CHAPTER : I

LOCATION, TOPOGRAPHY, DEMOGRAPHY AND SPECIAL FEATURES.

1.1 LOCATION - Sangli district is one of the parts of the famous "Deccan Plateau". It lies between 16°-45' and 17°-38' North Latitudes and 73°-42' and 75°-40' East Longitudes. This district is bounded on East by Bijapur district in Karnataka State, on the West by the district Ratnagiri, on the South by the district of Kolhapur and Belgaum district of Karnataka State. The districts of Satara and Solapur lies on the North boundaries of this district.

1.2 TOPOGRAPHY -

This district falls partly in Krishna basin and partly in Bhima basin. Consequently, it is divided into different drain systems. The whole district can also be divided into three different parts on the basis of topography, climate and rainfall viz.

- i) Western hilly area of Shirala tahsil with heavy rainfall.
- ii) The basic area of Krishna, Warna and Yerela comprising of Walwa tahsil, Eastern part of Shirala tahsil and Western parts of Miraj and Tasgaon tahsils.
- iii) Eastern draught prone areas which comprises eastern parts of Miraj and Tasgaon tahsils, North-Eastern part of Khanapur and whole of Atpali, Kavathe Mahankal and Jath tahsils.

1.3 HILL RANGES -

There are two main systems of hills, viz. i) Sahyadri ranges, and its offshoots, (ii) Offshoots of Mahimangad Panhala ranges.

1.3.1 The western part of Shirala tahsil is covered by Sahyadri hill ranges covering Bhairavgarh offshoots. These ranges rise to a height of 915 metres above mean sea level at the extreme west and drops down to 610 metres at the eastern borders of Shirala tahsil. The Machindranath hill ranges is the offshoot of main

Mahadev range running along the common boundaries of Walwa, Tasgaon and Khanapur tahsils. It is to the north of Krishna river, it rises sharply to a height of 762 metres above mean sea level with table lands on the top.

1.3.2 Another spur of Mahadev range known as Mahimangad Panhala spur stretches upto Khanapur. At Khanapur, it splits into two parts one branch passes 32 kms. in the South till it ends in the old Panhala fort 10 kms. from Kolhapur city. The other branch stretches south east to Bilur about 3 kms. south west of Jath. This range divides the district between Krishna and Dhima basins. It forms water dividing line and rises in three steps covered with terraces. The heights scaled by these ranges found to be between 636 to 333 metres above mean sea level.

1.4 RIVER SYSTEMS -

Krishna, with its Warna and Yerela tributaries, flows through the western part of the district. Warna flows from west to East along the southern boundaries of the district and joins Krishna river at Haripur near Sangli City. Yerela flows from north-west to south east and after traversing the western parts of Khanapur and Tasgaon tahsils, joins Krishna near Brahmanal. All these rivers are the lifelines of the western half of the district and serve as a source for large irrigation schemes.

Agarani, Man. and Tor rivers constitute the drain system for the eastern part of the district. The water resources from these rivers are very limited and these rivers remain dry for the major part of the year.

1.5 SOILS -

The type and nature of soil is one of the important factors influencing the cropping pattern in the area. The fertility of the land depends on the type of soil, its depth, slope, its chemical composition and the drain system. The soils of varied texture and structure are observed in Sangli district.

1.5(1) The soil in the western part of the district, comprising area from Shirala tahsil, is formed from red laterite mixed with hard - murum due to the hilly nature of the zone. This type of soil contains iron compounds and has a good property of drainage.

1.5(2) The central portion of the district which covers areas of Walwa, Tasgaon(Part) and Miraj(Part) tahsils has deep black soils capable of yielding bumper kharif crops. These soils which are highly retentive of moisture also grow rabbi jowar, wheat, gram and cash crops like sugarcane, turmeric, chillies, grapes etc. This central portion is thus the rich agricultural tract of the district.

1.5(3) The rest eastern part of the district comprising Miraj(part), Tasgaon(part), Khanapur(part) and whole of Atpadi, Kavathe Mahankal and Jath tahsils has a shallow poor grey soils, is a well known scarcity tract. Bajra, cotton, jowar are the main crops of this zone.

1.6 CLIMATE WINDS AND RAINFALL :

1.6(1) The district broadly can be divided into three agroclimatic zones as under.

i) Western part of Shirala tahsil

ii) Tahsils of Shirala(East), Walwa, Miraj(West), Tasgaon(West) and Khanapur(South-west)

iii) Tahsils of Khanapur, Atpadi, Kavathe Mahankal, Jath, Miraj(East) and Tasgaon(East). The climate gets hotter and drier towards the east and humidity goes on increasing towards the west. The maximum temp temperature ranges between 31.1°C in July to 41.5°C in April.

Similarly, the minimum temperature ranges from 10.3°C in December to 21.5°C from April to June. The percentage of humidity at 3.30 hours varies from 54 per cent in March to 37 percent in August.

Similarly, percentage of humidity at 17.30 hours varies from 30 per cent in April to 79 percent in July, the climate in the district is fairly tolerable throughout the year. The winter is

pleasant from December to February. The summer season starts from mid-February to the end of May. June to September are the months of normal rainy season.

1.6.2 Generally, the winds blow moderate. In the rainy season their velocity is high and the direction is from south-west to north-east, more frequently towards east. In the post monsoon periods, the winds are predominantly blow from north-east or east. By February the winds blow in west and north-west directions. This is a predominant feature of summer. Thunder storms occur in the hot and in the post monsoon seasons. The beginning and the end of the rainy season is generally marked by the rainfall often associated with thunders.

1.6.3. The rain starts sometimes in the middle of June and lasts till the end of September in the district. Major portion of the rainfall in the district is received between July and September. During the first half of the season, most of the days are cloudy with drizzling rains, whereas during the late half it rains torrentially.

The western portion of Shirala tahsil gets heavy rainfall on an average over 2000 mm in a year. The central and eastern portion receive annual rainfall measuring about 750 mms. The north eastern portion received the lowest rain fall in the district averageing about 500 mms. in a year.

The fact finding committee, appointed by Govt. of Maharashtra in 1973 has declared that there are six tahsils, namely Atpadi, Jath, Kavathe-Mahankal, Miraj (East), Tasgaon (East) and Khanapur (East) which fall in the broad drought zone. Although the Sangli district was one of the nine severely scarcity affected districts of Maharashtra State in the year 1972-73, there were no scarcity or akin to scarcity condition in the district after 1973-73. However some revenue circles of Jath and Kavathe Mahankal tahsils were scarcity affected in the year 1976-77.

1.7 MINERAL RESOURCES -

The geological formation of the district is the Deccan trap of "Plateau-Basalt", some deposits of calcium carbonate and bauxite containing high percentage of alumina are observed in this district. The bauxite deposits are found on the plateaus in extreme western part of Shirala tahsil, the same being not economically exploitable at present. The other minerals are building stone, clay, slit, sand and limestone. A good clay for brick and tiles is found on the banks of the rivers, particularly on the banks of Krishna, Warna & Yerala.

1.8 FOREST -

The total area under forests in this district according to the Statistician, Forest department is 46,994 hectares in the year 1973-79 which is nearly 5.45 percent of the total geographical area of the district. The dense forest is observed in extreme west boundaries of Shirala tahsil only.

1.9 AREA AND DEMOGRAPHY -

1.9.1 Sangli district has an area of 3563 sq. kms. The population of the district was 15,39,320 and ^{18,31,212} 13,50,000 as per 1971 and 1931 census respectively. The urban population of the district was 13.63% and 21.51% as per 1971 and 1931 census respectively. The rest of the population lived in rural areas. The density of population was observed to be 130 and ²¹⁴ 173 for district as a whole for 1971 and 1931 census respectively. The density of population was 151 and 1027 persons per sq. km. for rural and urban areas respectively as per 1971 census.

1.9.2 The decennial increase of population as per 1971 census when compared with 1961 census was 25.12 percent of total population and it was 49.09 percent in urban areas and 20.67 percent in rural areas. The decennial growth rate in 1971-81 census is 18.92 percent. The following table will give tahsilwise position in this respect.

1.9.3 The sex ratio (No. of females per 1000 males) was 949 and 971 as per 1971 and 1981 census respectively. Literacy percentage of population in district was 37.5. It was 51.0 percent in males and 23.2 percent in females. The percentage of literacy was 46.34 in 1981 census. It was 59.06 and 33.02 percent for males and females respectively as per 1981 census. The population of Scheduled Caste and Scheduled Tribes was 1,72,923 and 7308 respectively in 1971 while in 1981 it reached to 204352 and 15535 respectively.

