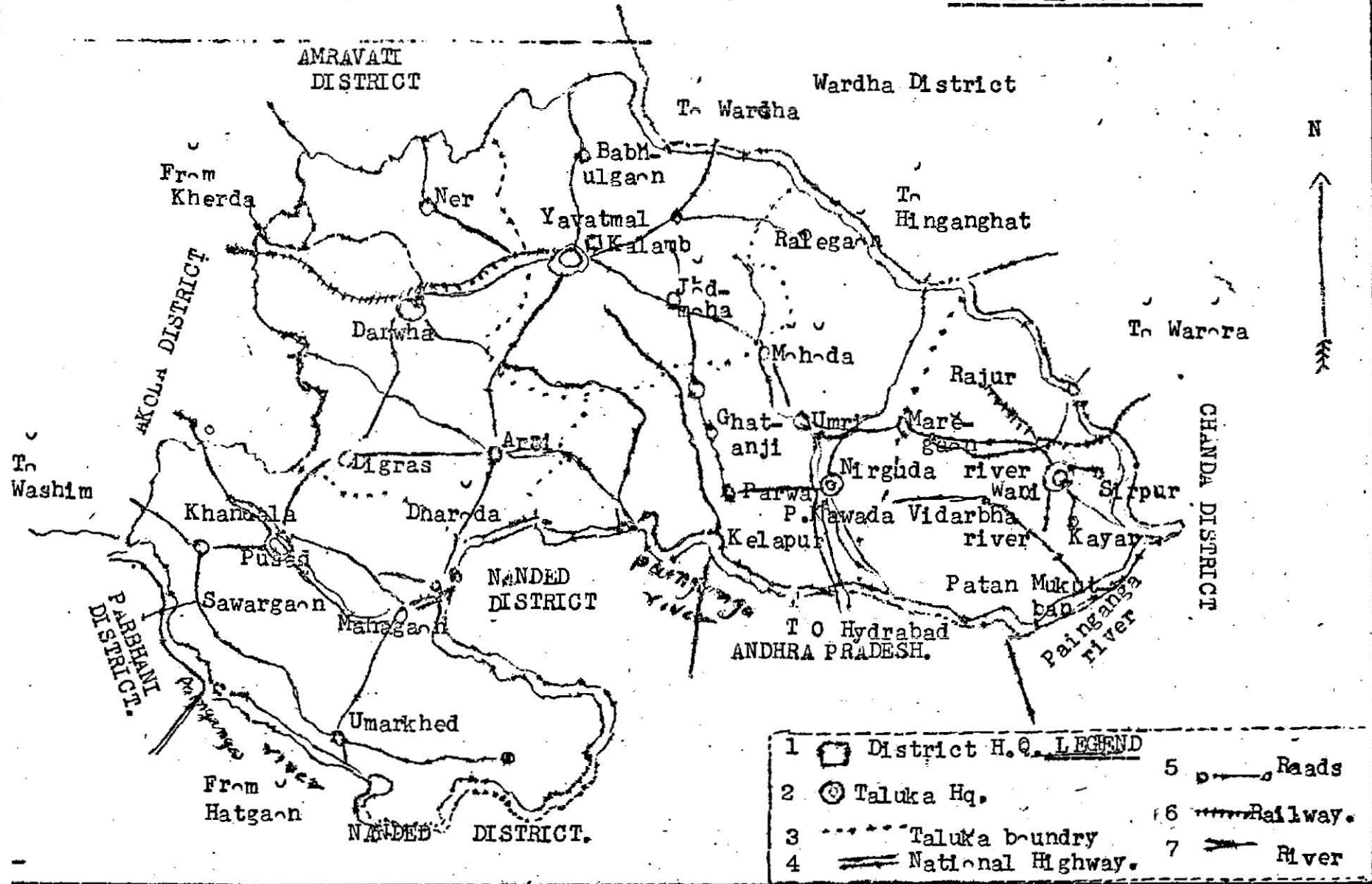

**CHAPTER I**

**INTRODUCTION**

**1.1 Location**

Yavatmal district is one of the eight districts of Nagpur Division of Maharashtra State lying between 19° 26' and 20° 42' North latitude and 77° 18' and 79° 9' East longitude. Most of the district belongs to the Balaghat i.e. southern plateau of Berar. It almost stands in the middle of the districts of Nagpur Division.

**1.2 Boundaries**

It is surrounded by Amaravati district in the North, by Akola and Parbhani districts in the west, by Nanded and Adilabad (Andhra Pradesh) districts in the south, and by Chandrapur and Wardha districts in the East. The district is quite extensive in size ranking second in Nagpur Division while 8th in the State.

The district has natural boundary in the East and South. The Wardha river separates the district from Wardha and Chandrapur districts in the East, while in the south Painganga river separates it from Nanded district and Adilabad district of Andhra Pradesh.

**1.3 Local Bodies, Panchayat Samities and Zilla Parishad.**

The Zilla Parishad and fourteen Panchayat Samities have been formed in the district on 1st May 1962. The Zilla Parishad is responsible for the development of the entire/in the district excluding municipal areas. The Panchayat Samiti covers the area of erst-while community development block. There are eight municipal councils to look after the develop-

ment of urban areas. There are 49 directly elected councillors in the Zilla Parishad. Out of these two seats are reserved for Scheduled Castes and seven seats for Scheduled Tribes. In addition, there are five associated members, who are the presidents of the five different Co-operative societies. An elected Chairman of each Panchayat Samiti is also ex-officio Councillor of the Zilla Parishad. The Zilla Parishad is headed by president assisted by vice-president, both of them are elected from the elected councillors. The Chief Executive Officer looks after the administration of the Zilla Parishad. For the administrative purpose, there are various departments of the Zilla Parishad carrying out different functions. The Deputy Chief Executive Officer (General) works as a Secretary to Zilla Parishad. The Zilla Parishad functions through a standing committee, presided over by the President and six sub-subject committees viz. Finance, Works, Agriculture, Education, Health and Social Welfare.

The Panchayat Samiti consists of elected and coopted councillors from the area of the Panchayat Samiti. The Panchayat Samiti has elected chairman and Vice-chairman. The Block Development Officer works as a Secretary to Panchayat Samiti.

There are 1,119 village panchayats in the district.

There is a Sarpanch for village panchayat who is elected from the elected members from the village or group of villages in that village panchayat. The Sarpanch and in his absence Up-Sarpanch looks after the development activities at village level.

#### 1.4 Area and Territorial change.

The area of the district is 13,925 sq.kms, which forms 14.28% of the area of the Nagpur Division and 4.53% of the area of the State. Its maximum length from East to West is 192 kms. Whereas its maximum breadth from North to South is 160 kms.

Out of the total area, about 94.34% (13,833.2 sq.kms.) area belongs to rural part of the district.

Yavatmal district is among the four district of the old Berar, handed over by the Nizam to the Govt. of India in 1853 A.D. It was a part of East Berar District upto 1862 A.D. A new Wun (Wani) district was formed by separating Yavatmal, Kelapur, Wani, and Darwaha talukas from East Berar district in 1864 A.D. Pusad taluka of Basim district was transferred to this Wun district in 1905 and Yavatmal district was newly constituted in that year. There were no major changes in the constituents of the district till 1955, when the district was transferred from Madhya Pradesh State to the then bilingual Bombay/w.e.f. 30-11-1956 due to State Reorganisation. At present it is a part of Nagpur Division of the Maharashtra State since 1st May 1960.

The earlier reference of Yavatmal is traced back in 'Ejn Akbari' as Yeot-lohara, which was one of the mahals of emperor Akbar. The name Yeot-Lohara is derived from Yeotmal and Lohara. Lohara is a village situated on Amravati Road at a distance of 5 kms. from Yeotmal.

The origin of the word 'Yeotmal' appeared in the grammer book 'Siddhaheim' written by Hemchandra (1088 to 1172 A.D.) and its meaning is hidden in mal i.e. Ghats or hillocks or mountains. Yeotmal is naturally surrounded by hillocks on all sides.

### 1.5 Topography

The district has an undulating topography. The whole district is covered by the Ajantha ranges broken by broad river valleys and partially surrounded by plains. The central portion of the district is a plateau with steep ghats with an elevation of 300 to 500 metres (1000' to 1500') above mean sea level. Both Paininganga and Wardha rivers with their tributaries provide

strips of plains in many parts along their course. The width of these plains varies from 5 to 15 kms.

