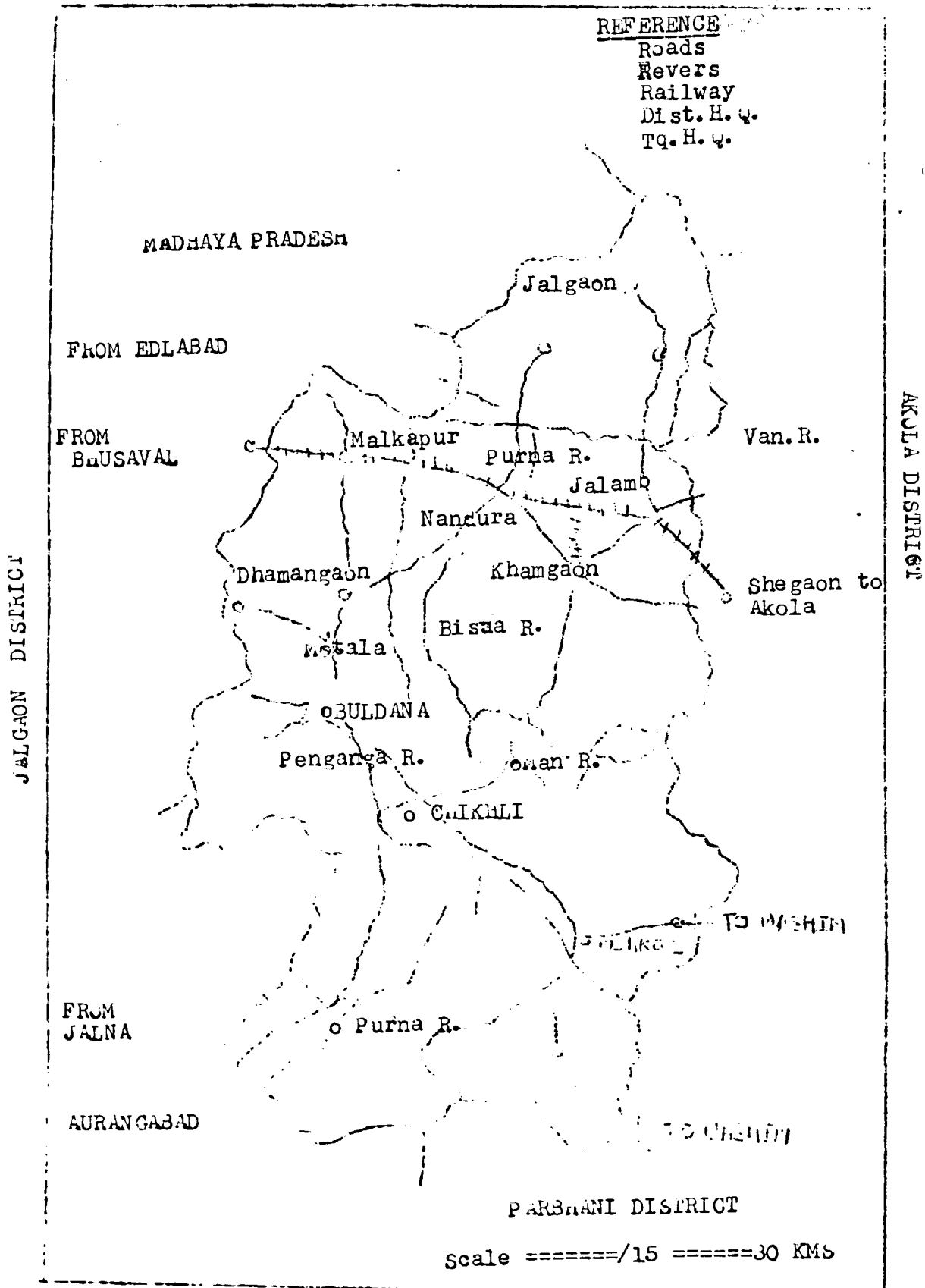

CHAPTER-I

1.1. Location

Buldana district has been named after Buldana town which is the district head quarter since the year 1867. It is situated partly in Tapi basin and partly in the Godawari basin. The northern half of the district, broadly called 'Payanghat' is drained by the Purna river which is a tributary of the Tapi. The southern half known as the 'Balaghat' is drained by the Penganga and the Katepurna rivers which are tributaries of the Godawari.

1.2 Boundaries

The district lies between $19^{\circ}51'$ and $21^{\circ}17'$ North latitudes and $75^{\circ}57'$, $76^{\circ}49'$ East Longitudes. It is bounded on the norths by the Nimar district of Madhya Pradesh, on the east by Akola district, on the south by Parabhani district, on the west by Aurangabad and Jalgaon district and on the north east by Amravati district. The district covers an area of 9,745 square kilometers.

1.3 AREA

The area, number of villages, population etc. according to 1971 census covered by each tahsil of the district is given in the following table.

Note:- The tahsilwise area figures do not add up to the district total as the figures for district are taken from survey or General of India and total area tahsilwise is worked out by adding rural area and urban areas as communicated by Municipal Councils.

Out of a total population of 12,62,973 for the district in 1971, 10,41,170 persons or 82.4 percent and 2,21,803 persons or 17.6 percent reside in rural and urban areas respectively. The area of the district is 9745 Sq. Kms per the 1971 census which accounted for 9.83 percent and 3.18 percent of the total area of Nagpur Division and Maharashtra respectively in 1971.

1.4 Topography

Out of the five tahsils now forming the district the tahsils of Chikhali and Mehkar lie on the Balaghat plateau, while rest of three tahsils of Malkapur, Khangaon and Jalgaon are in the great plain below known as the Payanghat. These are the two natural sub-divisions, which correspond closely to the administrative sub-divisions of the district. The edge of the plateau where it falls abruptly into the valley is ~~is~~ intercepted by numerous deep ravines.

The landscape is of varied character, fertile villages alternating with barren hillsides and deep ravines. Below the ghats, the land is flat, except where it is broken by spurs of hills putting out into a plain. The general slope of the district above the ghat is from north to south.

1.5 Hills, River System, Soils etc.

The main system of hills in the Ajanta range which has formed a plateau is called the Balaghat. It covers the southern portion of the district, comprising Chikhli and Mehkar tahsils. A ridge of low hills running from north-west to south east through the Balaghat forms the water shed between the valley of the Penganga and the

Katepurna. The main Ajanta range forms the northern wall of the Deccan table land and the water shed between the Godavari and Tapi Valleys.

There is also a branch of Satapura range in the north of Jalgaon Tahsil, which separates the district from the state of Madhya Pradesh,

The general slope of the district above the ghats is from north to south.

The elevation of the three plain tahsils of Malkapur, Khangaon & Jalgaon varies from 264 to 278 meters above sea level. The elevation of Chikhli and Mehekar table land varies from 529 to 737 metres above sea level.

The principal river in the district is the Penganga. The other important rivers are the Purna, the Katepurna, the Nalganga, the Vishwaganga, the Gyanganga and the Banganga.

