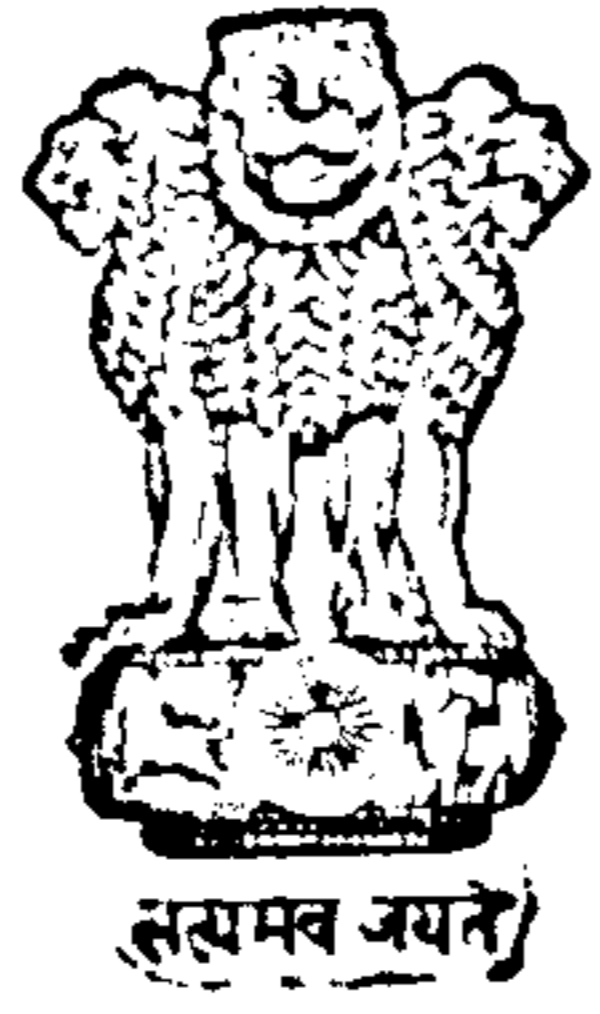

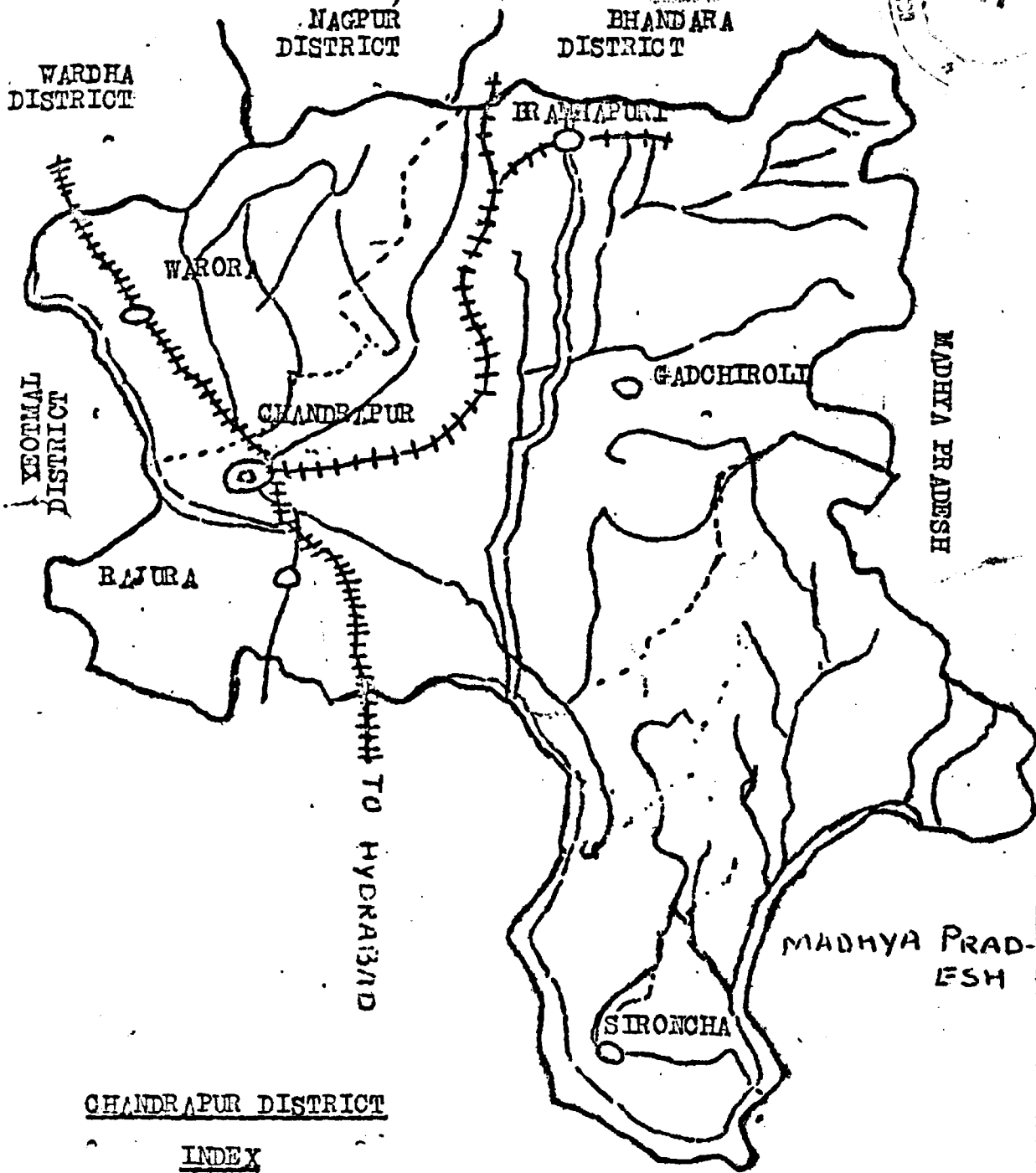

CHAPTER - I.

I. Introduction :

1.1 Brief History & Location :

Chandrapur district forming part of the kingdom of Raghuji Bhonsale was finally Annexed by the East India Company in 1854. The Bhonsale dynasty had acquired the district from the Gond Kings and ruled the territory from 1751 to 1853 when Raghuji Bhonsale died heirless in 1853 and Nagpur district was created for administrative purposes by the Company. Prior to the reign of Bhonsale dynasty, the district was under the rule of the Gond King from about 1240 to 1751. The Gond King Ballarshah founded the Chanda Fort. The early history of Chandrapur district, prior to the rule of Gond Kings, has to be pieced together from different inscriptions found in the district. The Gond King occupied this territory from Mana Kings of Wairagarh. Earlier to Manas, Budhist King known as Kosala Kings were ruling over this part whose capital according to one source was at Chanda and from other source was at Bhadravati and Wairagarh. However, it is in connection with Kosalas that we arrive at the first authentic historical record in the history about the district. Hsiun Tsiang, the Chinese pilgrim records that he visited the capital of Kosalas in 639 A.D. It is also conjectured that a strong kingdom rules in the ~~and Bhadravati with flourishing~~

early days at Bhadravati with flourishing civilisation existing there.

Chandrapur district lies in Godavari basin and was formed as an independent district in 1854. Upto 1874 the district comprised only of the three tahsils of Mul, Warora and Bramhapuri. In 1874 upper Godavari district of Madras was abolished and four talukas were adjoined to Chandrapur district to form one tahsil with Sironcha as its headquarters. The Zamindari estates from Bramhapuri and Chandrapur were merged into new tahsil with headquarters at Gadchiroli. In 1907, three tahsils of Cherala, Albaka and Nagpur were transferred to Madras State.

In 1956 with the reorganisation of States, the district was transferred from former Madhya Pradesh to bilingual Bombay State. At present district is a part of Nagpur Division of Maharashtra State since 1st May 1960.

In March 1959, Rajura tahsil of Nanded district was transferred to Chandrapur district and was notified as an independent district and division under the Collector, Chandrapur and the Commissioner, Nagpur Division, Nagpur respectively. Now Rajura has become a tahsil of Chandrapur district and its connection with the Aurangabad Division is completely revoked.

The district with a population comprising of the Marathas, Telugu and Gonds is

of peculiar interest from linguistic and anthropological point of view. It has also many other claims to distinction. In mineral wealth it is remarkably rich, as it possesses vast Forests and its area under Govt: Forests is bigger than the entire area of a few other districts in Maharashtra.

Its system of Agriculture is usually varying and in some respect, unique in the Division. The system of irrigation is very extensive and its sporting possibilities, though no longer what they were in the past, are still unsurpassed in few Parts of the country.

The district lies between 18.41' and 20.50' north latitude and 78-48' and 80.55' east longitude.

1.2 Boundaries:

Chandrapur district is bounded by Wardha, Nagpur and Bhandara districts on the north, Madhya Pradesh on the East Andhra Pradesh on the South and South-West: Yavatmal and Wardha districts towards the West and North-West. The whole of the western and Southern border is uninterruptedly bounded by the Wardha, the Pranhita and the Godawari Rivers. The Indravati river flows along south east boundary of the district.

The Wainganga river cuts the district into two halves. The eastern portion comprises, of Sironcha and Gadchiroli Talukas, which are

in term of area, two largest talukas, in the State, occupying together 59.1% of the total area of the total area of the district. The Western portion consists of four talukas viz: Bramhapuri, Chandrapur, Warora and Rajura and accounts for the remaining 40.9% of the area occupied by the district.

