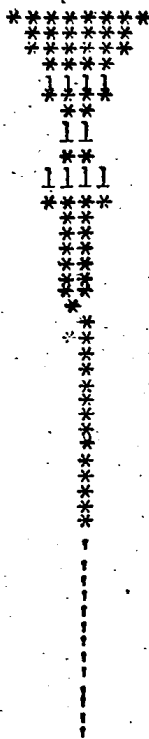

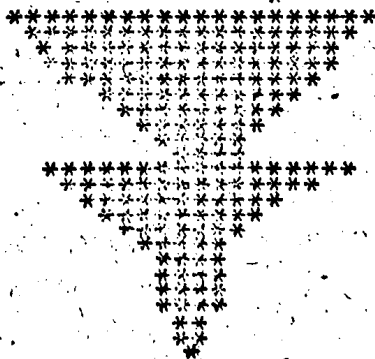

CHAPTER - I

1.1 INTRODUCTION AND LOCATION :

The district of Aurangabad, now a part of the Maharashtra State, is situated in upper Godawari basin and in the extreme north west of Marathwada. It lies in between the parallels of  $19^{\circ} 17' 30''$  and  $20^{\circ} 40' 10''$  north latitude and between the meridians of  $74^{\circ} 39' 30''$  and  $76^{\circ} 40'$  east longitude.

The district forms 5.3% of the total area of the State and 3.91% the population of Maharashtra. A small area in the north and north west lying beyond the Satmala hills is actually situated in the Tapi basin. The northern portion lying between the Satmala hills the central hill range known, Jalna hills is an upland plateau. The southern portion is comparatively low terminating at the banks of the Godawari. In general, the district slopes down towards the south and south-east.

1.2. BOUNDARIES :

It is bounded on the north by the districts of Jalgaon and Dhulia, on the south by Beed district and a portion of Ahmednagar district, on the east by Parbhani and Buldhana districts and on the west by Nasik district and again by a portion of Ahmednagar district. The maximum length of the district from north to south is about 161 Kms. from east to west about 201 Kms.

1.3 AREA :

The area of Aurangabad district as per 1971 population Census publications is 16,200 Sq. Kilometres, the rural area covering 16,059.2 Sq. Kilometres and the urban area 140.8 Sq. Kms. The rural area forms 99.1% and the urban area 0.9%.

The district or any of its talukas underwent no major changes in boundaries during 1901 to 1941. In 1950 twenty five enclave villages of Nasik East Khandesh and Ahmednagar were transferred to Aurangabad district and thus a change in boundary was effected. Consequent upon the integration of Jagirs, the taluka boundaries were reconstituted in April, 1950 and the new mahals of Khuldabad and Jafferabad were created.

Soegaon Mahal was carved out in 1953 by transferring 37 villages from Sillod taluka and 30 villages from Kannad taluka.

With the re-organisation of States on 1-11-1956 the district was transferred from the erstwhile Hyderabad State along with the rest of Maharashtra State.

#### 1.4 TOPOGRAPHY :

In general the district slopes down towards south and south east. The general elevation above the sea level varies from 2,000 to 2,200 feet on the north and 1,700 to 1,900 feet towards the south.

#### 1.5 HILLS RIVERS AND SOILS :

Aurangabad district is divided into the, Balaghat or uplands to the north and Ravanghat or low lands to the south the latter termination in the valley of the Godavari. The hills of Balaghat area continuation of the hill range of the same name in Vidarbha. There are important and noted hills in Aurangabad namely, Daultabad, Ajantha, Chowka and Jyotsna hills. All these have a terrace like appearance with flattened summits. Other hills of the district are Satara, Mahadeo, Maholi, Kankura, Surpanth, Satmala, Ajantha ghats and the Aurangabad hills. Their average height is about 2,000 feet above the sea level but in some places they reach a height of about 3,000 feet also. These hills consist mostly of trap rock with nodular limestone at some places.

The most important river of the district is Godavari which runs along the southern boundary for about 203 kilometres separating Aurangabad district from Ahmednagar and Beed districts. Its tributaries are Purna, Shivana, Dhenda, Dhudhna, Dhamna, Kham (Ganda) (which passes through the heart of the Aurangabad town), Dheku, Khelna, Kundalika, Sauki, Sukhna, Koriwad, Kalkali, Galathi and Jui.

The other small streams and nallas are Yela, Sabhanga Virbhadra, Kasner, Nalni, Dhori, Wagora, Sonuj, Bala Hewra, Arnavati and Guiduth.

The soil of Aurangabad district is black cotton soil of "Regur" formed by the weathering of the trap rock. The geological formation of the district is i) Middle traps of the Deccan territory ii) Older alluvial deposits of Godavari and iii) modern alluvial deposits of Godavari and other rivers forming the upper layer. The black cotton soil is rich in plant nutrients such as lime magnesia, iron and alkalies on which cotton and some of the dry crops flourish well. It swells and becomes sticky on wetting by water while on drying contracts and develops numerous cracks. The soil varies greatly both in its texture and depth. In the hilly tracts in the north it is shallow and relatively poor, but in the south it is deep and fairly rich. In Godavari valley specially along the river banks it is very deep and fertile.

#### 1.6 CLIMATE :

The climate of Aurangabad is pleasant and agreeable during the greater part of the year. The climatic year may be divided into three short seasons i) a moderately warm wet season from June to September ii) a cool dry season from October to February and iii) hot dry season from March to May.

The rainy season which lasts from June to September is warm and pleasant during rains as the temperature does not fall below 17°C. and normally ranges between 21°C. to 35°C. The winter season is comparatively dry and starts from November and ends in February, January being the coldest month of the year. The maximum temperature in the month of May rises even as high as 41°C. Hot dry winds prevail occasionally in April and May. During summer, the days are hot but nights are fairly cool. The climate of Aurangabad can thus be called pleasant and healthy.

