, 1960-61, 1966-67, 1970-71, 1971-72, 1972-73 and 1973-74. These selected indicators are very useful for assessing progress in various fields over important periods in the recent past.

### C H A P T E R - III

#### An Analytical Review of Sectorial trends 1973-74 :

3.1 An analytical review of the facts and figures regarding various socio-economic features of the Sangli district, which occurred as a result of the developmental activities can be visualised more accurately from the progress made in the fields of agriculture, livestock and poultry, employment, electricity consumption, extent of credit and banking facilities etc. The nature of progress achieved in these fields is considered for this purpose.

#### Agriculture :

3.2 Agricultural backwardness is one of the prominent features of our Agro-Economy even today. The State of Maharashtra and the districts of Sangli are no exception to this. In fact, in this area it is more pronounced. Hilly region, rocky or poor soils, scarcity and uncertain rains in the eastern zone, inadequate irrigation facilities, poor use of chemical fertilisers, all these have marred the productivity of the soil.

3.3 The figures furnished below will vividly throw light on important aspects of agriculture in Sangli district.

#### Percentage gross sown area.

3.4 The position regarding percentage of gross cropped area to net area sown i.e. the extent of double cropping can be assessed from the table given below.

3.5 From the above figures it will be seen that the percentage of gross cropped area to the net area sown for the district as a whole was constant during the years 1965-66 and 1971-72 <sup>but</sup> the same was found to be decreased in 1972-73.

3.6 Within the district, decrease was observed in Atpadi, Khanapur, Shirala and Kavathe Mahankal tahsils, in the year 1972-73 as compared to the previous year. In the tahsils of Walwa and Miraj there was slight increase in percentage of double cropped area. Tasgaon and Miraj tahsils have better percentage of double cropped area in the district.

#### Productivity of important crops.

3.7 The principal crops of the district are Jowar, Bajra, Rice, Wheat, gram, tur, groundnut and sugarcane. The following table furnishes the information about yields per hectare.

3.8 From the above table it is seen that yield rates in 1965-66 in general decreased as compared to 1960-61, due to scarcity conditions in Sangli district. There was some improvement in the later years and the yield rates of 1971-72 were in fact higher than those for 1965-66 in respect of crops Bajra, rice, gram, tur, groundnut. The yield rate of sugarcane during the year 1971-72 however, was still below its level in 1960-61 and 1965-66 and it further declined in 1972-73. During the year 1972-73, the yield rates of Jowar, Rice, Gram and groundnut were found to be decreased too much due to - severe scarcity conditions, scanty and untimely rains.

### Irrigation:

3.9 The percentage of gross irrigated area to net area - irrigated in Sangli district was only 113 in 1960-61. In 1971-72, it rose to 118. In 1972-73 however, it has sudden fall to 110 due to scarcity condition. The position in the tahsils also shows ups and downs in the double irrigated area over these years. The tahsilwise position is given below :

3.11 The percentage increased in the year 1972-73 as compared to the year 1971-72 in Shirala, Jath, Kavathe Mahankal tahsils only. In the remaining tahsils the same was found to have decreased. As a result, the percentage for the district as a whole, also decreased.

3.12 The percentage of net irrigated to net cropped area was highest in Walwa tahsil during 1972-73, Miraj and Tasgaon tahsils occupied second and third position. Khanapur stood last in the rank.

Changes in the cropping pattern

3.13 The table given below depicts the picture of share of different crops in gross cropped area and thereby throws light on changes in the cropping pattern.

3.14 There was a basic change in the cropping pattern in the year 1971-72. From 1960-61 to 1970-71, the percentage of area under food-crops was decreasing at the expense of increase in percentage of area under non food crops. This trend was reversed in 1971-72 and was continued in 1972-73, also. The percentage of area under Jowar and Sugarcane increased while that under rice, wheat, bajra, gram, other pulses, cotton and groundnut decreased during 1972-73 as compared to the previous year.

Agricultural credit and outstanding dues-

3.15 Agricultural credit is the vital need of our agro-economy. The figures presented below show the extent of agricultural credit facilities made available by agricultural cooperative credit societies in the year 1960-61, 1965-66, 1972-73 and 1973-74.

