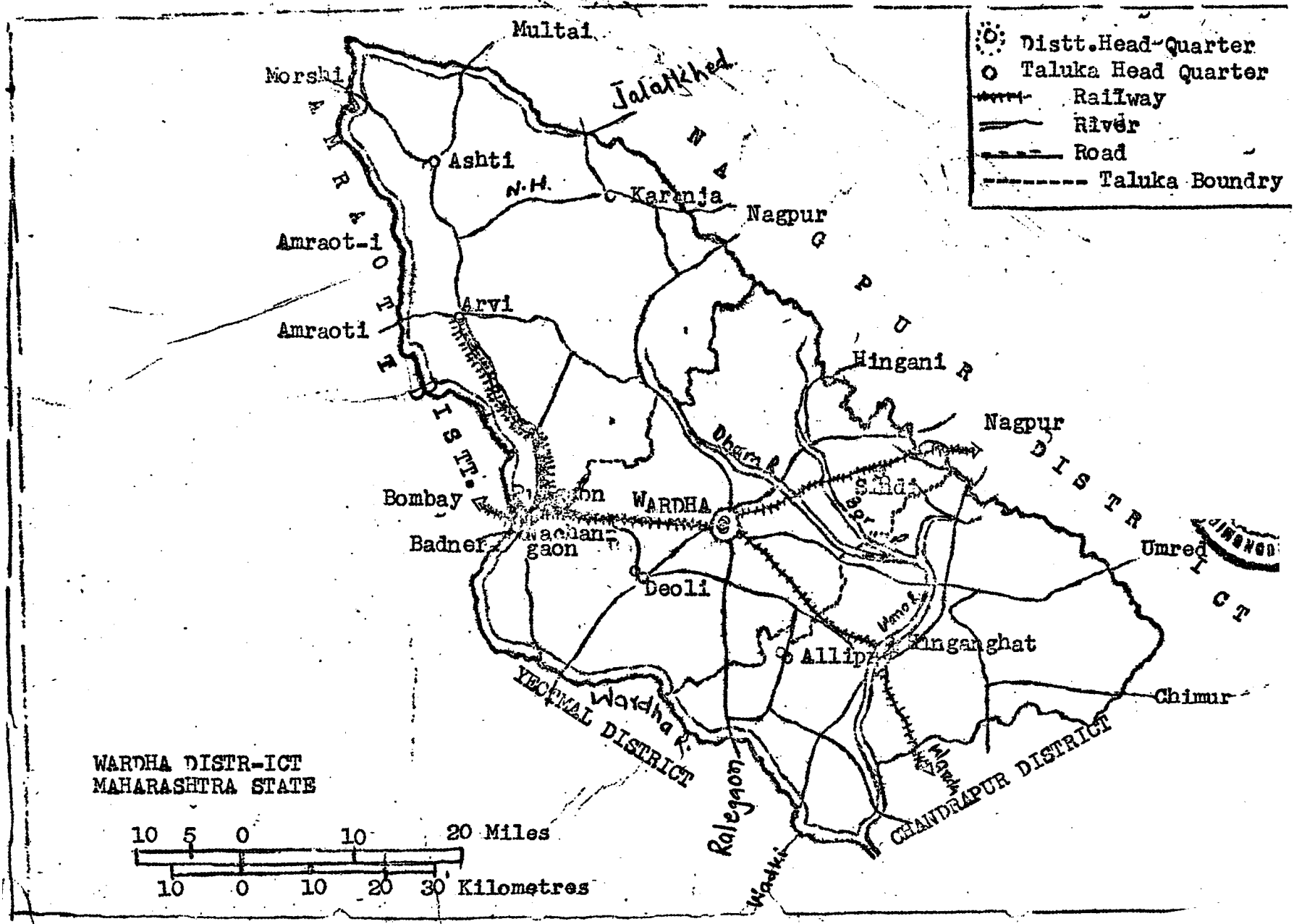

CHAPTER-I.

INTRODUCTION :-

1.1 LOCATION:-

Due to bifurcation of Nagpur district in the year 1862, the new district with Head quarters at Wardha was formed, district derived its name after the Wardha river which flows all along the western border of the district. The Wardha valley forms western portion of the district consisting of a long strip of land, running from North-West to South-East of the district occupies the Western portion of Nagpur plain and lies at the foot of Satpura hills adjoining Amraoti district. It lies between 20-21' North latitude and 78°- 30' and 79°-15' East longitude and is very narrow at the Northern extremity and gradually enlarge its width towards South.

1.2 BOUNDARIES :-

The District is surrounded by four districts of Vidarbha with Nagpur district on the East, Chandrapur district on the South, Yeotmal district on the South-West and Amraoti district on the West North-West and the North. The Wardha river separates the district all along the Western border from Amraoti and Yeotmal district.

1.3 ADMINISTRATIVE SET UP :-

The District is administratively divided into three Revenue Sub-divisions named Arvi, Wardha and Hinganghat each comprising of a Taluka. The talukas are further Sub-divided into 15 Revenue Circles in the district which in turn are divided into groups of village.

called 'Patwari Halka'. As such, village is the lowest unit in the administrative set up. The district forms part of the Nagpur Division and is administered by the Collector. The Collector is in-charge-of general administration, law and order, treasury, Land Revenue and Civil supplies besides being the head of the office for the Revenue department. He is assisted by a Resident Deputy Collector and other Deputy Collectors in his office and three Sub-divisional Officers of the rank of Deputy Collectors incharge of three revenue sub-divisions. He is also the District Magistrate and District Registrar. The Revenue Circle and Patwari Halka are in-charge-of Revenue Inspector and Patwari respectively.

ZILLA PARISHAD SET UP:-

With a view to promote development of democratic institution and to secure greater measure of participation by the people in Development plan and in local and Government offices by democratic decentralisation of powers and functions, an autonomous body of Zilla Parishad at district level and seven Panchayat Samities at Block level, have been established on the 1st May, 1962 under the Maharashtra Zilla Parishad and Panchayat Samities Act of 1962. The Zilla Parishad covered 99.2 percent of entire rural area of the district and 76.3 percent of the total population of the district. Many statutory powers are vested in it and various functions of the State Government and those earlier performed by the District Local Boards, Janpada Subhas, District Development Boards, have

been transferred to the Zilla Parishad.