#### 1.6 Hills, River, System, Soil etc.

The whole district is covered by small east-west ranges of the Ajantha mountains. The offshoots of the Ajantha ranges are, at places, broken by the broad valleys of the tributaries of Painganga and Wardha rivers.

Wardha and Painganga are the main rivers in the district, both of them flow along North-Eastern and Southern boundaries of the district respectively. They have numerous tributaries traversing in the middle of the district. The bed of the Wardha river is broad and deep, still the banks suffer from floods many a times. Wardha has two tributaries viz. Bembla and Nirguda has its entire course in Wani tahil, while the Bembla flows across the north of Yavatmal tahsil below the ghats.

The other river Painganga has six important tributaries viz. Pus, Arunavati, Adan, Waghadi, Khuni and Vidarbha. Pus flows through Pusad tahsil, Arunavati and Adan through Darwaha tahsil and Vidarbha flows through Wani tahsil. All the rivers with their tributaries maintain their flow for a greater part of the year and assist drainage system of the soil.

The soils in the district as a whole are uniformly good in texture, but vary in colour from black to dark brown. They are, however, slightly inferior in fertility to those in Akola and Amravati districts. The soils of the district, mainly suffer from the mixture of pieces of Churkhadi (Lime-stone), sloping surfaces and excessive admixture of sand. However, the soil varies from very fertile alluvial tracts in the valleys to hills and hard parts on the plateaus.

In Wani taluka the soil is uniform but coarse in texture and of a redish colour. In Kelapur tahsil and central

and southern parts of Yavatmal tahsil and hilly parts of Pusad tahsil, the soils are coarse gravelly of loose friable texture and of a colour varying from light brown to grey. The rich fertile alluvial soils are found in western parts of Yavatmal tahsil and in middle of Darwha and Pusad tahsils.

The district can be divided into three natural zones, viz. 1) the Bembla-Wardha basin in the North, 2) the plateau portion at the central and in the southwest part of the district and 3) the plain fertile lands of the Pus-Painganga basin in the south.

#### 1.7 Minerals.

Limestones and coal are the only important minerals found in the district. The limestone in cement grade variety is found near Chanakha in Kelapur tahsil. The estimated reserves are about 39 million tonnes. There is only one coal field near Pilsaon in Wani tahsil; extending over 31.08 Sq.kms. As regards coal, the reserves are estimated at 240 million tonnes and there is one colliery at Rajur exploiting coal.

#### 1.8 Climate, Temperature and Rainfall.

The climate of the district is in general hot and dry. The temperature ranges from 6.2 C to 34.0 C in Winter and 18.4 C to 44.2 C in summer during 1973.

The south west monsoon brings rains to the district. The rainy season lasts from June to October. The intensity of rainfall is highest in the month of August. The normal rainfall varies from 910 mms (31.5 inches) to 1260 mms (49.5 inches). In the past few years the monsoon is very irregular and it is also not uniform in the district. Darwha tahsil gets lowest rains on an average of about 889 mms. (35 inches) while Wani tahsil gets maximum rains about 1125 mms. (45 inches). The central region covering Yavatmal tahsil gets on an average nearly 1099 mms. (42 inches) of rains.

In the year 1975 Wani tahsil got about 1275.3 mms. of rains while Yavatmal tahsil got about 1252 mms. of rains. In the remaining talukas rainfall varied from 916.9 to 1136.2 mms. during this year.

### 1.9 Demography

The total population of the district is 14,23,677 as per 1971 census. The percentage of increase in the population of the district works out to 29.61 % in the last decade. The density of the population increased from 79 persons per sq.km (210 per sq.mile) in 1961 to 102 persons per sq.km. (272 persons per sq.mile) in 1971. Similarly the literacy percentage also increased from 23.48 % to 31.56 % during the decade. The progress made in the literacy is outstanding in context to the large tribal population and a small (13.65% of the total population) proportion of urban population. As regards working force in the district it is seen that there were 43.32% workers enumerated in the total population of the district at 1971 census. Out of the total working population in the district 26.50% are engaged as cultivators, 57.52% as agricultural labourers and 15.98% in different services. The remaining 56.68 % population of the district was non-workers including dependents.

### 1.10 Special features- Latest and important Development in the district.

Yavatmal is one of the industrially backward districts of Vidarbha Region which itself is industrially under developed region of the Maharashtra State. There is a meagre number of large sized industries which are almost entirely based on cotton and oil seeds in this district. The cottage and traditional village industries like smithy, carpentry, pottery, weaving, oil crushing, basketry, shoe making, rope making, bricks and tiles making are still

existing. There are number of small scale industries like ginning and pressing, oil mills, Saw mills, lime factories established mostly at taluka headquarters.

Major type of industries are agriculture based like oil and dal mills, cotton and ginning and pressing and food processing constituting nearly 30% of the total units. The forest based industries like saw mills are seen mostly concentrated in Yavatmal, Darwaha and Wani talukas and account for 20% of the total units. The lime manufacturing units are almost entirely concentrated in Wani taluka as it abounds in lime stone deposits. The building material units especially the brick kilns are also significant in Wani and Yavatmal talukas. The engineering fabrication and structural industry mainly in the form of work shops including welding and other repairing units constitutes single largest group. These units seem to be located in semi-urban areas of Yavatmal, Darwaha and pusad talukas. The oil mills and cotton processing units provide business to these workshops. The food processing and beverage units mostly include manufacturing of soda-water, bakery and one cattle feed manufacturing unit. Nearly 40% of the total units are located at Yavatmal proper.

There was <sup>not</sup> a single large industry in this district till the end of the year 1969. Three large scale industries in cooperative sector have come up later, These are -

1. Yavatmal Zilla Sahakari Soot and Kapad Girni Maryadit, Pusad.
2. Vasant Sahakari Shetkari Soot and Kapad Girni Maryadit, Pamharkawada.
3. Vasant Sahakari Sakhar Karkhana Phophali, Taluka-Pusad.

A fourth unit viz. a cement factory in the large scale sector is proposed to be set up at Chanakha in Wani taluka. M/s Cement and chemicals India Ltd. Madras has been granted an Industrial licence for the production of portland cement and the capacity licensed was 3,30,000 tonnes per annum. The licence has not been



implemented as yet. Similarly a closed coalmine at Rajur in Wani Taluka has been reopened under nationalisation programme of non-cooking coal industry.

The Vasant Sahakari Sahkar Karkhana at Phophali in Pusad taluka is running and created an employment opportunities for about 300 workers. The membership of this factory was 4333 with paid up share capital of Rs.113.68 lakhs in the year 1976-77. 1,13,018 bags of sugar was produced in the year 1976-77 in this factory.

The Yavatmal Zilla Sahakari Soot and Kapad Girni Pusad and Vasant Sahakari Shetkari Soot and Kapad Girni Pandharkanda had membership of 11572 and 11431 with paid up share capital of Rs.125.56 lakhs and Rs.119.23 lakhs respectively at the end of the year 1976-77. Number of spindle licensed at Pusad is 50,000 and that at Pandharkawada is 12,000. However installed Spindlage is 25,000 and 11,722 respectively. After December 1975 the textile unit at Pandharkawada was closed on account of heavy losses. The textile unit at Pusad was not working properly. The unit produced yarn of the count 245 to 345. During the year 1976-77 the production of yarn was 890 M. Tonnes costing Rs.163.43 lakhs.

The District Cooperative Industrialisation and Development society was registered in the year 1965 with an object of starting industrial units in the district which will give employment to landless labourers. The society works purely on the financial assistance from the Govt. of Maharashtra. It received grant of Rs.10.65 lakhs for the implementation of six schemes viz. 1. Hydraulic lime, 2. Manslove tiles, 3. Building bricks, 4. Bone mill, 5. Spun pipes, 6. Fertilizer mixtures. Out of these six schemes the society is now implementing the scheme for the manufacture of RCC spun pipes at village Lohara.

During the year of report there was no production in the factory at Lohara.

Recently one industrial estate sponsored by M.I. D.C. having 26 members has come up near village Lohara about 8 kms. from the district headquarter. This estate will provide opportunities for opening up of new industries in this district.

There were 6,03,034 total workers in this district as per 1971 population census. Out of these workers 12,000 workers were engaged in household industries. At the end of the year 1976 there were 97 registered factories having 5623 workers in this district. Out of these 97 factories, 66 factories were working and 21 factories were closed.

