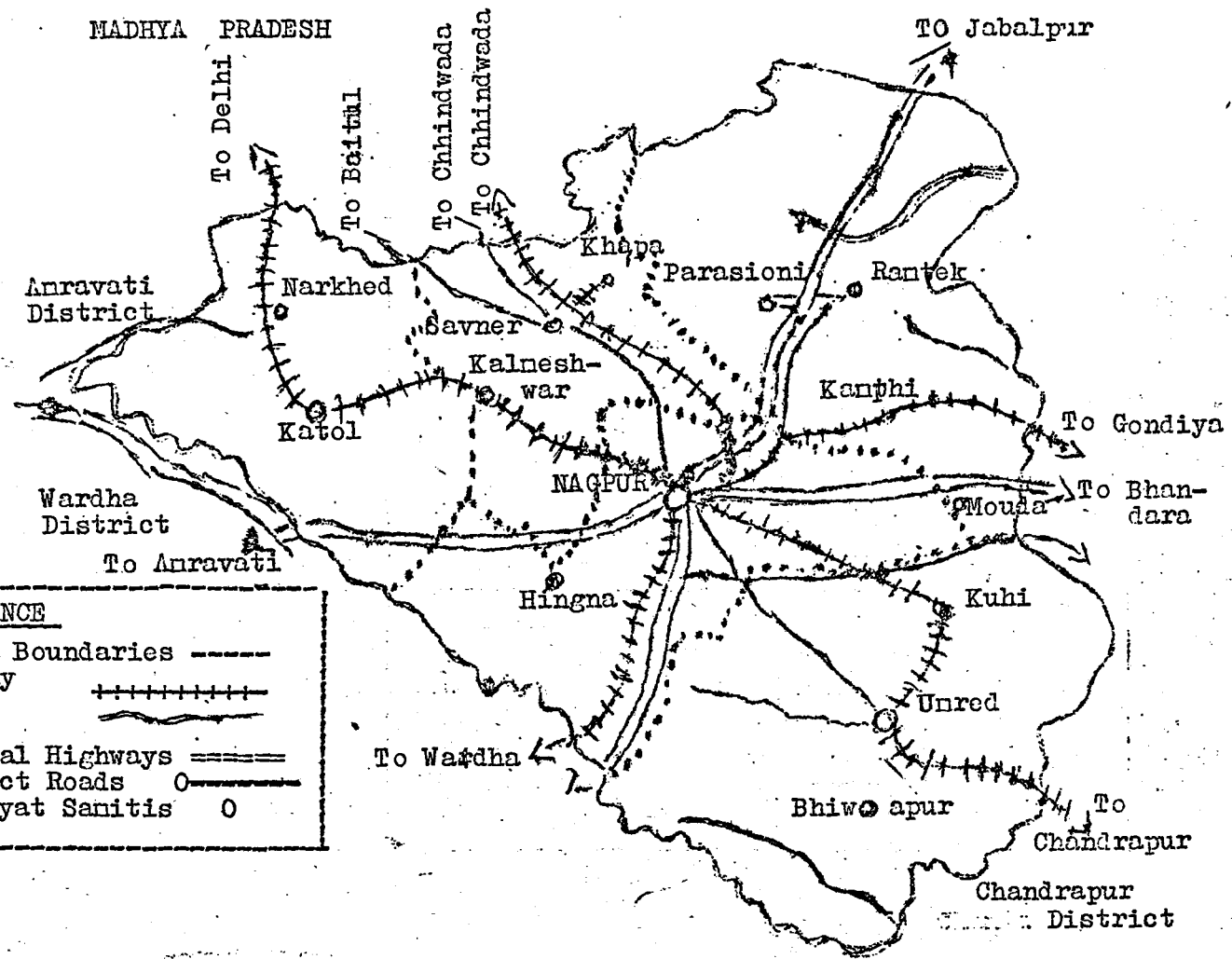

## CHAPTER-I.

**1.1 Location:-** Nagpur district was one of the Districts of Ex-Madhya Pradesh till the reorganisation of States in 1956 when alongwith the other seven districts of Vidarbha region, it formed a part of the bilingual state of Bombay. The State of Maharashtra came into existence on 1st May, 1960, with Nagpur district as one of its twenty six districts. Nagpur district is one of the important district of the four C.P. districts. The headquarters of the district is at Nagpur which was the capital of Ex-Madhya Pradesh State and now enjoys the status of the second capital of Maharashtra State.

This district lies between  $20^{\circ} 35'$  and  $21^{\circ} 44'$  North Latitudes and  $78^{\circ} 15'$  and  $79^{\circ} 48'$  East longitudes and it is triangular in shape.

**1.2 Boundaries:-** This district is bounded on the North by the Chhindwada and Seoni district of the Madhya Pradesh on the East by Bhandara, on the South and West by Chandrapur and Wardha districts respectively, with a small strip on the north-west by the Amravati district of Maharashtra State.

### 1.3 Highlight on Development :

**1. Agriculture:** The programmes of agricultural development have brought about an area of 118207 hectares under high yielding, high breed and improved varieties of various crops in the district, Out of 13 blocks in the district, three blocks were covered under integrated area development programme i.e. panchayat Yojana. An area of 127801 and 6338 hectares was counter bunded and terraced out of an area of 374701 hectares and 106955 hectares respectively available in the district.

**2. Dairy:** The Govt. Milk supply scheme of Nagpur has ensured the supply of pure milk to the citizens. The milk is collected from the villages of Nagpur Wardha and Bhandara district. The milk collected per day is 36548 litres in slack season and 46551 litres in peak season. Due to good response to this milk scheme from farmers, Govt. has decided to establish a power plant at Nagpur. The estimated



cost of the plant is Rs.1.20 Crores with the capacity of production of 5 / <sup>Tonnes</sup> Milk powder per day to ensure supply of milk to ennsurers in all the seasons.

3. Irrigation:- The Pench major Irrigation Project is under construction in Rantek tahsil of the district at the revised cost of Rs.40.69 crores. The project comprises of two parts viz. i) construction of dam at Totladoha which includes a power house at the dam site and for storing water mostly for irrigation purposes, and (ii) construction of picweir at Manthi Kheri with erection of gate over it. The gross / <sup>command</sup> area of this project is 155940 hectares and an area of 62020 Hectres will / <sup>be</sup> brought under irrigation in the near future. As such this project would be / <sup>the</sup> boon to this district for its rapid economic and industrial growth. In addition to the above eight Medium Irrigation Projects named Raktek, Wunna, Pandharbodi, Unri, Khursapar, Kesarnala, Kanoli, and Chandrabhaga were already completed. The Gross commanded area of these projects is 50953 hectares of which an area of about 15006 hectares has been brought under irrigation. The work of Khekhranala, Makardhokda Kolar and Mordhan were in progress. The gross command area of these medium irrigation projects is 27268 hectares and area of 10777 hectares will be brought under irrigation by all these projects after their completion. However at present much of the area under cultivation is under irrigation by minor irrigation schemes such as tanks, wells etc; .

4. Power:- As electricity is one of the basic infrastructures required for industrial, agricultural and other developments it is essential that adequate power stations shall have to be planned well in advance to carry through the ambitious programme of industrialisation of backward areas. As such the power generation programme has been drawn up with a view to take care of demand and reducing power shortage as at present experienced. With this view, though there was a power station at Khaparkheda 15 K.Ms. away from Nagpur city with an installed capacity of 120 M.W. the Thermal power station at Koradi near Khaparkheda has been established with the installed capacity of 1080 M.W. In addition to the above the work of Inter State (i.e. Maharashtra

(i.e. Maharashtra and Madhya Pradesh) Hydro Electric power station on Pench River with the installed capacity of 53 M.W. is in progress and will be completed by 1978-79.