1.10 ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT -

1.10.1 There are no major industries in this district which are based on mine deals owing to lack of important mineral deposits in the district as stated earlier.

1.10.2 The industrial development is observed mainly in Sangli Miraj-Madhavnagar urban complex. Other industrial growth centres in the district are located at Kirloskarwadi and Vita. There are three sugar factories in the district run by co-operative located at Sangli, Sakharale (Walva) and Chikhali (Shirala) and two Khandsari sugar factories located at Kavathe-Mahankal and Jath. Textile industries are located at Madhavnagar, Sangli, Miraj, ^{Vita} and Kupwad only. The Screening Committee of Govt. of India has sanctioned the proposal of starting one sugar factory each in Walva and Atpadi tahsils.

1.10.3 As per Economic Census 1977, there were 9702 establishments in the district out of which 3523 were found in urban areas. 67,312 out of total 73,155 usually employed workers ^{who} were hired workers in these establishments. In urban areas, 33,613 out of total 37,530 usually employed workers ^{who} were hired workers.

1.10.4 Agro-oriented industries are very few in the district, which are generally seasonal, for example gur industries. Sangli city is well known for "Vayade Bazars" in turmeric. ~~Agri~~ Agriculturists in some of the tahsils of this district use quite modern developed scientific technology in Agriculture to produce bumper crops like sugarcane, seedless grapes, rose-grafts and mango grafts nurseries.

1.10.5 The dairy development has a notable share in the economy of this district. There is one Government Milk dairy having capacity of 1,20,000 litres of milk collection per day located at Miraj and other six cooperative dairy sanghs collecting milk from every corner of the district. There are two chilling plants at Kadegaon and Jath in Government sector one mini chilling plant at Kerenjavate in Walva tahsil started functioning. The dairy sanghs and Govt. dairy Miraj had collected over 460 lakh litres of milk in the year 1930-31.

1.11 SPECIAL FEATURES -

Sangli district is famous for the following special features

i) Shetakari Sahakari Sakhar Karkhana, located at Sangli is one of the largest sugar factories in Asia continent with its daily crushing capacity of 5500 tonnes. Besides, there are two sugar factories located at Sakharale(Walwa) and Shikhali(Shirala),Walwa sugar factory has started its new acetone project.

ii) Tasgaon chaman grapes(seedless thompson) are not only famous in India but in middle east countries also. There is more than 300 hectares of area under this crop in the district.

iii) Miraj city is famous for sitar makers. It is a skilled hereditary occupation of specialised artisans of Miraj.

iv) Sangli city is famous throughout India and abroad for its forwarding market centre in turmeric.

v) Marathe Engineering Industries of Miraj is famous not only in India but in Western developed countries too for its highly sophisticated electrical and electronic controls mainly for textile industries. It is heartening to note that this industry has won the "Phonesia International Trade Trophy- 1973" from Malta.

vi) Sangli district is famous for its milk products. Govt.dairy at Miraj with its daily capacity of 1.20 lakh litres is functioning with its full intensity.

vii) Sangli and Miraj cities are well known for availabilities of best medical facilities. Number of well equipped medical institutions are located in and around these two cities. Miraj Mission Hospital is the biggest medical centre where eminent surgeons and renowned consultants render medical services.

viii) Maharashtra State electricity board, Sangli has electrified 543 villages in eight talukas of this district which contributes to 92 percent of electrification in the district by the end of March-32

ix) A godown of 4000 tonnes capacity for storage of chemical fertilizers is under construction on behalf of Marketing Federation in the premises of M.I.D.C. Sangli.

x) A biggest major earthen irrigation project namely "Chandoli project" is under construction on the river Warna at Chandoli in Shirala tahsil. It will submerge 301 sq. kms. of area and will store 964 million cubic metre of water after its completion. This project will bring 49,150 hectares of area under irrigation by its left bank canal in Sangli district and by its right bank canal area of 36,275 hectares in Kolhapur district will be irrigated directly.

xi) Yeralwadi, Basappawadi, Siddhewadi, Morna, Doddanala are other medium irrigation projects in the district. These projects are constructed on Yerala, Kokalendla, Agrani, Morna and Doddanala rivers and nalas respectively.

CHAPTER - II
EXPLANATORY NOTE

2.1 The data on different important sectors which have dominant effects on the economy are presented in this abstract for the year 1981-82. In most of the cases, the reference period of the data is the financial year. The data on Agriculture, however, relates to the Agricultural year, whereas the data on 'Co-operation' is for the Co-operative year (1st July to - 30th June). The data on other important items like rainfall, temperature, civil and criminal cases, vital statistics, are for the calendar year. The information as far as possible is presented, tahsilwise for inter tahsil comparison.

District At a Glance :-

2.2 Certain essential data on important spheres, such as ,

- i) Population
- ii) Agriculture
- iii) Animal husbandry
- iv) Industries
- v) Co-operation
- vi) Medical and Public Health
- vii) Education
- viii) Transport and Communication
- ix) Plan Expenditure etc.

pertaining to the district is presented alongwith the corresponding figures for the State for the comparison purpose.

District Statistical Abstract -

2.3 The data incorporated in the District Statistical Abstract have been presented in suitable tables, classified in appropriate groups. The concepts adopted in preparation of tables are summarised in the following paragraphs. The limitations of data are cited wherever necessary.

Area and Population-

2.4 The data of 1971 census mainly on population, area, houses, and livelihood occupation, rural urban breakup, distribution of houses and households according to status of tenure etc., are presented in the first nine tables for all tahsils in the district. Data on population per square kilometre, decadal variation during 1951-61 and 1961-72, classification of villages and towns according to population ranges, number of workers and non workers, population of Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes, distribution of population according to age groups and religion and distribution of houses by material used for walls/roof and distribution of households according to size and status of tenure are also given in these tables.

2.5 (a) Urban Area -

The following places have been treated as 'Urban Area' (towns)-

- 1) every place having a municipality or cantonment board irrespective of its population
- 2) every other place which satisfies following three conditions -
 - I) a population of at least 5,000;
 - II) at least three fourth of its male working population engaged in non-agriculture pursuits; and
 - III) a density of population of at least 400 persons per square km.
- 3) any other place not falling under above two categories but which possesses certain distinct characteristics to qualify to its being treated as urban such as its being project area or a developing township.

b) Rural Area -

These areas which do not satisfy the criteria prescribed for recognising urban area are called 'Rural Areas'.

A census village in Maharashtra has always been a revenue village. A revenue village has well defined boundaries, a map and a separate set of land records irrespective of whether that defined area has any population or not.

c) Worker -

A worker is defined as a person whose main activity is participation in any economically productive work through his physical or mental activity. Work involves not only actual work but effective supervision and direction of work. A public or social worker engaged actively in public or social work or a political worker actively engaged in - furthering the political aims of a party was also regarded as a 'worker'. In case of perennial work, such as, cultivation, livestock, plantation, some type of household industries, a person was treated as a 'worker' by ascertaining whether he has participated any time during the last one year, even if he was not economically active in the week prior to enumeration. In case of regular work in trade, profession, service or business, a person was - considered as 'worker' if he had participated in such regular work on any one of the days during the week preceding the date of enumeration and that work has been returned as his main activity.

d) Non-worker -

Non-workers are 'those who are not mainly engaged in any economically productive work'.

Persons primarily engaged in household duties or those who were students and helped in the family economic activity, but not on full time scale were treated as 'non-worker' in respect of their main activity.

e) House -

A house is defined as a structure or part of structure (inhabited or vacant or a dwelling, a shop, a shop cum dwelling or a place of business, workshop, school etc.) with a separate entrance whether that separate entrance leads directly to the street or to a common stair case, court-yard or a gate.

f) Household -

Household was defined as a group of persons living in a house and eating from the same kitchen unless the exigencies of work prevented any of them from doing so.

Climate -

2.6 The rainfall and temperature have pronounced effects on climate. The rainfall data presented in table No. 2.1 gives normal rainfall, monthly rainfall and number of rainy days during the calendar year 1981 for the selected eight centres. Normal rainfall figures are worked out on the basis of actual rainfall for the period ranging from a minimum of five year to a maximum of 30 years. A day was treated as a 'rainy day' if during the twenty four hours the rain gauge recorded a minimum of 2.5 mm. of rainfall. The table no. 2.2 gives actual maximum and minimum temperatures recorded during each of the month of calendar year 1981 in respect of one centre in Sangli district.

