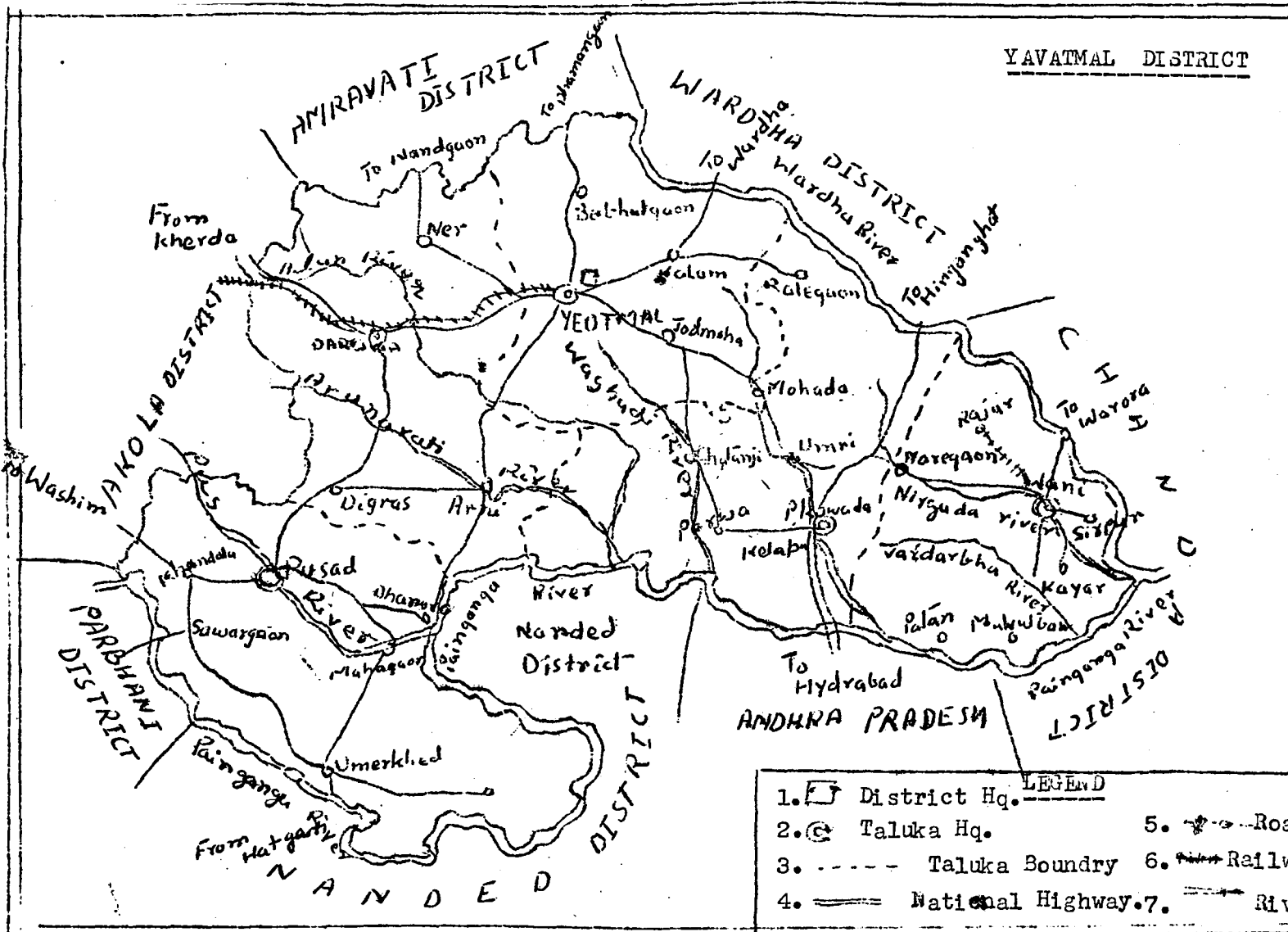

CHAPTER - I

INTRODUCTION

1.1 Location -

Yavatmal district is one of the eight districts of Nagpur Division lying between 19° 26' and 20° 42' North latitudes and 77° 18' and 79° 9' East longitudes. Most of the district is covered by the Deccan Plateau i.e. southern plateau of Berar.

1.2 Boundaries -

It is surrounded by Amaravati in the North, Akola and Parbhani districts in the west, Nanded and Adilabad (Andhra Pradesh) districts in the south, Chandrapur and Wardha districts in the East. The district is quite extensive in size, ranking second in Nagpur Division while 8th in the State.

The district has natural boundary in the East and South. The Wardha river separates the district from Wardha and Chandrapur districts in the East, while in the south Painganga river separates it from Nanded district and Adilabad district of Andhra Pradesh.

1.3 Administrative Set up -

The district is divided into five talukas for administrative purpose at present. The Collector is in charge of the district so far as general administration, Law and order, Land Revenue, civil supplies and coordination among various offices are concerned. The Collector is assisted by Resident Deputy Collector and four Deputy Collectors at headquarters, and five Sub-Divisional Officers posted at

five sub-divisions, viz. Tahsils. The Tahsildar assisted by a few Naib tahsildars, is incharge of the tahsil administration and assists the Sub-Divisional Officer in his functions.

The judiciary is entirely separated from the executive departments and the District and Session Judge is the head of Judicial Department in the district. However, the Collector continues to be the District Magistrate, whose powers are limited to security, law and order. The District and Session Judge is assisted by a Civil Judge (Senior Division) Five Civil Judges (Junior Division) and first class Judicial Magistrates at tahsil headquarters.

The police force in the district functions under the Superintendent of Police at district head-quarter. The Civil Surgeon is incharge of the Government Hospital and other medical facilities in the district. In addition there are other district heads of offices under various departments for respective functions.

1.4 Local Bodies, Panchayat Samities and Zilla Parishad.

The Zilla Parishad and fourteen Panchayat Samities have been formed in the district on 1st May 1962. The Zilla Parishad is responsible for the development of the entire area in the district excluding municipal area. The Panchayat Samiti covers the area of community development blocks. There are eight municipal councils to look after the development of urban areas. For Zilla Parishad, there are 49 directly elected councillors, out of which two seats are reserved for scheduled castes and seven seats for scheduled tribes. In addition, there are five associated members, who are the presidents of the five different Co-operative societies.

