MAP OF BHANDARA DISTRICT

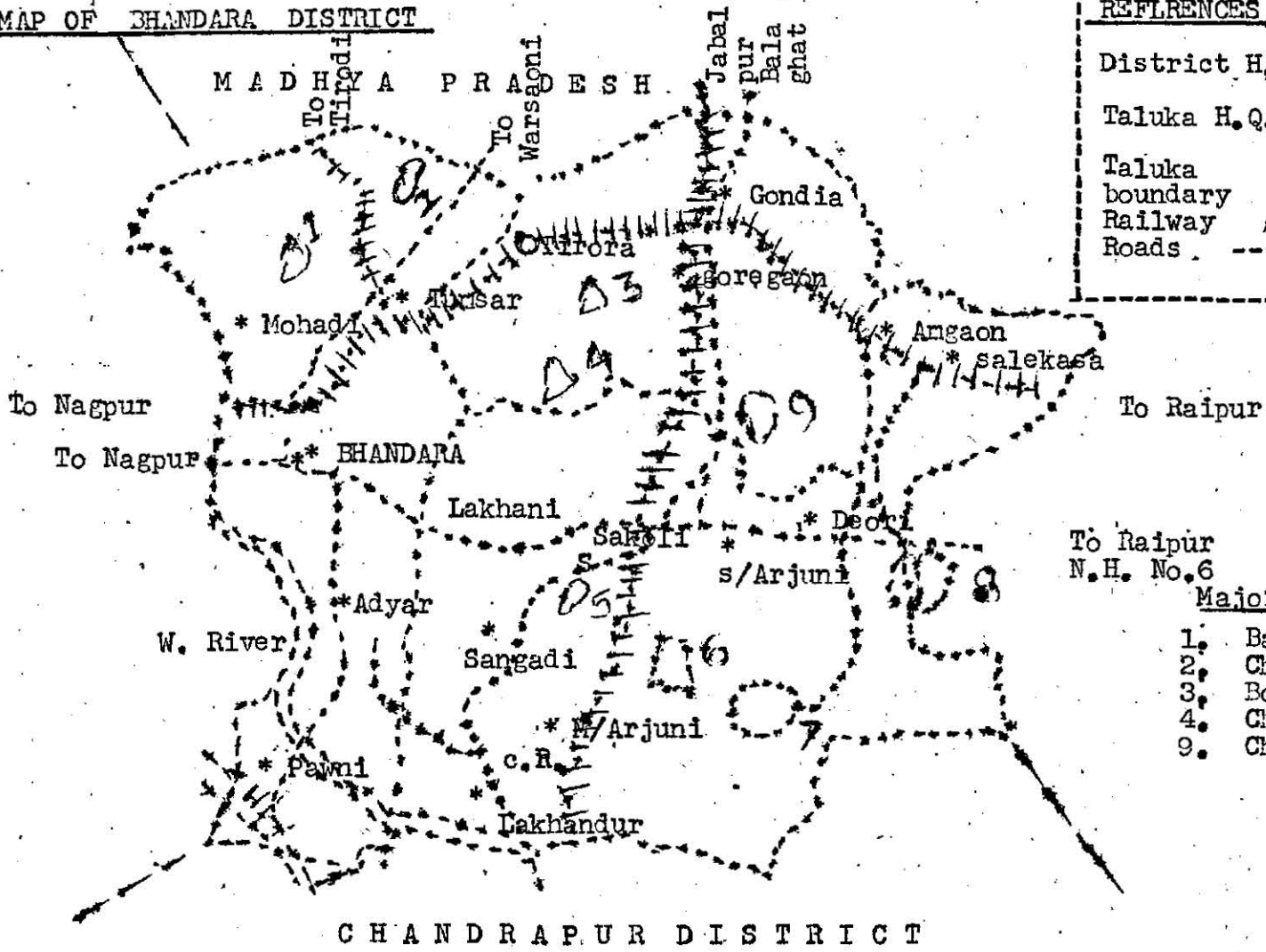

CHAPTER - I

Introduction

PHYSICAL FEATURES

1.1. LOCATION

The District was under pendency administration from 1818 to 1830 and the area became British territory in 1858. The head quarter of the district were brought from langi to Bhandara in 1820-21. The Bhandara district derives its name from the town Bhandara which has its origin in the term "Bhanara" a place where metal utensils are manufactured on large scale. The District is situated in the wainganga basin. It lies between 20° 39' and 21° 38' north latitude and between 79° 27' and 80° 42' East longitude.

1.2 BOUNDRIES :-

In the north, the district is surrounded by Balaghat and Chhindwada Districts of Madhya Pradesh and in the East Drug District of Madhya Pradesh, Chandrapur District in the south and Nagpur District in the west. The wainganga and Bawanthadi Rivers provide natural boundaries for the District in its major northern part. The wainganga serves as a natural boundary between Bhandara and Nagpur district in south west and Chandrapur district in south.

1.3. AREA

Bhandara district stretches over an area of 9280 sq.k.M. and its population according to 1971 census is 15,85,530. In terms of area and population, it contributes 3.01 and 3.14 percent of area and population of Maharashtra, excluding of course Greater Bombay. Length of the district in East west extension is 120 Kms. There were no major changes in the boundaries of the district and its talukas or its administrative divisions since 1911. In 1871, 11 villages of Nagpur district were transferred to Bhandara District. ~~XXXXXXXXXX~~

Since 1st May 1960, the district forms part of Nagpur Division of the Maharashtra State.

1.4 TOPOGRAPHY.

According to topography the district can be conveniently divided into 4 natural divisions as under :-

1. The hilly region of Gaimukh and Ambhaged hills.

This region located in the central portion of the District to northern side upto district boundary consists about 1/3 area of Chandara Tahsil, It has comparatively lower density of population.

2. The hilly region of Gaikhuri and Pratapgarh hills.

The region comprises of eastern portion of Gondia Tahsil and major portion of Sakoli Tahsil. This region is hilly and has extensive forests.

3. The basin of Wainganga Rivers.

The region consists of Western portion of Gondia Tahsil Southern portion of Chandara Tahsil and Western portion of Sakoli Tahsil. Soil in this area is very fertile.

4. The basin of the Bagh and Pangoli Rivers.

This portion consists of the Eastern portion of Gondia Tahsil. Rainfall in this part is comparatively very heavy.

5 HILLS RIVERS AND SOIL.

1) HILLS :- There are only a few isolated hill ranges in the District. In the extreme north of the district there is "Ambhaged" hill range, which is an offshoot of the Satpuras. It enters the district from the west and after winding up its course in the north eastern direction cuts up the Bawthadi valley from the rest of the district. In front of its looking across the valley which pierces the range is the remarkable ballistic precipice, with a sheer drop of some hundred feet.

In the centre of the district running from the east of Bhandara town to Gondia town, is the Gaikhuri range, a cluster of low peaks surrounded by irregular forest country. The points of Khura (2000') Lendzari (1490') and Jamani (1772') are mentionable peaks their elevation. The range divides the valley of Wainganga and Bagh Rivers just. West of Bhandara is the Bilai range consisting of a few sand stone hills capped with granite and over hanging the eastern road from a prominent feature in the landscape. Lastly in the south east lies the Nawangan or Pratapgarh hills, the highest part of the district.

2) RIVERS.

a) As already stated the district falls in the Wainganga basin the Wainganga river which is an important tributary of the Godavari and the biggest river of the district controls entirely its drainage system. The Wainganga enters the district from the North East corner and flows diagonally across it until it passes within a mile of Bhandara town on west. Then it winds its course in the south and forms natural boundary for a short distance between Nagpur and Bhandara district. Out of its total length of 578 Kms, it covers 208 Kms, of its length through Bhandara District. It then changes its course and flows to south-East direction to enter Chandrapur district.

b) The Bagh is another important river of the district and is a main tributary of the Wainganga. The whole of its 130 Kms. length right from its origin in Chichgad hills to the village Kati where it joins the Wainganga, falls in Bhandara District only.

c) Another important river next to the Bagh is the Chulband which rises in the Gaikhuri range in Gondia Tahsil. It flows through sakoli tahsil* on the southern border of the district.

d) Besides the above, the another tributaries of the wainganga flowing through Bhandara district are the paongoli, the Chandan, the Bawanthadi, the Gadhvi and the sur rivers, all of which, except Bawanthadi drain the area of the District to convert it in to a fertile tract.

3. SOILS

a) Type :- The main types of soils found in Bhandara district are Kalikanhar, sihar, Morand, Kharadi, Baradi. The area under Kali is not very extensive. The kanhar is a very rich alluvial soil. Kharadi differs from Kannar by the presence of limestone nodules. sihar is a redish-yellow soil formed mainly of the detritus of the crystall in rock.. It cracks very little in hot weather. Kharadi is the name given to very inferior type of sihar.

b) The Kanhar and the first class morand soils are mainly found in the plains in the south of Bhandara and sakoli tahsils and specially along the wainganga River. The soil is very deep, sticky, retentive of moisture and bears double crops. In the valleys of the wainganga the soils consists of sandy loam of varying quality but it is very suitable for cultivation of rice. The soil generally found in the district are Morand Class- II and Sihar which cover altogether 71 percent of the total cultivable area. These soils are both utilised for cultivation of Rice, but the sihar is perhaps prominently the rich soil while the morand, specially where it is the purest, grows Jowar, Wheat and linseed. The remaining baradi and Kharadi are very inferior type of sihar, morand are used for cultivation of inferior rice and minor millets.