5. Industries:- There are two textile mills in Nagpur since long of which Empress Mill is under private Sector where as management of Model Mill/<sup>is</sup> under Public Sector. A Co-Operative Spinning Mill and Ginning and Pressing units have ~~been~~ also been established recently in the district.

Industrial estate at Hingna near Nagpur was planned with an intention to promote the growth of ancillary industries around them eventually providing considerable employment to the rural population. An Industrial estate at Hingna has already been developed with the assistance of SICOM, VIDC and M.F.C. into sizeable industrial complex with the potential of growing bigger.

Weaving is the most important industry in the district as about 10 percent population of the district earn their livelihood on this industry. The Directorate of Handloom and Powerloom textile Co-operation has been established recently with the Headquarter for the State at Nagpur to solve the problems of handloom industries to improve economic conditions of weavers.

6. Medical :- There is a medical college hospital having 1201 beds in Nagpur city which was supposed to be a biggest hospital in the State. There are two medical colleges also in Nagpur city.

7. Water supply:- There are 13 towns in the district and Hygienic water is supplied to the citizens of 11 towns by completing 11 urban water supply schemes. The water supply schemes of Narkher/<sup>and Mowad</sup> towns ~~are~~ in progress. The work of 24 Rural pipe water supply schemes have been completed and 5 works are in progress in the district.

8. Employment Guarantee Scheme:-

Under this scheme 544 works were sanctioned, of which 294 works comprising tanks 71, forests 2, Soil Conservation 216 and roads 2, works were in progress by the end of March 1976.

9. Surplus land:- There are about 2397 land holders holding additional land in the district. Out of the above cases 406 cases have been settled and about 3183 Hect. of land has been brought under surplus at the end of March 1976. Out of the above land 2171 hectare of land has been distributed among 1319 landless persons of which 60 percent are from scheduled castes and 40 percent from other backward classes.

10. New Apprentice scheme:-

In the industrial training institute the number of industries under which trainees are trained have been increased to 102 from 62 and 661 trainees yearly are taking the benefit of this training to secure employment.

11. Construction of huts for landless labourers:-

There are 10566 landless labourers and 30'x30' land for construction of houses was distributed to all these land less persons. The construction of 5932 huts was also completed at the end of March 1976 on the land distributed to land less labourers.

12. Family Planning:- The district has exceeded the target of 10710 under family planning performing 12363 operations faring 15.43 percent over the target during the year 1975-76.

1.4 Area:- Nagpur district stretches over an area of 9928 Square K.Ms. and its population according to 1971 Census is 19,42,688. In terms of area and population it constitute 3.34 and 3.85 percent of area and population respectively of Maharashtra excluding Greater Bombay. The district remains first in Vidarbha and eleventh in Maharashtra in terms of population. The length of district in East West extenssion is 156 K.Ms. and its breadth in North-South extenssion is 150 Kns. There were no major changes in the boundries of the district and its talukas or its administrative divisions since 1911. However in 1971 Census 10 villages of this district were transferred to Bhandara

district measuring an area of 24.56 Sq.K.Ms.

1.5 Topography:- The district has an average elevation between 274.50 and 305 metres.(900 and 1,000 Feet) above sea level and its relief features are characterised, by and large, by the residual hill ranges of the Satpudas and their de-tached, hillocks enclosing then undulating black soil valleys. Much of the topography is typically one of the Deccan Trap having flat topped and terraced features, low but treassed side and isolited Knolls. Eastwards and north eastwards, the landscape changes in an interesting manner due to the change in the underlying rocks. The rocks of Gondwana series are not only important because of their coal and nanganese deposits, but in their surface expression they present a low rolling topography within a poor soil cover and vegetation.

The greater part of the district as an undulating plateau with a variation in height between 652.70 metres(2,140 feet) above sea level on the upland ridges in the North and about 247.50 metres(900 feet) near the Kanhan river. This plateau surface of the district falls into three district drainage basins. In the North the upland ranges are an extension of the Satpuda ranges, they are narrow in the West but widen to a breadth of about 19 Kns (12 miles) towards the East. Immediately south of these upland ranges, stretches the Anbagad Hills, the western extremity of which lies in the Nagpur district. The historic temple of Rantek is situated on a spur of this range signifying the Hill of Rama also known formerly as -- "Sundergiri" Vernillion Mount "Tapogri"(Hill of Penance) These isolated hills or knolls attain no great altitude.

1.6 Hills, Rivers and Soils:-

1) Hills:- The main system of hills is the satpuda and its offshoots. The northern range of hills extends along the whole border, being pieced only in two places where the Kanhan and the Pench rivers have broken through. On the west, it consists narely of the outlaying foothills of the Satpudas, the plateau proper lying behind them in Chindwara. But from the Kanhan to the Pench, it is the major

range of the Satpudas themselves which dominates the landscape and the ascent of the Khamarpani plateau is made in Nagpur. Along this length the hills are well wooded and picturesque and there is some striking scenery on the Pench river. The old Gond fort of Bhivagad stands on this range. Government managed forests in this district mainly belong to these hills between the Kanhan and the Bawanthari.

A few miles to the south of the main Satpuda range are two minor lines of hills, to the West and <sup>the</sup> East of Pench. These to the west lie between Bhivagad and Parashioni terminating in the peak of Tekadi 508.34 metres (1,669 feet) <sup>to the</sup> East of the Pench are the Mansar hills, both these and the western range being now denuded of trees, and, after a gap of a few miles, come well known Rantek hills, rising to 427 metres (1400 feet) at Rantek proper. Timely measures by the Government have helped retaining the wooded character of this range.

Minor Hills:- The second main hill track extends along the south east of the district from Khargad on the Wardha river where there are some fine waterfalls to the junction of Wardha and Chandrapur with Nagpur. They separate the valley of the Kar, from that of the Jan up to Kondhali and further south east forms the watershed between the latter river and the Bor. Near Bori, they become the Kauras Plateau and here terminate to afford a passage for the Wardha river, containing afterwards southeastwards and dividing the valley of the Nand from the Wainganga Plain. West of the Wunna the range is mostly well covered with picturesque valleys and ravines, among which are narrow strips of rich well irrigated land of great fertility. But to the east towards Unred the range has lower levels and is uninteresting. It consists of low bare hills which are grass covered and boulder strewn, except where over looking the Nand valley, some excellent teak is grown.

The third main range runs northwards through the Katol tahsil from Kondhali to Kelod, separating the Wardha and Wainganga Valleys. The highest peak of it is at Pilkapar.

2. Rivers:- The Wardha and <sup>the</sup> Wainganga are the main rivers of the district. The Wardha flows along the part of the western border and controls the drainage system of the western part of the district. The principal tributaries of <sup>the</sup> Wardha river are the Bor, the Wunna, the Jam and the Kar. The Bor rises in the hills near Bazargaon and rushes down a winding and rocky channel between Kondhali uplands and the Kauras Plateau, passing into the Wardha to join the Wunna. Its narrow valley is very fertile and the high well wooded cliffs on either sides render it a wild and beautiful spot in the whole of the district.

The Wunna rises near the hill of Mahadagad in the Pilkapar range and flows along the northern base of the Kauras plateau past Hingna and Bori, where it is crossed by the Central Railway. It leaves the district at Ashta. The small Krishna river joins it at Bori.

