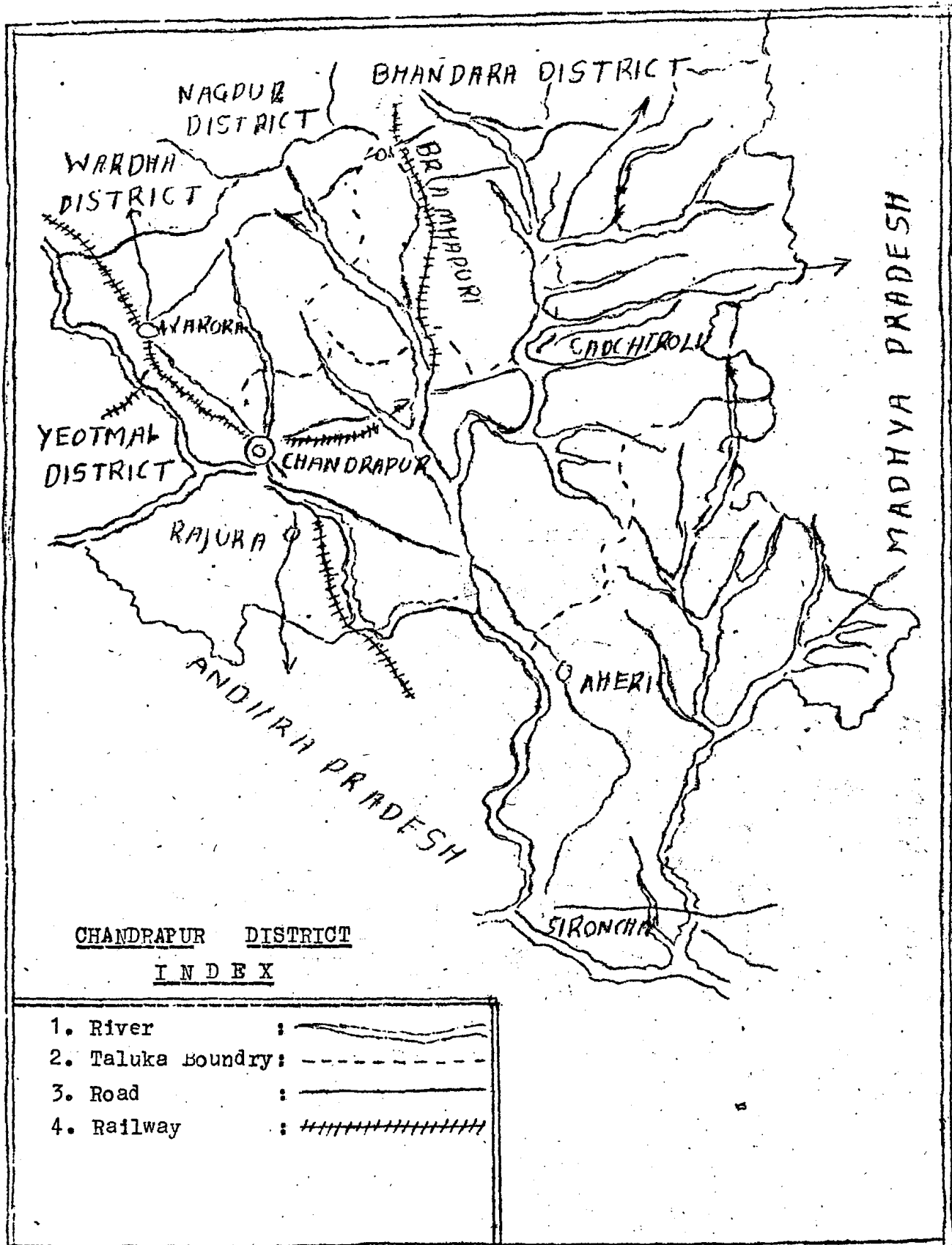

CHAPTER - I

1. Introduction :

1.1 Brief History and Location.

Chandrapur district forming part of the Kingdom of Raghuji Bhonsle was finally annexed by the East India Company in 1854. The Bhonsle dynasty had acquired the district from the Gond Kings and ruled the territory from 1751 to 1853 when Raghuji Bhonsle died heirless in 1853 and Nagpur district was created for administrative purposes by the Company. Prior to the reign of Bhonsle dynasty, the District was under the rule of the Gond King from about 1240 to 1751. The Gond King Ballarshah founded the Chanda fort. The early history of Chandrapur district, prior to the rule of the Gond Kings, has to be pieced together from different inscriptions found in the district. The Gond Kings occupied this territory from Mana Kings of Wairagarh. Earlier to Manas, Buddhist Kings known as Kosala Kings were ruling over this part whose capital, according to the source was Chandrapur and from other source was at Bhadrawati and Wairagarh. However, it is in connection with Kosalas that we arrive at the first authentic historical record in the history about the

district. Heium, Tsiang, the Chinese pilgrim records that ^{he visited} the/capital of Kosalas in 639 A.D. It is also conjectured that a Strong Kingdom rule in the early days at Bhadrawati with flourishing civilisation existing there.

Chandrapur district lies in the Godawari basin and was formed as an independent district in 1854. Up to 1874 the district comprised only of three Tahsils of Mul, Warora and Bramhapuri. In 1874 upper Godawari district of Madras was abolished and four talukas were adjoined to Chandrapur District to form one tahsil with Sironcha as its headquarters. The Zamindari estates from Bramhapuri and Chandrapur were merged in to a new Tahsil with headquarter at Gadchiroli In 1907, three tahsils of Cherala, Albaka and Nagpur were transferred to Madras State.

In 1956 with the reorganisation of States, the district was transferred from former Madhapradesh to Bilingual Bombay State. At Present it is a part of Nagpur Division of Maharashtra State Since 1 st May, 1960.

In March 1959, Rajura tahsil of Nanded District was transferred to Chandrapur district and

It was notified as an independent district and division under the Collector, Chandrapur and the Commissioner, Nagpur division, Nagpur respectively. Now Rajura has become a tahsil of Chandrapur district under the Collector, Chandrapur and its connection with Aurangabad Division is completely revoked.

The District with a population comprising of the Marathas, Telugu and Gonds is of peculiar interest from linguistic and anthropological points of view. It has also many other claims to distinction. In mineral wealth it is remarkably rich, as it possesses vast Forests and its area under Govt. Forest is bigger than the entire area a few other districts in Maharashtra.

Its system of Agriculture is usually varying and in some respects unique in the Division. The system of irrigation is very extensive and its sporting possibilities, though no longer what they were in the past, are still unsurpassed in few parts of the country.

The district lies between $18^{\circ}.41'$ and $20^{\circ}.50'$ north latitudes and $78^{\circ}.48'$ and $80^{\circ}.55'$ east longitudes.

1.2. Boundaries.

Chandrapur district is bounded by Wardha, Nagpur and Bhandara districts on the north, Madhya Pradesh on the east, Andhra Pradesh on the South and South West, Yeotmal and Wardha districts towards the West and North-west. The whole of the Western and Southern border is uninterruptedly bounded by the Wardha, the Pranhita and Godawari rivers. The Indrawati river flows along south east boundary of the district.

1.3 Administrative Set-up.

The Wainganga river cuts the district into two halves. The eastern portion comprises of Sironcha and Gadchiroli talukas, which are in terms of area, two largest talukas in the State, occupying together 59.1 % of the total area of the district. The Western portion consists of four talukas of Bramapuri, Chandrapur, Rajura and Warora and accounts for the remaining 40.9 % of the area of the district. Administratively the district is presently divided into six talukas or Revenue Divisions. The area, number of towns, Population and the percentage of area and population of each taluka are shown in the following table, as per 1971 Census.

1.4 Area :

Chandrapur district has a total area of 25641 Sq. Kilometres (10088.3 Sq.Miles). The length at the northern extremity from east to west is about 192 Kms. While the length from southern point to the northern base is about 240 Kms. In term of area, the district is the biggest in the whole of Maharashtra State and second biggest in India as stands next to Baster of Madhya Pradesh.

1.5 Topography :

The district is broader on the north and gradually tapers down towards the south. Topographically the district can be divided into the following four Zones:-

1). The plain fertile region in the west of the Wardha valley with its rich black soil and moderate rainfall with Cotton, Jowar and Wheat as the main crop covers western half of Warora, Chandrapur talukas and the whole of Rajura taluka and accounts for about one sixth of the total area of the district.

2). The Western upland hilly region lies between Wardha and Wainganga basin. It comprises of part of Warora and Chandrapur talukas and major part of Bramhapuri taluka. It has sandy soil and sufficient rainfall. Rice, Jowar and irrigated sugarcane are the main crops. Numbers hills have facilitated the contraction of irrigation tanks for irrigation purpose. This Zone makes about one Sixth of the area of the district.