1.3 Area :

The district occupies a total area of 25,641 Sq.Kms. or 10088.3 Sq. Miles having 3373 villages (2840 inhabited and 533 uninhabited), 7 towns distributed amongst six talukas or Revenue sub-Divisions with population of 16,40,137 persons with density of 64 persons per Sq. Km.

The length at the northern extremity from East to West is about 192 Kms, while the length from Southern point to the Northern base is about 240 Kms. In term of area the district is biggest in the whole of Maharashtra State and second biggest in India as stands next to Bastar district of Madhya Pradesh. The population according to 1971 Census and percentages of area and population of each taluka are represented in table below:-

1.4 Topography :

The district is broader on the North and gradually tapers down towards the south. Topographically the district can be divided into the following four zones.

(i) The plain fertile region in the West in the Wardha valley with its rich black soil and moderate rainfall with Cotton, Jowar and Wheat as the main crops cover half of Warora and Chandrapur talukas and whole of Rajura taluka.

(ii) The Western upland hilly region lies between Wardha and Chandrapur talukas and a major part of Bramhapuri taluka. It has sandy soil and sufficient rainfall. Rice and Jowar are the main crops. Numerous hills have facilitated the construction of irrigation tanks in this zone.

(iii) The Wainganga basin comprises of the eastern parts of Bramhapuri and Chandrapur Taluka and Western part of Gadchiroli taluka. It has a fertile black soil with sufficient rainfall, Rice being a main crop.

(iv) The eastern upland comprises of major part of Gadchiroli taluka and whole of Sironcha talukas. It has a hilly area with thick forests, heavy rainfall and large tribal population, Rice being the main crop. It covers nearly half of the total area of the district.

1.5 Hills, Rivers and Soil:

The whole of eastern portion of the district and the southern portion all along the eastern border is hilly and forms part of the eastern upland natural zone. The important hill ranges lie in the south. They are mainly Tipagarh Range, the Sironcha range near Sironcha, the Gadulgatta hills and the Surjagarh hills. To the south-west of Surgagarh hills beyond Indrawati river lies the famous Bhamagarh hills which overlook confluence of three mountain rivers and noted as unrivalled beauty spot in the district.

The Tipagarh range rises to an elevation of 609 metres and Sirkonda range is 548 metres above sea level. The other hill ranges in Sironcha taluka attain a height of 609 to 914 metres. The highest peak in the district is in the Gadulgatta ranges i.e. 967 metres.

The Western upland comprises of the main ranges of Chimur and Mul hills. They are of little height while serve as watersheds of the Wardha and the Wainganga rivers. The Chimur hills commence east of Chimur in the north of Warora taluka and stretch southwards with breaks from north to south with an average elevation of 137 metres above the surrounding plain. The range is 32 Kilometres in length and 9.6 kilometres in breadth. The highest peak is of 409 metres.

The Mul hills run east and parallel to Chimur hills and form a boundary between Warora and Bramhapuri Tahsils.

The general height of the plain country in district is about 274 metres above sea level in the north falling to 200 metres at Chanda and 649.6 metres at Sironcha.

The main rivers of the district are the Wainganga, the Wardha, the Pranhita, the Indravati and the Godavari. During its course in the south easternly direction, the Wardha river receives the Wainganga at Village Seoni on the right bank and the Frai on the left. After the confluence with the Wainganga, the combined stream is known as the Pranhita. The Pranhita join & the Godavari near Sironcha. The Indravati flows into the Godavari along the south east boundary of the district.

The Wainganga enters the district near the centre of the northern boundary and slices

the district into two unequal parts. The Wainganga is the recipient of numerous tributaries on either banks and ultimately receives the drainage of the entire central portion of the district. The main rivers flowing from north to south are the Kathani and the Potphodi meeting from the left and the Andhari on the right.

The Wardha, the Pranhita and the Godavari are the perennial rivers of the district.

The soil of the district falls into clearly defined tracts and each of these tracts display cropping pattern of wholly different kind.

The most fertile tracts are found in the Wardha and the Wainganga valleys. The varieties of soil in the district are numerous and are known by many local names which could be grouped under the representative classes viz: Kali, Kanhar, Barsi-Kanhar, Morand, Khurdi, Wardi, Retari or Bardi, Pandhari and Kacchar which is found in Sironcha Taluka along the banks of Godavari. The soil of the district falls into different kinds from that of its immediate neighbours.

On the extreme west, on the left bank of the Wardha and the Godavari, there is a broad strip of black soil known as Kali which is retentive of moisture and suitable for Cotton, Wheat, Gram, Jowar and linseed. Further in the interior but immediately adjoining this open tract there is a range of small hills with poor soil at their feet

and in the intervening strips. This soil is of little use without irrigation.

It is an ideal soil for Rice and Sugarcane. Further eastwards and on the either bank of river Wainganga the black loam reappears and is accompanied by few Rice growing villages.

Towards the east of Wainganga valley, the soil becomes poor and hills are abundant. Rice is the staple crop of this tract.

1.6 Climate, Temperature and Rainfall :

Chandrapur District is considered to be one of the hottest district of Maharashtra. Chandrapur district head quarter is slightly hot than Nagpur city. The highest temperature on record is 48.4 degrees centigrades on 18 th May 1897. The nights are uncomfortable in the months of May and June which are considered to be the hottest months of the year. The immense heat combined with high percentage of humidity due to the large forests in the district makes the climate uncomfortable. The nights are cool upto end of April. Winter is equally severe. The lowest temperature on record is 2.8 degrees centigrades as recorded on 10 th January, 1899.

Generally, May is the hottest month of the year. The temperature recording is done at Chandrapur, Bramhapuri and Sironcha. The highest temperature recorded during the year 1975 at all these three centres was 43.80 centigrades.

The minimum temperature recorded during 1975 at these three centres was 9.8°, and 10.5° and 11.6° respectively. Winter is more severe in December,

The South Western Monsoons are the Chief source of rain in the district which is divided into three rainfall zones viz :-

(1) The eastern zone comprising of Gadchiroli, Sironcha and Bramhapuri talukas having heavy and assured rainfall, the mean rainfall being about 1524 millimetres or 60 inches.

(2) The central zone comprising of Chandrapur and Rajura talukas with sufficient rains having normal rainfall 1302 millimetres or 50 inches.

(3) The Western zone comprising of Warora taluka having moderate rain fall with normal rainfall 1143 millimetres or 45 inches.

The monthwise rainfall in six centres of taluka headquarters is indicated in Table No. 8. The rainfall during the year 1975 was higher in all the six talukas of the district as compared to the year 1974.

1.7 The Development of the District :

The district is well known for its vastness, rich forest and mineral wealth. Though the Chandrapur district is endowed with rich soil, water and mineral resources, favourable climate, adequate manpower and low density population it is paradoxically a backward area with low income and high unemployment. This calls for immediate

measures to harness the resources of the district and optimise their use. Much efforts are being made in recent era of planning in this district. Some special plans are especially prepared for all out development of the district.

1. Total Eco-System Development Plan for Chandrapur.

The Govt: in Planning Department have set-up- Four Task Forces to examine the various aspects of the comprehensive Development Plan for Chandrapur district for exploitation of the vast resources in the district.

The Four Task Forces set up for are :-

- (i) Task Force on Mining and Mineral based industries.
- (ii) Task Force on Forest based industries.
- (iii) Task Force on Agro-Cattle, Fisheries based industries.
- (iv) Task Force on Infrastructure.

The Task Forces analyse SWOT- (Strength, Weakness, Opportunities and Treats) pertaining to the concerned sectors and proposed appropriate development projects in the context of the existing and untapped resources of the sectors concerned.

2. Integrated Rural Development for Chandrapur - District :-

A working group set up in May 1976 by the Department of Rural Development Govt: of India selected Chandrapur district from Maharashtra

State for setting up Integrated Rural Development (IRD) Project on the criteria fixed for selecting the districts. The task of preparing a portfolio of action plan was assigned to the Panjabrao Krishi Vidyapeeth, Akola. Action plan was thus prepared by the Panjabrao Krishi Vidyapeeth Akola and I.R.D. Project for Chandrapur district is completed for implementing the schemes.

3. Small Farmers Development Agency (SFDA) :

Under Panchayati Raj Yojana this district was taken up for implementation of IADP- Integrated Area Development Project. Bramhapuri and Nagbhid Panchayat Samiti areas were selected for implementation of the schemes under I.A.D.P. Besides, this district is entrusted with S.F.D.A. Project during 1976-77. Sixteen blocks are being covered under S.F.D.A. Project for implementation of the schemes benefitting the small holders.

4. Integrated Tribal Development Projects:- (ITDPs) :

Concentration of Tribals being more in this district Govt. has identified the Adiwasi areas in Chandrapur district covering 2129 villages from Sironcha, Gadchiroli and Rajura Talukas under Tribal Sub-Plan and from Chandrapur, Bramhapuri and Warora talukas under Additional Tribal Sub-plan Area.

Government has asked to prepare a detailed " Integrated Tribal Development Project Reports " for Tribal Sub-plan Areas. Three I.T.D. Projects viz: (1) Sironcha - covering 650 villages of Sironcha taluka i.e. whole of Sironcha Taluka, (2) Gadchiroli - covering 743 villages of Gadchiroli taluka and (3) Rajura - covering 181 villages of Rajura Taluka have been formulated in the distt. Three Project officers one each for Sironcha, Gadchiroli and Rajura I.T.D.Ps. are posted in these three Project areas for implementing the schemes and development of these Tribal areas and Adivasis.