The Penganga rises in the hills near Deulghat runs in a south easternly direction past Mehekar and then enters the Akola district. The portion of the river which lies in this district is almost dry in the hot weather.

The Kate or lower Purna rises in the Ajanta hills to the west of the district, which enters a little to the north of Deulgaon-Raja and traverse the tahsil of Mehekar in a south easternly direction for a distance of about 48 kilometres. Its course runs parallel to the south of that of the Penganga. It is dry in summer. Both the Penganga and the Katepurna are important rivers of the Godavari basin, but they do not acquire their importance till they come out of the district.

The Purna rises in the lower slopes of the Gawilgad hills in the Amravati district and runs west ward until it leaves the district at the northern most corner of Malkapur tahsil. Its principle Tributaries within the district are the Nalganga, the Vishwaganga and the Gyanganga from the south, and the Banganga from the north. There are two medium irrigation projects on the rivers of Nalganga and Gyanganga in this district.

The soils are derived from trap rock of volcanic origin. There are three main categories of soils in the district viz. i) Bhurkati, which is deep black soil of very fine texture and very retentive of moisture ii) morand, which is blackcotton soil containing lignum and less fertile than pure black cotton soil and iii) Barad, which is the shallow soil of the higher lands of the plateau and black, brown or reddish colour.

The soils in the northern tahsils viz. Jalgaon Malkapur and Khamgaon are generally deep black, formed by transported material washed from the higher lands. Cotton and kharif Jowar are the main crops. The largest stretches of such heavy soils are formed in strips of about thirteen kilometres on either side of the Purna river.

The belt lying between the railway mainline and purna river comprises some of the most fertile lands in Nagpur region.

To-wards the south, the soil is light and stony but pockets and belts of rich soil are found right upto the hills particularly in Malkapur tahsil.

On the plateau i.e. in Chikhli and Mehkar tahsils, there are considerable areas of medium black soil interspersed amidst the light and shallow soils which grow-

gotton, jowar, pulses and bajari. The Chikhli and Mehkar tahsils are well known for their wheat which is grown in the low lands between the plateau. These soils have a murum substratum and are, therefore well drained. The existence of rock sub-soil is also not uncommon and the soils formed on such rocky beds suffer both during scanty and heavy rains.

The district is not known to have any mineral of outstanding importance, except some saline deposits and lead in the lake of Lonar. These saline deposits were exploited for some time past, but subsequently found unprofitable and hence further exploitation of these deposits was abandoned. However, the agates, choranelians and elacite formed in the trap in southern part of the district have some utility, the first two for ornamental purpose and the last for optical purposes.

1.6 Climate, Temperature and Rainfall

The climate of the district is dry and hot in general and considered to be generally healthy. The maximum and minimum temperature at Buldana during 1976 was 37.1 centigrades and 14.7 centigrades respectively. After may, the temperature rapidly falls down. Then after June with the arrival of Monsoon, starts the rainy season and lasts upto the end of September. It is followed by winter season, which is quite pleasant.

The above temperature figures are typical of the Balaghat plateau (i.e. Chikhli and Mehkar tahsils) where the hot season sets in late and the heat is not intense. The rainy season is pleasant and the winter is invigorating. Buldana town itself is the coolest and

the most pleasant district head quarters in Nagpur division. The climate of the Payanghat i.e. Malkapur, Jalgaon and Khamgaon tahsils affords a great contrast. There the heat is intense and specially in the months of March to May it is perhaps as intense as in the hottest part of the country. The strong western winds, which then prevail become intensely heated and exercise their influence.

The rainfall is not uniform in all parts of the district. It is highest at Chikhli with a average of about 1381.0 mms. As against the average of 754.0 mms. If rains come in time and are equitably spread over the entire monsoon period properly the average rain fall in the district proves to be adequate for good crops. The district gets rain from the south west monsoons during the period from June to September.

Special features of the District

- 1) The Rajmata Jijabi's father Lakhuji Jadhava's native place is located at Sindkhed Raja which is important historical place in this district.
- 2) The richest temple of Balaji' is at Deulgaon-Raja.
- 3) The religious place of Shegaon is famous for Gajanan Maharaj.
- 4) Shri Kshetra Nagzari of Gomaji Maharaj is also situated in this district which attracts the attention of religious minded people. It is very near to Shegaon.
- 5) The first co-operative sugar factory in Vidharbha region is started as Jijamata sugar factory 'Dusaroid' in this district only.
- 6) 'Amoawarwa & Bhingara' are the forest hill stations situated in Jalgaon tahsil of this district.
- 7) Lonar is famous for 'salt water lake'

- 8) Buldhana district head quarter is having big T.B. sanatorium.
- 9) Two medium projects Nalganga & Dyanganga were completed in this district & work of 'Karadi' Paldhar & Mas projects are in progress.
- 10) There is one 'Industrial Estate' established at Kham-gaon in the district.
- 11) The work of Yelgaon project will solve the problem of drinking water of Buldana city for ever, when the work is completed.

Agro Industries important achievement

Agriculture sector : During the year 1976-77 kharif programme, area target of 230 133600 hectare was allotted to Buldana district. As against this target, achievement of 224060 hectare have been achieved in the kharif programme.

Also in respect of Hybrid Jowar crop the target of 115000 hectare was given, as against this, achievement was 117425 hectare. The target for improved pulses was allotted as 5000 hectares where as the achievement under improved pulses is 27300 hectares.

Important Industrial Development

During the year 1976-77 19 units were permanently registered & 34 units provisionally registered.

Under the scheme of financial assistance to small scale Industries an amount of Rs. 5 lakhs were disbursed upto 1973-74 & there after assistance is being made available through Maharashtra State Finance Corporation & Nationalised Banks.

The

There is one co-operative Industrial Estate at Khamgaon. The Government has handed over 5.83 hectares of land to the Co-operative society. The society has developed 22 plots & allotted 19 plots to the 14 members. M I D C has also planned area of 200.47 hectares for development of industrial area under sutala on National highway of Khamgaon Nandura Road.

Under self educated unemployment scheme 228 cases were sanctioned in 1976-77 & GA amount of Rs. 46.65 lakhs was sanctioned & Rs. 5.84 lakhs was disbursed as seed money to them.

There are two medium scale Industries. One M/s Bharat General textile ltd. Malkapur, which is engaged in manufacture of cotton seed oil & cake. It has also established a plant for refining the oil. The second unit is M/s Hanuman Vitamin Products pvt, ltd. Khamgaon, which is having a solvent plant & is extracting oil from cake by solvent extraction process. Both these units have exported their products & earned valuable foreign exchange of Rs. 180-61 lakhs.

There is good deposit of stone near Undri & Anadapur & said stones can be used for artifical Jewellery & presentable articles.

CHAPTER - II

Explanatory note on the scope and limitations of the Statistical data presented in the Part-II (Statistical Abstract)

I. Purpose

The abstract part of this publication gives exhaustive statistical data on important Socio-Economic indicators of development. Tables on almost all important topics, are presented in this part, so that the publication could serve as a reference book. Tahsilwise data have been displayed as far as possible for inter tahsil comparison. In most of the tables data for 1976-77 have been indicated with the data for 1975-76 could not be presented and the same for latest year or for which they were available, have been shown. In case of population census (1971), Livestock census (1972) the data for latest census have been presented. All the data have been collected from the state and Central Government Offices, Local bodies and other relevant agencies. The footnotes below each table indicate the source from which the data have been collected.

