CHAPTER NO. I

INTRODUCTION

1.1 Introduction and Location :

Nanded district is situated between $18^{\circ}-15'$ and $19^{\circ}-55'$ north latitude and $77^{\circ}-7'$ and $78^{\circ}-15'$ east longitude. The contour of the district is irregular. It is situated on south-east fringes of Maharashtra state demarcating the boundaries of Andhra Pradesh and Maharashtra. It is one of the five districts of Marathwada division and lies in the Godavari basin. As per 1971 census the area of this district is 10,492.0 Sq. Km. and the population is 13,97,672, constituting 3.37% and 2.78% of the area and population of the state respectively. Nanded town, the district head-quarters, is situated on the left bank of the river Godavari. It is a commercial town with facilities of communications. It has a Divisional Office of the Controller of Maharashtra State Road Transport Corporation and two Bus Depots. Besides this, a Railway Station to cater to the needs of the commuters, commerce and trade. The metre gauge track of the South Central Railway passes through the town. It is famous for the monumental Guru Govindsingh Guradwara which is next to Amritsar in India.

1.2 Boundaries :

The district is bounded on the north by Yeotmal district. Adilabad and Nizamabad districts of Andhra Pradesh lie on the east and south-east and Santpur taluka of Bidar district of Karnataka State lies in the south. Osmanabad district on south-west and Parbhani on north-west of the district.

1.3 Area:

The total area of the district is 10,492.0 Sq. Km. Out of which the rural area comprises 10,236.3 Sq.Km. and the urban area 255.7 Sq. Km. It is the seventeenth district in rank in terms of area in Maharashtra State and Visa-vis Marathwada region, it stands at the last rung of the ladder. Within the district, Kinwat taluka is the biggest of all the talukas, while Deglur is the smallest.

1.4 Topography:

As Nanded district lies in the plateau of south India, it is one of the most homogeneous districts in Maharashtra. It does not have any well defined topographical natural zones. The southern portion of the district is somewhat different because of its poor hilly soil. The north-eastern part of taluka kinwat is different because of its extensive mountain ranges and barren and ~~walk~~ unculturable area. The rest of the central part of the district is flat with fertile land of black cotton soil.

1.5(A) Hill Ranges and Forests:

There is only one main system of hills known as Bhag or Thanvari range. It traverses the district from north-west to south-east. There are a few minor hill ranges like Mukhed hill in Bhokar and Hadgaon talukas and Balaghat mountain in Kandhar and Mukhed talukas. This district has various types of forests from sparse and stunted to dense and ever green.

The area under forests is over 777 Sq. Km. forming 8.27% of the total geographical area of the district. Major portion of the forests area is in Kinwat taluka forming 25% of the total forests area in the district. Hadgaon and

Bhokar talukas are also gifted with dense forests area.

1.5(F) Rivers :

The important rivers that flow in the district are the Godavari, Manjira, Manyad, Saraswati, Penganga, Ashna, Sita and Lendi. The Godavari enters the district from the west, passing through the central part of the district, flows into Nizamabad district of Andhra Pradesh. The Manjira which is the largest tributary of the Godavari flows from south to north demarcating the boundry of the district and Andhra Pradesh. The Manyad, flows through Kandhar taluka from west to east and forms the natural boundary between Mukhed and Deglur talukas on one hand and Piloli on the other. The Saraswati rises in Wakhad hills and flows from north to south through the eastern portion of the district and embraces the Godavari near the village Malkautha. The river Ashna flowing in the eastern direction, joins the Godavari on left bank about three kilometres from Nanded town. The Lendi flows from west to east in Deglur taluka. It runs partly along the southern boundary and after taking slightly north-ward course passes through Deglur taluka and meets the Manjira. The Penganga river forms the northern boundary of the district flowing in the eastern direction and falls into the Wardha river in Yeotmal district of Vidarbha Region. The less important river Seeta rises from north and meets the Godavari.

The perennial rivers of this district are the Godavari, Manjira, Manyad and Penganga. The irrigation potentials of these perennial rivers are not fully utilized, except Manyad. The command area under its projects is only 39,772 Hectares.

1.5(C) Soil :

Black cotton soil is universal in all the taluka of the district. It is very rich in calcium, magnesium and carbonates, but poor in nitrogen, potash, phosphates and humous. The high retentivity of moisture has rendered it very useful in rainfall starved region of the district. The best black cotton soil is found in narrow strips of land on the banks of the Godavari and its tributaries.

Good black cotton soil is found along the banks of the Manjara and the Manyad rivers in Biloli taluka, while else-where it is undulating and much inferior in quality and covered with loose stones. The soil of Nanded taluka consist principally of rich black alluvial deposits. Near the foot of the hills black soil is scarce and it is of a very poor description. Deglur taluka though the smallest in the district is endowed with the best soil in the district. With the exception of a small portion of the taluka towards the western direction, the entire soil is of superior quality and suitable for raising Rabi crops. One half of the Kandhar taluka has black and rich soil and grows rabi crops. The other half is covered with hills, small bushes and light soil. It is undulating and covered with loose stones where Kharif crops are generally grown. About three fourth taluka of Hadgaon is highly fertile, particularly the soil spreading along the banks of penganga. Towards the south, near the hills, the soil is rather mixed up with certain saline matter. In the remaining two talukas i.e. Bhokar and Kinwat, except for the hilly tracts, the entire land is of black cotton soil.

1.5(D) Minerals :

This district is devoid of important minerals worth mentioning. The only mineral available in the district is lime stone. The deposits of intertrappean lime stone have been found to occur in Kinwat taluka. The lime stone quarried is not uniform in grade and is highly siliceous. Building materials like deccan trap or basalt, sand, sand-stones and brick clay are also found in this district.

