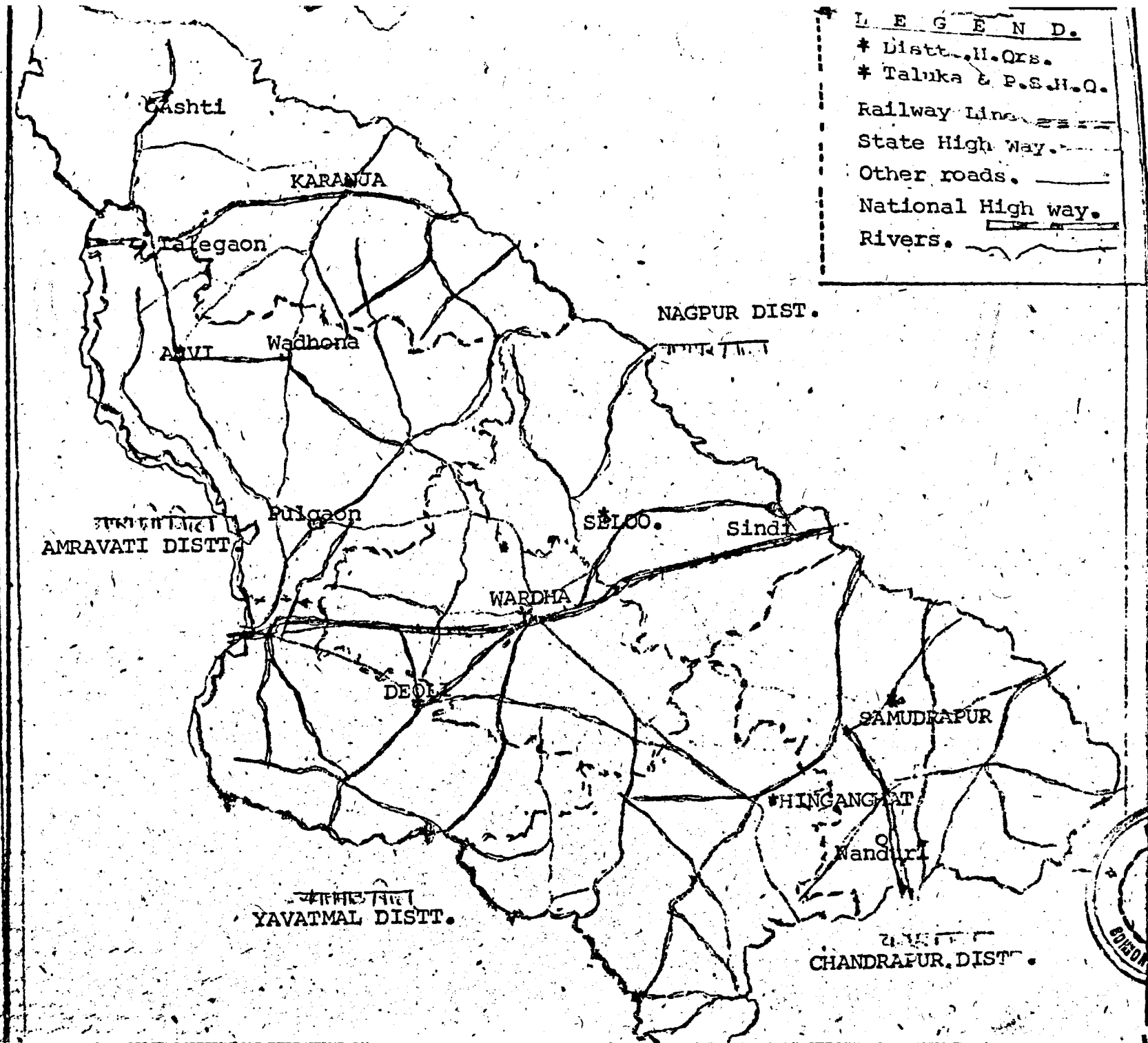

CHAPTER - I

INTRODUCTION

1. LOCATION

A new district named Wardha was formed with Head Quarter at Wardha in the year 1862 due to bifurcation of Nagpur district. The district derived its name from the river wardha which flows at along the western border of the district. The wardha Valley forms the western portion of the district consisting of a long strip of land, running from the North-west to the South-East of the district occupies the western portion of Nagpur plain and lies at the foot of Satpura hills adjoining, Amrawati district. It lies between $20^{\circ} - 18'$ to $21^{\circ} - 21'$ North Latitude and $78^{\circ} - 30'$ and $79^{\circ} - 15'$ East Longitude & is very narrow at the ~~North~~^{North en} extremity & gradually enlarge its width towards South.

2. BOUNDARIES

The district is surrounded by four district of Vidarbha with Nagpur district on the ~~East~~^{East}, Chandrapur district on the South, Yeotmal district of the South-west and Amrawati district on the west, the North-west and the North. The wardha river separates the district all along the western border from Amrawati and Yeotmal districts.

3. ADMINISTRATIVE SET UP

The District is administratively divided into three Revenue Sub-divisions namely Wardha, Arvi, and Hinganaghat, each comprising two Talukas. The talukas are further Sub-divided into 15 Revenue Circles which in turn are divided in to groups of of villages, Called "Patwari Halka". As such, village is the lowest unit in the administrative set-up. The district is a part of Nagpur Division and is administrat by the Collector.

4. AREA

The area of the district is 6307.0 Sq. Kms. (2,434 Sq. miles) and its population according to 1971 Census is 779562. In terms of area and population it constitutes 1.06% and 1.75% of area and population of Maharashtra state excluding Greater Bombay district. Its head-quarter was first located at Ketha a village near Pulgaon, but it was subsequently changed to the present site, at Falakwadi village subsequently named as Wardha after the name of the river 'The Wardha'. The maximum length of the district is about 123 kms. and its breadth at the southern extremity is about 58 kms. There were no major changes in the boundaries of the district and administrative divisions since 1911, though it formed a part of erstwhile state of Madhya Pradesh and bilingual state of Bombay. Due to State Reorganisation on 1st May, 1960, the district forms a part of Maharashtra State.

5. TOPOGRAPHY.

Wardha district naturally is divided into two parts. The northern part comprised of hilly parts due to underlying spur of Satpura and covers a major portion of Arvi Tahsil while on the South lies undulating plain intercepted by streams and is broken here and there by isolated hills rising abruptly from its surface. It covers most of Wardha tahsil and the entire Hinganghat tahsil. No peak in the range exceeds 610 m. and the average height of their summits is not more than 396 to 427m. above the level of the plain. The length of the hilly tract from the North-West to the South-east is 80 kms. and its North-greatest width is less than 32 kms. It occupies about one fourth of the whole area of the district. The elevation of the plain country is between 213 m. and 290 m. The slope of the district is from the North-west to the South-east.

6. HILLS, RIVER SYSTEM AND SOIL

6.1 HILLS.

There is only one main system of hills, which is the offshoot of the Satpura ranges. The length of the hill from the North-West to the South-East is about 80 km. and its maximum width is 32 km. The highest point in the district is the peak of Garamsar 602 m. Nanigaon 536 m. and Malegaon 492 m. in the hills of Arvi Tahsil. The trigonometrical survey Stations are near Nachangaon 374 m. and that near Kelzar 345 m.

6. 2. RIVERS.

The Wardha is the only important river of the district which rises from the Multai Plateau of the Satpura range and flows all along the Northern and Western borders dividing the district from former Berar. The main tributaries of the Wardha are the Yeshoda, and Wana and of the Bankali. The other notable rivers in the district are the Bhadadi, the Dham, the Bor and the Pothara. Though these rivers posed great threat and danger to the villages situated on their banks when they are in spate in the monsoon season, there remain hardly any water in them in Summer. Secondly the beds of these rivers are too deep to make them fit for canal irrigation. The river Bor is harnessed for irrigation purposes by construction of a dam named 'Yeshwant Dharan' on it.