An elected chairman of each Panchayat Samiti is also ex-officio Councillor of the Zilla Parishad. The Zilla Parishad is headed by president assisted by vice-president, both of them are elected from the elected Councillors. The Chief Executive Officer looks after the administration of the Zilla Parishad. For the administration purpose, there are various departments carrying out respective functions of the departments. The Deputy Chief Executive Officer works as Secretary to Zilla Parishad. The Zilla Parishad functions through a standing committee, presided over by the president and six sub-subject committees viz. Finance, Works, Agriculture and Co-operation, Education, Health and Social Welfare.

The Panchayat Samiti consists of elected and coopted councillors from the area of the panchayat samiti. The Panchayat Samiti has elected Chairman and Vice-Chairman. The Block Development Officer works as Secretary to Panchayat Samiti.

There are 1,119 village panchayats in the district. There is a Sarpanch for Village Panchayat who is elected from the elected members from the village or group of villages in that village panchayat. The Sarpanch and in his absence Up-Sarpanch looks after the development activities at village level.

1.5 Area and Territorial changes -

The area of the district is 13,925 sq.kms. which forms 14.28% of the area of the Nagpur Division and 4.53% of the area of the State. Its maximum length from East to west is 192 kms. Whereas its maximum breadth from North to South is 160 kms. Out of the total area, about 94.34% (13833.2 Sq.kms) area belongs to rural part of the district.

Yavatmal district is among the four districts of the Old Berar, handed over by the Nizam to the Govt. of India in 1853. It was a part of East Berar District upto 1863. A new Wun (Wani) district was formed by separating Yavatmal, Kelapur, Wani, Darwha talukas from East Berar district in 1864. Pusad taluka of Basim district was transferred to this Wun district in 1905 and Yavatmal district was newly constituted in that year. There were no major changes in the constituents of the district till 1955, when the district was transferred from Madhya Pradesh State to the then bilingual Bombay State due to State Reorganisation. At present, it is a part of Nagpur Division of the Maharashtra State since May 1st, 1960.

1.6 Topography

The district has an undulating topography. The whole district is covered by the Ajantha ranges broken by broad river valleys and partially surrounded by plains. The central portion of the district is a plateau with steep ghats with an elevation of 300 to 500 metres (1000' to 1500') above mean sea level. Both Painganga and Wardha rivers, with their tributaries, provide strips of plains in many parts along their course. The width of these plains varies from 5 to 15 kms.

1.7 Hills, River, System, Soil etc.

The whole district is covered by small east-west ranges of the Ajantha mountains. The off shoots of the Ajantha ranges are, at places, broken by the broad valleys of the tributaries of Painganga and Wardha rivers.

Wardha and Painganga are the main rivers in the district, both of which flow along North-Eastern and Southern boundaries of the district respectively. They have numerous tributaries traversing in the middle of the district. The bed of the Wardha river is broad and deep, still the banks suffer from floods many a times. Wardha has two tributaries viz. Bembla and Nirguda. Nirguda has its entire course in Wani tahsil, while the Bembla flows across the north of Yavatmal tahsil below the ghats. The other river Painganga has six important tributaries viz. Pus, Arunawati, Adan, Waghadi, Khuni and Vidarbha. Pus flows through Pusad tahsil, Arunawati and Adan through Dafwaha tahsil and Vidarbha flows through Wani tahsil. All these rivers with their tributaries maintain their flow for a greater part of the year and assist drainage system of the soil.

The soils in the district as a whole are uniformly good in texture, but vary in colour from black to dark brown. They are, however slightly inferior in fertility to those in Akola and Amaravati districts. The soils of the district, mainly suffer from the mixture of pieces of Chunchadi (limestone), sloping surfaces and excessive admixture of sand. However, the soil varies from very fertile alluvial tracts in the valleys to hills and hard parts on the plateaus.

In Wani taluka the soil is uniform but coarse in texture and of a radish colour. In Kelapur tahsil and central and southern parts of Yavatmal tahsil and hilly parts of Pusad tahsil, the soils are coarse gravelly or loose friable texture and of a colour varying from light brown to grey. The rich fertile alluvial soils are found in western parts of Yavatmal tahsil and in middle of Darwaha and

Pusad tahsils.

The district can be divided into three natural zones, viz. 1) the Bembra, Wardha basin in the North, 2) the plateau portion at the central and in the southwest part of the district, and 3) the plain fertile lands of the Pus, Painganga basin in the South.

1.8 Minerals

Limestones and coal are the only important minerals found in the district. The limestone found in cement grade variety found near Chanakha in Kelapur tahsil. The estimated reserves are about 39 million tonnes. There is only one coal field near Pigaon in Wani tahsil, extending over 12 sq. miles. As regards coal, the reserves are estimated at 240 million tonnes, and there is one colliery at Rajur exploiting coal.

1.9 Climate, Temperature and Rainfall

The climate of the district is in general hot and dry. The temperature ranges from 10.2°C to 31.8°C in Winter and 20.5°C to 41.6°C in Summer during 1974.

The south west monsoon brings rains to the district. The rainy season lasts from June to October. The intensity of rainfall is highest in the month of August. The normal rainfall varies from 910 mms (31.5 inches) to 1260 mms. (49.5 inches). In the past few years the monsoon is very irregular and it is also not uniform in the district. Darwha tahsil gets lowest rains on an average of about 889 mms. (35 inches) while Wani tahsil gets maximum rains about 1125 mms. (45 inches). The central region covering Yavatmal tahsil gets on an average nearly 1099 mms. (42 inches) of rains.

In 1974 Wani tahsil got about 868.6 mms. of rains while Yavatmal tahsil got about 668.0 mms. of rains. In the remaining talukas rainfall varied from 719 mms. to 786 mms. during this year.

1.10 Demography

The total population of the district was 14,23,677 as per 1971 census. The percentage of increase in the population of the district works out to 29.61 % in the last decade. The density of the population increased from 79 persons per sq. km. (210 per sq. mile) in 1961 to 102 persons per sq. km. (272 persons per sq. mile) in 1971. Similarly the literacy percentage also increased from 23.48% to 31.56% during the decade. The progress made in the literacy is outstanding in context of the large tribal population and a small (13.65% of the total population) proportion of urban population.

As regards working force in the district, it is seen that there were 43.32% workers enumerated in the total population of the district at 1971 census. Out of the total working population in the district 26.50% are engaged as cultivators, 57.52% as agricultural labourers and 15.98% in different services. The remaining 56.68% population of the district was non-workers including dependents.