An elected president is the head of the Zilla Parishad comprising of elected members. The elected Parishad forms six subject committees to deal with Finance, Works, Agriculture and Cooperation, Education Health and Social Welfare.

An Officer of the rank of Collector works as the Chief Executive Officer in the Zilla Parishad, The Parishad is also assisted by various departmental officers of Class-I and Class-II services under State Government. ^{They} are heads of those departments at the district level. The Deputy Chief Executive Officer works as a Secretary of the Zilla Parishad.

At the Block level the Panchayat Samitis have elected Chairman and Deputy Chairman. The Block Development Office-rs work as Secretaries of the Panchayat Samitis. The Panchayat Samiti consists of all elected and Coopted councillors from the areas of block and Chairmen of a Cooperative societies in the block area are coopted members. Sarpanchas elected by members of Village Panchayats, are also elected members of Panchayat Samitis.

The executive authority for the purpose of carrying out the provisions of the Maharashtra Zilla Parishad and Panchayat Samitis Act is vested in the Chief Executive Officer and the Block Development Office-rs.

At the village level, the Gram Panchayat is the elected body responsible for the developmental activities

of the Village. The Gram Panchayat elects Sarpancha and Deputy Sarpancha. The Gram Sewak, Assistant Gram Sakshayak works as Secretary to the Gram Panchayat.

Besides, the Revenue Department and Zilla Parishad, the major departments of Government functioning in the district are cooperation, Buildings and Communications, Judiciary and Forest etc.

1.4 AREA :-

The area of the district is 6307.0 Sq.Kms. (2,434 Sq.Miles) and its population according to 1971 census is 7,79,562. In terms of area and population, it constitutes 1.06 percent and 1.75 percent of area and population of Maharashtra State excluding, of-course greater Bombay. Its head-quarters was first located at Koatha a village near Pulgaon, but it was subsequently changed to the present site, at Palakwadi village subsequently named as Wardha after the name of the river 'The Wardha.' The maximum length of the district is about eighty miles and its breadth at the Southern extremity is about 36 miles. There were no major changes in the boundaries of the administrative divisions since 1911, though it formed a part of erstwhile State of Madhya Pradesh and bilingual State of Bombay. Due to states Reorganisation since 1st May 1960, the district forms a part of Maharashtra State.

1.5 TOPOGRAPHY :-

Wardha district naturally divides itself into two parts. The northern part comprises of hilly

parts due to underlying spur of Satpura and covers a major portion of Arvi tahsil while on the South, lies undulating plain intercepted by streams and broken here and there by isolated hilly rising abruptly from it's surface. It covers most of Wardha tahsil and the entire Hinganghat tahsil. No peak in the range exceeds 2,000 feet and the average height of their summits is not more than 1,300 to 1,400 feet above the level of the plain. The length of the hilly tract from North-West to South-East is 50 miles and it's greatest width is less than 20 miles. It occupies about one fourth of the whole area of the district. The elevation of the plain country is between 700 and 950 feet. The slope of the district is from north-west to South-East.

1.6 HILLS, RIVER SYSTEM AND SOIL:-

There is only one main system of hills, which is the off shoot of the Satpura ranges. The length of the hill from North-West to South-East is about 50 miles and it's maximum width is 20 miles. The highest points in the district are the peaks of a Garamsur (1976 feet) Nandgaon (1760 feet) and Malegaon (1615 feet) in the hills of Arvi Tahsil. The trigonometrical survey stations is near Nachangaon (1227 feet) and that near Kelzar is 1132 feet.

RIVERS:-

The Wardha is the only important river of the district which rises from the Multai Plateau of the Satpura range and flows all along the northern and Western borders dividing the district from former Berar. The main tributaries of the Wardha are the Yeshoda, the Wana

and the Bankali. The other notable rivers in the district are the Bhadadi, the Dhan, the Bor and the Bothara. Although these rivers pose great threat and danger to the villages situated on their banks when they are in spate only in monsoon season, there is hardly any water in them in summer. Secondly the beds of these rivers are too deep to make them fit for canal irrigation. The river Bor is harnessed for irrigation purposes by construction of a dam named 'Yeshwant Dharan.'

S O I L :-

To the south of a large number of villages around Anji and Hingani and slightly to the north of Nagpur Bombay Road, the country is hilly and the remaining parts of Wardha and Hinganghat tahsils are fertile plains with the exception of some low foot-hills running along the northern boundary of Wardha tahsil and of few small hills in the south-east of Hinganghat tahsil. The level portion of the Arvi tahsil in the north, is the most fertile part of the district and consists of a strip of land lying between the hills and Wardha river. The soil here is formed of the detritus brought down from the hills and is highly productive growing a singularly fine crop of cotton. The plains of Wardha and Hinganghat tahsils, are not so renowned for fertility but they are covered over most of the surface with a coating of fertile brown/black soil which cover the trap is believed to be formed by the denudation of basalt combined with the deposit of vegetable matters. The thickness of the soil in the district varies from

10 feet to a few inches, the average thickness being about 2 feet. The soil is generally found intermingled with calcareous tufa of 'Kankari'. The types of soil that are met with in the district are Kali I, Kali II, Morand and Kharai Bherai. The black soil occupies nearly 84 percent of the area of the district. The soils are mostly original from Deccan trap. The black soil contracts in summer and becomes fissured with rocks.

1.7 CLIMATE, TEMPERATURE AND RAINFALL:-

C L I M A T E:-

The climate of the district is hot and dry and somewhat cooler than Nagpur. The days are hot and nights are cool. Both summer and winter seasons are severe. The heat of the midday in summer is a little lesser than the hottest parts in India. The maximum temperature was 45.6 and 46.2 centigrade in the month of June and May while the minimum temperature was 11.4 and 15.2 centigrade in Feb., and January, during the year 1972 and 1973, respectively. The summer sets in roughly from the middle of February and continues up to the middle of June or till Monsoon sets in. The winter usually starts from the middle of October and ends by middle of February though the nights in February continue to be quite cold.

An observatory was started in the month of June, 1966 at Wardha. The temperature record shows that the month of May is the hottest while January is considered to be the coldest month of the year.

Over the whole district the major supply of rain is from the South-West monsoon, which sets in about the middle of June, and lasts till the end of October.