Agriculture -

2.7 Important tahsilwise statistics on agriculture, such as

- i) Land Utilisation
- ii) Area under different crops
- iii) Yield per hectare and outturn of principal crops
- iv) Irrigated area under different crops
- v) Sourcewise irrigated area, and
- vi) Data on irrigation and bore wells are given in tables 3.1 to 3.6

2.3 The basic definitions adopted are given below -

a) Geographical area - It is, according to village papers and it calculated from village returns prepared for revenue purposes. As such it may be different from that according to Surveyor - General of India.

b) Forests - It includes all actually forested areas or lands classed or administered as 'forests' under any legal enactment dealing with forests, whether State owned or private. If any portion of such land is not actually wooded but put to some agricultural use, that portion is included under the appropriate heading of cultivated or uncultivated land.

c) Land put to non-agricultural uses-

It stands for all lands occupied by buildings, roads and railways or under rivers, canals etc. and other land put to uses other than agriculture.

d) Barren and unculturable land-

It covers land which cannot be brought under cultivation unless at a high cost, whether in isolated blocks or uncultivated holdings. Land like mountains, deserts, etc. is classified under this category.

e) Permanent pastures and other grazing land -

It covers all grazing lands. Village common grazing lands and grazing lands within forest area are included under this head.

f) Culturable Waste Land - These may be either 'fallow' or covered with shrubs and jungles which are not put to any use and include all lands available for cultivation whether not taken up for cultivation or taken up for cultivation once but not cultivated during the current year and the last five years or more in succession.

g) Miscellaneous tree crops and groves not included in the net area sown -

This category includes all cultivable lands which is not included in net area sown but put to some agricultural use

h) Current fallow Lands - These are lands which are kept fallow during the current year. If any seeding area is not cropped again in the same year, it is also treated as 'current fallow'.

i) Other fallows - All lands which were taken up for cultivation but are temporarily out of cultivation for a period not less than one year and not more than 5 years are classed as 'other fallow'.

j) Net area sown - It consists of net area sown with crops and orchards, area sown more than once being counted only once.

k) Grossed cropped area - Total of area under all crops including area under crops sown more than once is taken as 'Gross cropped area'.

1) Cultivable area is a sum of areas under

- a) Miscellaneous tree crops and groves not included in the net area sown,
- b) Current fallows
- c) Other fallows
- d) Culturable waste land and
- e) Net area sown

Irrigation Statistics-

2.9 Important irrigation statistics regarding

- i) Number of irrigation wells
- ii) Activities of ground water survey and development agency
- iii) Minor irrigation works
- iv) Major and Medium irrigation projects, and
- v) Area irrigated under major and medium projects
- vi) Sourcewise area irrigated
- vii) Cropwise area irrigated are given in table Nos. 3.4 to 3.8

Allied Agriculture -

2.10 Agricultural wage rates of the selected centres

Block Statistical Assistants are given in table No.3.9. Number of operational holdings as per Agricultural Census 1976 are given in table No. 3.10. Final figures of agricultural implements enumerated during the twelfth Live Stock Census are given in table No.3.11. The tahsilwise data on 'famine and scarcity' is given in table No. 3.12 for the year 1931-32 and in table No.3.13 for the period from 1971-72 to 1981-82.

Animal Husbandry and Forests -

2.11 Population of Livestock and poultry as per livestock census 1978 (final data) is shown tahsilwise in table No.4.1. The data on tahsilwise no. of mobile veterinary units is given in table no.4.3. Statistics on veterinary facilities existed, animals treated in such centres and disease-wise mortality of Livestock are given in table Nos. 4.2 and 4.4. Table No.4.5 furnishes data on animals slaughtered in recognised slaughter houses in the district.

2.15 The data on 'area under forests' and major and minor forest produce for the year 1981-82 have been shown in table No.4.6 and table No.4.7 respectively. Area under forests with a classification into ...

i) Reserved

ii) Protected, and

iii) Unclassed forests under the control of State Revenue Department and under State Forests Department, has been shown. These areas may not tally with the area under forests shown in table No.3.1 due to different concepts of classification into above three heads. Reserved forests are intended mainly for timber production in which rights of grazing and cultivation are seldom allowed. Grazing and cultivation under certain limitations and restrictions are allowed in protected forests. The unclassified forests refer to 'inaccessible forests' or 'Unoccupied Waste'.

Inland Fisheries-

2.13 The statistics relating to total area suitable for fish culture, ponds, lakes and reservoirs, area under pisciculture, inland fish production and carp fry used for pisciculture are given in table No.4.8

Employment, Industry and Electricity -

2.14 The statistics relating to working factories under different groups with average daily employment, mandays working, classification of factories according to working strength and number of days worked are given for the year 1930 and 1931 in table Nos. 5.1, 5.2 and 5.3. The term factory includes

- a) those employing ten or more workers with the aid of power.
- b) those employing 20 or more workers without aid of power and
- c) those registered under the Factory Act 1948, even

though the above conditions are fulfilled, the Defence - Factories are excluded. Statistics regarding number of registered factories, productive capital investment, output and employment provided under different industries based on Annual Survey of Industries for the year 1979-80 and 1980-81 are given in table No.5.4. Monthwise registration, vacancies notified, placements done, number of employment seekers on the live register at the end of the month, occupationwise and sectorwise, other data of employment exchange have been shown in table No.5.5 and 5.8. The information regarding the employment generated under Employment Guarantee Scheme works is given in table No.5.7. The data on vocational guidance programme in the district is given in table No.5.9.

2.15 Data on consumption of electricity by different categories during the year 1931-32 is given in table No. 5.10 and No. of towns and villages electrified during and upto end of selected years are shown in table No. 5.9. The data are collected from Maharashtra State Electricity Board Private Electric Supply Companies and Electric Duty Inspector Kolhapur.

Co-operation -

2.16 Important statistical information of the co-operative institutions such as No., members, working capital, share capital, loans advanced is presented in Table Nos. 6.1 to 6 for the year 1931-32.

- i) Data on No. of co-op. societies is given in table No. 6.1.
- ii) Selected data of all types of societies and audit classification is given in table nos. 6.2 and 6.3.
- iii) Data of co-operative banks is given in table No. 6.4.
- iv) Primary Agricultural Credit Societies statistics is given in table No. 6.5.
- v) Table No. 6.6.1 to 6.6.3 gives data on crop loans advanced by different types of societies.
- vi) Data on Marketing societies and selected achievement of co-op. societies is given in table No. 6.7 to 6.9
- vii) Data on operation of Agril. Produce Market Committees is presented in table No. 6.10.
- viii) Data of other societies and money lenders is given in table no. 6.11 and 6.12.

Working Capital -

It includes paid-up capital, deposits and borrowings. Loans outstanding includes outstanding in respect of Loans, each credits and overdrafts and the amount of the outstanding bills purchased or discounted, or instalments which was due for collection but which was not overdue refer to the amount of loans actually collected and for the repayment of which no extension has been granted by the competent authority.

The main function of Agricultural credit societies are to help members by way of providing short and medium term loans for meeting their agricultural necessities like improved seeds, fertilizers, agricultural improved implements etc. The help is also extended in the matters of storage, transportation and sale of the agricultural produce.

2.17 The agricultural non-credit societies look after the work of better farming by way of educating the agriculturists in the adoption of improved agricultural practices, crop protection etc. The societies also undertake educational, economical, cultural and house building activities so as to uplift the standard of living of the agriculturists.

2.18 The main function of the Urban Bank, Urban credit cooperative societies and salary earners co-operative societies ^{is} to promote the qualities of economy and co-operation among the members and also to make them industrious. They also augment the saving habits of the people by way of making the banking facilities easily available.

They give loans to the members on the securities like gold, immovable property, Government securities, commercial goods, etc., They also provide loans to the citizens and small traders.

2.19 The main functions of non-agricultural non-credit societies are to run printing presses, to provide electricity to members and consumers for domestic, industrial and agricultural purpose, to run montessories, Primary Schools and Educational Institutions for educational spread and things of the kind.

The main function of primary co-operative marketing society is the purchase and sale of agricultural produce grown by its members of co-operative societies in its area of operation.

Medical and Public Health -

2.20 In this section, data on medical and public health for the year 1981 are given. Table No.7.1 gives medical facilities available through public and public-aided bodies in each tahsil alongwith indoor and outdoor patients treated. Data on 'Vital Statistica' e.g. tahsilwise and urban/rural areawise births and deaths and infant deaths registered in the year 1981 with break-up into male and female are given in table No.7.2. The data on No.of deaths due to important causes, for the years 1971, 1975, 1980 and 1981 is given in table No.7.3. Vaccination statistics and cholera inoculation done in each tahsil during 1981 is given in table No. 7.4. Table No. 7.5 gives statistics on family planning as on 31-3-1982.