6. 3 SOIL

To the south of a large number of villages around Anji & Hingani and slightly to the north of Nagpur Bombay Road, the Country is hilly and the remaining parts of Wardha and Hinganghat tahsils are fertile plains with the exception of some low foothills running along the northern boundary of Wardha tahsil and of few small hills in the South-East of Hinganghat tahsil.

The level portion of Arvi tahsil in the north, is the most fertile part of the district and consists of a strip of land lying between the hills and Wardha river. The soil here is formed of the detritus brought down from the hills and is highly productive growing a variety of fine crops of cotton. The plains of Wardha and Hinganghat tahsils, are not so renowned for fertilities but they are covered over most of the surface with a coating of fertile bank of brown soil of varying depth above the basaltic rock. The black soil which covers the trap is believed to be formed by the denudation of basalt combined with the deposit of vegetable matters. The thickness of the soil in the district varies from 10 feet to a few inches, the average thickness being about 2 feet. The soil is generally found intermingled with calcareous tufa of 'Kankari'. The types of soil in the district are Kali I, Kali II, Morand and Khardi - Bharadi. The black soil occupies nearly 34% of the area of the district. The soils are mostly original from Deccan trap. The Black soil contracts in summer and becomes fissure with cracks.

7. CLIMATE, TEMPERATURE AND RAINFALL

7. 1. CLIMATE

The climate of the district is hot and dry and somewhat cooler than Nagpur. The days are hot and nights are cool. Both 'Summer and Winter seasons are severe. The heat of the mid-day in summer is a little less than the hottest parts in India. The maximum temperature was 42° centigrades in the month of April while the minimum temperature was 15° centigrades in December during the years 1979. The summer sets in roughly from middle of February and continues up to the middle of June or till monsoon sets in. The Winter usually starts from the middle of October and ends by middle of February though the nights in

february continue to be quite cold.

7.2 TEMPERATURE

An observatory was started in the month of June, 1966 at Wardha. The temperature record shows that May is the hottest while January is considered to be the coldest month of the year.

7.3 RAINFALL

A major supply of the rain is from the South-West monsoon over in whole district which sets in about the middle of June, and ^{lasts} till the end of October. The rainfall data are recorded at the Taluka head quarters of Wardha, Arvi and Hingangaat. During the wet seasons, the month of August usually has the greatest intensity of rain followed by July. During the year 1979 & 80 at all the three Centres in the district, the rainfall was 1148, 1061 and 1530 mms. respectively, as against moving rainfall of 1134, 1140, & 993 mms. respectively. From Taluka to Taluka the average rainfall is more or less the same but is decreased as one proceeds from North to South.

8. POPULATION

The 1971 population of the district shows an increase of ^{22.91 %} over the year 1961 as against 3.5 % for Maharashtra. The urban and Rural population in 1971 form 24.51 % and 75.49 % of the total population of the district as against 23.35 % and 76.35 % in 1961. The density of population in 1971 was 124 per square kilometre as compared to 164 for Maharashtra 178 for India. An interesting feature of Wardha's population is, that the sex ratio i.e. females for 1000 males has declined to 949 in 1971 from 964 in 1961. The literacy ratio for the district is of 41.71 % in 1971 as against the rate of 30.45 % in 1961. The literacy rate of Maharashtra is 39.13 in 1971.

8. MISCELLANEOUS

8.1. Industries in the districts

The district has no natural resources of iron ore,

manganese, coal or other minerals. Therefore, the development as far as minerals are concerned is almost nil. The district has about 863 Sq. km. of forest consisting of Teak, Sal, Rose wood, Ail, Benteak, Tendu and Bomboo etc. There are some forest based industries in the district and there is ^a scope for development of forest based industries. The major portion of the production of the district comes from agriculture. The main products of agriculture are Cotton, groundnut, Sesamum, Linseed, Jowar, Wheat, rice, toor and moong. The district also produces bananas, oranges, Sugarcane. The industries based on farm products may come up in the district as there is much scope left for their development. There are at present saw-mills, oil mills, Cotton ginning and pressing, dal mills, weaving ~~XX~~ garments making, tanning of hides and skins, matting industries in addition to the three Cotton Textile mills. Maharashtra Industries Development Corporation and Govt. of Maharashtra undertaking has developed ~~XXXXXXXXXXXX~~ an Industrial Area at Wardha, with an objective to provide the infra-structure for industries by making available land, water power, communication facilities, which in effect will augment the industrial development of the district.

CHAPTER-II

EXPLANATORY NOTES

ON THE SCOPE AND LIMITATIONS OF THE STATISTICAL DATA REPRESENTED
IN PART II, (STATISTICAL ABSTRACT).

I. PURPOSE.

The abstract part of this publication gives exhaustive statistical data on important Socio-Economic indicators of development. Tables on almost all important topics are presented in this part, so that the publication could serve as a reference book. Tahsilwise data has been displayed as far as possible for inter taluka comparison. In most of the tables, data for 1979-1980 has been presented. All the ~~XXXXXX~~ data has been collected from the State and Central Government offices, Local bodies and other relevant agencies. The foot note below each table indicates the sources from which the data have been collected.

II. DISTRICT AT A GLANCE

This tables presents a birds -eyesview of the Socio-Economic Indicators of developments in Wardha district and Maharashtra State, under different heads such as area, population, agriculture, Animal Husbandry, Education, transport and communication, Local bodies and other miscellaneous statistics. Reference year of the data is also indicated in the table.

III. CONCEPTS, SCOPE & LIMITATIONS

The statistical tables presented in the ^{district} ~~district~~ Statistical Abstract are grouped in 13 parts. The contents of the tables and their scope and Limitations under each group are explained below:-

1. AREA AND POPULATION

In all 7 tables i.e., table No.1 to 7 are included in this section. Data for 1971 Census has been indicated in all these tables except table No.2, where in data for 1951,1961 and-

1971 Censuses has been shown with decadal percentage variations. The reference period for 1971 census was sunrise of the 1st April, 1971. Table No. 1 indicates area, houses and population according to 1971 census. For any place to be recognised as an urban area (town) for the 1971 census, it was to have a municipal corporation or an area under a municipal council or a contonment or a civil line. If it did not have any of these urban local bodies to administer, ~~(a) a minimum population~~ its affairs, the following empirical tests were applied (a) a minimum population of 5,000 (Estimated for 1971) (b) a density of not less than 400 per km. (1000 per Sq. mile). (c) the 75 percent of the male working population persing occupation falling outside agriculture; (d) the place should have according to the Director, of census operations of the State, a few pronounced urban characteristics and amenities.

Table No. 3 gives Panchayat Samitiwise classification of inhabited villages according to different population ranges. The term villges i.e. rural are used in the table devotes a statutorily recognised villages having a well defined boundary and seprate land records. Hamelots, wadies or padas have, therefore, not been shown as separate villages. On the other hand, statutorily recognised villages having no population have been shown separatley as ~~un-in habited villages.~~ Villages also included forest villages, comp ising mostly of forest labourers and their families. Total population of the villages in each range is also indicated in the table.

Table No. 4 gives number of towns, according to 1971 census. Table No. 5 gives number of workers and non-workers, in wardha distirct according to standard livelihood classes. The concept of dependency has been abandoned for economic classffication in the 1971 census. The emphasis is now on work and not on-

income or economic dependence. A person is defined as worker if (a) In case of seasonal work and ~~no~~ like cultivation, livestock dairying, household industry etc. he has had some regular work of more than one hour a day ^{through-out} the greater part of the working season, and (b) In case of or regular employment in any trade, profession, service, business or commerce, he was employed during any of the seven days preceding the day of the enumeration's visit to the household and the work has been returned as his main activities.

The table No. 6 gives distribution of population according to (a) age group and (b) Religion, separately for rural and urban areas and for the district as a whole as per 1971 census.

The table No.7 gives Panchayat Samitiwise details of Schedule Castes, Scheduled tribes and Neo-Buddhist separately for urban and rural areas and also for the district as a whole as per 1971 census.