3.16 It is apparent from the above table that the loans advanced by primary agricultural cooperative credit societies increased by 148 percent during 1965-66 and by 529 % during 1972-73 as compared to 1960-61. However, there was decrease during the year 1973-74 (477 %) as compared to 1972-73 owing ~~to~~ to scarcity conditions prevailing in this district. The loan advanced per member also decreased as a result of this during 1972-73 and 1973-74. The figures of loan per member for 4 years under consideration were Rs.189, - Rs.312, Rs.637 and Rs.565 respectively. The position of loans outstanding and the loans overdue in the year 1973-74 was also the result of the scarcity conditions prevailing in the district for the last three years.

Agricultural Wage rates -

3.17 Agricultural wage rates in each district of Maharashtra State are being collected since 1962-63. From each district, three rural centres were selected and from these selected rural centres data on agricultural wage rates were collected. In Sangli district the selected centres were 1) Mhaisal in Miraj tahsil 2) Jath in Jath tahsil and 3) Atpadi in Atpadi tahsil. During the year 1973, the wage rates for males (field labour) ranged between Rs.2.50 to Rs.3.50 and that for female labourers between Rs.1.00 to Rs.3.00.

Livestock.

3.18 Animal husbandry in India, from the view point of its substantial contribution in providing income and drought power to farmers and subsidiary food to human population, assumes great importance in the rural economy, even today. The eleventh quinquennial livestock census was conducted in 1972 throughout India to gauge the magnitude of this wealth.

3.19 The no. of livestock per 100 hectares of cultivable area was 128 in 1961 and 117 in 1966 in Sangli district. However, it again increased to 128 in 1972. The number of bullocks used for working decreased in 1972 as compared to 1966. Gross cropped area per pair of working bullocks was 9.08 hectares in 1961 and 9.30 hectares in 1966 which rose to 9.46 hectares in 1972.

3.20 Within the district, the tahsil of Walwa has the largest number of livestock per hectare of cultivable land. The tahsils of Atpadi, Shirala and Tasgaon also have the livestock more than the district average. The Jath tahsil has the lowest number of livestock per hectare of cultivable land.

### Poultry

3.21 During the years 1961, 1966 and 1972 a gradual increase in no.of poultry was observed in this district. In 1961, it was 4.98 lakhs. The same increased to 6.25 lakhs in 1966 and to 6.47 lakhs in 1972. In the year 1961 the number of poultry per thousand population was 405. The same increased to 420 in 1972. This means that increase in poultry population was faster than the increase in human population.

### Consumption of Electricity

3.22 The per capita consumption of electricity in Sangli district was 15.32 kw in 1961-62 which rose to 36.53 kw in 1965-66. The figures for the year 1971-72 and 1972-73 were 68.05 kw and 60.55 kw. During the year 1973-74, the per capita consumption, increased to 77.55 kw.

### Enrolment in employment exchange and vacancies notified-

3.23 Employment generation is one of the most important aims of planning in a overpopulated country like India. Employment Exchange statistics give an indication of the magnitude of the unemployment problem though to a very limited extent, because the majority of unemployed persons do not avail of the facilities provided by the employment exchange.

3.24 The position of Sangli district regarding registration and vacancies notified etc. can be seen from the table given below.

3.25 It is seen from the table no.7 that there was an increase in the registration and vacancies notified for the year 1973-74. However, employment provided by private sector, but not through the employment exchange is generally substantial and hence it will not be correct to draw final conclusions regarding the unemployment problem on the basis of employment exchange statistics alone. But the figures no doubt help to indicate the severity of the unemployment problem in the district.

#### Increase in outdoor and indoor patients

3.26 The comparative position can be seen from the table given below.

3.27 As compared to 1965, the increase in no.of patients in 1972 was 55 percent. The no. of outdoor patients treated was high in 1972 because the medical officers visited different scarcity hit areas and treated patients. This was not the position during 1973. There were 71 doctors in 1973, who were working in public and public aided bodies. The no.of doctors per lakh of population in 1972 and 1973 works to 5.46 and 4.61 respectively. The no.of nurses per lakh of population recorded a decrease because total no. of nurses decreased from 155 to 145. The position given above is not quite representative as the statistics regarding doctors and nurses in private sector are not considered here.