(Explanatory notes on the scope and limitations of the Statistical Data presented in the part - II of District Statistical Abstract.).

I. Purpose :- The abstract part of this publication gives exhaustive statistical data on important Socio-Economic indicators of development. Tables on almost all important topics are presented in this part, so that the publication could serve as a reference book. Talukawise data have been displayed as far as possible for inter taluka comparison. It has been further decided to display Panchayat Samitiwise data, wherever possible, in the tables of abstract. In most of the tables data for 1975-76 have been indicated while for few tables comparative data for 1974-75 and 1975-76 or even for earlier years are given. In the tables wherein data for 1975-76 could not be presented the same for the latest years, for which that was available have been shown. In case of population 1971 and Livestock 1972, the data for latest census have been presented. All the data are collected from the State & Central Government Offices, Local Bodies, and other relevant agencies. The footnotes below each table indicate the source from which the data have been collected.

II. District at a Glance :- This table presents a birds eye-view of the Socio-Economic Indicators of development in Chandrapur district and Maharashtra State under different heads, such

as area, population, agriculture, animal husbandry, education, transport and communication plan and C.D. Programme, Local Bodies and other miscellaneous statistics. Reference year of the data is also indicated in the table.

III. Concepts, Scope and Limitations :

The Statistical tables presented in the District Statistical Abstract are grouped into 13 parts. The concepts of the tables and the scope and limitations of the data presented under each group are explained below :

1. Area and Population :

In all 7 Tables i.e. Table No.1 to 7 are included in this section. Data for 1971 population census for the district as a whole as made available from the Primary Census Abstract of 1971 is given in all the tables. Reference period of 1971 population census was sunrise of 1st July 71.

The Table 1 indicates area in Sq.Km; population density per sq.km; number of inhabited and uninhabited villages, number of towns, number of occupied residential houses, number of households and sexwise population as per 1971 census for the rural and urban areas for the district as a whole. The area of the district as supplied by the Surveyor General of India is less than the area of 1961 census and is therefore, to be treated as provisional.

Table No.2 shows decadal variation in population of the district since 1951.

Table No.3 gives classification of inhabited villages according to different population ranges. The term village (i.e. rural area) used in the table denote a statutory recognised village having a well defined boundary and separate land records. Hamlets, Wadis or Padas have, therefore, not been shown separately as villages. On the other hand statutory recognised villages having no population have been shown separately as "Uninhabited" villages. Villages also include forest villages comprising mostly of forest labourers and their families. Total population of the villages in each range is also indicated in the table.

Table No.4 gives classification of towns and urban area according to different population ranges. Total population of the towns and urban area in each range is also indicated.

For any place to be recognised as an urban area.(town) for the 1971 Census, it was to have a municipal corporation or an area under a municipal council or a contonment or a civil line. If it did not have any of these urban local bodies to administer its affairs, the following emperical tests were applied, (a) a minimum population of 5,000 (estimated for 1971); (b) a density of not less than 400 per Km² (1,000 per sq.Mile); (c) 75 percent of the male working population pursuing occupations fallowing out side agriculture; (d) the place should have according to the Director of Census Operations of the State, a few pronounced urban Characteristics and amenities.

The towns having municipalities are suffixed with letter " M " whereas the urban areas without municipalities are not suffixed with any letter.

Table No.5 gives number of workers classified in to 9 categories alongwith total number of non-workers.

Table No.6 gives distribution of population according to (A) Age Groups and (B) Religion separately for Rural and Urban areas, and for the district as a whole as per 1971 census.

Table No.7 gives scheduled castes and scheduled Tribes population in rural and urban areas in the district according to 1971 census.

2. Climate:

Only two tables are included in this section pertaining to rainfall and temperature at the selected centres in Chandrapur district.

The table No.8 gives monthly rainfall and number of rainy days in each month at the selected centres for the year 1975. The data is collected through Revenue Agency. A day is treated as "Rainy day" if during the 24 hours the rain gauge recorded a minimum of 2.5 M.M.of rainfall. Annual rainfall for each centre is also indicated in the table. "Normal rainfall" is the average rainfall over a period of 10 years.

Table No.9 gives monthwise "Maximum" and "Minimum" and also annual temperature as recorded at selected centres for the year 1975. The data

is supplied by the Government of India's Regional-Meteorological Centre Nagpur. The maximum and minimum temperature is recorded daily during the month at selected centres.

3. Agriculture :

In all 14 Tables i.e. Table No.10 to 23 are included in this section.

Table No.10 indicates talukawise figures of land utilisation under the standard heads of land uses for the year 1973-74 and 1974-75. Against each taluka the break-up of the total geographical area according to different types of land uses is shown. Major constituents of the Geographical area are Forests, are not available for cultivation i.e. land put to non-agricultural uses, Barren and uncultivable land i.e. cultivable waste land, Other uncultivated land excluding fallow permanent pastures and other grazing lands, lands under miscellaneous tree crops etc; not included in area sown; Fallow land i.e. current fallows other fallows and lastly net area sown, area under 'Forest' included all actual forest areas of lands classed or administered as forests under any legal enactment dealing with forests whether State owned or private. If any portion of such land is not actually wooded but put to some agricultural use, that portion is included under the appropriate heading of cultivated or uncultivated land as the case may be - 'Land put to non-agricultural uses stands for all land occupied by buildings, roads and

railways or under water e.g. rivers and canals and other land put to uses other than agriculture.

"Barren and unculturable land" covers all barren and unculturable land like mountains, deserts etc;

Land which can not be brought under cultivation unless at a high cost is classified as 'Barren and unculturable land' whether such land is in isolated blocks or within cultivated holdings. 'Culturable waste' includes all land available for cultivation whether not taken up for cultivation or taken up for cultivation once, but not cultivated during the current year and last five years and more in succession.

Such lands may be either fallow or covered with shrubs and jungles which are not put to any use.

They may be assessed or not assessed and may lie in isolated blocks or within cultivated holdings.

Permanent pastures and other grazing lands cover all grazing lands whether they are permanent pastures and meadows or not. Village Common and grazing lands within forest areas are included under this head.

'Land under miscellaneous tree crops etc, not included in the net area sown' includes all cultivable land, which is not included under net area sown, but is put to some agricultural use. Land under casuarina trees, thatching grass, bamboo bushes and other for fuel etc; which are not included under 'Orchards' are classed under this category. Current fallow comprises of cropped areas, which are kept fallow during the current year. 'Other fallow' land includes all lands which were taken up for cultivation, but are temporarily

out of cultivation for a period of not less than one year and not more than five years. The 'Net area sown' consists of net area sown with crops and orchards. Area sown more than once being counted only once. The 'Gross cropped area' represents the sum total of area under all crops. The difference between the total gross cropped area and net area sown is accounted for by the area sown more than once during the same year with the same or different crops.

The table No. 12 gives yield per hectare and outturn in hundred metric tonnes for important crops for the years 1973-84 and 1974-75. The yield rates and outturn for 1974-75 are worked out on the revised forecast. The production of sugarcane is in terms of Gur while cotton production is in term of bales of 180 Kgs. each.

The Table No. 16 is a new table included in the abstract during 1975-76. Data about availability of under ground water in the district is presented in this table. Table No. 17 gives the information about Minor Irrigation while Table No. 18 gives the information on Major and Medium Irrigation Projects in this district. Both completed and incomplete Projects have been covered in this table. Position in this table is as it was on 30 th June 1975. The cost of Medium projects ranges between Rs. 20 Lakhs to 5 Crores, whereas that of a Major irrigation project, it is Rs. 5/- crores and above.

The table no. 19 deals with monthly agricultural wage rates in 1975. This data is collected fortnightly throughout the year from three selected rural centres viz: (1) Sindewahi (2) Mul and (3) Kothari in the district.

The Table No.20 is a new table included in the abstract which give information about operational holdings as per Agricultural Census, 1970.

The Table 21 provides livestock data as per livestock Census, 1972. Table No.22 provides famine and scarcity data in each taluka during 1975-76 and Table No.23 provides the history of famine and scarcity areas under Revenue circles in each taluka giving the no.of villages affected during the years 1970-71 to 1975-76. The data in table No.23 is related to Agriculture year while data in table No.22 is for financial year. Hence villages affected as given in Table No.22 will not tally with table No. 23.

4. Animal Husbandry :-

In all six tables i.e. Table No.24 to 29 are included in this section. Table No.24 to 27 provides Panchayat Samitiwise data.

Table No.24 gives number of various types of livestock and Poultry as enumerated in the district in the livestock Census, 1972. Table No.25 provides veterinary statistics during 1975-76. Table No.26 gives information about livestock mortality diseasewise during 1975-76 while Table

No.27 gives information about No. of slaughter houses and no. of animals slaughtered during 1975-76.

Table No.28(A) gives details of area in different types of Forests during the year 1975-76. Data regarding Forests under the control of of State Governments Forest Department and those under the control of State Government's Revenue Department are shown separately. The areas under forests are classified according to legal Status. refers reserved, Protected and unclassified forests. The legal status refers to the classification of Forests under the Indian Forest Act XVI of 1927. Reserved Forests are those that are intended mainly for timber production, wherein the rights of grazing and cultivation are seldom allowed.

In protected forests, the restrictions are not so rigid. Right of grazing or cultivation is allowed, but certain limitations and restrictions are imposed. The unclassified forest refer to the inaccessible forest or unaccounted waste. The forests which are taken by Govt: from local bodies or private individuals for management on lease basis are called leased Forests. There is no classification of Ex-Proprietary Forests as such but in Nagpur Division some private lands containing valuable forests are taken over by Govt: under section 29 of the Indian Forests Act, which are not yet classified as per tripartite classifications and they are termed as ex-proprietary. The Forest area shown in Table No.28(A) may not tally with the area

under forest shown in Table No.10. The two sets of figures differ due to the following reasons.