During the hot season in 1976 the maximum temperature 40.2° centigrade and 39.1° centigrade were recorded in May 1976, at Aurangabad and Chikalthana centres respectively where as the maximum temperatures recorded in May 75 at Aurangabad and Chikalthana centres were 41.2° and 41.2° centigrade respectively.

The minimum temperatures during the cool dry season of 1976 were recorded as 13.4 centigrade at Aurangabad centre, in the month of January 1976 and 9.8 centigrade at Chikalhana centre in the month of January 1976, where as in 1975 the minimum temperatures were recorded as 8.8° centigrade at Aurangabad centre in the month of December 1975 and 4.1° centigrade at Chikalhana centre in the month of December 1975.

The table below indicates the maximum and minimum temperature recorded during the year 1975 and 1976 at Aurangabad and Chikalhana centres in Aurangabad district.

1.7 RAINFALL :

In this district the rainfall is unevenly distributed in different parts of the district. According to variation in rainfall, the district can be classified in to three tracts, namely (i) where the rainfall exceeds 750 millimetres (ii) Rather insufficient rainfall, with rainfall ranging between 650 to 750 millimetres and (iii) Poor rainfall with rainfall below 650 . millimetres.

The normal rainfall is shown taking average of 34 years from 1922-23 to 1955-56 for Aurangabad, Khuldabad, Kannad, Sillod, Bhokardan, Jalna, Gangapur and Vaijapur and average of ten years from 1961 to 1970. for Soegaon, Jafferabad, Ambad and Paithan. During 1975 the highest rainfall of the year has been recorded at Soegaon centre and the lowest has been recorded at Gangapur centre whereas during the year 1976 the highest rainfall has been recorded at Soegaon and the lowest at Vaijapur. Considering the crop conditions, the rainfall during both the years was below the requirement.

The fact Finding Committee appointed by the Government of Bombay in 1960 reported that the rainfall is not dependable in the following areas which are likely to be affected by scarcity conditions.

Area	Estimated Frequency
1. Vaijapur Taluka	Once in Ten years.
2. Gangapur Taluka	Once in ten years.

Thus the south western region of the district generably recorded poor rainfall is more susceptible to failure of crops due to inadequate, irregular and untimely rains. The rainfall is unevenly distributed in the district leading sometimes to scarcity conditions.

#### 1.8 INDUSTRIAL DEVELOPMENT :

Three Industrial Estates are established in Aurangabad district viz; 1) Jalna Co-operative Industrial Estate 2) Aurangabad Co-operative Industrial Estate and 3) Government Industrial Estate Paithan. The position of industries is given below:-

1) Anglo Americans Marine Co. 2) Gedore Tools. 3) Greeves Lombardirn. 4) Kailash Tobacco. 5) International Converbelt.

Aurangabad district is declared as backward district by central Government, Under this scheme, 72 units received the subsidy to the tune of 61.44 lakhs during the year 1976-77.

1.9 CO-OPERATIVE SUGAR FACTORIES :

There are four Co-operative Sugar Factories in existence during the year 1976-77 which are located at

- 4) Sillod ( Sidhyshwar )

The fifth Co-operative Sugar Factory at Paithan (Santh Eknath Maharaj Sahkari Sakhar Karkhana ) is registered and yet to be erected.

CHAPTER - IIPURPOSE

Exhaustive Statistics about important Socio-Economic indicators have been presented in this Abstract with a view to make the Abstract useful as a reference book. The talukawise figures which have been given in the Abstract will enable the reader to compare the indicators of development between the talukas of the district.

DISTRICT AT A GLANCE :

This table indicates the data on all important items in order to have a birds-eye-view of the Socio-Economic Indicators of the district as compared to that of Maharashtra State. Items covered in the table are Area and Population, Agriculture, Animal Husbandry, Industries, Electricity, Co-operation, Medical and Health, Education, Transport and Communication, Plan and Community Development Programme, Local Bodies and other miscellaneous Statistics. Reference period of the data is also indicated in this table.

1. AREA AND POPULATION :

The data of 1971 population census are presented in table Nos. 1 to 7. The table No. 1 gives rural and urban area, population per Sq. Km. No. of villages inhabited and un-inhabited, No. of towns, No. of occupied residential houses, No. of Households and male and female population in Aurangabad district, according to 1971 Census. The table No. 2 shows decadal percentage variations in total, rural and urban population of Aurangabad district for 1951, 1961 and 1971 Censuses.

The table No. 3 shows talukawise classification of villages according to population ranges in 1971 Census gives No. of villages, in population ranges of less than 200, 200-499, 500-999, 1,000-1,999, 2,000-4,999, 5,000-9,999 and 10,000 and above population in Aurangabad district. The table No. 4 shows talukawise classification of towns according to population ranges in 1971 census in Aurangabad district. The table No. 5 indicates the number of workers and non-workers according to livelihood classes in each taluka of Aurangabad district according to 1971 census.



The table No.6 presents the data of distribution of total rural and urban population according to (a) age group and (b) religion in the district as per 1971 Census. The table No.7 gives information pertaining to talukawise total, rural and Urban population of scheduled castes, scheduled tribes and Neo-Bhuddis'tin the district at the time of 1971 census.