1.6 Climate, Temperature and Rainfall :

1.6(A) Climate :

The climate of the district is dry and subject to extremes of heat and cold. It is very hot in summer and cold in winter. The hottest month of the year is May and the coldest are December and January. Within the district itself, the weather conditions show local variations. Kinwat taluka in the extreme north-east is comparatively more hot than other talukas of the district. There are wide seasonal variations in temperature even at Manded town. Like other parts of the Division the rainy season starts from June and lasts upto the end of September. However, there are scattered and untimely rains in other seasons also. The climate of the district, in general, is healthy though subject to extremes of heat and cold.

1.6(B) Temperature :

Monthly temperature records are available only for Manded station. In the year 1975 the mercury touched the highest point i.e. 43.8 centigrade in the month of May and the lowest temperature recorded was in the month of January i.e. 6.2 centigrade.

1.6(C) Rainfall :

The rainy season commences from June and continues upto the end of September. Nanded district falls in assured rainfall zone of the state with a discount that the same is not evenly distributed in all parts of the district. Usually, 75% of the total rainfall is received from the South-west monsoon (June to September) and 16% from post monsoon period (October to December). Pre-monsoon showers contribute about 7% of the total rainfall and the remaining 2% is received from winter monsoon during January and February.

The rainfall data is available from eight rain-gauge centres located at each taluka head-quarters of the district. The maximum rainfall recorded in the year 1975 was 1332 M.M. in Deglur taluka, whereas the minimum rainfall recorded was 724 M.M. in Hadgaon taluka.

1.7 Development of Agro Industries in Nanded district.

The district being predominantly agricultural in nature grows among other crops, cotton, groundnut, sugarcane, chillies etc. which are important with industrial point of view. Based on the available agriculture resources procession of Industries like Ginning pressing, oil mills and Dal mills are found at Nanded and at a few taluka centres. However, as a result of many minor irrigation projects which have been put into operation besides Major irrigations project i.e. Manar projects, there is continuous increase in the net area sown in the district resulting in increase in the main food crops as well as commercial cash crops. Thus in the recent years some industrial development has taken place and most of the

units are based on agriculture resources, some of the worth mentioning units are as under :-

1. Spinning mill :

The unit has been established in co-operative sector by utilising the local available raw material of cotton. It produces cotton yarn of 20 to 40 counts. The unit has fixed capital investment of Rs. 100.25 lakhs employing 400 workers.

Another spinning mill is coming up in co-operative sector at Umri in taluka Bhokar.

2. Sugar Factories :

Kalambar vibhag sahakari sakhar karkhana, a sugar factory in co-operative sector is functioning in the Dist. at Kalambar village of Kandhar taluka. The capital investment of this unit is 243.63 lakhs with capacity to crush 1250 M.T.s. of sugarcane. About 500 workers are employed in the factory.

One more co-operative sugar factory is coming up at Kerur village of Biloli taluka, which is expected to go into production in next year.

3. Textile corporation of Marathwada :

As a partly integrated powerloom project for Marathwada, the texcom has established a pre-weaving and processing plant at M.I.D.C. Nanded- 48 co-operative societies having 2304 power looms have been organised at different places in Marathwada with centralised processing plant at Nanded. The capital investment of Texcom is 276.50 lakhs employing over 1000 workers in the central processing plant Nanded and about 2300 weavers are employed in wetting sectors.

4. MAFCO :

With a view to assist the farmers in marketing of perishable agriculture produce, MAFCO has established a cold storage and slaughter house at Nanded with fixed capital investment of 51.00 lakhs. It also produces beef and other canned fruits products. No. of workers employed in the unit is 54.

5. Other Agro based industries :

The Maharashtra Agro Industries Development Corporation has set up a unit for manufacture of granual fertilizer at Nanded which will meet the growing demand for the agricultural inputs in the district. Dairy industry, which is an allied agricultural activity, has very good scope in the district. There are nearly 153 primary dairy co-operative societies in the district with its federation functioning at district head-quarters. In order to faster the development of dairy activities and to increase the milk production with an object to provide a source of additional income to agriculturist, a Dairy project with collection capacity of one lakh litres of milk per day has been planned at Nanded. The project is expected to commence its activities in near future.

The abundant availability of groundnut offers good scope for establishment of vanaspati plant in the district. An oil complex with vanaspati as final product is coming up in co-operative sector at Dharmabad.

Apart from above, out of total 421 registered small scale industries in the district, there are 114 Agro based small scale industries in the district. The total capital

investment in these units is Rs. 75.32 lakhs giving employment to over 1000 persons. The activity-wise breakup is as given below :

The economy of the district is mainly agricultural and hence the industries based on demand for items like insecticides, pesticides, mixed fertilizers, agricultural implements including dusters and sprayers, have good scope in the area.

CHAPTER No. II

EXPLANATORY NOTES ON SCOPE AND LIMITATION OF STATISTICS
PRESENTED IN THIS STATISTICAL ABSTRACT

1975-76.

Purpose and scope :

This is the 16th issue of the District Statistical abstract published since 1958-59. As stated in the previous issue the purpose of this publication is to present the background of Statistical material on as many Socio-Economic characteristics of the district as possible, so as to make it a useful reference book. The statistical data presented in this issue for the year 1975-76 will be useful for research, planning or further socio-economic studies about the district. It presents taluka-wise data on various socio-economic aspects for inter-taluka comparison within the district. There are a few tables, for which data for the year 1975-76 were not available. The same have been substituted by the data available for the latest year. Data on similar items for the earlier year have also been incorporated in the respective tables to facilitate comparison and to draw safe inferences therefrom.