(i) In the Indian Forest Statistical Returns, the whole area including non-wooden area under control of the Forest Deptt: is taken as area under forest while in agricultural statistics, it is classified according to its actual utilisation.

(ii) The Forest Department returns are meant to serve a definite administrative purpose to indicate the ownership of the forest areas and the actual utilisation of these areas is not so important from the point of view of Forest Deptt: as it is in the land utilisation statistics under agriculture.

(iii) The Forest Deptt: returns relate to financial year while the Agricultural Statistics relate to the agricultural year.

Table No.29 (A) in this section gives information related to Inland Fisheries. This is a new table included in the abstract and provides information about fish production.

5. Employment, Industry, Mining & Electricity :

In all 10 Tables i.e. Table No.30 to 39 are included in this section.

The Factory statistics shown in Table No.30, 31 & 32 cover following types of factories registered under the Factories Act, 1948 :-

(1) Those employing ten or more workers working with the aid of power (Section 2(i)).

(2) Those employing twenty or more workers and working without the aid of Power (Section 2 (ii) and

(3) Those registered under section 85 of the Act, under which the State Government makes applicable the Provision of the Act, even though the above conditions are not fulfilled.

Table No.33 provides information based on Annual Survey of Industries, Table No.35 gives occupational distribution of total registrations and placements in the Employment Exchange for the year 1975-76 and according to Standard National-classification.

Table No.36 is New Table included in the abstract. This table provides works undertaken in Employment Guarantee Scheme during 1975-76.

6. Co-operation :

In all 8 Tables i.e. Table No.40 to 47 are included in this section.

Table No.42 gives Panchayat Samiti-wise number of Primary Agricultural Credit Societies, their membership, share capital, Reserve and other funds, working capital, Loans advanced and recovered, Loans outstanding and overdue and Percentage of recovery to total loan advanced for the year 1975-76. 'Working Capital' includes paid up share capital, deposits and borrowings. Loans outstanding include outstanding in respect of loans, Cash Credits and overdrafts and the amount of outstanding bills purchased or discounted. 'Overdues' referred to

amount of loan or instalments which were due for collection but which were not actually collected and for the repayment of which no extension has been granted by a competent authority.

The Table No.47 gives Panchayat-Samitiwise number of Registered Money lenders and loans advanced by them during 1975-76. The separate figures of loans advanced to traders and Non-Traders have been furnished in the table. The transactions of money lending in the State are regulated under the provision of Bombay Money lenders Act. The information for loans advanced to traders and Non-traders relates to those money lenders who have submitted the returns.

7. Medical and Public Health :

In all 5 Tables i.e. No.48 to 52 are included in this section.

Table No.48 given in this section indicates Panchayat Samitiwise number of hospitals, dispensaries, maternity centres, and P.H.Cs; doctors, Nurses, Vaidyas, beds and total no. of indoor and outdoor Patients treated for the year 1975. The table covers all the State and Central Govt: medical institutions, and also institutions owned by municipalities and local bodies engaged in providing medical facilities. Private clinics run by private bodies or individuals are however, not included in this table.

The table No. 49 provides Vital Statistics about number of registered births and deaths in the district during 1975. Table No.52 relates to Family Planning Programme for the year 1975-76 in this district.

8. Education :

In all 7 tables i.e. Table No.53 to 59 are included in this section. Table No.53 gives sexwise number of literates and percentage of Literacy separately for rural and urban areas and for males and females. As per 1971 Census definition, a person was classified, as a literate if he was able to read or write a simple letter in any language. Educational level in rural and urban areas is shown in Table No.54 and 55 separately according to 1961 census as this data for 1971 census is not yet available.

Table No.56 gives information regarding no. of educational institutions according to types for the year 1974-75 and 1975-76 (Provisional). Sex-wise enrolment and no. of trained and untrained teachers in these institutions is also included in this table. The classification of institutions according to type is slightly different from stage of education. There are at present many secondary schools, which also impart education in Primary course. Nevertheless, the entire enrolment of students is included under 'Secondary Education'.

Primary institutions provide education for standard

I to IV or standard I to VII/VIII or less and teach the curriculum approved by the Education Deptt. The secondary institutions coach the students for standard VIII to X/XI with or without lower standards. Higher Education is education after passing secondary school certificate examination, which leads to a Degree examination.

The Table No.57 presents data on the no. of beneficiaries amongst backward classes such as S.C./S.T. and other Backward Classes for the year 1974-75 and 1975-76. Beneficiaries for this table are persons who are getting educational concessions of either type such as scholarships, freeships etc;

9. Transport and Communications :-

In all 7 Tables i.e. Table No.60 to 66 are included in this section.

Table No.60 gives total railway length as at the end of March 1976 according to type of routes - Broad Gauge, Meter Gauge and Narrow Gauge. The Railway length is measured between the first and the last stations within the district boundary. The figures of length of each type of route are, therefore approximate and not accurate.

The Table No.63 deals with operational statistics of Nationalised Road, Transport in Chandrapur S.T. Division.

The table No.64 presents the results of the traffic census on important roads conducted by Building and Communication Deptt., Govt. of Maharashtra. Data of the number of vehicles is

according to categories and location of count-post. Type of surface and total traffic intensity in tons per 24 hours are also indicated in the Tables.

10. Local Bodies :

In all 4 Tables i.e. Table No.67 to 70 are included in this section.

The Table No.67 gives abstract of income and Expenditure of local bodies such as village Panchayats, Zilla Parishads and Municipal Councils for the financial years 1965-66 and 1968-69 to 1975-76. The number of village Panchayats includes number of individual village Panchayats as well as group village Panchayats.

11. Plan & Community Development :

In all 5 Tables i.e. Table No.71 to 75 are included in this section.

The table No.71 gives total expenditure during Fourth Five Year Plan and during 1974-75 & 1975-76. Similarly Table No.72 provides important physical achievements during Fourth Five Year Plan and for the year 1974-75 & 1975-76.

12. Prices :

In all 3 Tables viz: Table No.76 to 78 are included in this section.

Table No.76 gives month and sport wholesale Prices of the important agricultural commodities for the year 1975 for each of the regulated markets.

Table No.77 gives monthly average retail Prices of various commodities at District head quarters i.e. Chandrapur. The average prices under each commodity are shown from the month of January to December for the year 1975 alongwith units and varieties of Commodities for which prices have been quoted. The data is regularly collected on every Friday by visit to selected shops. As the information collected for the given commodities is restricted to only one quotation and that too only for one shop at District Head quarters, the average price for individual Commodity cannot be said to be fully representative, but the data may prove useful as a broad indicator of the trend in changes in retail prices over the period of time.

Table No.78 gives consumer Price Index Numbers (Revised series) for working class of Nagpur Centre published by the Office of the Commissioner of Labour, Bombay. Monthwise data for the year 1975-76 commencing from April and also average for the year 1975-76 have been given in this table. The base year for calculating Price Index (Revised Series) is 1960. The Index Number of Wholesale Prices are issued by the Economic Advisor to the Govt: of India. The base year for the same is 1952-53. The method of construction of the index is given in the Appendix to Index Numbers of wholesale prices in India Revised Series (1956) issued by the Office of the Economic Advisor Govt: of India.

The equivalent of old Index Numbers can be obtained by multiplying the next index by 5.22 as multiplier.

13. Miscellaneous:

In all 12 Tables viz: Table No. 79 to 90 are included in this section.

Table No.82 gives Panchayat Samitiwise cinema statistics for the year 1975-76. Number of Permanent, Semi-permanent and Touring talkies and the seating capacity per show has been indicated in this table.

Table No.84 is a New Table included in this abstract which provides data on no. of banking Offices, deposits and advance in the district as on 31 st December, 1974.

Table No.90 provides Trends in selected indicators for 1950-51, 1960-61, 1966-67 & 1970-71 and 1973-74, 1974-75 & 1975-76 about level of development in Chandrapur district.

CHAPTER - III.Important Indicators of Development .

In this chapter an attempt has been made to present certain important indicators of Development by presenting certain selected trends to indicate the impact of development and the disparity, if any, between talukas. The Indicators worked out show the comparative position during the year 1960-61, the year before the commencement of the Third Five year Plan, and the year 1975-76 or 1974-75 in a few cases, where the data for the year 1975-76 is not available.

Indicator No. 1: Percentage of Gross Area sown to
Net Area Sown:

The proportion of gross area sown to net area sown indicates the extent of area sown more than once. The double cropping is solely related to availability of irrigation facilities, mainly from tanks and the paddy fields which retain sufficient moisture after monsoon to enable the cultivators to take second crop of Wheat, Gram, Lakh and linseed. The second crop is locally known as "Utera" and sown by broadcasting method including crops like linseed, lakh and other pulses. The district has got a large number of small size tanks which are locally named as "Bodies" but all these tanks are only able to irrigate paddy crop in Kharif season and used as a protective measure. Double irrigated crop is not very much practiced and second crop is generally taken in the irrigated area of

Paddy fields. Comparative percentage of gross area sown to net area sown for the year 1960-61 and 74-75 are given in the following table :

It can be seen from the above table that there is no improvement in taking second crop in a period of fourteen years except in Gadchiroli taluka. The percentage of double cropping appears to be more practiced in all the paddy grown talukas. As Rajura being the non paddy crop area the double cropping appears to be very slightly practiced. The percentage of gross cropped area to net area sown is higher in Bramhapuri and Gadchiroli talukas *than the district average. Though Sironcha Taluka* is mainly the paddy growing tract the double cropping appears to be not practiced in that area. The fact that the cultivators who are mostly tribals do not understand the economical aspect of double cropping.

