CHAPTER : I
INTERODUCTION.

1.1 LOCATION:

The district of Sangli is part of the famous Deccan plateau. It lies between 16° 45' and 17° 33' North latitude and 73° 42' and 75° 40' East longitude. It is bounded on the east by the district of Bijapur in Karnatak State, on the West by the Ratnagiri district, on the south by the district of Kolhapur and Belgaum and on the north by the districts of Satara and - Sholapur.

1.2 TOPOGRAPHY : (1) SOIL :

The soils of varied texture and structure are met with in Sangli district. The soil in the district varies from the deep black in the river valleys to shallow murmad red or grey in the hilly areas.

1.3 The soil in the western part of the district, comprising area from the tahsil of Shirala is formed from red laterite mixed with hard murum due to the hilly nature of the zone.

1.4 The central portion of the district which covers areas of Walwa, Tasgaon(Part) and Miraj(Part) tahsils has deep black soils capable of yielding bumper Kharif crops. These soils which are highly retentive of moisture also grow Rabi Jowar, Wheat and Gram. They are also good for irrigated crops like sugarcane, turmeric, chillies etc. This central portion is thus the rich agricultural tract of the district.

1.5 The hilly tract comprising parts of Khanapur, Tasgaon and Miraj tahsils grows Jowar and Bajri, while the eastern zone comprising areas of Jath, Atpadi and Kavathe Mahankal tahsils with a very low rainfall and poor grey soils, is a well known scarcity tract.

1.6 (ii) RIVERS:

The Krishna and the Warna are the principal rivers of the district. The Yerala, the Morna, the Manganga, the Nanni, the Agrani and the Bor are the other small rivers flowing through this district. During rainy season the flood waters entail much soil erosion, while during the dry part, they resume a slender course. These rivers go dry in summer season.

1.7 (iii) HILL RANGES :

There are two main systems of hills. The Sahyadri range and its off-shoots, and the off-shoots of Mahadev range. The Sahyadri system includes the main range of the Sahyadri which forms the western boundary of the district. One of the spurs of the Mahadev range known as Mahimangad Panhala spur stretches up to Khanapur. At Khanapur it splits in two branches, one branch passes 32 km. in the South till it ends in the old panhala Fort, 24 km. from Athani road Railway station. The other branch stretches south east to Belur about 8 km. south west of Jath. It forms the water parting between the valley of the Yerla, a tributary of the Krishna on the right and the valley of the Man, a tributary of the Bhima on the left.

1.8 RAINFALL :

The rains start sometime in the middle of June and last till the end of September in the district. Major portion of rainfall in the district is received between July and September. - During the first half of monsoon, most of the days are cloudy with drizzling rains, whereas during the latter half it rains a bit heavily.

1.9 Rainfall is the heaviest in the regions of Sahyadri - Western portion of Shirala tahsil on an average gets rainfall over 2,000 mm. in a year. The central and eastern portion receive annual rainfall measuring about 750^{mm.}, The north eastern portion receives the lowest rainfall in the district averaging about 500 mm. in a year!

1.10 The fact finding committee appointed by the Govt. of Bombay in 1960 had reported that the rainfall in this area is not - dependable and the area is likely to be affected by scarcity conditions once in six years. The fact finding committee appointed by the Govt. of Maharashtra in 1973 has also recognised this fact . As per the report of this committee six tahsils of this district fall in the broad drought zone. These tahsils are Atpadi, Khanapur (Khanapur and Vita circles), Tasgaon (Savalaj and Visapur-circles), Jath, Kavathe Mahankal and Miraj (Malgaon circle).

1.11 Although Sangli district was one of the nine severely scarcity affected districts of Maharashtra State in the year - 1972-73 there were no scarcity or akin to scarcity conditions in this district particularly in the year 1973-74, 1974-75 or 1975-76.

1.12 MINERALS:

There are no important mineral deposits except building stones, clay and limestones. The limestone is associated with trap formation and the quality is not uniform. Good clay for bricks and tiles is found on the banks of the rivers.

1.13 FOREST :

The total area under forests in this district according to the Statistician Forest Department was 47994 hectares in 1974-75. The forest area formed hardly 5.6 percent of the geographical area of this district.

1.14 AREA AND DEMOGRAPHY :

The district has an area of 8563.0 sq. km and population of 15,39,820 as per population census 1971. Out of this 2.86 lakh persons (18.63 percent) were in urban areas and 12.53 lakh persons (81.37 percent) were in rural areas as compared to 31.17 percent urban and 68.83 percent rural population for the State.

1.15 The decennial increase of population compared to 1961 was 25.12 percent in total population, 49.09 percent in urban areas and 20.67 percent in rural areas. The following table will give tahsilwise position in this respect.

(I) ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT OF SANGLI DISTRICT :

1.16 As indicated earlier in para 1.12, there are no important mineral deposits in this district and as such there are no industries based on mine deals in this district. The only scope for industries is of agro and allied industries and consumer in special features.

1.17 HISTORY OF INDUSTRIALISATION:

In Sangli district there are 141 factories upto the year 1974. Upto the year 1940 there are only 12 Registered factories. Real progress was made in the decade of 1960 to 1970 and as many as 74 new factories were established.

The above industries are mostly concentrated in Sangli (76), Miraj (25) and Madhavnagar (9) and only 31 industries are outside these towns.

70% of factories are having less than 50 employees, 13% of factories are having 50 to 99 employees, 13% of factories are having 100 to 499 employees and remaining 4% factories are having more than 500 employees.

Maharashtra Industrial Development Corporation has acquired 559 Hect. land at Kupwad, Miraj and Sangli.

There are 3 Sugarfactories located in this district, which are in coop. sector. Out of 3 sugar factories, one of the biggest sugar factory in Maharashtra i.e. Shetkari Sahkari Sakhar Karkhana Ltd. at Sangli has daily capacity of sugarcane crushing with 5500 tons.

There are two dairies at Miraj viz. Krishna Khore Sangh and other Govt. Milk dairy. First is the collecting organisation while other is processing unit. The capacity of Govt. Milk scheme Miraj is 1,20,000 litres daily. Other biproducts like butter, milk powder are also prepared in the dairy.

Out of 9 oil mills in the district are not functioning properly for want of raw materials.

CHAPTER II
EXPLANATORY NOTE

2.1 The data on different important sectors which have dominant effects on the economy are presented in this abstract for the year 1975-76. In case the data for the year 1975-76 is not available the data for the latest available year are presented. Inmost of the cases, the reference period of the data is the financial year. The data on Agriculture, however, relates to the agricultural year, whereas the data on 'Co operation' is for the co-operative year (1st July to 30th June). The data on other important items like rainfall, temperature, civil and criminal cases, vital statistics, are for the calendar year. The information as far as possible is presented tahsilwise for inter tahsil comparison.

District at a glance -

2.2 Certain essential data in important spheres, such as,

- i) Population
- ii) agriculture
- iii) animal husbandry
- iv) industries
- v) co-operation
- vi) medical and public health
- vii) education
- viii) transport and communication
- ix) plan expenditure etc.,

pertaining to the district is presented alongwith the corresponding figures for the State for the comparison purpose.

District Statistical Abstract -

2.3 The data incorporated in the Dist. Statistical Abstract have been presented in suitable tables, classified in appropriate groups. The concepts adopted in preparation of tables are summarised in the following paragraphs. The limitations of data are cited wherever necessary.

Area and Population -

2.4 The data of 1971 census mainly on population, area, houses and livelihood occupation, rural urban breakup etc., are presented in the first seven tables for all tahsils in the district. Data on population per square kilometre, decadal variations during 1951-61 and 1961-71, classification of villages and towns according to population ranges, number of workers and non-workers, population of schedule castes and schedule tribes, distribution of population according to age group and religion are also given in these tables.