II. District at a Glance

The table presents a bird's eye-view of the Socio Economic indicators of development in Buldana District and Maharashtra State under different heads, such as area, population, agriculture and animal husbandary, education, transport and communication, Plan and C.D. Programme, local Bodies and other miscellaneous statistics. Reference year of the table is also indicated in the table.

III. Contents, Scope and limitation

The Statistical tables presented in the district Statistical Abstract are grouped in 13 parts. The contents of the tables and the scope and limitations of the data displayed under each group are explained below.

1. Area and Population

In all '7' tables i.e. tables No.1 to 7 are included in this section. Data for 1971 census are indicated in all tables except table No. 2 where in data for 1951, 1961 and 1971. Census are shown with decadal percentage variation. The reference period for 1971 census was sunrise of the 1st April 1971. The table No.1 given area, density of population, number of villages and towns, number of occupied residential houses and households and sexwise population separately for rural and urban,

For any place to be recognised as an urban area (town) for the 1971 census, it was to have a municipal corporation or an area under a municipal council or a cantonment or a civil line. If it did not have any of these urban local bodies to administer its affairs, the following empirical tests were applied, (a) minimum population of 5,000 (estimated for 1971), (b) a density of not less than 400 per Km² (1,000) per sq. mile), (c) 75 percent of the male working population pursuing occupations falling outside agriculture, (d) the place should have, according to the Director of Census Operations of the State, a few pronounced urban characteristics and amenities.

The term village (i.e. rural area) used, denotes a statutorily recognised village having a well defined boundary and separate land records. Hamlets wadies or padas have, therefore, been not shown as separate villages. On the other hand, statutorily recognised villages having no population have been shown separately as 'uninhabited' villages. Villages also include forest villages comprising mostly forest labourers and their families.

Table No.3 gives classification of villages according to population ranges in 1971 census.

Table No.4 gives number of towns, according to 1971 census alongwith population. Table No.5 give number of workers and Non-workers in Buldana district according to standard livelihood classes. The population according to livelihood classes is shown separately for rural and urban area and for the district as a whole. The concept of dependency has been abandoned for economic classification at the 1971 census. The ~~abandoned~~ emphasis is now on work and not on income or on economic dependence. A person is defined as worker if (a) in case of seasonal work like cultivation, livestock, household industry etc, he has had some regular work of more than one hour a day through-out the greater part of the working season, and (b) in case of regular employment in any trade, ^{profession,} service, business or commerce, he was employed during any of the seven days preceding the day of the enumerator's visits to the household.

The table No.6 gives distribution of population according to (a) age group and (b) Religion, separately for rural and urban area and for the district as a whole as per the 1971 census.

The table No.7 gives panchayat samiti wise details of scheduled caste, scheduled trive and neo-Buddhist separately for rural and urvan area and also for the district a whole according to 1971 census.

There are no scheduled tribes notified for this district in 1971.

2. Climate

Only two tables are included under this section pertaining to rainfall and temperature at the selected centres in Buldana district.

The table No.8 gives monthly rainfall and number of rainy days in each month at selected centres for the year 1975. The data is collected through Revenue agency. A day is treated as a rainy day if during the 24 hours the rainu_age recorded minimum of 2.5 m.m. of rainfall. Annual rainfall for each centre is also indicated in the table. 'Normal rainfall' is the average rainfall over a period raging from fifty to eighty years.

The table No.9 gives monthwise maximum minimum and also annual temperature as recorded at Buldana for the year 1975 by meteorological centre at Nagpur.

3. Agriculture

In all 14 tables i.e. table Nos. 10 to 23 are included in this section.

The table No. indicates tahsilwise figures of land utilisation under the standard heads of land uses for the 1974-75 and 1975-76. Against each tahsil, the break-up of the total geographical area according to different types of land uses is shown. Major constituents of the Geographical area etc, forest, land put to non-agricultural uses, barren and unculturable land, culturable wastes permanent pastures, land under miscellaneous tree crops not included in area sown current fallows, other fallows and net area sown. Under 'Forests' are included all actual forest areas of lands classed or administered as forests under any legal enactment dealing with forest whether state owned or private. If any portion of such land is not actually wooded but put to some agricultural use, that portion is included under the appropriate heading of cultivated or uncultivated land as the case may be 'Land put to Non-Agricultural uses' stands for all lands. Occupied by buildings, roads and railways or under water e.g. rivers and canals and other lands put to uses other than agricultural, Barren and unculturable land covers all barren and unculturable land like mountains, deserts etc. Land which can not be brought under cultivation unless at a high cost, is classed as barren and unculturable and whether such land is in isolated blocks or within cultivable holdings. Cultivation once but not cultivated during the current year and last five years or more in succession. Such lands may be either fallow or covered with shrubs

and jungles which are not put to anuse. They may be assessed or not assessed and my lie in isolated blocks or within cultivated holdings. Permanent pastures and other grazing lands cover all grazing lands whether they are Permanent Pastures or not. Villages-common and grazing land within forest area are included under the head 'land under miscellaneous tree crops etc.' not included in the net area sown are included, all cultivable land, which is not included under net area sown, out is put to some agricultural use. Land under casurina tree, thatching grass bamboo bushes and other for fuel etc. which are not included under 'Orchards' are classed under this category current fallows comprise cropped areas, which are kept fallow during the current year. Other fallow land included all lands which were taken up for cultivation, but are temporarily out of cultivation for a period of not less than one year and more than five years. The net area sown consists of net area sown with crops and orchards, area sown more than once being counted only once. The gross cropped area represents the sub-total of area under all crops. The difference between the total or the gross cropped area and net area sown is accounted for by the area sown more than once during the same year with the same or different crops. The table No.16 gives the information regarding the ground water survey & development agency in this district while table No.17 shows minor irrigation position.

The table No.18 gives the information on major and medium projects in this district. Both completed and in -completed projects have been covered in this table.

Position in this table is given for 30th June 1976. The cost of medium irrigation project ranges between Rs.20 Lakhs to 5 crores, where as that of a Major irrigation project is 5 crores and above.

Table No.19 deals with monthly agricultural wage rates in 1976. This data is collected fortnightly throughout the year from three selected rural centres in Buldana district viz. 1. Asalgaon 2. Deulghat & 3. Dongaon. Only one centre is selected from three tahsils. Table No. 20 gives information regarding Agri. Census operational holdings 1970. Table No. 21 gives Agricultural implements for all panchayat samities in the district. ~~whereas~~ Table No. 22 and 23 indicates scarcity position.