C H A P T E R _ I I

Explanatory notes on the scope and limitations of the
Statistical data presented in the Part-II (District Statistical
Abstract)

I. Purpose

The statistical abstract part of this publication contains exhaustive statistical data on important socio economic aspects. Tables on almost all important topics are presented in this part, so that this publication could serve as a reference book for various purposes. Tahsilwise information has been furnished where-ever possible for the purpose of inter-tahsil comparison. The data presented in this publication pertains to the year 1974-75 and 1973-74. The data for the latest available year have been given, where the data for the year 1974-75 could not be presented. The latest available data of population census 1971 and Live stock Census 1972 have been indicated. Almost all data have been collected from the concerned State and Central Government Officers, Local bodies and other relevant agencies. The foot notes below each table indicate the source from which the data have been collected.

II. District at a Glance -

This table gives information on important items relating to the Socio Economic Development in Yavatmal district and the State under different heads such as areas, population, agriculture, animal husbandry, education, health transport and communication, plan and community development programme, local bodies and other relevant statistics at a glance.

III. Contents, scope and limitations -

The statistical tables presented in the

statistical abstract are grouped into 13 parts. The contents of the tables and the scope and limitations of the data presented under each group are described here under .

1. Area and Population

The data for 1971 census are indicated in all the tables. The reference period for the 1971 census was the sunrise of 1st march, 1971.

Table No. 1

This table indicates area, density of population per sq. km., number of villages and towns, number of occupied houses and house-holds and Sexwise rural, urban and total population. The area figures are given in sq.kms. (1 sq.km. = 0.386 sq.miles).

Table No. 2

This table presents sex-wise rural urban and total population enumerated in 1951, 1961, and 1971 censuses alongwith the decadal percentage variations for the district as well as for each tahsil.

Table No.3

This table gives classification of inhabited villages according to different population ranges in the district. The term village (i.e. rural areas) used in the table denotes a revenue village having well defined boundaries and a separate set of land records irrespective of the fact whether that defined area has any population or not. Hamlets Wadies, Padas have therefore not been shown as separate villages. Similarly the revenue villages which do not have any residential population are shown as 'Un-inhabited Villages' The term village includes forest village comprising mostly of forest labourers and their families. Total population of the

villages in each population range is also shown in this table. The total number of inhabited and un-inhabited villages are also indicated separately.

Table No.4

This table presents talukawise classification of towns in the district according to different population ranges with total population of the towns in each population range.

Table No.5

This table gives the classification of population into workers and non-workers according to standard livelihood classes. A person is defined as a worker if (a) he has had some regular work for more than an hour for a day in greater part of the working season in case of seasonal work like cultivation, livestock, dairying, household industry etc. and (b) in case of regular employment in any trade, a professional service, business or commerce, he was employed during any of the fifteen days preceding the day of enumerater's visit to the household.

Beggars, pensioners, agricultural or non-agricultural royalty receivers, rent or devident receivers etc. who earn an income, but who are not participating in any productive work in any occupation and also persons who had been offered work but not joined the work, have been classified as non-workers.

This table indicates distribution of population according to (a) age group and (b) religion separately for rural/areas and for the district as a whole as per 1971 census.

2. Climata -

Table No. 8

This table indicates monthly rainfall and number of rainy days in each month at the selected centres and namely Yavatmal, Pandharkaoda, Wani, Pusad, /Darwha for the year 1974. The data is collected through revenue agencies. A day is treated as a 'rainy day' if during 24 hours, the rain gauge recorded a minimum of 2.5 mm of rain fall. 'Normal rainfall' is the average rainfall over a period ranging from fifty to eighty years.

Table No. 9

This table gives monthwise maximum and minimum temperature and also annual temperature as recorded at selected centres namely Yavatmal and Pusad for the year 1974. The data are supplied by the Regional Meteorological Centre at Nagpur. The maximum and minimum temperature denotes the average of the maximum and minimum temperatures recorded daily during the month. The annual maximum and minimum temperatures is the simple average of monthly maximum and minimum temperatures.

3. Agriculture

Table No. 10 -

This table gives talukawise figures of land utilisation for the year 1972-73 and 1973-74. Major groups in which the area is classified are forest, land put to non-agricultural uses, barren and unculturable land, culturable wastes, permanent pastures, land under miscellaneous tree

crops not included in area sown, fallow land and area sown.

All forest areas classed or administered as forests under any legal enactment dealing with forests, whether State owned or private, are included under forest. If any portion of such land is not actually wooded but put to some agricultural uses, that portion is included under the appropriate heading of cultivated or Un-cultivated land as the case may be. The areas occupied by buildings, roads and railways or area under water i.e. rivers and canals and other areas put to uses other than agriculture are included under 'Land put to non-agricultural uses'. 'Barren and unculturable land' covers land under mountains, deserts etc. which may be brought under cultivation but at a high cost. 'Culturable land' covers all land available for cultivation whether not taken for cultivation or taken up for cultivation once, not cultivated during the current and last five years or more in succession. Such lands may either be fallows or areas covered with shrubs. 'Permanent pastures and other Grazing land' included all grazing lands whether they are permanent pastures and meadows or not. 'Land under miscellaneous tree crops etc.' not included in 'net area sown' is the land under casurina trees, thatching grass, bamboo bushes, and other for fuel etc., which is included in cultivable land but not included in orchards. 'Current fallows' comprise cultivable areas which are kept fallow during the current year. 'Other fallows' include all land which are once taken up for cultivation, but are temporarily out of cultivation for a period of not less than one year and more than five years. The 'net area sown' consists of area sown under crops and orchards, area sown more than once being counted only once. The 'gross cropped

area' represents the sum total of area under all crops.

Table No.11

This table gives taluka wise area under different major crops for the year 1972-73 and 1973-74.

Table No.12

This table indicates outturn and yield rate per hectare of the principal crops during the year 1972-73 and 1973-74.

Table No.13

This table furnishes the talukawise data of the area irrigated by different sources of irrigation during the year 1972-73 and 1973-74.

Table No.14

This table presents talukawise area irrigated under different crops during the year 1972-73 and 1973-74.

Table No.25

This table gives talukawise number of irrigation wells in use and not in use during the year 1972-73 and 1973-74.

Table No. 16

This table furnishes the information regarding irrigation works (excluding irrigation wells) for the year 1973-74.