3) The Wainganga basins- This Zone comprises of the eastern parts of Bramhapuri and Chandrapur Talukas and western part of Gadchiroli taluka. It has the fertile black Soil, Sufficient

rainfall, rice being the main crop.

4). The Eastern upland - This region comprises of major part of Gadchiroli taluka, and the whole of Sironcha taluka. It has hilly area with thick forests, heavy rainfall and large tribal population. Rice is the main crop. It makes nearly half of the total area of the district.

1.5 Hills, Rivers and Soil.

The whole of eastern portion of the district and the southern portion all along the eastern border is hilly & forms part of the eastern upland natural zone. The important hill ranges lie in the south. They are mainly Tipagarh Range, the Sironcha range near Sironcha, the Gadulgatta hills and the Surajagarh hills. To the South-west of Surjagarh hills beyond Indrawati river lies the famous Bhama-ragarh hills which overlook confluence of three mountain rivers and noted as unrivalled beauty spot in the district.

The Tipagarh range rises to an elevation of 609 metres and Sirkonda range is 548 metres above sealevel. The other hill ranges in Sironcha taluka attain a height of 609 to 914 metres. The highest peak in the district is in the Gadulgatta ranges i.e. 967 metres.

The Western upland comprises of the main ranges of Chimur and Mul hills. They are of little height while serve as watersheds of the Wardha and the Wainganga rivers. The Chimur hills commence east of Chimur in the north of Warora taluka and stretch southwards with breaks from next norths to south with an average elevation of 137 metres above the surrounding plain. The range is 32 Kilometres in length and 9.6 Kilometres in breadth. The highest peak is of 409 metres.

The Mul hills run east and parallel to Chimur hills and form a boundary between Warora and Bramhapuri tahsils.

The general height of the plain country in district is about 274 metres above sea level in the north falling to 200 metres at Chanda and 649.6 metres at Sironcha.

The main rivers of the district are the Wainganga, the Wardha, the Pranhita, the Indrawati and the Godavari. During its course in the south easternly direction, the Wardha river receives the Wainganga at Village Seoni on the right bank and the Barai on the left. After the confluence with the

Wainganga, the combined stream is known as the Pranhita. The Pranhita join the Godavari near Sironcha. The Indravati flows into the Godavari along with the south-east boundary of the District.

The Wainganga enters the district near the centre of the northern boundary and slices the district into two unequal parts. The Wainganga is the recipient of numerous tributaries on either banks and ultimately receives the drainage of the entire Central portion of the district. The main rivers flowing from north to south are the Kathani and the Potphodi meeting from the left and the Andhari on the right.

The Wardha, the Pranhita and the Godavari are the perennial rivers of the District.

The Soil of the district falls into clearly defined tracts and each of these tracts display cropping pattern of wholly different kind. The most fertile tracts are found in the wardha and the Wainganga valleys. The varieties of soil in the district are numerous and are known by many local names which could be grouped under the representative classes viz. Kali, Kanhar, Barshi-Kanhar, Morand, Khurdi, Wardi, Retari or bardi, Pandhari and Kachhar

which is found in Sironcha taluka along the banks of Godavari. The soil of the district falls into different kinds from that of its immediate neighbours.

On the extreme West, on the left bank of the Wardha and the Godavari, there is a broad strip of black Soil known as Kali which is retentive of moisture and suitable for cotton, wheat, gram, jowar and linseed. Further, in the interior but immediately adjoining this open tract, there is a range of Small hills with poor soil at their feet and in the intervening strips. This soil is of little use without irrigation.

It is an ideal soil for rice and sugarcane. Further eastwards and on the either bank of river Wainganga, the black loam reappears and is accompanied by few rice growing villages.

Towards the east of Wainganga valley, the soil becomes poor and hills are abundant. Rice is the staple crop of this tract.

1.6 Climate, temperature and Rainfall:-

Chandrapur district is considered to be one of the hottest district of Maharashtra. Chandrapur district head-quarter is slightly hot than Nagpur city. The highest temperature on record is

48.4 degrees centigrades on 18th May, 1897. The nights are uncomfortable in the months of May and June which are considered to be the hottest months of year. The immense heat combined with high percentage of humidity due to the large forests in the district makes the climate uncomfortable. The nights are cool upto the end of April. Winter is equally severe. The lowest temperature on record is 2.8 degrees centigrades as recorded on 10th January, 1899.

Generally, May is the hottest month of the year. The temperature recording is done at Chandrapur, Bramhapuri and Sironcha. The highest temperature recorded during the year respectively 1980 at all these three centres was 46.5, 46.3 and 47.1 centigrades. The minimum temperature recorded during 1980 at these 3 centres was 8.6°, 9.0°, and 11.2° centigrades respectively. Winter is more severe in December.

The south western monsoons are the chief source of rains in the district which is divided into three rainfall Zones viz:-

(1) The eastern Zone comprising of Gadchiroli, Sironcha and Bramhapuri talukas having heavy and assured rainfall, the mean rainfall being about 1524 millimetres or 60 inches.

(2) The central Zone comprising of Chandrapur and Rajura talukas with sufficient rains having normal rainfall 1302 milimetres or 50 inches.

(3) The western Zone comprising of Warora taluka having moderate rainfall with normal rainfall 1143 milimetres or 45 inches.

The monthwise rainfall at six centres of taluka headquarters during the year 1980 is indicated in table No. 8.

1.8 The Development of the District :

Chandrapur is one of the 13 districts declared as industrially backward in Maharashtra State by the Central Government. Though this district is well known for its Vastness, rich forest mineral resources and endowed with rich soil, water, favourable climatic conditions, adequate man power and density of population it is predominantly a back ward area with low income and high unemployment. However the Ballarpur paper industries, Ballarpur, Associated cement factory, Ghugus, Elcetrosmelt and various coal mines around Chandrapur City, Thermal power station at Durgapur and few other factories are absorbing the manpower as well as mineral resources of this district. Apart from this, Larson & Tubro,

Hariganga cement projects are being setup at Gadchandur in Rajura taluka while one super Thermal Power station is under consideration either at Sasti (Rajura) or Bhadrawati.

The State and Central Government also some other agencies in the engineering, Technology and Economic fields initiated special efforts in this direction for upliftment of Economic conditions of the district.

C H A P T E R - II

(Explanatory notes on the scope and limitations of the Statistical Data Presented in the Part II of District Statistical Abstract.)

I. Purpose :- The abstract part of this publication gives exhaustive statistical data on important socio Economic indicators of development. Tables on almost all important topics are presented in this part, so that the publication could serve as a reference book. Talukewise data have been displayed as far as possible for inter taluka comparison. ^{Samitiwise} Panchayat/ data has also been presented wherever possible, in the tables of abstract. In most of the tables data for 1980-81 has been indicated while for few tables comparative data for 1979-80 or even for earlier years are given. In the tables wherein data for 80-81 could not be presented, the same for the latest years, for which that was available has been shown. In case of population census and livestock census, the data for latest census have been presented. All the data has been collected from the State and Central Government Offices, Local Bodies and other relevant agencies. The footnotes below each table indicate the sources from which the

data have been collected.

II. District at a Glance :- This table presents a bird's eyeview on the Socio Economic Indicators of development in Chandrapur district and Maharashtra State under different heads, such as area, Population agriculture, animal husbandry, education, transport & communication, plan and C.D. Programme, local bodies and other miscellaneous statistics. Reference years of the data are also indicated in the table.

III. Concepts, Scope and Limitations :- The Statistical tables presented in the District Statistical Abstract are grouped into 13 parts. The Contents of the tables and the scope and limitations of the data presented under each group are explained below.

1. Area and Population :

In all 7 Tables i. e. Table No. 1 to 7 are included in this section. Data for 1971 population Census for the district as a whole as made available from the primary Census Abstract of 1971 is given in all the tables except table No. 2 wherein data for 1951 and 1961 censuses has been shown with , decadal percentage variations. Reference period of 1971 population census was sunrise of 1st April, 1971.

The Table No. 1 indicates area in sq. Km. population density per sq km; Number of inhabited and uninhabited villages, Number of towns, Number of occupied residential houses, number of households and sexwise population as per 1971 census for the rural and urban areas for the district as a whole. The area of the district as supplied by the surveyor General of India is less than the area of 1961 census and is, therefore, to be treated as provisional.

The term village (i.e. rural area) used in the table denotes a statutory recognised village having a well defined boundary and separate land records, Hamlets, padis or padas have, therefore, not been shown separately as villages. On the other hand, statutory recognised villages having no population have been shown separately as "Un-inhabited" villages. Villages also includes forest villages comprising mostly of Forest Labourers and their families. Total population of the villages in each range is also indicated in the table.