Education -

2.21 The data on tahsilwise number of literates and percentage of literacy as per 1971 census are shown in table No.8.1. The data on education level of people in rural and urban areas are given in table Nos. 8.2 and 8.3. The data regarding pupils and teachers with No. of institutions in pre-primary, primary, secondary and higher categories are presented in table No.8.4. The data on backward class enrolment and concessions granted to economically backward class and expenditure incurred under normal and plan grants on primary education in the district is shown in table Nos. 8.5 8.7 and 8.8. The data on other types of educational institutions is given in table No. 8.6. The data on vocational and technical schools, adult education centres and teachers training institutions is given in table Nos. 8.9 to 8.11.

Transport and Communication -

2.22 Length of railway routes according to gauge is shown in table No.9.1. The table No. 9.2 gives road length according to category and surface classification. Roads maintained by Municipal Councils/Contonment Boards are also shown seperately in this table. The data of number of motor vehicles in operation in Kolhapur region covering Satara, Sangli and Kolhapur districts together are shown in table No.9.3(Districtwise figures are not available). Important operational statistics relating to Sangli Division of Maharashtra State Road Transport Corporation is given in table No.9.4. Results of traffic census conducted in important roads in Sangli district are given in table No.9.5.

Statistics on Postal, Telephones and Telegraph facilities and on rural broadcasting is depicted in the table Nos.9.6 and 9.7 respectively.

2.23 Local Bodies -

The financial position of village panchayats, Municipal councils and Zilla Parishad is shown in this section for the year 1981-82.

2.24 The number of village panchayats include number of independent village panchayats as also group village panchayats. Income and expenditure of village panchayats are exclusive of opening and closing balances of income and expenditure, respectively. Grants include grants from Government as well as from Zilla Parishad and from Panchayat Samities for developmental activities. Govt. grants to village panchayats are mainly land revenue grants, equalisation grants and local cess grants. - Govt. grants in respect of Municipal Councils are mainly grants on account of dearness allowances, grants for roads, for water supply for educational purpose for medical purpose and on account of percentage in land revenue. The receipts of Zilla Parishad are shown under four sub-heads viz.

- i) Self raised resources
- ii) Government grants
- iii) Grants for Agency Scheme and
- iv) Debt. section

The expenditure is shown under two heads i.e. Revenue Expenditure and Debt. section.

2.25 The data are collected from the Zilla Parishad, Sangli and all the Municipal Councils in Sangli district.

2.26 Plan and Community Development -

Data on plan expenditure under State and Local sectors and physical achievements in important fields during the year 1980-81 and 1981-82 are given respectively in table No.11.1 and 11.2.

2.27 Prices -

The table No.12.1 gives monthly average wholesale prices of agricultural commodities transacted in regulated markets. The district average for each variety and for each month is also given.

2.28 The table No.12.2 gives the monthly average retail prices of important commodities of Sangli head-quarter - during 1981. As the information collected for the given commodities is restricted to only one quotation and that also from only one shop in the district headquarter, the average shown for individual commodities cannot be said to be fully representative but the data may prove useful as broad indicator of the trend in changes in retail prices over the period of time. The table No.12.3 gives consumer price index number for working class of Solapur and Pune centres for the year 1981-82. For the calculation of index, the year 1960 and 1961 are taken as 'base year' for Solapur and Pune centres respectively.

Miscellaneous -

2.29 Statistical data pertaining to police force, crime statistics, cases disposed off in civil and criminal courts, cinema statistics regarding seating capacity in different types of theatres No. of Banking offices, No. of scheduled banks, their deposits and advances and No. of Joint Stock Companies, insurance policies and amount insured, collection of small savings, Land revenue collections, number of presses, newspapers and periodicals published list of inspection and traveller bungalows and list of railway stations etc. are given in the table Nos. 15.2. to 15.9. Table No. 15.5 gives information about the quantity of Rice, wheat and Sugar issued to fair price shops. The demand and procurement of levy in Gangla district are indicated in table No. 15.6. Statistics relating to General Election of Assembly 1980 and Lok Sabha 1980 are presented in table No. 15.7.

2.30 A table showing trends of selected indicators in the fields of development, such as -

- i) Agriculture
- ii) Livestock
- iii) Industry
- iv) Education
- v) Health, etc.

is appended at the end.

These selected indicators are very useful for assessing progress in various fields over important periods in the recent past.

CHAPTER - III
AN ANALYTICAL REVIEW OF SECTORIAL TRENDS.
1981 - 82.

3.1. An analytical review of various socio-economic activities, viz., agriculture, livestock and poultry, employment, electricity, consumption, extent of credit and banking facilities etc. has been presented in this chapter. The facts and figures of these sectors are presented in part- II of this issue. In order to have precise picture of the district, data for the year 1981-82 is compared with the past data for the years 1960-61 and 1970-71, which will indicate changes over the years.

3.2. Agriculture -

Indian economy is largely depends on agriculture even today. Agriculture backwardness is one of the prominent features of our economy. The Maharashtra State, as well as SANGLI district is no exception to this fact. As far as Sangli district is concerned, ^{agricultural} production is badly affected due to scarcity and uncertain rains,, especially in eastern zone, rocky and poor soil, inadequate irrigation facilities, poor use of fertilizers by the farmers etc.

3.3 The development in the field of agriculture can be judged from three main indicators, viz.,

- i. percentage of gross cropped area to net area sown,
- ii. percentage of net area irrigated to net area sown, and
- iii. productivity of important crops.

The figures furnished below will show position of the district as a whole and also that of individual tehsil in the district.

3.4 From the above table, it is seen that the percentage of gross cropped area of the district shows slightly decreasing trend when compared with the years 1960-61 and 1970-71. Within the district, decrease was observed in all the tahsils except Khanapur and Walwa.

The cropping pattern in the district does not show any remarkable changes in the years 1977-78 to 1979-80. However decadal variation is observed in the percentage area under different crops. It is observed that the percentage area under rice, wheat, total pulses and sugarcane, is significantly increasing, while Bajra, cotton and groundnut is decreasing over the years 1960-61 and 1970-71.

3.6. YIELD RATES :

The Agricultural Production of various crops depends on various factors, such as, natural condition, input factor, irrigation facilities etc. The following table indicates the yield rates and out turns of principal crops in the district for the years 1960-61, 1970-71 and 1978-79 to 1980-81.

It is seen that the yield rates of almost all principal crops vary year to year and show no specific trend. However, the yield rates in respect of rice, jawar, bajara, gram, groundnut, sugarcane and cotton are significantly increased over the year 1970-71.

The percentage of net area irrigated to net area sown in the district shows an upward trend since 1970-71 to 1977-78. However, from 1978-79 onwards the net irrigated area is decreased continuously in almost all the tahsils of the district. The percentage of net area irrigated to net area sown is highest in Walwa tahsil and lowest in Shirala tahsil.

3.8 An effort has also been made to see cropping pattern of irrigated crops in the district. The table below indicates the proportion of area irrigated under different irrigated crops to gross irrigated area.

From the above table it is seen that well irrigation is prominent in Sangli district and about 84 % of the total irrigation area is covered by wells.

CO-OPERATION :

3.10. Agricultural credit and outstanding dues :-

Now a days input factory in agricultural production plays an important role. More the investment in agriculture, more will be the production. But in our country due to poor economical conditions, farmers are unable to invest from their own resources and inturn production from agriculture gets affected. In order to enable farmers to invest substantial investment in agriculture, Agricultural Credit Societies were formed in almost all the villages in the district. The table below gives the position of these societies for the years 1960-61, 1970-71, 1980-81 and 1981-82.

3.11. Though the number of Agricultural credit societies are more or less the same, the membership in these societies is increasing day by day. It is worthwhile to note that the percentage of overdues to total loans advanced decreased from 26% in 1980-81 to 22% in 1981-82.

Agricultural Wage Rate -

3.12 The data on agricultural wage rates is being collected through three centres, viz., Atpadi, Jath and Mhaishal in Miraj tahsil. The monthwise data of agricultural wage rates for all the centres is given in table no.3.9. The daily wage rates for field labours ranges from Rs.5 to 6 for male workers and Rs. 3 to 5 for female workers. The skilled labours, viz., carpenter, blacksmiths, cobbler, generally work on contract basis.