The Jam rises among the hills south of Kondhali and flowing northwards into the centre of the Katol tahsil takes a westernly turn pass Katol and joins the Wardha at Jalalkhedal. The Kar rises in the same range, but flows directly south-west separating the Wardha and Nagpur districts till it joins the Wardha river at Khargad, the trijunction point of the 2 districts with Berar. The Nand flows across a small strip in the south of the district and joins the Wunna beyond the border of Wardha.

The Wainganga flows along the part of eastern border and controls the drainage system of the western and central portions of the district. It forms the district boundary with Bhandara district for some distance.

The Kanhan and <sup>the</sup> Pench are the most important tributaries of the Wainganga, both of which flow, from the Satpuda range in the Chhindwara district and meet near Kamthi, where they are joined by Kolar. The Kanhan, entering the district near Borgaon, takes a south-eastern course pass Khapa to Kamthi, where it receives the Pench and <sup>the</sup> Kolkar. In its subsequent course, it makes the boundary of Ramtek tahsil and after receiving the Nag river near the hills of Bhivakund, finally empties itself into the Wainganga. The Kanhan river provides drinking water to Nagpur city.

The Kolar rises in the north-east corner of the Katol tahsil and after passing through the rocky part of Lohagad in Pilkapar range emerges into the fertile plain of Savner and separates Nagpur from Ramtek tahsil until it's place as bondary river is taken by the Kanhan. It's bed is generally rocky. At Patansawangi, it receives the Chandrabhaga, which brings in the drainage of Kalmeshwar plain.

The other rivers of some importance are the Bawanthari, the Sur and the Gaotala sand, which drains the eastern half of Ramtek tahsil. The Sur is remarkable for its shallowness, but its fertile properties produce sugarcane and garden crops of the land.

3. Soil :- The main soils of the district are Kali (medium deep black cotton) Morand (Comparatively light deep brown in colour) and Bardi (Red graver with boulders).

Medium deep black soil is found around Kalmeshwar and Savner in the Wardha Valley and in the Nagpur Kamthi plains. The principal soil of the district is known as Morand. It is very suitable for cotton and jowar and is found in almost all the talukas, in the northern part of Ramtek taluka and especially in the valley of the Sur river. The morand soil is <sup>of</sup> very light

4. Climate :- Temperature and Rainfall :-

1. Climate :- Since the district is away from the sea shore, the climate of the district is uneven and as such there is large variation in hot and cold seasons of the year. The climate of the district is characterised by a hot summer, well distributed rainfall and dryness except in rainy season. The winter season sets in from December to February and January is the coldest month. Whereas, May is hottest in the year and is followed by the hot season from March to May. The south-east monsoon starts from June to September; while the period from October to November constitutes the post-monsoon.

2. Temperature :- The temperature data for Nagpur district is available for two centres named Nagpur Aerodrome and Nagpur city. The mean maximum temperature was highest in May, 1975, 45.2 centi. as against lowest 22.04 centi. in Jan., 1975. In general, it can be said that temperature begins to rise from February and reaches peak level in May.

Onset of the south-west monsoon in the second week of June brings welcome relief from the heat with a considerable drop in temperature. The temperature shows slight increase in October and thereafter getting to fall.

Except during the monsoon season, when the humidity is high, the weather is generally dry. The humidities go down to 20 % or less in summer season.

3. Rainfall :- The district gets rainfall from South-west monsoon originating from the Arabian sea. The average annual rainfall throughout the district amounts to 1016 mm. (40") and 1143 (49½") perhaps due to the hills and forest tracts in these areas. The rainy season usually starts in early June and lasts up to October. In the severe hot season, the light showers are sometimes followed by severe dust storms. The rainfall during June to September constitutes about 90 % of the annual rainfall. The variation in the annual rainfall from year to year is not very large, though the agricultural season is affected from year to year due to vagaries of monsoon. The heaviest rainfall in 24 hours recorded in the district was 330.20 mms.

(13 inches) at Umred on 14-8-53.

The rainfall during the year 1975 for Nagpur, Katol, Savner, Ramtek and Umred was 1193, 1118, 1244, 1691 and 1171 mms. respectively, which shows that rainfall increased from south to west.

5. Population :- The 1971 population of the district showed an increase of 28.68 percent over the year 1961 as against 27.45 percent for Maharashtra. The urban and rural population form 54.52 percent and 45.48 percent against 52.07 percent and 47.93 percent respectively in the year 1961. The density of population is 196 per sq. km. as compared to 164 for Maharashtra and 178 for India as per 1971 Census. The sex ratio i.e. females per 1000 males is 922 for the district as against 930 for Maharashtra in 1971. The literacy rate for the district is of 45.26 percent as compared to the rate of 39.18 percent for Maharashtra in 1971.

The percentage of scheduled caste in the district is 4.13 percent in 1971 as against 3.60 in 1961. Out of the total population of the district, 35.48 percent are workers of which 21.91 percent, 23.19 percent and 16.95 percent are reported as cultivators, agricultural labourers and in household industry respectively in the year 1971. The persons engaged in remaining services are reported 32.95 percent of the total workers according to 1971 Census.

5. : Nagpur city :-- The city of Nagpur and its suburban extensions, which now almost reached up to the industrial nucleus of Kanhan form the nerve centre not only of the district, but also of Vidarbha. Originally, being advantageous from the point of view of defence, Nagpur had grown up into an urban centre under the Bhonsales of the Maratha confederacy with the formation of the Central Provinces under the British regime, the town acquired a new importance as the administrative capital. Its growth coincided with the economic development of the surrounding region abounding in cotton crop. As in the case of large city, Nagpur developed a complex structure based on administrative, economic and social forces, which finds expression in its urban and suburban areas. It draws a greater strength from the new industrialisation and rightly compete with Bombay and Pune in its economic and social growth.

Explanatory notes on the scope and limitations of the Statistical data presented in the Part-II Statistical Abstract.

1. Purpose :- The abstract part of this publication gives exhaustive Statistical data on important Socio-Economic indicators of development. Tables on almost all important topics are presented in this part, so that the publication could serve as a reference book. Talukawise <sup>and even blockwise</sup> data have been displayed as far as possible for inter taluka <sup>as well as block</sup> comparison. In most of the tables, data for 1975-76 have been indicated with data for 1974-75 or even for earlier years in the tables; wherein data for 1973-74 and 1974-75 could not be presented, the same for the latest years for which they were available, have been shown. In case of 'Livestock and Census of Government employees, however, the data for latest Census have been presented. The population data have been shown for 1971 Census, All the data are collected from the State and Central Government Offices, local bodies and other relevant agencies. The foot notes below each table indicates the source from which the data have been collected.

II. District at a Glance:- This table presents a birds eyeview of the Socio-Economic conditions of development in Nagpur district and Maharashtra State under different heads, such as area, population, agriculture, animal husbandry, education, transport and communication, Plan and C.D. Programme, local bodies, <sup>and</sup> other miscellaneous statistics. Reference year of the data is also indicated in each table.

III. Contents, Scope and Limitation:-

The statistical tables presented in the District Statistical Abstract are grouped into 13 parts. The contents of the tables and the scope and limitations of the data displayed under each group are explained below:-

(1) Area and Population:-

In all 7 tables i.e. table Nos. 1 to 7 are included in this section. The data for 1971 census are also indicated in all the tables, except table No. 6.