The forest area is spread in large patches over all talukas of the district. The total area under forest in the district is 2,51,010 Hectares and accounts for nearly 19% of the geographical area of the district. The teak, bamboo, grass and fire wood are some of the important forest produce. There is a large scope for establishing forest based industries in this district.

There are in all 126 tanks in this district. Out of these 102 tanks are fit for Pisciculture. At the end of the year 1976-77 the number of tanks covered under pisciculture was 85 and the production of fish was 357 M. Tonnes. Efforts are being made to cover all the tanks under pisciculture. The work of one major Irrigation project viz. 1. Upper Painganga project has been started during the year 1974-75 and will be completed by 1984. The gross command area of this project is 1,69,078 hectares.

At the end of the year 1976-77, the works of the following five medium irrigation projects were in progress.

- 1. Goki River project.
- 2. Baghadl River project.

3. Lower pus project.
2. Sakhal Nala project.
5. Adan River project (Pimpri-Barwat).

The works of Saikhed, Nignoor, Pusad and <sup>Takli</sup> Sakhal projects have been completed. The gross command area of these projects is 84,267 hectares. Pusad project is taken up as major project instead of medium project.

The Bharatiya Agrar Industries Foundation Urali-Kanchan has taken up the Cross breeding programme of cows in this district during this year. One centre has been opened at village Dhanki in pusad taluka and there is a proposal to open such eight centres in near future.

The Sadguru Sewa Sangh Trust Bombay has taken up the programme of distribution of 'Sukadi' to the school-going children. This trust has proposed to take rural reconstruction programme in some villages in pusad taluka of this district.

A proposal to start a small unit of hand made paper industry at village Waghapur near Yavatmal is in offing.

Tribals are the weakest amongst the weaker sections of the society and because of their poverty and seclusion they could not derive the benefit of the various schemes. Implemented during the past four five Year plans to the extent desired. With a view, therefore, to removing this shortcoming, the Government of India have decided to ensure the development of the tribal people by formulating a special sub-plan for the Tribal area. According to the directions and guidelines received from the Government of India from time to time the State Government had prepared a separate sub-plan for Tribals in this State covering 6818 villages from 56 tahsils of 12 districts.

The State Government felt that in addition to the villages approved by the Government of India a large number of villages are

required to be included in the Tribal sub-plan area, though these do not fit for such inclusion strictly according to the guidelines formulated by the Government of India. The Tribal sub-plan formulated by the State Government, therefore, comprises identified villages. The programme in these areas not approved by the Government of India will be financed entirely from the State funds. Accordingly 285 villages in the tahsils of Wan and Kelapur are included in Tribal sub-plan area and 189 villages in the tahsils of Yavatmal and Pusad are included in Additional Tribal sub-plan area. Thus 474 villages and one Municipal Town of Pandharkawada are included in this plan for the uplift of the tribals in this district and as such separate plan provision is made during this year. Removal of exploitative practices, constitutes an important aspect in these tribal areas. With this end in view Government has recently taken steps through appropriate legislation to (i) prevent alienation of tribals' lands to non-tribals and (ii) return to the tribals their lands alienated to non-tribals.

The money lenders and traders have been exploiting the tribals. And this is one reason why the benefits of the plan efforts could not fully reach the tribals. Government has already taken steps through a recent legislation to give total relief for debts to schedule tribes and certain categories. Establishment of Adiwasi co-operative societies to meet the credit, marketing and other requirements in the areas will fill in the void created by the ousting of money lenders. Fourteen such Adiwasi co-operative societies are being organised in Tribal sub-plan area of this district.

CHAPTER II

Explanatory notes on the scope and limitations of the  
the Statistical data presented in the Part II District  
Statistical Abstract.

I. Purpose

The Statistical abstract part of this publication contains exhaustive statistical data on important socio-economic aspects. Tables on almost all important topics are presented in this part, so that this publication could serve as reference book for various purposes. Panchayat Samitiwise and tahsilwise information has <sup>been</sup> furnished where ever possible for inter-panchayat samiti or inter-tahsil comparison. The data presented in this publications <sup>is</sup> pertains to the year 1976-77 and 1975-76. The data for the <sup>is</sup> latest available year have been given, where the data for the year 1976-77 could not be presented. The latest available data of population census 1971 and Live stock census 1972 have been indicated.

Almost all data have been collected from the concerned State and Central Government Offices, Local bodies and other relevant agencies. The foot notes below each table indicate the source from which the data have been collected.

II. District at a Glance

This table gives information on important items relating to the Socio-Economic Development in Yavatmal district and the State under different heads such as area, population, agriculture, animal husbandry, education, health, transport and communication, plan and community development programme, local bodies and other relevant statistics at a glance.

III. Contents, scope and limitations.

The Statistical tables presented in the statistical abstract are grouped into 13 parts. The contents of the tables

and the scope and limitations of the data presented under each group are described here under -

1. Area and Population (Part-I)

The data for 1971 census are furnished in all the tables. The reference period for the 1971 census was the sunrise of 1st March 1971.

Table No.1

This table indicates panchayat samitiwise area, density of population per sq.km., number of villages and towns, number of occupied houses and house-holds and sex-wise rural, urban and total population. The area figures are given in sq.kms. (1 sq.km. = 0.386 sq.miles).

Table No.2

This table presents sex-wise rural, urban and total population enumerated in 1951, 1961 and 1971 censuses along with the decadal percentage variations for the district as well as for each tahsil.

Table No.3

This table gives panchayat samitiwise classification of inhabited villages according to different population ranges in the district. The term village (i.e. rural areas) used in the table denotes a revenue village having well defined boundaries and a separate set of land records irrespective of the fact whether that defined area has any population or not. Hamlets, wadis, padas have not therefore, been classified as separate villages. Similarly the revenue villages which do not have any residential population are shown as 'un-inhabited or deserted villages'. The term village includes forest village comprising mostly of forest labourers and their families. The population of the villages in each population range is also shown in this table. The total number of inhabited and

un-inhabited villages are also indicated separately.

Table No.4

This table presents taluka-wise classification of towns in the district according to different population ranges. Total population of the towns in each population range is also given in the table.

Table No.5

This table gives panchayat samiti-wise classification of population into workers and non-workers according to standard livelihood classes. A person is defined as a worker if (a) he has had some regular work for more than an hour for a day in greater part of the working season in case of seasonal work like cultivation, livestock, dairying, household industry etc. and (b) in case of regular employment in any trade, a professional service, business or commerce, he was employed during any of the fifteen days preceding the day of enumerators' visit to the household.

Beggars, pensioners, agricultural or non-agricultural royalty receivers, rent or dividend receivers etc. who earn an income, but who are not participating in any productive work in any occupation and persons, who had been offered work but not joined the work, have been classified as non-workers.

This table indicates distribution of population according to (a) age group and (b) religion separately for rural and urban areas and for the district as a whole as per 1971 census.

II. Climate (Part-II)

Table No.8

This table indicates monthly rainfall and number of rainy days in each month at the five selected centres namely, Yavatmal, Pandharkawada, Wani, Pusad and Darwaha for the year 1976. The data are collected through revenue agencies. A day is treated as a 'rainy day' if during 24 hours, the rain gauge recorded a minimum of 2.5 mm of rainfall. 'Normal rainfall' is the average rainfall over a period ranging from minimum five years to a maximum of eighty years.

Table No.9

This table gives monthwise maximum and minimum temperatures and also annual temperature as recorded at the two selected centres namely Yavatmal and Pusad for the year 1976. The data are supplied by the Regional Meteorological centre, Nagpur. The maximum and minimum temperatures, denote the average of the maximum and minimum temperatures recorded daily during the month. The annual maximum and minimum temperatures are the simple averages of monthly maximum and minimum temperatures.