Table No.17

This table describes the major and medium irrigation projects (both completed and not completed) in this district as on 30th June 1974. The cost of major irrigation project is between Rs.20 lakhs to 5 crores whereas the cost of major irrigation project is 5 crores and above.

Table No. 18

This table deals with the monthly average agricultural wage rates in 1974. This data is collected fortnightly through-out the year from the selected centres in this district namely (1) Ner (2) Kalamb and (3) Maregaon.

Table No. 19

This table gives data on agricultural implements collected in the live stock census 1972.

Table No. 20

The information regarding famine, scarcity and skin to scarcity for the year 1974-75 is furnished in this table.

Table No. 21

The data on scarcity for the last Five years i.e. from the year 1970-71 to 1974-75 is furnished in this table.

4. Animal Husbandry and Forest

4) Animal Husbandry

Table No. 22

This table gives talukawise number of various types of Livestock and poultry as enumerated in the district in the Livestock Census 1972, which was conducted through-out the country on an uniform basis. Precaution was also taken to enumerate livestock in slaughter houses, stray animals and animals in transit. The reference date and time of this livestock census was sunrise of 15th April, 1972. Sex and age-group wise classification of livestock is also given in this table.

Table No. 23, 24 and 25

These tables give talukawise veterinary statistics, diseasewise livestock mortality and slaughter houses and animals slaughtered for the year 1974-75 respectively.

(B) Forest

Table No. 26 (A)

The details of area under different types of forest during the year 1974-75 are given in this table. The data regarding the forest under the control of State Government both under Forest Department and Revenue Department are shown separately. The area under forest is classified according to legal status i.e. reserved forest, protected forests and unclassed forests. The legal status refers to the classification of forests under the Indian Forests Act XVI of 1927. The reserved forests are intended mainly for timber production, wherein the rights of grazing cultivation are seldom allowed. In case of protected forests, the restrictions are not so rigid. The unclassed forests refer to the inaccessible forests or un-occupied waste. The forest area shown in table No. 26 (A) may not tally with the area under forest shown in table no. 10. The two sets of figures differ due to the following reasons.

(1) In the Indian Forest Statistics returns, the whole area including non-wooden area under the control of Forest Department is considered as an area under forests, while in Agricultural Statistics, it is classified according to its actual utilisation.

(2) The forest Department returns are meant to serve a definite administrative purpose and indicate the ownership of the forest areas and the actual utilisation of these areas is not so important from the point of view of Forest Department, as it is in the land utilisation Statistics under Agricultural Statistics.

(3) Forest Department returns relate to the financial year while Agricultural Statistics relate to the agricultural year.

Table No. 26(B)

The information regarding major and minor forest produce for the year 1974-75 is indicated in this table.

5. Employment, Industry, Mining and Electricity -

The annual factory statistics for 1973 is furnished in these tables which cover the following types of factories registered under the Factory Act 1948.

- (1) those employing ten or more workers working with the aid of power (Section 2(1)).
- (2) those employing 20 or more workers and working without the aid of power (Section 2(1i)).
- (3) Those registered under section 85 of the Act under which the State Government make applicable the provisions of the act, even though the above conditions are not fulfilled.

Table No. 27

This table gives the average daily employment of workers in the factories for the year 1973.

Table No. 28

This table indicates industrywise distribution of working factories according to working strength in the year 1973.

Table No. 29

The distribution of factories according to working days for the year 1973 is given in this table.

Table No. 30

This table presents statistics relating to annual survey of industries, 1966 for nine types of industries.

Table No. 31

This table deals with registrations, vacancies notified and placements during the year 1974-75 with the employment exchange in this district.

Table No. 32

This table gives distribution of total registrations, placements in the employment exchanges according to standard National classifications for the year 1974-75.

Table No. 33

The volume of employment in different industries as on 31st March 1975 is indicated in this table.

Table No. 34 and 35

These tables furnish data regarding consumption of electricity for different purposes during the year 1974-75 and the data pertaining to the towns and villages electrified upto 31st March 1975 respectively,

6. Co-operation

Table No. 36

This table gives the total number of co-operative societies by types, functioning in the district during the year 1974-75.

Table No. 37

This table presents the position of Co-operative banks with regard to structure and business for the year 1974-75.

Table No. 38

This table gives talukawise number of the primary agricultural credit societies, service societies, their membership, share capital, reserve and other funds, working capital, loan advanced and recovered, loan outstanding

and overdues and percentages of recovery to total loans advanced during the year 1974-75. The term 'working capital' includes paid up share capital, deposits and borrowings. 'Loan outstanding' covers outstandings in respect of loans, cash credit and ~~overdrafts~~ overdrafts and the amount of outstanding bills purchase or discounted. 'over dues' refer to an amount of loan or instalments, which are due for collection but which were not actually collected and for the repayment of which no extension has been granted by the competent authority.

Table No. 39

The data pertaining to other different types of co-operative societies except primary agricultural credit societies and banks for the year 1974-75 is furnished in this table.

Table No. 40 and 41

The operational data of Central and primary co-operative marketing societies and other different types of co-operative societies for the year 1974-75 is presented in these tables respectively.

Table No. 42

This table indicates the operations of regulated markets in the district during the year 1974-75.

Table No. 43

This table gives talukawise number of registered money lenders and loans advanced by them during the year 1974-75. Separate figures of loans advanced to traders and non-traders are shown in this table. The transactions of Money lending in the State are regulated under the provisions of Bombay money Lenders Act, 1946. As per provisions in the Act,

no money lender shall carry on the business of money lending except in the area of which the licence has been granted to him and except in accordance with the terms and conditions of such license.

7. Medical and public Health

Table No. 44

This table indicates number of hospitals, dispensaries maternity homes, primary health centres, doctors vaidyas, nurses and the total number of indoor and outdoor patients treated during the year 1974. All the State Government medical institutions as well as the institutions run by the municipal councils and other local bodies are included. The private clinics, hospitals run by private bodies or individuals are, however not covered in this table.

Table No. 45

This table presents talukawise data of vital statistics such as number of registered births and deaths and infant deaths in the district during the year 1974.

Table No. 46

This table gives data regarding deaths due to important causes during the years 1971, 1972, 1973 and 1974.

Table No. 47

This table presents talukawise vaccination statistics for the year 1974.

Table No. 48

This table indicates the number of family planning centres in each taluka in the district as on 31st March, 1975 and the number of sterilisation operations under taken in these centres during the year 1974-75.