## II. CLIMATE :

Table Nos.8 and 9 deal the number of rainy days and rainfall and monthly temperature at the selected centres in the district. The monthwise information regarding rainy days and total rainfall at selected centres in the district during 1976 is given in table number 8, as recorded at the 13 centres in the district which are also taluka headquarters except one i.e. Chikalthana. The normal rainfall recorded in the table is the average rainfall between 1922-23 to 1955-56 for Kannad, Sillod, Bhokardan, Khuldabad, Vaijapur, Gangapur, Aurangabad and Jalna Centres, whereas for Soegaon, Jafferabad, Paithan and Ambad centres is the average rainfall of ten years i.e. 1961 to 1970 and for Chikalthana the average for ten years i.e. from 1863 to 1972 as the average rainfall between 1922-23 to 1955-56 is not available with the Statistician, Department of Agriculture, Pune. A day is treated as rainy day if during the 24 hours the rain gauge recorded a minimum of 2.5 mm. of rainfall. The table No.9 gives monthly maximum and minimum temperature at two selected centres in the district during 1976.

## III. AGRICULTURE :

Table No.10 to 23 deal with land utilisation, talukawise area under different crops, yield per hectare and out-turn of principal crops, talukawise area irrigated by different sources, talukawise area irrigated under different crops, number of irrigation wells in each taluka, number of minor irrigation works, major and medium irrigation projects in the district, agricultural wage rates operational holdings agricultural implements in each taluka famine scarcity and akin to scarcity data and determination of precarious and other scarcity areas.

The table No. 10 gives information about talukawise land utilisation in the district during 1974-75 and 1975-76 under the following standard heads of the land use. Under "Forests" are included all actually forested areas or lands classed or administered as forests under any legal enactment dealing with forests whether state owned or private. Land put to non-agricultural uses stands under water e.g. rivers and canals and other lands put to uses other than agricultural. Barren and unculturable land covers all barren and unculturable land like mountains deserts etc. Land which cannot be brought under cultivation, unless at a high cost, is classed as unculturable. Permanent pastures and other grazing lands cover all grazing lands, whether they are permanent pastures and meadows or not. Village common and grazing lands within forest areas are included under this head. Under miscellaneous tree-crops and groves not included in the net area sown, is included all cultivable land which is not included under net area sown but put to some agricultural use. Lands under Casurina trees, thatching grass, bamboo bushes and other groves for fuel etc. which are not included under orchards are classed under this category. Culturable waste includes all lands available for cultivation or taken up for cultivation once, but not cultivated during the current year and last five years or more in succession. Such lands may be either fallow or, covered with shrubs and jungles which are not put to any use. Current fallow comprises cropped areas which are kept fallow during the current year. If any seeding area is not cropped again in the same year it is also treated as current fallow. Other fallow land includes all lands which are taken up for cultivation but are temporary out of cultivation for a period of not less than one year and not more than five years. The reason for keeping such land fallow may be one of the following (i) Poverty of cultivator (2) Inadequate supply of water (iii) Siltting of canals and rivers (4) Malerial climate (5) Soil Erosion and (6) Unremunerative nature of farming.

The net area sown consists of net area sown with crops and orchards, area sown more than once being counted only once. The gross cropped area represents the sum total of area under all crops. The difference between the total cropped area and net area sown is accounted for by the area sown more than once, in the same land during the same year with the same or different crops. The area under different crops in each taluka of the district for the year 1974-75 and 1975-76 is given in table No.11. The yield per hectare and out-turn of principal crops in the district during 1974-75 and 1975-76 is furnished in table No.12. The data regarding the area irrigated by different sources in each taluka of the district during 1974-75 and 1975-76 is displayed in table No.13. The area irrigated under different crops in each taluka of the district during 1974-75 and 1975-76 is given in table No.14. The information regarding talukawise number of irrigation wells during 1974-75 and 1975-76 and number of minor irrigation works during 1976-77 and major and medium projects as on 30-6-1976 is furnished in table Nos.15,17 and 18 respectively. The availability of under ground water for 1976-77 is shown in Table No.16. The table No.19 deals with agricultural wage rates during 1976 Operational holdings as 1970 is shown in Table No.20 and table No.21 gives information about agricultural implements as per 1972 livestock Census. The information about famine and scarcity conditions in each taluka for the year 1976-77 is furnished in table No.22. The talukawise information about determination of precarious and other scarcity areas according to the history of scarcity in the district during the years 1970-71 to 1976-77 is supplied in table No.23.

IV/ ANIMAL HUSBANDRY, FOREST & FISHERIES :

The information about Animal Husbandry is supplied in table No.24 to 27. The table No.24 presents talukawise data relating to different categories of livestock, poultry, etc. enumerated at the time of quinquennial livestock Census, 1972. At those censuses all the livestock is enumerated by house to house enquiry. Particular care is taken to enumerate livestock in slaughter houses stray animals and animals in transit. The table No.25 gives information about development activities of the department of Animal Husbandry in the district for the year 1976-77. Diseasewise livestock mortality in the district is given in table No.26.

The number of recognised slaughter houses and number of animals slaughtered in those slaughter houses in the district during 1976-77 is shown in table No.27.

The two tables (table No.28(a) and 28(b) included in this section give details of area under different types of forests and value of different forest produce in the district during 1976-77. The areas under forests are classified according to legal status in to Reserved Forests, Protected forests and Unclassed Forests. The legal status refers to the classification of forests under the Indian Forest Act XVI of 1927 Reserved forests are those that are intended mainly for timber production and in which rights of grazing and cultivation are seldom allowed. In protected forests the restrictions are not so rigid, right of grazing and cultivation is allowed but certain limitations and restrictions are imposed. The unclassed forest refers to the in-accessible forest or un-occupied waste. The data of Inland Fisheries for 1975-76 and 1976-77 is shown in Table No.29(A).

#### V. INDUSTRIES, EMPLOYMENT, MINING AND ELECTRICITY :

The data regarding industries, employment mining and electricity is furnished in table No.30 to 39. The average daily employment of workers in factories in the district is given in table No.30.

A worker is defined as a person whose main activity is participation in any economically productive work through his physical or mental activity. Work involves not only actual work but effective supervision direction of work. The industrywise distribution of working factories according to working strength and number of days worked is supplied in table Nos.31 and 32.