1.6 CLIMATE, TEMPERATURE AND RAINFALL.

1. Climate :- Since the district is away from seashore, the climate of the district is uneven and as such there is large variation in the temperature in hot and cold seasons of the year. It may however, be maintained that Bhandara District is not as hot as Nagpur district. The heat during the day time is considerably high, while the nights are generally cool. Normally January is the coldest month in the year. Whereas May is the hottest. The climate in brief is healthy in the parts of the district except in some parts of sakoli and Gondia Tahsils. Where in due to dampness resulting from heavy rainfall combined with dense forests, the atmosphere is favourable to out break of diseases like Malaria and filaria.

2. Temperature :- 1. Temperature data for Bhandara district is available for one centre viz Gondia the mean maximum temperature was highest in the month of June 1979 i.e. 45.0 centigrade as against lowest viz 11.0 centigrade in February at Gondia centre. In general, it can be said that in Bhandara district the temperature starts increasing from February and reaches a peak level in May. Thereafter it starts decreasing from June until it reaches the lowest level in the peak of winter in December or January.

3. Rainfall :- The rains start in the district from first week of June and lasts till second week of October. The intensity of rainfall is generally experienced in the month of July, August and September. The rainfall is not also uniform in all parts of the District. It is generally greater in sakoli and Bhandara Tahsils than Gondia tahsil, for the obvious reasons that there are dense forests in sakoli. But the rainfall during the year 1979-80 is 1266.7 mm in Bhandara, 1102.8 mm in Gondia, 1404.6 in sakoli centre respectively.

1.7 POPULATION

The 1971 population of the district showed an increase of 24.59 percent over the year 1961 as against 27.45 percent for Maharashtra. The Urban and Rural population forms 11.38 percent and 88.62 percent against 10.74 percent and 89.26 percent respectively in the 1961. The density of population is 172 per sq. Kms. as compared to 161 for Maharashtra and 178 for India as per 1971 census. The sex ratio i.e. female per 1000 males is 987 for the district as against 930 for Maharashtra in 1971. The literacy rate for the district is of 35.40 percent in 1971 as against the rate of 24.07 in 1961. The literacy rate of Maharashtra is 39.13 in 1971.

The percentage of scheduled caste in the district is 5.23 in 1971 as against 2.45 in 1961. Out of the total population in Bhandara district 46.82 percent are workers of which 45.42 percentage 25.13 percent and 14.61 percent are reported as cultivators, agricultural labourers and in house hold industry respectively in the year 1971. The person engaged in remaining services are 14.84 percent of the total workers in 1971.

1.8 Important Development (Special Features)

1. Employment Garantee scheme :-

With a view to provide work to the employment seekers including small and marginal cultivators, 1760 works have been sanctioned by the Collector and were allotted 21 agencies of the District. The following table depicts the number of works sanctioned in the district.

Labour potential of these works is 267552 .

The labour attendance of these works varies from 4000 to 260223 excluding the Labour engaged on normal departmental works .

2 Dairy Development.

The agency has played an important role in providing the subsidary business to the cultivators in the Bhandara District . Under this programme, Milk is collected through 90 dairy co.opertive societies from which the main collection of milk is being done by Bhandara Zilla Dugdha Utpadak sehkari sangh Ltd. Bhandara Milk so collected by District Federation is being supplied to the Govt. Chilling Centre i.e. Bhandara Tamsar, Kohmara and Central Dairy Gondia. 9619 milk producers are benefited .

During the 1979-80 the procurement of milk was 7101000 litres against 4315400 litres in 1978-79 . For purchase of milk 1.66 crores of Rs were spent. At present local ditribution of milk is done through the Dairy Development department at Gondia only .

3. Inland Fisheries

Bhandara is a popularly known as District of Tanks having high potential for development of inland fisheries. There are 3165 Zilla parishad Tanks, 116 irrigation Tanks including the two Bagh and Itiadh major project adding more resources for fish culture. There are 10000 private Tanks with considerably water spread area. 22000 hectares area is suitable for fish culture. The schemes i.e. supply of fish seed of cultivable and fast growing varieties, fish seed production are implemented for increasing fish production so that more fish will be available which will help to combat malnutrition to some extent.

There are 112 fisheries co-op. societies and one District Federation functions in the District with a total membership of 8500 fishermen. The total share capital of these was Rs. 1.58 lacks and Govt. Share capital contribution Rs. 2.13 lacks.

The fish farmers development agencies a centrally sponsored scheme sanctioned for Bhandara District in 1977 has proved to be boon for Fishermen creating a significant impact through intensive fish culture practices. The scheme is implemented through Co-operative Sector i.e. Vitarbha Vibhagiya Macchimar Sahkari Sangh Nagpur .

4. Intensive Cattle Development Project

The programme of Intensive cattle Development project, Bhandara has been started from 1st November 1976. The object of introducing this programme is to improve the local cattle breed by providing A-1 facilities at village and thereby to increase milk production by cross breeding by undertaking various types of activities like mass vaccination programme, Surgical work, Campaign etc .

Regional Artificial Insemination Centre has been started at Deori especially, sanctioned for triable area of Bhandara District. Three other R.A.I.C. has been started at Bhandara Gondia, and Sakoli. 40 subcentres has been started for providing animal husbandary services in this project. All the sub centres has been located on milk route to help the Dairy societies to provide better technical know how.

5. Applied Nutrition programme

Under this programme it is expected to combat malnutrition by way of changing the choice of food and feeding habits with little or no extra expenses. This programme is being operated at village level with a view to bringout a change in production, preservation and consumption of food and feeding practices. As such, it is a demonstration cum- Education programme directed towards mothers and housewives to educate them in selection of better diet for their children and family. In some selected blocks, community school kitchen-garden are setup in selected villages where vegetables fruits and cereals are grown.

6. Rural Road Programme

Under this programme, Rs. 22.15 lacks for non-tribe and Rs. 5.62 for trible area (excluding centre charges) has been allotted for construction for rural roads in Bhandara District and the amount is fully utilised on construction of rural roads.

CHAPTER - IIEXPLANATORY NOTES ON THE SCOPE AND LIMITATIONS OF THE STATISTICAL DATA PRESENTED IN PART -II (STATISTICAL ABSTRACT).I. PURPOSE .

The abstract part of this publication gives exhaustive statistical data on important socio economic indicators of development. Data on almost all important topics are presented in this part so that the publication could serve as a reference book. Panchayat samitiwise data has been displayed as far as possible for inter blocks comparison. In most of the tables, data for 1979-80 could not be presented, the same for the latest two years, for which they were available, have been shown. All the data has been collected from the state and central Government offices, local bodies and other relevant agencies. The footnotes below each table indicate the source from which the data has been collected.

II. DISTRICT AT A GLANCE .

This table presents a birds eye-view of the socioeconomic indicators of development in Bhandara district and Maharashtra State under different heads, such as area, population, agriculture, animal husbandry, education, transport and communication, plan and C.D. programme local bodies and other miscellaneous statistics. Reference year of the data is also indicated in the table.

III. CONTENTS SCOPE AND LIMITATION

The statistical tables presented in the District statistical Abstract are grouped into 13 parts. The contents of the tables and the scope and limitations of the data displayed under each group are explained below.

1) AREA AND POPULATION .

In all 7 tables i.e. table Nos.1 to7 are included in this section . Data for 1971 population census has been included in all the tables . The table No. 1 indicates area, houses and population according to 1971 census. The term rural and urban area as used inCols. 3 of the table was defined as under . For any place to be recognised as an urban area (town) for 1971 census, it was to have a municipal corporation or an area under a municipal council or a cantonment or a civil line. If it did not have any of these urban local bodies to administer its affairs, the following tests were applied, (a) a minimum population of 5,000 (estimates for 1971), (b) a density of not less than 400 per sq.km. (1,000 per sq.mile) (c) 75 percent of the male working population pursuing occupations falling outside agriculture, (d) the place should have according to the Director of Census Operations of the State, a few pronounced urban characteristic and amenities .

The term village (rural area) used in the table denotes a statutorily recognised village having a well defined boundry and separate land records. Hamlets, wadis or padas have, therefore, not been shown as separate villages.

On the other hand, statutorily recognised villages having no population have been shown separately as " Un-inhabited " villages. village also includes forest villages comprising mostly forest labourers and their families.

Table No. 2 indicates decade wise population in population since 1951 to 1971 . Table No.3 gives classification of inhabited villages according to different population ranges. Total population of the villages in each table is also indicated in the table. The table No. 4 gives population of urban areas according to 1971 Census .