For any place to be recognised as an urban area (town) for the 1971 census, it was to have a municipal corporation or an area under a municipal council or a

cantenment or a civil line. If it did not have any of these urban local/bodies to administer its affairs, the following empirical tests were applied; a) Minimum population of 5,000 (Estimated for 1971) b) density of not less than 400 per Km², (1,000 per sq. mile); c) 75 percent of the male working population pursuing occupations falling outside agriculture ; d) the place should have according to the Director of Census Operations of the State, a few pronounced urban characteristics and amenities.

The towns having municipalities are suffixed with letter 'M' whereas the urban areas without municipalities are not suffixed with any letter.

Table No. 2 shows decadal variations in population of the distt. since 1951. Table No. 3 gives Classification of inhabited villages according to different population ranges Table. No. 4 gives Classification of towns according to different population ranges Total population of the towns and urban area in each range is also indicated.

Table No. 5 gives number of workers and non-workers in Chandrapur district according to standard livelihood classes separately for rural and urban areas and for the district as a whole. The concept of dependency has been abandoned for economic classification in the

1971 census. The emphasis is now on work and not on income or economic dependence. A person is defined as worker if a) In case of seasonal work like cultivation, live-stock dairying, household industry etc, he has had some regular work of more than one hour a day throughout the greater part of the working season and b) In case of regular employment in any trade, profession, service, business or commerce he was employed during any of the seven days preceding the day of the enumerator's visit to the household and the work has been returned as his main activity. The person like beggars, pensioners, agriculture or non-agriculture royalty, rent or dividend receivers etc. Who earn an income, but who are not participating in any productive work in any occupation, have been classified as non workers.

Table No. 6 gives distribution of population according to A) Age groups and B) Religion, Separately for Rural & Urban areas, and for the district as a whole as per 1971 census.

Table No. 7 gives scheduled castes and Scheduled tribes population in rural and urban areas in the

district according to 1971 census.

2. Climates :

Only two tables are included in this section pertaining to rain fall and temperature at the selected centres in Chandrapur district.

The table No. 8 gives monthly rainfall and number of rainy days in each month at the selected centres for the year 1980. The data is collected through Revenue Agency. A day is treated as 'Rainy day' if during 24 hours, the rain gauge recorded a minimum of 2.5 M.M. of rainfall. Annual rainfall for each centre is also indicated in the table. 'Normal rainfall' is the average rainfall over a period of 10 years,

Table No. 9 gives monthwise 'Maximum' and 'Minimum' & also annual temperature as recorded at the selected centres for the 1980. The data is supplied by the Government of India's Regional Meteorological Centre Nagpur.

3. Agriculture :

In all 14 tables i.e. Table No. 10 to 23 are included in this section.

Table No. 10 indicates talukewise figures of land utilisation under the standard heads of land uses for the years 1977-78, 1978-79 and 1979-80.

Against each taluka the break up of the total geographical area according to different types of land uses is shown. Major constituents of the geographical area are forest, area not available for cultivation, land put to non agricultural uses, barren and uncultivable land- Culturable waste, permanent pastures and other grazing lands, lands under miscellaneous trees crops etc. not included in area sown, fallow land i.e. current fallows, other fallows and lastly net area sown. Area under forest included all actual forest areas of lands classed or administered as forest under any legal enactment dealing with forests whether state owned or private. If any portion of such land is not actually wooded but put to some agricultural use, that portion is included under the appropriate heading of cultivated or uncultivated land as the case may be. Land put to non- agricultural uses stands for all lands occupied by building, roads and railways or under water e.g. rivers and canals and other purposes land put to uses. Other than agriculture/Barren and unculturable land covers all barren and unculturable land like mountains deserts etc. Land which can not be brought under cultivation unless at a high cost is classified as "barren and unculturable" Land, whether such land is in isolated blocks or within cultivated

holdings. Culturable waste includes all lands available for cultivation whether are not taken up for cultivation or taken up for cultivation once, but not cultivated during the current year and last five years and more in succession. Such lands may be either fallow or covered with shrubs and jungles which are not put to any use. They may be assessed or not assessed and may lie in isolated blocks or within cultivated holdings. Permanent pastures and other grazings lands cover all grazing lands whether they are permanent pastures and meadows or not. Village common and grazing lands within forest areas are included under this head. Land under miscellaneous tree crops etc. not included in the net area sown include all cultivable land, which is not included under net area sown, but is put to some agricultural use. Land under casurina trees, thatching grass, bamboo bushes and other for fuel etc. which are not included under Orchards are classed under this category. Current fallow comprises of cropped areas, which are kept fallow during the current year. Other fallow land included all lands which were taken up for cultivation, but are temporarily out of cultivation for a period of not less than one year and not more than five years.

The net area sown consists of net area sown with crops and orchards, area sown more than once being counted only once.. The gross cropped area represents the sum total of area under all crops, The difference between the total gross cropped area and net area sown is accounted for by the area sown more than once during the same year with the same or different crops.

The table No. 12 gives the data relating ^{to} yield per hectare and outturn in hundred metric tonnes for important crops for the years 1977-78, 1978-79, 79-80. The yield rates and outturn are worked out on the revised forecast. The production of sugarcane is in terms of gur while cotton production is in term of bales of 180 kgs. each .

Data about availability of under ground water in the district is presented in table. No. 16 , Table No. 17 gives the information about Minor Irrigation while Table No. 18 gives the information on Major and Medium Irrigation Projects in the district. Both completed and incomplete projects have been covered in this table. Position in this table is as it was on 30 th June 1980. The cultured command area of medium projects ranges between 7000 to 10,000 hectares where as that of Major Irrigation project it is 10,000 hect-

ares and above. The cost of medium irrigation project ranges between Rs. 20 lakhs to 5 crores and that of a major irrigation project is 5 crores and above.

Table No. 19 deals with monthly agricultural wages rates in 1980. This data is collected fortnightly throughout the year from three selected rural centres viz. 1) Sindewahi 2) Muli 3) Kothari, in Chandrapur district.

Table No. 20 gives information about operational holdings as per Agricultural Census 1976.

Table No. 21 provides livestock data as per livestock census 1978. Table No. 22 provides famine and scarcity data in each taluka giving the no. of villages affected during the year 1980-81. The data in table No. 23 is related to Agriculture year-^{wise} data in Table No. 22 is for financial year, hence villages affected as given in table No. 22 will not tally with table No. 23.

4. Animal Husbandry Forest and Fisheries :

In all six tables i.e. table No. 24 to 29 are included in this section. Table No. 24 to 27 provides panchayat Samitiwise data.

Table No. 24 gives number of various types of livestock and poultry as enumerated in the district in the Livestock census 1978. Table No. 25 provides

veterinary statistics during 1980-81. Table No. 26 gives information about livestock mortality, disease-wise during 1980-81 while table 27 gives information about no. of slaughter houses and no. of animals slaughtered during 1980-81.

Table No. 28 (A) gives details of area under different types of forests during the year 1980-81. Data regarding forests under the control of state Government's Forest Department and those under the control of state Govts. Revenue Deptt. are shown separately. The areas under forests are classified according to legal status into reserved, protected and unclassified forests. The legal status refers to the classification of forest under the Indian Forest Act, XVI of 1927. Reserved forests are those that are intended mainly for timber production, wherein the rights of grazing and cultivation are seldom allowed.

In protected forests, the restrictions are not so rigid. Rights of grazing or cultivation is allowed but certain limitations & restrictions are imposed.

The unclassified forest refer to the inaccessible forest or unoccupied waste. The forests which are taken up by Govt. from local bodies or private individuals for management on lease basis are called leased forests.

There is no classification of Ex-proprietary forests as such but in Nagpur Division some private lands containing valuable forests are taken over by Govt. under section 29 of the Indian Forest Act, which are not yet classified as per tripartite classification and they are termed as expropriatory. The forest area shown in table No. 28(A) may not tally with the area under forest shown in table No. 10. The two sets of figures differ due to the following reasons.

i) In the Indian Forest Statistical Returns, the whole area including now-wooden area under the control of the forest Department is taken as area under forests, while in agricultural statistics it is classified according to its actual utilisation.

ii) The forest department returns are meant to serve a definite administrative purposes to indicate the ownership of the forest areas and the actual utilization of these areas is not so important from the point of view of Forest Department as it is in the land utilisation statistics under agriculture statistics.

iii) The Forest Department returns relate to financial year while the agricultural statistics relate to the agricultural year.

Table No. 29 (1) in this section gives information related to Inland Fisheries, and provides data about fish production.

5. Employment, Industry, Mining and Electricity.

In all 10 tables i.e. table No. 30 to 39 are included in this section.

The factory statistics shown in Table No. 30, 31 & 32 cover following types of factories registered under the Factories Act 1948.

i) Those employing ten or more workers with the aid of power (section 2 (i)

ii) Those employing twenty or more workers and working without the aid of power (Section 2 (ii)

(3) Those registered under section 85 of the Act, under which the state Government make applicable the provision of the Act, even though the above conditions are not fulfilled. However, statistics of the domestic factories are excluded.