3.13 Livestock -

Livestock is wealth of the nation. It plays vital role in our economy. Livestock provides income, human food as well as draught power to the farmers. In order to know livestock strength quinquennial livestock censuses have been carried. The latest, i.e. 12th quinquennial census of livestock was carried in 1978. The livestock population data as per the above census is analysed below -

3.14 The bovine and ovine population per 100 hectares is observed to be highest, i.e., 215 in Walwa Tahsil followed by Atpadi and Shirala tahsils. In Kavthe Mahankal and Tasgaon tahsils the proportion of bovine and ovine population is little higher than the district. The rest portion of the district is having comparatively less number of bovine and ovine population than the district average of 147.

CONSUMPTION OF ELECTRICITY

3.15 Electrification of the villages is one of the important indicators for measuring socio-economic development. Now a days electricity is basic need of the human being. Hence, under electrification programme, maximum villages are electrified and agricultural pump sets energised. Upto the end of MARCH, 1982, out of 539 villages in the district 501 villages were electrified and 31209 agricultural pump sets were energised. The tahsilwise information is as given below -

As regards electrification, Shirala tahsil is lagging behind and nearly one-third of the villages are remained un-electrified upto the end of MARCH, 1982. It might be due peculiar topographical situation, i.e., nearly 30 villages are situated in hilly and rocky region and some of the villages are to be submerged under Warna dam. It is significant to note that Miraj, Tasgaon and Walwa tahsils have achieved the goal of cent percent electrification of the villages under its jurisdiction. For the remaining tahsils only 12 villages are to be brought under electrification programme. Considering district as a whole, about 93 % villages are brought under electrification upto 31st MARCH, 1982.

From the above table, it is seen that about 31 thousand agricultural pumpsets have been energised till end of MARCH, 1982 in SANGLI district. Maximum number of pumpsets have been energised in Walwa tahsil followed by Tasgaon and Miraj and nearly 21 thousand pumpsets have been energised in these tahsils upto 1981-82.

3.16 An effort has also been made to see quantum of electricity consumption according to different purposes.

2. For the years 1960-61 and 1970-71 separate break-up of consumption under Agriculture and other purposes is not available. Hence the figures shown against 'Other purposes' include consumption of electricity and agriculture also.

3. Per capita consumption of electricity on Agricultural and other purposes taken together appears to have declined during the year 1981-82 as compared to that in 1961-62 and 1970-71. This is due to the change in the procedure of computation of consumption of Electricity under Agriculture since computation of consumption of electricity under Agriculture has been changed from actual consumption to horse power of the pumpsets utilized, resulting in apparent decrease.
-

The consumption of electricity is increasing day by day. The per capita consumption in 1980-81 has been increased by nearly 40% over a decade back averaging 4% increase per year. The per capita consumption in 1981-82 is increased by a little over 11% over 1980-81 due to remarkable increase in industrial consumption.

3.17 EMPLOYMENT EXCHANGE STATISTICS

Employment Exchange statistics is one of the indicators of the magnitude of unemployment to some extent, because the unemployed persons seeking manual work and those who have not enrolled their names with employment exchange are excluded from employment exchange statistics.

The position of the Sangli district regarding registration and vacancies notified etc. is summarised in the table below -

The above figures reveal that the proportion of enrolment has been increased very sharply during 1970-71 to 1980-81 and 1980-81 to 1981-82 to the extent of about 22 per cent and 24 per cent respectively. On the contrary, rate of placement against enrolment is decreasing since 1979-80 onwards.

4.3 To assist the council in its day to day work, the Executive Committee is constituted at the District Level. The Chairman and Vice Chairman of the committee are the same as those of the council. The Member secretary is, however, the District Planning Officer, the committee meets regularly to plan programmes and suggest ways and means for its effective implementation.

4.4 The year 1981-82 was the second of sixth five year plan (i.e. 1980-81 to 1984-85). After the Fifth Plan period two annual plans i.e. 78-79 and 79-80 were implemented. Government then formulated the Sixth Five Year Plan for the period from 1980-81 to 1984-85. This chapter gives review of the second year of Sixth Five Year Plan i.e. 1981-82.

4.5 The following table gives the consolidated information about the budget and expenditure figures under the State plan and the centrally sponsored plan schemes for the Annual Plan 1980-81 and for the second year of the sixth plan i.e. 1981-82.

From the above table it will be seen that the total expenditure during the year 1980-81 was Rs.367.35 lakhs, which was 104.56 percent of total budget provision. While in the year 1981-82 it was Rs.1505.6 lakhs which was 101.97 percent of the total budget provision.

4.7 As could be seen from the above mentioned table budget provision during the year 1980-81 was fully utilised and the expenditure exceeded the budget provision. In 1981-82 also expenditure exceeded the provision. The expenditure during 81-82 was 117.35 percent of the budget provision. Social Services Programme received the highest importance and next in order was Agri. programme in 1980-81. The percentage of budgetary provision was 31.25 and 24.85 respectively. These two sectors received the priority in 1981-82 also. The percentage of budgetary provision for them was 35.59 and 30.06 respectively. The expenditure on Employment Guarantee scheme was under Miscellaneous Head during 1980-81. The expenditure on Employment Guarantee Scheme was included in Agricultural programme during 1981-82.

The budgetary provision for co-operation and Community Development was Rs.2.37 lakh in 1980-81. There is noteworthy increase in budgetary provision for 1981-82, which amounts to Rs.193.69 lakh. Major portion of the provision is for assistance of share capital and loans for rehabilitation of sick sugar factories. The provision on these two schemes was 185 lakh Rs. However under Irrigation and Power, there is decline of budgetary provision from Rs.132.00 lakh to Rs.96 lakh in 1981-82 over 1980-81.

In general, budget utilisation was 102.45 percent for all major heads taken together during 1980-81 while it was 117.35 percent during 1981-82.

4.8 The following table gives the percentage distribution of expenditure on different major heads of development.

It is seen from the above table that there is noteworthy expenditure on co-operation and Community Development in 1981-82. The expenditure on this head was less than one percent in 1980-81 which rose to 10.41 percent in 1981-82. Rs.135 lakh were spent on assistance of share capital to new sugar factories and rehabilitation of sick sugar factories. There is also increase in expenditure under Agricultural Programme and Social Services in 1981-82 as compared to 1980-81.

II. PHYSICAL ACHIEVEMENT : STATE PLAN SCHEME :

4.9 The details of physical achievements under different schemes are given in table No.11.2 of part-II of this publication. However, a brief review of the important achievements under each sub-head of development is taken in the following paragraphs.

RKG

I. Agricultural Programme-

4.10 This major head covers important programme, viz., Agricultural production, Soil conservation, Animal Husbandry, Minor Irrigation, D.P.A.P., Forest, Fisheries etc. The expenditure on Employment - Guarantee Scheme is included under this sector in 1981-82.

a) Crop-Husbandry -

4.11 In all there were ten schemes implemented under this sub-head. 230 farmers were given subsidy for plant protection equipment in 1981-82. Subsidy for Gobar Gas plants was given to 4 beneficiaries. 7060 small and marginal farmers were given subsidy for purchase of nitrogenous, phosphatic fertilisers. Rs.5.76 lakh were spent on this scheme. Intensive oil seed development programme was launched in 6500 plots.

b) Soil Conservation-

4.12 The scheme of bunding and terracing programme mainly covers the expenditure on staff. Under the scheme of land development through the soil conservation, bunding and terracing programme work in 488 hectares was completed. The expenditure of this scheme - exceeded the budget provision.

c) Minor Irrigation-

4.13 Major portion of the expenditure of this scheme was on construction of percolation and Minor Irrigation tanks in 1981-82. Rs.90 lakh were spent on this scheme out of total expenditure of Rs.92 lakhs during 1981-82. The two schemes implemented during 1980-8 viz. loans to Co-operative lift irrigation societies and subsidy for failed irrigation wells were implemented during 1981-82 and their achievements in 1981-82 are 2 and 15 respectively.

d) Drought Prone Area Programme-

4.14 Sangli district is one of the centrally assisted district. However upto 1979-80 the assistance was 50% of the total expenditure. Since 1979-80 the assistance in respect of only centrally approved blocks of Jath and Atpadi was given to the tune of 50% of the total expenditure of block or Rs.7.50 lakh per block whichever was less. The programme in four State approved blocks was entirely borne by the State Government. The subsectorwise budget and expenditure during 1981-82 is as follows .

e) Animal Husbandry -

4.16 The total budget provision for 18 schemes under this sub sector was Rs.12.09 lakhs and the expenditure was Rs.10.06 lakhs. The major portion of expenditure was on establishment, construction of veterinary polyclinic, building and construction of residential and non residential building at Intensive Poultry development block. Under the individual beneficiary scheme of distribution of cockerels and the special livestock production programme 800 cockerels were given on subsidy against loan from banks.

f) Dairy Development -

4.17 The managerial subsidy amounting to Rs.0.33 lakhs was given to 45 Dairy co-operative societies. The handling of milk per day was 1.19 lakh litres as against the targeted figure of 1.24 lakh litres. An amount of Rs.0.51 lakhs was spent for purchase of dairy machinery. The total budget provision for this sector was 72.50 lakhs and the expenditure incurred was Rs.72.00 lakhs.

g) Fisheries -

4.18 The netting and stocking are the main activities under this sub-head. 43 tonnes of fish were netted during the financial year 1981-82. 3.65 lakhs fingerlings were stocked. As an assistance to the fisherman 216 kg. nylon twine was also distributed.

h) Forest -

4.19 Only seven schemes with budget provision of Rs.0.56 lakhs were implemented and the expenditure exceeded the budget. The work of nature conservation and beautification of Sagarashwar and Dandoba was executed and an amount of Rs.5.42 lakhs was spent for this purpose.