The table No. 5 gives number of workers and non-workers in Bhadara District according to 1971 Census, and they are classified according to standard of livelihood classes is also shown separately for rural and Urban areas and also for the District as a whole. The concept of dependency has been abandoned for economic classification at the 1971-census. Instead of the population is classified into workers and non-workers ~~xxxxxx~~ The emphasis is now on work and not on income of economic dependence. A person is defined as worker if (a) in case of seasonal work like cultivation livestock, dairy household industry ect. he has some regular work of more than one hour a day throughout the greater part of the working season and (b) in the case of regular employment in any trade, profession, service, business or commerce was employed during any of the seven days preceding the day of the enumerators visit to the household.

persons like beggars pensioners, agricultural or non agricultural royalty, rent or dividend receivers, etc. who earn an income but who are not participating in any productive work in any occupation, a person who had been classified as non-workers.

The table No. 6 gives distribution of population according to (a) Age group and (b) religion separately for Rural and Urban areas and also for district as a whole as per 1971 Census.

The table No.7 gives population of scheduled caste, scheduled tribes and non-buddhists separately for rural and Urban areas and also for the district as a whole.

SCHEDULED TRIBES :²

There are no scheduled areas in Bhandara District and as such no person was reported as a scheduled Tribe in 1971 population census .

2) CLIMATE

Only two tables are included under this section pertaining to rainfall and temperature at the selected centres in Bhandara district .

The table No.⁸ gives monthly rainfall and number of rainy days in each month at the selected centres for the year 1979 . The data has been collected through the Agricultural Department. A day is treated as a " Rainy day ." if during the 24 hours the rain gauge recorded a minimum of 2.55 M.M. of rainfall. Annual rainfall for each centre is also indicated in the table . Normal rainfall is the average rainfall over a period ranging from a minimum of five years to a maximum of eighty years.

Table No.9 gives monthwise "Maximum " Minimum " and also annual temperature recorded at selected centres for the year 1979 . The data is supplied by the Government of India's Regional Meteorological centre at Nagpur. The mean maximum and mean minimum temperature denotes the average of the maximum and minimum temperature recorded daily during the month . The mean (average) temperature is the simple average of the mean maximum and minimum temperature .

3) AGRICULTURE .

In all 14 tables i.e. table No .10 to 23 are included in this section .

The table No. 10 indicates talukawise figures of land utilisation under the standard heads of land uses for the years 1977-78 and 1978-79 against each taluka. The break up for the geographical area according to different types of land uses is shown. Major constituents of the geographical area are forest, land put to non-agricultural uses, barren and uncultivable land, cultivable waste, permanent pastures, land under miscellaneous tree crops not included in area sown-current fallows other fallows and lastly net area sown. Under "Forest" area included are actual forest areas or lands classed or administered as forest under any legal enactment dealing with forests whether state owned or private. If any portion of such land is not actually wooded but put to some agricultural uses, that portion is included under the appropriate heading of cultivated or uncultivated land as the case may be "land put to non-agricultural uses" stands for all lands occupied by buildings, roads and railways or under water e.g. rivers and canals and other lands put to uses other than agricultural uses. "Barren and uncultivable land" covers all barren and uncultivable land like mountains, deserts etc. Land which can not be brought under cultivation unless at high cost is classed as "Barren and uncultivable land" whether such land is in isolated blocks or within cultivated holdings. "Cultivable waste" includes all lands available for cultivation whether not taken up for cultivation or taken up for cultivation once but not cultivated during the current year and last five years or more in succession.

Such land may be either fallow or covered with shrubs and Jungles which are not put to any use . They may be assessed or not assessed and may lie in isolated blocks or within cultivated holdings . " permanent pastures and other grazing lands " cover all grazing lands whether they are permanent pastures and meadows or not. Village Common and grazing lands within forest areas are included under this head. " Land under miscellaneous tree crops etc. not included in the net area sown includes all cultivable land , which is not included under net area sown , but is put to some agricultural use . Land under casuarina tree , thatching grass, bamboo bushes and other for fuel etc. which are not included under orchards are classed under this category. " Current fallows " comprise of cropped areas , which are kept fallow during the current year . " other fallow land " includes all lands which were taken up for cultivation, but are temporarily out of cultivation for a period of not less than one year and more than five years. The net area sown " consists of net area sown with crops and orchards , area sown more than once being counted only once. The " Gross cropped area " represents the sum total of area under all crops . The difference between the total or gross cropped area and net area sown is accounted for by the area sown more than once during the same year with the same or different crops .

The table No. 16 is introduced from the year 1975-76 and gives the information of activities of the Ground Water Survey and Development agency in the district such as No. of bore holes drilled , no of successful bore holes successful etc. during the year 1979-80 .

The table No. 17 gives the information of minor irrigation works excluding wells in Bhandara District. All sectors such as zilla parishad, state and private sector (Cooperative) have been covered in this table. Similarly minor irrigation works in use and not in use are shown separately in this table.

Table No.18 gives the information on Major and Medium irrigation projects in this district. Both complete and incomplete projects have been covered in this table. The cost of Medium irrigation projects ranges between Rs. 20/- Lacks to Rs. 5 Crores. Whether as that of Major irrigation projects, it is Rs. 5 Crores and above.

Table No.19 deals with monthly agricultural wage rates during 1979. This data is collected fortnightly throughout the year from three selected Rural Centres viz 1) Mundlikota 2) Lakhani and 3) Adyar, only one centre is selected from a taluka.

The table No. 20 is also a new table, included from the year 1975-76 and gives the findings of Agricultural Census 1976-77. Table No.21 Gives data on agricultural implements for the year 1978.

Table No.22 and 23 deals with famine, scarcity, akin to scarcity data in the district for the year 1979 -80.

4. ANIMAL HUSBANDRY AND FOREST :

In all 6 tables i.e table No.24 to 29 are included in this section.

A - Animal Husbandry

The table No. 24 gives talukawise number of VARIOUS types of livestock and poultry as enumerated in district in the livestock census, 1978. The census is conducted throughout the country on an uniform basis of concepts and methods of enumeration once in 5 years.

During the livestock census operations, the livestock and poultry were enumerated by house to house enquiry. Particular care was taken to enumerate livestock in slaughter houses, stray animals and animals in transit. Sex and age-groupwise classification of the livestock is also indicated in the table.

B - Forest :-

The table No. 28 (A) gives details of area under different types of forests during the year 1979-80. Data regarding forests under the control of the state Government's Forest Department and those under the control of the state Government's Revenue Department are shown separately. The area under forests are classified according to legal status into reserved forests, protected forests and unclassed forests.

The legal status refers to the classification of forests under the Indian Forest Act, XVI of 1927. Reserved forests are those that are intended mainly for timber production where in the rights of grazing and cultivations are seldom allowed. In protected forests, the restrictions are not so rigid. Right of grazing or cultivation is allowed but certain limitations and restrictions are imposed. The unclassed forests refer to the inaccessible forest of unoccupied waste. The forests which are taken over by Government from local bodies or private individuals for management on lease basis are called "leased forests". There is no classification of expropriatory forests as such but in Nagpur Division some private lands containing valuable forest are taken over by Government under section 29 of the Indian Forests Act. Which are, not yet classified as per tripartite classification and they are termed as expropriatory. The forest area shown in the table No. 28 (A) may not tally with the area shown in the table No. 20. The two sets of figures differ due to the following reasons.

(i) In the Indian Forest Statistics Returns, the whole area including non wooden area under the control of forest Department is taken as area under the Forest, while in Agricultural statistics, it is classified according to its actual utilisation. (ii) The forest department returns are meant to serve a definite administrative purpose and indicate the ownership of the Forest areas and the actual utilisation of those areas is not so important the point of view of Forest Department, as it is in the land utilisation statistics under Agricultural Statistics.

Table No. 29 (A) is new tables regarding fisheries included from the year 1975-76.

5) EMPLOYMENT INDUSTRY AND ELECTRICITY

In all 10 tables i.e. table No. 30 to 39 are included in this section.

The factory statistics shown in table No. 30, 31 and 32 cover following types of factories registered under the factory Act, 1948.

1) Those employing 10 or more workers and working with the aid of power (Section 2 n. (i)).

2) Those employing 20 or more workers and working without aid of power § section 2 n. (ii)

and 3) Those registered under section 85 of the Act, under which the state Government makes applicable the provisions of Act even though the above conditions are not fulfilled. However, statistics of the Defence Factories are excluded. Table No. 34 deals with employment exchange statistics while, the table No. 35 gives occupational distribution of total registrations and placements in the employment Exchange for the year 1979-80.

according to standard national classification . The table No.36 indicates the progress of Employment Gurantee scheme in the District. The Table No.33 gives the consumption of electricity during the year 1979-80 whereas table No.39 indicates the towns and villages electrified as on 31-3-1980 in the district .

6. Cooperation.

In all 8 tables i.e. table No.40 to 47 are included in this section .

The table No.42 gives talukawise number of Primary Agricultural credit societies, their membership , share capital reserve and , other funds working capital , loan advanced and recovered loans outstanding and overdues and percentage of recovery to total loan advanced for the year 1979-80 working capital included paid up capital, deposits and borrowings. Loans outstanding includes outstandings in respect of loans, cash credits, over draft and the amount of outstanding bills purchased or discounted. " Overdues " refer to amount of loan or instalments which were due for collection but which were not actually repaid and for the repayment of which no extension has been granted by a competent authority .