Table No. 33 provides information based on Annual survey of Industries. Table No. 34 regarding Employment Exchange Statistics gives information relating to No. of Registration, vacancies, Employers using exchange and candidates placed in employment. Table No. 35 gives occupational distribution of total

registrations and placements in the Employment Exchange for the year 1980-81 and according to standard National classification,

Table No. 36 provides works undertaken in Employment Guarantee scheme during 1980-81.

6. Co-Operation :

In all 8 tables i.e table No. 40 to 47 are included in this section.

Table No. 42 gives panchayat Samitewise number of primary Agricultural Credit Societies, their membership share capital, reserve, loans outstanding and overdue and percentage of recovery to total loan advanced for the year 1980-81. "Working Capital" includes paid up share capital, deposits and borrowings, loans outstanding include outstanding in respect of lock cash credits and overdrafts and the amount of outstanding bills purchased or discounted. Overdues referred to amount of loan or instalments which were not actually collected and for the repayment of which no extension has been granted by a competent authority.

The table No. 47 gives panchayat samitewise number of Registered Money lenders and loans advanced by them during 1980-81. The separate figures of loans

advanced to traders and non-traders have been furnished in the table. The transactions of money lending in the state are regulated under the provisions of Bombay Money Lenders Act. According to the Act, no money lender shall carry on the business of money lending except in the area for which he has been granted licence and except in accordance with terms & conditions of such licence. The information for loans advanced to traders and non traders relates to those money lenders who have submitted the returns.

7. Medical and Public Health :

In all 5 tables i.e. Table No. 48 to 52 are included in this section.

Table No. 48 given in this section indicates panchayat samitiwise number of hospitals, dispensaries, maternity homes and P.H. Cs doctors, nurses, viidyas, beds and total no. of indoor and outdoor patients treated for the year 1980. The table covers all the State and Central Govt. medical institutions and also the institutions owned by municipalities and local bodies engaged in providing medical facilities. Private Clinics run by private bodies or individuals are however, not included in

this table.

The Table No. 49 provides Vital Statistics about number of registered births and deaths in the district during 1980 Table No. 52 relates to Family planning programme for the year 1980-81 in this district.

8. Education;

In all 7 tables i.e. table No. 53 to 59 are included in this section. Table No. 53 gives sexwise number of literates & percentage of literacy separately for rural and urban areas and for males and females. As per 1971 Census definition, a person was classified as a literate if he was able to read or write a simple letter in any language. Education level in rural and urban areas are shown in Table No. 54 and 55 separately according to 1961 census as this data for 1971 census is not yet available.

Table No. 56 gives information regarding no. of educational institutions according to types for the year 1979-80 & 1980-81 (Provisional) Sexwise enrolment and no. of trained & untrained teachers in these institutions, is also included in this table. The classification of institutions according to type is slightly different from stage of education. There are at present many secondary schools, which also impart education in primary

course. Nevertheless, the entire enrolment of students is included under secondary education. Primary institutions provide education for standard I to IV or standard I to VII /VIII or less and teach the curriculum approved by the Education Department. The secondary institutions coach the students for standard VIII to X/ XII with or without lower standards. Higher Education is education after passing secondary school certificate examination, which leads to a Degree Examination.

The Table No. 57 presents data on the no. of beneficiaries amongst backward classes such as S C/S T and other backward classes for the year 1979-80 and 1980-81. Beneficiaries for this table are persons who are getting educational concessions of either type such as scholarships, freships etc. Table No. 58 presents data on concessions to the economically backward classes. The concessions of free education and amount incurred is given in this table for the year 1980-81 under the category of economically backward students whose parents/Guardians Income is less than Rs. 8500 are covered.

9. Transport and Communication :

In all 7 tables i.e. table no. 60 to 66 are included in this section.

Table No. 60 gives total railway length as at the end of March 1981 according to type of routes, Broad Gauge, Meter Gauge and Narrow Gauge. The Railway length is measured between the first and the last stations within the district boundary. The figures of length of each type of route are, therefore, approximate and not accurate.

The table No. 63 deals with operational statistics of Nationalised Road Transport in Chandrapur S.T. Division.

The table No. 64 presents the results of the traffic census of important roads conducted by Building and Communication Department, Government of Maharashtra. Data on the number of vehicles is according to categories and location of count. Posts. Type of surface and total traffic intensity in vehicles per 24 hours are also indicated in the tables.

10. Local Bodies :

In all 4 tables i.e. table No 67 to 70 are included in this section.

The table No 67 gives abstract of income and expenditure of local bodies such as village panchayats, Zilla parishad and Municipal Councils for the financial years 1965-66 and 1968-69 to 1980-81. The number of

village panchayats includes number of individual village panchayats as well as group village panchayats.

11. Plan and Community Development :

In all 5 tables i.e. table No 71 to 75 are included in this section.

The table No 71 gives plan expenditure under different development heads and sub heads during 1979-80 and 1980-81. Similarly table No. 72 provides important physical achievements during 1979-80 and 1980-81.

12. Prices :

In all 3 tables viz. table No 76 to 78 are included in this section.

Table No. 76 gives monthly spot of wholesale prices of the important agricultural commodities for the year 1980 for each of the regulated markets.

Table No. 77 gives monthly average retail prices of various commodities at district ^{head} quarters, Chandernagur. The average prices under each commodity are shown from the month of January to December for the year 1980 along with units and varieties, of commodities for which prices have been quoted. The data is regularly collected on every Friday by visit to selected shops, by The District Statistical Office, as the information collected for the given commodities is restricted to

only one quotation and that too only from one shop at District Head quarters, the average price for individual commodity cannot be said to be fully representative, but the data may prove useful as a good indicator of the trend in changes in retail prices over the period of time.

Table No. 78 gives consumer price Index number (Revised series) for working class of Nagpur centre, published by the office of the Commissioner of Labour, Bombay. Monthwise data for the year 1980-81 commencing from April and also average for the year 1979-80 & 1980-81 have been given in this table. The base year for calculating price Index (Revised Series) is 1960. The Index Number of wholesale prices are issued by the Economic Advisor to the Government of India. The base year for the same is 1961-62. The method of construction of the index is given in the appendix B.

Index Numbers of wholesale prices in India, Revised Series, 1961-62 issued by the office of the Economic Advisor Govt. of India. The equivalent of old Index numbers can be obtained by multiplying the new Index by 5.22 as multiplier.

13. Miscellaneous :

In all 15 tables viz. table no 79 to 93 are included in this section.

uded in this section.

Table No. 82 gives panchayat Samitiwise cinema statistics for the year 1980-81. Number of permanent semi-permanent & touring talkies and the seating capacity per show has been indicated in this table.

Table No. 84 provides data on no. of banking offices, deposits and advances in the district as on 31 st December 1980.

Table No. 90, 91 and 92 are three new tables included in this abstract from the year 1976-77. Table No. 90 and 91 provides data on quantity of Rice, Wheat and Sugar issued to Fair Price shops and Demand and procurement of Levy in Chandrapur district respectively. Similarly table No. 92 provides data on General Elections.

Table No. 93 profiles Trends in selected Indicators for 1950-51, 1960-61, 1966-67 and 1970-71, 1974-75, 1977-78, 1978-79, 1979-80 and 1980-81 in Chandrapur district.

Chapter - IIIImportant Indicators of Development

1. In this Chapter an attempt has been made to present specific important indicators of development by presenting certain selected trends to enlighten and evaluate the impact of development & disparity, if any, between talukas. The various indicators worked out show the comparative position of the year 1960-61, the year before the commencement of the third plan, 1970-71 the year after the end of third plan and the year 1979-80 or 1980-81 in few cases where the data for the year 1980-81 is available.

1. Agriculture percentage of gross area sown to net area sown

The proportion of gross area sown to net area sown indicates the extent of area sown more than once. Taking of double crop solely depends upon the availability of irrigation facilities and the capacity of soil to retain sufficient moisture in the paddy fields, after monsoon to enable the cultivators to take second crop. The Crop, in general, is locally known as 'Utera' and mostly sown by broadcasting method. The district is having large number of small size tanks which are locally known as bodies. However most of these bodies are just sufficient to irrigate the paddy crop.

in kharif season. Double irrigated crop is rarely taken and that too in the area where the canal irrigation is available. Second crop is generally taken where the minimum irrigation is required and where the soil retains sufficient moisture in the field. Tehsilwise comparative percentages of gross area sown to net area sown in Chandrapur district during the year 1960-61, 1970-71 and 1979-80 are given in the following table.

It can be seen from the above table that there is no improvement in taking second crop since last nineteen years, but there is decreasing trend over the year 1970-71 in all the tehsils except Chandrapur. The percentage of gross cropped area to net area sown is higher than the district average in Chandrapur, Bramhapuri and Gadchiroli

tahsils. Though the Gadchiroli and Sironcha tahsils and Considerably more area of Rajura tahsil is paddy growing track the double cropping appears to be not practiced.