2.5 (a) Urban Area -

The following places have been treated as 'Urban areas' (towns)-

1) every place having a municipality or contonment board irrespective of its population.

2) every other places which satisfies following three conditions-

- i) a population of at least 5,000;
- ii) at least three fourth of its male working population engaged in non-agricultural pursuits; and
- iii) a density of population of at least 400 persons per square km.

3) any other place not falling under above two categories which possesses certain district characteristics to qualify to its being treated as urban such as its being a project area or a - developing township

b) Rural area - These areas which do not satisfy the criteria prescribed for recognising urban area are called - 'Rural areas'.

A census village in Maharashtra has always been a revenue village. A revenue village has well-defined boundaries, a map and a separate set of land records irrespective of whether that defined area has any population or not.

(c) Worker - A worker is defined as 'a person whose main activity is participation in any economically productive work through his physical or mental activity. Work involves not only actual work but effective supervision and direction of work. - A public or social worker engaged actively in public or social work or political worker actively engaged in furthering the political aims of a party was also regarded as a 'worker'. In case of perennial work, such as, cultivation, livestock, plantation, some type of household industries, a person was treated as a 'worker' by ascertaining whether he had participated any time during the last one year, even if, he was not economically active in the week prior to enumeration. In case of regular work in trade, profession, service or business, a person was considered as 'worker' if he had participated in such regular work on any one of the days during the week preceding the date of enumeration and that work has been returned as his main activity.

(d) Non-worker- Non-workers are 'those who are not mainly engaged in any economically productive work.'

Persons primarily engaged in household duties or those who were students and helps in the family economic activity, but not on full time scale were treated as 'non-worker' in respect of their main activity.

2. Climate -

2.6 The rainfall and temperature have pronounced effects on climate. The rainfall data presented in table no.3 gives normal rainfall, monthly rainfall and number of rainy days during the calendar year 1975 for the selected five centres. A day was treated as a 'rainy day' if during the twenty-four hours the rain gauge - recorded a minimum of 2.5 mm. of rainfall. The table no.9 gives actual maximum and minimum temperatures recorded during each of the month of the calendar year 1975 in respect of one centre in Sangli district.

3. Agriculture-

2.7 Important tahsilwise statistics on agriculture, such as

- i) land utilisation
- ii) area under different crops
- iii) yield per hectare and outturn of principal crops
- iv) irrigated area under different crops
- v) sourcewise irrigated area, and
- vi) data on irrigation etc.

are given in tables 10 to 14.

2.8 The basic definitions adopted are given below.

- a) Geographical area - It is, according to village papers, calculated from village returns prepared for revenue purposes and as such it may be different from that according to Surveyor General.
- b) Forests - It includes all actually forested areas or lands classed or administered as 'forests' under any legal enactment dealing with forests, whether State owned or private. If any portion of such land is not actually wooded but put to some agricultural use, that portion is included under the appropriate heading of cultivated or uncultivated land.

- c. Land put to non-agricultural uses -
It stands for all lands occupied by buildings, roads and railways or under rivers, canals etc. and other land put to uses other than agricultural.
- d) Barren and unculturable land- It covers land which cannot be brought under cultivation unless at a high cost, whether in isolated blocks or uncultivated holdings. Land like mountains, deserts etc. is classified under this category.
- e. Permanent pastures and other grazing land- It covers all grazing lands. Village common grazing lands and grazing lands within forest area are included under ~~xx~~ this head.
- f. Culturable waste land- These may be either fallow or covered with useless shrubs and jungles and include all lands available for cultivation whether not taken up for cultivation or taken up for cultivation once but not cultivated during the current year and the last five years or more in succession.
- g. Miscellaneous tree crops and groves not included in the net area sown.
This category includes all cultivable land which is not included in net area sown but put to some agricultural use.
- h. Current fallow lands - These are lands which are kept fallow during the current year. If any seedling area is not cropped again in the same year, it is also treated as 'current fallow'.
- i. Other fallows- All lands which were taken up for cultivation but are temporarily out of cultivation for a period not less than one year and not more than 5 years are classed as 'other fallow'
- j. Net area sown - This consists of net area sown with crops and orchards, area sown more than once being counted only once.
- k. Gross cropped area - Total of area under all crops including area under crops sown more than once is taken as 'Gross cropped area'

4. Irrigation Statistics-

- 2.9 Important irrigation statistics regarding
- i. number of irrigation wells
 - ii) activities of ground water survey & Development Agency.
 - iii) minor irrigation works.
 - iv) major and medium irrigation projects, and
 - v) area irrigated under major and medium projects.
- are given in table nos 15, 16, 17 and 18.

5. Allied Agriculture-

- 2.10 Agricultural wage rates at the selected centres viz.,
- i) Atpadi (taluka - Atpadi)
 - ii) Jath (taluka - Jath)
 - iii) Mhaisal (taluka - Miraj)

collected by the Dist. Statistical Officer through the Block Statistical Assistants are given in table no. 19. Number of operational holdings as per Agricultural Census- 1970 are given in table no. 20. Final figures of agricultural implements enumerated during the eleventh livestock census are given in table no. 21. The tahsil-wise data on 'famine and scarcity' are given in table No. 22 & 23 for the year 1975-76.

6. Animal Husbandry and Forests-

- 2.11 Usewise population of livestock and poultry as per livestock census, 1972 (final data) is shown tahsilwise in table no. 24. Statistics on veterinary facilities existed, animals treated in such centres and disease-wise mortality of livestock are given in table nos. 25 & 26. Table no. 27 furnishes data on animals slaughtered in recognised slaughter houses in the district.
- 2.12 The data on 'area under forests' and major and minor forest produce for the year 1975-76 have been shown in tables 28(a) and 28(b) respectively. Area under forests with a classification into ---

- i. reserved
- ii. protected, and
- iii. unclassified forests under the control of State Revenue department and under State Forests Department.

has been shown. These areas may not tally with the area under forests shown in table no. 10 due to different concepts of classification into above three heads. Reserved forests are intended mainly for timber production in which rights of grazing and cultivation are seldom allowed. Grazing cultivation under certain limitation and restrictions are allowed in protected forests. The unclassified forests refer to 'inaccessible forests' or 'unoccupied waste'.

7. Inland fisheries-

2.13 The statistics relating to total area suitable for fish culture, ponds, lakes and reservoirs, area under ~~px~~ pisciculture, inland fish production and carp fry used for pisciculture are given in table no. 29(A).

8. Employment, Industry and Electricity-

2.14 The statistics relating to working factories under different groups with average daily employment, man-days worked, classification of factories according to working strength and number of days worked are given for the year 1974 in table nos. 30, 31 and 32. Statistics regarding number of registered factories, productive capital investment, output and employment provided under different industries based on Annual Survey of Industries for the year 1968 is given in table no. 33. Monthwise registration, vacancies notified, placements done, number of employment seekers on the live register at the end of the the month, occupations-wise and sectorial, other data of employment exchange have been shown in table no. 34, 35 and 37. The information regarding the employment generated under Employment Guarantee Scheme works is also given in table no. 36.

2.15. Data on consumption of electricity by different categories during the year 1975-76 is given in table no.38 and no. of towns and villages electrified during and upto end of selected years are shown in table no.39. The data are collected from Maharashtra State Electricity Board, Private Electric supply companies and Sugar factories in the district.