8. Education

Table No. 49

This table gives Sexwise number of literates and percentage of literacy separately for rural and urban areas of each tahsil according to 1971 census. A person was classified as a literate, if he was able to read or write a simple letter in any language.

Table No. 50 and 51

Since the data regarding the distribution of literates according to educational standards in rural and urban areas as per 1971 census is not available, the data for these two tables on this subject are given for 1961 census.

Table No. 52

This table indicates the number of educational institutions according to types for the year 1973-74. Sexwise enrolment and number of trained and untrained teachers in these institutions is also given in this table. The classification of institutions according to 'Types' in this table is slightly different from stage of education. There are at present many secondary schools which also impart education in primary courses, the entire pupil enrolment of students is included under 'Secondary' education. Primary institutions provide education for standards I to IV or standards I to VII/VIII or less and teaches the curriculum approved by the Education Department. The Secondary institutions coach students for standards VIII to X or XI with or without lower standards. Higher education is the education after passing Secondary School Certificate Examination which leads to a degree examination.

Table No. 53

This table gives the number of beneficiaries

among backward classes such as Scheduled Castes, Scheduled tribes and other Backward classes in the different types of educational institutions during the year 1973-74.

The pupils who get educational concession of either types such as scholarships, free ships etc. are treated as beneficiaries.

Table No. 54

This table indicates the number of beneficiaries under economically backward class concessions and the amount of concessions granted during the year 1973-74 and 1974-75.

Table No. 55

This table gives the expenditure incurred on primary education during the year 1974-75 by different agencies like Zilla Parishad, Municipal councils etc. Plan and non-plan expenditure is shown separately.

9. Transport and communications -

Table No. 56

This table gives total railway length as on 31st March, 1975 according to types of routes i.e. broad gauge metre gauge and narrow gauge. The railway length is measured between the first and last stations within the district boundary. The figures of length of each type of route are therefore approximate and not accurate.

Table No. 57

This table indicates the road length according to category of roads and surface classification as on 31st March, 1975.

Table No. 58

This table gives the number of motor vehicles in operation as on 31st March, 1975 in Amravati Region in

which this district is also included.

Table No. 59

This table deals with the operational statistics of Nationalised Road Transport in Yavatmal Division as on 31-3-1975. The State Transport Division Yavatmal comprises of Yavatmal district and Wardha depots.

Table No. 60

This table presents the results of Census of important roads conducted by buildings and communication Department Govt. of Maharashtra as on May, 1973. The data regarding the number of vehicles is according to categories and location of count-posts.

Table No. 61

This table gives an abstract of income and expenditure of local bodies such as Zilla Parishad, Municipal Councils and Village Panchayats for the financial year 1965-66, 1968-69 to 1974-75. An independent as well as group village gram panchayats are included in the number of village panchayats.

Table No. 64

This table indicates headwise income and expenditure of village panchayats in each Panchayat Samiti for the year 1974-75 excluding opening and closing balances.

Table No. 65

This table is divided in three parts viz. (A), (B) and (C). The table no. 65(A) gives the total receipt of Zilla parishad derived from self raised resources, Government grants, loans and advances, deposits and remittances. The table No. 65(B) indicates the receipts of Zilla Parishad from different Government grants, while the Table No.65(C) gives the total expenditure incurred by Zilla Parishad. The expenditure is further divided into two parts i.e. (1) Revenue expenditure and (2) debt section including remittances. Data regarding actuals for the year 1973-74, revised estimates for 1974-75 and estimates for 1975-76 are given in this table.

Table No. 66

The income and expenditure Statistics of each municipal council in the district is given in this table for the year 1974-75. The opening balances and closing balances are however not considered while giving income and expenditure figures for the said year.

This table presents data regarding plan expenditure during Fourth Five Year Plan and Annual Plan 1974-75 according to sub-head of Development.

Table No. 68

The statistics pertaining to Community Development Programme are presented in these tables. The position of

Community Development blocks as on 31st March, 1975 is shown in table No. 69 while the expenditure incurred under different stages of blocks upto end of 1974-75 is given in table no.70. The table No. 71 gives important physical achievements in C.D. blocks during the year 1974-75.

This table deals with the monthly wholesale prices of important agricultural commodities at regulated market centres in the district during the year 1974. Price average for the year are worked out by simple arithmetic mean.

monthly average retail prices of various commodities for the month of January to December 1974 are given in this table, along with varieties. The average prices of all the commodities for the year are also given in this table. As the data collected for the given commodities is restricted to only one shop at District Headquarter, the average price of each individual commodity can not be said to be fully representative but this data may prove useful as a broad indicator of the trend of changes in retail prices over the period of time.

This table gives data regarding consumer price index numbers (revised series) for working class (for the year 1960) of Nagpur centre published by the Commissioner of Labour, Bombay for the year 1974-75. The averages for the year 1973-74 and 1974-75 are also given.

Percentage of gross sown area -

The table below indicates the percentage of gross sown areas to respective net sown areas for the years 1960-61 and 1973-74.

It is seen from the above table that there have been marginal increases in the percentages of gross sown areas to respective net sown areas in case of all the talukas except Yavatmal and Wani. The food crops Rice, Jowar and Tur have suffered shortfall in production during 1973-74 as against the levels of 1960-61. The production of wheat increased significantly as there is 49.41% rise in the out-turn over the out-turn in 1960-61. The sugarcane production is tremendously increased in 1973-74 when compared to the production in 1960-61, mainly because the irrigation facilities were made available in Pusad taluka and the sugarcane area was also increased due to establishment of Sugar Factory at Pophali in Pusad taluka. The productions of crops of viz. Gram, groundnut and chillies have shown slight improvement. The decrease in the production of cotton and sesamum was due to failure of crops.

Indicator No. 3

Gross value of agricultural production

As the farm harvest prices of various commodities are not available, this indicator could not be worked out.

Indicator No. 4

Percentage of area irrigated

The percentages of net irrigated area to net sown area and the gross irrigated area to net irrigated area are given in the following table:-

The above table shows that the irrigation in the district is too low. Only 2.01 percent of the total net sown area of the district is irrigated during 1973-74. These percentages of irrigation are rather higher in Pusad and Darwha talukas. The percentages of gross irrigated area to net irrigated area are shown in last two columns, which indicate that there was no area under double irrigation in any of the talukas during the year 1973-74.