4. Animal Husbandary and Forest

A Animal Husbandary:- In all 4 tables i.e. tables Nos. 24 to 27 are included in this section. Table No. 24 gives panchayat samitiwise numbers of various types of livestock as enumerated in the district in live-stock census, 1972. The census is conducted through-out the country on an uniform basis of concepts and methods of enumeration once in '5' years. During the livestock census operations, the livestock and poultry were enumerated by house to house enquiry, particular care was taken to enumerate livestock in slaughter houses, stray animals and animals in transit. Sex and age groupwise classification of the livestock is also indicated in the table.

Table number 25, 26 and 27 gives panchayat samiti wise veterinary statistics, disease wise livestock mortality and number of slaughter houses and animals

slaughtered in them for the year 1976-77.

B- Forest - The table number 28 (a) gives details of area in different types of forests during the year 1976-77. Data regarding forests under the control of the state governments forest department and those under the control of the state Govt.'s revenue deptt. are shown separately. The areas under forests are classified under according to legal status i.e. the reserved forests, protected forests and unclassed forests. The legal status refers to classification of forests under the Indian forests Act. XVI of 1927. Reserved forests are those that are intended mainly for timber production, wherein the right of grazing and cultivation are seldom allowed. In protected forests the restrictions are not so rigid. Right of cultivation is allowed but certain limitations and restrictions are imposed. The unclassed forest refers to the inaccessible forest or unoccupied waste. The forests which are taken by Govt. from local bodies or private individuals for management on lease basis are called leased forests. There is no classification of ex-proprietery forests as such, but in Nagpur Division some private lands containing valuable forests are taken over by government under section 29 of the Indian forest Act. which are not yet classified as per tripartite classification and they are termed as ex-proprietery. The forest area shown in table No.28 (a) may not tally with the area under forest shown in table No.10. The two sets of figures differ due to the following reasons. 1) In the Indian forest statistics returns, the whole area including non-wooden area under the control -

of forest department is taken as area under forest, while in Agricultural statistics, it is classified according to its actual utilisation ii) The forest department returns are meant to serve a definite administrative purpose and indicate the ownership of the forest areas and actual utilisation of these area is not so important, from the point of view of forest department as it is in the land utilisation statistics under Agricultural Statistics. (III) The forest department returns relate to financial year and Agricultural statistics relate to the agricultural year.

5. Employment, Industry and Electricity

In all 10 tables i.e. table No.s 2 30 to 39 are included in this section.

The factory statistics shown in table No. 30,31,32 cover following types of factories registered under the Fact. Aft. 1948.

- 2) Those employing ten or more workers working with the aid of power (section 2m (i))
- 2) Those employing twenty or more workers and working without the aid of power (section 2m (ii)) and
- 3) Those registered under the section 35 of the act, under which the state government makes applicable the provisions of the Act., even though the above conditions are not fulfilled. However, statistics of the defence factories are excluded.

The table No.34 & 35 gives occupational distribution of total registrations and placements in the employment exchange for the 1976-77 according to standard National classification.

The table No.33 deals with the results of the Annual survey of Industries indicating industry wise working and reporting factories, employment, fixed working and productive capital, total value of production and value added for the year 1966. This survey is carried out by the Directorate of Economics & Statistics, Bombay annulay. Table No.36 show tahsilwise work undertaken under E. C. S. programme during 1976-77.

6) Co-operation

In all 8 tables i.e. table No.40 to 47 are included in this section.

The table No.42 gives panchayat samiti wise number of primary agricultural societies, their membership, share capital Reserve and other funds, working capital, loans advanced for the year 1976-77, 'Working Capital' includes paid up capital, deposits and borrowings till purchased or discounted. Overdues refer to amount of loan or instalments which were due for collection but which were not actually collected and for the repayment of which no extension has been granted by competent authority.

The table No.45 gives tahsilwise number of registered money lenders in each tahsil and loans advanced to traders and non traders have been furnished in this table. The transactions of money lending in the state are regulated under the provisions of Bombay money lenders Act. 1946. According to the Act, no money lender shall carry on the business of money landing except in the area for which he has been granted a licence, and except in accordance with the terms and conditions of such licence

7. Medical and Public Health

In all five tables i.e. table Nos. 48 to 52 are included in this section.

The table No.48 indicates tahsilwise number of hospitals, dispensaries, maternity homes, health centres and primary health centres, doctors, nurses, Vaidyas, beds and total number of indoor and outdoor patients treated for the year 1976. The table covers all the state and central Government medical institutions and also institutions owned by municipalities and local bodies engaged in providing medical facilities. Private clinics run by private bodies or individuals are, however, not included in the table.

The table No.49 gives vital statistics such as number of registered births and deaths in this district.

8. Education

In all 7 tables i.e. No. 53 to 59 are included in this section.

The table No.53 gives sexwise number of literates and percentage of literacy separately for rural and urban areas of each tahsil according to 1971. Population census. As per 1971 census definition, a person was classified as a literate if he was able to read or write a simple letter in any language. The table No.56 gives information according to number of educational institutions according to types for the year 1975-76 & 1976-77. Sexwise enrolment and number of trained and untrained teachers in these institutions is also indicated in this table. The classification of institutions according to types is slightly different from state of education.

The table No.57 presents data on the number of beneficiaries among backward classes such as scheduled tribes and other backward classes for the year 1976-77. Beneficiaries for this table are persons who are getting educational concessions of either type such as scholarships, freeships etc. Table No.58 presents data on concessions to the economically backward classes. The concessions of free education and amount incurred is given in this table for the year 1976-77. Under the category of 'economically backward' students whose parents guardians income is less than Rs. 2400 are covered

9. Transport and Communication

In all 7 tables i.e. table Nos. 60 to 66 are included in this section.

The table No.60 A gives total railway length on 31st March 1977 according to the type of routes i.e. Broad, Metre Gauge, Narrow Gauge. The railway length is measured between the first and last stations within the district boundary. The figures of length of each type of route are, therefore, approximate and are not accurate.

The table No.63 deals with operational statistics of Nationalised road Transport in Buldana division only.

The table No.64 presents the results of the traffic census on important roads conducted by building and communication department, Government of Maharashtra. Data on the number of vehicles is according to categories and location of count post. Type of surface and total traffic intensity in tonnes per 24 hours are also indicated in the table.

10) Local Bodies

In all 4 tables i.e. table Nos. 67 to 70 are included in this section.

The table No.67 gives abstract of income and expenditure of local bodies such as village panchayat, Zilla Parishad and Municipalities for the year 1965-66 & 1968-69, 70-71 to 1976-77. The number of village panchayats includes number of independent village panchayats as well as group village panchayats.

11. Plan and Community Development

In all 5 tables i.e. table No.71 to 75 are included in this section. These tables present data on sub-headwise expenditure incurred on District level plan schemes and E.C.D. Blocks and physical achievements - during the year 1976-77.

12. Prices

In all 3 tables i.e. table Nos. 70 to 78 are included in this section.

Table No.76 presents data on monthly wholesale prices of important agricultural commodities in the district and hence they are limited to certain commodities marketed by these market committees.