District at a Glance :

This table gives a picture of the district in a nutshell. It is divided in two parts. The first part deals with general particulars on various topics like population, agriculture and education etc. The second part presents the data on these items for the district as a whole. The reference period to which the data relates to the district or state is shown against each item through it may not relate to the identical period due to non-availability of data for the same year.

The scope and limitation of the statistical data presented in this issue is briefly described in the following paragraphs :-

(1) Area and population :

Table Nos. 1 to 7 presents population data as per 1971 population census. Table No. 1 gives taluka-wise data on Rural and Urban areas and population of the district alongwith number of inhabited, uninhabited Villages, towns, occupied residential houses and households. It also gives the break-up of male and female population. Table No. 2 shows decadal variation in population since 1951. It deals with rural and urban, male and female population and density of population per sq.km with decadal percentage variations in population. Table No. 3 gives taluka-wise classification of villages according to population ranges in 1971 census. The ranges are (1) ~~1000xxx~~ less than 200; (2) 200 to 499; (3) 500 to 999; (4) 1000 to 1999 and so on, alongwith number of un-inhabited villages. Table No. 4 shows taluka-wise classification of towns according to population ranges with population ranging from below 5,000 to 1,00,000 and above as per 1971 population census. Table No. 5 indicates taluka-wise workers and non-workers according to 1971 census. It deals with rural and urban livelihood classes as cultivators, agricultural labourers and other persons engaged in forestry, fishing, plantation, mining, manufacturing, processing and household industry etc. It also gives the number of non-workers in the district. Table No. 6 indicates distribution of rural and urban population according to age groups, mother tongue and religion. Table No. 7 gives taluka-wise rural and urban scheduled caste, scheduled tribes and

Neo-buddhists population according to 1971 census with its break-up in males and females.

(2) Climate :

Table No. 8 presents centre-wise monthly rainfall, number of rainy days alongwith normal and total rainfall in millimetre during the year 1975. Table No. 9 shows the monthly maximum and Minimum temperature in centigrade at Nanded proper for the calender year 1975.

(3) Agriculture .

The table Nos. 10 to 23 deal with the data on land utilization, area under different crops, yield per hectare, area irrigated by different sources of irrigation, area irrigated under different crops, number of irrigation wells, minor irrigation works, major and medium projects, agricultural wage rates, agricultural implements, famine and akin to scarcity conditions and history of scarcity in the district during the years 1973-74 and 1974-75.

Table No. 10 gives taluka-wise land utilization figures in hectares for the years 1973-74 and 1974-75 respectively. This table indicates geographical area, forest area and land used for other purposes. Table No. 11 stands for taluka-wise area under different crops during the above period, while Table No. 12 gives data of yield per hectare and out-turn of certain selected crops of the district supplied by the Department of Agriculture, Pune. Table No. 13 shows irrigated area by different sources i.e. Govt. canals, tanks and wells etc. in each taluka, in hectares, during the above period. It also gives total net and gross area irrigated. Table No. 14 deals with the area irrigated under different crops in each taluka of the

district during the years 1973-74 and 1974-75 respectively. Table No. 15 shows the taluka-wise number of irrigation wells in use, not in use and other wells during the years 1973-74 and 1974-75. Table No. 16 gives taluka-wise data regarding availability of under ground water during the year 1975-76. Table No. 17 presents information regarding number of minor irrigation works excluding wells. This table also shows number of irrigation works not in use and in use with net area irrigated during the above period. Table No. 18 presented in this publication is meant for giving information on major and medium irrigation projects in the district as on 30-6-1975. It gives the location of the projects, area under its command and area irrigated by it. It also shows the cost of construction of the project. Table No. 19 deals with agricultural wage rates for skilled and unskilled labourers prevalent in the three selected rural centres namely Ardhapur, Loha and Bhokar for the calendar year 1975. Table No. 20 gives data regarding Agril. census operational holding, 1970. Table No. 21 gives taluka-wise number of Agricultural implements, as per 1972, Live-stock census. Table No. 22 shows taluka-wise famine, scarcity and akin to scarcity conditions in the district experienced during the year 1975-76. Table No. 23 gives circle-wise and taluka-wise information of number of villages affected for determining the precarious scarcity condition and history of scarcity during the years 1970-71 to 1975-76 in this district.

(4) Animal Husbandry, Forest and Fisheries :

The table Nos. 24 to 27 furnish the statistical data on Animal Husbandry and Table Nos. 28(A) and 28(P) deal

with forests in the district. Table No. 24 shows taluka-wise livestock population under different categories i.e. Cattle, Puffalows, sheep, goats and poultry as per 1972 live-stock census. Table No. 25 indicates veterinary facilities available in each taluka of the district during the year 1975-76. Table No. 26 shows disease-wise live-stock mortality during the year 1975-76. Table No. 27 gives the statistics relating to number of recognised slaughter houses and animals slaughtered in them during the year 1975-76. Table No. 28(A) shows the classification of forest area in the district during the year 1975-76, whereas Table No. 28(B) gives the quantity and value of major and minor forest products. Table No. 39 presents taluka-wise data regarding inland fisheries for the year 1974-75 and 1975-76.