Increase in no.of students of different categories-

3.28 Education is the backbone of socio-economic development. The percentage of pupils taking education in Primary, Secondary and Higher institutions has increased during 1972-73. The following table shows the percentage increase or decrease in no.of students in respect of different types of education.

3.29 The increase in no.of boys and girls students was notable in respect of secondary schools. As regards no.of students per teacher, the position in respect of both primary and secondary education was little bit improved in 1972-73.

Increase in road length per 100 sq. km.

3.30 Roads constitute one of the important items in the infrastructure of a country's economy. The extent of road facilities available can be judged by working out road length per 100 sq. km.

3.31 In Sangli district, the road length per 100 sq. km was 26.04 km. in 1960-61 which increased to 77.53 km. in 1973-74. The same was 46.87 in 1972-73. The sizable increase was possible due to roads constructed during the scarcity period.

Increase in Banking facilities in proportion to population

3.32. In 1961, there were 34 banking offices of different types in Sangli district. The same rose to 131 as on 31st March 1973. In 1961, there were 3 bank offices per lakh of population. As at the end of 31st March 1973, the same increase to 9 offices.

Prices

3.33 Since November 1962, the work of collection of prices at district Headquarter in the Maharashtra State was entrusted to the District Statistical Offices of the Directorate of Economics and Statistics. From the collected data, the trend of the prices of important commodities during 1973 can be ascertained.

3.34 The prices in respect of items like cereals and pulses under food; sugar, gur, edible oil and vanaspati; condiments and spices; vegetables; clothing; charcoal; match box; firewood etc. under fuel; tea and coffee under beverages; and washing soap, pan, supari, tobacco, cigarettes, hair oil etc. under miscellaneous articles; have shown rising trend since 1962.

3.35 The General Index Number of Sholapur and Poona centres for 1973-74 were 277 and 239 respectively.

INTRODUCTION :

4.1 The year under review was the fifth and the last year of the Fourth Five Year Plan. The year happened to be a normal year in the sense that with its emergence, the State of Maharashtra in general and the district of Sangli in particular, received a little bit relief from the severe scarcity conditions which prevailed for almost three continuous years both in the State and Sangli district.

4.2 The performance made under different activities relating to plan schemes during the year 1973-74 is assessed in the following paras.

4.3 For this purpose a table giving the details such as budget allocations and expenditure on various major heads of development during the year under review is also supplied herewith.

STATE PLAN SCHEMES :

4.4 During the year 1973-74, sizable expenditure was incurred under major heads of development such as Agricultural Programme, and Social Services. But as compared to the year 1972-73, the percentage of expenditure on agril. programme decreased considerably while in respect of Social Services the same increased appreciably. The comparative position for these two years in percentages is displayed below for ready reference.

4.5 It is revealed from the Table that the increase in expenditure under the head of social services is 11.35 percent.

I - AGRICULTURAL PROGRAMME :

(a) Agricultural Production -

4.6 From the very beginning of the 4th plan attempts were being made to maximize food production in Maharashtra State, for bringing self sufficiency in food production. In view of this, good deal of impetus was given to various programmes under Minor Irrigation, Horticulture development, Soil conservation etc. both under Plan and Non Plan activities.

4.7 In all ten schemes were implemented under the sub head of agricultural production. The achievement under the scheme of development of manurial resources was better in 1973-74, in as much as 17790 tonnes of compost was prepared, as against 16350 tonnes in the year 1972-73. Additional area of 113 acres was covered under horticultural development. Not only this but with a view to induce farmers to get more production of green vegetables and potato 5 demonstration plots were also taken in this year. The expenditure on the scheme of small holders was increased two fold. Under this scheme, 1000 seedlings, 19 bullocks and 19 goats were distributed during the year under review.