The table No.77 gives monthly average retail prices of various commodities at District head quarter Buldana. The average monthly prices of each commodity are shown in this table for the year 1976 alongwith units are varieties of commodities for which prices have been quoted. The data are regularly collected by the District Statistical Officer every week on Friday by visiting the selected shops. The average price of each commodity for the year is also shown in the table. As the information

collected for the given commodities, is restricted to only one quotation and that too only from one shop at District Head quarter, the average price for individual commodity cannot be said to be fully representative, but the data may prove useful as broad indicator of the trend in changes in retail prices over period of time.

The table No.78 gives consumer price index number (revised series) for working class of Nagpur centre published by the office of Commissioner of Labour Bombay. Monthwise data for the year 1976-77 commencing from April and also average for the year 1975-76 have been given in this table. The base year for calculating price index (New series) is 1960.

13. Miscellaneous

In all 14 tables i.e. table Nos. 79 to 92 are included in this section. Table Nos. 79 to 92 present data on various subjects such as police, crime statistics, cinema statistics, Banking, Joint stock companies, L.I.C., Small saving. ^{This} year two tables i.e. 90 and 91 are added showing therein details of quantity of Rice, wheat & sugar issued to fair price shops in district in table No.90 and demand and procurement of levy in table No.91.

Table No. 92 gives trends in selected indicators for the year 1950-51, 1960-61, 1966-67, 1970-71, 1974-75, 1975-76 and 1976-77.

C H A P T E R - III
INDICATORS OF DEVELOPMENT

In this chapter, the progress of development covering the period of the fifth plan 1975-76 has been reviewed by presenting tahsilwise sectoral trends based on certain important indicators of development comparative tahsilwise figures wherever available for 1960-61 & 1975-76 or 1976-77 as the case may be, have also been presented.

Indicator No. I - Percentage of gross sown area

The extent of double cropping is solely related to the availability of irrigational facilities and soils capable of retention of moisture after the monsoons. The district accounted for a very low percentage of area sown more than once to the net area sown as compared to Maharashtra State.

The following table gives the percentage of gross sown area to net sown area in 1960-61 & 1975-76 in each tahsil in the district.

It is seen from the above table that the percentage of gross cropped area has increased from 102.57 in 1960-61 to 107.06 in 1975-76. The percentage of double cropped area was highest in Chikhli tahsil followed by Mehekar tahsil.

In other three tahsils the proportion was less than the district average. The proportion of double cropped area in & tahsil is higher as most of the cultivators grow moong, urid, Hybrid jowar, groundnut etc. in kharif season & then grow crops like wheat, saflower gram etc. as second crop in Rabi season.

Indicator No.2 - Productivity of Important Crops

The productivity of crops by & large depends upon the timely rains, it even spreading over the period of the season, so also upon the adoption of hybrid & high yielding varieties of seeds use of chemical fertilizers & pest control measures.

Jowar, wheat, Rice, Tur are the main food crops of this district, while cotton, Groundnut are the major cash crops. The data of productivity for the year 1960-61 & 1975-76 are presented in the following table.

It will be observed from above table that the production of all the crops except cotton has increased in 1975-76 as compared to the production in 1960-61.

Indicator No.3 - Gross Value of Agricultural Production

As relevant price data required is not available, gross value of agricultural production could not be calculated.

Indicator No.4 - Percentage of irrigated area

The district Buldhana is mainly depends upon wells irrigation except the Nalganga Project located in Malkapur tahsil, Gyanganga project located in Khangaon tahsil, and Paldag project in Chikhli tahsil & some minor irrigation tanks & handharas located in different parts in the district. The percentage of irrigated area is very low as compared to other districts of Maharashtra.

The following table shows the percentage of gross irrigated area in 1960-61 & 1976-76.

From the above table, it is seen that the percentage of net irrigated area to net sown area has increased from 1.85 in 1960-61 to 3.29 in 1975-76. The increase was observed in all the tahsils. The percentage of area irrigated was highest in Chikbli tahsil followed by Mehkar tahsil. In other tahsils, the percentage was below the district average.

Indicator No. 5 - Changes in the Gross Pattern (Total & irrigated)

The major crops in the district are cotton & Jowar which accounted for 27.89 % & 35.93 % of the gross cropped area in the year 1975-76 respectively. The district also grows wheat & sunflower (Kardi) in Rabi season & Mung & Urid in Kharif season on large scale. The district has 60.82% of the gross cropped area under food crops in 1975-76.

From the above table it is seen that the proportion of area under food crops has slightly increased in 1975-76 as compared to the area in 1960-61.

The absolute increase is noted in Khangaon, Malkapur & Jalgaon tahsils on the contrary notable decrease is seen in Chikhli & Mehekar. The percentage of area under food crops was highest in Malkapur tahsil followed by Chikhli, Mehekar & Khangaon. In Jalgaon tahsil, the percentage was below the district average.

The proportion of area under non-food crops has slightly decreased in 1975-76 as compared to the area in 1960-61. The increase is noted in Chikhli & Mehekar and Jalgaon tahsils.

It is seen from the above table that the percentage of area under irrigated food crops to gross irrigated area has decreased from 92.1% in 1960-61 to 83.2% in 1975-76. The increase was in Chikhli, Khamgaon & Jalgaon tahsils while the percentage was decreased in remaining tahsils. The percentage of irrigated food crops to gross irrigated area was highest in Khamgaon followed by Chikhli & Jalgaon tahsils. The percentage in Mehekar tahsil was below the district average. Among the non-food crops, cotton is the main irrigated crops grown while wheat, sugarcane, Banana & other fruits vegetables & Chillies are the main irrigated food crops.

Indicator No.6 - Increase in Agricultural credit and Outstanding dues

The co-operative credit structure has been developed for financing the agriculturists according to their needs. Special facilities are also being made available to the agriculturist through the Co-operatives credit structure for participating in the schemes implemented by Govt. in the five year Plan period. The short & medium term loans are given by the District Central Co-operative Bank through the primary agricultural credit societies and service co-operatives, long term finance is however advances by the District Land Development Bank through its branches.

The following table shows talukawise primary agricultural societies, amount of loan advanced and loan outstanding in 1963-64 & 1976-77.

From the above table, it is seen that the number of credit societies decreased during the year 1976-77 over the number during 1963-64. The total amount of loan advanced has however increased by 271.87 percent in 1976-77 over the corresponding figure in 1963-64. The amount of loan outstanding has increased by 152.51 percent in 1976-77 as compared to the been outstanding in 1963-64.

Indicator No.7 - Agricultural Wage rates

The agricultural wage rate are collected from selected cultivators in selected centres viz. Dongaon, Deulghat and Asalgaon in Mehkar, Chikhli and Jalgaon tahsils respectively. Generally the skilled workers like carpenters, Blacksmiths, Cobblers etc. are not employed on daily wages and hence wage rates for these categories are not available. The wage rates are collected fortnightly. As these centres do not represent the district position very correctly, these wage rates may be taken as broad indicator of wage level in the district. The following table gives average wage rates of selected centres for the year 1963-64 and 1975-76 as the work of collection of these wage rates was started from June 1963.

The poultry population in District has decreased by 22.1 percent during 1972 as compared to the poultry population in 1961. This decrease has been observed in all tahsils of the district except Khangaon. The poultry per 100 persons was found to be above the district average in Chikhali & Mehkar tahsils while it was below the district average in other tahsils in the district in 1972. It was highest in Mehkar tahsil and lowest in Malkapur.