The rainfall data are recorded at the taluka head quarters of Wardha, Arvi, and Hinganghat. During the wet season, the month of August usually has the greatest intensity of rain followed by July. During the year 1973 at all three centres of the district, named Arvi, Wardha and Hinganghat the rainfall was 1188.1, 1160.6 and 1172.8 mms. respectively against moving normal rainfall of 1208.3, 1043.5 and 1086.1 M.Ms. respectively. From Taluka to taluka the average rainfall is more or less the same but is decreased as one proceeds from North to South.

1.8 P O P U L A T I O N:-

The 1971 population of the district shows an increase of 22.91 percent over the year 1961 as against 27.5 percent for Maharashtra. The urban and rural population forms 24.51 percent and 75.49 percent of the total population of the district as against 23.35 percent & 76.35 percent respectively in 1961. In 1971, the density of population was 124 per square kilometre as compared to 164 for Maharashtra and 178 for India. An interesting feature of Wardha's population is, that the sex ratio i.e. females for 1000 males has been declined to 949 in 1971 from 964 in 1961. The literacy rate for the district is of 41.71 percent in 1971 as against the rate of 30.45 percent in 1961. The literacy rate of Maharashtra is 39.02 in 1971.

The percentage of scheduled caste is 3.02 percent in 1971 as against 2.39 percent in 1961. Out of total population in Wardha district, 39.10 percent were workers of which 25.24 percent and 51.24 percent were reported as cultivators and agricultural labourers in the 1971 census. The persons engaged in remaining services were 23.52 percent of the total workers in 1971.

CHAPTER-II.

EXPLANATORY NOTE ON THE SCOPE AND LIMITATIONS OF THE STATISTICAL DATA PRESENTED IN THE PART-II (STATISTICAL ABSTRACT):

I. PURPOSE :- The abstract part of this publication gives exhaustive Statistical data on important Socio-Economic indicators of development. Tables on almost all important topics are presented in this part, so that the publication could serve as a reference book. Talukawise data has been displayed as far as possible for inter taluka comparison. In most of the tables, data for 1973-74 have been indicated. In the tables wherein data for 1973-74 could not be presented, the same for the latest two years, for which they were available, have been shown. All the data are collected from the state and central Government Offices, Local Bodies and other relevant agencies. The footnotes below each table indicate the source from which the data ^{have} been collected.

II. DISTRICT AT A GLANCE:-

This table presents a birds-eye-view of the Socio-Economic indicators of development in Wardha district and Maharashtra State, under different heads such as area, population, agriculture, animal husbandry, education, transport and communication, plan and C.D. Programme, Local Bodies and other miscellaneous statistics. Reference year of the data is also indicated in the table.

III. CONCEPTS, SCOPE & LIMITATION:-

The Statistical tables presented in the District Statistical Abstract are grouped into 13 parts. The contents of the tables and the scope and limitations of the data displayed under each group are explained below.

1. AREA AND POPULATION :-

In all 7 tables i.e. table Nos.1 to 7 are included in this section. Data for 1971 census are indicated in all the tables. Table No.1 indicates area, houses and population according to 1971 census.

Table No.2 indicates (Decadal variation) sex-wise rural and urban population enumerated in 1951, 1961 and 1971 census, along with variation between the three censuses. The population figures for 1951 and 1961 census shown in the table have been adjusted to cover the boundaries or areas of the district and talukas as they existed at the time of 1971 Census. According to 1971 census, the term urban area as used in Col.6 of the table was defined as under:--

A town or an urban area is defined as a place which has ---

1. A Municipality, a cantonment or Civil lines or
2. (i) A population of 5,000 or over and
(ii) At least 3/4 or more of male workers are engaged in non-agricultural pursuits.

Table No.3 gives talukawise classification of inhabited villages according to different population ranges. The term village (i.e. rural area) used in the table denotes a statutorily recognised village having a well defined boundary and separate land records. Hamlets, wadies or padas have therefore not been shown as separate villages. On the other hand, Statutorily recognised villages having no population have been shown separately as 'Uninhabited' villages. Villages also include forest villages comprising mostly of forest labourers and their families.

Total population of the villages in each range is also indicated in the table. Table No.4 gives talukawise classification of towns according to population ranges in 1971 census. The table No.5 gives number of workers and non-workers in each taluka of Wardha district according to 1971 census, and they are classified according to standard livelihood classes. The population according to livelihood classes is also shown separately for rural and urban areas and also for the district as a whole. The concept of dependency has been abandoned for economic classification at the 1971 census. Instead the population is classified into workers and non-workers. The emphasis is now on work and not on income or economic dependence. A person is defined as worker, if (a) In case of seasonal work like cultivation, livestock, dairy-ing, household industry, etc; he has had some regular work of more than one hour a day throughout the greater part of the working season and (b) In the case of regular employment in any trade, profession, service, business or commerce, he was employed during any of the fifteen days preceeding the day of the enumerator's visit to the household.

Persons like beggars, pensioners, agricultural or non-agricultural royalty, rent or dividend receivers etc; who earn an income but who are not participating in any productive work, but who had not actually joined has, been classified as non-workers.

The table No.6 gives distribution of population according to (A) Age group and (B) Religion separately for Rural and Urban areas and for the district as a whole.

The table No.7 gives talukawise details of scheduled caste and scheduled tribes separately for rural and urban area and also for the district as a whole.

The scheduled castes notified for this district are as follows :--

Scheduled Tribes:- There are no scheduled Tribes for which any one was returned in the district in 1971.

2. CLIMATE :

Two tables are included under this section pertaining to rainfall and temperature at the selected centres in Wardha district.

Table No.8 gives monthly rainfall and number of rainy days in each month at the selected centres for the year 1973.The data are collected through Revenue agency.A day is treated as a 'rainy day' if during the 24 hours, the rain gauge recorded a minimum of 2.55 M.M.of rainfall. Annual rainfall for each centre is also indicated in the table.'Normal rainfall' is the average rainfall over a period ranging from fifty to eighty years.But moving average rainfall of ten year is given in this table.

Table No.9 gives monthwise 'Maximum','minimum' and annual temperature as recorded at selected centres for the year 1973.The data are supplied by the Government of India's Regional Meteorological centre at Nagpur.