1) Integrated Rural Development Programme -

4.20 This is an important centrally assisted programme where individual beneficiary schemes are executed with 50% central assistance. As per the instructions from the Government, one block from D.P.A.P. namely Atpadi and one block from C.A.D.A. namely Walwa was selected for the purpose. The total expenditure in the year 1981-82 was Rs.29.46 lakh. The important physical achievements for 1981-82 are as given below.

II. Co-operation-

4.21 There were 10 schemes under this sector which were implemented in 1981-82. Two new schemes viz. assistance of share capital to new sugar factories and assistance to sick sugar factories were implemented in 1981-82. The expenditure on these two schemes alone was Rs.100 and Rs.35/- lakh respectively. Under these schemes two sugar factories were benefitted. The schemes like outright grants to village societies, share capital assistance to urban credit societies, interest subsidy on short term loans to small farmers etc. which were implemented in 1980-81 were taken up in 1981-82 also.

III) WATER AND POWER DEVELOPMENT :

1. Medium Irrigation Project -

4.22 The work of five medium projects namely Bassappawadi, Doddanala and Sankha in Jath tahsil, Siddhewadi in Tasgaon tahsil and Morna in Shirala tahsil were in progress in this district. The total budget provision for these five works was Rs.28.00 lakhs, out of which Rs.24.02 lakhs were spent.

2. Power Project -

4.23 The total provision for the four schemes viz. i) Normal Development ii) System improvement iii) Rural electrification iv) Electrification of Harijan bastis was Rs.69.02 lakhs and the expenditure was Rs.68.24 lakhs. 9 Gaothans were electrified during 1981-82.

IV) Industry and Mining-

4.24 With a view to provide all facilities at one place only, the new offices centralising all the processing required for development of an industry were opened during 1979-80. The provision of Rs.2.56 lakhs to start District Industry Centre during 1981-82 was made in the annual plan. The other schemes were of routine nature. The total budget provision was Rs.21.49 lakhs and the expenditure incurred was Rs.13.84 lakhs.

4.25 Under the scheme of Financial Assistance to Small Scale Industries under S.A.I. Rules. 577 small scale industries were given interest subsidy of Rs.0.69 lakhs, 113 educated unemployed were given seed money assistance of Rs.9.68 lakhs for starting new ventures. 303 persons were sponsored under E.P.P. programme for obtaining practical experience. Three Balutedar societies were given share capital of Rs.0.50 lakhs.

V) Transport and Communication -

4.26 The total budget provision of Rs.92.85 lakhs was made under this head of development as against which an expenditure of Rs.89.08 lakhs was recorded. The targets and achievements in respect of four schemes implemented under this head were as follows .

In the paragraphs, important physical achievements under each sub-head are explained.

a) General Education -

4.28 Under this sub-head, as many as 32 schemes were implemented in this district. Under the scheme of attaching standards V to VIII to secondary schools, 10 divisions in the year 1981-82 were created. Under the scheme of educational concessions to economically backward class students, as many as 27400 students were benefitted in the year 1981-82. 28 kit boxes were also distributed under UNICEF aided programme of science kit boxes. In all 1567 students belonging to SC/ST were given special benefits.

b) Medical and Health -

4.29 Under this sub-head 6 schemes were implemented. An amount of Rs.3.83 lakhs was spent on construction of Primary Health centres and sub-centres. Under another schemes viz. Malária control an amount of Rs.2.90 lakhs was spent on equipments.

c) Nutrition -

4.30 The scheme of midday meals to school going children in Drought Prone Areas was implemented benefitting 31,660 students. The expenditure was Rs.12.47 lakhs. The other schemes were Applied Nutrition Programme and special nutrition programme in urban slums and integrated child development service scheme.

d) Sewerage and water supply -

4.31 The scheme of boring operation of G.S.D.A. was implemented in the year 1981-82 and 349 bore wells were drilled at the cost of Rs.55.80 lakhs. Besides this scheme, seven other schemes were -

implemented in the year 1981-82. This year 238 bore wells were fitted with electric pumps. Piped water supply scheme work for one municipality was in progress as at the end of the year. As against the provision for Rs.366.34 lakhs, Rs.402.26 lakhs were spent.

e) Housing -

The provision of house sites to landless labourers was the only important scheme. 690 huts were constructed with the expenditure of Rs.12.39 lakhs.

f) Urban Development -

4.32 The only scheme implemented under this sub-head was to help the implementation of development plan of municipal councils, which recorded an expenditure of Rs.26.53 lakhs in 1981-82.

g) Welfare of Backward Classes -

4.33 In all 17 schemes were implemented under this sub-head. The achievements are as follows. 1014 students were given tuition fees. The provision was Rs.11.60 lakhs where as the expenditure was Rs.10.52 lakhs.

h) Labour and Labour Welfare -

4.34 All the expenditure under this head was booked on expansion of I.T.I. and the staff scheme of the employment exchange.

Employment Guarantee Scheme -

4.35 The main object of the scheme is to provide gainful and productive employment (gainful to the individual and productive to the economy) on approved works to all unskilled persons in the rural areas including the area of 'C' class municipal councils, who are in need of work and are willing to do manual labour. The Guarantee is for unskilled work and work will be given at Panchayat Samiti level. The budgetary provision for this scheme was of -

supplementary nature in which as much as the work which are not being accommodated in plan or non-plan funds are taken up under the E.G.S. The scheme is being implemented since 1972-73.

4.36 During the year 1981-82 an amount of Rs.50.00 lakhs was provided and the expenditure incurred during this year was Rs.159.82 lakhs. The workwise achievement for the year 1981-82 is given below.

4.38 During the year 1980-81 and 1981-82 the major portion of the expenditure on the centrally sponsored schemes was under social and Community Services i.e. health and Agril. Programme under Drought Prone Area Programme.

4.39 As regards the expenditure under Social Services i.e. implementation of medical and health programme, blood smears collection under the Malaria Eradication scheme and welfare of backward class students for scholar-ships.