Indicator No.2 :- Productivity of Important Crops :

Agriculture is the most important activity and amongst the least productive, though it

is the primary occupation of 80 percent of the working population.

The programmes for agricultural development have all along received a high priority. The average annual food grains production from the First Plan period rose from 2.62 lakh Metric Tonnes to 3.18 lakh Metric Tonnes by the end of Third plan period and the same was increased to 3.46 lakh Metric Tonnes upto the year 1970-71. The increase in food production was mainly due to increase in area under improved agricultural practices. A comparative picture for the base year 1960-61 and 1974-75 of some important crops is shown in the following table.

The area of food grains has shown increase i.e. 7.20 percent in the year 1974-75 over the year 1960-61. However the production of rice decreased by 15.78 percent over the year 1960-61. Wheat, Jowar, Gram, Cotton shows increase in production in the year 1974-75 over the year 1960-61 while the production of Tur, Sesamum, linseed declined in the year 1974-75 over the year 1960-61. There is very little scope for extending the crop area in this district. However the area under irrigation can be increased considerably and would significantly increase the production capacity of the land.

Indicator No. 3 :- Gross Value of Agriculture - Products :

Though the district ranks second in whole of Maharashtra in case of percentage of Gross area irrigated to Gross area sown, it stands 22nd in case of Gross value of Agricultural Product per hectare. The data available for the year 1967-68 reveals that the gross value of agricultural product per hectare is Rs. 402 for this district as against Rs. 540 for the State as a whole. The main factor responsible for such poor productivity of land is that a majority of cultivators are small holders having land less than 5 acres, who are unwilling to adopt the methods of improved agricultural practices because of uneconomic holding size.

Indicator No. 4 :- Percentage of Irrigated Area :

The district has high percentage of area under irrigation and stands second in rank in

whole of Maharashtra. The paddy is the main crop of the district and irrigation to this crop is adopted as a protective measure after the monsoon season is over.

High percentage of area under irrigation in the year 1974-75 is found in Bramhapuri (39.86); Gadchiroli (30.14) and Chandrapur (20.64) talukas than the district average (16.63). The table below shows talukawise percentage of net area irrigated to net area cultivated during the years 1960-61 and 1974-75.

It appears from the above table that the percentage of net area irrigated to net area cultivated rose from 15.88 in 1960-61 to 16.63 in 1974-75 in the district as a whole. A significant rise in the percentage of net area irrigated to net area sown is observed in Gadchiroli taluka only. In Sironcha taluka the percentage of net area irrigated to net area decreased from 5.50 in 1960-61

to 5.42 in 1974-75. Percentage decrease may be due to sizeable increase in net area sown whereas the net irrigated area shows slight increase in the year 1974-75 over the year 1960-61.

The Table below shows talukawise percentage of gross irrigated area to net irrigated area during the year 1960-61 and 1974-75.

It is seen from the above table that the practice of taking two successive irrigated crops is not in vogue in major part of this district and hence the percentage of gross irrigated area to net irrigated area is found to be only 103.83 during the year 1974-75. The practice of taking two successive irrigated crops does not appear to be followed in Chandrapur, Gadchiroli, Rajura talukas because the water resources which are available at present are just enough to irrigate any single crop. It is possible to irrigate larger area if the

efficiency of water use is increased. There appears to be considerable scope for reducing the seepage and other losses in carrying water from the reservoir to the fields, as well as by reducing the per hectare consumption of water without affecting yields. The potential benefits by way of increase in the area which can be served by the available water resources could be very substantial and could be worth while for the district to investigate these possibilities.

Indicator No. 5 :- changes in cropping Pattern:

The Chandrapur district mainly grows food crops and has 80.12 percent of the gross cropped area under food crops and remaining 19.88 percent area under non-food crops during the year 1974-75. Among Food crops, Rice occupies 35.64 percent of the total food crop area. Jowar is the second major food crop of the district and accounts for 35.92 percent of the total food crop area during 1974-75. Jowar is sown both in Kharif and Rabi seasons. Pulses are also sown in sizeable proportion accounting for 17.87 percent of the total food crop area in 1974-75. Among non-food crops, oil seeds and cotton occupy 67.20 percent and 30.95 percent respectively of the area under non-food crops during the year 1974-75. The following tables give talukawise food and non-food crops for the years 1960-61 and 1974-75.

It is seen from the above tables that there is a slight change in the cropping pattern of the district and also within talukas since the year 1960-61. An increase in the food cropped area is observed in Bramhapuri taluka in the year 1974-75. A decrease in food cropped area is observed in all other talukas so also in the district in the year 1974-75 over the year 1960-61.

An increase in Rice crop is observed in Chandrapur, Warorda, Bramhapuri and Rajura talukas, while area in Jowar crop increased in Bramhapuri and Gadchiroli talukas in the year

1974-75 over the year 1960-61. There is marked difference in the cropping pattern of eastern and western talukas of the District. The talukas viz:- Bramhapuri, Gadchiroli, Sironcha and Chandrapur have more than 83 percent of the gross cropped area under food crops while in Rajura (62.15) and Waroda (67.77) which is less than the district average (80.12). The fact that Waroda and Rajura talukas are the rain shadow areas where cotton and oilseeds crops are the major non-food crops which cover sizeable area. It is also observed that within talukas the changes from food crops to non-food crops and vice-versa are marginal and mainly depend upon rainfall.

Indicator No. 6 : Increase in Agricultural credits and Outstanding dues.

The Cooperative movement was primarily started to provide easy credit facilities to the cultivators as the inadequacy and high cost of finance are the major obstacles in the way of rapid development of agriculture. To meet this end, extension of Cooperative Credit to the Village level is made by the District Co-operative Bank through primary agricultural credit societies (Service Cooperatives) which provide short term loans to the cultivators to facilitate them to carry out different agricultural operations with more ease and confidence. The second agency engaged in meeting the agricultural needs of the cultivators is

the Maharashtra Land Development Bank which finances the cultivators directly by granting them long term loan. The total agricultural credit made available to the cultivators by the Service, Co-operatives and the Maharashtra Land Development, Bank together was of the order of Rs. 775.84 lakhs in 1975-76. The Table below indicates the loans advanced by the Primary Agril: Credit societies and outstanding dues during the years 1961-62 and 1975-76.

The Primary Agril: Credit societies had advanced loan to their members to the tune of Rs.453.26 lakhs in the year 1975-76 showing an increase of 635.81 percent over the year 1961-62. Whereas the amount of loans outstanding in the year 1975-76 was to the tune of Rs. 533.49 lakhs thus, showing an increase of 255.83 percent over the year 1961-62. As the scarcity conditions were prevailing in the consecutive three years from 1971-72 to 1973-74 in this district and the policy of agricultural upliftment was undertaken the loan advanced & amount of loan outstanding show a steep rise.

Indicator No. 7 :- Agricultural Wage Rates:

Agricultural labour is one of the important class of workers. As per 1971 census the percentage of Agricultural labourers to total workers was 35.17. The data on agricultural wage rates are being collected from selected cultivators in the three centres viz: Kothari, Mul and Sindewahi in Chandrapur district. The annual average of wage rates for the years 1964 and 1975 collected from these three centres are shown in the Table below :

It is seen from the above table that agricultural wage rates of male and female workers indicate a noticeable increase at all centres in the year 1975 over the year 1964. The increase in agricultural wage rates in case of male and female agril: workers at Kothari centre is due to the fact that Kothari centre is surrounded by Cash crop area of chillies and cotton cropped and hence the wage rates of male and female workers appear to be higher. While in case of Mul centre

the wage rates of Male workers increased due to growing tendency of the centre towards urbanisation.

Indicator No.8 z; Livestock per hectare of Land:

Animals besides providing most of the draught power required for agricultural operations are an important source of food and raw material. Bovine population comprises of the population of buffaloes and cattle where as ovine population comprises of the population of sheep and goats. The following table gives total livestock (excluding Pigs, horses & Ponies) per hectare of cultivable land in each taluka.

Livestock per hectare of Cultivable land is found to be higher in Sironcha, Gadchiroli, and Bramhapuri talukas than the district average. The reasons for higher ratio are that (1) the talukas viz: Bramhapuri, Gadchiroli and Sironcha are mainly paddy growing tracts where the

requirement of draught animals is generally higher than other tracts and (2) the percentage of cultivable area is comparatively much less because of most of the area is covered with forest.

Indicator No. 9 :- Poultry as compared to population:

Development of poultry is essentially a cottage industry without being linked up with commercial hatcheries, commercial feed industry and organised marketing of poultry products. Much stress has been given in the plan periods in popularising poultry keeping specially in rural areas as an additional source of income and also to bridge over food shortage.

As per 1961 livestock census poultry keeping was flourishing well in Chandrapur district accounting for 319 birds per 100 Households. Per Capita poultry keeping the year 1961 worked out to 0.66. However, poultry in 1972, as per livestock census decreased considerably. The per capita poultry in 1972 was worked out to 0.51. The table below gives talukawise position of poultry per 100 households in 1961 and 1972. The number of households enumerated in 1961 and 1971 censuses have been adopted for working out poultry birds kept per 100 Households.