Table No.47 gives talukawise number of registered money lenders in each taluka and loans advanced by them during 1979-80 separate figures of loans advanced to traders and non traders have been furnished in the table . The transactions of money lending in the state are regulated under the provisions of Bombay Money Lenders Act . 1946 . According to the Act, no money lender shall carry on the business of money lending except in according with the terms and conditions of such licence .

7. MEDICAL AND PUBLIC HEALTH .

In all 5 tables i.e. table No. 48 to 52 are included in this section .

The table No. 48 in this section indicates talukawise number of hospitals, dispensaries, doctors, nurses, vaidyas beds and total number of indoor and out-door patients treated for the year 1979 and also the table covers all the state and central Government Medical Institutions and also institutions owned by municipalities . clinics run by private bodies or individuals are however, not included in the table .

The table No. 49 gives vital statistics such as number of registered births and deaths in this district . Sexwise classification of births, deaths and infant deaths for 1979 are mentioned . The table No. 52 deals with the number of family planning centres operating in the District .

8 EDUCATION .

In all 7 tables i.e. table No. 53 to 59 are included in this section .

The table No. 53 gives sexwise number of lit rates and percentage of literacy separately for rural and urban areas of each taluka according to 1971 population census . As per 1971 Census definition, a person was classified as a literate if he was able to read or write simple letter in any language .

Table No. 56 gives information regarding number of educational institutions according to type for 1978-79 and 1979-80 . Sexwise enrolment and number of trained and untrained teachers in these institutions according to " Type " is slightly different from stage of education . There are at present many secondary schools, which also impart education in primary course, Nevertheless the entire enrolment of students is included under

" Secondary Education " Primary institutions provided education for standards I to IV or standards I to VII/VIII or less and teach the curriculum approved by the education department. The secondary institutions teach students for standard VIII to X or XI /XII with or without lower standards. Higher education is education after passing secondary school certificate examination, which leads to degree examination. Table No. 57 presents data on Backward Class enrollments while table No. 58 gives data on the number of beneficiaries amount backward classes such as scheduled caste, scheduled tribes and other Backward Classes for the year 1979-80. Beneficiaries for the table No. 58 are the students who are getting educational concessions of either type such as scholarships, Freeship, etc.

9 TRANSPORT AND COMMUNICATIONS

In all 7 tables i.e. table No. 60 to 66 are included in this section.

The table No.60 gives total railway length at the end of 31 st March ,1980 according to type of route i.e. broad guage, meter guage and narrow guage. The Railway length is measured between the first and last station within the District boundry. The figures of length of each type of routes are therefore, approximate and not accurate.

The table No. 63 deals with operational statistics on Nationalised Road Transport in Bhandara S.T. Division.

The table No. 64 presents the result of the traffic census on important roads conducted by public works and Housing Department, Government of Maharashtra. Data on the number of vehicles is according to categories and location of countpost. Type of surface and total traffic intensity in tons per 24 hours are also indicated in the table.

10. LOCAL BODIES

In all 4 tables i.e. table No. 67 to 70 are included in this section.

The table No. 67 gives abstract of income and expenditure of local bodies such as village panchayats, Zilla parishad and Municipal Councils for the financial year 1979-80. The number of village panchayats included number of independent villages panchayats as well as group village panchayats.

11. PLAN AND COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT

In all 5 tables i.e. table No. 71 to 75 are included in this section. The table No. 71 and 72 deal with district level plan scheme while table No. 73 to 75 gives data on community Development Blocks in the District.

12. PRICES

Only 3 tables i.e. table Nos. 76 to 78 are included in this section. The table No. 76 shows the wholesale prices of certain agricultural commodities at selected centres in the District.

The table No. 77 gives monthly average retail price of various commodities at district headquarter, Bhandara. The average prices under each commodity are shown from the month of January to December for the year 1979 along with units and varieties of commodities for which prices have been quoted. The data is regularly collected by the District Statistical officer every week on Friday by visiting the selected shops. The average price of each commodity for the year is also shown in the Table. As the information collected for the given commodities is restricted to only one quotation and that too from one shop at district headquarter, the average price for individual commodity can not be said to be fully representative.

but the data may prove useful as a broad indicator of the trend of changes in retail prices over the period of time .

The table No. 73 gives consumer price index numbers (revised series) for working class of Nagpur centre published by the office of the commissioner of Labour Bombay . Monthwise data for the year 1979-80 commencing from April 79 to March 1980 . and also average for the said years have been given in this table. The base year for calculating the price Index (New series is 1960 , The index no. of wholesale prices are issued by the Economic Advisor to the Government of India, The base year for the same is 1960 .

13. MISCELLANEOUS .

In all 15 tables i.e. Table No. 79 to 93 are included in this section .

The table No. 82 gives talukawise cinema statistics for the year 1979-80 . Number of permanent, semi-permanent and touring theatres and their seating capacity per show has been indicated . The table No. 93 indicates the important indicators of development in the District .

Chapter - IIIImportant indicators of development.

In this chapter an attempt has been made to give a comparative picture of the tahsils in the district based on certain important indicators of development during the year 1960-61, 1970-71 and 1978-79 .

I- AGRICULTURE .

The developments in the field of Agriculture can be assessed from 3 main indicators.

- i) Percentage of gross area sown to net area sown .
- ii) Percentage of net area irrigated to net area sown .
- iii) Productivity of important crops.

Percentage of gross cropped area to net area sown .

Agriculture has been the mainstay of the district economy in as much as 70.55% of its population is dependent on it for its livelihood. The extent of double cropping is solely related to the availability of irrigation facilities and soil capacity of retention of moisture after the Monsoons. The district accounts for a low percentage of area sown more than once to the net area sown as compared to Maharashtra state .

In 1960-61, 1970-71 and 1978-79 the percentage of gross cropped area to the total geographical area in the district was 56,55 and 54 respectively . The district accounted for 35% 32% and 30% of area sown more than once to net area sown during the year 1960-61 , 1970-71 and 1978-79 respectively.

The following table gives the percentage of gross cropped area to net area sown in Bhandara district in the year 1960-61 , 1970-71 and 1978-79 .

From the above table it is seen that gross cropped area has been decreased in the district by 3% and 5% in the year 1970-71 and 1978-79 as compared to the percentage figure of 1960-61, this was mainly due to reduction in area under pulses which were taken after paddy and the availability of moisture in the paddy lands.

The percentage distribution of gross area under important crops to total gross cropped area.

The productivity of crops by and large depends on the timely rains and its even distribution over the period of the season and also upon the adoption of high yielding and high yielding varieties of seeds and use of chemical and pest control measures.

Rice, wheat, jowar, are the main food crops of the district while sugarcane and groundnut are the main cash crops which are not of much significance.

The above table broadly indicates the trend of cropping pattern in the district. Bhandara district is a predominantly paddy growing district. The percentage of area under food crops has increased by 3.61 % in 1970-71 as compared to 1960-61 while it has slightly decreased by 0.65 % in 1978-79 as compared to 1970-71. The area under total non food crops has decreased by 3.61 % in 1970-71 as compared to 1960-61 but has slightly increased by 0.66 % in 1978-79 as compared to 1970-71.

The production of Rice, Jowar, Tur and groundnut has shown increasing trend in the year 1978-79 as compared to the year 1970-71. The production of wheat, has slightly decreased while the production of gram has considerably been decreased in the year 1978-79 as compared to the year 1970-71. It is seen from the above table that the progress of co-operative societies has not been satisfactory. The no. of co-operative societies has been increased for 783 in 1960-61 to 790 in 1970-71 but the same has been decreased to 687 in 1979-80 because of some societies have gone into liquidation. The membership has shown an increasing trend in 1979-80 as compared to 1970-71.

III Wage rate.

Agriculture wage rate.

The term Agriculture wage rate denotes the wages paid to workers employed on daily wages in agricultural operations. The agricultural wages are collected from 3 rural centers in the district viz, Aiyal, Mundikota and Lankhani since July, 1963.

The average agriculture wage rates of skilled and unskilled labourers during the year 1979-80, in Lankhani centre are Rs. 8.00 and Rs. 5.00 respectively which are high as compared to Aiyal and mundikota centre,

Where the rates are Rs. 7.00 and Rs. 4.00 in Adyal Centre and Rs. 6.00 and Rs. 4.50 in Mundikota centre respectively.

The higher carpentry rates was Rs. 10.00 at Lakhani and Mundikota centres while at Adyal centre it was Rs. 9.00. The highest Black smith rates was Rs. 9.00 at Lakhani centre while it was Rs. 8.00 at Adyal centre and Rs. 6.00 at Mundikota centre.

IV Live stock

Bovine and ovine population per 100 hect of cultivable Land

The programme of live stock development was introduced with the object of increasing the supply of productive food, improving nutritional standards of community and to provide draught cattle for farming operations. This programme has made substantial contribution to the district economy by providing subsidizry income to the formers, food to human population and providing avenues of employment to landless labourers.