Change in Cropping pattern.

The following table will broadly indicate the trend of cropping pattern in the district during the year 1960-61, 1970-71 & 1979-80.

From the above table it is clear that the area under Nonfood crops has increased considerably in the year 1970-71 and 1979-80 as compared to the year 1960-61. The area under Rice, Cotton, Oilseeds and Nonfood crops

show slight increase over the year 1960-61 and 1970-71, where as the area under Jowar, Wheat, Total Cereals, Total Pulses and Total Food- grains are found to have been decreased as compared to the year 1960-61 and 1970-71.

Yield rate and out turn of Principal Crops

Though agriculture is the most important activity of the nation and about 80% population depends on agriculture, it is the least productive activity, because it depends upon the various factors such as natural conditions, irrigation facilities, soil etc. Chandrapur district is mainly paddy growing district. The following table gives details of Cropwise Yield rate and out turn for the year 1960-61, 1970-71 & 1979-80.

It can be seen from the above table that the yield rates of Wheat, Jowar, Maize, Ground nut and Cotton have increased and the yield rates of Rice, Gram, Tur and Sugar cane have decreased during the year 1979-80, as compared to the year 1970-71. Similarly the out turn of Rice, Wheat, Jowar, Maize, Gram, Ground nut and Cotton are increased. However there is decrease in the out turn of Tur and Sugar cane during the year 1979-80. The out turn of Jowar during 1979-80 is next to Rice. Percentage of net area Irrigated to net area sown.

The paddy, being the main crop of the district, irrigation to this crop and even other crops in some part of the district is adopted as a protective measure after monsoon season is over. The following table shows the year wise percentage of net area irrigated to net area sown, which is decreased in the year 1979-80 by 2.27% as compared to the year 1970-71.

Net area irrigated by different sources:

It will be seen from the above table that though the number of member is increased during the year 1980-81 as compared to the 1979-80 , there is no change in the number of primary Agricultural Credit societies. The figures of loans overdues shows the tendency people not to repay the Govt. loans and this may be one of the

seve reasons of decrease in the primary Agricultural Societies.

3. WAGE RATE :

There is a considerable increase in the Agriculture wage rates during the year 1980-81 . The average daily wages paid ^{to} male field labour and female field

labour during 1979-80 were Rs. 4/- & Rs. 3/- respectively

where as the average daily wages paid to male and

respectively. It means that the Agricultural wage rates

have been increased by 50 percent , during 1980-81 as

compared to 79-80.

Livestock per hectares of Cultivable land is found to be higher in Sironcha, Gadchiroli & Bramhapuri talukas, than the district average. The reasons for higher ratio are that (1) the talukas, Sironcha, Gadchiroli & Bramhapuri are mainly paddy growing, where the requirement of draught animals is generally higher than other talukas and (2) the percentage of cultivable area is comparatively much less because of the major area covered under forest.

Increase in number of candidates enrolled in Employment Exchange.

The media of employment exchanges is being utilised both by employment seekers as well as employers. Due to increase in number of educated persons and various employ-

ment, avenues, though comparatively less than the educated persons created in the development process, the number of registrations have been increased after 1970-71 but unfortunately the percentage of placement to Registration is considerably decreased. The comparative figures of registrations, Vacancies notified and placement are depicted in the following table.

Thus it can be seen that percentage increase in number of Registration is very high over 1960-61 and also 1970-71 level. Similarly corresponding percentage increase in number of vacancies notified is also increased as compared to the year 1960-61 or 1970-71 but

UNfortunately the percentage of placement to registration is tremendously decreased after 1977-78. The main reason behind this seems that the vacancies are not adequate to accommodate the educated unemployed.

6. Consumption of Electricity :

There are in all 2840 inhabited villages & 7 towns the district. It can very well be seen from the following table, that the progress relating to electricity in the district as on 1960-61, 1970-71, 1979-80 and 1980 - 81 and also the percentage of villages electrified, i.e. 33.90 is comparatively very less though it has increased considerably during the year 1980-81 as compared to previous years. The talukewise numbers of electrified villages during the year 80-81 is not available with the Maharashtra State Electricity Board, Chandrapur Division and hence it is not given in the table. However the total number of villages electrified as on 198081, as obtained from the source is given. As regards the pumpsets the cultivators are using electric pumps more and more for irrigation instead of oil engines and hence the number of pumps energied during 1980-81 is seen to be increased considerably.

Talukewise per capita consumption can not be given as it is not available with the Maharashtra State Electricity Board, Chandrapur Division. However there is no considerable increase in per capita consumption

during the year 1980-81 as compared to the previous years.

7. Medical facilities

This district has made a significant progress in providing curative and preventive health Services over last two decades. Life expectancy has increased considerably and the death rate has been found to be declined. The achievement has been mainly due to better availability of medical and health facilities in the district as compared to prior of Preindependence period. Following table will throw light upon the health statistics.

8. Education.

Much stress was given to the development of education during plan periods. The primary education was made compulsory during the Third plan. As such tremendous increase in both the number of Institutions and pupils enrolled is noted since 1960-61. Remarkable progress was also noticed in education of Females during the last one decade. The increase in number of female students is firstly due to the availability of educational facilities in the Village itself and change in the traditional outlook of the parents. The comparative figures of the number of institutions and students for the years 1960-61; 1970-71, 1979-80 and 80-81 are given in the following table.

The above table indicates the ratio of Secondary institutions to primary educational institutions and higher educational institutions to secondary educational institutions in part (a) and the ratio of teachers, to pupils in primary, Secondary and higher education in part (b) The ratio of teachers to pupils is showing upward trends in case of primary education and it is near about constant in case of higher education during the year 1979-80 to 1980-81.

9. Banking facilities.

It is seen from the above table that the No. of population served per banking office is decreased from 10970 to 3577 from the year 1960-61 to 1979-80 which show the increasing facilities of banking offices in the district.

10. Roads :

This district is largest one in terms of area in

the Maharashtra state. Though the Govt. is giving much importance to the Rural Roads through Crash programme & Minimum Needs Programme the communication facilities in the district are still very poor. However, as a result of various Road Development programmes implemented during last 10 to 15 years there is a considerable increase in Road Communication facilities in the district. The road length per 100 sq Km. area is seen to be increased from 4.9 Kms. in the year 1960-61 to 21.3 Kms. in the year 1980-81. It means that there is about 370% increase in the road length.

It can be seen from the above table that the prices of Rice & wheat are increasing ^{from the} year 1962-63 to 1980-81. There is also considerable increase in the prices of Arhar dal, Moong dal and Ground nut oil during the year 1979-80 & 1980-81 as compared to the year 1976-77. The prices of Ground nut oil have been increased by about 563 times during the year 1980-81 as compared to the year 1962-63. The prices of all most all the commodities have shown considerable increase in the year 1980-81 over the year 1962-63.

Annual Plan: 1980-81

4.1 (a) Principal of decentralised implementation of Plans :

In accordance with the policy of decentralisation of planning efforts the Govt. of Maharashtra has adopted the principal of district planning since the commencement of the Fifth Five Year Plan 1974-79. In order to maintain the tempo of growth, it is necessary to ensure the participation of a large segment of the population in the development process. In conformity with this objectives, the 5th Plan of the state of Maharashtra seeks to achieve the following.

- 1) Acceleration of the growth rate of state income.
- 2) Promotion of appropriate technologies in agriculture and rural Industries with a view to increase employment opportunities.
- 3) Creating conditions favourable for the most valuable sections of the population in the benefits of the plan.
- 4) A guarantee of employment in manual work to all able bodied adults who are willing to work.
- 5) Provision of basic minimum needs of life to people.

- 6) Removal of imbalances of development between district and areas within districts.

Decentralised implementation of District Plans at District level has been principally followed accordingly. Necessary powers have been delegated to District level officers in order to implement the plan effectively for the benefit of weaker sections.

- b) Adoption of District as a unit of planning during the

fifth plan

During and up to the end of fourth five year plan the progress in the implementation of the plans were reviewed at the district level by advisory committees appointed under Govt. circular, Cooperation and Rural Development Deptt. dated 5th August, 1964 and at the Divisional level by the Divisional Advisory committee constituted under Govt. circular Finance Department, dated 13th December 1965.

Govt. has since decided that the District should be adopt as unit of planning during fifth plan and that perspective five year and annual plans should be formulated for each district so that imbalances in development between districts and the areas within the same district are steadily removed to the extent possible and all the districts are given an opportunity to attain full development having regard to their potential, available manpower and other resources.

The very basic idea about district planning is that every district shall get certain plan allocation worked out on the basis of certain parameters and.

broad cross section of the representatives should have a definite say as to how this allocation should be spent in the best possible way.