9. Co-operation -

2.16 Statistical information on the co-operative institutions and their activities have been given for the year 1975-76 on the following items -

- i. Loan advanced by cooperative banks and primary agricultural credit societies- different types of societies, their membership.
- ii. Total value of purchase and sales by the central and primary co-operative marketing societies, and
- iii. Annual arrivals in the regulated markets in each tahsil of Sangli district in tables 40 to 46. Tahsilwise data regarding no. of members, capital structure, loans advanced and recovered etc. have also been given.

Working capital - It includes paid-up capital, deposits and borrowings. Loans outstanding includes outstandings in respect of loans, cash credits and overdrafts and the amount of the outstanding bills purchased or discounted. Overdues refer to the amount of loans or instalments which was due for collection but which was not actually collected and for the repayment of which no extension has been granted by the competent authority. Information of registered money lenders and loans advanced by them is given in table number 47.

The main functions of Agricultural credit societies are to help members by way of providing short and medium term loans for meeting their agricultural necessities like improved seeds, -

fertilizers, agricultural improved implements etc. The help is also extended in the matters of storage, transportation and sales of the agricultural produce.

2.21 The agricultural non-credit societies look after the work of better farming by way of educating the agriculturists in the adoption of improved agricultural practices, crop protection etc. The societies also undertake educational, economical, cultural and house building activities so as to uplift the standard of living of the agriculturists.

2.22 The main function of the Urban Bank, Urban credit cooperative societies and salary earners' co-operative societies is to promote the qualities of economy, and co-operation among the members and also to make them industrious. They also augment the saving habits of the people by way of making the banking facilities easily available. They give loans to the members on the securities like gold, immovable property, Government securities, commercial goods, etc. They also provide loans to the Artisans and small traders.

2.23 The main functions of non-agricultural non-credit societies are to run printing presses, to provide electricity to members and consumers for domestic, industrial and agricultural purposes, to run Montessories, primary schools and educational institutions for educational spread and things of the kind.

The main function of primary co-operative marketing societies is the purchase and sale of agricultural produce grown by its members or co-operative societies in its area of operation.

10. Medical & Public Health -

2.24 In this section, data on medical and Public Health for the year 1975 is given. Table no.48 gives medical facilities available through public and public-aided bodies in each tahsil alongwith indoor and outdoor patients treated. Data on 'vital statistics' e.g. tahsilwise birth and deaths and infant deaths registered in the year 1975 with break-up into male and female and no.of deaths due to important causes, from the year 1971 to 1975 gives in tables no.49 and 50 respectively. Vaccination statistics and cholera - inoculation done in each tahsil during 1975 is given in table no.51. Table no.52 gives statistics on family planning during the year - 1975-76.

11. Education -

2.25 The data on tahsilwise number of literates and percentage of literacy as per 1971 census are shown in table no.53. The data on education level of people in rural and urban areas are given in table nos. 54 and 55. The data regarding pupils and teachers with no.of institutions in pre-primary, primary, secondary and higher categories are presented in table no.56. The data on backward class enrolment and concessions granted to economically - backward class and expenditure incurred under normal and plan grants on primary education in the district is shown in table nos. 57 to 59.

12. Transport and Communication-

2.26 Length of railway routes according to gauge is shown in table no.60. The table no.61 gives road length according to category and surface classification. Roads maintained by municipal - councils/contonment boards are also shown separately in this table.

The data of number of motor vehicles in operation in Kolhapur region covering Satara, Sangli and Kolhapur districts together are shown in table no.62.(districtwise figures are not available). Important operational statistics relating to Pune division of Maharashtra State Road Transport Corporation are given in table no.63(Maharashtra State Transport division comprises of Sangli-district). Results of traffic census conducted in May 1974 on important roads in Sangli district are given in table no.64 - Statistics on Postal, Telegraphs and telephones facilities and on rural broadcasting are depicted in the table nos.65 and 66 respectively.

13. Local bodies -

2.27 The financial position of Village Panchayats, Municipal councils and zilla parishad is shown in this section for the year 1975-76.

2.28 The number of village panchayats include number of independent Village Panchayats as also group village panchayats, income and expenditure of village panchayats are exclusive of opening and closing balances respectively. Grants include grants from Government as well as from Zilla Parishad and panchayat samities for developmental activities. Government grants to village panchayats are mainly land revenue grants, equalisation grants and local cess grants. Government grants in respect of municipal councils are mainly grants on account of dearness allowances, grants for roads, for water supply, for educational purpose, for medical purpose and on account of percentage in land revenue. The receipts of zilla parishad are shown under four -

sub-heads, viz.

i. self raised resources

ii. government grants

iii. grants for agency scheme, and

iv. Debt section. The expenditure is shown under

two heads- Revenue expenditure and Debt section.

2.29 The data are collected from the zilla parishad, Sangli and all the municipal councils in Sangli district.

14. Plan and Community development.

2.30 Data on Plan expenditure under State and Local sectors and physical achievements in important fields during the year 1975-76 are given respectively in table nos. 71 and 72. Statistics in respect of coverage of community development programme, stagewise expenditure of various blocks and blockwise physical achievements under community development programme are shown in table nos. 73 to 75

15. Prices -

2.31 The table no. 76 gives monthly average wholesale prices of agricultural commodities transacted in regulated markets. The district average for each variety and for each month is also given.

2.32 The table no. 77 gives the monthly average retail prices of important commodities of Sangli head-quarter during 1975. As the information collected for the given commodities is restricted to only one quotation and that also from only one shop in the district headquarter, the averages shown for individual commodities cannot be said to be fully representative but the data may prove useful as broad indicator of the trend in changes in retail prices over the period of time. The table no. 78 gives consumer price index number for working class of Sholapur and Pune centres for the year 1975-76. For the calculation of index, the years 1960 are taken as 'base years' for Sholapur and Pune centres respectively.

16. Miscellaneous-

2.33 Statistical data pertaining to police force, crime statistics, cases disposed of in civil and criminal courts, cinema statistics regarding seating capacity in different types of theatres, no. of banking offices, no. of scheduled banks, their deposits and advances and no. of joint stock companies, insurance policies and amount insured, collection of small savings, land revenue collections, number of presses, newspapers and periodicals published etc. are given in the table nos. 79 to 89.

2.34 A table showing trend in selected indicators in the fields of development, such as -

- i. agriculture
- ii. livestock
- iii. industry
- iv. education
- v. health, etc.

are indicated for the years 1950-51, 1960-61, 1966-67, 1973-74, 1974-75 and 1975-76 is appended at the end. These collected indicators are very useful for assessing progress in various fields over important periods in the recent past.

CHAPTER- III

An Analytical Review of Sectorial trends 1974-75

3.1 An analytical review of the facts and figures regarding various socio economic features of the Sangli district, which occurred as a result of the developmental activities can be visualised more accurately from the progress made in the fields of - agriculture, livestock and poultry, employment, electricity consumption, extent of credit and banking facilities etc. The nature of progress achieved in these fields is considered for this purpose.

Agriculture :

3.2 Agricultural backwardness is one of the prominent problems of our Economy even today. The State of Maharashtra and the - district of Sangli are no exception to this. In fact, in this area it is more pronounced. Hilly region, rocky or poor soils, scarcity and uncertain rains in the eastern zone, inadequate irrigational facilities, poor use of chemical fertilisers, all these have marred the productivity of the Agril.

3.3 The figures furnished below will vividly throw light on important aspects of agriculture in Sangli district .

Percentage gross sown area .

3.4 The position regarding percentage of gross cropped area to net area sown i.e. the extent of double cropping can be assessed from the table given below :

3.5 From the above figures it will be seen that the percentage of gross cropped area to the net area sown for the district as a whole was constant during the years 1965-66 and 1971-72 but the same was found to be decreased in 1972-73 and remained same during 1973-74, but it again increased in 1974-75 to the 1960-61 level.