Indicator No.10 - Per Capita consumption of Electricity

The demand for electricity in the district is on rapid increase for boosting agricultural production. In all 652 villages and 9 towns were electrified by the end of 1976-

The following table shows the per capita consumption of electricity in 1961-62 and 1976-77.

It is observed from the above table that the per capita consumption of electricity in 1976-77 has increased by 393.02 percent over the corresponding consumption in 1961-62. The per capita consumption has increased mainly due to the increase in number of villages electrified under the Rural Electrification programme upto 1976-77 the per capita consumption has rapidly increased in the consumption classfied under other purposes due to increase in the electric pumps for agriculture. Industrial and Domestic consumption has also shown remarkable increase in 1976-77 over the year 1961-62.

Indicator No.11 - Increase in the number of candates enrolled in Employment Exchange and Vacancies

The following table gives the number of 1) Registration 2) vacancies notified and 3) placements in the district in 1960-61 and 1976-77.

It is seen from the above table that number of registration has increased by 139.45 percent in 1976-77 as compared to 1960-61. However, the vacancies notified and placements decreased by 68.56 and 71.68 percent respectively. The number of live registrar in 1960-61 and 1976-77 of vacancies notified to the registration 1960-61 and 1976-77 was 15.87 and of placements to the vacancies notified during the year 1960-61 and 1976-77 was 58.10 and 60.73 respectively.

Indicator No. 12 :- Increase in Indoor and Out-door patients treated in hospitals

The general aim of the health programme is to expand the existing health services to bring them within the reach of the people and to promote a progressive improvement in the level of natural health. Provision of adequate institutional facilities for organising health services, family planning etc. where important health programmes included in the Annual Plan 1976-77 for improving the health standard.

The following table gives number of indoor & outdoor patients treated in each tahsil of the district during 1960 & 1976 in the medical institutions available there.

From the above table, it is seen that the indoor patients treated in various public institutions patients have increased by 964.9 percent in 1976 as compared to the indoor patients treated in 1960. The increase is mainly due to the increase in the number of institutions (public health centre) treating indoor patients in rural area.

The number of out-door patients treated in the public institutions have also increased in the year 1960 as compared to the year 1960. The increase is 75.2 percent.

Indicator No.13 - Increase in the number of students in different categories

According to 1971 population census 37.31 (31.3 % Males & 22.77 females) of the population of this district was literate as against the literacy percentage of 37.4 (49.577 males & 24.87 females) and 39.1% (51.17 males and 26.4% females) of Vidarbha and Maharashtra respectively.

In this district the compulsory primary education was governed by primary education Act. of 1950 and amended Act. of 1956 of Ex. M.P. Govt. In 1955 the compulsion was introduced in Vidarbha for age group under the education Act of the region. Due to compulsion the number of schools and enrollment rose very rapidly in all tahsils. At the end of the year 1972-73 every village in district was within the vicinity of primary school or had a primary school in it. The following table gives the number of pupils enrolled in different categories of education for the year 1960-61 and 1976-77 in the district.

From the above table it is seen that enrolment in primary schools & secondary schools, has increased by 76.16 and 136.43 respectively in 1976-77 as compared to the enrolment in 1960-61. The increase in the enrolment of girls was however more for all categories due to increase in educational institutions in rural areas and due to the change in the outlook of people towards the female education.

Indicator No.14 - Increase in Road length per 100 sq.kms.

The Road Development programme in the fourth and fifth year plan has been formulated in accordance with the broad objective laid down in the 'Nagpur Plan' of 1961-62. The broad objectives of this plan were that no village in the developed and agricultural area should remain more than four miles away from metal road and more than 1 1/2 miles away from any type of road. The following table indicates road length per 100 square kilometers and per lakh of population in the district during 1960-61 and 1976-77.

From the above table, it is observed that the road length per 100 sq. kms. has increased from 9.56 in 1960-61 to 31.03 kms. in 1976-77, while the road length per lakh of population increased from 87.95 kms. in 1960-61 to 239.42 kms. in 1976-77.

Indicator No. 15 - Increase in banking facilities in proportion to population

Since the nationalisation of the banking business the various banking companies have brought the field of agricultural and industrial development in their operational field and area advancing loans to the agriculturists and

small units of industries. The co-operative banks also made a remarkable progress in expanding their business in rural areas. There were 10 scheduled banks and 12 Co-operative banks functioning in this district during 1960-61. At the end of the year 1976, the number of scheduled banks rose to 36 while there were 51 co-operative banks in Buldana district. The following table gives the No. of banks & population per banking office during the year 1960-61 & 1975-76.

From the above table, it is seen that the No. of banking offices per lakh of population increased from 2.08 in 1960-61 to 6.89 in 1975-76. During the year 1976 a banking office could cater to the needs of 14517 persons as against 48,168 persons in 1960-61. The banking facilities were available at 41 places in various parts in the district covering a population of 354048 at the end of the year 1976.

Indicator No.16 - Prices

since the declaration of emergency in the country 1962, price quotations for the same important commodities from all district head quarters are collected on weekly basis by the district statistical officer. The prices of different commodities are collected from selected shops and for selected varieties on each Friday and do not fully represent the district position, but the data may still prove useful as a broad indicator of the trend in changes in retail prices over a period of time in the district. The table below indicates the average of prices of some important commodities collected at Buldana town for the year 1963 and 1976.

From the above table it will be seen that prices of all the commodities have increase upto 1976 as compared to the prices in 1963. The increase is remarkable in almost all the commodities and particularly in all food grains, sugar, groundnut oil, chillies, potatos etc.

CHAPTER -IVANNUAL PLAN 1976-77

Adverse climatic conditions during 1970-71 and unfavourable monsoon in 1971-72, 72-73, 73-74 have adversely affected the agricultural production which necessitate the reorientation of plan priorities and programme. After careful re-appraisal of plan priorities, specific programme & for securing social justice, promoting the economic progress of weaker section of community and backward area have been initiated during the year 1976-77.

During the year 1976-77 an amount of Rs. 447.75 lakhs was utilised under different district level schemes in this district, out of which Rs.351.70 lakhs were expended in the state sector and Rs.96.05 lakhs were spent in local sector.

The table No.71 of this publication gives plan expenditure utilised under different development schemes head & sub-headwise, during the year 1975-76 & 76-77 - implemented in this district under state sector and local sector separately. The following table gives amount spent under different heads of development during the year 1975-76 and 1976-77 in this district.

The achievement under different heads of development is summarised below :-

1. Agricultural Programme / Agricultural Production

Under this sub-head, expenditure of Rs. 4.27 lakhs was incurred for schemes relating to seed farms, Development of local manurial resources, plant protection and integrated area development programme including community

2. Minor Irrigation

Under this sub-head minor irrigation, subsidy was given to 54 new wells & 61 pump sets. 11 percolation tanks & 3 minor irrigation tanks from local sector works were in progress. So also, 17 M.I. works were in progress from state sector.