(5) Employment, Industry, Mining and Electricity :

Under this heading, Table Nos. 30 to 39 present data on employment, industry, mining and electricity. Table No. 30 gives details of each industry, the total number of working factories, total workers classified as males and females and total number of mandays for which they worked during the year 1974. The data presented in columns 6 to 8 relate only to the factories submitting returns, while column 9 for factories not submitting returns. Table No. 31 gives industry-wise distribution of working factories according to working strength ranging from less than 10 workers to 5000 and above during the year 1974. Table No. 32 presents the distribution of factories for each industry by number of days worked during the year 1974. Table No. 33 shows statistics relating to Annual Survey of Industries in the district furnishing the figures ^{as} number of factories

registered, their production, capital, employment, gross out-put in terms of Rupees and value added by manufacture. Table No. 34 deals with month-wise employment exchange statistics of the district for the year 1975-76. while Table No. 35 indicates occupational distribution of total registration and placement in the employment exchange in the district during the year 1975-76. Table No. 36 gives taluka-wise data regarding works under taken in Employment guarantee scheme during the year 1975-76. Table No. 37 gives volume of employment in different industries like agriculture, mining and quarrying, manufacturing, construction, trade and commerce and Transport etc; as on 31st March, 1976. Table No. 38 deals with generation and consumption of electricity during the year 1975-76 consumed for different purposes i.e. domestic, commercial, industrial, public lighting and agriculture, in Nanded district. Table No. 39 shows number of towns and villages electrified upto 31st March 1976 and population covered as per 1971 census.

(6) Co-operation :

The data relating to various activities of co-operative movement in the district is displayed in 8 tables i.e. from table Nos. 40 to 47. Table No. 40 gives number of different types of co-operative societies in operation in the District in 1975-76. Table No. 41 presents statistics relating to co-operative banks in Nanded district during the year 1975-76. This table deals with the total members, share capital, working capital and loans advanced by these banks. Table No. 42 deals with taluka-wise number of primary agricultural credit societies, number of members, share capital, working capital, loans etc., while table No. 43

presents data on other co-operative societies of different types in the district during the year 1975-76, table No. 44 deals with the taluka-wise data on operations of primary co-operative marketing societies during the year 1975-76, whereas table No. 45 shows operations of other co-operative societies of different types during the said period with achievements on selected items. Table No. 46 shows the operations of regulated markets in each taluka of the district during the year 1975-76 with quantity and value of important agricultural commodities marketed. Table No. 47 gives the taluka-wise number of registered money lenders and loans advanced by them during the year 1975-76.

(7) Medical and Public Health :

Table Nos. 48 to 52 present data on medical facilities available during the year 1975. Table No. 48 gives taluka-wise medical facilities extended by the hospitals and dispensaries for the treatment of indoor and outdoor patients. It shows the number of hospitals, dispensaries, maternity homes, health centres and primary health centres. It also shows the number of doctors, valdyas, nurses and beds in these hospitals during the year 1975. Table No. 49 presents the taluka-wise data on number of births, deaths and infant deaths registered in the district during the year 1975. Table No. 50 shows number of deaths occurred due to different important causes like Malaria, Cholera, Small pox, Tuberculosis etc. in the district during the years 1971 to 1975. Table No. 51 gives taluka-wise information on primary vaccination and revaccination with Cholera inoculations in the district during the year 1975. Table No. 52 gives statistics on taluka-wise number of family planning

centres as on 31st March, 1976 inter-alia data on sterilization operations and Intra Uterine contraceptive device insertions, in the district during the year 1975-76.

Table No. 58 gives data on concessions of free education extended to economically backward classes during the years 1974-75 and 1975-76. Table No. 59 shows recurring and non-recurring expenditure on primary education incurred by local bodies during the year 1975-76.

(9) Transport and Communications :

Table Nos. 60 to 66 give information on transport and communication facilities available in the district. Table No. 60 shows the length of railway route in Kms. in Nanded district as on 31st March, 1976 covered by metre gauge. Table No. 61 gives length of roads in Kms. according to category and surface classifications in Nanded district as on 31st March, 1976 under Public Works Department, Zilla Parishad and Municipal councils. Table No. 62 shows the data on different types of motor vehicles in operations in

Aurangabad region as on 31st March, 1976, while Table No. 63 presents data regarding operational statistics of nationalised road transport according to Nanded S.T. Divn. for the above period with number of routes, route distance in Kms., vehicles on road per day, average daily earning, number of passengers travelled every day etc. The information regarding traffic census on important roads in Nanded district is furnished in table No. 64. Table No. 65 deals with number of post office, telegraph offices, letter boxes, post-men, telephones and number of radio licences issued and renewed together during the period 1961-62, 1965-66 and 1970-71 to 1975-76. Table No. 66 shows taluka-wise rural broadcasting statistics such as, number of villages where receiving sets are installed, rural population covered and total number of radio farm forums as on 31st March, 1976.

(10) Local bodies :

This table indicates the sources of income by way of grant-in aid, contribution, donations, taxes, fees etc. and expenditure on sanitation, health, public works, social welfare, administration etc. Table No. 69(A) gives the head-wise receipts of Zilla Parishad, Nanded during the years by way of receipt from various heads under Revenue sections and

Table No. 82 shows the taluka-wise number of permanent, semi-movement and touring talkies with their seating capacity for the year 1975-76 in this district. Indicator No. 1. percentage of gross sown area to net sown area for the year 1960-61 1970-71 and 1947-75.

1.1 A continuous increase in the percentage of gross sown area to net sown area in the district was observed during the period commencing from 1960-61 to 1966-67. During the years under reference i.e. 1970-71 and 1974-75 the percentage of gross sown area to net area sown stood at 104.61 and 103.14 respectively. The talukawise percentage of gross sown area to net area sown indicated considerable variation. In the year 1960-61, Nanded taluka had the highest percentage of gross area sown to net sown area. In 1970-71 Kandhar taluka with its percentage 114.61 stands at the top of the ladder and Kinwat taluka was the lowest (100.21) of gross sown area to net sown area. Similarly in the year 1974-75, Biloli taluka had the highest percentage 109.30 and Phokar taluka had the lowest percentage 100.88.