(b) Minor Irrigation :

4.8 No new scheme was implemented during the year 1973-74. The expenditure on the schemes in the state sector was also less than that in 1972-73. The no. of wells and pumps receiving subsidy decreased during this year. The no. of wells was 463 and the no. of pump was 414 during this year as compared to 584 and 771 respectively in the previous year. In the case of Minor -

Irrigation works in local sector, 28 Bandharas, 29 Tanks and 56 Lift Irrigation schemes were completed during 1973-74. This achievement was no doubt meaningful on the background of - district's battle against scarcity.

c) Soil Conservation :

4.9 Four schemes were implemented during the year 1973-74 and the expenditure of Rs.25.07 lakhs was incurred on them. With this, an area of 22122 hectares as against the target of 17150 hectares was covered under the scheme of contour bunding and levelling. The plantation and premonsoon works was done in 70 hectares and an area of 48 hectares was reclaimed under the scheme of reclamation of saline and alkline lands. The achievement under the scheme of Agave plantation was however not at all satisfactory.

d) Animal Husbandry :

4.10 Only one scheme namely opening of veterinary aid centres was implemented during 1972-73 and 1973-74.

e) Dairy Development :

4.11 During the year under review the target of handling of milk per day was exceeded considerably. The achievement was 27677 litres as against the target of 25000 liters, per day. The achievement in the year 1972-73 was 23193 litres per day. Under the scheme of assistance to Dairy cooperatives, 28 societies were given assistance to the tune of Rs.31000.

f) Forest

4.12 Three schemes namely development of minor forest produce, farm forestry and development of fodder resources were implemented during 1973-74. The expenditure was slightly more in the year under review. The physical achievement was satisfactory and the targets of premonsoon and plantation were fulfilled for all the schemes falling under this sub head.

g) Fisheries

4.13 The scheme of fish farming in impounded water was executed satisfactorily in 1973-74. One lakh sixty thousand fingerlings were stocked and 32500 kg. of fish were netted under this scheme. These figures for the year 1972-73 were 80000 and 14500, respectively. The physical achievement under the schemes of supply of fishery requisites was, however, not satisfactory during this year.

h) Warehousing and Marketing

4.14 Three Agril. Produce Market Committees were assisted with subsidy during the year under review.

II. CO-OPERATION AND COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT

a) Cooperation

4.15 In all 8 schemes were implemented during 1973-74 out of which two schemes namely caderization of secretaries and staff for liquidation proceedings, were staff schemes. The budget for the year was Rs.1.07 lakhs and the expenditure was Rs.1.38 lakhs.

4.16 Sixty two societies were given assistance under <sup>the</sup> scheme of strengthening of coop. credit structure. Assistance for construction of godown to the tune of Rs.13000 was given to two coop. marketing societies. The physical achievement under the

scheme of labour contract societies was also good. The no. of societies assisted during the year under review was 21. Five coop. farming societies were given financial assistance during 1973-74 as against 18 in the year 1972-73.

b) Community Development

4.17 Three schemes were implemented during both years. Eleven panchayat Chars and 33 school buildings were constructed under the scheme of community development project with an expenditure of Rs.3.68 lakhs. Four Mahila Mandals were assisted under the composite programme for Women and Children. The expenditure under the scheme of Applied Nutrition Programme during the year 1973-74 was Rs.50,000 as against Rs.98,000 in 1972-73. Two wells were constructed under this scheme during 1973-74.

III- POWER PROJECT

a) Normal development

4.18 Considered from the point of view of both expenditure and physical achievement, the progress made under this sub head was good during the year 1973-74 as compared to the year 1972-73. As against an expenditure of Rs.11.85 lakhs during the year 1972-73, the expenditure during the year under review was Rs.13.46 lakhs.

4.19 There was increase in no. of villages electrified from 4 to 9 in this year. Nine hundred and thirty pumps were connected during 1973-74. The no. of industrial connections and single - phase connections increased from 61 to 192 and 332 to 2483 respectively, during this year.

#### IV- INDUSTRY AND MINING

4.20 As the Industries and Cooperation Officer under local sector was repatriated to State sector, all the three schemes pertaining to local sector were now executed under state sector. The aim of the scheme of organisation of Balutedars, is to organize village artizans(Balutedars) into multipurpose coop. societies for economic uplift and for development of village industries. Eight such type of societies were assisted by way of giving them share capital, 5 handloom societies were assisted with share capital contribution and development rebate under the scheme of development of handloom industry. The no. of societies assisted with share capital and subsidy and loan for tools and equipments, under the scheme of dev. of industrial coop. including handicraft workers, was fourteen in 1973-74 as against five in the year 1972-73.