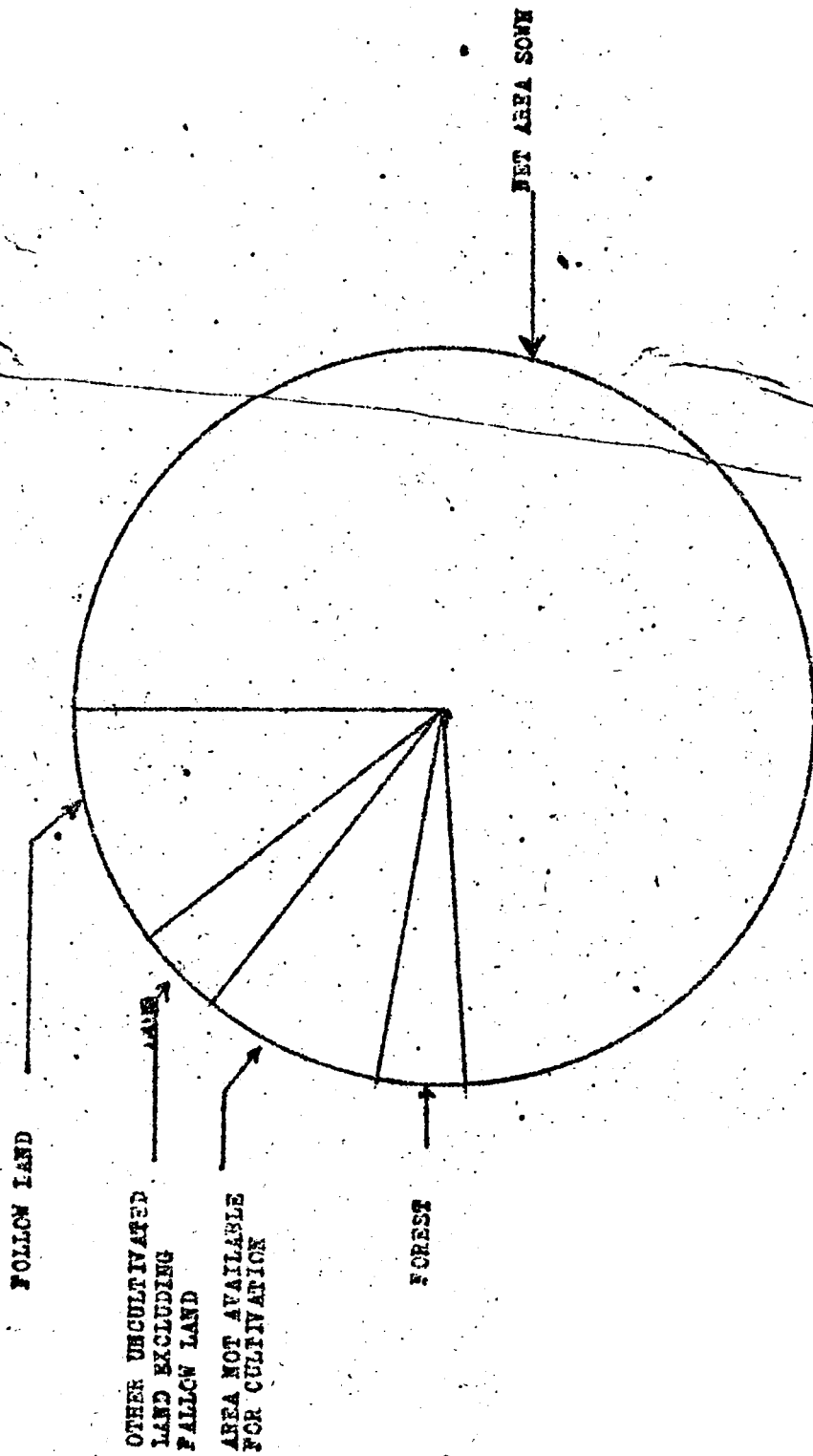
4.40 Under the Agricultural Programme the expenditure was mainly on Drought Prone Area Programme, and Integrated Rural Development Programme during the year 1981-82.