The total consumption of electricity during 1974-75 in the district was reported as 33,774 thousand KWH of which 6,556 thousand KWH was for domestic consumption, 3,141 thousand KWH for commercial light & small power, 14,889 thousand KWH for industrial consumption, 1,274 thousand KWH for public lighting while 8,240 thousand KWH was for agricultural purposes and 674 thousand KWH for other purposes.

The table below shows per capita consumption of electricity in the district.

The per capita consumption of electricity has significantly increased, which is owing to large scale rural electrification programme and establishment of new industrial units. The number of registrations increased to 6,442 during the year 1974-75 as against those of 6,189 in 1960-61. The number of notified vacancies was 513 in 1974-75 as against 926 in 1960-61.

The placements against the notified vacancies during 1974-75 (including some placements against vacancies notified in last year) were 69% as against 59% in 1960-61.

The percentage of actual placements to total registrations works out to 6 in 1974-75 as against 9 in 1960-61.

At the end of 1974, the hospitals and dispensaries have reached the level of 6 per lakh population in the district as against 4 in 1961. This position among all the talukas is similar, except for Yavat-al taluka, where it is better because of district head-quarter.

Similarly number of beds per lakh population in the district was 34 in 1974 as against 26 in 1961. The number of beds per lakh population increased in Yavat-al, Kalapur, Pusad and Darwaha talukas and decreased in Wani taluka in the year 1974 when compared to the corresponding number in 1961.

The indoor patients are reported proportionately higher in Yavat-al taluka which is because of available bed facilities. The outdoor patients are however, higher in Yavat-al and Kelapur talukas and lower in Wani, Pusad and Darwha talukas in 1974 when compared to the corresponding figures in 1961.

Increase in the number of students in different categories

The percentage of literacy as observed during 1971 population census was 31.60 for the district. The literacy percentage among males was 43.43, while it was 19.58 among females.

With the opening of large number of primary schools under the Five Year Plan programme, the enrolment in primary schools has gone up upto 1.52 lakhs in 1973-74 against 0.83 lakhs of 1960-61. Similar was the case with the enrolment in secondary schools, the number of enrolment has gone up upto 43,925 in 1973-74 as against 17,660 in 1960-61. The strength of higher education also showed tremendous increase, the enrolments being reported as 6,803 during 1973-74 as against 1,183 during 1960-61.

Indicator No. 14

Increase in road length per 100 sq.kms. area

This being a hilly district, it suffers from insufficient road mileage. The roads only have to cope up with the traffic in the district, as the railways share very small part in the traffic of the district. There is a narrow gauge line linking Yavat-al to Nagpur-Bombay line at Murtizapur and one broad gauge line linking Wani and Rajur to Majari on Nagpur-Hyderabad line, the total railways route being of 82 kms. length.

The total road length in the district was reported as 5,133.53 k-m. as on 31-3-1975, out of which 659.61 k-m. road length was under National Highways and State Highways, while the road length of major district roads, other district roads and village roads was 4,314.56 k-m. Besides there exist municipal roads of the length of 192.41 k-m. in the district.

Increase in Banking facilities in proportion to Population -

Banking facilities are very important from the point of view of economic development of the area. There has been a programme of opening new branches of banks in rural areas. The number of branches of scheduled banks increased to 26 in 1974 as against 12 in 1961. Similarly the number of banks in cooperative sector increased to 35 in 1974 as against 12 in 1961. Thus in 1974, the total number of branches of all the banks in the district increased to 61 as against 24 in 1961. The percentage of population covered by the banking offices to total population of the district works out to 20.4

It is seen that the prices of all the commodities have tremendously gone up during the period 1963 to 1974. The increase in the prices are 100 to 400 percent in case of foodgrains, 289% in case of sugar, 363% in case of groundnut oil, 109% in case of tea, 129% in case of kerosene and 89% in case of washing soap.

CHAPTER - IV

ANNUAL PLAN 1974-75

4.1 Planning plays an important role in phasing out the development programmes by providing various schemes with a view to improve the living conditions of the people. It also helps in improving Socio-economic conditions of the weaker section of the society and in building up sound and stable economy of the nation.

The Fourth Five Year Plan was deemed to be started from the year 1969-70. However, the Annual Plans which were visualised as a part of the Fourth plan were actually implemented and the Annual Plan 1973-74 was the last part of the Fourth Five Year Plan. The following table presents the headwise details of expenditure incurred on district level schemes implemented in this district during the Fourth Five Year Plan.

It is clear from the above table that the emphasis was given on Agricultural Programme (32.97%) Irrigation and power (26.29%) and Social Services (24.80%) during the Fourth Five Year Plan. The expenditure on 'Co-operation and community Development' and 'Transport and Communications' was 8.91% and 6.35% respectively. The expenditure on Industry and Mining (0.55%) and Miscellaneous (0.13%) was very meagre.

The National Development Council endorsed the Fifth Five Year Plan in Dec., 1973, but on account of some unforeseen factors, it has not yet been finalised. Maharashtra's Fifth Five Year Plan which was formulated on the basis of National and State Policies has also not been finalised. In the formulation of the Fifth plan, Maharashtra State has given a practical shape to the concept of District Planning. The District was adopted as the unit of Planning and District Planning Bodies were constituted for each district. The objectives of the District plan, the State plan and the National Plan should be broadly identical but the programmatic contents of the various district plans may differ on the basis of their resource endowments and their need-based priorities.

The Annual Plan 1974-75 is the first part of the Fifth Five Year Plan. In the Annual Plan 1974-75, emphasis was given on the development of core sector, viz. Agriculture, Irrigation and Power which have a long term impact on the economy. The emphasis was also given on 'Employment Guarantee scheme' in Annual Plan 1974-75.

4.2 An amount of Rs. 379.719 lakhs was provided during the year 1974-75 for implementing all district level schemes in the district. The following table presents headwise Budget provisions received during the year 1974-75 for implement-

ation of these schemes.

It may be seen from the above table that the major portion of the budget was provided for implementation of Agricultural programme (25.87%) with a view to increase agricultural production in the district. Social Services accounted for 24.07% of the total budget provision for providing facilities viz. education, medical facilities, water supply, housing, backward class welfare, labour welfare, etc. Irrigation and power was provided 20.39% for rural electrification programme. Miscellaneous including Employment Guarantee scheme was provided 13.45%. Transport and communications was provided 7.39% for road development while Industry and Mining was provided 6.84% for development of industries. The Co-operation and Community Development was provided only 1.99% of the total budget provision for development activities under Co-operation and community Development programme.