#### V- TRANSPORT AND COMMUNICATION

4.21 From the point of view of expenditure, the performance during 1973-74 was not upto the mark. Rs.35.21 lakhs were spent during the year 1972-73, while only Rs.28.92 lakhs could be spent in 1973-74. As regards physical achievement, 6 Km. roads were newly constructed under the scheme of village roads. The new road construction under the scheme of Roads in hilly areas was 7.85 km. and under the scheme of district roads it was 12.64 km. Roads measuring 24.60 km. were improved under the scheme of Black lopping of roads with an expenditure of Rs.4.93 lakhs. One bridge work was also completed under the scheme of roads in hilly areas. The total expenditure on this scheme was 2.12 lakhs.

## VI- SOCIAL SERVICES

### a) General Education-

4.22 As in the year 1972-73, 13 schemes were implemented in state sector and four in the local sector. The expenditure on various schemes under this <sup>st</sup> sub-head recorded an increase from Rs.65.16 lakhs to Rs.108.07 lakhs in the year 1973-74.

4.23 Under the scheme of expansion of primary education, 1365 teachers were appointed during the year 1973-74. 327 teachers were benefitted under the various schemes of teachers' training. The no. of beneficiaries under the scheme of Educational concessions to Economically Backward Class pupils and concessions to children of primary teachers was 21160 and 1572 respectively, during this year.

### b) Technical education

4.24 A grant of Rs.91000 was given to Walchand College of Engineering during 1973-74 as against an expenditure of Rs.34000 in the year 1972-73.

### c) Public Health

4.25 The construction works of residential quarters and - infections diseases ward were in progress during the year 1973-74. The staff scheme of Deep X-ray therapy plant was implemented with an expenditure of Rs.12000. The construction of building of one primary health centre was completed during this year. However the progress of expenditure was not satisfactory and the budget was not fully utilized under this sub-head.

d) Water supply and drainage

4.26 The progress of expenditure under this ~~sub~~ head was also not satisfactory. Whereas Rs.60.13 lakhs were spent in the year 1972-73, only Rs.55.53 lakhs were spent during the year 1973-74.

4.27 The drainage work at Sangli and water supply works in other 4 towns were in progress during this year. Seventeen villages were benefitted under <sup>rural</sup> ~~rural~~ piped water supply scheme. In addition 2 wells and 18 bores were completed during the year under review, under the scheme of rural water supply(simple measures).

e) Housing

4.28 Under the state sector, only one scheme namely extension of village gaonthan was executed and the expenditure was only Rs.1000. Under the scheme of thatched houses converted into mangalore tiles 43 persons were given loans and subsidy to the tune of Rs.15000.

d) Urban Development

4.29 Under this scheme financial assistance is given for implementation of development plans of municipal councils. The progress of expenditure during the year 1973-74 was very good. Rs.3.94 lakhs were spent in 1973-74. In the year 1972-73 only Rs.17000 were spent . The Sangli and Miraj municipal councils were given grant in aid amounting to Rs.1.54 lakhs and a loan amounting to Rs.2.40 lakhs under this scheme.

g) Welfare of Backward classes :

4.30 Out of 6 schemes, one scheme was implemented in State sector. One industrial society was assisted under the scheme of financial assistance to industrial co-operative of Backward Class. In all 777 students were benefitted under the scheme of grant of scholarships and tuition fees etc. Three hostels were given assistance of Rs.32000. The expenditure under these schemes however recorded a down fall from Rs.1 lakh in 1972-73 to - Rs.64000 in 1973-74.

h) Labour and Labour welfare:

4.31 Under the scheme of craftsman training, an amount of Rs.26000 and Rs.27000 were spent during the year 1972-73 and - 1973-74, respectively.

VII- MISCELLANEOUS :

Information and Broadcasting :

4.32 The target of installation of 30 Radio sets was fulfilled during this year. The expenditure incurred was Rs.13000.

Employment Gurantee Scheme :

4.33 After the end of scarcity conditions in this district, the implementation of the scheme was revived in the last quarter of the year 1973-74. An amount of Rs.52000 was expended and the work in respect of 14 percolation tanks was in progress.