3. Soil Conservation

Under this sub-head, soil conservation bunding was completed in 21605 heactares and afforestation for soil conservation was completed in 25 heactares as second year operations & premonsoon work done in 240 heactares & in addition in 545 heactares plantation was done.

4. Ayacut Development

Under this programme, 242.48 heactares of land was developed & made suitable for irrigation purposes.

5. Animal Husbandary

The amount incurred under this sub-head was mainly for construction of A.I. centres & improvement in 20 A.I. sub-centres & also for key villager centres.

6. Forest

Under the sub-head forest, plantation programme Third year operation in 55 hectares, General utility timber second year operation in 6 hectares & pre-monsoon in 35 hect., fast growing species pre-monsoon work in 400 hectares, fodder development in 25 hect. & pre-monsoon in 80 hect. & reforestation of degraded forests pre-monsoon work were carried out in 464 hectares.

7. Irrigation & power Project

Under this sub-head 13 villages were electrified and 272 pump sets were installed under R.E.C. -II & 1279 pump were connected under normal development. Under irrigation 2 medium project works i.e. Paldhag & Karadi are in progress.

8. Co-operation & Community Development

Under this programme subsidy was granted to 3 urban consumer co-op. societies.

9. Community Development

The amount under this sub-head was incurred mainly on the incomplete 64 Community Development Works and A.N.P. in three selected i.e. Buldana, Motala and Sindkhed-Raja Panchayat Samities.

10. Industry & Mining

Under this sub-head Industry and mining, seed money assistance was given to the 200 educated unemployed persons & grant in aid was given to 13 B.L.V. societies in the district.

11. Transport & Communication

Under this programme, 2 bridges were completed & 15 C.D. works were carried out. So also an amount of Rs. 3.37 lakhs was spent on minimum needs programme of roads.

12. General Education

Under this programme, grant in aid assistance was given for 26 school rooms, one balwadi was opened, 49 Non Govt. secondary schools were developed. Inservice training to 40 teachers was imparted & for 4000 students E.B.C. concessions were given.

13. Water Supply & drainage

Under this programme simple measures 43 drinking water wells were in progress & in addition 27 well works deepening of wells were undertaken of G.S.D.A.