C) Objects of District Planning :

The main object of the District planning is to take into account the local resources, manpower, institutional funds and after careful consideration, formulate the District plans in accordance with the requirements of the District and also to solve the various pressing problems of the District on priority basis, wherever required by providing adequate funds to that effect. While formulating the District plan, it is presumed that active public participation is a must, (i.e. people's active Co-operation). It is desired by district planning to achieve the rational utilisation of resources, removal of inter-talimbalances as well as proper coordination and full utilisation on development programmes.

4.2 Organisation of Machinery set-up in the District for formulation, monitoring over-seeing of the District plans :

It has been decided by the Govt. of Maharashtra that there should be a agency or machinery at District level for formulation, monitoring and over seeing of District plans, and accordingly as per Government Resolution , General Administration Department No. GD/SR/1072/1, dated 26 th Oct. 1972. District planning board was constituted. The main function of the district planning Board was to ensure Co-ordinated action by various implementing agencies including the Zilla Parishads and to

give guide lines to the various implementing agencies in formulation & implementation of perspective Five year plans.

a) In the District planning board, there were in all 12 members, out of which ³ were non-officials. To assist the District planning Board a District planning team consisting of Eight members was also constituted where in Collector was appointed as chairman and planning officer as member Secretary.

In order to associate the elected representatives of the people in parliament ^{and} state legislature and the representatives of various interests, such as industries, trade commerce, university and social welfare institutions in the district with the planning process, Govt. under its Resolution No. DDC/1073/P/1.

A) Dated 20.6.73 has ^{set} up a District Development council in each District which would serve as a for ascertaining the views of the people in the matter of development of the district and their needs for periodical review of the District plans.

B) After reviewing the working of the District planning Board and District Development councils, Govt. has taken the decision to associate the elected representatives of the people more directly with the planning process. In view of the above decision, Govt. has decided to amalgamate these planning bodies at the district level with immediate effect under its Resolution No. DDC-1074/p-dated 1-10-74. The function of the district planning and Development council are the same of that of

district planning board, mentioned in para 4.2, (a) above.

To assist the District planning and development councils in the days to day planning and development activities Government in planning Deptt. under the said resolution, has constituted a small Executive Committee of the Council of 9 members, who were also the members of the D. & D.C. . The designated Minister of the district worked as a chairman where as the Dy. C.E.O (Planning) would work as secretary of this small Executive Committee of the D. & D.C. . The Executive committee can meet as often as required but at least once in two months.

C) Organisational set up for D.& D.C. and Executive Committee.

In supersession of all previous orders issued so far, Government in planning Deptt under its Resolution No. D/C/1079/PRG-- dated 21.6.79, has fixed the composition of the D.& D.C. as follows.

On going through the total No. 7 given above, it would be seen that percentage distribution of out-lay to the different heads of development and the percentage of expenditure to the total outlay is approximately same except the expenditure incurred on Employment Guarantee Scheme, covered under the head 'Miscellaneous'. As regards the Tribal Sub-plan, the total expenditure is far more than the outlay provided for the sub-plan, particularly more emphasis is given to constructive schemes such as irrigation, power, agricultural programmes, Social Services and Transportation and Communication.

4.4. The important achievements and expenditure incurred there for in the Annual Plan 1980-81 is summarised below.

4.4(a) AGRICULTURAL AND ALLIED SERVICES :

This programme includes in all 12 different sub-sectors of developments.

(i) Crop Husbandry :- A provision of Rs. 3.61 lakhs was made for crop Husbandry, under Tribal Sub-plan against which the expenditure was Rs. 3.80 lakhs i.e. 105.26%. During the year 7 Gobar Gas plants costing Rs. 0.50 lakhs were installed. The provision of Rs.0.50 lakhs was utilised for providing seed for green manuring and glyricida cutting in 200 hectares, giving incentives for vegetable cultivations to 2250 beneficiaries, and arranging

demonstrations of important cash crops.

Similarly Rs. 1.10 lakhs were sanctioned for Crop Husbandry under Non-tribal programme against which Rs. 1.31 lakhs were utilised. During the year provision of Rs. 0.07 lakhs was utilised for providing seed for green manuring and glyricidya cutting in 100 hectares. Similarly the insecticides and raticides were provided for 3852 hectares amounting to Rs. 0.20 Lakhs.

Apart from above stated achievements, Nitrogenous fertilizers and Dixture fertilizers were distributed in Chandrapur district.

2) Minor Irrigation : Taking in to consideration the role of minor irrigation in agricultural development total provision of Rs. 80.94 lakhs, for both Tribal and Non-tribal areas, was earmarked for minor irrigation in the Annual Plan 1980-81 out of which Rs. 78.92 lakhs is 97.50% were spent. Subsidy was given to 220 irrigation wells including tribal and non-tribal sub-plan. At the same time, in local sector minor irrigation tanks were completed & irrigation potential was created in about 3356 hectares. In state sector the entire provision was utilised for completion on spillover works. An amount of Rs. 6.15 lakhs

earmarked for loans & subsidy were spent on construction of wells and installation of pump sets. In all 519 cultivators i.e. 116 under non-tribal and 403 under tribal plan were benefited during the year.

3) Soil Conservation : In the Annual Plan 1980-81 provision of Rs. 7.75 lakhs for Non-tribal and of Rs. 5.25 lakhs for Tribal Sector was made and the expenditure was incurred to the tune of Rs. 14.83 lakhs and Rs. 11.52 lakhs as against the provision for Non-tribal and Tribal respectively. The expenditure was incurred on terracing work in 744 hectares and bunding work in 645 hectares under Non-tribal & bunding work in 917 hectares under Tribal areas.

4) Ayacut Development : Ayacut development programme is most essential for utilisation of irrigation potential & hence in all Rs. 10.50 lakhs (Rs. 7.84 lakhs in NTS & Rs. 2.66 lakhs in TSP) was earmarked for land development under Ayacut development including field channels in the command areas of Vidium Irrigation projects of Chandrapur district. The provision was utilised on land development works in 217 hectares of non-tribal and 684 hectares of tribal areas and 920 and 710 small cultivators for non-tribal and tribal areas respectively were also covered under wage scheme.

5) Animal Husbandry : Rs. 6.68 lakhs against the provision of Rs. 7.30 lakhs and Rs. 7.93 lakhs against the provision of Rs. 8.02 lakhs was incurred on Animal Husbandry programme under Tribal sub-plan and non-tribal respectively during the year 1980-81. The expenditure was incurred on providing medicines to 30 Vet. institutes (Rs. 1.00 lakhs) under Tribal sub-plan) and 35 Vet. institutions (Rs. 1.00 lakhs) under Non-tribal. Major portion of the provision was utilised for establishing medical teams, centres, construction of buildings and purchase of jeeps for Vet. units.

6) Dairy Development :- One Govt. milk project was established during the 1979-80 in Chandrapur district with 20,000 litres capacity of handling of milk in a day. The project started its functioning on 15 th August 1979. The share of expenditure of non-tribal and tribal sub-plan was Rs. 1.83 lakhs and 12.06 lakhs respectively. Besides, under tribal sub-plan 50 one year old buffaloes and 10 pregnant buffaloes were distributed to tribals for which Rs. 0.26 lakhs and Rs. 0.08 lakhs respectively were spent as against the provision of Rs. 0.64 lakhs and Rs. 0.16 lakhs respectively. Subsidy of Rs. 0.04 lakhs had also been distributed to tribals for improved buffaloes.

7) Fisheries : Rs. 9.69 lakhs were utilised on fish seed production forms in tribal area of this district for production of 60 lakhs fish seed. At the same time 41.54 lakhs finger lings were stocked in tanks. The fish production was 6.51 lakhs in tribal and 6.00 lakhs in non-tribal areas.

Similarly in the Annual Plan 1980-81 Rs. 0.28 lakhs in tribal and Rs. 0.20 lakhs in non-tribal were provided for fisheries development. The major items of expenditure were purchase of accessories including Nylon thread and it's distribution to fishermen.

8) Forest :- No. provision was made for this programme in the Annual p/lan 1980-81 (excluding Tribal Sub-plan)

In the Tribal sub-plan Rs. 10.22 lakhs i.e. 100% were utilised for the programme elimination of contractors by departmental working of cones against the budget provision of Rs. 10.22 lakhs. The remaining whole budget provision was utilised for purchase of trucks, jeeps, tractors and staff there for. The second major item of expenditure was Forest Communication where Rs. 9.23 lakhs were spent on road development programme in forest area. Under the scheme 8 Kms. road, 5 C.D. works and 1 bridge were completed.

4.5 CO-OPERATION :

In the Annual plan 1980-81 (excluding Tribal sub-plan) very negligible provision i.e. only 1.86 lakhs was made for Co-operative sector. The expenditure was of Rs. 1.86 lakhs, which was utilised for providing financial assistance to 5 urban consumer's stores and 8 labour contract societies.