3. Agriculture (Part III)

Table No.10

This table gives taluka-wise figures of land utilisation for the year 1974-75 and 1975-76. Major groups in which the area is classified are forest, land put to non-agricultural uses, barren and unculturable land, culturable wastes, permanent pastures, land under miscellaneous tree crops not included in area sown, fallow land and area sown. All forest areas classed or administered as forests under any legal enactment dealing with forests, whether State owned or private, are included under forest. If any portion of such land is not actually wooded but put to some agricultural uses, that portion is

included under the appropriate heading of cultivated or un-cultivated land as the case may be. The areas occupied by buildings, roads and railways or area under water i.e. rivers, nalas and canals and other areas put to uses other than agriculture are included under 'land put to non-agricultural uses'. 'Barren and unculturable land' covers land under mountains, deserts etc. which may be brought under cultivation but at a high cost. 'Culturable wastes' covers all land available for cultivation whether not taken for cultivation or taken up for cultivation once, not cultivated during the current and last five years or more in succession. Such lands may either be fallows or areas covered with shrubs. 'Permanent pastures and other Grazing land' includes all grazing lands whether they are permanent pastures and meadows or not. 'Land under miscellaneous tree crops etc. not included in 'net area sown' is the land under casuarina trees, thatching grass, bamboo bushes and other used for fuel etc. and is included in cultivable land but not included in orchards. 'Current fallows' comprise cultivable areas which are kept fallow during the current year. 'Other fallows' includes all land which are once taken up for cultivation, but are temporarily out of cultivation, for a period of not less than one year and more than five years. The 'net area sown' consists of area sown under crops and orchards and is being counted only <sup>once</sup>. The 'gross cropped area' represents the sum total of <sup>areas</sup> under all crops.

Table No.11

This table gives taluka-wise area under different major crops for the years 1974-75 and 1975-76.

Table No.12

This table indicates outturn and yield rate per hectare of the principal crops in the district during the years 1974-75 and 1975-76.

Table No. 13

This table furnishes the taluka-wise data of the area irrigated by different sources of irrigation during the years 1974-75 and 1975-76.

Table No. 14

This table presents taluka-wise area irrigated under different crops during the years 1974-75 and 1975-76.

Table No. 15

This table gives taluka-wise number of irrigation wells in use and not in use during the years 1974-75 and 1975-76.

Table No. 16

This table gives the panchayat samiti-wise data regarding availability of under ground water during the year 1976-77.

Table No. 17

This table furnishes the panchayat samiti-wise information regarding irrigation works (excluding irrigation wells) for the years 1975-76 and 1976-77.

This table deals with the monthly average agricultural wage rates in 1976. This data are collected fortnightly throughout the year from the three selected centres in this district namely (1) Ner (2) Kalamb and (3) Maregaon.

This table presents data regarding Agricultural census operational holdings for the year 1970.

Table No. 21

This table gives panchayat samiti-wise data on agricultural implements as per Livestock census 1972.

Table No. 22

The taluka-wise information regarding famine, scarcity and akin to scarcity for the year 1976-77 is furnished in this table.

Table No. 23

This table furnishes the taluka-wise information about the total number of villages regarding determination of precarious and other scarcity during the years 1970-71 to 1976-77.

4. Animal Husbandry, Forest and Fisheries (Part-IV)

(A) Animal husbandry

This table gives panchayat samiti-wise number of various types of livestock and poultry as enumerated in the livestock census 1972. This census was conducted throughout the country on an uniform basis. Precaution was also taken to enumerate Livestock in slaughter houses, stray animals and animals in transit during this census. The reference date and time of this livestock census was sunrise of 15th April 1972. Sex and age-group-wise classification of livestock is also given in this table.

Table No. 25, 26 and 27

These tables give panchayat samiti-wise Veterinary Statistics, disease-wise livestock mortality and number of slaughter houses for the year 1976-77, and animals slaughtered during the year 1976-77.

(3) Forests.

Table No. 28(a)

The details of area under different types of forests in the district during the year 1976-77 are given in this table.

The data regarding the forests under control of State Govern-  
ment both under Forest Department and Revenue Department are  
shown separately. The area under forest is classified according  
to legal status, i.e. reserved forests, protected forests and  
unclassified forests. The legal status refers to the classification  
of forests under the Indian Forests Act XVI of 1927. The reserved  
forests are intended mainly for timber production, where-in the  
rights of grazing and cultivation are seldom allowed. In case of  
protected forests, the restrictions are not so rigid. The  
un-classed forests refer to the inaccessible forests or un-  
occupied waste. The forest area shown in table No.28(A) may not  
tally with the area under forest shown in the table No.10. The  
two sets of figures differ due to the following reasons.

- (1) In the Indian Forest Statistics returns the whole area  
including non-wooden area under the control of forest Department  
is considered as an area under forests, while in Agricultural  
statistics, it is classified according to its actual utilisation.
- (2) The forest Department returns are meant to serve a definite  
administrative purposes and indicate the ownership of the forest  
area and actual utilisation of these areas is not so important  
from the point of view of Forest Department as it is in land  
utilisation statistics under Agricultural Statistics.
- (3) Forest Department returns relate to the financial year while  
Agricultural Statistics relate to the agricultural year.

Factories (1) those employing ten or more workers working with the aid of power section 2(1).

(2) those employing 20 or more workers and working without the aid of power section 2(ii).

(3) those registered under section 85 of the Act under which the State Government make applicable the provision of the Act, even though the above conditions are not fulfilled.

This table gives the data regarding number of factories and average daily employment of workers in the factories in the district for the years 1975 and 1976.

This table gives panchayat samiti-wise number of primary agricultural credit societies, service cooperative societies, their membership, share capital, reserve and other funds, working capital, loans advanced and recovered, loans outstanding and overdues and percentage of recovery to total loans

advanced during the year 1976-77. The term 'working capital' includes paid up share capital, deposits and borrowings. 'Loan outstanding' covers outstanding in respect of loans, cash credit and over-drafts and the amount of outstanding bills purchased or discounted. 'Overdues' refer to an amount of loan or instalments, which are due for collection but which were not actually collected and for the repayment of which no extension has been granted by the competent authority.

The data pertaining to other different types of co-operative societies except primary agricultural credit societies and banks in the district are furnished in this table for the year 1976-77.

As per provisions in the Act, no money lender shall carry on the business of money lending except in the area for which the licence is granted to him and except in accordance with the terms and conditions of such licence.

7. Medical and public health (Part VII).

This table indicates the panchayat samiti-wise number of hospitals, dispensaries, maternity homes, primary health centres, doctors, Vaidyas, nurses and the total number of indoor and outdoor patients treated during the year 1976. All the State Government medical institutions as well, as the institutions run by the municipal councils and other local bodies are included. The private clinics, hospitals run by private bodies or individuals are, however, not included in this table.

This table presents talukwise vital statistics such as number of registered births and deaths and infant deaths in the district during the year 1976.

Table No.50

This table gives data regarding number of deaths due to important causes in the district during the years 1971 to 1976.

Table No.51

This table presents panchayat samiti-wise vaccinations statistics for the year 1976.

Table No.52

This table gives panchayat samiti-wise number of family planning centres in the district as on 31st March 1977 and the number of sterilisation operations undertaken in these centres during the year 1976-77.

## 8. Education (Part VIII).

### Table No.53

This table presents sexwise number of literates and percentage of literacy separately for rural and urban areas of each tahsil according to 1971 census. A person was classified as a literate, if he was able to read <sup>or</sup> write a simple letter in any language.

### Table No.54 and 55.

Since the data regarding the distribution of literates according to educational standards in rural and urban areas as per 1971 census are not available, the data for these two tables on this subject are given for 1961 census.

### Table No.56

This table indicates the number of educational institutions according to types for the year 1975-76 and 1976-77. Sexwise enrolment and number of trained and un-trained teachers in these institutions are also given in this table. The classification of institutions according to 'Types' given in this table is slightly different from stage of education. There are, at present, many secondary schools which also impart education in primary courses in this case the entire pupil enrolment of students is included under 'secondary' education. Primary institutions provide education for standards I to IV or standards I to VII/VIII or less and teach the curriculum approved by the Education Department. The Secondary institutions teach the students for standards VIII to X with or without lower standards. Higher education is the education after passing Secondary school certificate examination which leads to a degree examination. The Junior colleges imparting education for the standards XIth and XIIth are included under secondary schools.

Table No.57

This table gives the number of beneficiaries among backward classes such as scheduled castes, Scheduled Tribes and other Backward Classes in different types of educational institutions during the years 1975-76 and 1976-77. The pupils who get concessions of either types such as scholarships, free ships etc. are treated as beneficiaries.

Table No.58

This table indicates the number of beneficiaries under economically backward class concessions and the amount of concessions granted during the years 1975-76 and 1976-77.

Table No.59.

This table gives the information regarding expenditure incurred on primary education by different agencies like Zilla Parishad, Municipal Councils etc. during the year 1976-77. Plan and Non-plan expenditure is shown separately.

9. Transport and communications (Part-IX)

This table gives total railway length in the district as on 31st March 1977 according to types of routes i.e. broad guage, metre guage and narrow guage. The railway length is measured between the first/last stations within the district boundary. The figures of length of each type of route are therefore approximate and not accurate.