The Scheduled Castes notified for this district are as follows:-

Scheduled Tribes :- There are no scheduled tribes notified for this district in 1971.

2. CLIMATE.

Only two tables are included under this section pertaining to rainfall and temperature at the selected centres in Wardha district.

Table No.8 gives monthly rainfall and ~~am~~ number of rainy days in each month at selected centres for the year 1979. The data is collected through revenue agency. A day ^{is} - treated as a rainy day if during the 24 hours the rain gauge recorded minimum of 25mm of rainfall. Annual rainfall for each centres is also

2.8 mm. off rainfall. Annual rainfall for each Centre is also indicated in the table. 'Normal Rainfall' is the average rainfall over a period ranging from fifty to eighty years.

Table No. 9 gives monthwise Maximum, Minimum and Annual Temperature as recorded at Wardha for the year 1979 by meteorological Centre at Nagpur.

3, AGRICULTURE

Table No. 10 to 23 are included in this section

The table No. 10 indicates talukawise figures of land utilisation under the standard heads of land uses for the year 1977-78 & 78-79. The break up for the total geographical area according to different types of land uses is shown. Major Constituents of the Geographical area are forested land put to non-agricultural uses, barren and uncultivable land, cultivable waste permanent pastures, land under miscellaneous tree crops not included in area shown, current follows, other follows and lastly net area shown. Under forest are included ~~all actual forest~~ areas of lands classed or administered as forests under any legal enactment dealing with forests, whether state owned by private. If any portion of such land is not actually wooded, but put to some agricultural use, that portion is included under the appropriate heading of cultivated or uncultivated land as the case may be, 'Land put to non-agricultural uses' stands for all lands, occupied by buildings, roads & railways or under water e.g. rivers and canals and other lands put to uses other than agricultural. 'Barren and Uncultivable land' covers all barren and uncultivable land like mountains, deserts etc. Land which can not be brought under cultivation unless at a high cost, as closed as 'barren and Uncultivable land' whether such land is in isolated blocks or within cultivated holdings 'Cultivable Waste' includes all lands available for cultivation whether not-

taken up for cultivation or taken up for cultivation once but not cultivated during the current year and last five years, or more in succession. Such lands may be either fallow or covered with shrubs and jungles which are not put to assessed or not assessed and may lie in isolated blocks or within cultivated holdings. Permanent Pastures and other grazing lands cover all grazing lands, whether they are permanent pastures and meadows or not. Village common and grazing land within forest areas are included under this head. Land under miscellaneous tree crops etc. not included in the net area sown included all cultivable land which is not included under net area sown, but is put to some agricultural use. Land under Casuarina tree thatching grass bamboo bushes and other for fuel etc. which are not included under 'Orchards' are ^{classified} under this category. Current follows comprised cropped area, which are kept fallow during the current year. Other follows land included all lands which were taken up for cultivation, but are temporarily out of cultivation for a period not less than one year and more than five years. The net area sown consists of net area sown with crops and orchards, area sown more than once being counted only once. The gross cropped area represents the sub-total or area under all crops. The difference between the total or the gross cropped area and net area sown is accounted for by the area sown more than once during the same year with the same or different crops. Table No. 16 has displayed the availability of ground water in the district while table No. 17 shows minor irrigation position.

Table No. 18 gives the information on Major and Medium projects in this district.

Table No. 19 gives the monthly agricultural wage rates in 1979. This data is collected fortnightly throughout the year from three selected Rural Centres viz. (i) Seloo (ii) Karanja -

and (iii) Samudrapur. Table No. 20 gives the number of operational holding in different size and area operated by operational holding in each group as per Agril. Census, 1976-77. Table No. 21 gives the no. of Agril. implements as per five stock Census 1978. Table No. 22 and 23 indicates scarcity position.

4. ANIMAL HUSBANDARY AND FOREST.

A. ANIMAL HUSBANDARY:- In all 4 tables i.e. tables No.24 to27 are included in the section. Table No. 24 gives talukawise number of various types of livestock as enumerated in the district in livestock census 1978.

B. FOREST :- Table No. 28(a) gives details of area in different types of forest during the year 1979-80. The areas under forests are classified according to legal status i.e. the reserved forest, protected forests and unclassified forests.

The legal status refers to classification of forests under the Indian Forests Act XVI of 1927. Reserved forest are those that are intended mainly for timber production, wherein the right of grazing and cultivation are seldom allowed. In protected forests, the restrictions are not so rigid. The forests which are taken by Govt. from Local bodies or private individuals for management on loose basis are called 'Leased forest'. There is no classification of ex-proprietary forests as such, but in Nagpur Division some private lands containing valuable forests are taken over by Govt. under Section 29 of the Indian Forest Act, which are not yet classified as per tripartite classification and they are termed as ex-proprietary. The forests area shown in table No.28 (A) may not tally with the area under forest shown in table No.10. The two sets of figures differ due to the following reasons.

(I) In the Indian Forest Statistical Return, the whole area including non-wooden area under the control of forest deptt.

is taken as area under forest while in Agril. Statistics, it is classified according to its actual utilisation. (ii) The forest Deptt. returns are meant to serve definite administrative purpose and indicate the ownership of the forest areas and actual utilisation of these areas is not so important from the point of view of forest Deptt, as it is in the land utilisation Statistics under Agril. Statistics. (iii) The forest Deptt. returns relate of financial year and Agril. Statistics relate to the Agril. year.

c. FISHERIES

Table No. 29 gives the area suitable for fish culture ----- fish production and its value etc.

5. EMPLOYMENT, INDUSTRY, MINING AND ELECTRICITY

Table No. 30 to 39 are included in this section. Factory Statistics shown in table No. 30, 31 and 32 covers the following types of factories registered under the factory Act 1948.

1. Those employing ten or more workers working with the aid of power (Section 2 m(i)).

2. Those employing twenty or more workers and working without the aid of ^{power} (Section 2 m(ii). and

3. Those registered under Section 85 of the Act. Statistics of the defence factories are however excluded. Table No. 33 deals with the results of the Annual Survey of Industries, indicating industriewise working and productive capital, total value of production and value added for the year 1977-78 and 1978-79. This survey is carried out by the Directorate of Eco. & Stat., Bombay, annually.

Table No. 34 & 35 gives occupational distribution of total registrations and placement ⁱⁿ the employment exchange for the year 1979-80 according to standard National Classification.

Table No. 36 shows tahsilwise workers undertaken under the Employment Guarantee Programme during the year 1979-80.

6. CO-OPERATION

In all 8 tables i.e. table no. 40 to 47 are included in this section.

The table No. 42 gives panchayat Samitiwise number of primary Agril. Societies, their membership, share Capital, reserve and other funds, working Capital, Loans and Advances for the year 1979-80, 'working Capital' includes paid up Capital deposits and borrowings till purchased or discounted. Over dues refers to amount of loan or instalments which were due for collection, but were not actually collected and for the payment of which no extension has been granted by the competent authority.

Table No. 47 gives blockwise number of registered money lenders in each taluka and loans ^{advanced} by them during 1979-80. Separate figures of loans advanced to traders and non-traders have been furnished in this table. According to the Act, no money lender shall carry on the business of money lending except in the area for which he has been granted licence and except in accordance with the terms and conditions of such licence.

7. MEDICAL AND PUBLIC HEALTH

In all 5 tables i.e. Nos. 48 to 52 are included in this section.

The table No. 48 indicates P.S. wise number of hospitals, dispensaries, maternity homes, health Centres and primary health centres, doctors, nurses, vaidyas, beds and total number of indoor and outdoor patients treated for the year 1979.

The table covers all the state and central Govt. Medical institutions and also institutions owned by municipalities. Private claims are however not included in the table.

The table No. 49 gives Vital statistics such as number of registered births and deaths in the district.

8. EDUCATION

In all 7 tables i.e., table NOs. 53 to 59 are included in this section.

The table No. 53 gives sexwise number of literates and percentage of literacy ^{seperately} for rural and urban areas of each taluka according to 1971 population census as per 1971 census definition a person was classified as literate if he was able to read or write a simple letter in any language.