The following table shows talukawise live stock population (Bovine and ovine) as per 1978 livestock census, Bovine and ovine per 100 hect of cultivable land for the year 1978.79 .

From the above table it is seen that the number of livestock per. 100 hectare of cultivable land is highest in saloli taluka where as it is lowest in Bhandara taluka as compared to district average .

The poultry population in Bhandara district in 1978 was 6,14,875 as against 1,82,236 in the year 1972 which has increased by about 337 % . The human population according to 1971 Census for the district was 15,85,530. The poultry population per 100 person was 23 in the year 1960-61, and 11 in the year 1971-72 because of decrease in poultry population and increase in human population during that period.

The poultry population per. 100 persons was 39 % in the year 1978 which was increased because the increase in poultry population. The poultry population per 100 hectare is highest in saloli taluka and lowest in Gondia Taluka .

V. Electricity

Consumption of electricity .

Power development programme has been given the highest priority in view of its importance in the economic development in the state .

The following table gives No. of villages electrified puoups engerged and per capita consumption of elecricity in the district during the year 1960-61 , 1970-71 and 1979-80.

From the above table it is seen that no. of village electrified has increased from 37 in 1960-61 to 1004 in 1979-80. The percentage of electrified villages to the total no. of inhabited villages comes to 67% .

The percapita consumption of electricity increased from 31 K.W.H. in 1960-61 to 146 K.W.H in 1970-71 and it has been further increased to 221 K.W.H. in 1979-80 .

VI Employment .

The media of employment exchanges is being utilised by employment seekers as well as by employers .

Vacancies notified by the employers have been increased considerably since 1960-61 due to various employment facilities created in the development process . The comparative figure of registration vacancies notified and placement for the year 1960-61, 1970-71 and 1979-80 are given in the following table .

From the above table it is seen that the enrollement of the candidate in the employment exchange has increased from 5000 in 1960-61 to 11,212 in 1979-80 . The percentage of placement has however decreased from 12.2 % in 1960-61 to 5.17% in 1979-80 . The number of candidates on live register at the end of 1979-80 has increased more than 14 times as compared to 1960-61 , which indicated the magnitude of unemployment problems. This does not include the unemployed persons who have not, so far, registered their names with the employment exchange .

VII Medical Facilities

The general aim of health programme is to ~~expand~~ expand the existing health services to common persons and to promote progress and improvement in the level of national health .

Health condition of human being exert powerful influence on productivity and pace of economic growth . Accordingly the progress in providing curative as well as preventive health measures have been made in the previous years .

The following table gives no. of hospitals and dispensaries, indoor and outdoor patients treated in public public aided institutions in Bhandara district during the year 1960-61, 1970-71 and 1979-80 .

From the above table it is seen that no. of hospitals and dispensaries have increased from 7 in 1960-61 to 10 and 122 in 1970-71 and 1979-80. The no. of indoor and outdoor patients have increased from 18,433 and 2,99,766 in 1960-61 to 1,22,000 and 15,34,000 in 1979-80. The increase in indoor and outdoor patients from the year 1960-61 to 1979-80 was 67% and 31% respectively. The increase in indoor and outdoor patients is due to increase in medical facilities throughout the district.

VIII Education

The education helps to make people aware of the needs of development and equips them with specific skill to participate in the process of development. The quantitative expansion in primary secondary and higher education has been achieved during the plan period.

From the above table it is seen that the increase in number of primary school institutions in very large i.e from 283 in 1960-61 to 1345 in 1979-80. The enrollement and no. of teachers has increased from 29650 and 895 in 1960-61 to 2,25,478 and 5874 in 1979-80 respectively.

The number of secondary institutions have increased from 37 in 1960-61 to 167 in 1979-80. The enrollement and the no. of teacher have also increased from 10685 and 470 in 1960-61 to 78,436 and 2759 in 1979-80, respectively.

The progress of higher education is also remarkable. The no. of institutions in 1979-80 was 11 as compared to 1 in 1960-61. The no. of enrollement and teachers have also increased from 149 and 11 in 1960-61 to 5299 and 231 in 1979-80 respectively.

CHAPTER IV .Annual plan . 1979-80para 4-1a) Principle of decentralised implementation of plan .

In the context of the farreaching changes in the social and economic policies which have been made for the fulfilment of the pledges given to the people of the state and for the implementation of the 15 point programme adopted by the state Govt, the strategy of development has been reoriented to meet the needs of growth with social justice and to make a direct line of attack on the problems of poverty and unemployment so as to establish a social order in which all agencies and departments of Govt, Localbodies, as also public institutions would sub-serve, to the common good . In addition to the yearly and Five yearly plans being prepared at present, perspective plans for the state for each district have also to be prepared so as to ensure interalia minimum norms of basic amenities are provided to the people and disparities as between various districts and areas within each district are removed so far as possible . The tasks of planning have thus become more complex and required greater measure of expertise .

Para -1 Ab) Adoption of District as a unit of planning during the plans .

During and up to the end of 4th F.Y.P the progress in the implementation of the plans was reviewed at the district-level by advisory committess appointed under Govt .circular coop & R.D.D. ^{date} 5th August, 1964 and at the Divisional level by the divisional Advisory committee constituted under Govt circular F.D. ^{date} 13-12-1966 .

Govt has since decided that the district should be adopted as an unit of planning during the 5th plan and that perspective five year and Annual plans should be formulated for each district so that in-balances in development as between district and areas within the same district are steadily removed to the extent possible and all the districts are given an opportunity to attain full development having regard to their potentials, available man power and other resources .

The very basic idea about district planning is that every district shall get certain plan allocation worked out on the basis of certain parameters and broad cross section of the representative should have a definite say as to how this allocations should be spent in the best possible way .

C) Objects of District Planning .

The main object of the district planning is to take into account the local resources, man power institutional funds and after careful consideration formulate the district plans in accordance with the requirements of the XI district and also to solve the various pressing problems of the district on priority basis , wherever required by providing adequate funds to that effect .

1- B

While formulating the district plan it is presumed that active public participation is a must. It is desired by district planning to achieve the rational utilization of resources , removal of inter tahsil imbalances as well as proper orientation and full utilization on development programme .

Para -4.2.Organisation of machinery setup in the district for formulation, monitoring and overseeing of the District plan.i) Formulation of District Planning Board.

On the recommendation of the planning commission, the state Government decided to strengthen the planning Machinery at the district level with a view to bring out coordination between the various development agencies in the district and for the formulating and implementing coordination between the various development agencies in the district and for the formulating and implementing coordinated plans of development for each district. The state Government also decided to adopt the district as a unit for planning and to formulate perspective plans for each district, so that imbalances in development as between districts and areas within the same district are steadily removed to the extent possible and all the district are given an opportunity to attain full development having regard to their potential available manpower and other sources. The preparation and implementation of the perspective plans and five year plans within such perspective plans calls for coordinated efforts on the part of the various organisations concerned with the development of the district, such as Govt departments, Local Bodies, i.e Zilla parishad, panchayat sanities village panchayats, Municipal councils and financial Institutions like the District Cooperative Bank, The District Land Mortgage Bank, Nationalised Bank and commercial Banks, The public enterprises and the cooperative sectors. With a view to bring out Coordination between all such agencies in the task of formulation and implementation of the perspective and five year plans for the district.

The state Govt. constituted, under G.A.D. Resolution No. pp/SPM/1072/P-I, dated 20.10.1972, the District planning Board for each district consisting of the designated Minister of the Distt. as chairman. Commissioner of the concern administrative division as vice-Chairman, and the Collector, President of Zilla parishad, president of Municipal Councils, Chairman of District Central Coop Bank, Chairman District Land Mortgage Bank, Regional Manager of lead Bank and 3 non officials to be nominated by the Govt. as members of the District Development Board. The Chief Executive officer was designated as a member secretary of the District planning Board.

The District planning Board would meet as often as required but atleast once in every 3 months. The Board was required to ensure coordinated action by various implementing agencies including Zilla parishad, to give guide line to the various implementing agencies in regard to preparation and implementation of the perspective and Five Year Plan of the district to approve Five Year plan and Annual plans of the district subject to the order of the state Government.

ii) Setting up of District Planning Team

The District planning Team consisting of the collector of the District as Chairman. The chief Executive Officer of Zilla parishad. The district Deputy Director of Agriculture, the District Deputy Registrar of Cooperative societies District statistical Officer, Divisional Forest Officer, Industry officer, as Members and planning officer of Zilla parishad as members secretary was constituted vide G.A.D. Resolution No. PD/SPM/1072/P-I, dated 20.10.72 to assist the District Planning Board and to take an over all review of all resources available or being made available to the various agencies in the district to ensure their proper allocation in the light of district priorities and needs and to supervise implementation of various plan schemes including central plans and centrally sponsored schemes.

III) Setting up of District Development Consultative Council.