CENTRALLY SPONSORED SCHEMES:

4.34 Besides the state plan schemes, there were some centrally sponsored schemes implemented during 1972-73 and 1973-74. Those schemes were implemented under the major heads of Agri. Programme, Community Development, Social Services and Miscellaneous.

## I AGRICULTURAL PROGRAMME :

### a) Agril. production :

4.35 One new scheme namely campaign for increasing cotton production was implemented and an area of 395 hectares was covered under this scheme. The area covered under the scheme of maximizing of production of groundnut for export purposes was increased from 19759 hectares in 1972-73 to 33739 hectares in 1973-74.

### b) Minor Irrigation:

4.36 The progress of expenditure under the scheme of Rural Works Programme was disheartening. Only Rs.36.15 lakhs were spent during the year 1973-74 as against Rs.83.77 lakhs in 1972-73. Three tanks and 12 percolation tanks were completed during this year.

## II COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT

4.37 Two new schemes namely Applied Nutrition Programme and composite programme for Women and Children were implemented during this year. The expenditure on both the schemes together was Rs.46000 only.

## VI SOCIAL SERVICES :

### a) General Education

4.38 Eight hundred and thirty eight primary teachers were appointed during the year and the expenditure was Rs. 9.32 lakhs in State and Local sectors taken together, under the scheme of appointment of additional primary teachers. No expenditure however, was incurred on the scheme of construction of class rooms in the primary schools.

b) Health

4.39 The scheme of Malaria Control was continued during 1973-74. An amount of Rs.5.54 lakhs was spent. The no. of blood smears collected was increased from 1.97 lakhs in 1972-73 to 2.45 lakhs in 1973-74.

4.40 In the local sector, 14118 sterilization operations were performed during this year. The expenditure on this scheme was Rs.12.53 lakhs. The no. of primary and revaccination was 30609 and 23033 respectively during the year under review.

c) Welfare of backward classes;

4.41 Three schemes were implemented during the year 1973-74. Thirty six students were benefitted under the scheme of exemption from payment of tution fees etc. One well was constructed under the scheme of Irrigation Wells for Vimukts Jatics. One balwadi was assisted under the scheme of Balwadies for vimukts jatics. The total expenditure on these 3 schemes was Rs.5000 - during 1973-74.

VII - MISCELLANEOUS :

a) Statistics :

4.42 Two staff schemes namely timely reporting of agricultural intelligence and conducting assesment survey for determination of spread and yield rates etc. were implemented in both the years 1972-73 and 1973-74. The expenditure on these schemes was Rs.0.22 lakhs in each year.


b) Other programmes :

4.43 The crash schemes for rural employment was implemented in both the years 1972-73 and 1973-74. This scheme was implemented in the relatively backward areas where normal plan programmes or special programmes like S.F.D.A. and D.P.A.P. had not made impact. Under this scheme provision of employment to landless labourers and, for the family where not a single person is employed, is made. The scheme was executed by Zilla Parishad, Sangli and an amount of Rs.10.19 lakhs and Rs.4.43 lakhs was spent during the year 1972-73 and 1973-74, respectively.


4.44 The total budget provision of centrally sponsored schemes was Rs.117.03 lakhs and Rs.63.36 lakhs respectively during the year 1972-73 and 1973-74 and the expenditure of 122.22 lakhs and Rs.72.40 lakhs itself speaks about the satisfactory progress of these schemes during the respective years.

GRAPH NO. 1 .. LAND UTILIZATION IN SANGLI DISTRICT- 1971-72




GRAPH NO. 2.- SOURCEWISE IRRIGATION IN SANGLI DISTRICT- 1971-72.

Scale- 1" = 100 villages





CHART NO. 5 - NO. OF TOWNS AND VILLAGES ELECTRIFIED IN SANGLI DISTRICT  
Scale- 1" = 50.




GRAPH NO.6 - CONSUMER PRICE INDEX NUMBERS FOR SHOLAPUR AND PUNE CENTRES