The table no. 56 gives information according to number of educational institutions according to types for the year 1978-79 and 1979-80. Sexwise enrolment and number of trained and untrained teachers in these institutions is also indicated in this table.

Table No. 57 presents data on the number of beneficiaries among backward classes such as scheduled Caste / Tribes and O.B.C. for the year 78-79 and 79-80. Beneficiaries for this table are persons who are getting educational concessions of either type such as scholarship, Freeships etc. Table No.58 presents data on concessions to economically backward classes. The concessions of free education and amount incurred is given in this table for 1978-79 and 1979-80. Under the category of economically backward students whose parents / guardians income is less than Rs. ⁴⁸⁹⁷4800/- are covered.

9. TRANSPORT AND COMMUNICATIONS

From table No.60 to65 are included in this sections.

Table No.60 gives total railway length on 31st March 1980 according to type of routes. The railway length is measured between the first and last stations within the district boundary. The figures of length of each type of route are, therefore, approximate and not accurate.

Table No.63 deals with operational statistics of Nationalised road Transport in the district.

Table No.64 presents the results of the traffic census on important roads conducted in P.W.D. & H. Deptt. Govt. of Mah. Data on number of vehicles is according to categories and locations of count post. Type of surface and total traffic intensity in tonnes per 24 hours are also indicated in this table.

10) LOCAL BODIES

In all 4 tables i.e. table Nos. 67 to 70 are included in this section.

Table No.67 presents abstract of income & expenditure of Local bodies such as village Panchayats, Z.P. & M.Cs for the year 1965-66, 68-69, 69-70 to 1979-80. The Number of village Panchayats include number of independent V.Ps as well as group village panchayats.

11) PLAN & COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT

From table Nos. 71 to 75 are included in this section. They represent expenditure on Plan and C.D.P. and achievements under them.

12) PRICES

Only three tables are included in this section i.e. Table Nos. 76 to 78 table No. 76 shows the monthly wholesale prices of important Agriculture commodities, Regulated market centres in the district during the year 1979.

Table No.77 gives monthly average retail prices of various commodities at District Head Quarter i.e. Wardha commoditywise from the month of January to December for the year 1979, alongwith units & varieties for which prices have been quoted.

Table No.78 gives consumer price index number (revised series) for working class of Nagpur centres published by the office of Commissioner of Labour Bombay. The base year

for calculating price index (New series) is 1960.

In all the 15 tables i.e. table Nos. 79 to 93 are included in this section. It will be seen from the above table that the percentage of area under food crops, foodgrains, sugarcane has decreased in the year 1978-79 as compared with the 1970-71 and 1977-78. It is doubled under the crops Rice, Gram, Groundnut while decreased under the crops wheat, Jowar and Bajra.

The agricultural production depends upon the timely rains, its even spreading over the periods of season so also upon the adoption of hybrid and high yielding varieties of seeds use of chemical fertilizers and input factors etc.

From the above table it is seen that the percentage of net Irrigated area to net sown area has been increased from 1.22 in 60-61 to 5.36 in the year 1978-79. The increase in Irrigation facilities is mainly in Wardha tahsil due to Borod project while in Hinganghat tahsil, no Irrigation facility is available.

The percentage of area under different Irrigated crops to gross Irrigated area shows that the percentage of total Irrigated area under food crops has decreased from 94.02 in 1960-61 to 87.08 in 1970-71, while it has again increased from 87.08 to 94.88 in the year 1977-78. It has however, declined to 92.55 in 1978-79

The percentage of total non-food crops shows increasing trend from 5.98 in 1960-61 to 12.92 in 1970-71, while in 1977-78 the percentage of non-food crops decreased from 12.92 in 1970-71 to 5.12 in 1977-78 & 7.45 in 1978-79.

From the above table, it will be seen that the number of Societies have decreased from 419 in 1960-61 to 402 in 1979-80. The membership increased from 30980 in 1960-61 to 96501 in 1979-80. which accounts an increase of 311.49 percent membership during the period 1960-61 to 1979-80. The Loans advanced also shows remarkable increase which accounts an increase of 328.9 percent during the same period. The amount of outstanding loan is very high and this is discouraging fact.

3. WAGE RATES.

Since July, 1963, the data on agricultural wage rates in rural areas are collected in three Rural Centres in Wardha district on fortnightly basis. These Centres are Seloo, Karanja and Samudrapur, from Wardha, Arvi and Hinganghat Tahsil respectively. The average wage rates during the year 1979 for male field labour were found to be Rs.4.00 at Seloo, while the same at Samudrapur and Karanja were Rs.5.00 & Rs.5.00 respectively. For the Female the wage rates at Seloo & Samudrapur to be Rs.2.00 while Karanja were Rs.3.00 during the year 1979. During the year 1979, the wage rates of Carpenter in Seloo and Samudrapur Centres have been increased from Rs.9. to Rs.12. There are variation in the wage rates of Blacksmith and Cobbler also in all the three centres in the year 1979.

4. LIVE STOCK AND POULTRY

Livestock makes a substantial Contribution to the economy by providing subsidiary income particularly to small and marginal farmers, food to human population and also provides employment to landless labourers and helps to solve the unemployment problem in rural and urban area also.

The following table gives talukwise position of livestock per 100 hectares.

In the case of primary education, there was an addition of 400 institutions and 212.3 percent increase in the enrolment during the period of 1960-61 to 1979-80. The number of teachers has also increased from 2013 in the year 1960-61 to 3290 in 1979-80. The No. of Secondary institutions has increased from 56 in 1960-61 to 118 in 1979-80, while the enrolment increased from 19,584 in 1960-61 to 59,206 in 1979-80 and the number of teachers increase from 824 to 2018 in the same period.

From the above table it is seen that the banking Offices have been increased, from 15 in 1960-61 to 61 in 1978-79. The no. of h.hds. served by each banking office was increased to 2201 during 1978-79. (H.hds served per banking office were assumed, dividing by 5 to the population covered by banks centres.)

INCREASE IN ROAD LENGTH

The better communication system paves way for social and economic development of a region, Wardha district enjoys comparatively a favourable position. Delhi - Madras broad guage railway route goes through the district with a total length of 109 Kms. and Pulgaon - Arvi narrow guage with a total length of 35.

CHAPTER - IVAnnual Plan 1977-78 and 1978-79 79-804.1 (a) - Principal of decentralised implementation of Plans:-

In accordance with the policy of decentralisation of planning effort, the Govt. of Maharashtra has adopted the principal of district planning since the commencement of the Fifth Five Year Plan 1974-75. In order to maintain the tempo of growth, it is necessary to ensure the participation of a large segment of the population in the development process. In conformity with this objectives, the 5th plan of the state of Maharashtra seeks to achieve the following.

- 1) Acceleration of the growth rate of state income.
- 2) Promotion of appropriate technologies in agriculture and rural industries with a view to increasing employment opportunities.
- 3) Creating conditions favourable for the most valuable sections of the population in the benefits of the plan.
- 4) A guarantee of employment in manual work to all able bodied adults who are willing to work themselves for such work.
- 5) Provision of basic minimum needs of life to people.
- 6) Removal of imbalances of development as between district ~~as-~~ and areas within districts.

Decentralised implementation of District Plans at District level has been principally followed accordingly. Necessary powers have been delegated to District level officers in order to implement the plan effectively for the benefit of weaker sections.

b) Adoption of District as a unit of Planning during the fifth Plan :

During ~~the~~ and up to the end of fourth five year Plan, the progress in the implementation of the plans were reviewed.

at the district level by advisory ex committees appointed under Govt. circular, Co-operation and Rural Development Deptt., dated 5th August, 1964 and at the Divisional level by the Divisional Advisory committee constituted under Govt. circular Finance Department dated 13th December, 1965.

Govt. has since decided that the District should be adopted as unit of planning during fifth plan and that perspective five year and annual plans should be formulated for each district so that imbalances in development as between districts and the area within the same district are steadily removed to the extent possible and all the districts are given an opportunity to attain full development having regard to their potential, available manpower and other resources.