The Statistics relating to annual survey of industries in Aurangabad district for the year 1966 is furnished in table No.33. The employment exchange activities are displayed in table No.34 and 35. The data regarding works undertaken in Employment Guarantee Schemes for 1976-77 is shown in Table No.36. The volume of employment in different industries as on 31st March 1977 is given in table No. 37.

The generation and consumption of electricity during 1976-77 and the number of towns and village electrified and population covered in the district as on 31st March 1961, 1966, 1970, 1975, 1976 and 1977 are given in table Nos. 38 and 39.

#### VI. CO-OPERATION :

The data regarding the co-operative movement in the district is furnished in table Numbers 40 to 47. The number of different types of co-operative societies working in the district in 1976-77 is given in table No. 40 while the statistics relating to co-operative banks in the district in 1976-77 is supplied in table No. 41. INDICATORS OF ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT :

To get an idea of the economic development achieved and to measure the success of economic planning, a comparison of position over a definite period is always helpful. In this chapter an attempt has been made to review the progress of economic development in the district after the year 1961-62 onwards with the help of certain selected trends based on certain important indicators of development.

INDICATOR NO. 1.

Percentage of gross area sown to net area sown.

The percentage of gross cropped area to the net area is an indicator to show the extent of double cropped area. To increase the food production, efforts are being made to increase the number of crops raised during the year. The double cropped area of the district depends upon the quality of soil and availability of the perennial irrigation. The table below shows the percentage of gross cropped area to net cropped area in each tahsil during the year 1960-61, 1974-75 and 1975-76.

It will be seen from the above table that the percentage of gross cropped area to net cropped area, has increased in 1975-76 in Kahnad, Sillod, Ambad, Paithan tahsils as compared to 1974-75. The percentage is highest in Jalna tahsil and lowest in Gangapur tahsil in 1975-76.

INDICATOR NO. 2Productivity of Important crops :

The success in efforts to increase the food production can be measured in terms of the productivity of some important crops. The following table shows productivity of some important crops in the district during the year 1961-62, 1974-75 and 1975-76.

It would be seen that the yield per hectare in respect of all the crops has increase in 1974-75 and 1975-76 as compared to 1961-62 with the exception in cotton.

INDICATOR NO. 3.

Gross Value of Agricultural Production :

As the population of the district depends mainly on the agriculture, the gross value of total agricultural production is the best indicator of the economic development. The gross value of a particular commodity is calculated on the basis of total produce of the particular commodity multiplied by harvest season price prevailing during the year.

In the table below, gross value of important agricultural commodities for the year 1961-62, 1974-75 and 1975-76 is given in crores of rupees.

It would be seen that the gross value of all the crops has increased considerably in 1974-75 and 1975-76 as compared to 1961-62.

INDICATOR NO. 4Percentage of Irrigated area ;

Till the recent years, the cultivation in the district depended on the vagaries of the monsoons as there were no irrigation facilities developed. Whatever irrigation was found that was all well irrigation. Naturally, the Government realised the point that without the development of irrigation facility, the development of agriculture was impossible and then the efforts in this direction were made.

In the following table, the percentage of net irrigated area to net sown area is given for the years 1961-62, 1974-75 and 1975-76.

From the above table, it would be seen that the percentage of irrigated area has considerably increased in all the talukas except Ambad, Gangapur, Sillod & Kannad tahsils.

Change in Cropping Pattern.

Over a few years in the past, there is change in the cropping pattern in the district. As more and more irrigation facilities are available, the tendency to raise perennial cash crops is at increase in the cultivators. Before the monopoly purchase of cotton, more and more land was put under the cotton. But, at present the area under sugarcane is continuously increasing. More and more sugar factories in Co-operative sector are coming up which are giving encouragement to the cultivators to grow more sugarcane. The table below shows the percentage of food crops and non food crops in the district.

From the above table, it is seen that the percentage of food crops has increased in 1975-76 as compared to that in 1974-75, while the percentage of non food crops has decreased. The percentage of food crops was highest in Vaijapur taluka in 1974-75 as also in 1975-76.

INDICATOR NO. 6Increase in agricultural credit and outstanding dues.

The influence of farm credit on the Indian, economy is tremendous and as such it needs to be given a proper place in the planning process. The vast number of small and marginal farmers constitute the bulk of our agricultural population and it is the most significant constituent of the neglected sector by the commercial banks. To relieve the farmers from such difficulties, the cooperative movement has come forward with open arms. The cooperative agricultural credit societies play an important role in financing agriculture through a large net work of primary cooperative agricultural credit societies covering the entire rural population of the district.

During the year 1975-76, the total amount of loans advanced in the whole district through the primary cooperative agricultural credit societies was Rs. 571.10 lakhs and the loans outstanding at the end of that year were Rs. 1217.03 lakhs. The figures for these items for the year 1976-77 were Rs. 688.50 lakhs and Rs. 1258.24 lakhs respectively. In the above table, it is seen that the percentage of loans advanced was the highest in Bhokardan tahsil in 75-76 and in Sillod tahsil in 1976-77. The percentage of loan outstanding was highest in Vaijapur tahsil for both the above years.

INDICATOR NO. 7.Rural Agricultural wage Rates.

The Directorate of Economics & Statistics, Maharashtra State, collects rural agricultural wage rates at three selected centres in the district from the year 1963. These three centres are, Bidkin in Paithan taluka, Ajantha in Sillod taluka and Mahalgaon in Vaijapur taluka. As such tahsilwise data are not available for comparison. The wage rates collected do not represent the actual wage level in the district because only annual averages have been taken for comparison and they too at particulars selected centres. Still they are helpful to know the general trend of the agricultural wage rates in the district for a large span of period.