Table No. 1:- Indicates Panchayat Samitiwise area, number of houses and population according to 1971 Census in Rural and Urban areas of Nagpur district. Total area figures of the district as on 1st July, 1971 are as supplied by the Surveyor General of India. Also the area figures of Urban

areas are as supplied by Municipal Corporations or Councils. For any place to be recognised as an urban area (town) for the 1971 census, it was to have a Municipal Corporation or an area under a Municipal Council or a cantonment or a civil line. If it did not have any of these urban local bodies to administer its affairs, the following empirical tests were applied (a) a minimum population of 5,000 (estimated for 1971) (b) a density of not less than 400 per Km<sup>2</sup> (1000) per square mile (c) 75 percent of the male working population pursuing occupations falling outside agriculture (d) the place should have, according to the Director of Census Operations of the State, a few pronounced urban characteristics and amenities. The area figure in table 1 have been given in square kilometres. One square kilometre is equal to 0.386 Sq. miles.

Table No.2:- It indicates decadal variations in population since 1951 to 1971.

Table No.3:- gives Panchayat Samitiwise classification of inhabited villages according to different population ranges. The term village i.e. (rural area) used in the table denotes a statutorily recognised village having well defined boundary and separate land records. Hamlet, Wadis or Padas have, therefore, not been shown as separate villages.

Table No.4:- gives talukawise classification of towns according to population ranges in 1971 census.

Table No.5:- gives Panchayat Samitiwise number of workers and non-workers in Rural and Urban areas of the district according to 1971 Census and their classification according to standard livelihood classes. The population according to livelihood classes is classified under rural and urban classification.

Table No.6:- The table No.6 gives distribution of population according to (A) Age group (B) Mother tongue and (c) Religion separately for Rural and Urban areas and for district as a whole according to 1971 Census. Here 'Mother tongue' is defined as a language spoken by the persons 'Mother' or the person in his childhood or mainly spoken in the house. Dialects have been included in the main language on the basis of Giersious classification.

Table No.7:- Gives Panchayat Samitiwise and taluakwise details of total population of scheduled caste, scheduled tribes and Neo-Buddhist in Rural and Urban areas with the population of Males Females, under above mentioned categories according to 1971 Census in Nagpur district. The scheduled castes notified for this district according to 1971 Census are as follows :-

1. Scheduled Tribes:- No caste is notified as scheduled tribe in Nagpur district.
2. Climate:- Only two tables are included under this section pertaining to rainfall and temperature at the selected centres in Nagpur district.

Table No.8:- It Gives monthly rainfall and number of rainy days in each month at the selected centres for the year 1975. The data are collected through Revenue Agency. A day is treated as 'Rainy Day' if during the 24 hours, the rain gauge recorded a minimum of 2.5 M.M. of rainfall. Annual rainfall for each centre is also indicated in the table 'Normal Rainfall' is the average rainfall over a period ranging from fifty to eighty years.

Table No.9:- It Gives monthwise, maximum, minimum and also annual temperature as recorded at selected centres for the year 1975. The data are supplied by the Government of India's Regional Meteorological Centre at Nagpur. The maximum and minimum temperature denotes the Maximum and minimum temperature on any day during the month.

3. Agriculture:-

In all 12 tables, i.e. table Nos. 10 to 21 are included in this section.

The table No.10 indicates talukawise figures of land utilisation under the standard heads of land uses for the years 1973-74 and 1974-75. Against each taluka, the break-up of the total geographical area according to different types of land uses is shown. Major constituents of the Geographical area are forests, land put to non-agricultural uses, barren and unclutivable land, cultivable

wastes, permanent pastures, land under miscellaneous trees, crops not included in area sown, current fallows, other fallows and lastly net area sown.

Under 'Forest' are included all actual forest areas of land classed or administered as forests under any legal enactment dealing with forests whether state owned or private. If any portion of such land is not actually wooded, but put to some agricultural use, that portion is included under the appropriate heading of cultivated or uncultivated land as the case may be. Land put to non-Agricultural uses, stands for all lands, occupied by buildings, roads and Railways or under water e.g. rivers and canals and other lands put to uses other than agriculture. Barren and unculturable land covers all barren and unculturable land like mountains, deserts etc.; Land which cannot be brought under cultivation unless at a high cost is classed as 'Barren and unculturable land,' whether such land is in isolated or within cultivated holdings. Culturable waste includes all land available for cultivation whether not taken up for cultivation or taken up for cultivation once, but not cultivated during the current year and last five years or more in succession. Such land may be either fallow or covered with shrubs and jungles, which are not put to any use. They may be assessed or not assessed and may lie in blocks or within cultivated holdings. Permanent pastures and other grazing lands cover all grazing lands, whether they are Permanent Pastures and meadows or not. Village common and grazing lands within forest areas are included under this head 'Land under miscellaneous tree crops etc. not included in the net area sown, are included in cultivable land, which is not included under net area sown but is put to some agricultural land under casurina tree, thatching grass, bamboo bushes and other groves used for fuel etc; which are not included under 'Orchards are classed under the category 'Current fallows' comprise cultivable areas, which are kept fallow during the current year. Other fallow land includes all lands, which

were taken up for cultivation, but are temporarily out of cultivation for a period of not less than one year and more than five years. The net area sown consists of area sown, under crops and orchards, area sown more than once being counted only once. The gross cropped area represents the sub-total of area under all crops. The difference between the total of gross cropped area and net area sown is accounted for by the area sown more than once during the same year, with the same or different crops.

Table No.11: It shows the area under different crops in each taluka. It gives break-up of the total gross cropped area according to major group of food and non-food crops.

Table No.12: It gives yield per hectare and output of principal crops in the district.

Table No.13: depicts the picture of talukawise area irrigated by different sources whereas table No.14 shows an area irrigated under different crops in each taluka.

Table No.15: It shows the talukawise number of irrigation wells in the district. A quinquennial census of irrigation wells takes place after every five years. For any intermediate years, the village officers are instructed to note the number of new wells constructed or old wells, which have gone out of use and thus bring upto date the earlier census figures of number of wells.

Table No.16: It gives Panchayat Samitiwise availability of underground water for the year 1975-76.

Table No.17: It indicates Panchayat Samitiwise as well as talukawise minor irrigation works for the year 1974-75.

Table No.18: It gives the information on major and medium projects in this district. Both completed and incomplete projects have been covered in this table. Position in this table is given as it was on 30th June, 1976. The cost of medium irrigation project as between Rs.25 lakhs to Rs.5 crores; whereas that of a major irrigation project, it is Rs.5 crores and above.

Table No.19: It deals with monthly agricultural wage rates in 1975. This data is collected fortnightly throughout the year from the selected rural centres in Nagpur district viz: 1. Mouda 2. Kuhl 3. Dhapewada.

Table No. 20: It shows agricultural census operational holdings for the year 1970.

Table No. 21: It deals with agricultural implements in each block within the taluka. The implements are wooden and iron ploughs, carts, sugarcane crushers operated with power and bullocks, oil engines with pumps for irrigation purpose, electric pumps for the irrigation purpose, Tractors and oil ghanis (less than 5 Kgs. and above 5 Kg.) according to 1972 Census.

Table No. 22: It deals with famine scarcity and akin to scarcity data in the district for the year 1975-76.

Table No. 23: It gives the position of determination of precarious and other scarcity areas according to the history of scarcity in the district.

#### 4. Animal Husbandry, Forest and Fisheries:

(A) Animal Husbandry: In all 6 tables i.e. table No. 24 to 29 are included in this section.

Table No. 24: It gives Panchayat Samitiwise and talukawise number of various types of livestock and poultry as enumerated in the district in the Livestock Census, 1972. The census is conducted throughout the country on a uniform basis of concepts and methods of enumeration once in 5 years. Precaution was also taken to enumerate livestock in slaughter houses, stray animals and animals in transit. Sex and age groupwise classification of the livestock is also indicated in the table. Table No. 25, 26 and 27: It gives Panchayat Samitiwise and talukawise veterinary statistics, disease wise Livestock mortality and no. of slaughter houses and animals slaughtered in them for the year 1975-76.