2.2 It will be seen from the above table that during the year 1970-71 only sugarcane registered sizeable increase in production over the year 1960-61, whereas considerable increase was observed in 1974-75 in agricultural production under different crops, such as wheat, Tur, Gram, Sugarcane, Tobacco and abnormal increase in cotton when compared to 1960-61.

Indicator No. 3 :- Gross value of Agril. Production.

3.1 Agriculture constitutes a major portion in National Income of our country and hence any change in agricultural production affects the level of National Income. Gross

contd.....

value of agricultural production is always studied in the context of the prices which is a relative phenomena.

3.2 The gross value of the agricultural production in the year 1960-61 at the prices prevailing in the same year was around Rs. 16.05 crores and in the years 1970-71 and 1975-76 at the prices prevailing in the corresponding years was Rs. 19.73 crores and Rs. 12.75 crores, respectively. The gross value of agricultural production in the district increased by 22.90% in 1970-71 and reduced by 20.50% in 1975-76 over 1960-61.

Indicator No. 4 :- percentage of gross irrigated area to net irrigated area.

4.1 The taluka-wise percentage of gross irrigated area to net irrigated area in the years 1960-61, 1970-71 and 1974-75 is given below :

The above table shows that the percentage of gross irrigated area to net irrigated area as increased from 103.98 during 1970-71 to 111.61 during 1974-75 in Nanded district. The highest percentage 109.60 and 131.47 is

observed in Mukhed and Kinwat talukas during the year 1970-71 and 1974-75 respectively. The lowest percentage of gross irrigated area to net irrigated area is noticed in Phokar taluka (100.00) for the year 1970-71 and in Manded taluka 104.12 for the year 1974-75.

5.2 The above table indicates that the food crops dominate the cropping pattern of the district covering 67.66%, 65.54% and 65.30% of the total cropped area during the years 1960-61, 1970-71 and 1974-75, respectively. It can be observed that the area under food crops decreased from 67.66% during 1960-61 to 65.54% in 1970-71 and subsequently decreased to 65.30% during the year 1974-75. In the case of area under irrigated crops the percentage of food crops has gone down from 99.88% during 1960-61 to 91.34% during 1974-75 where as the percentage of non-food crops has gone up from 0.12% during the year 1960-61 to 8.66% in 1974-75.

INCREASE IN AGRICULTURAL CREDIT, OUTSTANDING DUES AND GROSS VALUE OF AGRICULTURAL PRODUCE.

6.1 When compared with the year 1960-61 the agricultural credit increase by 320.70% in 1970-71 and 459.49% in 1975-76. Similarly, outstanding dues also increased by 988.66% in 1970-71 and 9158.65% in 1975-76 over the year 1960-61. The gross value of agricultural production increased by 22.90% during the year 1970-71 over 1960-61 whereas the same is decreased by 20.50% during 1975-76 over 1960-61. The details of agriculture credit, outstanding dues and gross value of agricultural production in the district during the years 1960-61, 1970-71 and 1975-76 are shown in the following table.

6.2 It can be observed from the above table that agricultural credit increased by more than four times during the period from 1960-61 to 1970-71, and about six times during the period from 1960-61 to 1975-76. Outstanding dues increased about 11 times in the year 1970-71 and more than about 11 times in the years 1975-76 over 1960-61. The gross value of agricultural produce indicated decrease in the year 1975-76 over the year

1970-71. The percentage of outstanding dues to agricultural credit was 93.26%, 241.34% and 169.34% respectively in the year 1960-61, 1970-71 and 1975-76. The decrease in gross value of agriculture produce during the year 1975-76 over 1970-71 is due to decrease in prices during the year 1975-76.

Indicator No. 7: Agricultural wage rates :

7.1 The agricultural wage rates for the skilled labours as well as unskilled labours employed for different agricultural operations were collected in the district since 1963 at three centres namely (1) Ardhapur (2) Loha and (3) Bhokar.

The above table indicates that the average wage rates of skilled as well as unskilled labours showed increasing trend in the year 1975 over the year 1963. The highest

increase was observed in the Wages of unskilled male workers. It was partly due to the fact that these type of labours were diverted towards the works other than agricultural operations in the nearby urban centres and partly due to imbalance between demand and supply of male labourers for agricultural operations. Implementation of employment guarantee scheme in rural areas is also one of the causes of increase in wages.

8.2 Considerable variations are observed in the live-stock per hectare of cultivable area in different talukas of this district, both in 1960-61 and 1974-75. It varies from 0.83 in Hadgaon taluka to 1.54 in Kandhar taluka during the year 1960-61. It was again the lowest 1.04 in Hadgaon taluka and highest (1.30) in Nanded taluka during the year

1974-75. Livestock per hectare of cultivable area remained the same (1.17) during the years 1960-61 and 1974-75 in the district.

Indicator No. 9 :- Poultry compared to population:

9.1 The ratio of poultry per lakh of population had decreased from 14,807 in 1961 to 8,037 in 1966. whereas in 1972 it showed an upward trend and increased to 10,402 in the district. The highest ratio of poultry per lakh of population was 18,311 in Phokar taluka for the year 1961, 9,590 in Mukhed taluka for the year 1966 and 18,655 in Kinwat taluka for the year 1972. The ratio of poultry per lakh of population was more than the district average in Hadgaon, Kinwat and Deglur talukas and less than the Dist. average in the remaining talukas for the year 1972. The lowest ratio was observed in Nanded taluka for the year 1972.