The maximum and the minimum temperature denotes the maximum and the minimum temperature recorded on any day during the month.

3. AGRICULTURE:-

In all 12 tables i.e. table Nos. 10 to 21 are included in this section.

The table No. 10 indicates talukawise figures of land utilisation under the standard heads of land uses for the year 1972-73. The break-up for the total geographical area according to different types of land uses is shown. Major constituents of the Geographical area are forests, land put to non-agricultural uses, barren and uncultivable land, cultivable waste, permanent pastures, land under miscellaneous tree-crops not included in area sown, current fallows, other fallows and lastly net area sown. Under 'Forest' are included all actual forest areas of lands classes or administered as forests under any legal enactment dealing with forests whether state owned or private. If any portion of such land is not actually wooded but put to some agricultural use, that portion is included under the appropriate heading of cultivated or uncultivated land as the case may be 'Land put to non-agricultural uses' stands for all lands, occupied by buildings, roads and railways or under water e.g. rivers and canals and other lands put to uses other than agriculture. 'Barren and unculturable land' covers all barren and unculturable land like mountains, deserts etc. Land which cannot be brought under cultivation unless at a high cost, is classed as 'barren and unculturable land' - whether such land is in isolated blocks or within cultivated

holdings. 'Culturable waste' includes all lands available for cultivation whether not taken up for cultivation or taken up for cultivation once but not cultivated during the current year and last five years, or more in succession. Such lands may be either fallow or covered with shrubs & jungles which are not put to any use. They may be assessed or not assessed and may lie in isolated blocks or within cultivated holdings. 'Permanent Pastures' and other grazing lands cover all grazing lands, whether they are permanent pastures and meadows or not. Village common and grazing lands within forest areas are included under this head. 'Land under miscellaneous tree crops etc; not included in the net area sown' includes all cultivable land, which is not included under net area sown, but is put to some agricultural use. Land under casurina tree, thatching grass, bamboo bushes and other for fuel etc. which are not included under 'orchards' are classed under this category. 'Current fallows' comprises cropped areas, which are kept fallow during the current year. 'Other fallow' land includes all lands which were taken up for cultivation, but are temporarily out of cultivation for a period of not less than one year and more than five years. The 'net area sown' consists of net area sown with crops and orchards, area sown more than once being counted only once. The gross cropped area represents the sum total of area under all crops. The differences between the total or gross cropped area and net area sown is accounted for by the area sown more than once during the ^{same} year with the same or different crops.

Table No.17 gives the information on Major and Medium Projects in this district. Both complete projects have been covered in this table. Position in this table is as it was on 30th June 1973. The cost of Medium irrigation project ranges between Rs.20 lakhs to Rs.5 crores whereas that of a Major irrigation project, it is Rs.5/- crores and above.

Table No.18 deals with monthly agricultural wage rates in 1973. This data is collected fortnightly through out the year from three selected Rural centres viz. 1) Seloo, 2) Karanja and 3) Samudrapur. Only one centre is selected from a taluka. Table 20 deals with famine, scarcity, Akin to scarcity and Table No.21 indicates determination of precarious and other scarcity areas.

4. ANIMAL HUSBANDRY AND FOREST:

A- ANIMAL HUSBANDRY :- In all 4 tables i.e. table Nos.22 to 25 are included in the section.

Table No.22 gives talukawise number of various types of livestock and poultry as enumerated in the district in the livestock census, 1972. The Census is conducted through out the country on an uniform basis of concepts and methods of enumeration once in 5 years. During the Livestock census operations, the livestock and poultry were enumerated by house to house enquiry particular care was taken to enumerate livestock in slaughter houses, stray animals and animals in transit. Sex and age-groupwise classification of the livestock is also indicated in the table.

B. FOREST :- The table No.26 gives details of area in different types of forests during the year 1973-74. Data regarding forests under the control of the state Govern-

ment's Forest Department and those under the control of the State Government's Revenue Department are shown separately. The areas under forests are classified according to legal status into reserved forests, protected forest and unclassified forests.

The legal status refers to the classification of forests under the Indian Forests Act, XVI of 1927. Reserved forests are those that are intended mainly for timber production wherein the rights of grazing and cultivation are seldom allowed. In protected forests, the restrictions are not so rigid. Right of grazing or cultivation is allowed, but certain limitations and restrictions are imposed. The unclassified forest refers to the inaccessible forest or unoccupied waste. The forests which are taken by Government from local bodies or private individuals for management on lease basis are called 'Leased forests'. There is no classification of expropriatory forests as such but in Nagpur Division, some private lands containing valuable forest are taken over by Government under section 29 of the Indian forests Act, which are not yet classified as per tripartite classification and they are termed as expropriatory. The forest area shown in the Table No. 26(A) may not tally with the area under forest shown in table No. 10. The two sets of figures differ due to the following reasons.

(i) In the Indian Forest Statistics Returns, the whole area including non-wooden area under the control of Forest Department is taken as area under forests, while in Agricultural Statistics, it is classified according to its

actual utilisation(ii) The forest Department returns are meant to serve a definite administrative purpose and indicate the ownership of the forest areas and actual utilisation of these areas is not so important from the point of view of Forest Department, as it is in the land utilisation statistics under Agricultural Statistics.(iii)The Forest Department returns relate to financial year and Agricultural Statistics relate to the Agricultural year.

5. EMPLOYMENT, INDUSTRY AND ELECTRICITY:-

In all 9 tables i.e. table Nos.27 to 35 are included in this section.

The factory statistics shown in table Nos.27, 28 and 29 relate to the following types of factories registered under the Factories Act,1948.

(1) Those employing 10 or more workers working with the aid of power(Section 2(i)).

(2) Those employing 20 or more workers and working without the aid of power(Section 2(ii)).

and (3)Those registered under section 85 of the Act,under which the State Government makes applicable the provisions of the Act,eventhough the above conditions are not fulfilled.However,statistics of the Defence Factories are excluded.

Table No.32 gives occupational distribution of total registrations and placements in the employment exchange for the year 1972-73 according to standard National classification.

6. CO-OPERATION :

In all 8 tables i.e. table Nos.36 to 43 are included in this section.