In order to associate the elected representatives of the people in parliament and the state legislature, and the representatives of the various interests such as industry, Trade and commerce, universities and social welfare institutions in the district with the planning process, Government had set-up District Development consultative council in each District of the state except greater Bombay under planning Department Resolution No.DDC-1073/P-I(A) dated 20.6.73, which would serve as a forum for ascertaining the views of the people in the matter of development of the district and their felt needs and for periodical review of the district plan. The council consisted of the designated Minister of the district as a Chairman other member of District planning Board, all members of the Loksabha and the Vidhansabha elected from the district, all members of the Rajyasabha and the vidhanparishad of the district and 4 representatives to be nominated by the Govt. to represent the interest of Industry, Trade and Commerce, Universities, and social welfare institutions in the district as members of the council. The chief executive officer of Zilla parishad was the member secretary of the council.

The District Development consultative Council was required to advise the District Planning Board in the formulation of the perspective, Five Year and Annual plans of the district and to associate itself with the review of the District plan from time to time. The council would meet as often as required but at least in every 6 months.

b) Amalgamation of District Planning Board and District Development consultative council and formation of District planning and Development Council.

After reviewing the working of the District planning Board and the District consultative council and considering direct association of the elected representatives of the people with planning process the state Govt. and with a view to bring a close co-operation and collaboration between the various agencies responsible for the development of a district, the state Govt. decided to amalgamate the above two planning bodies designated as the District Planning and Development council for each district. Accordingly the District planning and Development council for each district. Accordingly the District planning and Development council for each district was formed under planning Deptt. Resolution No. DPC-1074/P-I, dated 1.10.74.

The District planning and Development council consisted of the designated Minister of the district as chairman, commissioner of the concerned division as vice chairman, all members of Lok Sabha and vidhansabha elected from the District all members of the Rajyasabha and vidhan-parishad residing in the district, the collector of the district president of Zilla parishad, president of Municipal councils in the district chairman District central cooperative Bank Representative of the board of disectors, Maharashtra state Cooperative Bank development Bank Ltd. Regional Manager of load Bank in the district, Representative of Regional Development corporation 3 non official members of the Former District planning Board, Nominated by the Govt. 4 Non official members of the former District Development consultative council nominated by the Govt, The Chairman District Committee, Maharashtra state Khadi and village Industries Board as members and the chief

The District Planning and Development Council of the district is required to ensure coordinated action by various implementing agencies at all the district level including Zilla parishad, to give guide lines to the various implementing agencies at the district level in regard to preparation and ~~the~~ implementation of perspectives, Five Year and Annual plans, to approve the perspective, Five Year and Annual plans of the district subject to the orders of the state Govt. to review from time to time the implementation of the Five year and Annual plans and make recommendations to the state Govt. state planning Board in that behalf. The District planning & Development Council would meet twice or at the most 3 times in a year .

1) Executive committee of the District planning and Development Council .

To assist the District Planning and Development council in the day to day planning and Development activities, a executive committee of the council consisting of designated Minister of the District as chairman and president of Zilla parishad, Divisional commissioner, collector of the district, chief executive officer of Zilla parishad, 2 other representatives of the council to be elected by the council, Managers central cooperative Bank, Manager ^{Bank} Lead , president of largest Municipal council in the district as members and Deputy C.E.O . (planning) as secretary was formed. The executive committee of D.P.D.C . would meet as often as required but once in two months. The executive committee invites district heads of various departments and or regional officers to attend meetings so as to provide continuous dialogue between the departments responsible for the various developmental activities in the district under the plan, and the district planning authorities.

It also takes an overall review of all the resources available or being made available to the various agencies in the district priorities and needs and supervises implementation of Plans schemes including central plan and centrally sponsored schemes.

The Collector of the district has become the member secretary of D.P.D.C. in place of the Chief Executive officer Zilla Parishad and the District planning officer has become the secretary of the executive committee of the District planning Development council in place of Deputy Chief Executive officer (planning) Zilla parishad vide planning Department Resolution No. DPC/1079/PRG-3, dated 21.10.1979.

The meeting of Executive committee of District planning Development Council is being held at least once in a month instead of once in 2 months.

ii) Special Executive Committee of District planning Development Council for Tribal sub-plan.

Bhandara district is one of the 12 district where Tribal Area sub-plan is implemented since the year 1976-77. There is no "Schedule A-Roa" specified by Government of India in Bhandara District, therefore no scheduled Tribe population have been reported in 1971 census. However concentration of tribal population in block of 282 villages from sakoli and Gondia talukas of the district; in the total population of about 1,39,121 there are 66,058 tribal habitation i.e. 47% of total population. Additional Tribal sub-Plan is therefore implemented in their pocket since 1976-77 onwards.

A special executive committee of District planning Development Council for Tribal Area sub-plan has been formulated by the Govt for preparation of Annual plan and coordinated implementation of Tribal Area sub-plan. The constitution of the Committee consists of designated Minister of the ~~Distt~~ district and chairman of Distt planning Development council as its chairman one of the tribal elected, representative from the district as vice chairman, tribal commissioner as vice chairman and president of Zilla parishad, all tribal M.P's MLA's MLC's from the district as members and the district collector as a member secretary vide Govt. Resolution planning Department No. Twp-1075/X/PRG/SPP, dated 30.9.1975.

a) The annual plan for the year 1979-80 of Bhandara District has been prepared keeping in view the National and state objectives and more stress has been given on the schemes covered under 15 point programme and minimum needs programme.

Physical Achievements

The Physical achievement under different Heads of Developments are summarised below :-

I) Agricultural programme .

i) Agricultural production Under this subhead Rs. 4.51 lakhs was spending during the year 1979-80 . Under the plant protection programme spraying of pesticides and ractivides etc. in 81.00 hectares was completed 169 quintals of improved seeds and 167.35 M.T. chemical and Fertilizers were also distributed to small cultivators during the year 1979-80 .

ii) Soil conservation Under this subhead Rs. ~~Rs~~ 6.50 lakhs were spent during the year 1979-80 and 25 hectares area were terraced .

iii) Forest :- Under this sub head Rs. 12.64 lakhs were spent during the year 1979-80 . The work such as plantation of timber in 160 hectares for forestry in 87 hectares completed .

iv) Fisheries :- Under this sub-head Rs. 4.90 lakhs were spent during the year 1979-80 Construction of nursery in 51.53 hectares were completed during the year . 118.68 lakhs spawn were produced as well as 172 lakhs stocking of fry. 27 fishermen were trained and 649 kgs nylon twine were distributed to fishermen. Financial assistance were given to 34 co-operative societies .

II - Cooperation and community Development

i) Co-operation :- Under this subhead on expenditure Rs. 7.35 lakhs was incurred during the year 1979-80 . The financial assistance were given to 2 tribal Co-operative societies .

Irrigation & power

i) Irrigation :- Under this subhead Rs. 24.03 were spent during the year 4 medium irrigation projects has physically been completed

ii) Power :- Under this sub-head Rs.36.37 lakhs were spent during the year 1979-80 . 32 villages were electrified ,and 536 irrigation pump sets were connected during the year Supply of electricity to 1308 small industries, 328 street light were installed and 3188 D.L.F. connections were given during the year .

IV Industry and Mining

Under this major head an amount of Rs. 7.57 lakhs were spent during the year 1979-80 financial assistance was given to 120 small scale industries , seed money distributed to 238 educated unemployment during the year , Financial assistance given to 6 Handloom industries and 2 industrial co-operative societies during the year . 79-80 .

V - Transport and Communication .

Under this sub-head Rs. 63.09 lakhs were spent during the year 1979-80 , 37.46 Kms new roads were constructed during the year 1979-80 .

VI Social Services

Under this major head Rs. 125.12 lakhs were spent during the year. Book banks were opened to 488 primary and middle schools, 300 kid boxes were supplied under UNICEF programme during the year 1979-80 educational concession were given to 1038 E.B.C students . 41 non-Govt secondary schools were opened 121 tubwells were constructed during the year 1979-80 scholarships to 2108 B.C. students were granted during the year, Tuition fees and examination fees were granted to 864 Backward students grants given to 10 B.C. Hostels and building grants were given to 2 B.C. Hostels during the year 1979-80 .

VII Employment Guarantee schemes

Under this sub-head Rs. 1041.45 lakhs were spent during the year 1979-80 , 1760 no. of works were work in progress and 548 No. of works were completed .

Difficulties and bottlenecks experienced in the implementation of various schemes during the year 79-80 .

- 1) The budget provision under most of the schemes were received late, i.e. by May end. In case of new works/items schemes the provision as proposed by the District planning and Development council were remained unbudgetted for want of administrative or technical sanction.
- 2) In case of continued schemes the administrative approval and orders to continue the schemes were abnormally delayed by various heads of Departments. Even in case of budgeted schemes orders to release budget grants were considerably delayed by the heads of the departments resulting in failure to achieve the targets in the plan year .

- 3) The schemes were formulated without any study or survey but on the basis of the schemes implemented in other districts and without studying the feasibility of the schemes in the district .
- 4) Roads were proposed without studying whether the land would have to be acquired or not . Normally the land acquisition process takes its own time. The provision under such works remained un-spent under such circumstances .
- 5) The preliminaries required to be completed before implementation of such programme were never completed beforehand and those steps were taken after a major period was lapsed .

Planning of programme in most of the schemes was not done which resulted in not achieving the desired targets .