The very basic idea about district planning is that every district shall get certain plan allocation worked out on the basis of certain parameters and broad cross section of the representatives should have a definite say as to how this allocation should be spent in the best possible way.

c) Objects of District Planning :

The main object of the District planning is to take in to account the local resources, manpower, institutional funds and after careful consideration, formulate the District plans in accordance with the requirements of the District and also to solve the various pressing problems of the District on priority basis, wherever required by providing and adequate funds to that effect. While formulating the District Plan, it is presumed that active public participation is must, (i.e. people's active co-operation). It is desired by District planning to achieve the rational utilisation of resources, removal of inter tahsil imbalances as well as proper coordination and full utilization on development programmes.

4. 2 Organisation of Machinery set-up in the District for
formulation, monitoring over- seeing of the District

Plans :

It has been decided by the Govt. of Maharashtra that there should be an agency of machinery at District level for formulation, Monitoring and overseeing of District plans, and accordingly as per Government Resolution, General Administration Department No. PD/SPM/1072/P-1, dated 20th Oct, 1972, District Planning Board was constituted. The main function of the district planning Board was to ensure co-ordinated action by various implementing agencies including the Zilla Parishads and to give guide lines to the various implementing agencies in formulation & implementation of perspective of Five Year Plans.

a) In the District planning Board, there were in all 12 members, out of which 3 were non-officials to assist the District planning Board a District planning team consisting of Eight members was also constituted wherein Collector was appointed as chairman and planning team Officer as member secretary. Amalgamation of the 2 bodies to form single body i.e. D.P. & D.C. .

G. In order to associate the elected representatives of the people in parliament and state legislature and the representatives of various interests, such as industries, trade, commerce, universities and social-welfare institutions in the district with the planning process, Govt. under its Resolution No. DDC/1073/P/1(A) dated 20-6-1973 has set up a District Development council in each district which would serve as a forum for ascertaining the views of the people in the matter of development of the district and their felt needs for periodical review of the District plans.

contd....

b) After reviewing the working of the District Planning Board and District Development Councils, Govt. has taken the decision to associate the elected representatives of the people more directly with the planning process. In view of the above decision, Govt. has decided to amalgamate these planning bodies at the district level with immediate effect under its Resolution no. DPC/1074/P-I dated 1-10-74. The functions of the district Planning and Development ^{council are} the same of that of District Planning Board, mentioned in para 4.2(a) above.

To assist the District planning and development councils in the day to day planning and development activities, Government in Planning Department under the said resolution has constituted a small Executive Committee of the Council of 9 members, who were also the members of the D.P. & D.C. Designated Minister of the district worked as a chairman, where as the Dy. C.E.O. (planning) would work as Secretary of this small Executive Committee of the D.P. & D.C. The executive committee can meet as often as required but at least once in two months.

c) Organisational set up for D.P. & D.C. and Executive Committee

In supersession of all previous orders issued so far, Government in Planning Deptt; under its Resolution No. DPC/1079/PRG-B, dated 21-6-79, has fixed the composition of the D.P. & D.C. as follows:-

4.3 As the fifth Plan period which was originally to run till the 31st March, 1979 was curtailed by one year and it was decided to treat 1978-79 as the last year of the Vth Five Year Plan and 1st Year of Sixth Five year Plan 1978-79. Accordingly the year 1979-80 was treated as the 2nd year of the Sixth Five Year Plan (1978-83) due to change in Govt planning. However, the Sixth Five year Plan was refinanced by the Govt. for the year 1980-85 and hence, the Annual Plan 1979-80 was to be treated as an independent Annual Plan and not as a part of either the Fifth Five Year Plan or the Sixth Five Year Plan.

4.4 The Annual Plan of Wardha district for 1979-80 approved by the D.P.D.C. Wardha involves ^a total outlay of Rs. 434.26 Lakhs.

A feature of the Annual Plan 1979-80 was that the D.P.D.C. was not required to provide for continued staff schemes of the Vth Five Year Plan as the expenditure on staff was asked to be treated as committed expenditure. The Annual Plan 1979-80, thus includes schemes in the nature of spillover of development schemes not-

During the year 1979-80 the highest share of budget provision was earmarked to the Sector "water & power Development" i.e. 35.58% to be followed by social services and Agriculture Programme i.e. 24.01%, 21.88 % . Under the sector "Water and power Development" and Agriculture Programme the Percentage of expenditure incurred was 131.62% and 123.71% respectively.

1. CROP HUSBANDRY

The total geographical area of the district is 5,81,637 Hect. out of which 4,27,962 Hect is under cultivation.

Under "Crop Husbandry" out of budget provision of Rs.1.06 lakh an amount of Rs.1.07 lakh was incurred during

1979-80. The main feature of the programme are 1) Subsidy for pesticides, insecticides and / ii) Subsidy for plant protection measures, iii) Demonstration on oilseed crops iv) Oil seed distribution etc. Under plant protection measures spraying was done for 10,552 hect. during 1979-80 and 15700 pockets of raizoofian culture were distributed in the district.

2. Minor Irrigation

Under this programme budget provision of Rs. 59.75 lakh was made for subsidy on construction of new irrigation work of percolation tanks and irrigation tanks both in state and local sectors. The achievement of physical target during 1979-80 is given as under

6. Dairy Development :-

As against the budget provision of Rs. 15.23 lakhs, an amount of Rs. 14.81 lakhs was incurred during 1979-80 on dairy development programme viz. i) Managerial subsidy to milk producers Societies / unions ii) Supply of one year old buffaloes calves iii) and townmilk schemes Wardha (chilly plant). 7. Fisheries :-

An outlay of Rs. 2.09 lakhs was provided during 1979-80, out of this an amount of Rs. 2.09 lakhs was incurred on district level schemes viz. i) Farm forestry ii) Mixed plantation on waste lands, Ancharat lands iii) Development of forest resources and iv) wild life preservation and Nature conservation.

9. Community Development

Under the community Development programme Rs.0.20 lakhs were incurred as against the budget provision of Rs.0.20 lakhs during 1979-80 for Rural sanitation programme which includes Gram-safai & Bhangi Mukti programme.

10. Warehousing & Marketing

Economic / - of the district is depends on adequate communication facilities, though the need to create adequate communication facilities in rural area was recognised even in past, the road development activity could not gether momentum in these area due to paucity of resources & core sector priorities. 4.11 Employment Guarantee Schemes

The aim of the E.G.S. is to provide gainful and productive employment gainful to the individual and productive to the economy on approved works to all unskilled persons in the rural areas including the area of 'C' class Municipal councils, who need works and are prepared to do manual labour but cannot find it on their own. The guarantee of work is restricted to unskilled Manual work. The participant has no choice of work or the area of the work. The operation of the scheme has been so designed as to ensure that labour is deployed to the extent possible on

existing construction activities in the ^{area} and care is taken to see that the Employment Guarantee scheme does not adversely affect agricultural operations and production and that the scheme is not to be activated where work is available on Plan or Non-Plan works in progress. Work is to be provided under the scheme within 15 days of receipt of a notice of demand for work.

Budget provision of Rs. 26.15 lakhs ^{was} made during 1979-80, as against expenditure incurred to the ^{tune} of Rs. 99.88 lakhs.

Difficulties and bottlenecks experienced in the implementation of various schemes during the year 1979-80.

- i) The budget provision under most of the schemes were received late, i.e. by ^{the} may end. In case of new works/ items/Schemes ^{the} provision as proposed by the District Planning and Development Council were remained unbudgetted for want of administrative or technical sanction.
- ii) In case of continued schemes the administrative approval and orders to continue the schemes were abnormally delayed by various heads of Departments. Even in case of budgeted schemes orders to release budget grants were considerably delayed by the heads of the departments resulting in failure to achieve the targets in the Plan year.
- iii) The schemes were formulated without any study or survey but on the basis of the schemes implemented in other districts and without studying the feasibility of the schemes in the district.
- iv) Roads were proposed without studying whether the land would have to be acquired or not. Normally the land acquisition process takes its own time. The provision under such works remained unspent under such circumstances.
- v) The ^{preliminaries} required to be completed before implementation of such programme were never completed before hand and those steps were taken after a major period was lapsed.
- vi) Planning of programme in most of the schemes was not done which resulted in not achieving the desired targets.