Table No.38 gives talukawise number of primary agricultural societies, their membership, share capital, reserve and other funds, working capital, loans advanced and recovered, loans outstanding and overdues and percentage of recovery to total loan advanced for the year 1973-74. 'Working Capital' includes paid up capital, deposits and borrowings. Loans outstanding includes outstanding in respect of loans, cash credits and over drafts and the amount of outstanding bills purchased or discounted. 'Overdues' refer to amount of loan or instalments which were due for collection but which were not actually collected and for the repayment of which no extension has been granted by a competent authority.

Table No.43 gives talukawise number of registered money lenders in each taluka and loans advanced by them during 1973-74. Separate figures of loans advanced to traders and non-traders have been furnished in the table. The transactions of money lending in the State are regulated under the provisions of Bombay Money Lenders Act, 1946. According to the Act no money lender shall carry on the business of money lending except in the area for which he has been granted a licence, and except in accordance with the terms and conditions of such licence.

7. MEDICAL AND PUBLIC HEALTH :

In all 5 tables i.e. table Nos.44 to 48 are included in this section.

Table No.44 given in this section indicates talukawise number of hospitals, dispensaries, maternity homes,

Health centres and Primary Health centres, doctors, nurses, vaidyas, beds and total number of indoor and outdoor patients treated for the year 1973. The table covers all the State and Central Government medical institutions, and also institutions owned by municipalities. Private clinics run by private bodies or individuals are, however, not included in the table.

Table No. 45 gives vital statistics such as number of registered births and deaths in this district for the year 1973. The table 48 deals with the number of Family Planning centres operating in the district in the year 1973-74.

8. E D U C A T I O N:-

In all 7 tables i.e. Table Nos. 49 to 55 (except Table Nos. 50 and 51) are included in this section.

Table No. 49 gives sexwise number of literates and percentage of literacy separately for rural and urban areas of each taluka according to 1971 population census. As per 1971 census definition, a person was classified as a literate if he was able to read or write a simple letter in any language.

Table No. 52 gives information regarding number of educational institutions according to types for the 1973-74. Sexwise enrolment and number of trained and untrained teachers in these institutions is also indicated in this table. The classification of institutions according to type is slightly different from stage of education. There are at present many Secondary schools, which also

impart education in primary course. Nevertheless, the entire enrolment of students is included under 'Secondary education. Primary institutions provide education for standards I to IV or standards I to VII/VIII or less and teach the curriculum approved by the Education Department. The secondary institutions teach students for standards VIII to X or XI/XII with or without lower standards. Higher education is the education, which leads to a Degree examination after passing S.S.C. examination.

Table No. 53 presents data on the number of beneficiaries among backward classes such as Scheduled Caste, Scheduled Tribes and Other backward classes for the year 1973-74. Beneficiaries for this table are persons who are getting educational concessions of either type such as scholarships, etc.

9. TRANSPORT AND COMMUNICATIONS:-

In all 7 tables i.e. table Nos. 56 to 62 are included in this section.

Table No. 56 gives total railway length as at the end of 31st March 1974 according to types of route i.e. Broad Gauge, Metre Gauge and Narrow Gauge. The information is compiled from the railway time table. The railway length is measured between the first and last stations within the district boundary. The figures of length of each type of route are, therefore, approximate and not accurate.

Table No. 59 deals with operational statistics of Nationalised Road Transport in Nagpur division. For this

table, the S.T. Division comprises of (1) Nagpur (2) Bhandara (3) Wardha and (4) Chandrapur districts of Nagpur Region.

Table No. 60 presents the results of the traffic census on important roads conducted in Building and Communication Department, Government of Maharashtra. Data on the number of vehicles is according to categories and location of countpost. Type of surface and total traffic intensity in tons per 24 hours are also indicated in the table.

10. LOCAL BODIES :-

In all 4 tables i.e. table Nos. 63 to 66 are included in this section.

Table no. 63 gives abstract of income and expenditure of local bodies such as village panchayats, Zilla Parishad and Municipalities for the financial year 1973-74. The number of village panchayats includes number of independent village panchayats as well as group village panchayats.

11. PLAN AND COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT :-

In all 5 tables i.e. table Nos. 67 to 71 are included in this section.

12. PRICES :-

Only three tables i.e. table Nos. 72 to 74 are included in this section. Table No. 72 shows the wholesale prices of certain agriculture commodities at selected centres in the district.

Table No. 73 gives monthly average retail prices of various commodities at district headquarters Wardha. The average prices under each commodity are shown from the month of January to December for the year 1973 alongwith units and varieties of commodities for which prices have been quoted. The data are regularly collected by District Statistical Office every week on Thursday by visiting the selected shops. The average price

of each /visiting the selected shops. The average price of each commodity for the year is also shown in the table. As the information collected for the given commodities is restricted to only one quotation and that too from only one shop at District Head Quarter, the average price for individual commodity cannot be said to be fully representative, but the data may prove useful as a broad indicator of the trend of retail prices, over the period of time.

Table No.74 gives consumer price index number (revised series) for working class for Nagpur centre published by the office of the Commissioner of Labour, Bombay. Monthwise data for the year 1973-74 commencing from April and also average for the year 1973-74 have been given in this table. The base year for calculating price index (new series) is 1960. The Index Number of wholesale prices are issued by the Economic Adviser to the Government of India. The base year for the same is 1961-62. The methods of construction of the index is given in Appendix to Index Numbers of wholesale prices in India Revised series (1961-62) issued by the Office of the Economic Adviser to Government of India.

13. MISCELLANEOUS :

In all 11 tables i.e. table Nos.75 to 85 are included in this section.

The table No.78 gives talukawise Cinema statistics for the year 1973-74. Number of permanent, semi-permanent and touring theatres and their seating capacity per show has been indicated in the table. Table No.85 indicates important trends in selected indicators.

CHAPTER-III.

INDICATORS OF DEVELOPMENT:-

In this chapter attempt is made to compare the sectorwise progress achieved in the tahsils of the district through various indicators. The year 1960-61 is made use of for the purpose of comparison and calculation of indicators. Earlier years have also been considered where the necessary data for the year 1960-61 were not available. The indicators for some important items of development have been worked out for each taluka in the district for intertaluka comparison and to know the pace of development made by the taluka and the district as a whole, in the year 1972-73 or other taking into account the availability of data.