3.6 Within the district percentage was increased in almost all the tahsils in 1974-75 as compared to the figures of 1973-74. This increase is more pronounced in tahsils of Miraj, Khanapur, Walwa and Shirala. As compared to the figures of 1974-75 to those of 1960-61, it is observed that the percentage of gross cropped area is increased in Khanapur, Jath, Walwa, while those of Miraj, Tasgaon and Shirala are decreased.

Productivity of important crops

3.7 The principal crops of the district are Jowar, Bajra, Rice, wheat Gram, Tur, Groundnut and Sugarcane. The following table furnishes the information about \bar{x} yields per hectare.

3.8 From the above table it is seen that ~~xx~~ yield rates in 1965-66 in general decreased as compared to 1960-61, due to scarcity conditions in Sangli district. There was some improvement in the later years and the yield rates of 1971-72 were in fact higher than those for 1965-66 in respect of crops Bajra, Rice, Gram, Tur, - Groundnut. The yield rate of sugarcane during the year 1971-72 however, was still below its level in 1960-61 and 1965-66 and it further declined in 1972-73. During the year 1972-73, the yield rates of all crops were found to be decreased too much due to severe scarcity-conditions, scanty and untimely rains.

3.9 During the year 1974-75 as compared to 1973-74, the yield rates were better in respect of all crops except Bajra, Groundnut and Tobacco. However the yield rate of Jowar, Bajra, Gram and Cotton are still lower than those of 1960-61 level. The yield rates however have shown much improvement in respect ~~xx~~ of crops like Rice, Wheat, Tur and Sugarcane in 1974-75 over 1960-61 level.

Irrigation :-

3.10. The percentage Of gross irrigated area to net area irrigated in Sangli district was Only 113 in 1960-61. In 1971-72, it rose to 118. In 1972-73, however, there was sudden fall to 110 due to scarcity conditions. The position in the tahsils also show ups and downs in the double irrigated area over these years. ^{3.11} The tahsilwise position is given below :-

3.12. The above table shows that in 1973-74, the double irrigated area recorded a rise of 2 percent over the 1972-73 figure. The significant achievement was in Khanapur, Miraj, Tasgaon and Atpadi tahsils. However, there was sudden down fall in percentage of double irrigated area in Shirala

tahsils. From the level of 120 percent in 1972-73 to 100 percent in 1973-74.

3.13. The percentage of gross irrigated area to net irrigated area which was 113 percent in 1960-61 is still not achieved in 1973-74 which was still at 112 percent.

3.14. The percentage of net irrigated area to net sown area can be seen from the table given below :-

3.15. The percentage increased in the year 1973-74 as compared to the year 1972-73 in Khanapur, Shirala, Tasgaon and Miraj tahsils only. In the remaining tahsils the same was found to have been decreased. As a result, the percentage for the district as a whole, also decreased.

3.16. The percentage of net irrigated to net cropped area was highest in Walwa tahsil during 1973-74. Miraj and Tasgaon tahsils occupied second and third position. Khanapur stood last in the rank.

Changes in the cropping pattern.

3.17. The table given below depicts the picture of share of different crops in gross cropped area and thereby throws light on changes in the cropping pattern.

3.18 From the above table it is observed ^{that} during the 15 years span, the area under non food crops increased from 21.87 percent in 1960-61 to 22.86 percent in 1974-75, while that of food crops decreased from 78.13 percent in 1960-61 to 77.14 percent in 1974-75. Significant change in the figures of 1960-61 and 1974-75 was observed in the crops of Jowar from 38.98 percent to 35.58 percent, total pulses from 10.91 to 12.59 percent, Sugarcane from 1.36 percent to 3.26 percent and Groundnut from 12.47 percent to 3.04 percent.

Agricultural credit and outstanding dues -

3.19 Agricultural credit is the vital need of our agro-economy.

The figures presented below show the extent of agricultural credit facilities made available by agricultural cooperative credit societies in the year 1960-61, 1965-66, 1973-~~74~~¹⁹⁷⁴⁻⁷⁵ and 1975-76.

3.20 It is apparent from the above table that the loans advanced by primary agricultural cooperative credit societies increased by 148 percent during 1965-66, by 519 percent during 1974-75 and by 265 percent during 1975-76 as compared to 1960-61. The figures of loan per member for 5 years under consideration were Rs.189, Rs.312, Rs.565, Rs.589 and Rs.319 respectively.

The position of loan advanced and loan outstanding during 1975-76 has been reduced as compared to the figures of 1974-75. This is because of conversion of short term loan into medium term loan.

Agricultural Wage Rates :-

3.21 Agricultural wage rates in each district of Maharashtra State are being collected since 1962-63. From each district, three rural centres were selected and from these selected rural centres data on agricultural wage rates are collected. In Sangli district the selected centres are 1) Mhaisal in Miraj tahsil 2) Jath in Jath tahsil and 3) Atpadi in Atpadi tahsil. During the year 1975 the wage rates for males (field labour) was Rs.3.00 and that for female labourers between Rs.1.50 to 2.00. The wages of carpenter, blacksmith and Mochi varied between Rs.4.00 to Rs.8.00.

Livestock

3.22 Animal husbandry in India, from the view point of its substantial contribution in providing income and drought power to farmers and subsidiary food to human population, assumes great importance in the rural economy, even today. The eleventh quinquennial livestock census was conducted in 1972 throughout India to gauge the magnitude of this wealth.

3.23 The no. of livestock per 100 hectare of cultivable area was 123 in 1961 and 117 in 1968 in Sangli district. However, it again increased to 128 in 1972. The number of bullocks used for working decreased in 1972 as compared to 1966. Gross cropped area per pair of working bullocks was 9.03 hectares in 1961 and 9.30 hectares in 1966 which rose to 9.46 hectares in 1972.

3.24 Within the district, the tahsil of Valwa has the largest No. of livestock per hectare of cultivable land. The tahsils of Atpadi, Shirala and Tasgaon also have the livestock more than the district average. The Jath tahsil has the lowest number of livestock per hectare of cultivable land.

Poultry -

3.25 During the years 1961, 1966 and 1972 a gradual increase in no. of poultry was observed in this district. In 1961, it was 4.93 lakhs. The same increased to 6.25 lakhs in 1966 and to 6.47 lakhs in 1972. In the year 1961 the number of poultry per thousand - population was 405. The same increased to 420 in 1972. This means that increase in poultry population was faster than the increase in human population.

Consumption of Electricity -

3.26 The per capita consumption of electricity in Sangli district was 15.32 KWH in 1961-62 which rose to 36.53 Kwh in 1965-66. The figures for the year ~~1971-72~~ 1971-72 and 1974-75 were 68.05 Kwh and 94.69 Kwh respectively. The per capita consumption of electricity increased to 103.83 Kwh in 1975-76. The per capita consumption of ~~xxx~~ electricity in 1975-76 increased to 7 times as compared to figures of 1961-62.

Enrolment in employment exchange and vacancies notified-

3.27 Employment generation is one of the most important aims of planning in a overpopulated country like India. Employment Exchange statistics give an indication of the magnitude of the unemployment problem though to a very limited extent, because the majority of unemployed persons do not avail of the facilities provided by the employment exchange.

3.28 The position of Sangli district regarding registration and vacancies notified etc. can be seen from the table given below.

3.29 It is seen from the table no.7 that there was a substantial increase in the registration and vacancies notified for the year - 1975-76. However, employment provided by private sector, but not through the employment exchange is much more significant and hence it will not be correct to draw final conclusions regarding the - unemployment problem on the basis of employment exchange statistics alone. But the figures no doubt help to indicate the severity of the unemployment problem in the district.