This table indicates the road length in the district according to category of roads and surface classification as on 31st March 1977.

This table gives the number of motor vehicles in operation as on 31st March 1977, in this district.

This table deals with the operational statistics of Nationalised Road Transport in Yavatmal Division as 31-3-1977. The State Transport Division, Yavatmal comprises of Yavatmal district only.

The Yavatmal Lok Sabha Constituency consists of six legislative Assembly Constituencies in this district i.e. Wani, Ralegan, Kelapur, Yavatmal, Darwaha and Digras out of eight Legislative Assembly Constituencies. Two Legislative Assembly Constituencies viz. Pusad and Umarkhed in this district are included in Washim Lok Sabha Constituency in Akola district.

The food crops Jowar and Tur have suffered shortfall in production during 1975-76 as against the levels of 1960-61. The production of wheat increased significantly as there is 297.64% rise in the out-turn over the out-turn in 1960-61. The sugarcane production is tremendously increased in 1975-76 as compared to the production in 1960-61 mainly because the irrigation facilities were made available in Pusad taluka and the sugarcane area was also increased due to establishment of sugarcane factory at Phophali in Pusad taluka. The production of crops viz. Rice and Gram has shown significant improvement. The decrease in the production of Jowar, Tur, Seasamum and chillies was due to failure of crops. There is decrease in the production of cotton as compared to the year 1960-61.

#### Gross value of agricultural production

As the farm harvest prices of various commodities are not available, this indicator could not be worked out.

It is seen from the above table that the proportion of areas under food and non-food crops are actually been

reversed during the course of the period. The area under food crops has been reduced to 51.88 in 1975-76 as against 54.77% in 1960-61. Consequently, the area under non-food crops has been increased to 48.12% in 1975-76 as against 45.23 in 1960-61.

Indicator No.6

Increase in agricultural credit and outstanding dues.

The primary agricultural credit societies have come to the rescue of small cultivators. These societies provide financial assistance in the form of short term loans to the cultivators. This helps the cultivators financially in purchasing of improved seeds fertilisers, pesticides etc. The following table indicates the level of credit advanced by the societies on short term during 1960-61 and 1976-77.

At the end of 1976, the hospitals and dispensaries have reached the level of 6 per lakh population in the district as against 4 in 1961.

With the opening of large number of primary schools under the Five Year Plan programme, the enrolment in primary schools has gone up upto 1.67 lakh in 1976-77 against 0.83 lakhs of 1960-61. Similar was the case with the enrolment in secondary schools, the number of enrolment has gone up to 50,306 in 1976-77 as against 17,660 in 1960-61. The strength of higher education also showed tremendous increase, the enrolment is being reported as 5,548 during 1976-77 as against 1,183 during 1960-61.

Indicator No. 14 - Increase in road length per 100 sq. kms. areas.

This being a hilly district suffers from insufficient road mileage. The roads have to cope up with the traffic in the district as the railways share very small part in the traffic in the district. There is a narrow guage line linking Yavatmal to Nagpur Bombay line at Murtizapur and one broad guage line linking Wani and Rajur to Majari on Nagpur-Hyderabad line. The total railway route is of 82 kms. length.

The total road length in the district was reported as 5,314.66 kms. as on 31-3-1977, out of which 638.94 kms. road length was under National Highways and State highways, while the road length of major district roads, other district roads and village roads was 4,483.33 kms. Besides there exist municipal roads of the length of 192.39 kms. in the district.

It is seen that the prices of all the commodities have gone up during the period 1963 to 1976. The increase in the prices are 100 to 291 percent in case of foodgrains, 292 percent in case of sugar. 221 percent in case of groundnut oil, 168 percent in case of tea, 187 percent in case of kerosene and 109 percent in case of washing soap.

CHAPTER - IV

ANNUAL PLAN 1976-77

4.1 Planning plays an important role in phasing out the development programmes by providing various schemes with a view to improve the living conditions of the people. It also helps in improving Socio-Economic conditions of the weaker sections of the society and in building up sound and stable economy of the nation.

The State Government presented its draft Fifth Five Year Plan in July 1973. The National Development Council endorsed the same in December 1973 but on account of some unforeseen factors, the same was not finalised. In the meanwhile, Annual Plans for the years 1974-75 and 1975-76 were formulated and implemented. Annual Plan 1976-77 is the third in the series.

The Annual Plan, 1976-77 has been drawn up on the basis of the experience gained in the first two years of the Fifth Plan which were marked by a considerable increase in prices. The Annual Plan, therefore, reflects the basic imperative before the National and State Economy which is to ensure growth with stability. The Planning Commission issued guidelines to the State Governments in formulating the Annual Plan 1976-77 which inter-alia require the State Government to keep in mind the following factors.

(i) The 20 point economic programme announced by the Prime Minister.

(ii) Acceleration of the tempo of activities in the core sector of the economy viz. Agriculture, Irrigation, Power and industry.

(iii) Phasing of investment so as to ensure quick return and price stability, adequate provision for completion of works in progress and full utilisation of capacity already created.

The State Approach not only conformed to the National Priorities but also took into account the peculiar needs and resources of the State.

Maharashtra is the only state in which District Planning is a vital and important ingredient of the total planning process. The process of District Planning acquired a sharper edge, a better technical base and a greater sophistication during this year and this is also reflected in the Annual Plan 1976-77 of this district. Financial ceilings were communicated to the Districts on the basis of the requirements of the various programmes for continuation activities. The District Planning and Development Council formulated the District plan bearing in mind this factor and on the basis of national and State priorities and the guidelines given by the Government. The objectives of the District Plan, the State Plan and the National Plan were broadly identical but the programmatic contents of the various District Plans might differ on the basis of their resources and their need-based priorities.

Tribals are the weakest among the weaker sections of the society and because of their poverty and seclusion they could not derive the benefit of the various schemes implemented during the past Four Five Year Plans to the extent desired. With a view to remove this shortcoming, the Government of India has decided to ensure the development of the Tribal people by formulating a special sub-plan for the Tribal Areas. Accordingly the Government of Maharashtra has taken up 474 villages and one town of the district under the Tribal sub-plan and Additional / Tribal sub-plan.

The District Planning and Development Council, Yavatmal has finalised the Annual Plan for the year 1976-77 for Rs.516.00 lakhs. It has also formulated Tribal Sub-plan for

Rs.85.40 lakhs for the year.

4.2 The following table presents major groupwise expenditure during the Fourth Five year Plan period and for the years 1974-75, 1975-76 and 1976-77.

It would be seen from the expenditure incurred under different Heads of Development during the first three years of the Fifth Five Year Plan that the emphasis has been given on the programmes of developments included in core sector i.e. Agricultural programme (24.32%), Irrigation and power (25.22%), Expenditure has also been incurred under the Head 'Social Services' to the tune of Rs.391.36 i.e. 25.01% as this district is backward one. The emphasis was also given on these sub-sectors of development during the Fourth Five Year Plan. The expenditure under the Heads of Development viz.

1. Cooperation and community development (0.99%) and 2. Industries and Mining (3.13%) was very meagre.

Agricultural programme

4.3 The Agricultural and allied activities are the main source of livelihood of more than 70% population of this district. The schemes under the minor heads of developments viz: 1. Agricultural production 2. Minor Irrigation, 3. Soil Conservation, 4. Ayacut Development, 5. Animal Husbandry, 6. Dairy Development, 7. Forest 8. Fisheries and 9. Warehousing and marketing were included under this programme. The sub-headwise expenditure incurred during the Fourth Five Year Plan/during the years 1974-75, 1975-76 and 1976-77 is depicted in the table given below -

The Schemes were formulated so as to help the cultivators to boost up the Agricultural production by reducing their dependence on the monsoons to the minimum extent. During this year intensive cultivation of cotton was taken up in 3,52,057 hectares. Subsidy for 167 irrigation wells and 96 pump sets was sanctioned. Three community wells, six minor irrigation tanks and two percolation tanks were constructed during this year.

Small Farmers and Agricultural Labourers constitute a large section of the rural community. They had remained more or less deprived of the fruits of economic development achieved under the first three Five year plans. Amelioration of the conditions of this section is necessary not only from the point of view of Social Justice but also for the success of the programme of agricultural development in general. The Government of Maharashtra has decided to tackle the problem by adopting an area approach. A scheme for Integrated Area Development has been introduced in Pusad Panchayat samiti of this district.