4.3 Out of the total budget provision of Rs.379.719 lakhs,

the expenditure of Rs. 330.320 lakhs was incurred on all the district level schemes implemented in the district during the year 1974-75. The percentage of expenditure to the budget provision works out to 86.99%. The details of major headwise expenditure and its percentage to respective provision are indicated in the table given below.

It is evident from the above table that there was a shortfall in expenditure under Irrigation and Power (43.08%), miscellaneous (including Employment Guarantee Scheme) (66.03%) and Co-operation and Community Development (72.33%) owing to delay in executing the works for want of funds, sanction etc. Under all other heads, the progress of expenditure was upto the mark.

4.4 Agricultural Programme

The Agricultural and allied activities are the main source of livelihood of more than 70 percent population of the district. The schemes pertaining to Soil

Conservation on water shed area, land development, minor irrigation through wells, tanks and bandharas, intensive cultivation of food crops by adopting improved practices, forest, fisheries, dairy development, warehousing and marketing were included under Agricultural programme. The table below gives sub-headwise expenditure incurred during the year 1974-75.

It is clear from the above table that the schemes pertaining to minor irrigation and soil conservation were given more importance for increasing agricultural production. The sann seed weighing 206 quintals was distributed for green manuring during Fourth Five Year Plan. It was however not distributed during 1974-75. 2,16,790 metric tonnes town compost was produced during the year 1974-75 as against 55,068 metric tonnes during Fourth Five Year Plan. Fruit trees were planted in 357 hectares during Fourth Five Year Plan while during 1974-75 the fruit trees were planted in 82 hectares only. During Fourth Five Year Plan, intensive culti-

48
vation of cotton was under taken in 26,479 hectares while in 1974-75 this programme was under taken in 7,806 hectares only. One Small holders block was started during Fourth Five Year Plan and the same was continued during 1974-75. Under resettlement of landless agricultural workers, area reclaimed was 3,252 hectares during Fourth Five Year Plan and it was 465 hectares during 1974-75. Similarly 1,068 families were settled during Fourth Five Year Plan and 253 families were settled during this year.

Under agricultural labourers model colonisation, 305 houses were constructed during Fourth Five Year Plan, and no house was constructed during 1974-75.

Subsidy was given to small holders for 301 irrigation wells during Fourth Five Year Plan and for 150 wells during 1974-75. Subsidy was also given to small holders for 207 pump sets during Fourth Five Year Plan and for 57 pump sets during 1974-75.

With a view to provide more irrigation facilities, the construction of 183 community wells was taken up during Fourth Five Year Plan and the work of 46 community wells was in progress. 12 Community wells were completed during the year 1974-75. The construction of 61 minor irrigation tanks was taken up during Fourth Five Year Plan and the work of 20 tanks was in progress. During the year 1974-75, the construction work of 9 minor irrigation tanks was in progress. 31 percolation tanks were constructed during Fourth Five Year Plan and the construction of 22 percolation tanks was in progress during the year 1974-75. 15 Co-operative lift irrigation societies were organised in the district during Fourth

Five Year Plan and no such society was organised during 1974-75.

This district has an undulating topography and hence soil erosion is a problem in this district. As a measure of soil conservation, bunding works were undertaken in 64,394 hectares during Fourth Five Year Plan and in 10,709 hectares during 1974-75. The programme of afforestation for soil conservation was taken up in 110 hectares during Fourth Five Year Plan where as no such programme was taken up during the year 1974-75.

An area of 7,351 hectares under ayacut was developed during Fourth Five Year Plan and the area of 1,493 hectares was developed during 1974-75.

Under animal husbandry, loan was granted to 46 landless persons for starting poultry during Fourth Five Year Plan. During 1974-75 no such loan was granted.

Under forests, plantation of Teak wood was undertaken in 910 hectares, Bamboo in 140 hectares, fodder plantation in 120 hectares and fast growing species in 80 hectares during Fourth Five Year Plan. 10 drinking water wells were also constructed for forest labourers during Fourth Five Year Plan. During 1974-75, plantation of Teak wood was undertaken in 15 hectares, Bamboo in 15 hectares, fodder plantation in 15 hectares and fast growing species in 20 hectares. No well was constructed for forest labourers during the year 1974-75.

Under fisheries development programme, fish seed farm was constructed in 1.74 hectares during Fourth Five Year Plan only. Number of spawns produced during Fourth

Five Year Plan was 62.00 lakhs while it was 27.00 lakhs during 1974-75. Number of carp fry supplied was 55,50,900 during Fourth Five Year Plan while it was 18,89,500 during 1974-75. The fish production was 6,01,502 kgs. during Fourth Five Year Plan and it was 1,64,651 during the year 1974-75. The nylon twine weighing 557 kgs. was supplied to the fishermen and their Co-operatives on subsidised rates during Fourth Five Year Plan and the nylon twine weighing 264 kgs. was supplied during the year 1974-75.

Under warehousing and marketing loan and subsidy both were granted to 11 agricultural marketing societies during Fourth Five Year Plan while during 1974-75 loan was given to one society and subsidy was granted to 10 societies only.

4.5 Co-operation and Community Development

Under Co-operation programme, share capital was given to 12 Co-operative marketing societies during Fourth Five Year Plan and to one society during 1974-75. Share capital was given to 14 and 2 Co-operative ginning and pressing societies during the Fourth Five Year Plan and during 1974-75 respectively. Share capital was also given to one co-operative sugar factory during this period. Under co-operative farming societies, share capital was given to 7 societies, loan for land development was given to 13 societies and management subsidy was granted to 33 societies during Fourth Five Year Plan. Management subsidy was only granted to one co-operative farming society during 1974-75. During Fourth Five Year Plan 8 labour contract societies and 14 co-operative supervising unions were given financial assistance. These societies were

not assisted during 1974-75.

Under community development programme, financial assistance was given to 14 existing community development blocks during Fourth Five Year Plan and during 1974-75.

4.6 Irrigation and power

Under electrification programme, 63.53 kms. of 66 K.V. lines and 854.00 kms. of 11 K.V. lines were laid in the district, 390 villages were electrified, 4806 pump sets were connected and 2 harijan basties were electrified during Fourth Five Year Plan. During 1974-75, 247 villages were electrified, 488 pump sets were connected and one harijan basti was electrified.