LAND UTILISATION IN BHANDARA DISTRICT 1978-79

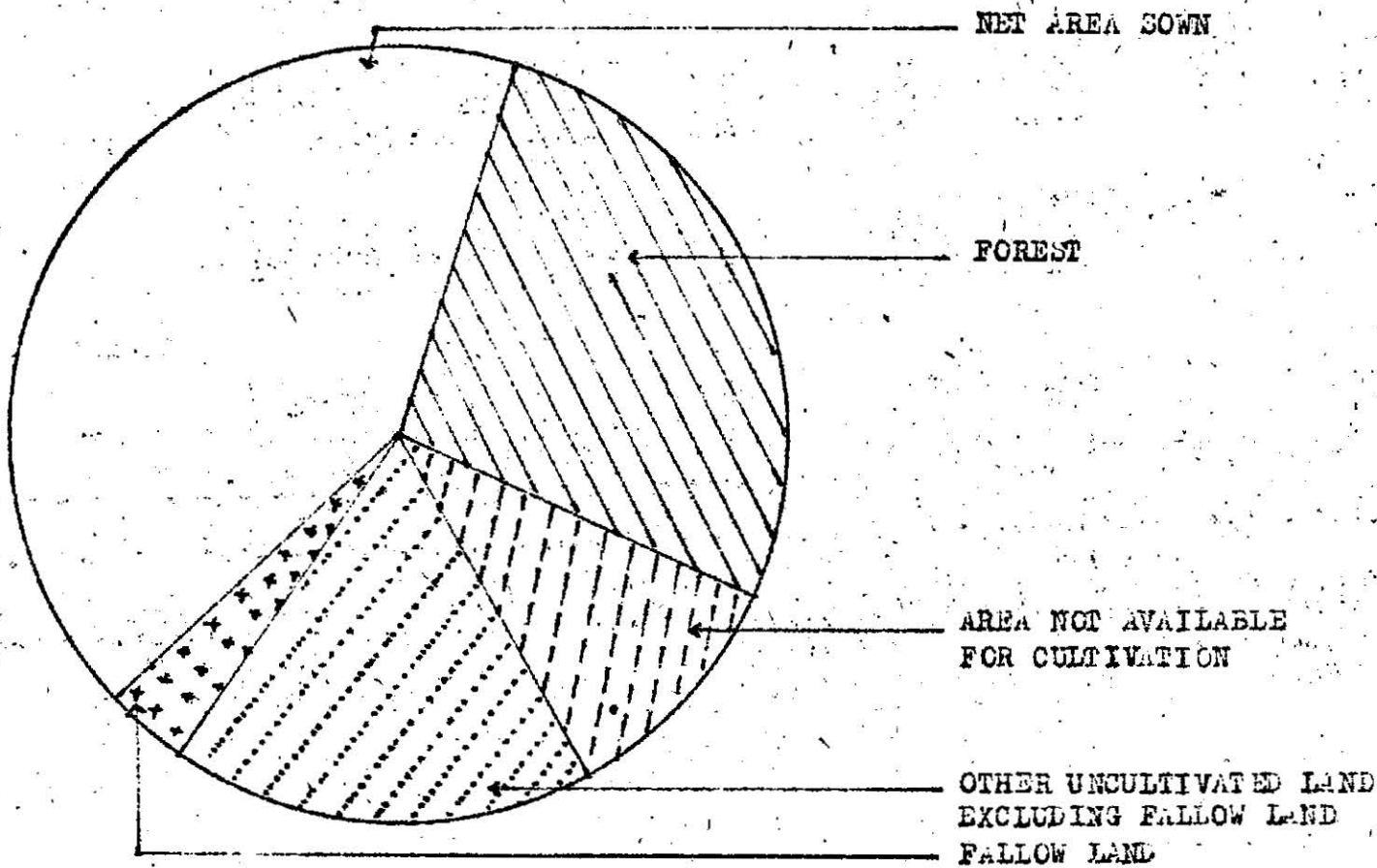

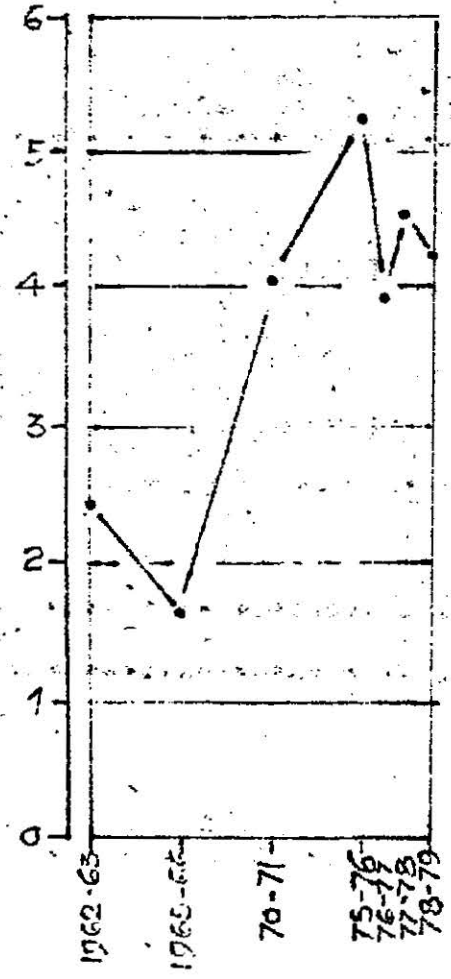

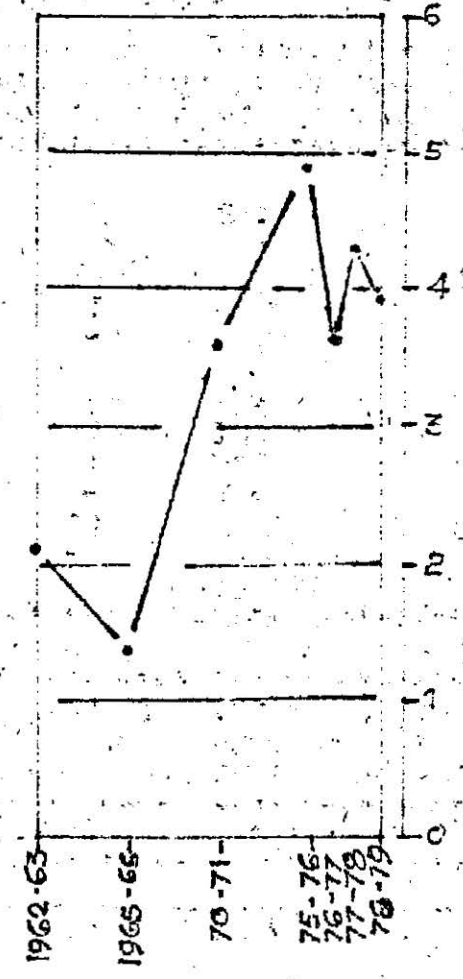
FOODGRAINS PRODUCTION BHANDARA DISTRICT

ALL PULSES

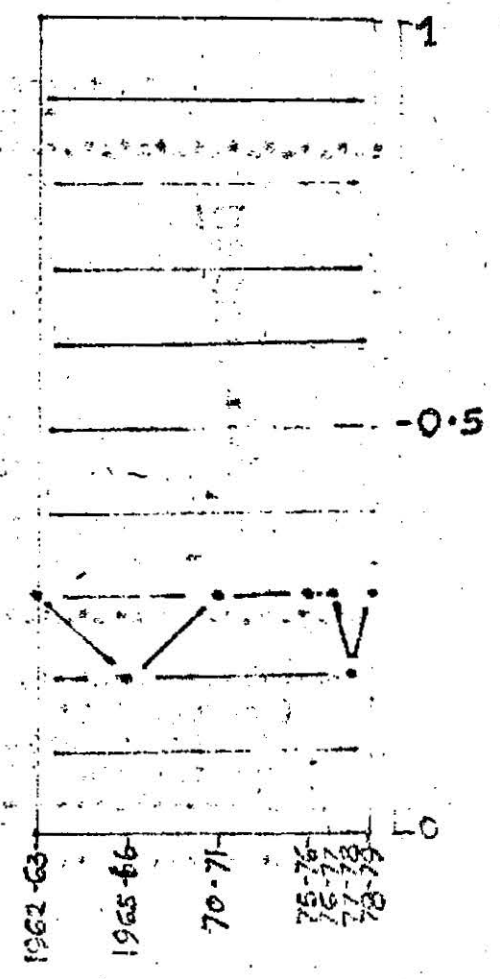