INDICATOR NO.1:

PERCENTAGE OF GROSS SOWN AREA TO NET SOWN AREA:-

Agriculture has been the main stay of district economy. As much as 72 percent of the district population is dependent on it for its livelihood. Percentage of gross sown area to net sown area denotes the frequency of land sown more than once. Availability of sources of irrigation decide the use of land for double cropping. Net sown area forms 71.75 percent of the geographical area of the district. Hardly about 2 percent area of net area sown is under double cropping. The table below gives the talukawise percentage of gross cropped area to net cropped area.

The above table indicates that the percentage of gross sown area to net sown area of the district in the year 1972-73 had increased to 101.99 percent from 100.84 percent in the year 1960-61. Similar increasing trend was observed in Wardha and Arvi Tahsils. However in Hinganghat 1972-73 tahsil percentage increase was as low as 100.93 in/though it is a little more as compared to 100.79 percent in the year 1960-61.

INDICATOR NO. 2:

PERCENTAGE OF PRODUCTIVITY OF IMPORTANT CROPS :-

Productivity of land in the district is low due to various factors such as meagre irrigation facilities, inadequate and uneven rainfall, large scale soil erosion and uneconomic size of the average holding. As in the past, productivity of important crops had been assigned highest priority under the programme of agricultural production. Following table gives the productivity of important crops in the district for the year 1972-73 as compared with the corresponding position in the year 1960-61 which was supposed to be exceptionally good year.

The above table shows that over all productivity of food grains had decreased by 38.09 percent in 1972-73 as compared to the year 1960-61, mainly due to size-able decrease in the productivity of pulses by 60.08 percent during the period. Among non-food crops, the productivity of groundnut and linseed had decreased by 79.41 percent and 34.52 percent respectively. However the productivity of cotton had rose by 60.47 percent during the year as compared to the year 1960-61.

INDICATOR NO.3:

GROSS VALUE OF AGRICULTURAL PRODUCTION :-

As the relevant price data required are not available, the gross value of agricultural production could not be calculated.

INDICATOR NO.4:

(a) PERCENTAGE OF IRRIGATED AREA :-

Wells are the major source of irrigation in the district. The number of irrigation wells in the

district in the year 1972-73 was 10,334 wells. Following table shows the percentage of gross irrigated area to net irrigated area for the year 1972-73 as compared with the corresponding position in the year 1960-61 of the district.

The above table indicates that the percentage of gross irrigated area to net irrigated area for the district had decreased to 103.67 percent in the year 1972-73 from 114.75 percent in the year 1960-61. The net irrigated area and the gross irrigated area was the same in Arvi and Hinganghat Tahsils while it was increased to 106.90 in 1972-73, from 173.44 in 1971-72.

(b) PERCENTAGE OF NET IRRIGATED AREA TO NET SOWN AREA:-

Since there are no perennial rivers in the district, the irrigation facilities in rabi season mainly depend upon the availability of water in the wells. The following table shows the percentage of net irrigated area to net sown area.

The above table indicates that the percentage of net irrigated area to net sown area had increased from 1.22 percent in the year 1960-61 to 2.99 percent in the year 1972-73. Wardha Tahsil had the highest percentage of the net irrigated area to net sown area in 1972-73 and it was lowest in Hinganghat tahsil in that year.

INDICATOR NO.5:-

PERCENTAGE OF AREA UNDER FOOD AND NON FOOD CROPS TO GROSS CROPPED AREA.

There had been no change in the cropping pattern of the district except shifting of acreage under some crops, due to rotation of crops. Following table shows the percentage of area under food and non-food crops to gross cropped area in each tahsil of the district during the year 1960-61 and 1972-73.

The above table indicates that the percentage of area under food crops to gross cropped area had decreased from 58.43 percent in 1960-61 to 52.44 percent in the year 1972-73 whereas the percentage of area under non-food crops to gross cropped area had increased to 47.56 percent in the year 1972-73 from 41.57 percent in 1960-61 due to increasing tendency of agriculturists to grow more and more cash crops like cotton which is the important cash crop in the district.

(b) PERCENTAGE OF IRRIGATED AREA UNDER FOOD AND NON-FOOD CROPS TO GROSS IRRIGATED AREA :-

During the year 1972-73 the percentage of area irrigated by wells to the total gross irrigated area in the district was 86.21 percent. Following table shows percentages of irrigated area under food and non-food crops to gross irrigated area of the district for the year 1960-61 and 1972-73.

It will be seen from the above table that the percentage increase in average wages of skilled labourers was highest at Karanja and was lowest at Seloo centre in the year 1973.

labourers for men and women was highest at Soloo centre in the year 1973 over the year 1963.

LIVESTOCK PER HECTARE OF CULTIVABLE LAND:-

Its use in daily diet certainly will increase the nutritional standard of the community. progress of poultry forming is much emphasised in the plans. But it has not attracted the people in this district as it will be seen from the following table.

It is seen from the above table that the number of poultry birds have decreased substantively from 1,37,707 as per 1961 census to 1,28,514 as per 1972 census and the number birds per 100 persons from 22 to only 16. The decrease was observed in all the tahsils of the district. However, considerable decrease was observed in case of Hinganghat tahsil. Even after the substantial decrease in number of birds Hinganghat tahsil ranks the first at 18 birds per 100 persons in 1972 as compared to 15 birds in Arvi and Wardha.

It will be seen from the above that road length in the district increased by 333.57 percent as on 31-3-74 as compared to the position as on 31-3-1961. The percentage increase in road length relating to National Highways, State Highways and Major District Roads was 47.83, 50.00 and 166.67 percent respectively in the year 1973-74 over the year 1960-61. However the percentage increase in

road length of other district roads and village roads in 1973-74 was 2357.29 and 2700.00 respectively over the year 1960-61.

INDICATOR NO.15:

INCREASE IN BANKING FACILITIES IN PROPORTION TO POPULATION.

Banks play a great part as creditors of money and controller of its supply as well as its demand. Banks had a very small beginning in the district. But the scheduled banks and cooperative banks have made a remarkable progress in expanding their business in rural areas. The following table gives the number of banks and population per banking office during the year 1960-61 and 1972-73.

Since the banking facilities available at 14 places in various parts of the district covering a population of 2,18,365 in 1972-73, which formed 28.01 Percent of the total population of the district. The above table indicates that the number of banking offices per lakh of population have increased from 2.36 in 1960-61 to 4.36 in 1972-73. During 1972-73 a banking office could cater to the needs 22,928 persons as against 42,285 persons in 1960-61.