In the Tribal Sub-plan of 1980-81 an amount of Rs. 17.59 lakhs was earmarked for this head of development. Accordingly Rs. 17.59 lakhs were spent on various schemes. The major provision i.e. Rs. 16.82 lakhs was utilised on providing financial assistance to 100 Tribal Co-operative Societies and rest of the balance was spent on providing financial assistance to 7 rural consumer's stores and 5 labour contract societies.

4.6. MEDIUM IRRIGATION AND POWER :

1) Medium Irrigation : There were in all 10 medium irrigation projects in progress during the year 1980-81 in Chandernagour district. The yearwise expenditure incurred on these 10 projects from 1974-75 to 1980-81 is given in the following table.

The above expenditure is inclusive of Tribal Non-tribal plans. The irrigation potential was created in chargaon and Chenda/jala projects only, whereas the work of remaining projects was in full swing.

2) Power : Due to industrial development of Chandrapur district the demand of electricity is increased the tremendously. In the Annual plan 1980-81 an amount of Rs. 16.50 lakhs and 31.50 lakhs were provided from Tribal and non-tribal sub-plan respectively. The expenditure has incurred on electrification of 8 villages and energisation of 9 pumps in non-tribal area and of Rs. 14.00 lakhs was incurred on electrification of 16 villages and energisation of 18 pump sets in Tribal areas. At the same time an amount of Rs. 0.55 as against the provision of Rs. 1.50 lakhs under Tribal and Rs. 8.00 lakhs as against the provision of Rs. 8.00 under non-tribal had been spent on method development. In all 0.07 Kms. L.T. line, 0.15 Kms. L.T. line and 2 transformers under Tribal and 10.54 Kms. H.T line, 4.14 Kms. L.T line and 15 transformers had been installed.

4.7. INDUSTRY AND MINING;

In the Annual plan 1980-81 (excluding Tribal Sub-plan) Rs. 17.26 lakhs were sanctioned for this head of development and the expenditure was of Rs. 17.27 lakhs. Maximum expenditure i.e. Rs. 11.74

lakhs was incurred on providing seed-money assistance to 131 educated unemployed for starting their own enterprises. Training was given to another 247 Youths Rural/ for self employment 209 educated unemployed under employment promotion programme on which Rs. 0.85 lakhs & Rs. 1.01 lakhs respectively were spent. An amount Rs. 0.29 lakhs has also been spent for development of Hand-loom industry under which 14 workers were benefited.

Under Tribal Sub-plan Rs. 1.17 lakhs were provided for this programme and the same were utilised for providing financial assistance to 14 block level village artisans co-operative societies and eliminating seed money assistance to 12 educated unemployees.

4.8 ROAD DEVELOPMENT : The proposed road length in 1961-81 road development plan and the present road length in Chandrapur District's as follows.

It will be seen from the above data that the progress under road development in Chandrapur district is very poor. The percentage of present road length, including the length of other roads (2396.19- Kms.) to the proposed road length in 1961-81 road development plan comes to 77.50%. It means that still about 22.50% road length is remained to be completed as per 20 years road development plan, specially in case of major state Highways and major District Roads and other District Roads.

In the Annual plan 1980-81 in all Rs. 255.66 lakhs were provided for road development in both the areas i.e. Rs. 117.79 lakhs in Tribal and Rs. 137.85 lakhs in non-tribal areas. Out of which Rs. 249.23 lakhs i.e. Rs. 118.39 lakhs under Tribal and Rs. 130.84 lakhs under Non-tribal were spent on road development, construction of bridges and new roads etc. The physical achievement during the year 1980-81 separately for Non-tribal and Tribal sub-plan areas under.

4.9 SOCIAL SERVICES :

A provision of Rs. 274.53 lakhs was made for this head during the year 1980-81. Out of Rs. 274.53 lakhs, Rs. 141.56 lakhs were sanctioned for Non-tribal and Rs. 132.97 lakhs were sanctioned for Tribal Sub-plan. The respective expenditure was Rs. 135 lakhs and Rs. 132.97 lakhs. The percentage of total expenditure to total provision was 98.15%. Under this sector in all 11 sub-sectors are covered and the important physical achievements of which are summarised below.

1) General Education : In the Annual plan 1980-81 a provision of Rs. 42.78 lakhs i.e. Rs. 24.35 lakhs under Tribal and Rs. 18.43 lakhs under Non-tribal Sub-plan was made for general Education. The expenditure of Rs. 20.78 lakhs and Rs. 15.20 lakhs was made under Tribal and Non-tribal respectively on more than 45 various schemes pertaining to education from kindergarten level to Higher education. However the important schemes on which the maximum expenditure was booked were opening of Vidyalyas in pry. Schools, opening of pry. schools in schoolless villages, attaching std. 5 th to 7 th to

middle schools, non-formal educational programme for pupils of 9 to 10 age group, opening of book banks in primary and secondary schools, Special facilities to pry. school students belonging to S.C./ S.T Grants to Zilla Parishad for construction of school building, construction of residential buildings for pry. School teachers and development of Non- govt. secondary schools and attachment of extra classes etc. The details of provision for, expenditure on and achievement of the above important schemes was as under.

Though Chandrapur district is having maximum Tribal Population and the communication facilities have not reached to the Tribals, the percentage of School going children is considerably increased from 1967-77 to 1980-81. The remaining expenditure was incurred on miscellaneous schemes.

2) Health :- A provision of Rs. 28.62 lakhs was made for this sub-sector in the annual plan 1980-81 (excluding Tribal Sub-plan) against which the expenditure was Rs. 25.53 lakhs. A major portion of provision was spent on construction of out door patient department in General hospital, providing additional facilities in hospital and dispensaries, appointment of nurses and other staff in general hospital, grants to pry. health centres and sub-centres etc. and nurses hostels in general hospital Chandrapur.

In the Tribal sub-plan Rs. 16.46 lakhs were spent on rural family welfare centres, national malaria control programme, filaria control programme, construction of primary health centres and sub-centres, additional grants to pry. health centres and subcentres for medicines, establishment of pry. health centres etc.

Under nutrition programme Rs. 2.76 lakhs i.e. Rs. 1.69 lakhs under Tribal and Rs. 1.07 lakhs under Non-tribal were spent on providing special nutrition food to 3100 primary school Children, pregnant women and mothers.

3) Water supply and Drainage : In all Rs. 42.05 lakhs were sanctioned for the programme during the year 1980-81 for non-tribal area. The expenditure was Rs. 54.45 lakhs.

Out of which Rs. 9.31 lakhs were incurred on construction of 92 drinking water wells and Rs. 25.57 lakhs on 102 bore well holes, 86 hand pumps and 34 power pumps.

Remaining amount was spent on Govt. water supply schemes and drainage (Rs. 11.33 lakhs) conversion of dry latrines into sfty tanks (1.75 lakhs) piped water supply (simple measures) (Rs. 6.49 lakhs) etc.

Under Tribal Sub-plan of 1980-81 Rs. 4.70 lakhs were spent on Rural piped water supply scheme. Rs. 10.72 lakhs on construction of 115 wells (simple measures) and Rs. 39.56 on 237 bore well holes, 221 hand pumps and 29 power pumps.

4) Urban Development:- There are in all 5 Municipal Councils in Chandrapur district and all are coming under non-tribal area and hence Rs. 9.95 lakhs were provided in the Annual plan 1980-81 for implementation of development plan. The provision was fully utilised.

5) Housing :- (Under Tribal Sub-plan Rs. 11.08 lakhs were provided for extension of village gao-than, provision of house site to landless in rural areas and filling of roof. The expenditure on extension of village gao-than was 1.58 lakhs (100%) provision of house site to landless Rs. 4.45 lakhs (100%) and for filling of roof was Rs. 5.05 lakhs against provision of Rs. 5.10 lakhs. In

all 261 and 150 villagers respectively were benefited.

6) Welfare of Backward Classes : In the Annual plan 1980-81 (excluding Tribal Sub-plan) a provision of Rs. 7.86 lakhs was made for welfare of backward classes. The expenditure of Rs. 7.67 lakhs was incurred on different schemes. The important physical achievements are depicted below.

i) Rs. 1.13 lakhs were spent on grant of examination and Rs. 0.42 lakhs as grant of schoolerships to 915 backward class students. fees to 7591 backward class students/studying in secondary schools.

ii) Rs. 0.90 lakhs were utilised for grant in aid to five backward class hostels and Rs. 1.17 lakhs were incurred on development and maintenance of 3 ashram shales.

iii) Twelve irrigation wells were constructed with the expenditure of Rs. 0.25 lakhs and Rs. 0.25 lakhs were given to 29 backward class cultivators for purchase of fertilizers and agril. implements.

iv) Rs. 0.75 lakhs were utilised on construction of 86 houses under the scheme 'grant in aid to community and group housing societies of backward class people and individual. An amount of Rs. 0.75 lakhs were spent on improvement of 4 Harijan settlements.