Increase in outdoor and indoor patient -

3.30 The comparative position can be seen from the table given - below.

3.31 As compared to 1965, the increase in no. of patients in 1972 was 55 percent. The no. of outdoor patients treated was high in 1972 because the medical officers visited different scarcity hit areas and treated patients. This was not the position during 1973 or 1975. There were 67 doctors in 1975, who were working in public and public aided bodies. The no. of doctors per lakh of population in 1974 and 1975 works to 5.00 and 4.35 respectively. The no. of nurses per lakh of population recorded slight increase because total no. of nurses increased from 154 to 157. The position given above is not quite representative as the statistics regarding - doctors and nurses in private sector are not considered here.

Increase in no. of students of different categories -

3.32 Education is the backbone of socio-economic development. The percentage of pupils taking education in RKMV Primary, Secondary and Higher institutions has increased during 1974-75. The following table shown the percentage increase or decrease in no. of students in respect of different types of education.

3.33 The boys in Primary schools increased only 2.65 percent in 1975-76 over 1974-75 figure but Girls students increased by 5.77 percent in 1975-76 over the figure of 1974-75.

As regards Secondary schools, the strength of boys decreased by nearly 6.77 percent while that of Girls students increased by 2.79 percent in 1975-76 over the figure of 1974-75.

Increase in road length per 100 sq. km -

3.34 Roads constitute one of the important items in the infrastructure of a country's economy. The extent of road facilities available can be judged by working out road length per 100 sq. km of area.

3.35 In Sangli district, the road length per 100 sq. km was 26.04 km in 1960-61 which increased to 78.96 km. in 1975-76. The same was 46.87 in 1972-73. The sizable increase was possible due to roads constructed during the scarcity period.

Increase in Banking facilities in proportion to population

3.36 In 1961, there were 34 banking offices of different types in Sangli district. The same rose to 169 as on 31st March 1975. In 1961, there were 3 bank offices per lakh of population and at the end of 31st March 1975, the same increased to 11 offices.

Prices

3.37 Since November 1962, the work of collection of prices at district headquarter in the Maharashtra State was entrusted to the District Statistical Offices of the Directorate of Economics and Statistics. From the collected data, the trend of the prices of important commodities during 1975 can be ascertained.

3.38 The prices in respect of items like cereals and pulses under food, sugar, gur, edible oil and vanaspati, condiments and spices; vegetables; clothing; charcoal; match box; firewood etc. under fuel, tea and coffee under beverages; and washing soap, pan, supari, tobacco, cigarettes, hair oil etc. under miscellaneous articles; have shown rising trend since 1962.

3.39 The General Index Number of Sholapur and Pune centres for 1975-76 were 342 and 296 respectively.

CHAPTER NO. IV.
ANNUAL PLA-N- 1975-76

Introduction :-

4.1 The year 1975-76 was the second year of Fifth Five Year Plan 1974-79. From last year i.e. from 1974-75 the idea of planning from below was started operating and basic concept of planning - undergone important, fundamental changes. The past experience in the field of planning revealed that the approach of directing development in the state from above had not only distorted the state priorities but it had not given due regard to the variety of conditions existing within the different areas.

4.2 In the new approach therefore, the district was adopted as the unit of planning and District Planning Bodies were constituted for each district. The draft fifth plan for each district was - formulated by the district planning body at present called the District Planning and Development Council.

4.3 Against the ceiling of Rs.33.21 crores District Planning and Development Council formulated the plan of Rs.33.66 crores as given below.

4.4 For the 1974-75 Annual Plan a ceiling of Rs.372.84 lakhs was laid but actual budget provision by various departments was to the tune of Rs.480.27 lakhs and expenditure of Rs.351.68 lakhs was incurred.

4.5 For the Annual Plan 1975-76, an outlay of Rs.532 lakhs was finalized as follows .

In view of the emphasis on Agricultural programme more funds have been provided to that sector. To accomodate the plan within the final outlay, reduction was made in the outlay proposed under, Irrigation and power. Against this outlay of Rs.532.49 lakhs pdr. of Rs.355.99 lakh was incurred i.e. about 66.9 % of total outlay finalised by Govt. However, it comes to 97% expenditure of revised budget provision. The performance in various fields during the year is reviewed in the following paras. For this purpose a table giving the details of budget provision and expenditure incurred on the schemes is given herewith.

4.7 The major expenditure during 1975-76 was on Agricultural programme followed by other programmes, social services, Industry and Irrigation and Power. The following table gives comparative position of expenditure under different heads during 4th plan, 1974-75 and 1975-76.

4.8 There is wide disparities in expenditure in different sectors of development heads. Of the total expenditure during 1975-76, as much as 32.74 percent expenditure was incurred on Agricultural programme followed by 28.92 % on other programme.

While comparing the expenditure of 1974-75 and 1975-76 with that of 4th plan expenditure it is revealed that, percentage of expenditure on Agriculture programme and Social services declined while that on Industry and Mining and other programme, is increased. Another important feature of fifth plan in general is that the Employment Guarantee Scheme is implemented on a large scale. Similarly a new scheme of Drought Prone Area programme is being implemented from 1974-75 .

Schemewise review as given below :-

I. Agricultural Programme -

(a) Agricultural production-

4.9 Under this head two schemes were implemented, out of which one is a staff scheme under other integrated area scheme, plant protection measures in 500 hectares were carried out

other
In addition: Under general agricultural development programme - improved seeds were distributed as follows - Jowar 2291 qtls., Wheat- 13071 qtls. Cotton 98 qtls. and paddy 9 qtls. Similarly 5454 tons of fertilisers were also distributed.

4.10 (b) Minor Irrigation - Under this scheme an expenditure of Rs.64.57 lakhs was incurred during the year 1975-76 on two schemes viz. 1) construction and repair of wells and installation of pumping sets 2) construction of Minor irrigation works. First is a subsidy scheme under which loan is given by land development bank for the above purpose and Divisional Soil Conservation Officer sanctioned as subsidy. During the year subsidy to 63 wells and 91 pumps was granted. Under the second scheme 3 bandharas and 43 percolation tanks were constructed.

4.11 (c) Soil Conservation- There are two schemes implemented under this developmental head, one is bunding and terracing and other is afforestation for soil conservation. An expenditure of Rs.15.08 lakhs were incurred on these two schemes. During the year bunding in 8842 hectares and terracing in 218 hectares were completed. Under afforestation scheme, 150 hectares were brought under afforestation.

4.12 (d) Drought Prone Area Programme-

This is the second year of operation of this scheme. During the year under report an amount Rs.17.83 lakhs was spent on this scheme and same amount was spent in central sector as it is implemented on 50:50% basis. Under this scheme, all types of schemes viz. Agricultural Soil Conservation, Minor Irrigation, Forest, Dairy etc. are implemented through various departments. In this district 6 water sheds have been

selected and all the above developmental activities are carried out on intensive basis in that area. During the year under report soil testing was carried out in 3200 hectares while, contour bunding in 1667 hectares. 3 Minor Irrigation tanks were constructed and tree plantation in 350 hectares was carried out;

4.13 (e) Animal Husbandry-

Only two schemes viz- Distribution of cocrecls and establishment of Veterinary Dispensary were implemented during the year and an amount of Rs.0.15 lakhs was spent. Under first scheme 800 cocrecls were distributed while the work under other scheme is in progress.

4.14 (f) Dairy Development :- There are two scheme viz. Govt. Milk Supply Scheme Miraj and organisation of coop. societies and federation. Under first scheme, against the target of 1,20,000 litres, 99,942 liters of milk was handled on an average daily and under the second scheme 43 milk societies were organised or assisted for milk collection.