1978-79

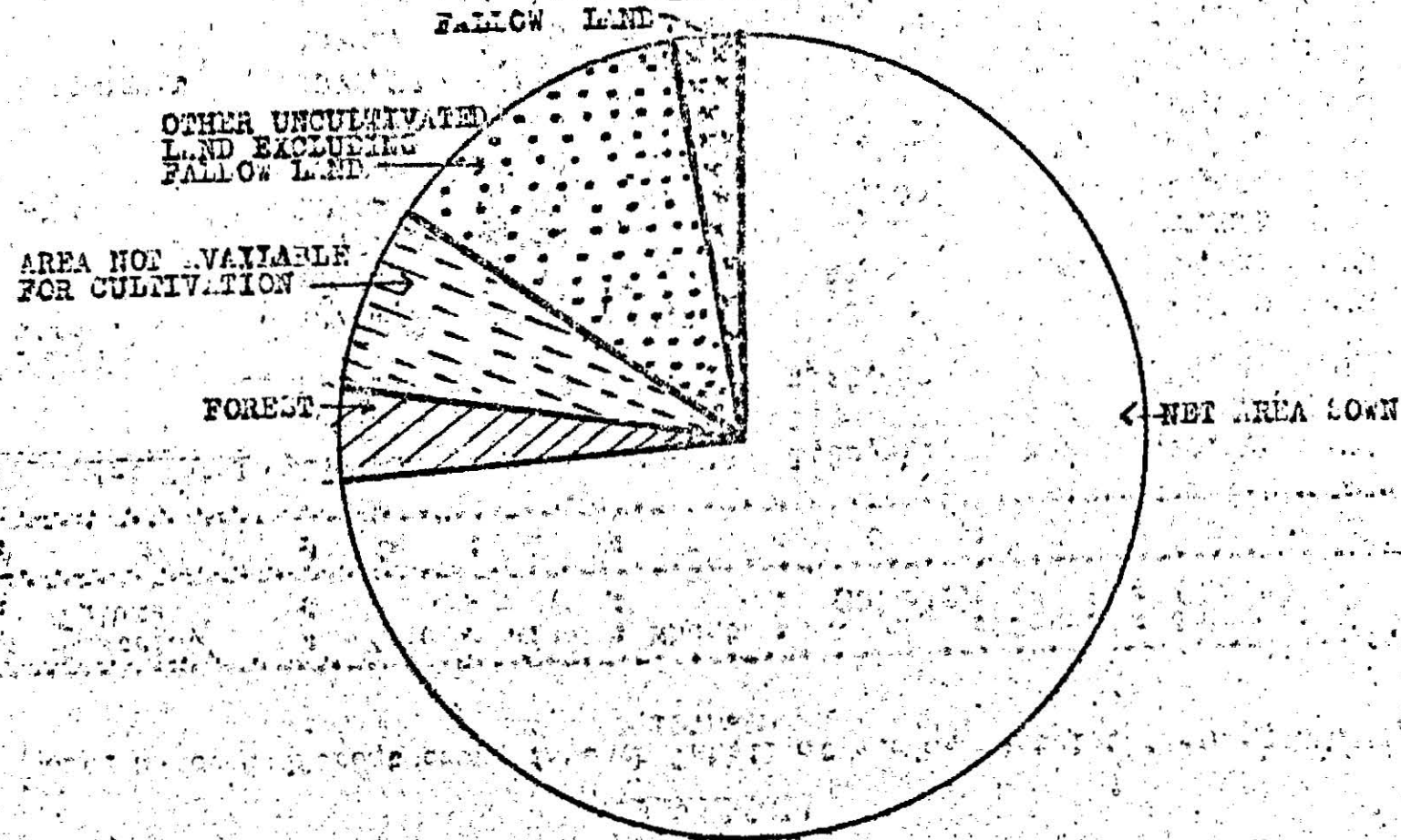

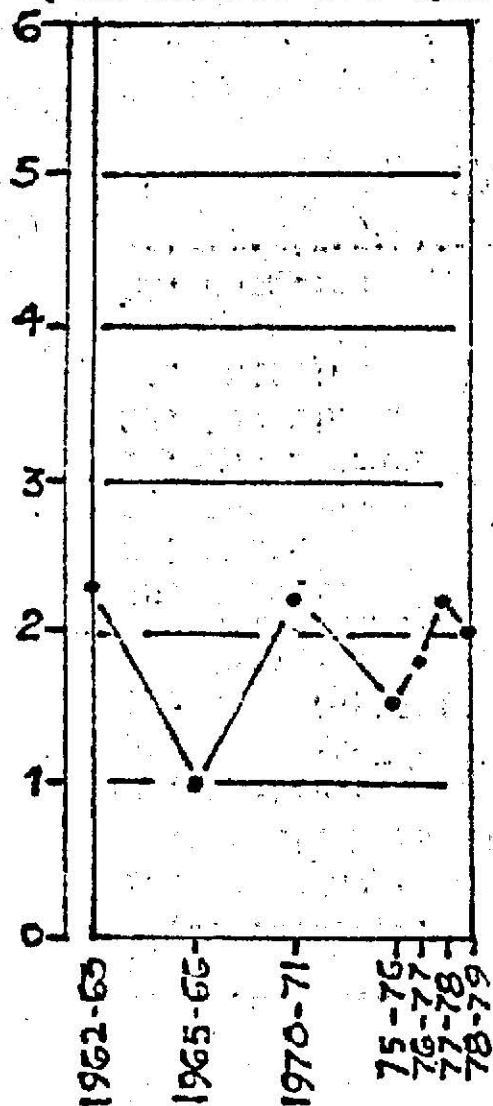

FOODGRAINS PRODUCTION

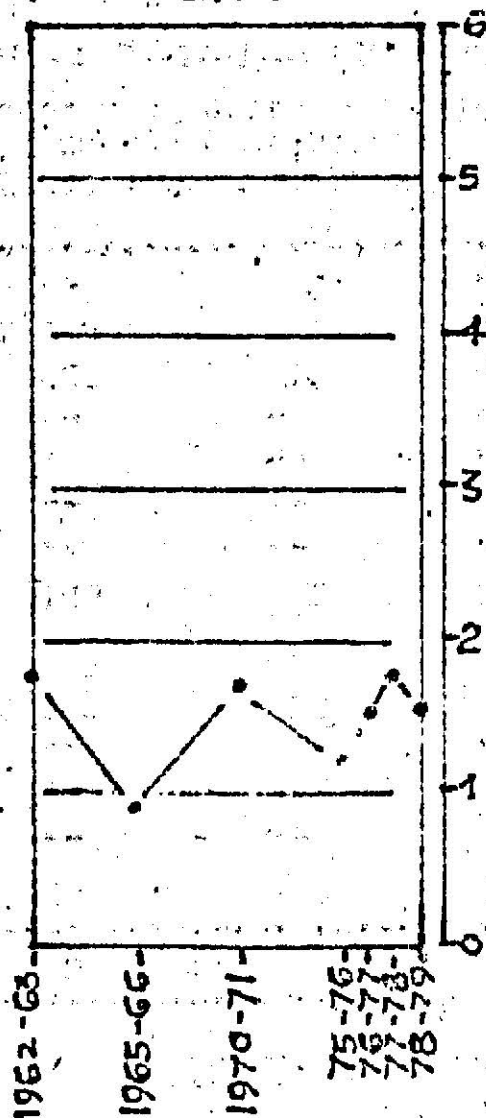