4.7 Industry and Mining

Under Small Scale industries Development, loans were given to 288 village artisans and 5 industrial co-operative societies were assisted during Fourth Five Year Plan only. Share capital and subsidy both were given to 14 Balutedars societies during Fourth Five Year Plan and also during 1974-75.

4.8 Transport and Communication

Road transport has significant importance in the development of this district, as the district is not well served with railways. Under road development programme, 209.80 kms. of paccā roads and 23.40 kms. of kacha roads were constructed during Fourth Five Year Plan, while during 1974-75, 46.86 kms. of paccā roads and 2.90 kms. of kacha roads were constructed. Black topping was done on 44.12 kms. and on 10.50 kms. of roads during Fourth Five Year Plan and during

1974-75 respectively. The construction of 3 bridges was completed and the construction of 4 bridges was in progress and 153 cross drainages were constructed during Fourth Five Year Plan. During the year 1974-75, construction of 2 bridges and one cross drainage was completed.

4.9 Social Services.

During the year 1974-75, an expenditure of Rs.110.556 was incurred on this major head of development with a view to improve economic conditions of the weaker section of the society and to promote socio-economic development of the district. The following table indicates sub-headwise expenditure during the year 1974-75.

Under general education, primary education was given more importance. 39 new primary schools were started during Fourth Five Year Plan and 18 new primary schools were started during 1974-75. During Fourth Five Year Plan 149 rooms in primary school buildings were constructed while during

1974-75, 15 rooms were constructed. 8 rooms of secondary schools building were constructed during Fourth Five Year plan only. 360 and 2 additional sets of scholarships in secondary schools were granted during Fourth Five Year Plan and during 1974-75 respectively. 25 new classes were started in Government multipurpose secondary schools during Fourth Five Year Plan only. Educational concessions were given to 17,069 economically backward class students during Fourth Five Year Plan and to 510 such students during 1974-75. Similarly educational concessions were given to 2,432 children of primary teachers during Fourth Five Year Plan and to 1,019 children during 1974-75. Loan scholarships were given to 400 primary teachers under training during Fourth Five Year Plan and to 8 such primary teachers during 1974-75. Stipend was also given to 222 primary/ pre-primary teachers under training during Fourth Five Year Plan only. 1,84,134 adults were made literate during Fourth Five Year Plan only.

Under technical education, construction of 4 staff quarters at Government Polytechnic Yavatmal was completed during Fourth Five Year Plan only. The construction of hostel building at Government polytechnic, Yavatmal was in progress during Fourth Five Year Plan and during 1974-75 also.

Under health, the construction of one 252 bedded civil hospital was nearing completion during Fourth Five Year Plan, which was completed during 1974-75. The construction of 9 primary health centres/ sub-centres buildings was completed during Fourth Five Year Plan and construction of one building was completed during 1974-75. Spraying of D.D.T. was done in 16,80,079 houses and in 9,42,531 houses during Fourth

Five Year Plan and during 1974-75 respectively. Family planning operations were performed on 49,081 persons and 182 I.M.C.D. insertion cases were covered during Fourth Five Year Plan, while during 1974-75, such operations were performed on 3,683 persons and 44 I.M.C.D. insertion cases were covered. The construction of 35 family planning centres/sub-centres buildings was completed during Fourth Five Year Plan only.

Under water supply and drainage, one Government water supply scheme at Yavat-al was completed, three municipal water supply schemes were completed and two in progress and one drainage scheme at Wani was in progress during Fourth Five Year Plan and during 1974-75. Similarly 3 rural water supply schemes for individual villages were completed and 3 were in progress during Fourth Five Year Plan and during 1974-75. 5 rural water supply schemes for groups of villages were completed during Fourth Five Year Plan and 9 such water supply schemes were completed during 1974-75. The construction of 1,118 and 167 drinking water wells was completed during Fourth Five Year Plan and during 1974-75 respectively. Similarly the construction of 8 tube wells and 48 tube wells was completed during Fourth Five Year Plan and during 1974-75 respectively. 583 old drinking water wells were renovated during Fourth Five Year Plan and 163 such wells were renovated during 1974-75. Under the housing programme, the house sites were provided for 114 and 35 developing villages during Fourth Five Year Plan and during 1974-75 respectively. The financial assistance was given for tiling of roofs to 207 persons and 110 persons of Scheduled Tribes during Fourth Five Year Plan and during 1974-75 respectively.

Under welfare of backward classes, scholarships

were given to 8,173 and 938 SC/ST/OBC students during Fourth Five Year Plan and during 1974-75 respectively. The building grants were given to 19 backward class hostels during Fourth Five Year Plan, and to 5 such hostels during 1974-75. The grants were given to 257 backward class hostels during Fourth Five Year Plan and 2 such hostels during 1974-75. The housing aid was given to 133 and 64 persons of backward classes during Fourth Five Year Plan and during 1974-75 respectively. The financial assistance was also given to 222 and 246 persons of backward classes for cottage industries and professions during Fourth Five Year Plan and during 1974-75 respectively. The scholarships were granted to 1,740 students of Vimukta jatis during Fourth Five Year Plan and to 107 such students during 1974-75. The financial assistance was given to 9 forest labourers cooperative societies of SC/ST/OBC during Fourth Five Year Plan only.

The technical courses were taught in the Industrial Training Institute at Yavatmal under labour and labour welfare programme during Fourth Five Year Plan and during 1974-75.

4.10 Miscellaneous

Under the sub-head information and publicity, rural broadcasting facilities were provided and radio sets were installed in 263 villages during Fourth Five Year Plan and in 43 villages during the year 1974-75.

Employment Guarantee Scheme was taken up during the year 1974-75 to provide gainful and productive employment to all unskilled persons in rural areas, who need work and are prepared to do manual work but can not find it

anywhere. The objective of the scheme is that the works undertaken should produce durable community assets in the area and that wages paid to the workers should be linked with the quality and quantity of output of work. Only productive works of labour intensive nature like minor irrigation, soil conservation, nalla bunding, canal excavation, land development, afforestation etc. are undertaken. The works are implemented departmentally and not through contractors, so that at least 60 percent of the works expenditure is incurred in wages to the workers. The significance of providing a guarantee of work lies in the fact that it is one of the most effective instruments of creating a work consciousness among the poor and that it inculcates in them a feeling of self-reliance and self respect and also a feeling of active participation in the programme of rural construction. The expenditure of Rs.33.620 lakhs was incurred on Employment Guarantee Scheme during the year 1974-75.