4.15 (g) Forest - Under this development head 4 schemes were implemented and an amount of Rs.1.20 lakhs was spent on these schemes during the year. 50 hectares of new land was brought under Minor Forest produce, in addition to last years 50 hectares. Nature conservation site at Sagaroba, is being developed. During the year under report 2530 meters of fencing work part construction of pagoda huts, 1.70 km. of roads works were completed. Under fodder development 23 hectares were developed in addition to last years 25 hectares.

4.16 (h) Fisheries- Under the scheme of stocking of fish about 2,12,000 fingerlings were stocked at various tanks at the cost of Rs.0.¹⁴ lakhs. The other two schemes are subsidy and loan schemes and an amount of Rs.0.03 lakhs was spent during the year.

4.17 (i) Warehousing and marketing- During the year 4 Agriculture Produce Market Committee were assisted with subsidy.

II- Cooperation and Community Development -

4.18 (a) Cooperation- Under this development head, only two schemes were implemented. Under the first scheme of strengthening of coop. credit, amount of Rs.0.09 lakhs was spent mostly to assist 31 societies by way of managerial subsidy, while under second scheme of development of coop. marketing, Rs.0.50 lakhs were spent and 2 societies were assisted.

4.19 (b) Community Development- An amount of Rs.6.00 lakhs was spent mostly to complete the incomplete works viz. school buildings, roads, panchayat ghars etc. There are 106 such works in the district, which are under various stages of completion.

III. Irrigation and Power Project-

4.20 Irrigation Project - Two medium irrigation project viz. Yeralwadi and Sidhewadi are in progress. Work of Sidhewadi is in progress and an expenditure of Rs.13.91 lakhs was incurred, though Yeralwadi, is in Satara district, areain Sangli district will also be benefitted by the project. An amount of Rs.4.69 lakhs from this district funds were spent.

As regards Warna project, the work has been just started. This project will benefit both Kolhapur and Sangli district.

IV. Power Project -

4.21 Under this scheme comes the rural electrification and normal development. Under rural electrification 2 villages were electrified and 478 agricultural pumps were energised including those under - Rural Electrification Centre schemes.

4.22 V. Industry and Mining -

Under the scheme of package incentives worth Rs.14.40 lakhs were given to eligible entrepreneurs on the basis of actual performance. The scheme is implemented with a view to diversity in the industries to industrially backward areas and the incentives are in the form of refund of sales tax, refund of octroi, subsidy in electricity consumption etc. Rs.10.00 lakhs were given to spinning mill at Vita as matching share capital contribution.

4.23 Under small scale industries an amount of Rs.8.55 lakhs was spent, and 3 handloom coop. societies, 7 industrial coop. societies and 8 block level multipurpose societies were assisted. One industrial estate was given Rs.0.50 lakhs for expansion. Under seed money scheme an amount of Rs.6.76 lakhs was given to 259 persons and under state aid to industries, 85 units were assisted and an amount of Rs.0.16 was spent.

VI- Transport and Communication-

4.24 During the year 18.60 km. of length of new road was constructed 9 C.D. works were constructed under district roads. While - under M.N. Programme 5 C.D. works were constructed. Total amount to the tune of Rs.15.39 lakhs was spent during the year.

VII- Social Services-

4.25 General Education- Under this subhead of development as many as 16 schemes were implemented during the year. The total expenditure was Rs.30.82 lakhs during the year. The important schemes and achievement are as follows -

- i) Programme of attaching standards V to VII to secondary schools - An amount of Rs.3.00 lakhs was spent and 176 classes were attached to the highschool during the year.
- ii) Grants to Zilla Parishad for primary school building -under this scheme, Rs.0.92 lakhs were spent. Work of about 50 school building was in progress.
- iii) Development and Expansion of Non-Govt. Secondary schools under this scheme an amount of Rs.8.02 lakhs was spent and 85 schools were assisted in this respect in the year.
- iv) Development of Junior College- Under this head an amount of Rs.7.70 lakhs were spent and 53 Junior College classes were assisted during the year.
- v) Educational concession to E.B.C. students- Under this scheme, Economically backward class students are given assistance by way of payment of fees, and donation of books etc. An amount of Rs.8.96 lakhs was spent and 6620 students were assisted under the scheme in the year.

(b) Health -

4.26 Under this developmental subhead, three schemes were implemented as follows -

Under Primary Health Centre and Primary Health Units schemes 2 buildings were constructed while under the scheme of increase in

medical aid to Primary Health Centre etc. Medical aids worth Rs.1.61 lakhs were given, Rs.0.50 lakhs were given as aid to two Public - Health Units under the scheme of grant to Public Health Units.

(c) Water Supply and Drainage-

4.27 Govt. water supply scheme- Miraj and Municipal water supply scheme Sangli are in progress but as the D.P.D.C. has not sanctioned any fund for those scheme, no expenditure was incurred against the district fund. Under rural piped water supply schemes, as many as 12 schemes were under various stages of progress and an amount of Rs.11.55 lakhs was spent on these schemes.

(d) Housing -

4.28 During the year under report, nearly 837 houses were constructed for Agricultural Labourers and houseless population and an amount of Rs.0.36 lakhs was spent from Government fund.

(e) Urban Development -

4.29 Under this head an amount of Rs.1.35 lakhs given as assistance to 4 municipal councils under the scheme of financial assistance to Municipal Councils to implement their development plans.

(f) Labour and Labour Welfare-

4.30 Under the scheme of craftsmen training Rs.0.40 lakhs were given to I.T.I. Sangli to purchase equipment and tools.

Under other scheme of Extension of E.S.I. scheme to new industrial area of Madhavnagar, the remaining amount was spent for purchase of equipment and furniture etc.

(g) Welfare of Backward Classes-

4.31 In all 9 schemes were implemented and an amount of Rs.2.13 lakhs was spent on these scheme during the year. The important schemes and achievements are as follows -

1) Under the scheme of Grant in aid to aided B.C.Hostels, an amount Rs.0.94 lakhs was spent and 48 hostels with 2200 B.C. students were assisted (ii) One Ashram Shala with 50 students was given - Rs.0.25 lakhs as aid. (iii) Under improvement of Harijan Vasties one Harijan vasti was improved at the cost of Rs.0.48 lakhs. (iv) One cooperative housing society was assisted and given Rs.0.17 lakhs as financial assistance.

Centrally Sponsored Scheme -

4.32 Besides the State plan schemes, there were some centrally sponsored schemes implemented under heads Agril. Programme, Social Services and other programmes etc.

AGRICULTURAL PROGRAMME :

4.33 (a) Agricultural Production- Out of 6 schemes implemented during this year 4 schemes were staff schemes. Under the other two schemes 1196 farmers were trained in cultivation of high yielding varieties of crops.