ALL PULSES

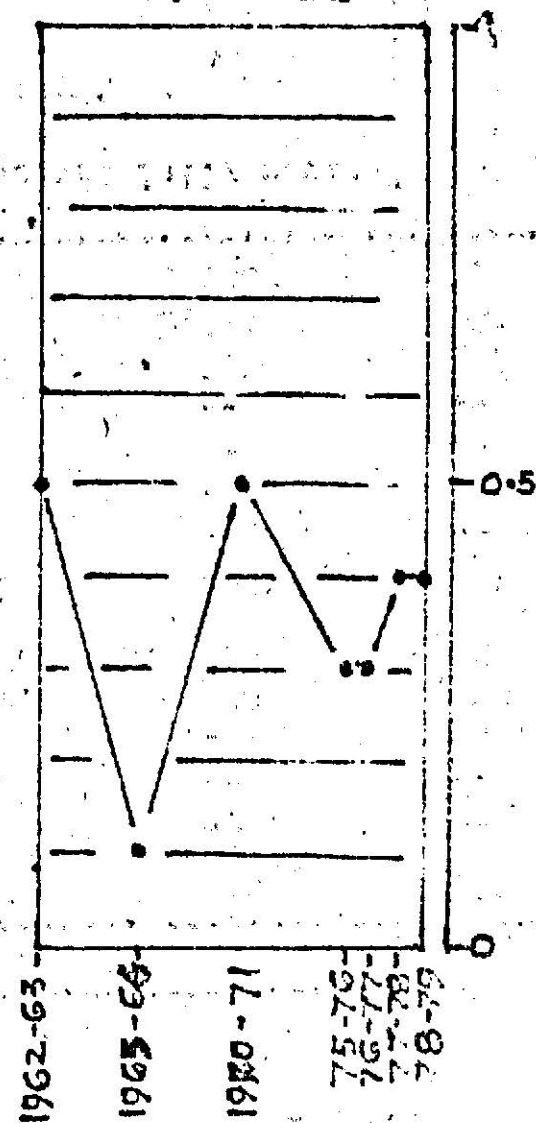

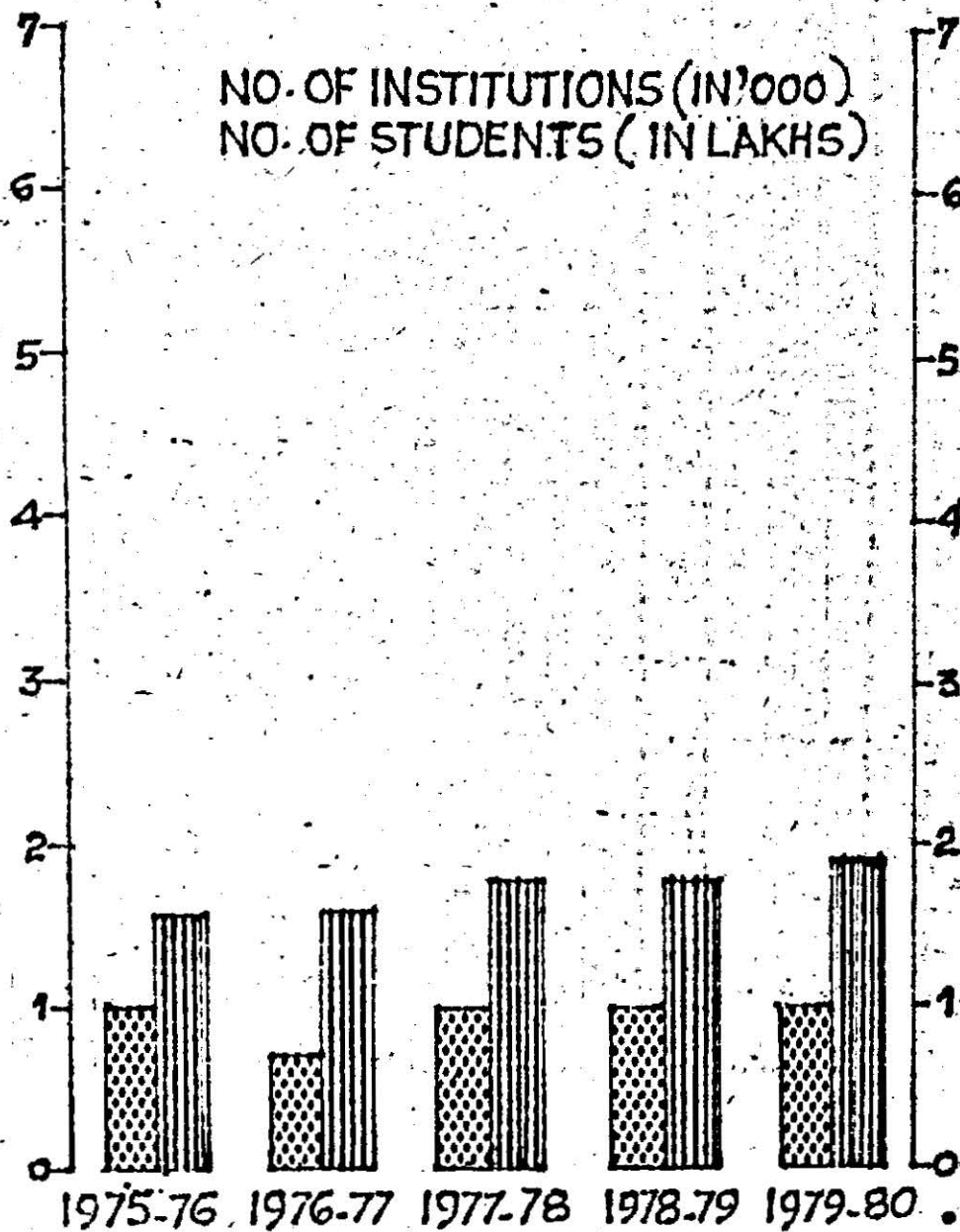

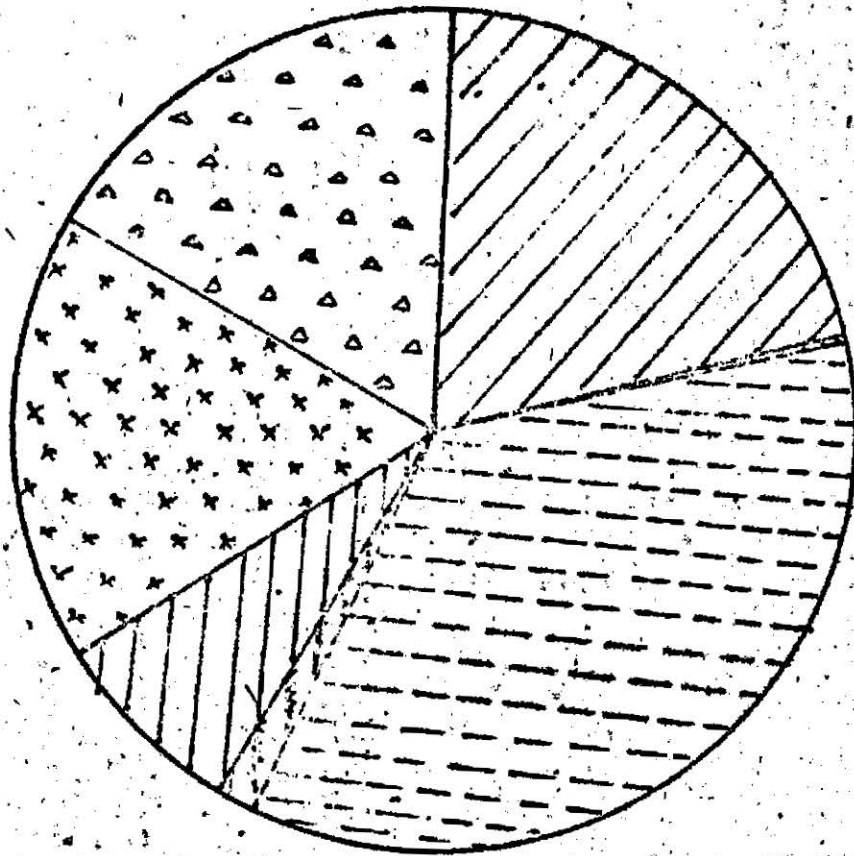

PLAN EXPENDITURE UNDER DIFFERENT