In the table below, the annual average daily agricultural wage rates at the three centres for the category of skilled and unskilled labours are given.

It is seen from the above table that the wage rates of the skilled labour increased at Bidkin and Ajantha centres in 1976.

As regards unskilled labour the wage rates increased in all the centres. The trend of increase in the wage rates is seen.

INDICATOR NO. 8

Livestock per hectare of land.

This indicator is based on the population of total bovines and ovines. Bovines include cattle and buffaloes and ovines include sheep and goats. The livestock is the major source of power to the agriculturist. The comparison of the livestock population of 1966 and 1972 livestock census population with the cultivable area in the district is given below.

It is seen that the number of livestock per hectare of cultivable land is the highest in Aurangabad tahsil for 1966 and 1972 Census. As per 1966 livestock census the total population of Bovines and Ovines was 13,02,445 and the total cultivable area during the year 1965-66 was 13,95,454 hectares. The same figures for 1972 census and 1972-73 agricultural year were 12,50,224 and 13,89,144 hectares, respectively. It is further seen in the above table that there is a general fall in all the tahsils in the number of livestock per hectares of cultivable land. This was due to continuous drought conditions through out the district since 1970-71.



Poultry as compared to Population :

Poultry is a quick returning livestock which can both supplement the food resources and increase income in rural as well as urban areas. For this reason only poultry farming has been given very much importance in Integrated area development scheme (page scheme) for providing subsidiary occupation, to small land holders as well as landless labours. Under the development plans special efforts are continued for the encouragement of poultry farming in the district.

The figures in the above table show that the ratio of the poultry birds per 1000 population was the highest in Jafferabad tahsil as per 1961 and 1972 livestock census and in Soegaon tahsil as per 1966 livestock census. The range of variation was considerably wide as the maximum ratio was 216 while the minimum was 70 during the year 1972. As per the 1972 livestock census, total poultry population of Aurangabad district was 2,22,309. Comparing this with the human population of 1971 census it is seen that there was one poultry bird for about every nine persons in the district. Thus there is a scope for the development of poultry in the district.

INDICATOR NO. 10

Per capita consumption of Electricity:

Now the district Aurangabad gets the electric supply from the grid system, fed by Koyana Hydro Electric Power Station and Khaperkheda thermal power station. The economic progress goes always hand in hand with the spread of electricity. For the propegation of electricity special funds have been made available through R.F.D. and A.R.F.C. The table below shows the consumption of electricity for different purposes during the year 1975-76 and 1976-77.

Increase in the number of candidates enrolled in Employment Exchange and vacancies notified.

The sub-Regional Employment Exchange office is located at Aurangabad which helps the employers as well as the employment seekers. The number of candidates registered for employment in the exchange and the number of vacancies notified give a picture of unemployment problem in the district. The number of registration indicates the number of unemployed where as the vacancies notified show the employment opportunities created.

It is seen from the above table that the number of indoor patients treated has increased in all tahsils except Bhokardan and Jalna tahsils whereas the number of outdoor patients treated has increased in all tahsils except Aurangabad and Paithan tahsils.

INDICATOR NO. 13.Increase in the number of students.

Aurangabad town, the divisional headquarter, is an important centre of educational activities in Marathwada region. Specially with the establishment of Marathwada University in 1958, there has been rapid increase in the number of colleges. The percentage of literacy for the district is 28.49 which is the highest in Marathwada region. The percentage of literacy for the whole of Maharashtra is 39.2 and for India it is 29.5.

It would be seen that there is increase in the number of students of primary stage of education, but most noteworthy fact is that the percentage increase in the number of primary girl students is more than that in case of male students which clearly shows that the spread of education in girls is more rapid.

CHAPTER - IV  
PLANNING

This chapter deals with Annual Plan review for the year 1975-76 and 1976-77, which are the 2nd & 3rd year of the Vth Five year Plan. It gives broad outline of the different sectors under various District level Plan schemes carried out through the district implementing officers of the State Government and Local Sector for Economic Development of the district.

The total approved outlay for 1975-76 and 1976-77 is Rs. 649.66 lakhs and Rs. 746.93 lakhs. The actual expenditure incurred during 1975-76 and 1976-77 is Rs. 748.67 lakhs and Rs. 1023.80 lakhs. The percentage of total expenditure to approved outlay comes to 115.2% in 1975-76 and 137.06% in 1976-77.

The Major Head wise actual expenditure during 1975-76 and 1976-77 is given below in the table.

The study of table No. 4.1 reveals that the highest priority was given during the year 1975-76 to the schemes of Industry & Mining and about 34.3% of the total expenditure incurred on the same. The second highest priority was given to the schemes of Social Services and about 23.7% of the total expenditure was incurred. Next to these in order of percentages of expenditure were the heads of development of Agricultural programme (23.4%), Irrigation & Power (10.3%), co-operation & Community Development (6.0%) Transport & Communication (2.3%) and lastly miscellaneous (0.02%). During 1976-77 the highest priority was given to the schemes Industry & Mining, and about 36.78% of the total expenditure incurred on the same. Next to the Industry & Mining the 2nd highest priority was given to the schemes of Agricultural Programme (19.98) of the total expenditure was incurred. Next to these in order of percentage of expenditure, were the heads of developments of Social Services (18.67%), Irrigation & Power (13.77%) Transport & Communication (6.11%), Co-operation & Community Development (4.69%) and lastly miscellaneous 0.002%.