Soil Conservation programme aims at improving lands by adopting suitable techniques according to topography, rainfall and land use capability. Under this programme bunding is done for conserving soil and moisture. During the year 1976-77 an area of 17,119 hectares was banded and 3564 hectares were taken up under Ayacut Development.

There is much scope for the development of fisheries in this district. Attempts are being made to increase Fish production to ameliorate the socio-economic conditions of the Fishermen who form the backbone of this industry, to create employment opportunities for them and to effect rational utilisation of natural resources. Production of 7.82 lakhs sprawns and 3.05 lakh kilograms of Fish were done during the year 1976-77.

42.65 lakhs of carp fry for stocking and 425 kgs. of Nylon twine for weaving nets were supplied during this year.

Forestry is the largest single land use next only to agriculture in this district. It provides much needed Timber, fuel and fodder and a host of other forest produce and earns livelihood to the Tribals residing in this district. Plantation of wood was taken in 156 hectares during the year 1976-77. So also fodder plantation was taken up in 20 hectares and Fast growing species were also planted in 20 hectares. One drinking water well was constructed for providing drinking water to the labourers working in forest area.

Livestock plays an important role in sustaining and improving the farmers economy. Animal Husbandry is labour intensive and hence schemes were taken up to absorb under employment, to intrease production of Milk and eggs and to provide efficient and effective veterinary Health cover.

Under Warehousing and Marketing, loans to one Agricultural Marketing society and subsidy for propoganda to twelve marketing societies were disbursed during this year.

#### 4.4 Co-operation and community development

An amount of Rs.0.57 lakhs has been disbursed to one cooperative Marketing society and one cooperative Ginning and pressing society as Govt. Contribution towards shares capital and as subsidy to eight labour contract societies during the year under report.

Financial assistance of Rs.2.22 lakhs was given to 14 existing community development blocks during this year for completing the incomplete works.

#### 4.5 Irrigation and Power

Agriculture is the mainstay of rural life and economy. In a predominantly agricultural economy, therefore, all round

development of agriculture is naturally a ~~paramount~~ <sup>of</sup> importance. Any appreciable progress in agricultural production essentially depends on the quantum of availability of irrigation facilities because water is key input and without it all other inputs are <sup>either</sup> ~~very~~ ineffective or much less effective. Development of irrigation is hence the sine-qua-non for agricultural prosperity and general economic well-being of the rural population.

Apart ~~from~~ <sup>apart</sup> from the two major irrigation projects, benefitting the district i.e. upper penganga, and pus the other six medium Irrigation projects viz. Takali, 2. Pimpri-Warvat (Adan), 3. Sakhal Nala, 4. Goki, 5. Waghadi <sup>Lower</sup> and 6. Pus are under construction. These projects when completed will change the entire cropping pattern of this district. An expenditure of Rs.214.07 lakhs has been incurred on these medium Irrigation projects during this year.

Availability of cheap and reliable power supply is the basic requirement for both industrial and agricultural development, Consumption of electricity is also an indicator of the standard of living. The demand of power for agricultural production is increasing day by day in this district. The demand of power for industry is not keeping pace with that for agricultural production as the district is industrially backward one. An expenditure of Rs.29.91 lakhs has been incurred during this year on various programmes of power development. During this year 280.26 kms. of 11 K.V. line have been laid and 40 villages have been electrified. Power Supply to 1168 electric pumps for irrigation has been given and 52 Harijan bastis have been electrified.

#### 4.6 Industry and Mining.

Yavatmal is one of the Industrially backward districts of Maharashtra. An expenditure of Rs.17.04 lakhs has been incurred on various schemes under this head during the year 1976-77.

Under the Package Scheme of Incentives SICOM sanctioned Rs.5.00 lakhs to four Industrial Units. Seed money assistance of Rs.0.50 lakhs has been granted to 127 educated unemployed. An amount of Rs.6.33 lakhs has been disbursed to one spinning Mill towards contribution of Govt. share capital. An amount of Rs.0.06 lakhs towards share capital to three societies and of Rs.0.80 lakhs as subsidy to fourteen Block level village Artisans' societies has been disbursed during this year. Rs.0.46 lakhs have been disbursed to eight societies in Tribal sub-plan area as subsidy and contribution towards share capital.

#### 4.7 Transport and communications.

Communications constitute an important item of infrastructure for the progress of all development activities. This district is lagging behind in the matter of road development. Road transport has significant importance in the development of this district as the Railways do not serve this district well. An expenditure of Rs.60.21 lakhs has been incurred during the year 1976-77 under road development, 16.21 kms. of Pucca roads and 19.00 kms. of Katcha roads have been constructed during this year and 2.80 kms. of roads have been provided with black topping. Seven bridges were under construction and out of these seven the construction of one bridge is completed. Construction of 55 cross drainages were taken. The construction of 48 cross drainages out these 55 has been completed during this year and 7 works are in progress.

#### 4.8 Social Services

An expenditure of Rs.154.50 lakhs has been incurred under various sub-heads of development during the year 1976-77. The break up of this expenditure is indicated in the table given below along with the expenditure incurred during previous years and Fourth Five Year Plan period.

(1) General Education

The present pattern of Education lays greater emphasis to link education with the realities of life. Attempts were made to formulate schemes keeping in view this fact. During this year 21 new primary schools have been opened and 7 buildings for primary schools have also been constructed. 1495 Students from Economically backward classes and 34 children of primary Teachers were given educational concessions. Five new classes were started in Ex-Govt. Secondary Schools, 104 primary teachers were deputed for inservice training. Expenditure of Rs.21.20 lakhs has been incurred under this Sub-head of Development.

An amount of Rs.0.50 lakhs has been granted to Stadium

Committee for construction of Stadium at Yavatmal and Rs.0.06 lakhs have been expended on sports festival in which 1955 pupils from the schools in the district had taken part.

(2) Technical education

An expenditure of Rs.2.13 lakhs has been incurred under this sub-head. Out of this amount Rs.1.94 lakhs were expended to provide facilities in Polytechnic, Yavatmal and Rs.0.19 lakhs for purchase of raw materials, tools and equipments in Technical High School.

(3) Health

An expenditure of Rs.12.05 lakhs has been incurred under Various Health programmes during the year 1976-77. Construction of buildings for main Hospital at Yavatmal was in progress and an amount of Rs.2.00 lakhs has been expended for providing 371 beds in this Main Hospital at Yavatmal. Various Schemes including construction of buildings for Rural Hospital at village Sawana, supplying medicines to Primary Health Centres etc. had also been taken under Health programme in this district.

(4) Nutrition

An expenditure of Rs.1.42 lakhs has been incurred under the Applied Nutrition Programme in two panchayat samities viz. Kalamb and Ralegan during this year.

(5) Water Supply and drainage

Under water supply and drainage an amount of Rs.0.50 lakhs has been utilised to provide additional reservoir at Yavatmal. This work has been started and is in progress. Three municipal water supply schemes viz. at Umarkhed, Digras and Ghatanji and drainage work at Wan were in progress and an expenditure of Rs.40.07 lakhs has been incurred on these schemes. Four Rural piped water supply schemes covering 40 villages have also been taken up during this year and an amount of Rs.21.64

lakhs has been expended under these schemes. Construction of 93 Drinking water wells has been taken up to provide water to the villages. The Ground water survey Division of the Government has taken 61 Borewells in difficult villages to provide drinking water. Total amount utilised during this year under this programme is Rs.71.57 lakhs.

(6) Housing

An expenditure of Rs.21.49 lakhs has been incurred under this sub-head of development. House sites were provided to the Landless labourers in 112 villages and 7047 huts have been constructed. Tiling of roofs of 32 huts has been completed and Ganthans of 14 villages have been extended during this year.

(7) Urban Development

Financial Assistance of Rs.2.00 lakhs has been disbursed to two Municipal councils during this year for implementation of their Development plans i.e. Rs.1.50 lakhs to Digras Municipal council for construction of Hospital and staff quarters and Rs.0.50 lakhs to Pusad Municipal council for development of garden.