The poultry keeping appears to be more popular in Tribal Areas viz: Gadchiroli, Sironcha and Rajura talukas having tribal population, where birds per 100 households are more than the district average in 1972. In almost all talukas except Warora and Rajura number of poultry birds per 100 households shows considerable decline in the year 1972 over the year 1961. The overall decrease may probably be the result of lack of market facilities to promote the industry and also due to gap between the rate of consumption with the rate of production.

Indicator No. 10 : Per Capita consumption of Electricity:

Rural Electrification has a special significance in the development of the Rural Economy. Apart from providing power for agricultural purposes small consumers industries and domestic use, it helps in modernising the outlook of people living in Rural Areas.

The district has not made any significant progress in Rural Electrification as compared to other districts of the state. By 31st March 1961 only 353 villages and 5 Towns were electrified whereas on 31 st March, 1976 their correspon-

ding number increased to 544 villages and 7 towns. The per capita consumption of electricity for domestic purposes as well as total electricity consumption inclusive of all purposes for the years 1960-61 and 1975-76 are shown in the table given below :

It can be seen from the above table that per capita consumption of electricity in the year 1975-76 was 119.11 K.W.H. which is somewhat high because of heavy electrical consumption for industrial purpose viz. Ballarpur Paper Mill, A.C.C. Factory, Ghugus, Defence Project, Bhadravati and other industries developed recently in the district. However per capita domestic consumption during 1975-76 is as low as 3.17 KWH. The percentage increase in per capita domestic consumption during the year 1975-76 over the year 1960-61 is mainly due to increase in number of electrified villages as well as increase in number of households consumers.

Indicator No. 11 : Increase in number of Candidates enrolled in Employment Exchange.

The media of Employment Exchange is being utilised both by employment seekers as well as employers. Due to increase in number of educated persons and due to various employment avenues created in the development process, the number of registrants and the number of vacancies have increased considerably after 1960-61. The comparative figures of registrations, vacancies notified and placements during the year 1960-61 & 1975-76 are as follows:

Thus it can be seen that percentage increase in number of Registration is very high over 1960-61 level. Similarly, corresponding percentage increase in number of vacancies notified and number of placement is also very high over 1960-61 level. The fact that increase in registrations with the Employment Exchange is mainly due to (1) the growth of population (2) Changes in the age composition of the population and (3) the behaviour of participation rates because of

spread of education. The rapid industrialisation of the district and comprehensive development started in the district since Third & Fourth plan period increased the number of vacancies and placements which shows immense increase in percentage of registrations, vacancies notified and placements during 1975-76 over 1960-61.

Indicator No. 12 : Increase in the Outdoor and Indoor Patients treated :

The district has made significant progress in providing curative and preventive health services over last two decades. Life expectancy has increased considerably and the death rate has declined to 13 per one thousand population as compared to the year 1947. The achievement has been mainly due to better availability of medical and health facilities in the district as compared to pre-independence period.

In table No. 48 the data on the Indoor and Outdoor patients treated in Public sector hospitals, dispensaries, primary health centres and maternity homes is compiled and given for the year 1975. As the data prior to the year 1963 was not available talukawise and also because of incomplete coverage, the data for the year 1963 is treated as base year for comparison with the year 1975. The Table below gives information accordingly for the year 1963 and 1975.

The above table indicates that number of Indoor patients treated show an upward trend in all talukas and district as a whole except Rajura Taluka. An increase in indoor patients treated may be due to increase in number of beds corresponding during the years 1975. The indoor patients treated per bed during the years 1973 and 1975 worked out as 16 and 173 respectively. Similarly, there is an increase in outdoor patients treated in 4 talukas viz: Chandrapur, Gadchiroli, Sironcha and Rajura and in district while decrease in Waroda and Bramhapuri Talukas in the year 1975 over the year 1963.

Indicator No. 13 :- Increase in number of students in different categories :

Much stress was given on the development of education during plan periods. The Primary education was made compulsory during the Third Plan. As such tremendous increase in both the number of Institutions and pupils enrolled in

is noticed since 1960-61. Remarkable progress was also noticed in education of females where the percentage increase in number of students was 261.61 and 483.25 respectively for Primary and Secondary standards in the year 1975-76 over the year 1960-61. The increase in number of female students is mainly due to increase in number of primary and secondary schools in rural areas and also because of change in traditional outlook of villagers who were not very much keen in the past to send their wards to schools. The comparative figures of number of institutions and number of students for the years 1960-61 & 1975-76 are given below :

The above table indicates growth of primary and secondary education in the district by March, 1976 over the position as on March 1961. The Primary and secondary schools increased by 91.78 and 137.70 percent respectively by March 1976 over March 1961. The percentage increase in students during the period of 15 years is 148.28 and 217.81 percent respectively in primary and secondary education. The college education facilities have also been abnormally increase during the said period. Number of Higher educational institutions rose from 2 to 14 by March 1976. The percentage increase in students attending higher education was 1523.25 by end of March 1976 over the year 1960-61.

Indicator No. 14 :- Increase in Road Mileage Per 100 Sq. Kilometers :

The road development programmes during Third and Fourth Plans was formulated in accordance with the broad objectives laid down in Twenty years Road Development plan of 1961-81. The said plan was drawn up by the Chief Engineers of the State and Central Government. The broad objectives of this road plan was that no village in a developed and agricultural area should remain more than four miles from a metalled road and more than one and half miles from any type of road.

In Chandrapur district Transport and Communications facilities are very poor. In fact, this is one of the main reasons for the economic

backwardness of this district or otherwise this district is potentially rich. The position of road development has been considerably improved in comparison to 1960-61. The Road length per 100 Sq.-Kms. of area rose from 2.54 kms. as on 31.3.61 to 11.83 kms. as on 31.3.1976 comparative figures for the years of these two reference periods are given in the table below :

The above table reveals that road length per 100 Sq.Kms. increased in all types of road in this district during the period of 15 years.

Indicator No. 15: Increase in Banking facilities in proportion to population :

There is a substantial increase in number of scheduled banks and its branches since 1961 as the number of scheduled banks increased from 7 as on 31.12.1960 to 30 as on 31.12.1975, showing the percentage increase of 328.57. Similarly, the

Cooperative Banks increased by 10 during the said period accounting the percentage increase of 50.00 . The comparative position of Banks and population served by those banks during these two reference period is shown in the following table .

It is seen from the above Table that though the number of banking offices show a noticeable increase, the corresponding figure of banking offices per lakh of population does not show a sizeable increase. The fact is that, due to increase in population in the last decade the number of banking offices per lakh of population show a marginal increase. It is also found that out of 60 banking offices 23 banking offices are located in 5 urban towns and remaining 37 banking offices are located in 25 villages.

Indicator No. 16 : Prices :

The price collection work at the district headquarters was started in November, 1962 since the declaration of emergency in the country. The Prices of some important essential commodities are obtained every week ending Friday from the selected shops. These price quotations are concerned to selected shops only and but still can not be said to be fully representative, but still these serve as broad indicator of trends in the prices over a period of time. The following table indicates the yearly average prices for the year 1963 and 1975 respectively of some important commodities.

The prices of Rice, Wheat, all types of pulses except Udid dal, Sugar and meat in 1975 were more than thrice the prices prevailing in 1963 while the prices of Groundnut oil in 1975 was abnormally increased and was four times more in comparison to the year 1963. The prices of gur and washing soap were double in 1975 than those prevailing in 1963. Thus the prices of all most all commodities have shown sizeable increase in the year 1975 over the year 1963.

CHAPTER - IV.ANNUAL PLAN - 1975-76.

General :- The Fourth Five Year Plan has been officially announced to have commenced from 1st April, 1969. However the process of Planning is continued through the Annual Plan keeping in view the broad policies and programmes contemplated for the Fourth Five Year Plan, during 1969-70 to 1973-74. In the Fourth Plan period Chandrapur district also witnessed scarcity during the successive three years i.e. 1970-71, 1971-72 & 1972-73, like various parts of the State. About 1193, 509 and 764 villages in this district were affected by scarcity during these three years respectively. During the fifth year 1973-74 of the Fourth Five Year plan because of sufficient and timely rainfall the agricultural production particularly the paddy crop was slightly higher than normal expectations. The irrigation tanks were full even after the kharif harvest of paddy crop and the cultivators under the command area were encouraged to take the second crop of summer Paddy.

Fourth Five Year Plan (1969-74) :

During the course of Fourth

Five year plan an expenditure of Rs. 406.80 lakhs was incurred under, the Major Head Agriculture programme out of which expenditure on minor irrigation was of Rs. 186.18 lakhs. Amount of expenditure incurred on various other sub-heads was Soil Conservation 107.25 lakhs, Forests-74.05 lakhs, Agricultural Production 30.21 lakhs, Fisheries 5.63 lakhs, Warehousing and Marketing 2.81 lakhs and Animal husbandry 0.67 lakhs.

Rs. 59.05 lakhs incurred on Cooperation and Community Development, Rs. 27.94 lakhs were spent on Irrigation and Power, Rs. 5.61 lakhs were incurred on Industry and Mining, Rs. 133.45 lakhs were spent on Transport and Communications, Rs. 305.42 lakhs were incurred on Social Services and Rs. 11.26 lakhs were spent on Miscellaneous head covering Employment Guarantee Scheme and Information and publicity.