It is observed from the above table that during 1975-76 major part of the amount for Agricultural Programme was spent on Irrigation (50.48%) of the total expenditure followed by Soil Conservation (14.12%), Area Development (12.75%), Dairy Development (12.35%), Drought Prone Area Programme (4.45%), Agricultural production (3.55%), Fisheries (1.38%), Forest (0.75%), Animal Husbandry (0.14%) and lastly ware Housing and Marketing (0.03%), while during the year 1976-77 highest priority was given to the schemes of Minor Irrigation and about (47.89%) of the total expenditure incurred on the same head followed by Drought prone area programme (15.51%) Area Development (15.02%) Soil Conservation (10.75%), Dairy Development (4.04%), Fisheries (2.63%), Agricultural Productions (1.98%), Forest (1.24%), Animal Husbandry (0.91%) and ware Housing & Marketing (0.03%).

#### I. AGRICULTURAL PROGRAMME.

The amount of expenditure incurred during 1975-76 and 1976-77 under Agricultural Programme comes to the tune of Rs. 175.39 lakhs & Rs. 204.57 lakhs respectively.

The details of sub-headwise expenditure incurred during the 2nd & 3rd year of Vth Five year Plan i.e. during 1975-76 and 1976-77 are indicated in table No.4.2 above with the percentage to the total expenditure under Agricultural Programme.

##### i) Agricultural Production:-

In order to promote agricultural production in the district the schemes such as seed farm, plant protection, subsidy for Integrated area Development programme were implemented during 1975-76 & 1976-77. Under this sub-head of Development Rs.6.23 lakhs and Rs. 4.05 lakhs were spent during the years 1975-76 and 1976-77 respectively. So far as achievement during the year 1975-76 and 1976-77 of this sub-head is concerned improved seed of 4555 Qts and 18295 Qts were distributed to the cultivators. The Chemical fertilisers to the tune of 15020 tones and 21700 tones were distributed. Compost of 25500 tones and 17752 tones were prepared during the years 1975-76 and 1976-77.

ii) Minor Irrigation:-

Irrigation is life belt of agricultural production and minor irrigation is considered as more economic and suitable to agro-economic development. It is felt that imbalances in the development of Irrigation can be corrected to considerable extent by creating minor irrigation facilities with the aspect in view scheme of construction of tanks, new & old wells, and pumping sets were programmed and implemented during the year 1975-76 and 1976-77, and Rs.88.53 lakhs and Rs.97.97 lakhs were spent on this sub-head during the years 1975-76 and 1976-77 respectively. During 1975-76 and 1976-77 under this programme 4 Tank works and 17 Tank works were completed, with an irrigation potential 2886 Hectares and 2308 Hectares respectively.

iii) Soil Conservation:-

The Soil Conservation is the other programme which helps to increase agricultural production. Exhaustive programme of bunding and reclamation was under taken and expenditure of Rs. 24.76 lakhs and 22.00 lakhs were incurred during 1975-76 and 1976-77 respectively.

iv) Avacut Development:-

During 1975-76 and 1976-77 Rs. 22.37 lakhs and Rs. 30.73 lakhs were spent on the schemes respectively. The area covered was 16,624 hectares and 10505 Hectares, respectively during 1975-76 and 1976-77.

v) Animal Husbandry:-

An amount of Rs. 0.24 lakhs and Rs. 1.86 lakhs were incurred during 1975-76 and 1976-77. During both years 3 Artificial insemination centres were started.

vi) Dairy Development:-

Dairy Development is also one of the means to provide supplementary occupation to the rural population. During 1975-76 and 1976-77 expenditure to the tune of Rs. 21.67 lakhs and 8.27 lakhs were incurred.

vii) Drought Prone Area Programme:-

This scheme is introduced from 1975-76 and an expenditure of Rs. 7.80 lakhs and Rs. 31.72 lakhs were booked during 1975-76 and 1976-77 respectively.

viii) Forests:-

Under this sub-head expenditure of Rs. 1.31 lakhs and Rs. 2.54 lakhs were incurred on different schemes during 1975-76 and 1976-77 respectively. Afforestation for Soil Conservation in 100 Hectares and 150 Hectares were carried out during 1975-76 and 1976-77 respectively.

ix) Fisheries:-

The programme of fisheries is considered as supplementary food for human consumption. It is a nutritional programme providing important proteins. The expenditure of Rs. 2.42 lakhs and Rs. 5.37 lakhs were incurred on different schemes during 1975-76 and 1976-77 respectively. During the year 1975-76 42.01 lakhs of fingerling were stocked and 305 M. tones fish were netted, and during 1976-77 44.00 lakhs of fingerling were stocked and 470 M. Tones fish were netted.

x) Ware Housing & Marketing:-

Rs. 0.06 lakhs was incurred during 1975-76 and 0.06 lakhs were booked during 1976-77.

II. Co-operation & Community Development:-

To provide facilities to the agriculturist the activity of co-operation have been intensified the expenditure of Rs. 36.86 lakhs and Rs. 43.37 lakhs were booked during 1975-76 and 1976-77 respectively.

There are 20½ C.P.A. unit blocks functioning in 12 Panchayat Samities of the district. An amount of Rs. 7.95 lakhs and Rs. 4.64 lakhs were incurred during 1975-76 and 1976-77 on Community Development Programme.

III. Irrigation & Power:-

Under this head on amount of Rs. 77.01 lakhs & Rs. 140.97 lakhs were incurred on continuing medium Irrigation projects and power projects respectively, during the year 1975-76 and 1976-77. The work of Lahuki & Ambadi project is at completion stage.

iv) Industry & Mining:-

Aurangabad district is one of the 13 districts in the state which have been identified as industrially backward. The total expenditure on this sub-head including E.G.S. was Rs. 256.86 lakhs and Rs. 376.51 lakhs respectively during 1975-76 and 1976-77, short term loan of worth Rs. 300.06 lakhs and Rs. 891.82 lakhs was advanced during 1975-76 and 1976-77 respectively.