(8) Welfare of Backward Classes

An expenditure of Rs.21.03 lakhs has been incurred under this sub-head during the year 1976-77. Government has recognised the need to increase the level of development of these weaker sections of the society by increasing their level of income by providing employment etc. The schemes were formulated in consonance with the directives of the Government in this district in the Annual plan 1976-77. The programme under this sector can be classified into three broad categories viz. Education, Economic uplift, Housing and other schemes. Some of the important educational schemes related to grant of tuition fees, award of scholarships, stipends, opening of Backward class

Grant in aid to Backward class Hostels  
 Hostels, run by voluntary agencies. Under the programme of  
 economic uplift, several schemes like construction of new  
 irrigation wells, installation of pumping sets, financial  
 assistance for purchase of agricultural implements,  
 loan-cum-subsidy to B.C. Artisans etc. were taken up. Under  
 other programmes including Housing some of the following  
 important schemes were implemented.

- a. Ashram Shala complexes.
- b. Financial assistance to cooperative housing societies of Backward classes.
- c. Propaganda for removal of untouchability.
- d. Improvement of Harijan Bastis.
- e. Balwadies for Schedule castes.

300 students from Backward classes were granted  
 tuition fees during this year. Building grants to two Backward  
 class hostels and other grants to 83 Backward class hostels  
 were sanctioned. Loan to 40 irrigation wells and subsidy to 9  
 irrigation wells were disbursed. 78 pumpsets have been supplied  
 and Financial Assistance was given to one Housing society for  
 construction of 53 houses. 36 Balwadies for Schedule Castes  
 have been assisted by incurring an expenditure of Rs. 0.53 Lakhs.

(9) Social Welfare

An expenditure of Rs. 0.05 lakhs has been incurred  
 under this sector for expansion work under Probation of Offend-  
 ers Act and scholarships of Rs. 0.01 lakhs have been disbursed  
 to two physically handicapped students. 782 cases were invest-  
 igated during this year under P.O. Act.

(10) Labour and Labour welfare

An expenditure of Rs. 1.44 lakhs has been incurred  
 under this sub-head for purchase of equipments and for  
 starting additional popular courses in Industrial Training



Institute, Yavatmal. Under labour apprenticeship training scheme an expenditure of Rs.0.11 lakhs has been incurred during this year.

#### 4.9 Miscellaneous

##### (1) Information and Publicity

An expenditure of Rs.0.27 lakhs has been incurred and 89 community Radio sets have been supplied to Village panchayats for installation in the villages in their jurisdictions under Rural Broadcastings scheme.

##### (2) Employment Guarantee scheme

Employment Guarantee scheme is introduced to give guarantee of work to all able bodied persons from rural areas who are willing to do manual work. The scheme intends to provide productive employment in manual work to the rural unskilled labour and thereby aims at reducing rural poverty. Under the Scheme gainful employment gainful to the individual as well as to the community is provided to adults in rural areas. The guarantee of work constitutes a major and fundamental objectives of Government fiscal and economic policy and is intended to provide the first step towards implementing the right to work enshrined in Article 41 of the Constitution. An expenditure of Rs.112.84 lakhs has been incurred on various works started under this scheme during the year 1976-77. Various types of 72 works viz. percolation tanks, Irrigation tanks, canal works and soil conservation works were taken up during this year. In all 131 works were in progress and out of these 12 works have been completed and the remaining 119 works will be completed in the ensuing year. The expenditure figure given in Table No.36 is Rs.114.04 lakhs while the same in table No.71 is Rs.112.84 lakhs. The sources are different and hence there is change in reporting.