FOODGRAINS PRODUCTION

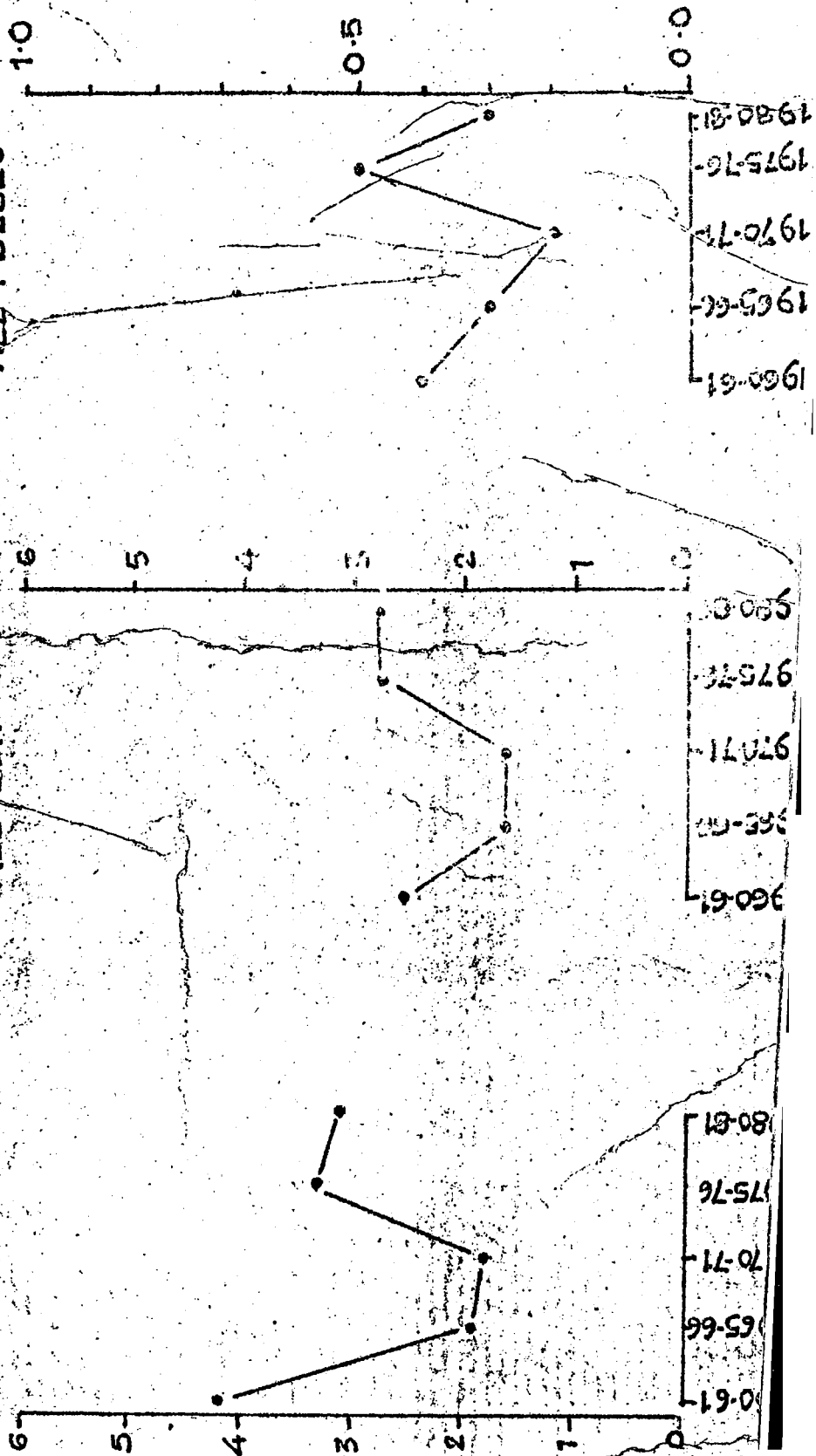

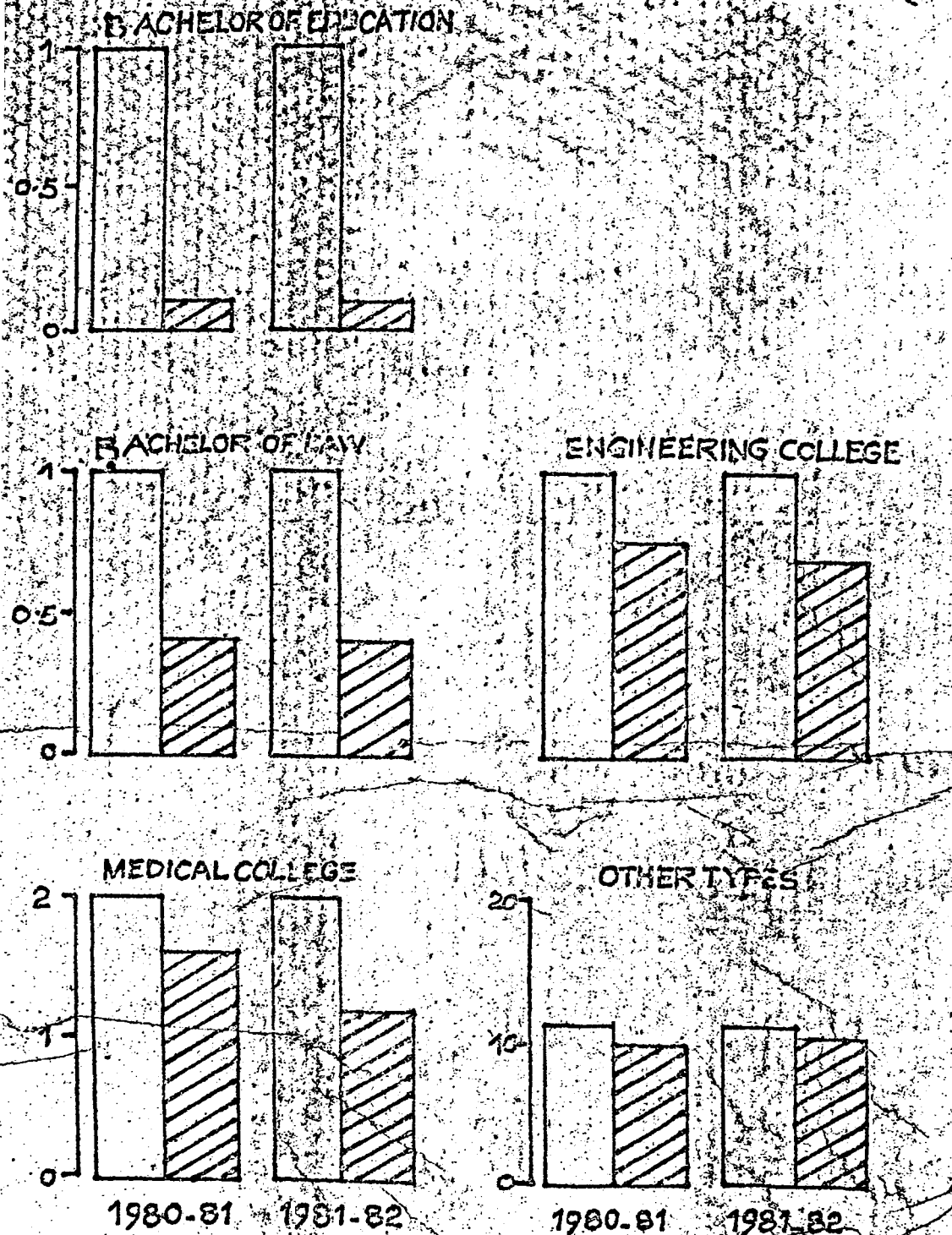

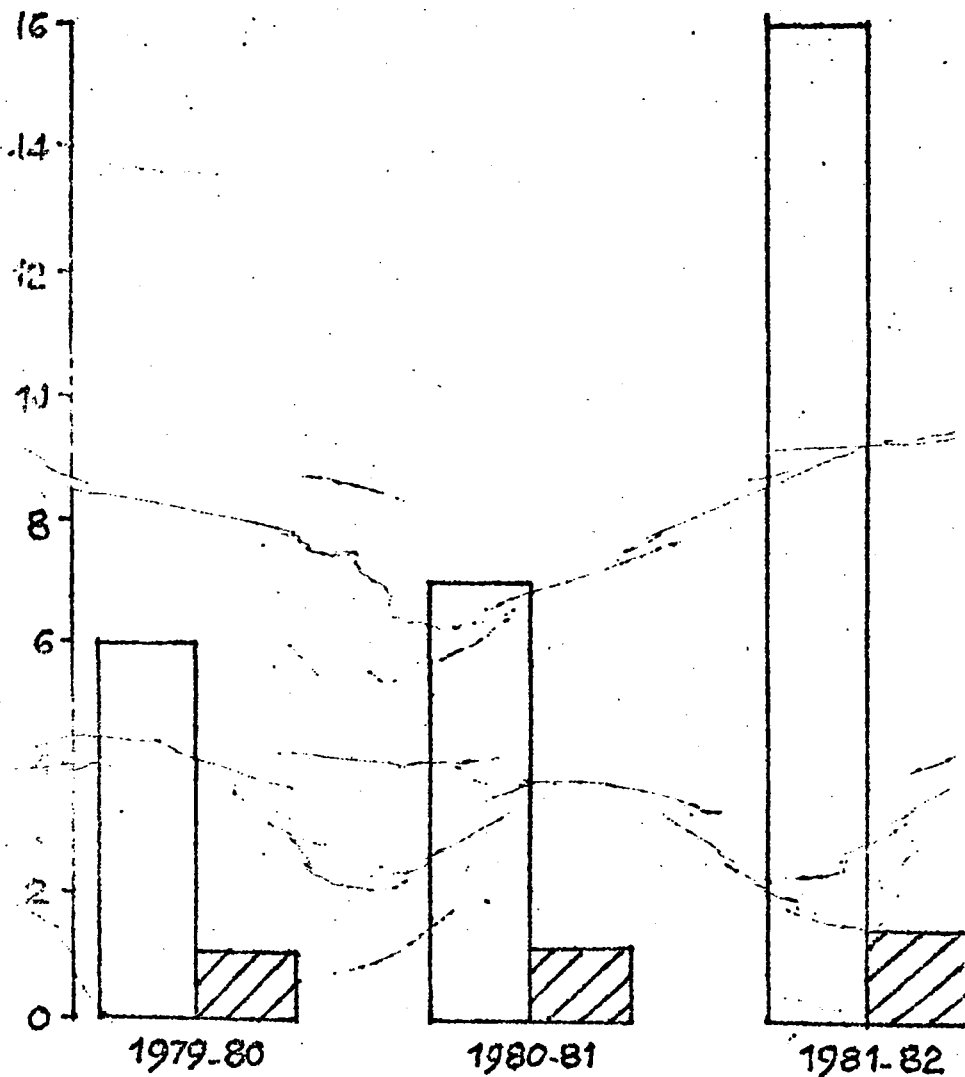

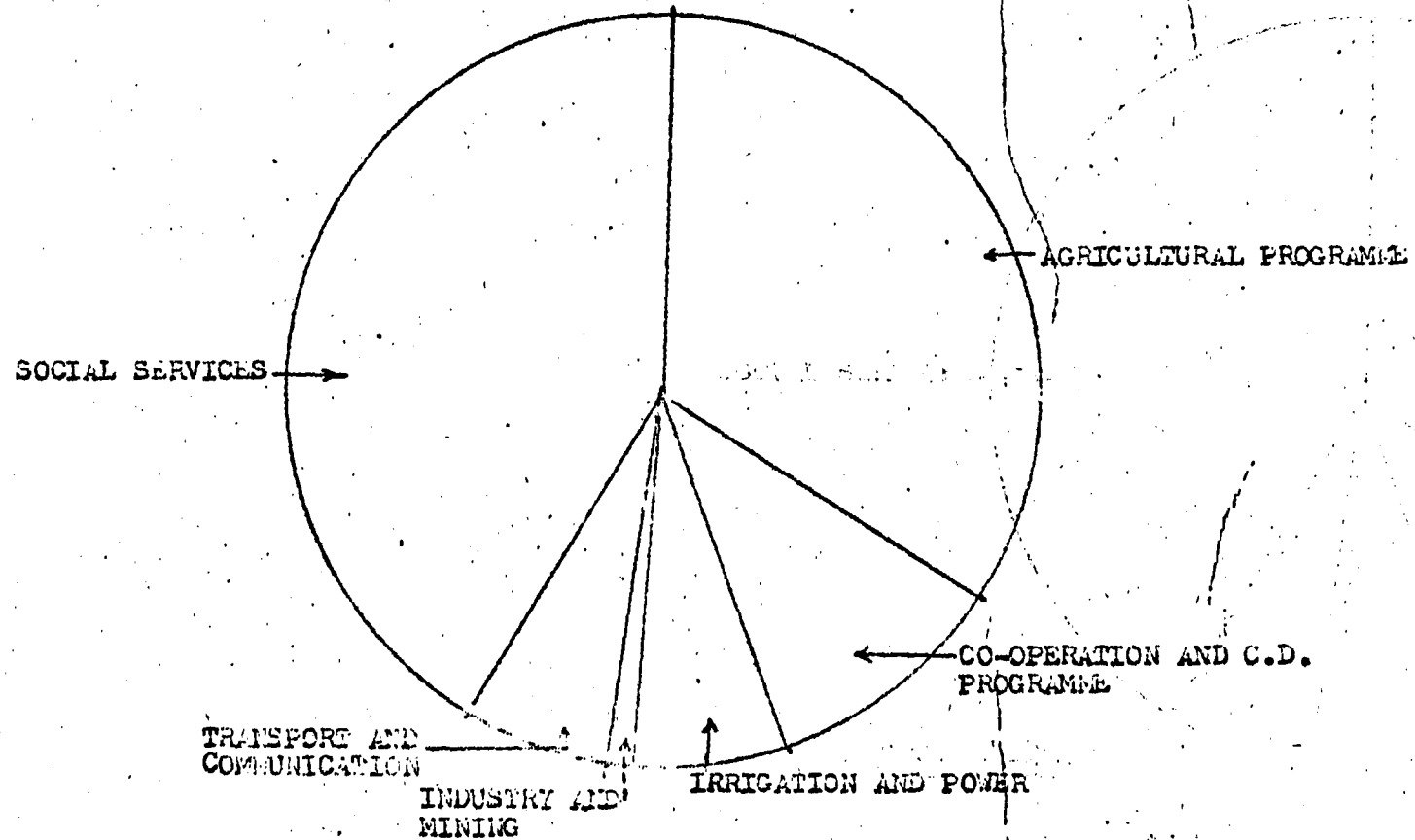