V. Transport and Communication:-

The expenditure incurred on this sub-head during the year 1975-76 and 1976-77 were Rs. 17.83 lakhs and Rs. 62.59 lakhs respectively. 22.60 kms and 30.7 kms of new road length constructed during 1975-76 and 1976-77 respectively. 17.00 kms 10.0 kms Road length modernised during 1975-76 and 1976-77. 21 and 9 culverts were construction during 1975-76 and 1976-77 respectively.



VI. Social Services:-

This major head includes in all ten sub-heads. The Percentage of expenditure incurred on the programme of this major head during 1975-76 and 1976-77 is shown in the table given below:-

The above table indicate that maximum expenditure of Rs. 93.83 lakhs and Rs. 59.42 lakhs were booked during 1975-76 and 1976-77 on water supply & drainage respectively, and next to this sub-head was general education on which Rs. 31.08 lakhs and Rs. 47.42 lakhs were incurred during 1975-76 and 1976-77 respectively. This indicate that much emphasis was paid upon the schemes which directly related to the basic needs of the people for both the years under review.

General Education:-

During the year 1975-76 and 1976-77 Rs. 31.08 lakhs and Rs. 47.42 lakhs were spent respectively on general education. 500 and 37 school building rooms were constructed during 1975-76 and 1976-77, respectively. 4 and 31 Primary and 1 and 4 secondary schools were started during 1975-76 and 1976-77 respectively.

Technical Education:-

Rs. 0.40 lakhs and 1.47 lakhs were spent during 1975-76 & 1976-77 respectively on Technical Education schemes.

Public Health:-

An amount of Rs. 7.00 lakhs and Rs. 11.28 lakhs were spent during 1975-76 and 1976-77 respectively on construction of Primary health centre, sub-centres and on upgradation of P.H.C. and on training of Medical interns, and on medical grants.

Water supply & drainage:-

Under this sub-head of development, the scheme of piped water supply are implemented by state and local sectors. An amount of Rs. 93.83 lakhs and Rs. 59.42 lakhs were spent during 1975-76 and 1976-77 respectively. 18 and 12 drinking water wells were constructed during 1975-76 and 1976-77 respectively. 12 & 22 villages were benefited by rural piped water supply scheme during 1975-76 and 1976-77 respectively.

Nutrition Programme:-

The total expenditure on this sub-head during the year 1975-76 and 1976-77 was Rs. 0.55 lakhs and Rs. 1.80 lakhs respectively.

Housing:-

The total expenditure on this sub-head during 1975-76 and 1976-77 were Rs. 16.21 lakhs and Rs. 17.82 lakhs, booked by way of implementing different schemes of housing and the weightage was given on the construction of huts for landless labourers.

Urban Development:-

The total expenditure under this head during the year 1975-76 and 1976-77 was Rs. 5.00 lakhs and Rs. 9.45 lakhs respectively. Three Municipal Councils during 1975-76 and five Municipal Councils during 1976-77 were given financial assistance.

Welfare of backward classes:-

The development programme for welfare of backward classes constitute educational and economical uplift alongwith health, housing, and other schemes for backward classes. During the year 1975-76 and 1976-77 Rs. 17.63 lakhs and Rs. 24.77 lakhs were incurred respectively on welfare of backward classes. Different schemes were implemented during 1975-76 and 1976-77 for welfare of backward classes.

Social Welfare:-

The object of the Social Welfare programme is to provide care, protection and relief to persons who suffer from Social and physical handicaps. The problem of Social Welfare is felt more acutely in big cities. The expenditure on this sub-head during 1975-76 and 1976-77 were Rs.0.03 lakhs and Rs.0.54 lakhs.

Labour and Labour Welfare:-

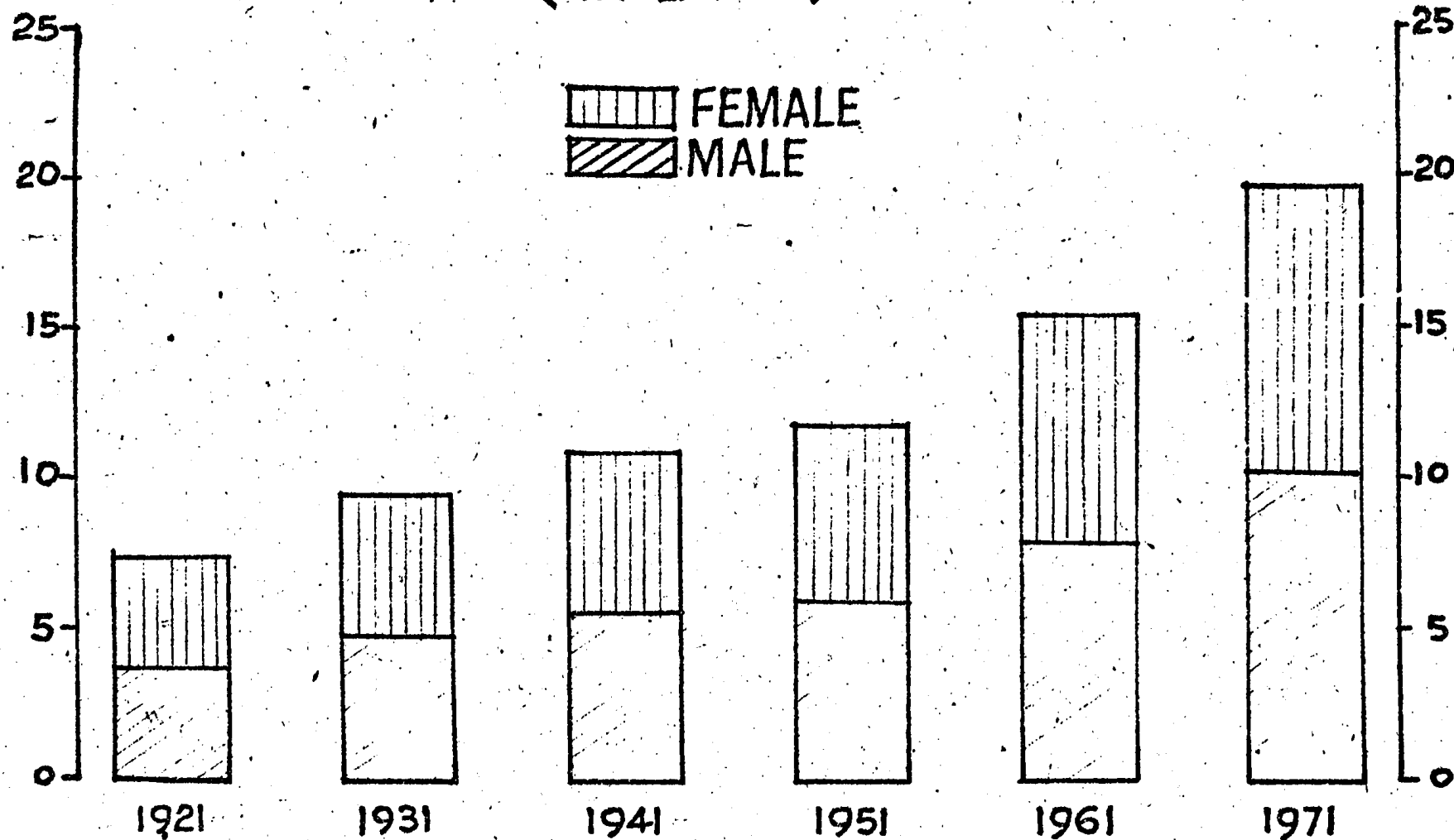
The development programme under this head aim at the improvement of the quality of labour by providing training facilities. During 1975-76 and 1976-77 an amount of Rs.5.33 lakhs and Rs. 17.15 lakhs were booked respectively.