SOCIAL SERVICES:

Health

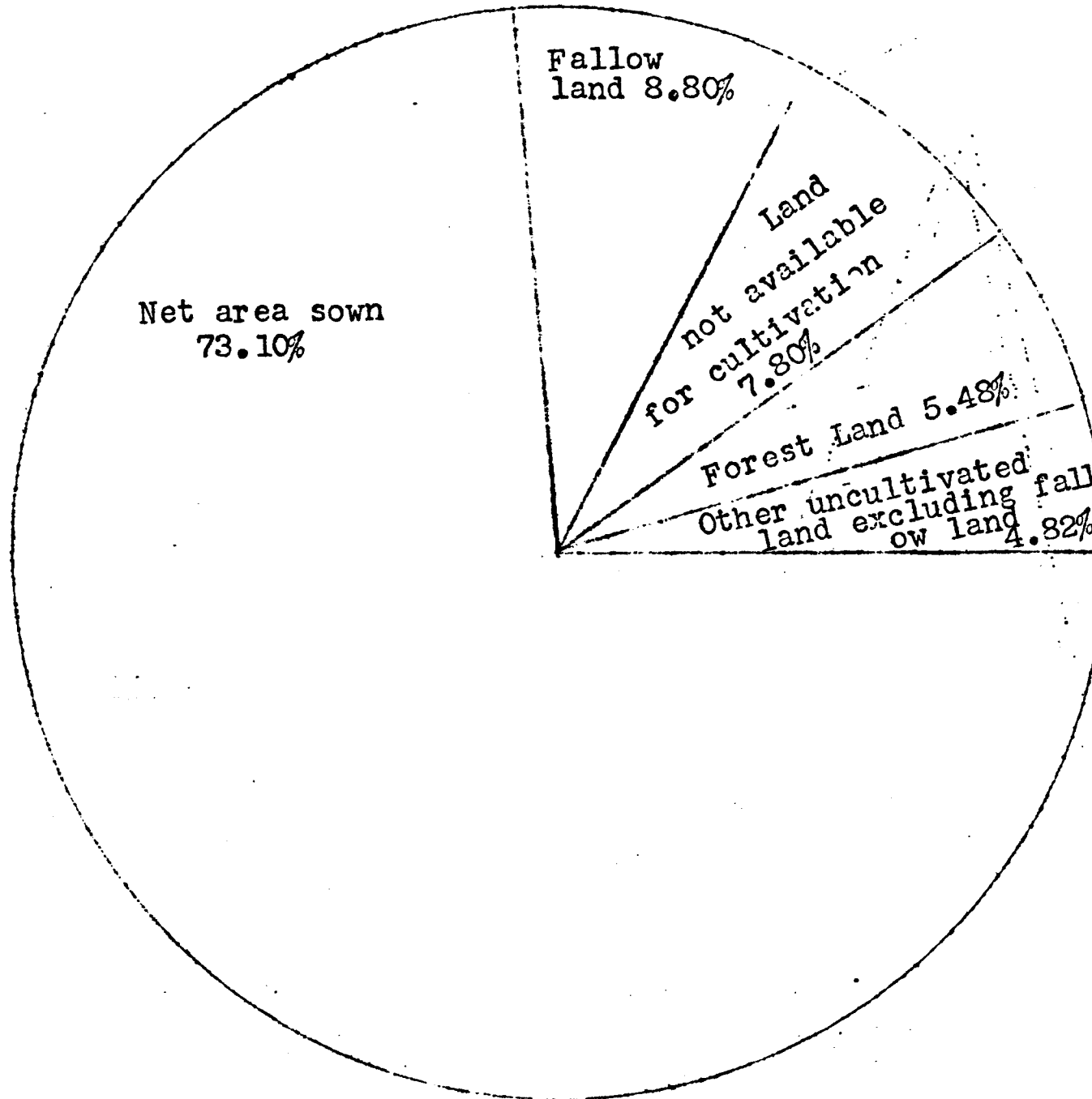
4.34 Under the scheme of National Malaria Eradication, 94, 278 blood smears were collected and examined. 19336 sterilization operations were performed during this year and 85 loops were inserted. The expenditure on this scheme was Rs.23.99 lakhs 5158 leprosy cases were handled and expdr. of Rs.1.31 lakhs was incurred on this scheme. The expenditure incurred on small pox eradication programme was - Rs.3.70 lakhs during the year 75-76. Under the scheme of scholarships to B.C. students in post S.S.C. courses, Rs.9.66 lakhs were spent on 1127 students.

OTHER PROGRAMME :