INDICATOR NO.16:-

Since the declaration of emergency in the country, price quotations of some important commodities

from district headquarter, are collected on every Thursday since 9th November 1962. The average monthly price is worked out for each of the commodities. As the information collected for the given commodities is restricted to only one quotation and that too from only one shop at the district head quarter, the average of monthly prices for individual commodity cannot be said to be fully representative. But the data may still prove useful as a broad indicator of the trend of changes in retail prices over the period of time in the district.

The following table shows average prices of certain commodities and percentage rise during the year 1973 at the district head quarter as compared to the corresponding average prices of these commodities in the year 1963.

It is observed from the above table that the average prices of most of the essential commodities like Rice, Wheat, Jowar, Pulses, Sugar, Gur, Groundnut Oil, Potato, Plantains, Dhoti and Shirting cloth, brass and washing soap have risen above hundred percent in the year 1973 over the year 1963. While the average prices of some commodities have shown a rise of below hundred percent ranging from 35 percent in case of tea leaf to 86 percent in case of brass during the year 1973, compared with the year 1963.

The monthly average price of Sugar in the fair price shop was worked out to Rs. 2.15 per Kg. in the year 1973. The open market average price of Sugar showed an increase of 268 percent in 1973 over the year 1963. Amongst the essential commodities which have not risen considerably during the span of 10 years are salt 60 percent, turmeric 40 percent, dry chillies 70 percent, tea leaf 35 percent, Kerosene 53 percent and Washing soap 50 percent.

CHAPTER-IV.
ANNUAL PLAN.

1973-74 is a concluding year of the Fourth Five Year Plan, 1969-74. In the Annual Plan 1973-74, the amount of Rs.177.60 lakhs was provided for district level plan schemes in Wardha district. The expenditure incurred on the schemes implemented during the year 1973-74 was Rs.155.49 lakhs. It forms 88 percent of the budget provision. The expenditure incurred in State Sector was Rs.88.56 lakhs out of Rs.104.25 lakhs of budget provision and in the local sector it was of the order of Rs.66.93 lakhs out of the budget provision of Rs.73.35 lakhs.

The following table gives the headwise provision for the year 1973-74 and its percentage to total budget provision for the district.

From the above table it is obvious that agriculture was given higher priority i.e. 46.99 percent of total budget provision in the annual plan 1973-74, seeing the very limited scope for development of industries.

The higher priority given to Agriculture was followed while implementing the schemes covered in the annual plan as it would be seen from the following table of expenditure during 1973-74 on various heads of expenditure.

The expenditure on Agriculture was incurred on the various schemes included in the Plan to the tune of Rs.80.85 lakhs which comes to 97 percent of the budget provision made for the year. It was in the order of the priority given to agriculture. The expenditure on Cooperation and Community Development was of the order of Rs.1.88 lakhs i.e. 45 percent of provision made for the year. Expenditure on Industry and Mining and Transport and Communication was of the order of 91 percent and 102 percent respectively of the provisions for the year for these heads of development. On Social Services expenditure

of Rs.63.26 lakhs was incurred out of the total budget provision of Rs.80.40 lakhs for the year 1973-74. Expenditure on ^{er} other programme was of the order of Rs.0.19 lakh out of budget provision of Rs.0.25 lakh. Thus total expenditure incurred during the Annual Plan period 1973-74 was Rs.155.49 lakhs i.e. 88 percent of the total budget provision of Rs.177.60 lakhs.

Performance of the Annual Plan 1973-74 under different heads of development is summarised in the foregoing paragraphs.

I. AGRICULTURE.

Most of the population i.e. about 80 percent of the district population is dependant upon agriculture as a main source of livelihood and consists of rural people. For the development of these agrarian people huge amount requires to be spent on agriculture and allied occupations keeping in view the uplift of our nation. The amount of Rs.83.44 lakhs forming 46.99 percent of total budget allocation for the year 1973-74 was provided for Agriculture and allied occupations. As there is a very limited scope for starting big industries, agriculture gets importance, and lion's share in expenditure.

The following table gives details of provision in the budget and expenditure incurred during the year 1973-74 under the head Agriculture and different sub-heads, with percentage of expenditure incurred to budget provision.

From the above table it is clear that percentage of expenditure to budget provision was above 80 percent except for sub head Fisheries (67 percent) and Ware housing and Marketing (45 percent)

(1) Agriculture Production including land development:-

Expenditure of Rs.9.96 was incurred out of budget Provision of Rs.11.81 forming 84 percent of the provision for the year 1973-74, in both the sectors i.e.State and Local. The schemes implemented and carried out were establishment of Taluka seed multiplication farms and seed processing plant including improved seed; land development; loan for horticultural development and vegetable development; scheme for small holders under integrated area development and construction of community wells. There are 8 seed farms functioning in the district. Compost manure to the tune of 12,000 M.Tonnes was produced. Plantation of 446 hectares of

land was made during the year under horticulture development and 15 demonstration trials were conducted. Expenditure of Rs.4.22 lakhs was incurred on the scheme for small farmers under integrated development scheme out of the budget provision of Rs.4.97 lakhs. The schemes implemented were, (i) distribution of milch cattle under which 1091 cattle were distributed, (ii) distribution of agricultural implements 10 implements were distributed and (iii) subsidy on seed distribution, subsidy on 24,218 QHS. of improved seed, 41,998 M.T. of fertilizer and 6,440 litres of insecticides for 366 hectares of land was given; and (iv) under the scheme construction of community wells, 13 wells were constructed.

(ii) Minor Irrigation:-

On this scheme expenditure to the tune of Rs.46.32 was incurred out of the budget provision of Rs.48.59 i.e. 95 percent during the year 73-74. Subsidy on 250 new wells was given. 4 minor irrigation works were executed under State Sector, and 281 hectares of land was irrigated through the schemes under local sector in 1973-74.

(iii) Soil Conservation:-

Rs.11.71 lakhs were expended on contour bunding as against the budget provision of Rs.8.55 lakhs forming 137 percent of budget provision and 1258 hectares of land was brought under the scheme.