Indicator No. 10: per capita consumption of Electricity:

10.1 per capita consumption of electricity is one of the best indicators to judge economic development of the district as it co-relates with the industrial, agricultural and other production activities. The per capita consumption of electricity increased from 1.49 KWH in 1960-61 to 17.70 KWH in 1971-72, 31.47 KWH in 1974-75 and 33.20 KWH in 1975-76. This shows that there is a constant increase in the per capita consumption of electricity in the district over the period from 1960-61 to 1975-76. This increase has become 22 fold in 1975-76 when compared with the year 1960-61. This was due to implementation of urban and rural electrification programme in the district. More electric motors were installed on irrigation wells for lifting water and more power connections were given to industrial purposes.

The result was more consumption of electricity both for agricultural as well as industrial uses.

Indicator No. 11 : Candidates enrolled in employment exchange.

11.1 Statistics relating to candidates enrolled and the vacancies notified depict the nature and intensity of unemployment problem. The number of candidates enrolled in the employment Exchange of this district has decreased from 7,094 in 1960-61 to 6,778 in 1971-72, whereas it increased to 9,367 in the year 1974-75 and 9,590 in 1975-76. Similarly, the number of vacancies notified decreased from 1,113 in 1960-61 to 998 in 1971-72 and the same further decreased to 622 in the year 1974-75 and increased in the year 1975-76 to 633 when compared with the figures of 1974-75. The number of vacancies notified per lakh of population decreased from 105.00 in 1960-61 to 84.74 in 1971-72 and 44.50 in the year 1974-75 and slightly increased to 44.53 in the year 1975-76.

Indicator No. 12 :- Increase in in-door and out-door patients treated in hospitals dispensaries & the primary health centres in the years 1960, 1971 & 1975 :-

12.1 In-door and out-door patients treated for the years 1973 and 1975 have increased considerably, when compared with the year 1960. The highest number of in-door and out-door patients treated was recorded for Nanded taluka. This is due to the fact that two hospitals are located in Nanded town, the lowest number of indoor and outdoor patients treated during the year 1974 was in Kinwat taluka. In the year 1975 the lowest number of in-door patients

treated was in Kinwat taluka and the lowest number of outdoor patients treated was in Bhokar taluka.

It is evident from the above table that the strength of students, boys as well as girls, increased considerably in primary and Secondary institutions. Abnormal increase is observed in the strength of boys and girls in higher institutions during 1970-71 and 1975-76. The higher percentage of 706.68 & 1326.41 in respect of boys and higher percentage of 628.30 and 1441.51 in respect of girls is observed for the years 1970-71 and 1975-76 respectively in the higher institutions.

14.1. Road communication facilities increased faster than the other facilities of socio economic development of the district. Increase in road mileage per 100 Sq.Km. is the indicator of the development in this respect. It increased considerably from 3.79 Km. in 1960-61 to 30.91 Km. in 1971-72 and 46.67 Km. in 1975-76. This increase in road mileage can be attributed to the implementation of road development programme taken up in the district under plan schemes.

14.2 No national highway passes through this district. The length of State high way was 290.07 Km. in 1971-72, which increased to 656.93 Km. during the year 1975-76. The length of Major District Roads was 666.08 Km. during the year 1971-72 and the same was decreased to 534.55 Km. in the year 1975-76. This decrease is due to conversion of Major District Roads to State Highways. The length of water bound macadam surface roads was 826.54 Km. and 1013.77 Km. for the years 1971-72 and 1975-76, respectively. The Flack topped surface road length was 450.42 Km. in the year 1971-72 and 513.71 Km. in the year 1975-76. The rest was covered by granular material and lower type of surface.

Indicator No. 15 : Increase in banking facilities
in proportion to population;

15.1 The total number of bank offices in the district are increasing every year. There were 16 offices in 1960-61, 65 in 1970-71, 72 in 1971-72, 75 in 1972-73, 77 in 1973-74 and 83 in 1975-76.

Contd.....

15.2 In the year 1960-61, the number of bank offices per lakh of population in the district was one, whereas it increased to 4.7 in 1970-71, 5.2 in 1971-72, 5.4 in 1972-73, 5.5 in 1973-74 and 5.9 in 1975-76. Manded taluka has the largest number of bank offices in the district. This is due to the fact that most of the banks are located at Manded proper.

Indicator No. 16 : P r i c e s .

16.1 For the last few years an increasing trend is observed in the prices of different commodities. The retail prices of almost all the commodities indicated increasing trend in the district in the year 1975 when compared with the prices in 1963. The following table indicates the increase in prices for the year 1975 over 1963.

C H A P T E R No. IV

P L A N N I N G

4.1 Planning is essential and a pre-requisite for the systematic economic growth of a developing country. Objectives of planning are all round socio economic development of the people and also attainment of economic self sufficiency. It covers the raising of standard of living, creation of employment opportunities, optimum utilisation of manpower and natural resources available. Since the inception of plan we have achieved much in all the fields and more efforts are yet to be made for removing inter-district imbalances.

4.2 Since 1966-67 Annual plans were formulated to meet the urgent needs, the annual plan for the year 1973-74 was the last part of the IVth Five Year Plan. In the formulation of the Vth Five Year Plan, Maharashtra State has given a practical shape to the concept of District Planning. The District was considered as the unit of planning and the Annual Plans for the years 1974-75 and 1975-76 relating to first and second year of the Vth Five Year plan were formulated by the District Planning Board and by the District Planning and Development Council, respectively.

4.3 The total expenditure incurred on all the district level schemes during IVth Five Year Plan, during Annual Plan 1974-75 and 1975-76 was to the tune of Rs.1,584.87 lakhs, Rs.312.15 lakhs and Rs.408.49 lakhs, respectively, as detailed below :-

4.4 It may be seen from the above table that the highest percentage of expenditure was on Agriculture programme i.e. (48.72%) during IVth Five year Plan and (44.26%) during 1974-75 and on Social Services (25.33%) during 1975-76. The lowest percentage of expenditure was on Miscellaneous (0.11%) during IVth Five Year Plan, on Industries and Mining (0.43%) during 1974-75 and on co-operation and community development (1.38%) during 1975-76.