# POPULATION DURING LAST FIVE DECADES IN YAVATMAL DISTRICT (IN LAKHS)

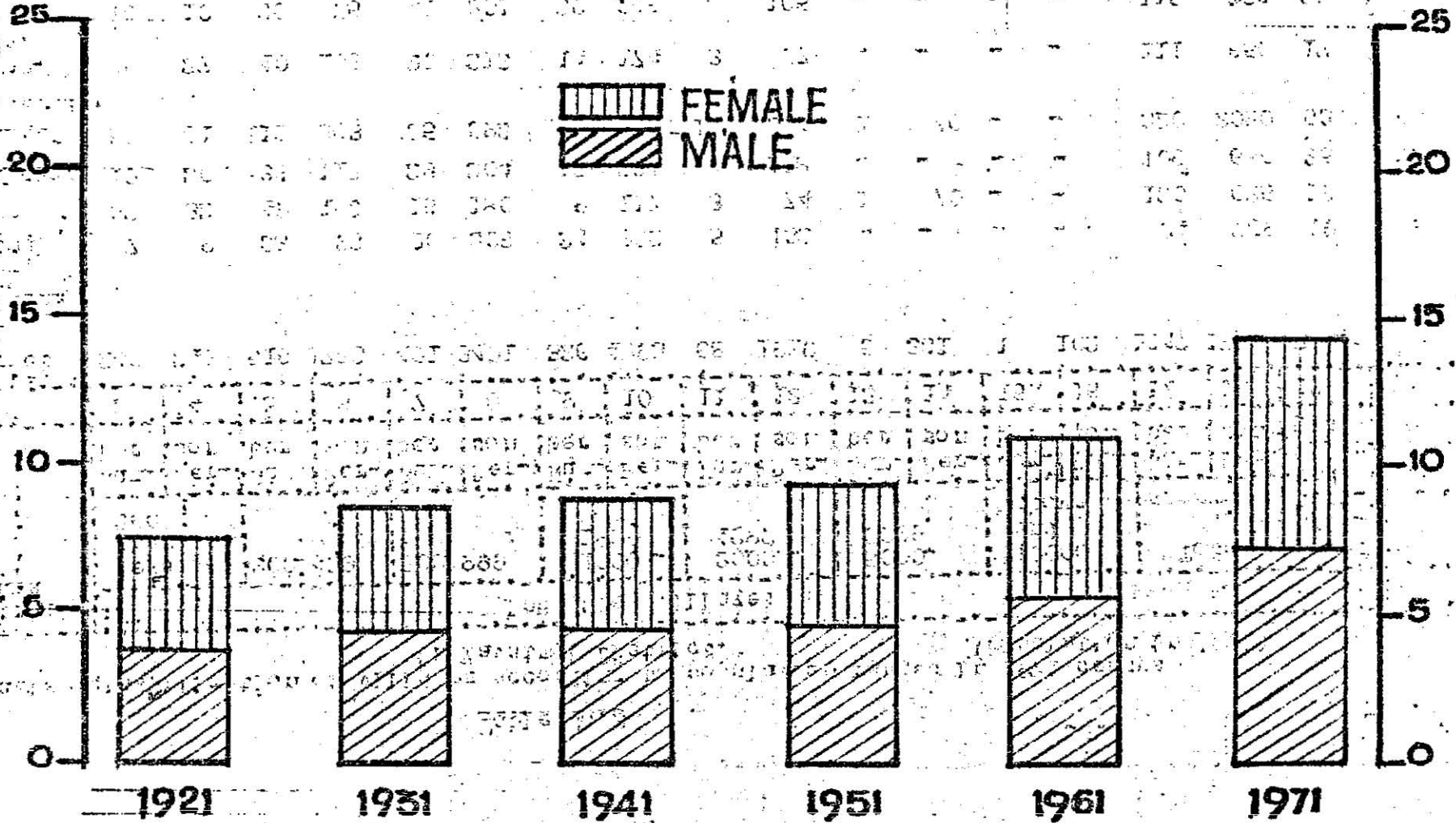

# LAND UTILISATION IN YEOTMAL DISTRICT. 1975-76

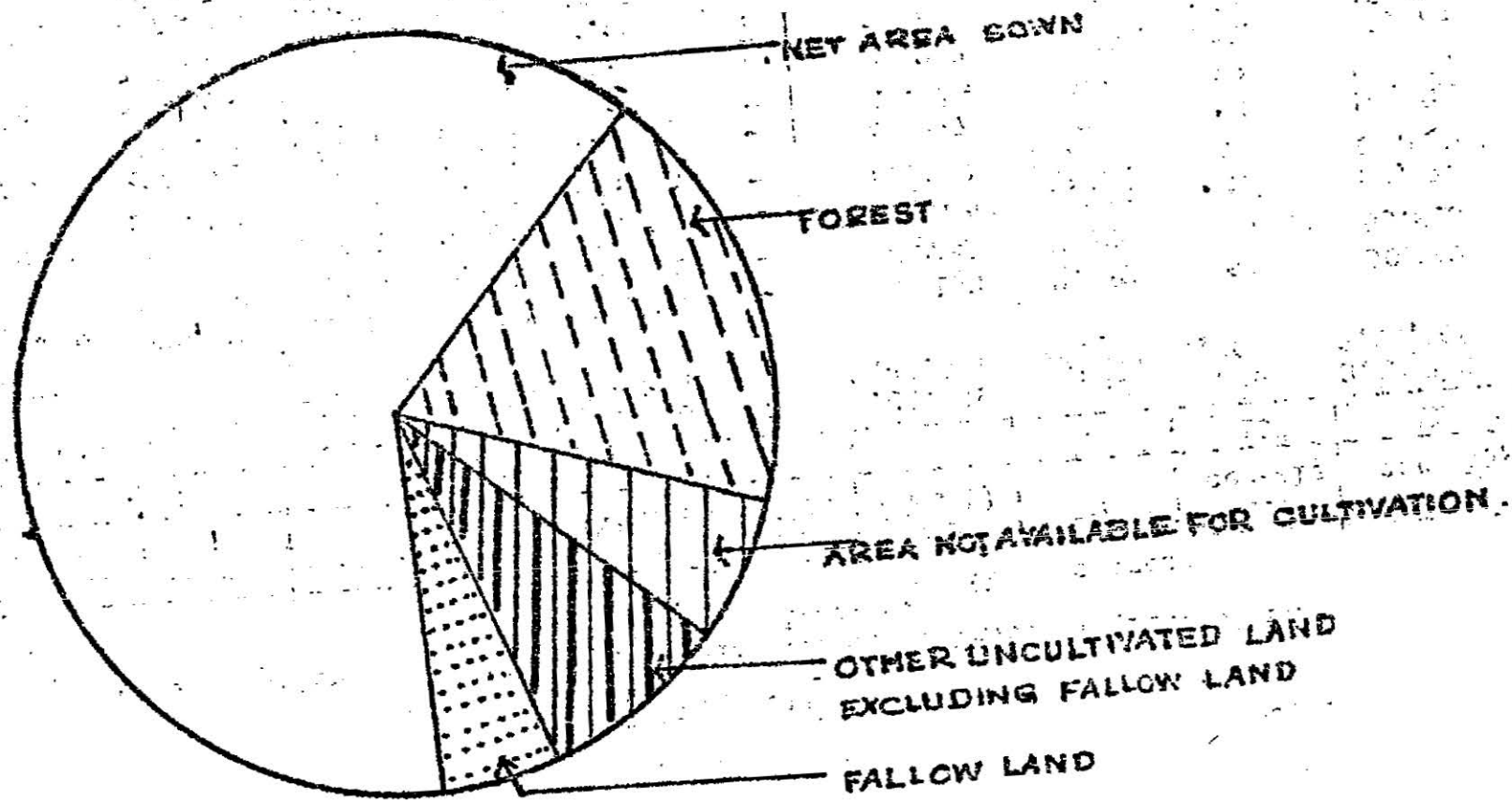

BY PRIMARY AGRICULTURAL CREDIT SOCIETIES

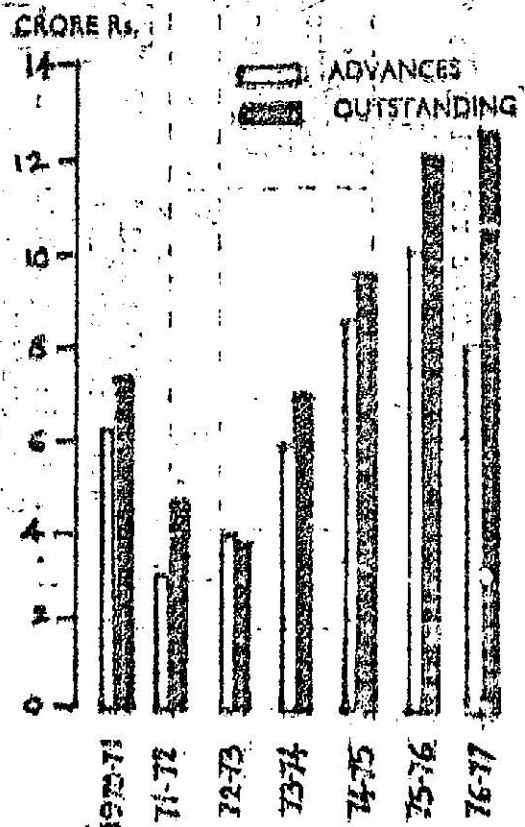

# EDUCATION INSTITUTIONS & ENROLMENT 1972-73 TO 1976-77 YAVATMAL DISTRICT

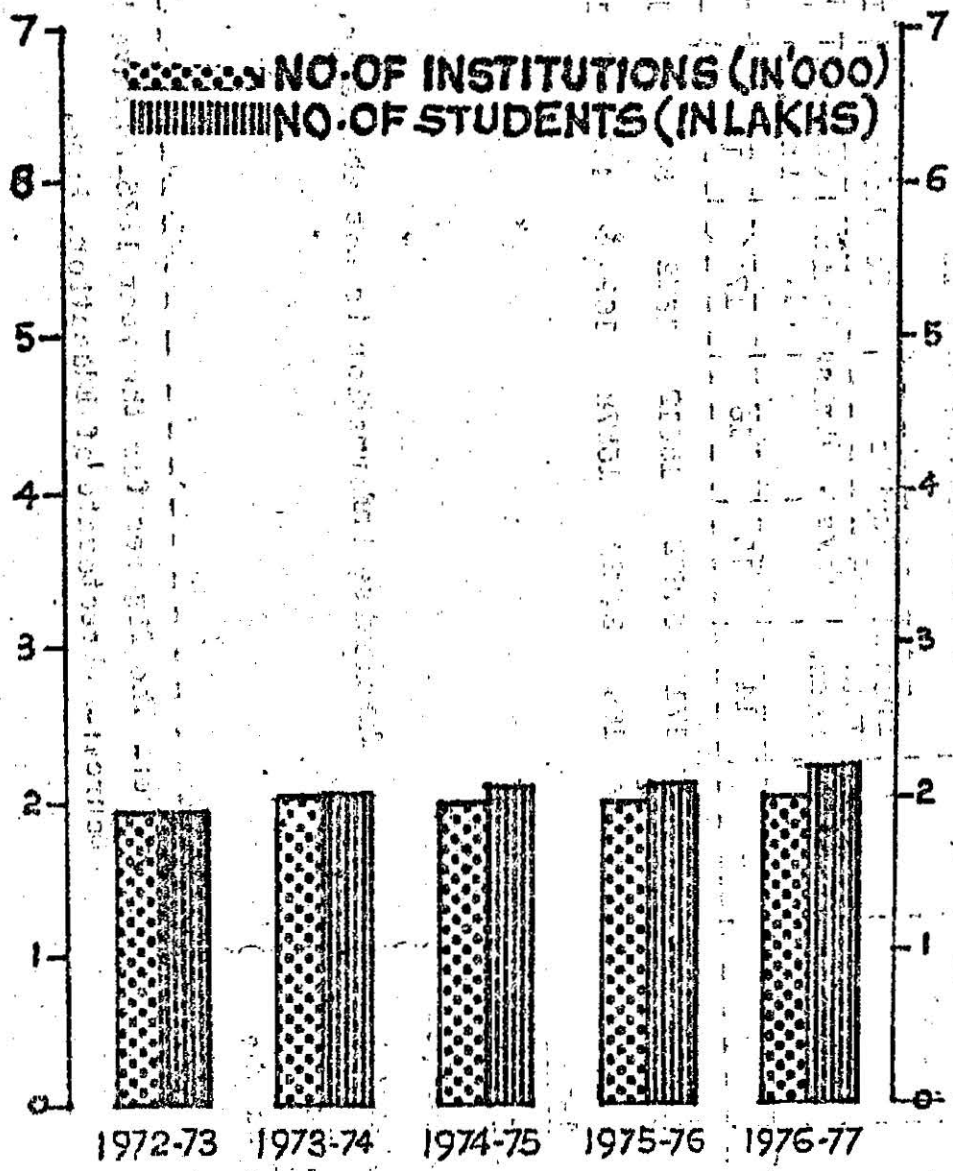

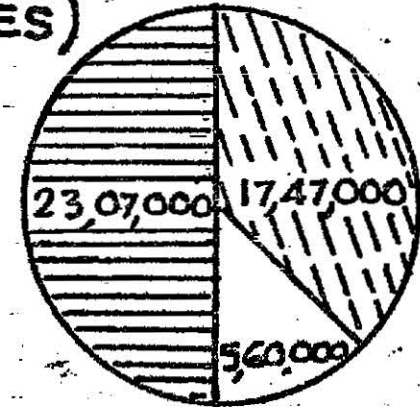