B-Forest: The table No. 28(A) gives details of area in different types of forests during the year 1975-76. Data regarding forests under the control of the State Governments' Forest Department and these under the control of the State Governments' Revenue Department are shown separately. The areas under forests are classified according to legal status into reserved forests, protected forests and unclassified forests. The legal status refers to the classification of forests under Indian Forests Act XVI of 1927.

Reserved forests are those ~~which~~ <sup>which</sup> are intended mainly for timber production, wherein the rights of grazing and cultivation are <sup>sold on</sup> allowed. In protected forests, the restrictions are not so rigid. The right of grazing and cultivation is allowed, but certain limitations and restrictions are imposed. The unclassed forest refers to the inaccessible forest or unoccupied waste. The forests which are taken by Government from local bodies or private individuals for management ~~on~~ <sup>on</sup> lease basis are called 'leased forests'. There is no classification of ex-proprietary forests as such, but in Nagpur Division, some private lands containing valuable forest are taken over by Government under section 29 of the Indian Forests Act, which are not yet classified as per tripartite classification and they are named as ex-proprietary. The forest area shown in the Table No.28(A) may not tally with the area under forest shown in Table No.10. The two sets of figures differ due to the following reasons,

1. In the Indian forest Statistics, ~~the~~ <sup>the</sup> whole area including non-wooden area under the control of Forest Department is taken as area under forest, while in Agricultural statistics, it is classified according to its actual utilisation.

2. The Forest Department returns are meant to serve a definite administrative purpose and indicate the ownership of the forest areas and the actual utilisation of these areas is not so important from the point of view of Forest Department, as it is in the land utilisation statistics under Agricultural Statistics.

3. The Forest Department returns relate to financial year and Agricultural statistics relate to the Agricultural year.

Table No.28(B):<sup>It</sup> Gives the information on major and minor forest production in the District during the year 1975-76.

Table No.29:<sup>It</sup> Gives talukawise data on inland fisheries for the year 1974-75 and 1975-76.

5. Employment, Industry, Mining and Electricity:-

In all, 10 tables, i.e. tables Nos. 30 to 39 are included in this section. The factory statistics shown in table No.30, 31 and 32 cover following types of factories

- 1) Those employing ten or more workers working with the aid of power (Section 2(1))
- 2) Those employing twenty or more workers and working without the aid of power (Section 2(ii) and 3) Those registered under Section 85 of the Act. under which the State Government ~~may~~ applicable the provisions of the Act, even though the above conditions are not fulfilled. However, Statistics of the Defence Factories are excluded.

Table No. 33:- Deals with the information pertaining to Annual Survey of Industries.

Table No. 34:- Shows the employment Exchange Statistics for 1975-76.

Table No. 35:- Gives occupational distribution of total registrations and placements in the employment exchange for the year 1975-76 according to Standard National Classification.

Table No. 36:- Shows work undertaken in employment guarantee scheme for 1975-76.

Table No. 37:- Gives the volume of employment in different industries as on 31st March, 1976.

Table No. 38:- Gives the figures of consumption of Electricity during 1975-76 and table No. 39 gives progress of electrification of towns and villages and population covered in the district from the year 1961.

6. Cooperation:- In all 8 tables i.e. tables No. 40 to 47 are included in this section.

Table No. 40:- Gives the number of co-operative credit and non-credit societies, of different types in Panchayat Samitis during the year 1975-76 as on 30th June, 1976 in Nagpur district.

Table No. 41:- Presents data of central co-operative Bank & Urban Banks in the District.

Table No. 42:- Gives Panchayat Samitiwise and talukawise number of Primary agricultural societies, their membership, share capital, Reserve and other funds, working capital, Loans advanced <sup>loans</sup> recovered, loans outstanding and overdues and percentage of recovery to total loan advanced for the year 1975-76. Working Capital includes paid up share capital, deposits reserved and other funds and borrowings,

Loans Outstanding includes outstanding in respect of loans, cash credit and over drafts and the amount of outstanding bills purchased or discounted. Overdues refer to amount of loan or instalments which are due for collection but which were not actually collected and for the repayment of which no extension has been granted by a competent authority.

Table No. 43:- Presents the No. of societies, their membership share capital, working capital and operation respectively for each type of co-operative societies.

Table No. 44:- Shows data Panchayat Samitiwise regarding operation of primary Co-operative marketing societies in the district during the year 1975-76.

Table No. 45:- Gives the data regarding operation of other Co-operative societies of different types in the district.)

Table No. 46:- Gives the value of purchases and sales of agriculture produce through regulated markets panchayat samitiwise in the district.

Table No. 47:- Gives Panchayat Samitiwise and talukawise number of registered money lenders in each taluka and loans advanced by them during the year 1975-76. Separate figures of loans advanced to traders and non traders have been furnished in the table. The transactions of money lending in the state are regulated under the provisions of Bombay Money Lenders Act, 1946. According to the Act, no money lender shall carry on the business of money lending except in area for which he has been granted a licence and except in accordance with the terms and conditions of such licence

7. Medical and Public Health:- In all 5 tables i.e. table Nos. 48 to 52 are included in this section.

Table No. 48:- indicates Panchayat Samitiwise and talukawise number of hospitals, dispensaries, maternity homes and medical facilities, available through public and public aided bodies in this district with the number of health centres and Primary Health Centres, Doctors, Nurses, Valdyas, Beds and total number of indoor and outdoor patients treated for the year 75. The table does include all

the Central Govt. Medical Institutions and also Govt. aided institutions engaged in providing medical facilities. Private clinics run by Private bodies or individuals are however not included in the table.

Table No. 49:- It gives vital statistics such as number of Registered births and deaths in the district. Sexwise classification of registered births death and infant deaths for 1975 is also given.

Table No. 50:- Gives number of deaths due to important causes in Nagpur district during 1971 to 1975. Table No. 51:- / It Gives talukwise statistics of vaccination and revaccination for small pox and Cholera Inoculation etc. during 1975.

Table No. 52:- Indicates number of sterilisation operations done under Vasectomy and Tubectomy with number of I.U.C.D. insertions performed during the year 1975-76 and Family Planning Centres in the District.

8. Education:- In all seven tables i.e. table 53, 54, 55, 56, 57, 58 and 59 are included in this section. The data in table No. 53 is according to 1971 Census.

Table No. 53:- Gives sexwise number of literate and percentage of literacy separately for rural and Urban areas of this district according to 1971 population census. As per 1971 Census definition a person was classified as a literate if he was able to read or write a simple letter in any language.

Table No. 54:- Gives the sexwise educational level in rural area according to 1961 census in Nagpur District.

Table No. 55:- Gives the sexwise educational level statistics in urban areas according to 1961 census.

Table No. 56:- Gives information regarding number of educational institutions according to types for the year 1974-75. Sexwise enrolment and number of trained and untrained teachers in these institutions is also indicated in this table. The classification of institutions according to 'type' is slightly different from stage of education. ~~There~~ <sup>were</sup> at present many Secondary Schools, which also impart education in Primary course. Nevertheless, the entire enrolment of students included under 'Secondary' education. Primary institutions provided education for standard I to IV standard ~~E~~ <sup>&</sup> to VII/VIII or less, and

teach the curriculum approved by the Education Department. The Secondary institutions coach students for standard VIII to X standards with or without lower standards. Higher education is education after passing Secondary School Certificate Examination, which leads to a Degree Examination.