I. Agricultural Programme.

4.5 The agricultural programme comprises of the following sub-heads of development. The sub-head-wise expenditure with percentage (in bracket) to the total expenditure on agricultural programme during IVth Five Year Plan and during the Annual Plan 1974-75 and 1975-76 is shown as under:-

4.6 The above table indicates that the highest percentage of expenditure to total expenditure on Agril. programme was on Minor Irrigation i.e. 51.50%, 48.31% and 63.55% during Fourth Five year plan and during Annual Plans 1974-75 & 1975-76 respectively. The percentage of expenditure was 21.85, 19.27 and 11.68 on Soil conservation and it was 16.54, 24.74 and 14.16 on Ayacut Development programme during those periods.

4.7 Under the sub-head Agricultural production improved seeds of (a) Food grains Jowar, wheat, Paddy, Maize, Others (Gram), (b) Cotton & (c) Oil seeds were distributed to the tune of (a) 11,506/29,081/1,613/59/2,510 (b) 2,392 and (c) 1,623 quintals respectively during Fourth Five Year Plan. The corresponding figures during 1974-75 were (a) 1,359/358/200/ others (Gram) 15 c-quintals and for (b) cotton 354 quintals. Similarly under the schemes of distribution of

improved agricultural implements for propagation, 252 iron ploughs, 482 hand sprayers and 70 foot sprayers were distributed to the cultivators during IVth Five year plan.

4.8 The figures of chemical fertilizers distributed during IVth Five year plan were Ammonium sulphate 21,314 Tonnes, Super phosphate 1,750 Tonnes, Fertilizer mixtures 15,378 Tonnes, Uria 3,996 Tonnes and others (sulphates, Amophospates) 3,742 Tonnes. The corresponding figures of distribution of these chemical fertilizers during the year 1974-75 were 393,138, 3,677, 1,028 and 238 Tonnes respectively.

4.9 Under the sub-head minor irrigation 2,090 new wells were constructed, 917 old wells were repaired, 1,750 pumping sets were installed, 4 Bandharas were constructed and additional irrigation potential of 8,842 hectares was created during Fourth Five year plan. Similarly during 1974-75, 60 new wells were constructed, 12 old wells were repaired, 152 pumping sets were installed, one Bandhara was constructed and the additional irrigation potential of 260 hectares was created. During the year 1975-76, 33 new wells were constructed, 35 pumping sets were installed and additional irrigation potential of 271 hectares was created.

4.10 Under the Sub-head Animal husbandry, 4 veterinary dispensaries/Aid centres and 12 artificial insemination centres were started and 107 co-operative milk societies and federations were formed during IVth Five year plan. During 1974-75 only 5 co-operative milk societies and federations were formed. Under the sub-head forests, the programme of afforestation was taken in 1,999 hectares during IVth Five year plan, in 150 hectares during 1974-75 and in 23 hectares during 1975-76.

4.11 Under the sub-head fisheries, one fish farm was established for inland fisheries during IVth Five year plan. The figures of fingerlings stocked during IVth Five year plan was 27.93 lakhs, where as it was 17.50 lakhs during 1974-75 and 21.00 lakhs during 1975-76. Similarly the figures of fish netted during IVth Five year plan was 4,131.9 quintals, where as it was 2,000 quintals during 1974-75 and 2,010 quintals during 1975-76.

II-Co-operation and Community Development:

4.12 The expenditure on the following two sub-heads, included under this head of development with the percentage (in braket) to the total expenditure under this head is given as under :-

4.13 The above table indicates that the expenditure under co-operation was 31.93%, 55.14% and 34.57% during the IVth Five year plan, during Annual plans 1974-75 and 1975-76 respectively, where as under community development it was 68.07%, 44.86% and 65.43% during those periods to the total expenditure under the head co-operation and community development.

4.14 The programme under Co-operation emphasises the purpose of inculcating the spirit of self-help among the individuals and providing credit facilities and other requirements. The scheme under community development programme envisages socio-economic development of rural population in the district.

4.15 The co-operative societies are the source for providing short-term, medium-term and long-term credit needs of the rural area. During IVth Five year plan, 13 agricultural credit societies were formed by adding membership of 6,856 persons, 2 processing societies were formed by adding membership of 176 persons, 22 industrial co-operative societies were formed by adding membership of 2,508 persons and 5 handloom weavers co-operative societies were formed by adding membership of 216 persons. The agricultural credit societies advanced short-term loans of Rs. 608.43 lakhs, medium-term loans of Rs. 171.40 lakhs and long-term loans of Rs. 10.58 lakhs during IVth Five year plan. During the year 1974-75, the membership of 16,884 persons was added under agricultural credit societies and short-term loans of Rs. 301 lakhs and medium term loans of Rs. 3 lakhs were advanced by the agricultural credit societies. During the year 1975-76, 4 processing societies and 4 handloom weavers co-operative societies were formed and short-term loans of Rs. 759 lakhs, Medium-term loans of Rs. 418 lakhs and long-term loans of Rs. 42 lakhs were advanced by the agricultural credit societies.

4.16 Twelve C.P.A. size community development blocks were continued during IVth Five year plan and during the year 1974-75 and 1975-76 as post stage-II. The expenditure

was incurred only for completing the incomplete works and no fresh works were taken up. Apart from community development blocks, four applied nutrition blocks were in operation during that period.