(iv) Ayacut Development:-

Under this scheme expenditure to the tune of Rs.10.97 lakhs was incurred on land development (water courses) under strengthening of irrigation construction of three

divisions and 16 sub-divisions under command of irrigation project and Rs.0.80 lakh on establishment of trial cum demonstration farm at Seloo. Thus the percentage of expenditure incurred to budget provision is 89 percent.

(v) Animal Husbandry, Poultry and Dairy Development:-

No expenditure was incurred on animal husbandry and poultry development during the year 1973-74. Amount of Rs.0.31 lakh was spent on dairy development as against the provision of Rs.0.07 lakh.

(vi) Forest:-

Full amount of budget provision of Rs.1.02 lakh was expended during the annual plan year 1973-74 on this sub-head of expenditure. The programmes implemented were farm forestry, afforestation for soil conservation, development of fodder resources and forest labour welfare.

(vii) Fisheries:-

Out of budget provision of Rs.0.46 lakh on this sub-head of expenditure amount of Rs.0.31 lakh was spent on following programmes --(i) Fish seed production in number 22.32 lakhs of spans production and expenditure incurred was Rs.0.19 lakh (ii) Fish farming in impounded water, (iii) supply of fishery requisites and (iv) grant of loan to fishermen of fisheries co-operative societies.

II. COOPERATION AND COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT :-

(A) Cooperation:-

Out of budget provision of Rs.1.47 lakh on this head of development amount of Rs.1.10 lakhs forming 75 percent was spent on programmes like financial assistance to labour contract societies, cooperative farming and assistance to block level artisans' multipurpose societies.

(B) Community Development :-

Out of budget provision of Rs.2.73 lakhs on this head of development amount of only Rs.0.78 lakh i.e. 29 percent of budget provision was spent on the schemes included in it. Amount of Rs.1.95 lakhs was surrendered to the Govt. which was allotted to the Local Sector for community development project.

III. INDUSTRY AND MINING :-

Budget provision to the tune of Rs.1.37 lakh was made for the year 1973-74 on this head of development. Out of it Rs.1.25 lakh i.e. 91 percent was spent on development of handloom industries by granting rebate to weavers loans to villages. Nothing was spent out of the provision of Rs.0.32 lakh for financial assistance to industrial Co-operative Societies including handicrafts.

IV. TRANSPORT AND COMMUNICATION :-

Budget provision for this head of development was made to the tune of Rs.7.94 lakhs for the year 1973-74. The expenditure incurred was Rs.8.06 lakhs i.e. 102 percent of budget provision which was expended as follows -- i) District road under State Sector 4 Kms. and amount spent was Rs.1.36 lakh, ii) District road under Local Sector 1 Km. out of the target of 99 Kms. for the year 1973-74 by spending the amount of Rs.1.27 lakh out of budget grant of Rs.1.30 lakh. iii) On Road under public participation, amount of Rs.0.30 lakh was spent on it for the fulfillment of 10 Kms. road, iv) Road in hilly inaccessible area full amount of Rs.0.97 lakh. v) Black topping of roads - amount expended was Rs.4.16 lakhs as against the budget provision of Rs.4.10 lakhs for black topping of 9 Kms. road during the year 73-74.

V. SOCIAL SERVICES :-

Community development is one of the most important major head of development and expenditure. Out of total budget provision of Rs.177.60 lakhs for the district for the year 1973-74 Rs.80.40 lakhs i.e. 45.27 percent are provided for social services. Out of the above provision of Rs.80.40 lakhs, amount of Rs.63.26 lakhs was spent on various programmes included in this head of development forming 83 percent of budgeted figure. Sub-headwise allocation of budget provision and their percentage with expenditure incurred and its percentage to budget provision are shown in the following table. :-

(1) EDUCATION:- Under social services education is the important sub-head of expenditure for which about 39 percent out of the budget provision of Rs.80.40 lakhs for the year 1973-74 was provided. Expenditure of Rs.30.44 lakhs i.e. 98 percent of budget grant of Rs.31.03 lakhs was incurred during this year. Under this head many programmes were taken like expansion of primary education, grants to Zilla Parishad

Municipalities etc; expansion of buildings, additional scholarships, free education, teachers' training, eradication of illiteracy, EBC. concession, development of science teaching etc; Under the programme eradication of illiteracy 4462 adults were made literate during the year.

(ii) Public Health:- Amount of Rs.0.35 lakh was spent on maintenance of primary health centres out of the provision of Rs.0.38 lakhs.

(iii) Water Supply and Drainage:-

Under this sub-head of expenditure amount of Rs.27.98 lakhs was spent on various water supply schemes in both the sectors i.e. State and Local out of budget provision of Rs.35.21 lakhs forming 79 percent.

(iv) Housing:- Under this sub-head of expenditure schemes like subsidised industrial housing scheme, economically weaker section housing scheme, low and middle income group housing scheme, village housing project scheme, land acquisition and development, extension of gaonthan, resettlement of persons affected by flood and replacement of thatched roofs by tiles etc; were implemented and expenditure of Rs.2.72 lakhs was incurred on them in both the sectors forming 25 percent of budget provision of Rs.10.79 lakhs.

(v) Urban Development:-

No expenditure was incurred during the year 1973-74 out of budget provision of Rs.1.20 lakh.

(vi) Backward class welfare:-

Provision of Rs.0.91 lakh was made for the welfare and uplift of backward class i.e. Scheduled Castes, Scheduled Tribes and Other Backward Class in the district during the year 1973-74 and full amount was spent on the programmes. Among the programmes executed were grant of scholarships,

tution fees and examination fees to 1426 students, grant-in-aid to 4 hostels, building grants to 2 hostels, subsidy for construction of 2 new irrigation wells, 4 cultivators for development of land, and 20 houses under housing to backward classes.

(vii) Social Welfare:-

Expenditure of Rs.0.77 lakhs was incurred on grant-in-aid to social welfare schools out of the budget provision of Rs.0.76 lakhs.

(viii) Labour Welfare:-

Expenditure of Rs.9 thousand was incurred on the training of craftsmen under this sub-head during the year 1973-74.

VI. OTHER PROGRAMME :-

Under this major head of development Rs.25 thousand were provided for programme like extension of rural broadcasting under information and publicity. During the year 1973-74. Rs.19 thousand were expended on installation of 57 rural radio sets during the year.