Table No. 57:- Presents data on the number of beneficiaries among backward classes such as scheduled caste, scheduled tribes and other backward classes for the year 1974-75 and 1975-76. Beneficiaries for this table are persons who are getting educational concessions of either type such as scholarships, freeships etc;.

Table No. 58:- Gives number of beneficiaries and financial concession granted to the Economically backward class in respect of Primary, Secondary and Higher Institutions in the district during the years 1974-75.

Table No. 59:- Gives data regarding recurring and non-recurring expenditure under Normal Plan heads by different agencies viz. Zilla Parishad, Municipal Councils Corporations, Cantonment Boards etc. during the year 1975-76 in this district.

9. Transport and communication:- In all seven tables i.e. table Nos. 60 to 66 are included in this section.

Table No. 60:- Gives total railway length as on 31st March 76 according to type of routes Broad Gauge, Metre Gauge and Narrow Gauge. The railway length is measured between the first and last stations within the district boundary. The figures of length of each type of route are therefore, approximate and not accurate.

Table No. 61:- Gives road length according to different categories and surfacewise for the roads of Zilla Parishad and Building and Communication Department as on 31st March 76.

Table No. 62:- Gives the motor vehicles in operation in Nagpur District as on 31st March 76.

Table No. 63:- Deals with operational statistics of Nationalised Road transport in Nagpur division as on 31st March 1976. For this table, the S.T. Division Comprise of Nagpur district only.

Table No. 64:- Presents the results of the traffic census as on May 74 on important roads conducted by Buildings and Communication Department, Govt. of Maharashtra. Data on the number of vehicles is according to categories and location of count-post. Type of surface carriage way, No. of light, Medium and heavy motor vehicles and total traffic intensity in towns per 24 hours are also indicated in the table based on traffic census.

Table No. 65:- Relates to communication systems, No. of post Offices, telegraph offices No. of letter Boxes, telephone numbers, Radio Licences renewed during the year 1961-62; 65-66 1970-71 to 1975-76.

Table No. 66:- Relates to Rural Broad Casting Statistics as on 31st March, 1976 for each Panchayat Samiti in Nagpur District.

10. Local Bodies:- In all 4 tables i.e. tables No. 67 to 70 are included in this section.

Table No. 67:- Gives abstract of income and expenditure of local bodies such as village Panchayats, Zilla Parishads and Municipalities for the financial years 1965-66 and 1968-69 to 1975-76.

Table No. 68:- Indicates expenditure of village Panchayats, Panchayat Samitiwise for 1975-76.

Table No. 70:- Indicates income and expenditure of Municipal Councils for the year 1975-76.

Table No. 69-A, 69-B, 69-C:- Give headwise receipts of Zilla Parishad for the financial year 1974-75 (Actuals) 1975-76 (Revised) and 1976-77 Estimated.

11. Plan and Community Development:- In all 5 tables i.e. Table Nos. 71 to 75 are included in this section.

12. Prices:- Only 3 tables i.e. table Nos. 76, 77 and 78 are included in this section.

Table No. 74:- Gives monthly average wholesale prices of certain Agricultural Commodities at regulated markets during the year 1975 in Nagpur District. Table No. 77 gives monthly average retail prices of various commodities at district head quarters during the year 1975. The average prices under each commodity are shown from the month of January to December for the year 1975 along with units and varieties of commodities for which prices have been quoted. The data are regularly collected by the District Statistical Office, every week on Friday by visiting the selected shops. The average price of each commodi-

ties for the year is also shown in the table. As the information collected for the given commodities is restricted to only one quotation and that too only from one shop at District Headquarter, the average price for individual commodity cannot be said to be fully representative. But the data may prove useful as a broad indicator of the changing trend in retail prices over the period of time.

Table No.78:- Gives consumer price index number(revised) series for working class of Nagpur Centre published by the office of the Commissioner, of Labour, Bombay. Monthwise data for the year 1975-76 commencing from April and also averages for the year 1975-76 have been given in this table. The base year for calculating price Index(new series) is 1960. The Index numbers of wholesale prices are issued by the Economic Adviser to the Government of India. The base year for the same is 1952-53. The method of Construction of the index is given in the Appendix to Index Numbers of wholesale prices in India revised series(1956) issued by the office of the Economic Adviser to Government of India. The equivalent of old Index numbers can be obtained by multiplying the new index by 5.22 as Multiplier.

13. Miscellaneous:- In all 12 tables i.e. table Nos.79 to 90 are included in this section.

Table No.79:- Gives the strength of Police Force in Nagpur district during the year 1975.

Table No.80:- Indicate crime statistics giving classification of offences under cognizable crimes and Non-cognizable crimes with the details of No. of offences, persons tried. Persons convicted and person's acquitted under above categories during the year 1975.

Table No.81:- Gives statistics regarding work disposed of in Civil and Criminal Courts in Nagpur district during the year 1975. The cases decided by the District Magistrate and Executive Magistrate are not included in this table.

Table No.82:- Gives the talukawise classification of cinema Talkies and Theaters during 1975-76.

Table No.83:- Gives the list of towns and villages having District Offices, population covered with list of scheduled banks, co-operative banks and other banks in the Nagpur District for the year 1975.

C H A P T E R -- III

This chapter deals with the stage of development in respect of different indicators during 1974-75 as compared to the stage of development during 1960-61. Wherever the position during 1960-61 is not available, the data during the year nearer to 1960-61 has been utilised for the purpose of comparison. The talukawise position has been depicted wherever possible and in case it is not possible, district position has been shown. The data on agricultural statistics have been presented for the year 1974-75.

Indicator No. 1 :- Percentage of gross sown area to net area sown.

The following table indicates the talukawise comparative percentage of gross sown area to net sown area during the year 1960-61 and 1974-75.

Indicator No. 2 :- Productivity of important crops -

The availability of area for cultivation being limited as compared with the growing population, one of the ways to increase agricultural production is to step up the productivity of land. The productivity of crops ~~exam~~ by and large, depends upon uneven and inadequate rainfall, meagre irrigation facilities large scale soil erosion and uneconomic size of the decrease holding.



Jowar, Wheat, Rice, Tur and Gram are the main food crops of the district, while cotton, ground-nut and chillies are the major crops in the district. The data of productivity for the year 1960-61 which was supposed to be an exceptionally good year and 1974-75 are presented in the following table.

The above table indicates that the productivity of all most all the crops had increased, except Rice, Tur and Groundnut during 1974-75 as compared to the year 1960-61. The percentage was highest whereas it was lowest for Rice during the year 1974-75 as compared to 1960-61, Since the data in respect of Chillies for the year 1960-61 productivity of Chillies could not be compared.

The percentage of net irrigated area to net area sown in Nagpur district was 5.17 during 1960-61, which is increased to 7.03 during 1974-75. Low percentage of net irrigated area to area sown indicates that the irrigation facilities are very meagre in the district and needs to be improved. The percentage of net irrigated area to net sown area has slightly increased during 1974-75 as compared to the figures of previous year for the district as a whole. There was slight increase in percentage of net irrigated area to net area sown in the Nagpur district during 1974-75 as compared to 1960-61. Considerable increase was observed in Katol, Ramtek and Savner tahsils.

The percentage of gross cropped area to net cropped area in the district has increased to 103.49 during 1974-75 over 1960-61 when it was 102.00.