HEADS IN WARDHA DISTRICT 1979-80











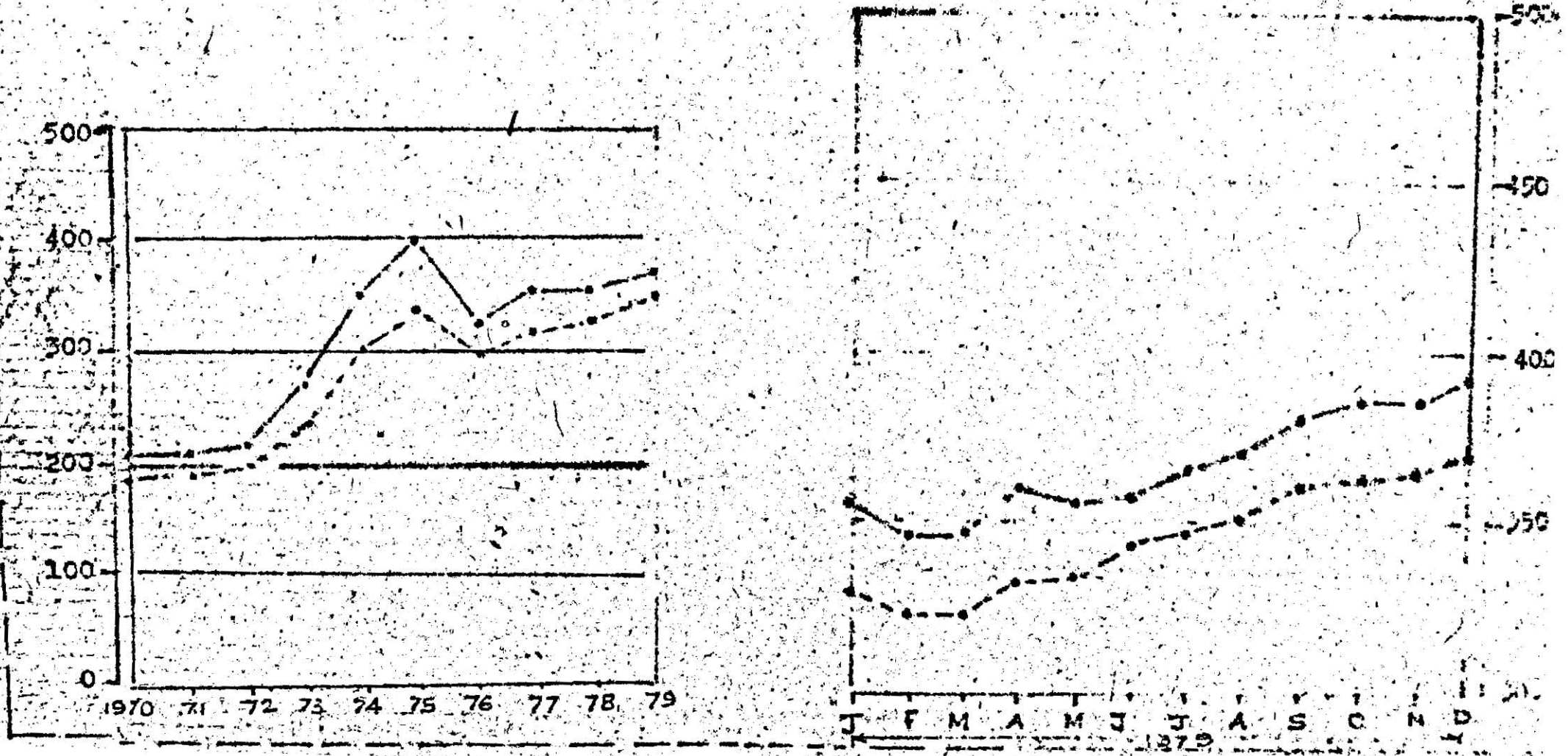

LAND REVENUE IN WARDHA DISTRICT

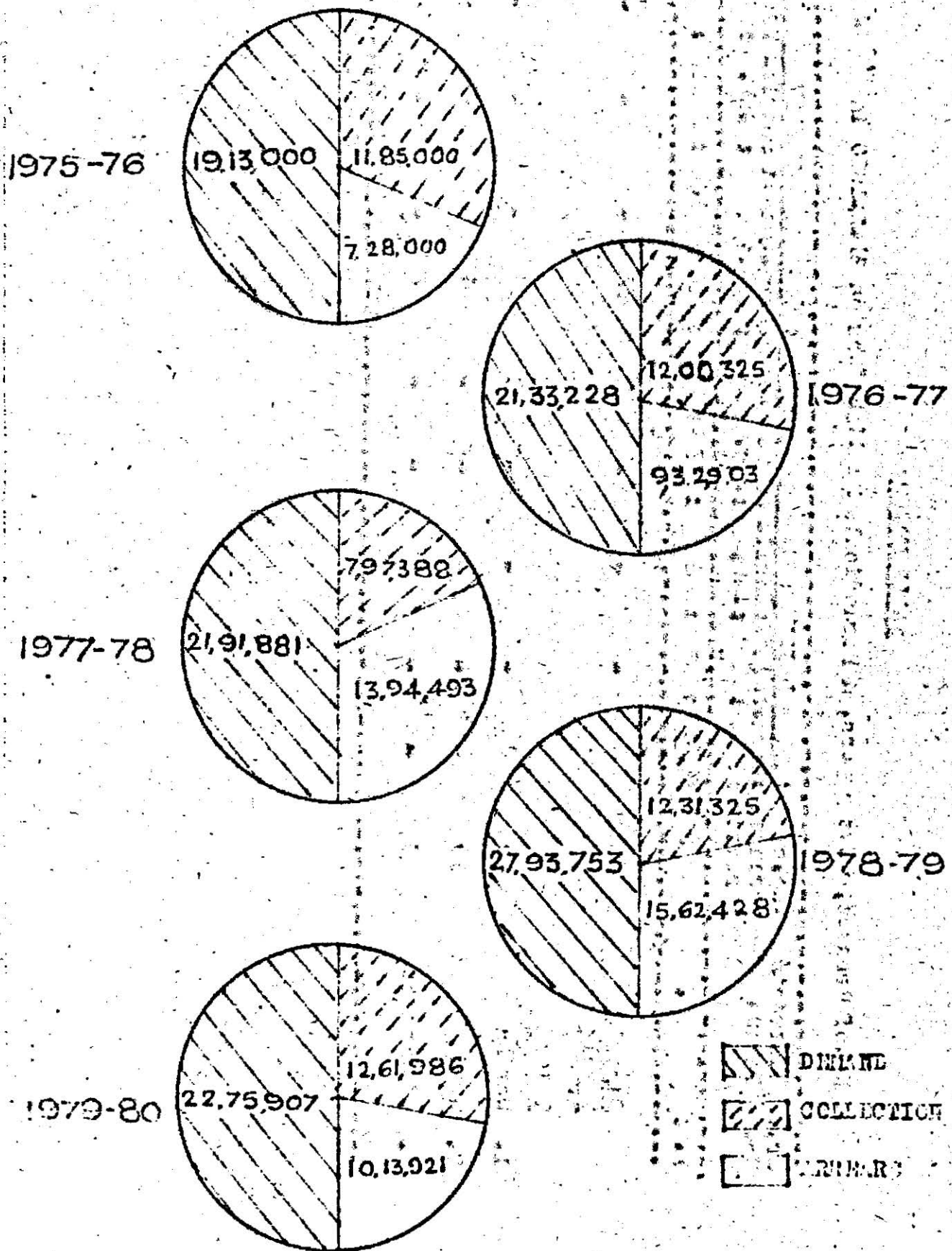