Information & Publicity:-

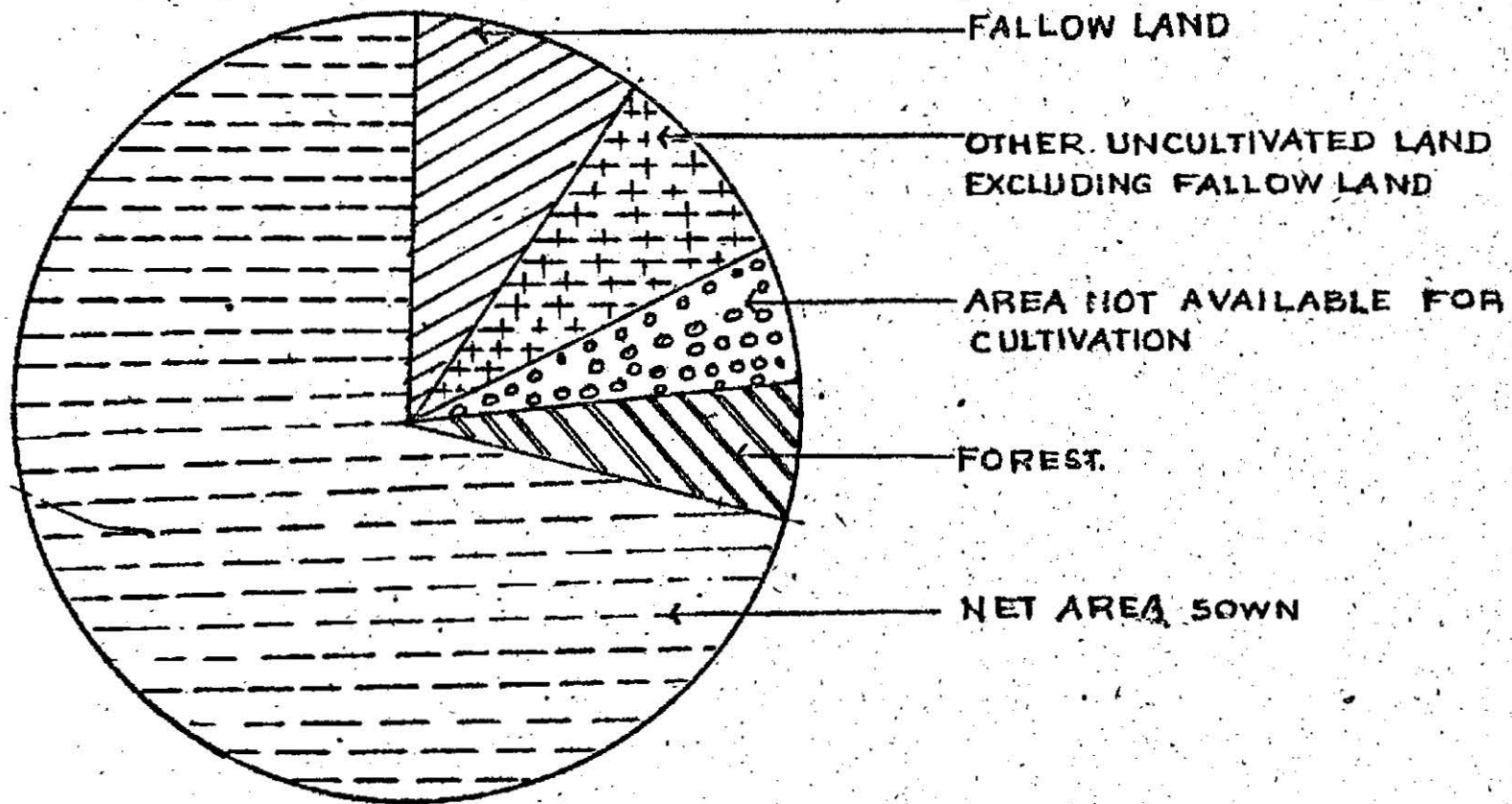