Thus total expenditure of Rs. 949.53 lakhs was incurred during Fourth Plan period in Chandrapur district. The Programme of Agriculture, Cooperation & Community development shared 49.06 percent of the total expenditure during Fourth Plan. Social Services accounted for 32.17 percent, Transport and Communications 14.06 percent. Irrigation and Power 2.94 percent, Industry & Mining 0.59 percent and Employment Guarantee Scheme 0.47 percent respectively of the total Fourth Plan expenditure.

Fifth Five Year Plan-District Planning :

The importance of District Planning has all along been emphasised by the Planning Commission for ensuring rational utilisation of resources, reduction of intra-state imbalances as well as proper co-ordination and implementation of development programmes. For which Govt. has established Planning Boards at the District levels. Resources survey of district were carried out to facilitate District Planning which would be an important feature of the Fifth Five year Plan.

District Planning and Development Board has formulated Draft Fifth Five Year Plan 1974-75 to 1978-79 within the allocation of Chandrapur district. Draft Fifth Five Year Plan thus formulated has accorded high priority to the Development of agriculture, irrigation and power as well as to the national Programme for Minimum Needs and to the State's Fifteen Point Programme. In consequence of the National Five Year Plan not having been finalised, the States Five Year Plan as well as the District Five Years Plan have ^{also} remained to be finalised and may have to be modified in the course of time, taking into account the changes in the policy which have emerged subsequent to the preparation of the Draft Fifth Five Year Plan.

It was only during the Fifth Five Year Plan that any serious attempt was made in the direction of District Planning. But even so,

during the first year of the fifth Plan, the State's Annual Plan was finalised in the absence of all the District Annual Plans. It was only in the second year i.e. 1975-76 of the Fifth Plan that the District Annual Plans were fully integrated with the State Plan. District Planning is an evolving process which has to undergo constant modification. The role of District Planning got sharp edge when the District Planning and Development Councils engaged themselves very actively in the formulation of Annual Plan.

Tribal Sub-plan :

In addition to the exercise in District Planning with District as the basic unit Govt. has also undertaken the task of Formulating development plans on area basis for certain special areas like the Tribal and Hilly and inaccessible areas in this district with an aim to integrate development of this area for accelerating Socio-Economic development of the people living in Tribal areas. For the purpose of formulation of the Tribal-Sub-Plan and for supervision over the implementation thereof "Special Executive Committees" of the District Planning and Development Council has been constituted in the district.

Annual Plan 1974-75 :-

The outlay of the Annual Plan 1974-75 for the District level Programmes of this district was of the order of Rs. 465.85 Lakhs, against which the total expenditure incurred amounted to

Rs. 425.77 lakhs. Irrigation and Power were given the highest priority in this district. About 38 percent of the total Annual Plan outlay was earmarked for the various Irrigation Projects & Power. The Programme for Agriculture, Cooperation and community development shared 28 percent of the total Annual Annual plan Outlay, Social Services accounted for 15 percent. Industry and Mining shared 10 percent, Transport and Communications shared 4 percent, Miscellaneous Programme including Employment Guarantee Scheme shared 10 percent respectively of the total Annual Plan outlay 1974-75 in the district.

Expenditure incurred for Irrigation & Power was 162.24 lakhs 38.1 percent, Agriculture, Co-operation and Community Development 106.97 lakhs 25.1 percent. Social Services 79.04 lakhs, 18.6 percent, Industry & Mining 27.39 lakhs, 6.4 percent; Transport and Communications 18.07 lakhs, 4.3 percent; ~~Transport and Communications 18.07 lakhs, 4.3 percent; and E.G.S. 32.05 lakhs, 7.05 percent -~~ ~~Transport and Communications 18.07 lakhs, 4.3 percent; and E.G.S. 32.05 lakhs, 7.05 percent -~~ lakhs respectively of the total Annual Plan expenditure of Rs. 425.77 during 1974-75.

The overall performances during the year 1974-75 under various programme was substantial. The provisions set aside for all most all programmes were spent except Industry & Mining and Miscellaneous Programme. Expenditure against Irrigation & Power and Social Services was over & above the outlay placed during the Annual Plan 1974-75.

Annual Plan 1975-76 :

The Annual Plan Outlay for 1975-76 for the District Level Programme of Chandrapur district was of the order of Rs. 665.67 lakhs, against which the total expenditure incurred amounted to Rs. 552.08 lakhs. Irrigation and Power were given the highest priority. About 36 percent of the total Annual Plan outlay was earmarked for the various Irrigation Projects & Power. The Programme for Agriculture, Cooperation & Community Development shared 24 percent of the total Annual Plan outlay, Social Services accounted for about 15 percent of the total Annual Plan Outlay of the district. Transport & Communication shared 12 percent while Miscellaneous including Employment Guarantee scheme shared 9 percent and Industry & Mining shared 4 percent of respectively of the total Annual Plan outlay of the district.

The overall performance under various programmes was substantial. The provisions for most of the programmes were spent except in Irrigation & Power and Transport & Communication. Expenditure against Industry & Mining and Employment Guarantee Scheme under Miscellaneous Programme was over & above the outlay placed for during the year.

AGRICULTURAL PROGRAMME:

The various schemes under Agricultural Programme were specially aimed at improvement of agricultural productivity. The district was covered under intensive cultivation of food crops

Particularly of Paddy crop because of its maximum irrigation potential for increasing the food production. Soil Conservation measures Minor Irrigation works, Development of Forest and Fisheries were the other programmes, that were implemented in the Dist. The following table indicates the allotment and expenditure under these various programmes:

Agricultural Production :

The sub-head of Agricultural Production under crop husbandry was provided with an outlay of Rs. 13.11 lakhs during 1975-76, against which an expenditure of Rs. 3.20 lakh was incurred. Over Integrated area development scheme for Small holders including community wells (Rs.2.90 lakhs) and Purchase of P.P. appliances (0.30 lakhs). Though

the provision was made against the scheme of Estt: of Taluka seed Farms, Model colonisation scheme expenditure was not incurred as these schemes were dropped. The details of important achievements under various activities were as follows :-

Under the scheme development of Small Farmers 1045 Small holders were benefited while under the scheme of Plant protection appliances 274 P.P. appliances were purchased and distributed to the cultivators.

MINOR IRRIGATION:

Minor Irrigation works play an important role in the agricultural economy of the district. There are large number of Ex-Malguzari Tanks in this district. The Programme of renovation of these tanks for providing quick irrigation facilities was launched on a large scale. New Irrigation wells and Repairs to old wells were also taken up. The Total expenditure on these minor irrigation works was of Rs.72.24 lakhs as against total provision of Rs. 84. 00 lakhs. In all 189 New Wells were constructed, while 226 Pumpssets were installed during the period under review. Besides 4 lift Irrigation works from rivers and streams were completed in the district Irrigation potential of 2570 hectares is covered under the Minor Irrigation works in State and local sector-schemes.

Soil Conservation:

Under the soil conservation measures contour bunding and terracing were completed in an area of 1617 hectares and 230 hectares respectively. The total expenditure incurred was of Rs. 21.56 lakhs against annual plan outlay of Rs. 29.05 lakhs.

ANIMAL HUSBANDRY AND DAIRY DEVELOPMENT :

During the period under review 21 premium Bulls were distributed, 13576 animals were castrated and 2627 improved birds were supplied.

Expenditure of Rs. 0.45 lakh was incurred on this sub-head against outlay of Rs. 1.00 lakh.

Under dairy development, scheme of Organisation of dairy Cooperatives, unions and federations was implemented during the period under review against which Rs. 0.04 lakh was spent for organising 3 dairy societies.

FORESTS:

Forests form one of the most important resources of the district and its abundance is a striking feature. Forests cover about 56 percent of the district's total area as against 20 percent in the state. The development programme of forest was therefore quite important. In all Rs. 16.84 lakh have been expended on the various forest development schemes in the district as against the total allocation of Rs. 14.41 lakhs. The expenditure thus incurred was over and above the outlay originally fixed. The plantation of valuable trees such as Teak was done on 549 hectares area. In addition to this plantation of Fodder resources on 30 hectares area was completed during the year 1975-76. Under Forest Communications Black Topping of 7.50 Kms, Improvement of 14.00 Kms. existing road, Metalling on 7.00 Kms. road and part work of 2 C.D. works was completed during the year under review.

FISHERIES :

The aim of the fisheries development programme was to increase production of fish and to improve Socio-Economic conditions of the fishermen working in the field. The district is naturally endowed with good potential of water resources. District has 5 perennial rivers all measuring to 672 Kms. In addition to above there are 4 seasonal rivers in the district. There are 2380 tanks brought under pisciculture covering suitable area of 13110 hectares. During 1975-76 total area brought under pisciculture was 11957 hectares (average). An expenditure of 3.19 lakhs was incurred on various schemes as against Annual Plan Outlay of Rs.5.08 lakhs earmarked for this sub-head. During the year under report 69.25 lakhs fingerlings were stocked and 640 Metric Tonnes fish was netted under the plan scheme. However total fish production under Inland Fisheries was of 886 M.Tonnes during the year under review.

COOPERATION AND COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT:COOPERATION :

Cooperative movement has taken tremendous strides in Maharashtra. The State's Five Year Plans have sought the promotion of Cooperative Organisations through financial supports, for undertaking different economic activities in the form of subsidies, share capital investments and advancing loan according to needs. The Programme, was continued during the Fifth Plan period and was concerned mainly

with the development of Cooperative Marketing.

Credit facilities were taken up to the doors of the agricultural cooperative and Cooperative farming.