Indicator No. 5 :- Changes in cropping pattern :-

The types of cropping patterns followed, bifurcate the district in two parts. The first part comprises of Katol and Savner tahsils and part of Nagpur tahsil, where Kharif jowar and cotton crops are mainly grown. The other part consists of Ramtek and Umred tahsils and part of Nagpur taluka, where paddy, rabi - Jowar, wheat and linseed crops are predominately grown.

During 1960-61, the area under food crops was approximately four times to the areas under non-food crops in the district. The areas under food crops during 1974-75 had decreased to 70.04 percent from 79.35 percent in 1960-61 in all the tahsils of district. Reverse is the case with the area under non-food crops. The change is due to the tendency of cultivators to grow more cash crops.

Indicator No. 6 :- Increase in agricultural credit and outstanding dues --

Agricultural credit is the backbone of the Co-operative movement even though it has been enlarged to marketing, processing, Industry, Labour etc.. There were 2,097 Co-operative Societies in Nagpur district during the year 75-76, out of which 629 were agricultural credit societies.

The agricultural credit facilities given by the agricultural credit societies, play vital role and have paved a way to bring rapid development in the rural economy. The above table indicates that during the Fourth Five Year Plan, 37.57 percent expenditure was incurred under agricultural programme; whereas an expenditure of 22.82 percent and 22.87 percent in the Annual Plan - 1974-75 and 75-76 respectively. Since minor irrigation pays immediate results as compared to major and medium irrigation projects, more weightage is given to minor irrigation and 19.82 percent 9.57 percent and 17.60 percent expenditure out of the total expenditure incurred during the Fourth Five Year Plan and

and first and second year of the Fifth Five Year Plan respectively. The performance under different sub-heads of development are given below :--

1. Agricultural production :- Under this sub-head/development mainly the expenditure was incurred on intensive area development programme. Under this programme, during the year 1975-76, 4 community wells were constructed and two plant protection appliances supplied as against 4 and 20 respectively in the year 1974-75. During the year 1975-76, 80 goats 37 milch cows were supplied to small farmers and the work of 4 lift irrigation scheme is in progress.
2. Minor Irrigation :- Under this sub-head, four ex-malguzari tanks were renovated, subsidy for 2 new wells constructed for irrigation wells, was adjusted and the work of four lift irrigation schemes was in progress during the year 1975-76.
3. Soil Conservation :- During the year 1974-75 and 1975-76, soil and moisture conservation by contour bunding and terracing was done in the district. During the year 1975-76, contour bunding and terracing on 3,962 hectares was done on the cultivators' land at the cost of Rs. 2,72 lakhs.
4. Dairy Development :- The scheme aims at providing subsidiary industry to agriculturists in rural areas by encouraging milk production and to increase the supply of milk to milk plants. Due to good response from the cultivators, 34,840 litres and 43,000 litres of milk collected during the year 1974-75 and 1975-76 respectively, the Government has decided to construct a milk powder plant at Nagpur.
5. Forests :- The importance of forests cannot be more emphasized. Apart from protecting land against erosion, floods and subsididing by maintaining a fertility, forests are a perennial source of renewable natural resources. Forests help promotion of forest based industries and provide employment. Forests also earn revenue in substantial measure. During the Fourth Five Year Plan, schemes, plantation of fuel wood, general utility timbers, bamboos, farm forestry and development of fodder resources were implemented. Plantation of general utility timber on 50 hectares and 75 hectares was undertaken in the year 1974-75 and 1975-76 respectively. An area of 50 hectares and 25 hectares was covered in the year 1974-75

\* 1974-75 and 1975-76 respectively for general utility timber. Apart from this, four and six kms. road was constructed in the year 1974-75 and 1975-76 respectively, and two works for wild life preservations are in progress and during the fourth five year plan, an amount of Rs. 10.50 lakhs was incurred on this sub-head. ( During the year 1974-75, and 1975-76, an expenditure of Rs. 3.79 lakhs and Rs. 3.06 lakhs respectively was incurred. )

6. Fisheries :- The objects of Government programme of fisheries are to increase production for securing rich and proteinous subsidiary food and improving nutritional standards of masses and to improve Socio-Economic condition of fishermen. Under this sub-head of development, an expenditure of Rs. 5.70 lakhs under the fourth Five Year Plan, Rs. 1.12 lakhs in the year 1974-75 and 1.11 lakhs in the year 1975-76 was incurred. During the year 1975-76, 57 lakh fingerlings were stocked and 62,000 kgs. fish was netted. About 506 kgs. nylon was distributed among fishermen and managerial subsidy to 7 fisheries co-operative societies was granted.

7. Warehousing and Marketing :- During the fourth five year plan, an expenditure of Rs. 2.57 lakhs was incurred under this sub-head of development. Whereas an expenditure of Rs. 1.09 lakhs and 1.50 lakhs was incurred in the year 1974-75 and 1975-76 respectively. During the year 1975-76, 9 A.P.M.Cs were assisted.

8. Ayacut Development :- One of the major bottlenecks for speedy utilisation of irrigation potential is lack of preparation by the beneficiaries for taking water to their fields. During the fourth five year plan, an expenditure of Rs. 0.63 lakh, in 1974-75, Rs. 1.28 lakh and in 1975-76, Rs. 2.03 lakhs was incurred.

II) Co-operation and Community Development :-

1. Co-operation :- During the fourth five year plan, an expenditure of Rs. 32.05 lakhs and during the year 1974-75, Rs. 0.20 lakh were incurred. No expenditure was incurred in the year 1975-76 or under this sub-head of development.

2. Community Development :- During the fourth five year plan, an amount of Rs. 32.05 lakhs, Rs. 3.65 lakhs in 1974-75 and Rs. 4.54 lakhs in 1975-76 was incurred on different activities of development in all 13 community development



III - Irrigation and Power :-

Under this head of development, an expenditure of Rs. 89.34 lakhs was incurred in the Fourth Five Year Plan. Whereas, an expenditure of Rs. 173.30 lakhs and Rs. 136.05 was incurred during the year 1974-75 and 1975-76 respectively.

1) Irrigation :- Out of the total expenditure incurred during 1975-76, Rs. 86.36 lakhs was incurred on medium irrigation projects and works of Kanholibara, Kasarnala, Chandra bhaga Khekranala and Makardhokda medium irrigation projects are in progress.

2) Power :- During the year 1975-76, an expenditure of Rs. 49.67 <sup>lakhs</sup> was incurred under the sub-head of Government. - Out of the above expenditure, an amount of Rs. 15.88 lakhs and Rs. 33.79 lakhs was incurred on urban and rural electrification programme. Under the scheme, 'Rural Electrification', 5 villages were electrified, 68 pumps were energised, 2 industrial units, 1,374 households, 256 public institutions supplied electric connections. Under urban electrification, 4,840 - consumers were supplied electric connections.

IV - Industries and Mining :-- Under this head of development, an expenditure of Rs. 116.31 lakhs, during fourth five year plan, Rs. 47.25 lakhs in 1974-75 and Rs. 46.52 lakhs in 1975-76 has been incurred. Under the scheme of incentives through SICOM, an expenditure of Rs. 29.42 lakhs and under S.A.I. act, financial assistance to 319 industrial units was granted.

For the development of handloom industry, rebates to 189 units, interest subsidy to 4 units and share capital contributions to 16 Co-operative Industrial units were granted during the year 1975-76. All the 13 multi-purpose Co-operative Societies in the district were assisted for distribution of instruments to individual rural artisans. Under 20 point programme, 43 weavers in district were supplied with improved implements at the cost of Rs. 1.80 lakhs.