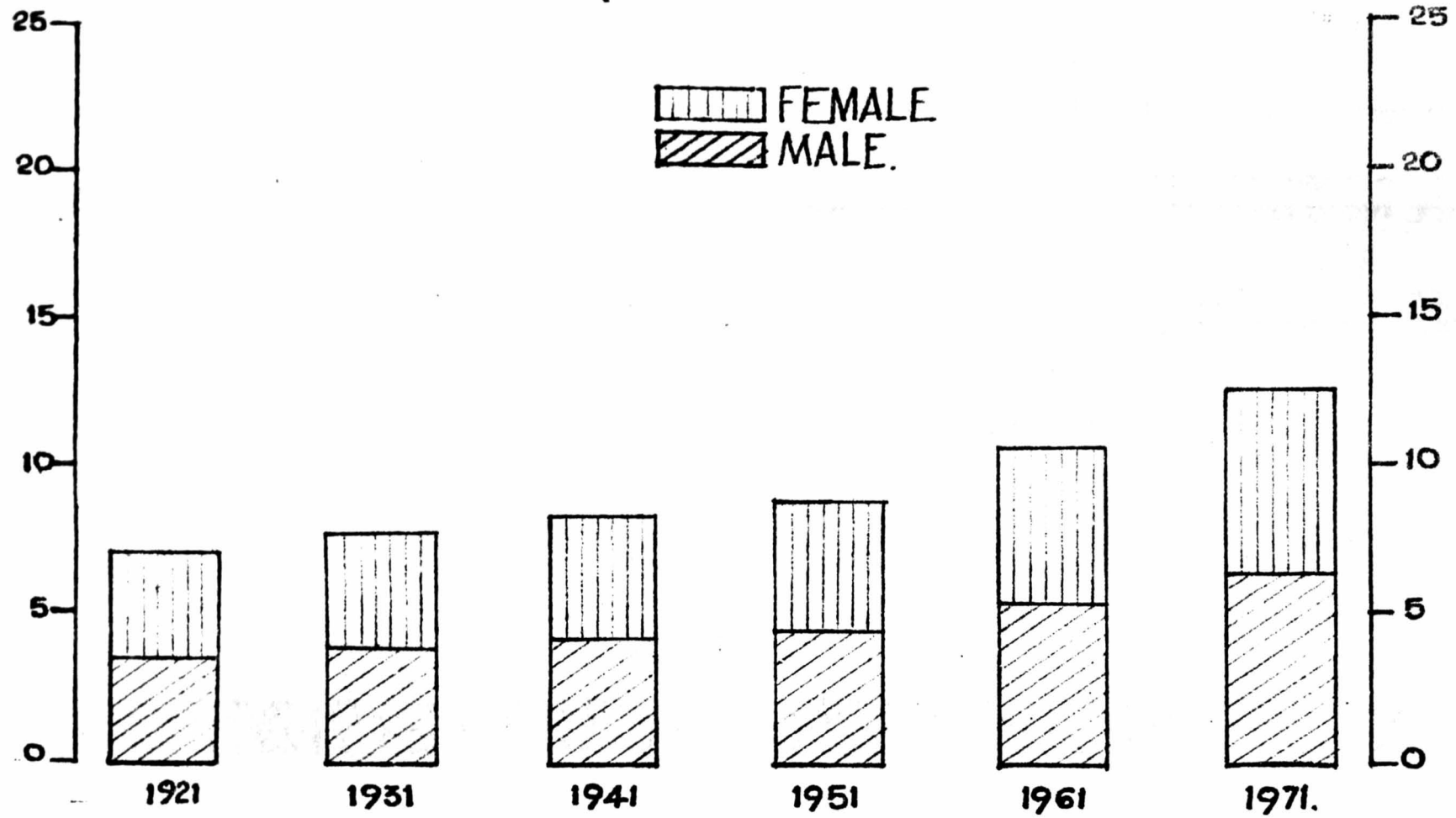
14. Welfare of Backward Classes

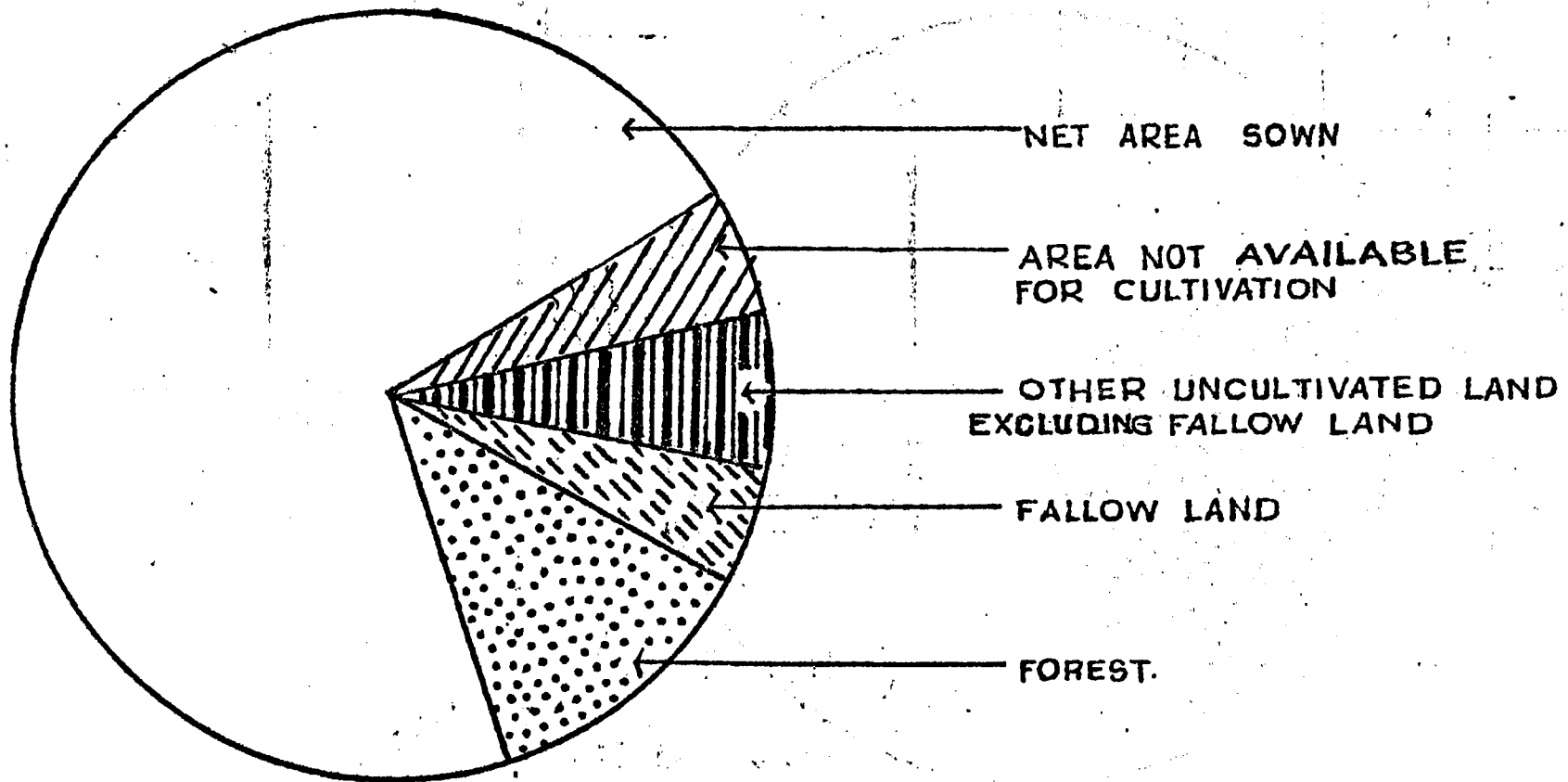

LAND UTILISATION IN BULDHANA DISTRICT

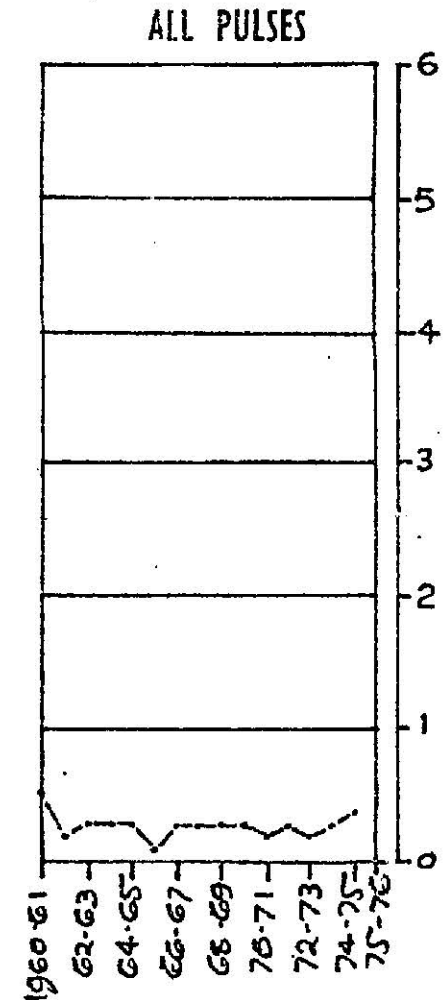
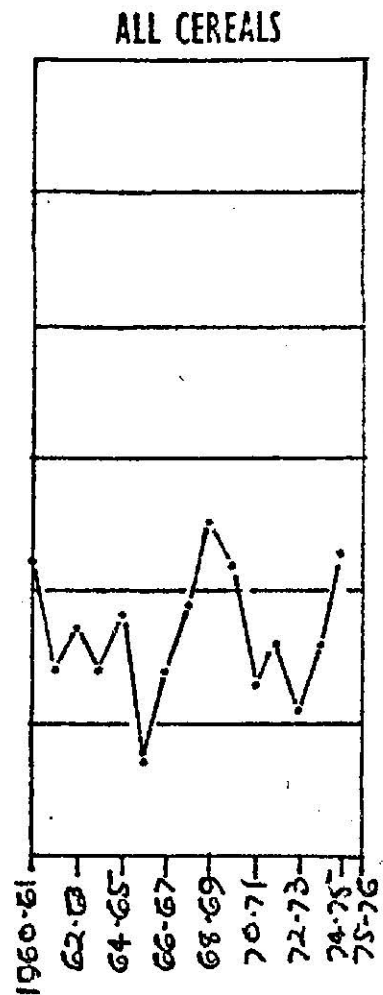
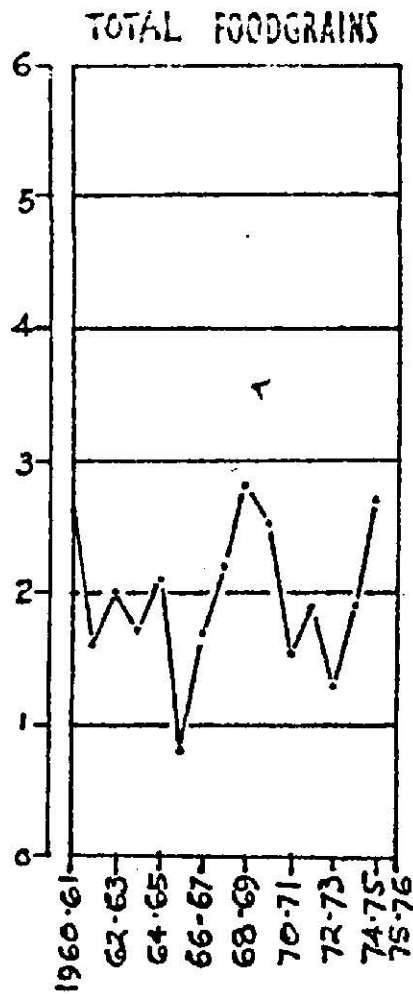