An outlay of Rs. 0.70 lakhs was fixed up for the schemes under Cooperation against which no expenditure is incurred. However, 0.22 lakhs were spent on the schemes of Ware housing & Marketing against the total outlay fixed of Rs. 0.22 lakhs for the said schemes and Agricultural Produced Market Committees benefitted with financial assistance. Short term loan to the tune of Rs. 382.28 lakh was distributed to the members of primary agricultural credit societies. Medium Term loan of Rs. 95.96 lakh & Long term loan of Rs. 322.58 lakh was also distributed during the year under review.

COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT :

Community development was described as a method of rural extension and as an agency through which the transformation of the social & Economical life in village was to be initiated. The concept of rural extension has broadened into that of Panchayat Raj. One of the principal tasks in the Fourth Plan was to ensure the growth and working of Panchayat Raj so as to enable each area to realise its maximum development potential on the basis of local man-power and other resources, Cooperative self help and community efforts and effective use of the available resources and manpower.

During the plan year under review the blocks as shown below were functioning.

(1) State I - Nil (2) State II - 1 (3) Post Stage II - 13.50 and (4) M.D.P. & T.D. Blocks - 6.00.

During the plan year 1975-76 under review the provision made for the programme was to the tune of Rs. 8.43 lakhs. Whereas the expenditure incurred was of Rs. 8.02 lakhs. Composite programme for women and children was continued in the district in the five selected blocks. Special Nutrition Programme was also continued during the year under review in 11 blocks. Similarly, Applied Nutrition Programme was continued in seven selected blocks. Besides, Gram Safai Programme in 24 villages was implemented under the scheme during the year.

MAJOR & MEDIUM IRRIGATION PROJECTS :

As high priority was given to the irrigation projects during the Fifth Plan Rs. 197.00 lakhs were earmarked during the Annual Plan 1975-76 for the continuing Major and Medium projects viz: Itiadh & Dina, Chargaon Nala, Amal Nala Projects and Chandai Nala, Chenna Nadi and Labhan Sargd Nala now medium irrigation projects. Against which the expenditure of Rs. 133.42 lakhs was incurred.

POWER PROJECTS :

Under this sub-head Rs. 27.76 lakhs were expended during the plan year under review against the schemes of Rural Electrification and Normal Development. The provision made in Annual Plan

1975-76 for these schemes was of Rs.38.00 lakhs.

Under Rural Electrification Programme 21 villages have been electrified and 290 Electric Pumpsets have been installed during the year.

INDUSTRY AND MINING :

MEDIUM AND SMALL SCALE INDUSTRIES :

Development Programme for Medium and Small Scale industries aimed at helping the medium industries under Package scheme of Incentives (SICOM) and to the small scale and cottage industries to overcome the handicaps such as capital resources lack of knowledge of modern technique, method of production and improvement of marketing of products. The provision made available for this sub-head during the year under review was of Rs.27.76 lakhs against which an expenditure of Rs. 27.96 lakhs was incurred. Out of which Rs.25.58 lakhs were spent against Package scheme of incentives which was administered by SICOM to provide financial incentives for development of industries. For the development of handloom industry rebate subsidy for the sale of handloom cloth was continued to be given to the 18 cooperatives in the district and Rs.0.21 lakhs were spent against the scheme. Financial assistance worth to Rs.1.88 lakhs was given to Block level village Artisans multipurpose Coop Societies.

TRANSPORT AND COMMUNICATIONS :

Road transport has much significance in this district as it is major means of commu-

nication as railway facilities are ill equipped. The total road length in the district as on 31 st March 1976 was 3032.72 Kms. which is in other words meant 11.82 Kms. of road per 100 Sq.Kms. of area.

The Annual Plan outlay for 1975-76 was fixed at Rs. 81.85 lakhs under the sub-head of Road Development in this district against which expenditure of Rs. 61.56 lakhs was incurred during the year on this sub-head of Road Development. During the Fifth Plan, Scheme of Rural Roads was to be covered under Minimum Needs Programme. Provision of Rs.2.00 lakhs was made for the scheme during 1975-76. Against which expenditure of Rs. 2.11 lakhs was incurred i.e. over and above the outlay fixed. New Roads of 34 Kms. were constructed under the Road Development Programme. Metalling of 35 Kms. of Road completed, 2 Bridges and 45 culverts completed and 49.50 kms. of Rural Roads constructed in Rural Road Scheme under Minimum Needs Programme.

SOCIAL SERVICES :

GENERAL EDUCATION :

The programme of General Education was emphasised as an important aspect of development. Elementary Education was included as an item of Minimum Needs Programme during Fifth Plan as of National importance. During the Annual Plan 1975-76 total amount of Rs.22.35 lakhs was spent on this sub-head of General Education, Out of which amount of Rs.0.36 lakhs was spent of Primary education. During

the year under review 97 school buildings were constructed. Number of pupils increased in Primary schools 20732 and in secondary schools 6936 respectively and 2330 adults were made literate.

HEALTH AND FAMILY PLANNING :

During the year under review Rs.2.41 lakhs were spent on the sub-head of Medical and Public Health. Over and above the Annual Plan Outlay of Rs. 2.29 fixed for 1975-76. During the year under review 54 Family Planning units were functioning. Under Family Planning Programme 20176 sterilisations were performed and I.U.C.D. of 17 completed.

NUTRITION PROGRAMME :

Under the scheme of special Nutrition Programme implemented in 11 Blocks in the district for pre-school children and pregnant lactating mothers Rs. 2.45 lakhs were spent during the year under review covering 45363 beneficiaries, while Rs.2.39 lakhs were spent Applied Nutrition Programme covering 7 blocks under the programme.

WATER SUPPLY AND DRAINAGE :

Under this sub-head the outlay of Rs.38.83 was fixed during the year 1975-76 under review. Against which expenditure of Rs.34.10 was incurred under rural and urban water supply scheme. The amount spent on all rural water supply scheme was to the tune of Rs.24.07 lakhs. 271 New Drinking Water Wells were constructed during the year under review.

Rural Piped water supply scheme in 11 villages was undertaken. Under Boring operation of G.S.D.A. scheme drilling of 31 Boreholes was completed and 19 handpumps were installed. Besides rural water supply schemes urban water supply schemes in 3 Municipal areas were executed during the year under review.

HOUSING :

Under the sub-head of housing out of total provision of Rs. 4.44 lakhs for the year 1975-76, the amount of Rs. 10.73 lakhs was expended. This was over and above the outlay fixed due to the expenditure on the scheme Hutmnt Programme of provision of housesites to landless workers in rural areas and construction of huts thereon. Provision of 7963 house sites was made under the scheme, and 5444 huts were constructed during the year under review. Under extension of village Gaothan scheme 3 villages were covered by providing gaothans. Under the scheme Tiling of roofs to huts 10 roofs were completed in the year.

WELFARE OF BACKWARD CLASSES :

Under this sub-head, out of the total provision of Rs. 16.74 lakhs earmarked for the year 1975-76, the amount of Rs. 16.58 lakhs was expended. The programme such as Grants of Tutition & Examination Fees to B.C. class students, Award of scholarships, award of stipends, awards of post S.S.C. scholarships, construction of B.C. Hostels, construction of B.C. Hostels,

construction of New Irrigation wells, Grant of loan cum subsidy to B.Cs. for village industries and professions, Installation of Irrigation Pumpsets, Financial Assistance to individual and group housing of B.Cs. Subsidy to B.Cs. agriculturalists for land development and purchase of fertilisers, were the major schemes implemented during the year.

Besides above B.C. Welfare Programme, for launching a 15-Point Programme opening of Ashram Shala complexes with an area development approach for the Welfare of Adivasis 2 Ashram Schools were opened and 3 Ashram Schools were maintained during the year under review.

During the year under review 4 hostels for B.C. Boys and Girls were maintained in the district. Two Welfare centres were functioning. Under grant of Tution/examination fees 517 students of B.Cs. were benefitted. Scholarships to 24 students of B.Cs. were given. Stipends to 144 students awarded in I.T.Is. and Post S.S.C. scholarships awarded to 664 students.

SOCIAL WELFARE :

Under this sub-head, out of total provision of Rs.0.13 lakhs made during 1975-76 under Annual Plan Rs. 0.17 lakhs was spent. Three schemes viz: (1) Rehabilitation of Physically handicapped (2) Rehabilitation of Leprosy affected Persons and (3) Expansion work under Childrens Act were executed during the year under review while benefiting the institutions.

LABOUR AND LABOUR WELFARE :

Under this sub-head a provision of Rs.0.20 Lakh was made in the Annual Plan 1975-76 against the scheme Apprenticeship Training Programme of Craftsmen Training. The ^{entire} outlay of Rs. 0.20 lakhs was expended under the said scheme during the period benefitting one institution.

MISCELLANEOUS :

EMPLOYMENT GUARANTEE SCHEME :

Item of providing a guarantee of employment in manual work for the rural population was included under 15-Point Programme. Accordingly Employment Guarantee scheme was implemented during the year 1975-76 in the district in General Services Programme. Provision of Rs.60.00 lakhs was earmarked under Annual Plan 1975-76 for the scheme against which expenditure of Rs.73.50 lakhs was incurred i.e. over and above the outlay fixed. During the year under review Employment was provided under the scheme in this district on 45 Irrigation works, 33 Soil conservation works, one road work and six other works including forest works.

INFORMATION AND PUBLICITY :

On the scheme of Community Radio Sets under this sub-head of Development outlay of Rs. 0.20 lakh was earmarked in Annual Plan 1975-76. However expenditure incurred on the scheme was of Rs.0.03 lakhs against the same. 10 Radio sets were installed in rural areas of the district in the scheme during the year under review.