III-Irrigation and Power :-

4.17 Under the sub-head-irrigation, no district level scheme was implemented in Nanded district during IVth Five year plan. The medium irrigation projects were classified as district level schemes from 1974-75 onwards. The expenditure incurred on these district level schemes under this sub-head during the years 1974-75 and 1975-76 was to the tune of Rs. 23.90 lakhs and Rs. 34.75 lakhs respectively and the work of 6 medium irrigation projects was in progress.

4.18 Under the sub-head-power, only two district level schemes namely " Rural Electrification " and "Normal Development " were implemented. The expenditure incurred on this sub-head during IVth Five year plan, during 1974-75 and 1975-76 was to the tune of Rs. 114.34 lakhs, Rs. 27.46 lakhs and Rs. 48.44 lakhs respectively. During 1974-75, 14 villages were electrified and 490 Agril. pump sets were energised, whereas in the year 1975-76, 23 villages were electrified and 462 Agril. pump sets were energised.

IV- Industries and Mining .

4.19 The expenditure of Rs. 2.33 lakhs, Rs. 1.35 lakhs and Rs. 15.82 lakhs was incurred during IVth Five year plan, during 1974-75 and 1975-76 respectively for development of large and medium industries as well as small scale industries.

4.20 Under the package scheme of incentive for development of large and medium industries, 6 industrial units

were assisted during 1975-76. The financial assistance was also given to one co-operative spinning mill and to one Industrial unit under Industrial Estate development during 1975-76. Similarly financial assistance was also given to 25 and 11 handloom co-operative societies during the year 1974-75 and 1975-76 respectively for development of handloom industries. The ~~xx~~ number of industrial co-operative societies assisted during the year 1974-75 and 1975-76 was 10 and 4 respectively.

V- Transport and communications .

4.21 The schemes under road development were implemented in the district under this head of development. The expenditure of Rs. 124.47 lakhs, Rs. 20.03 lakhs and Rs.24.88 lakhs was incurred on this head of development during IVth Five year plan, during 1974-75 and 1975-76 respectively.

4.22 The schemes under road development programme were taken-up with a view to increase the road length, improvement in the existing roads and construction of bridges and culverts. During IVth Five year plan period, the new roads of 297.69 Km. were constructed and the roads of 86.90 Km. were modernised, 115 C.D. works and rural roads of 116.40 Km. were constructed. Similarly, 12 bridges and 87 culverts were constructed during the ~~3~~ period. During 1974-75, new roads of 26 Km. were constructed, the roads of 23 Km. were modernised, 2 bridges and 26 culverts were constructed. Only new roads of 23 Km. and 15 culverts were constructed during the year 1975-76.

VI- Social Services :

4.23 Multifarious programmes were envisaged to educate ~~the~~ the masses and to provide them with better medical, housing

and other facilities under this head of development with a view to improve the socio-economic conditions of weaker sections of the society. The figures of expenditure incurred on various sub-heads of development, under this head of development, during IVth Five year plan, during 1974-75 and 1975-76 are furnished below .

4.24 Out of the total expenditure incurred on this head of development, the highest percentage of expenditure was recorded on the sub-head-Water supply and Drainage followed by General Education.

4.25 The schemes under the sub-head general education, aim at expansion of educational facilities. During IVth Five year plan, 35 school buildings and 108 school rooms were constructed. Similarly 27 school rooms and 77 school rooms were constructed during the year 1974-75 and 1975-76 respectively. The number of teachers trained was 1,152, during IVth Five year plan and it was 246 for the year 1974-75. 54 primary schools and 21 secondary schools were started in the district during IVth Five year plan. During 1974-75 and 1975-76, one primary school and 5 primary schools were started, respectively. One Bal Bhavan was opened during the year 1974-75. Grants were given to Zilla Parishad for primary school buildings. Under the sub-head technical education, one Govt. Polytechnic was continued.

4.26 Under the sub-head medical and public health, 4 hospitals and dispensaries buildings were constructed during IVth Five year plan period and one such building in each of the years 1974-75 and 1975-76 and 20 additional beds were provided during 1974-75. One building of primary health centre was constructed during IVth Five year plan and one such P.H.C. building was constructed during 1975-76.

4.27 Municipal water supply and drainage scheme was continued during IVth Five year plan, during 1974-75 and 1975-76. Similarly rural piped water supply schemes and drinking water wells under simple measures were taken-up in the district. The housing programme taken-up in the district aimed at providing housing facilities to the persons belonging to low income group and assistance for developing village housing and provision of house sites under extension of goathan scheme.

4.28 The schemes under, welfare of backward classes aimed at grant of scholarships to Backward class students, grants to backward class hostels, propagation of improved agricultural implements, grant of loans and subsidy for cottage industries and housing aid to backward classes etc. Under the sub-head, Social welfare, only one welfare extension project was continued during IVth Five year plan and also during 1974-75 and 1975-76. Similarly, only one scheme of consolidation of I.T.I. was functioning in the district during that period under the sub-head labour and labour welfare.

VII - Miscellaneous :

4.29 Under the sub-head, information and publicity, only one scheme namely extention of rural broadcasting was implemented in the district incurring expenditure of Rs.1.71 lakhs, Rs.0.04 lakh and Rs. 0.09 lakh during IVth Five year plan and during 1974-75 and 1975-76 respectively, with installation of 110 community radio sets in 1974-75 and 27 community radio sets in 1975-76.

Employment Guarantee scheme was implemented in the district with a view to ~~provide~~ ^{Provide} employment to the needy persons from rural areas and the expenditure of Rs.19.81 lakhs and Rs. 80.76 lakhs was incurred on this scheme during the year 1974-75 and 1975-76 respectively.