V - TRANSPORT AND COMMUNICATIONS :-

Under this head of development, an expenditure of Rs. 86.47 lakhs during the fourth five year plan, Rs. 26.97 lakhs in 1974-75 and Rs. 24.23 lakhs in 1975-76 was incurred.

The schemes as major and other district roads, roads in hilly and inaccessible areas and minimum need programme were taken up in the district. During the year 1975-76, 33 kms.kilometres road water-bound macadam and 3 C.D. works, completed.

VI- SOCIAL SERVICES :-

Under this head of development, an expenditure of Rs. 444.30 lakhs was incurred during the fourth five year plan; whereas an expenditure of Rs. 204.52 lakhs was incurred forming 32.57 percent of total expenditure during the year 1975-76. Following table indicates sub-headwise expenditure incurred during the fourth five year plan and first and second year of the fifth five year plan.

1) General Education :- Under this sub-head of development, an expenditure of Rs. 171.72, Rs. 30.92 and Rs. 39.98 lakhs was incurred during the fourth five year plan, 1974-75 and 1975-76 respectively. During the year 1975-76, seven rooms of primary schools constructed. Under the scheme of,

'development of Non-Government secondary school, 331 additional classes were opened by incurring an expenditure of Rs. 15.00 lakhs. During the year 1975-76, 654 primary teachers were trained and financial assistance to three institutions for conducting summer classes for secondary school teachers was given. Six non-Govt. colleges were also assisted by grant of Rs. 4.00 lakhs as establishment grant. Five classes were opened under the scheme 'development of school complex. The open merit scholarships at the rate of Rs. 30/- per month were awarded to 21 students of Arts, Science and Commerce colleges in the district. Similarly, two joint-merit scholarships were awarded to the students in rural areas of the district. During the year - 1975-76, E.B.C. concessions to 12,220 students were granted, for which an expenditure of Rs. 9.99 lakhs was incurred. About 150 prisoners were made literate and free. About 1,780 students being sons of primary school teachers were also assisted by giving free educational assistance. During the year - 1975-76, an expenditure of Rs. 6.31 lakhs was incurred for opening/<sup>34</sup>classes of XIth standar in the district.

2. Health :- Under this sub-head, an expenditure of -- Rs. 7.65 lakhs was incurred as against an outlay of Rs. 1.70 lak during the year 1975-76. During 1975-76, medicine of ;. 6.64 lakhs was purchased and supplied to primary health centres and its sub-centres in the district. The work of construction of rural hospital at Kuhi was completed, for which an expenditure of Rs. 0.73 lakhs were incurred during the year 1975-76.

3. Water supply & drainage :- Under Urban supply scheme, work of Narkhed water supply scheme has been completed by - incurring an expenditure of Rs. 7.78 lakhs. Under rural water supply scheme, the work of one village has been completed and the work of three rural water supply scheme is in progress. During the year, construction of 125 drinking water wells and 22 tube wells in rural areas have been completed.

4. Nutrition Programme :- Under this programme, an expenditure of Rs. 0.44 lakhs was incurred in two community development blocks.

5. Housing :- Under this sub-head of development, an - expenditure of Rs. 74.05 lakhs has been incurred. During the year 1975-76, construction of 3,900 huts for rural landless and 10 persons were assisted for

labourers have been completed and 10 persons were assisted for repairing roofs of their houses.

6. Backward Class Welfare :- During the year 1975-76, an expenditure of Rs. 8.05 lakhs was incurred as against the provision of Rs. 8.59 lakhs under this sub-head of development. During the year 1975-76, 545 backward class students were assisted by grant of tuition fees, 191 scholarships to the students in High Schools, free student<sup>ships</sup> /, 60 students of industrial training institutes, 961 scholarships to post-S.S.C. students of backward classes, were granted. Ten hostels of backward classes were assisted by grant of additional grants. An amount of Rs. 0.37 lakh was incurred for construction of 24 irrigation wells and financial assistance of Rs. 0.48 lakh to 230 cultivators of backward classes was also granted. Financial assistance to 79 persons for starting household industries was granted by incurring an expenditure of Rs. 0.39 lakhs. During the year 1975-76, three housing societies of backward classes were assisted, one Ashram school opened, 17 electric pumps energise for development of balwadis of scheduled tribes and grant-in-aid to ten hostels of backward classes was sanctioned.

7. Social Welfare :- Under this sub-head of development, an expenditure of is mainly incurred for maintenance of one beggars' home having 38 beggars.

8. Labour and labour Welfare :- Under this sub-head of development, an expenditure of Rs. 4.86 lakhs, Rs. 1.23 lakhs and Rs. 8.05 lakhs was incurred during the 4th five year plan, in 1974-75 and 1975-76 respectively for the welfare of labourers

VII - Miscellaneous :- Under this head of development, out of the total expenditure of Rs. 68.54 lakhs, an expenditure of Rs. 58.59 lakhs was incurred under Employment Guarantee Scheme; thereby providing 16.78 lakhs man-days of employment. The average peak labour attendance during this year was 18,214 per day.

TRIBAL SUB-PLAN FOR NAGPUR DISTRICT

Maharashtra Government has identified Deolapar as additional Tribal Sub-Plan area comprising 97 villages in Ramtek tahsil. The main purpose of preparation of a Sub-Plan in the Plan period for the benefit of these people is to identify their special problems and find out workable solutions. The entire tribal sub-plan area of the district comes under the Satpuda belt.

Boundaries :- The tribal sub-plan area 'Deolapar' is surrounded on the north by Betul district of Madhya Pradesh on the east and <sup>the</sup> south Bhandara district of Maharashtra on the west by Paraseoni Block of Nagpur district.

Area and Population :-

1) The tribal sub-plan area is remote, hilly and ~~pxx~~ thinly populated. The total population of this area is 39,658, as such the density of population is hardly 114 persons per square kilometres as against that of <sup>196</sup> persons per square kilometre for the district as a whole. The over-all population of tribals of this area is about 23,000 persons consisting of 4,386 households.

2) The tribal sub-plan area extends over an area of 347.91 sq. kms.. Out of which, 50.23 sq. kms. is of under forests forming 14.43 percent of the total geographical area of the tribal sub-plan area.

3)\* The climatic conditions in tribal sub-plan area are suitable for jowar, paddy and other millets. Consequently, paddy and jowar are the most important crops of this area.

Annual Plan - 1975-76 :- Since no separate budget estimates were prepared for Additional Tribal Sub-Plan area, the outlay for the Additional sub-plan area is to be carved out from the District Annual Plan outlay. The expenditure incurred during the year 1975-76 in the tribal sub-plan area is given below:---

3)\* About 43 percent area of the total sub-plan area is under cultivation and the remaining 42 percent area is under non-agriculture uses, fallow and unculturable lands.

There are 57 tanks including ex-Malguzari tanks. During the year 1975-76, 36.71 percent expenditure out of the total expenditure was incurred on Minor Irrigation and 3 tanks were completed and 484 hectares of irrigation potential created. Afforestation on 40 hectares, forest road of 1 Km. and general utility timber on 75 hectares were planted. During the year 1975-76, about 9.49 lakhs of fish seed stocked and 40 Kgs. Nylon supplied to the fishermen. The road of 16 kms. is under construction for which an amount of 2.29 lakhs was incurred during the year 1975-76. An expenditure farming 0.90 percent, 2.23 percent and 0.47 percent was incurred on drinking water wells, housing for weaker classes and for the welfare of backward classes. Under the scheme of 'Employment Guarantee Scheme', an employment of 2.3.21 lakhs mandays was created by incurring an expenditure of Rs. 10 lakhs during the year 1975-76.