Similarly Rs. 30.30 lakhs were sanctioned under Tribal subplan out of which Rs. 20.69 were spent on 29 Ashram School Complex, Rs. 1000 lakh on construction of irrigation wells, 2.00 lakhs on 38 electric pumps, 4.00 lakhs on 80 oil engines, Rs. 0.18 lakhs on tuition fees Rs. 0.08 lakhs for 173 backward class students in secondary schools, of 543 backward class students, Rs. 0.17 lakhs on grant in aid to 2 B.C. hostels. Remaining provision was spent on various miscellaneous Schemes.

7) Labour and Labour Welfare :- In all Rs. 12.03 lakhs had been spent, out of sanctioned provision of Rs. 12.78 lakhs for this subsector in the Annual plan 1980-81 (excluding Tribal Sub-Plan) The expenditure of Rs. 9.03 was incurred on payment of honourarium to educated unemployed, for part time employment. For providing additional instruments and tools in the I.T.I. Chandrapur an amount of Rs. 1.07 lakhs were utilised. Similarly Rs. 0.54 lakhs were spent on payment of honourarium to educated unemployed in tribal areas.

18 - A :

Difficulties and bottlenecks experienced in the implementation of various schemes during the year 1980-81

- 1) The budget provision under most of the schemes were received late. i.e. by May end. In case of new works items/ schemes the provision as proposed by the

District planning and development Council were remained unbudgetted for want of administrative or technical sanction.

2) In case of continued schemes the administrative approval and orders to continue the schemes were abnormally delayed by various heads of the Departments. Even in case of budgetted schemes orders to release budget grants were considerably delayed by the Heads of the departments resulting in failure to achieve the targets in the plan year.

3) The schemes were formulated without any study or survey but on the basis of the schemes implemented in other districts and without studying the feasibility of the schemes in the district.

4) Roads were proposed without studying whether the land would have to be acquired or not. Normally the land acquisition progress takes its own time. The provision under such works remained unspent under such circumstances.

5) The preliminaries required to be completed before implementation of such programme were never completed before hand and those steps were taken after a major period was lapsed.

6) Planning of programme in most of the schemes was not

done which resulted in not achieving the desired targets.

4.10 EMPLOYMENT GUARANTEE SCHEMES:

During the year 1980-81 in all Rs. 419.57 lakhs i.e. Rs. 196.72 lakhs under Tribal and Rs. 222.85 lakhs under Non-tribal sub-plan were spent in Chandrapur district. The details of works under taken and man power engaged are given separately in table No. 36 of part II of this publication.

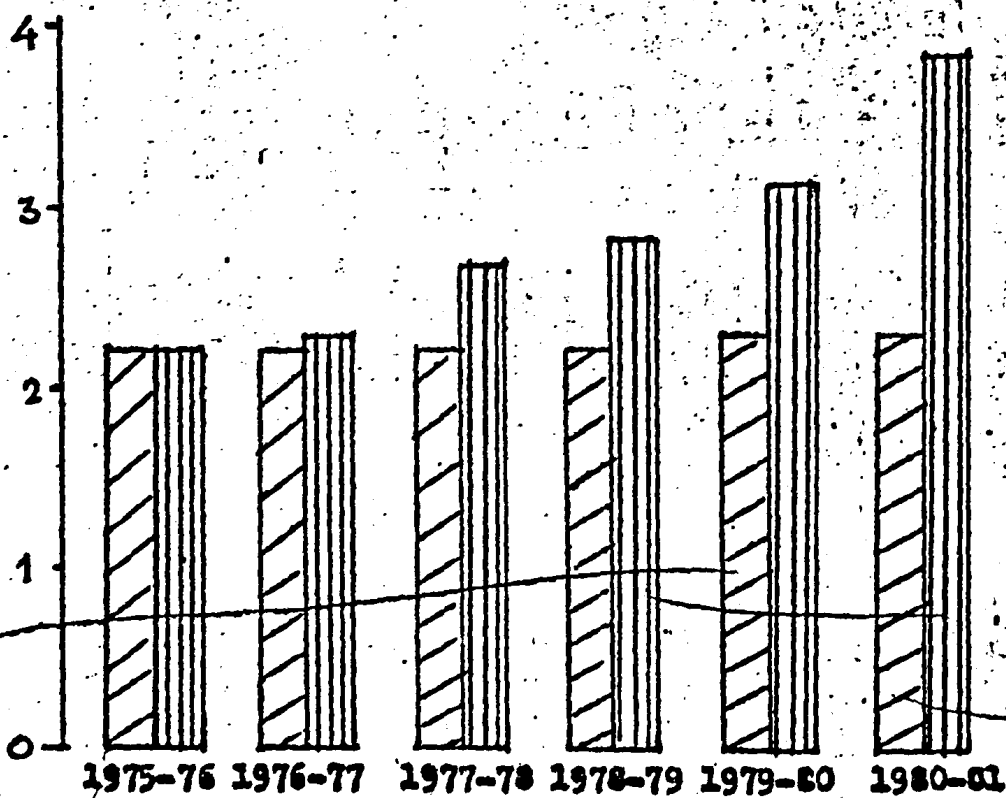

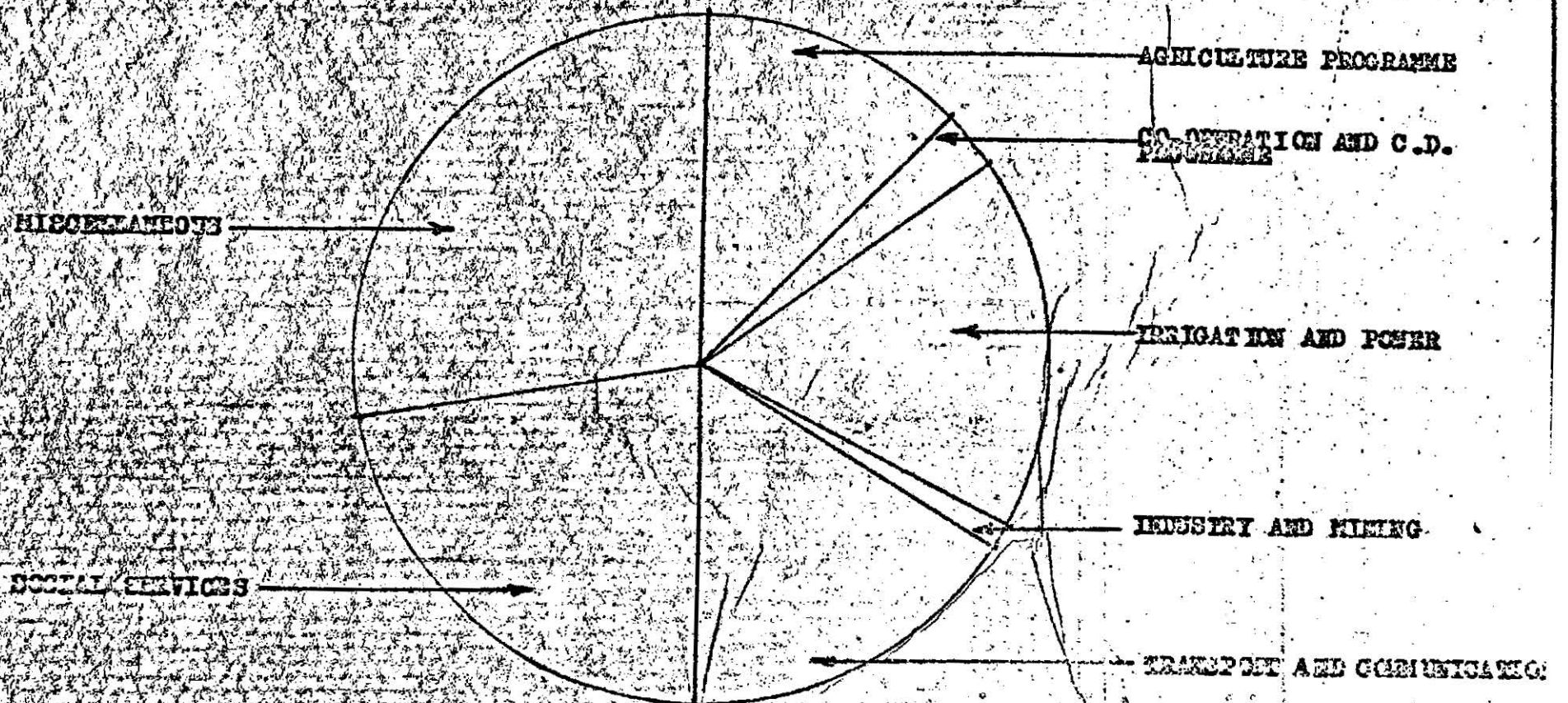