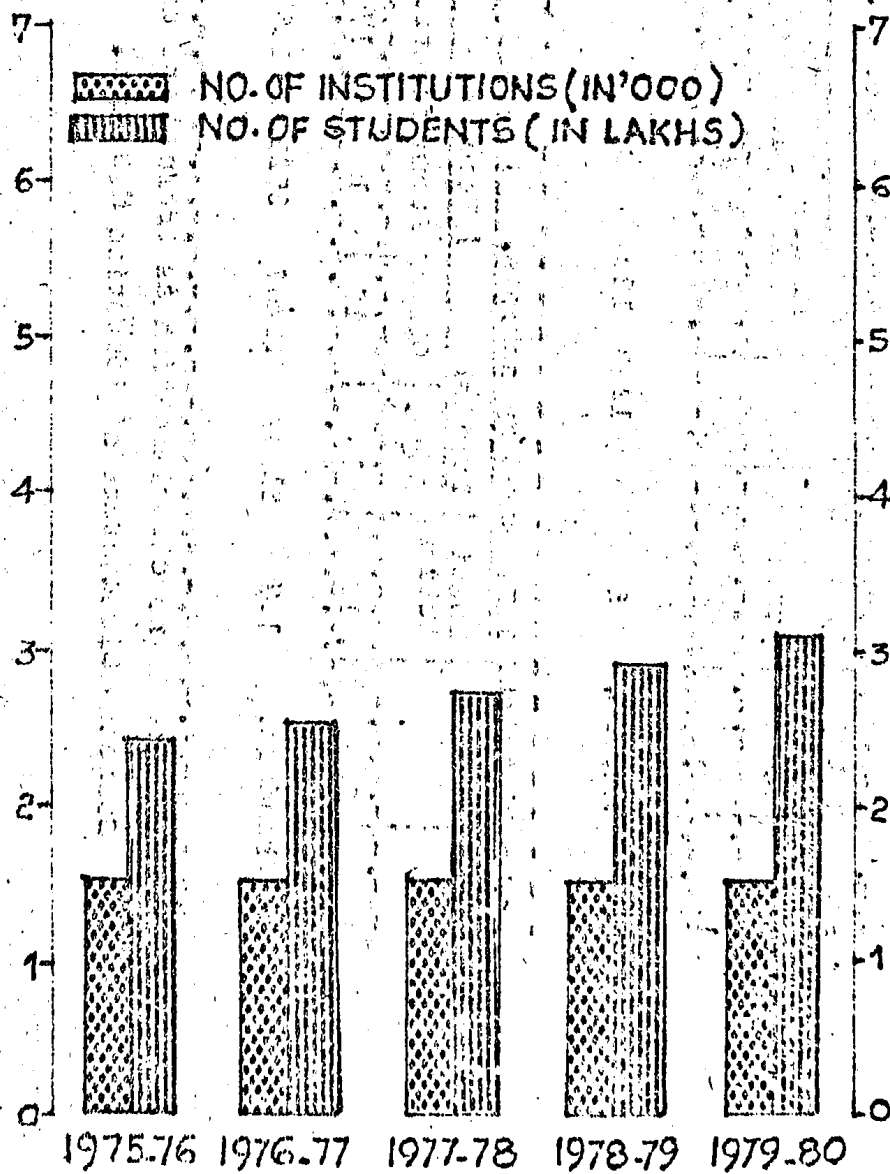

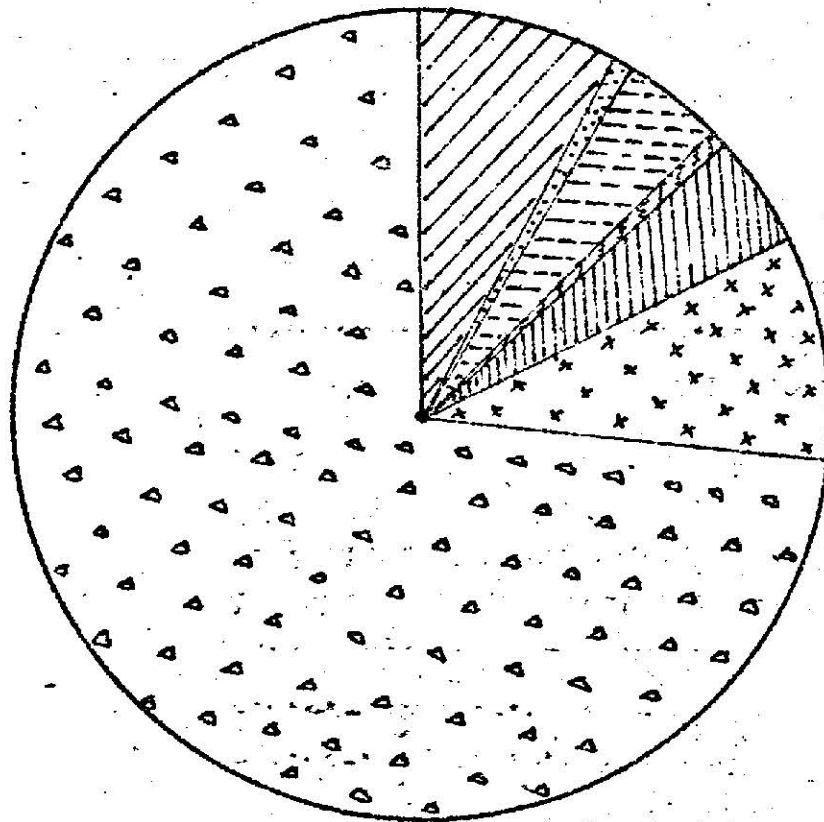

PLAN EXPENDITURE UNDER DIFFERENT HEADS IN BHANDARA DISTRICT 1979-80










LAND REVENUE (IN RUPEES) IN BHANDARA DISTRICT

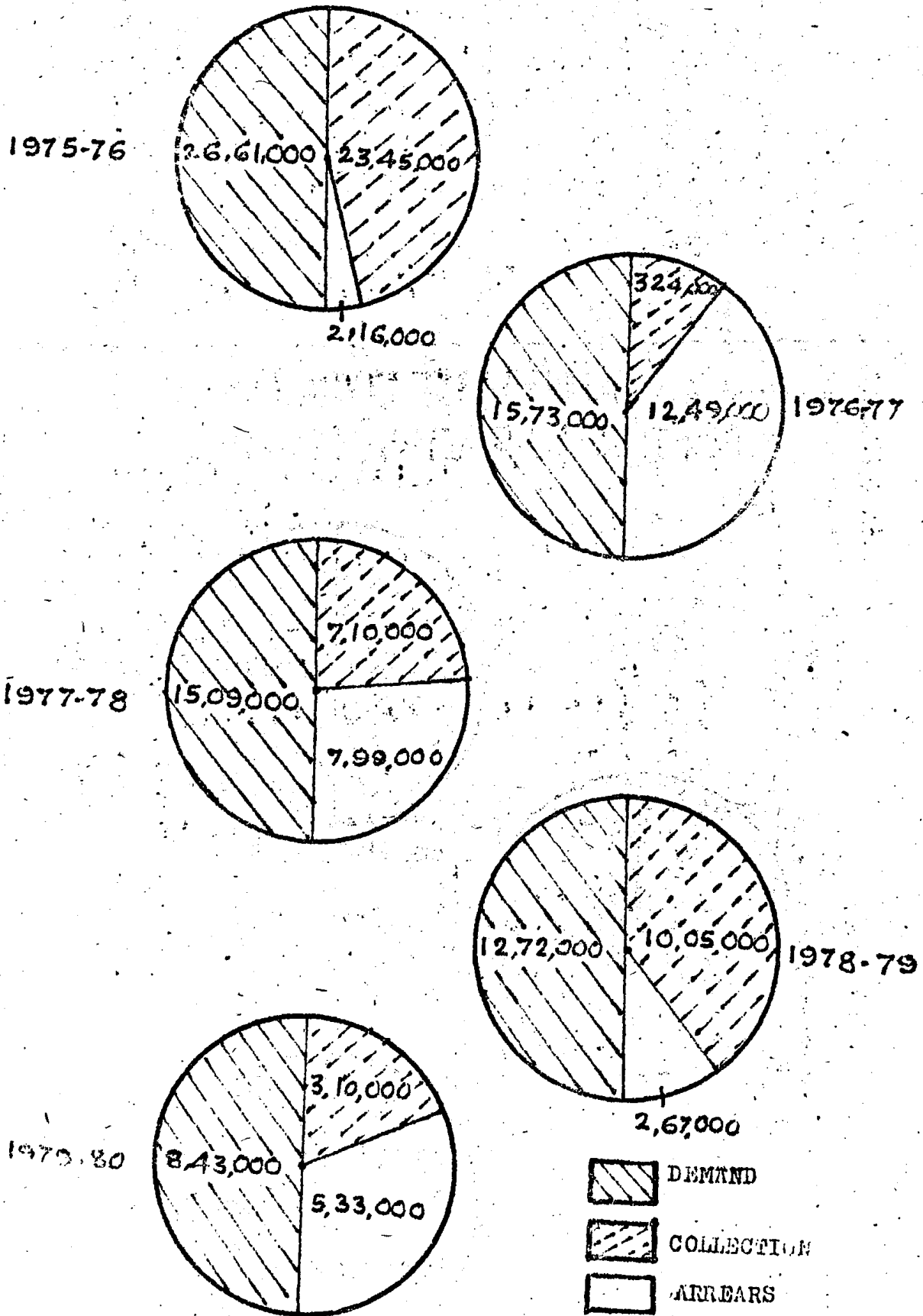