4.35 Under the scheme of Multi crop Demonstration Rs.3488/- were spent for 8 demonstration.

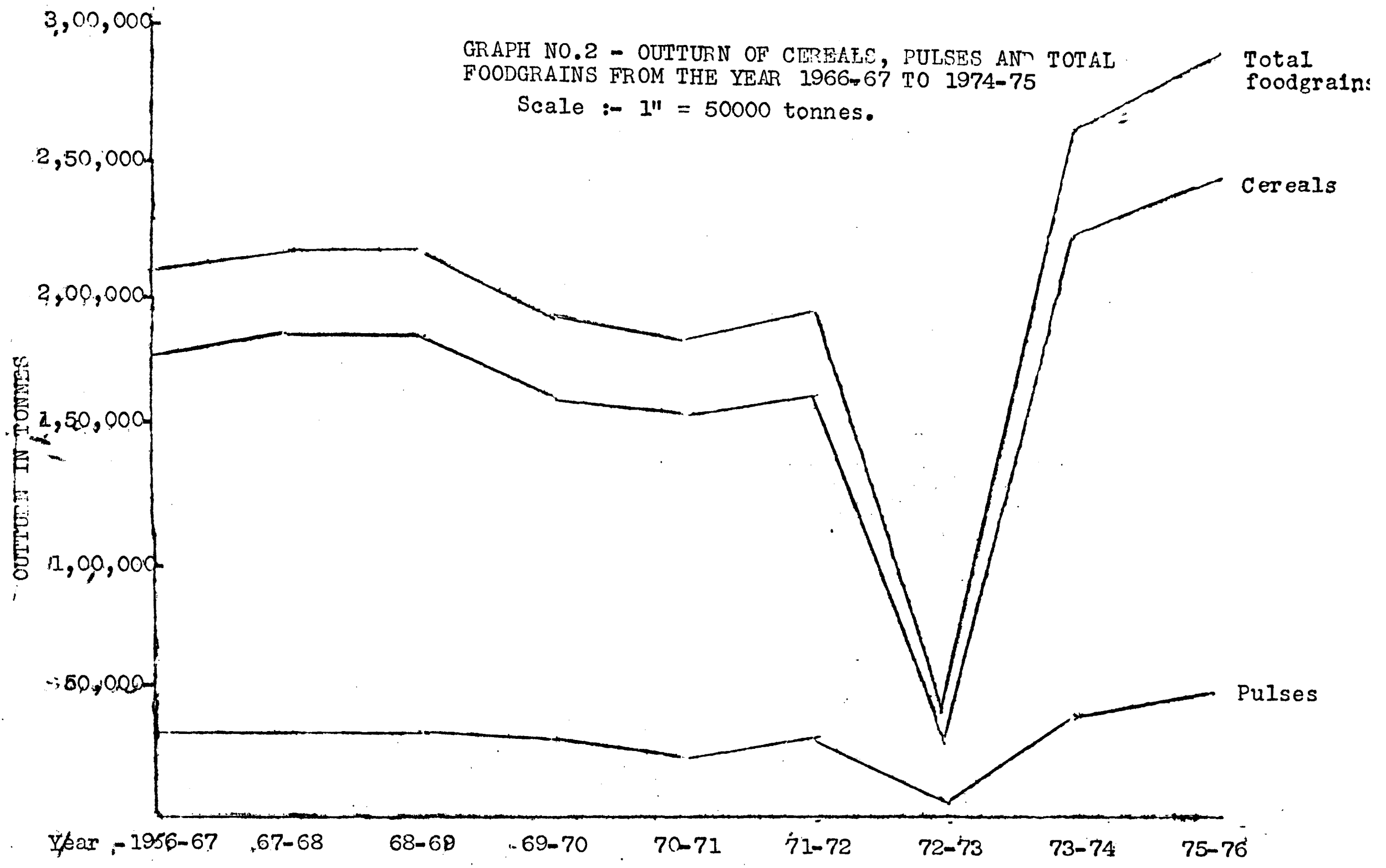

1974-75



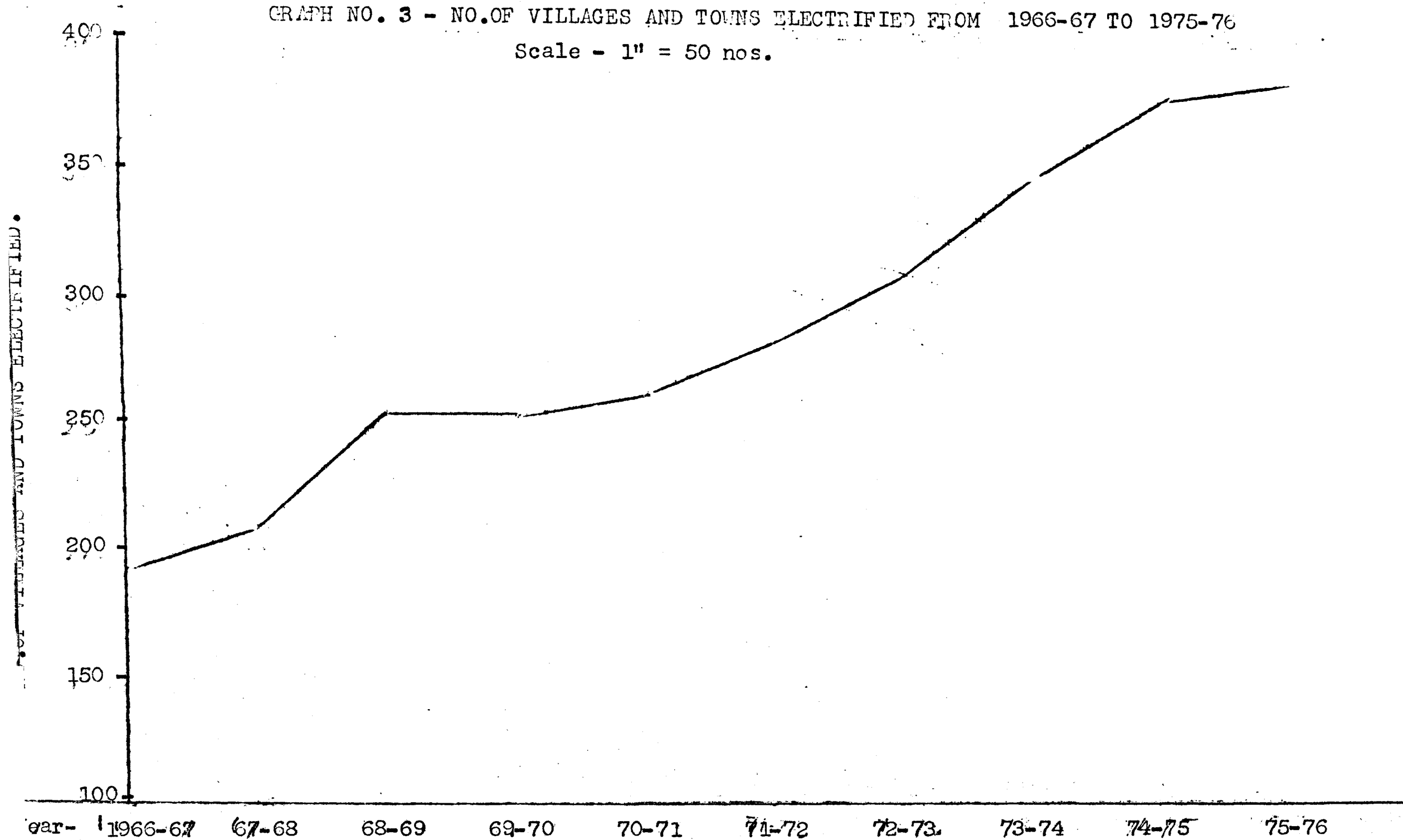

Scale :- 1" = 50000 tonnes.



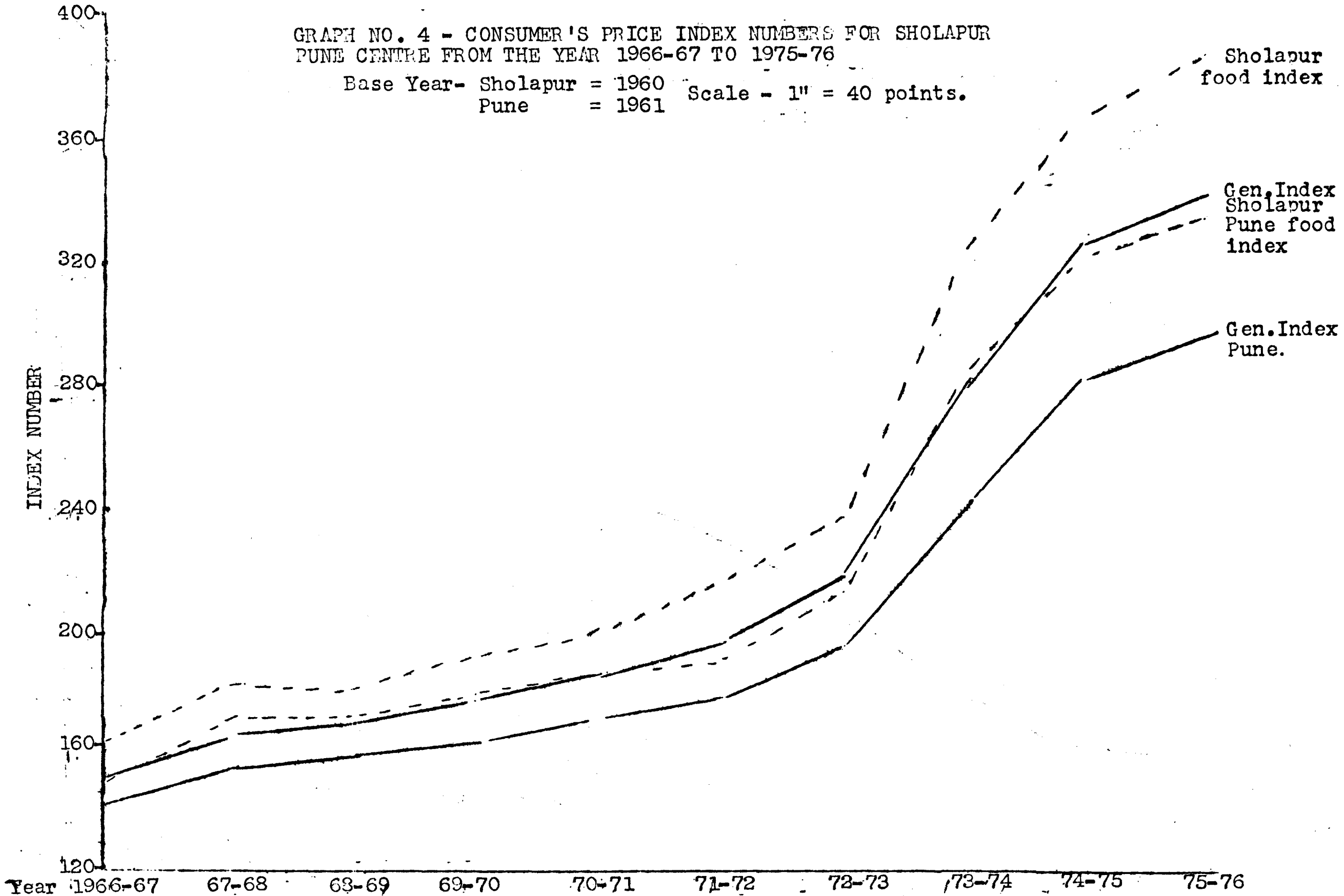
GRAPH NO. 3 - NO. OF VILLAGES AND TOWNS ELECTRIFIED FROM 1966-67 TO 1975-76
