CHAPTER - I

INTRODUCTION

1.1. Brief History :

Yeotmal district which forms a part of Berar was handed over by the Nizam to Government of India in 1903. Upto 1853 it was a part of East Berar district. In 1854 the talukas of Yeotmal, Darwaha, Kelapur and Wani were separated from that district to form a new district termed as WUN (Wani) district. In 1905 the taluka of Pusad was transferred from Basim district to Wun district and name of the district was changed to Yeotmal district. There were no major changes in the district till 1956 when the district was transferred to erstwhile bilingual Bombay State after the States Re-organisation. The 2 district forms a part of Maharashtra since 1st May, 1960.

1.2: Boundaries:

Yeotmal district lies between $19^{\circ} 23'$ and $20^{\circ} 42'$ North latitude and $77^{\circ} 18'$ and $79^{\circ} 9'$ East longitude. It is surrounded by Amravati district in the north, Nanded district and Andhra Pradesh in the south, Akola and Parabhani district in the west and Chanda and Wardha districts in the east. The district is quite extensive in size, second in Nagpur division and eighth in the Maharashtra State.

1.3 Administrative Set-up :

For Administrative purposes the district is at present divided into 5 talukas. The Collector is in-charge of the district. He is assisted by a Resident Deputy Collector and four Deputy Collectors at Headquarters. The Collector is responsible for General Administration and Law and Order, land Revenue and Civil supplies. Under the Collector there are five Sub-Divisional Officers of the Deputy Collector's grade, posted at five revenue sub-division i.e. talukas. The revenue

sub-divisions, comprises one taluka, in-charge of one Tahsildar who is assisted by few Naib-Tahsildars. The District and Sessions Judge is the head of Judicial Department in the district. The Judiciary is entirely separated from the Executive. The Collector continues to be District Magistrate but those powers are limited to Security proceedings. The District and Sessions Judge is assisted by one Civil Judge (Sr. Division) and five Civil Judges (Jr. Division) and First Class Judicial Magistrate whose Head-quarters are the taluka headquarters. The police force in the district functions under the District Superintendent of Police who is assisted by two Deputy Superintendents. In addition to these, there are various District Heads of the Offices under various Departments.

Zilla Parishads and Panchayat Samities

With a view to promote development of democratic institutions and securing greater measure of participation by the people in developmental plans, a Zilla Parishad and 14 Panchayat Samities have been established in the district on 1st May, 1963. The area under the jurisdiction of Zilla Parishads corresponds to the District boundary except for the eight municipal towns which are not covered by them. The area under Panchayat Samities is the respective area of Community Development Block which excludes Municipal areas thereunder. The Yeotmal Zilla Parishad has 49 directly elected councillors. Out of these 49 seats, two seats are reserved for Scheduled Castes and five for Scheduled Tribes. Besides one woman councillor has been coopted by the elected councillors. There are also five associate councillors who are chairman of five Cooperative societies conducting business in the district. The elected chairman of 14 Panchayat Samities

are also ex-officio councillors of the Zilla Parishad. At the block level, the Panchayat Samiti consists of elected and co-opted councillors from the area of the block. The Zilla Parishad is headed by its President assisted by Vice-President both of whom are elected from amongst elected councillors. One Officer in the senior scale of I.A.S. works as Chief Executive Officer of the Zilla Parishad. The Zilla Parishad comprises various departments and the heads of those departments. Officers at district level are officers of Class-I or Class-II service under State Govt. The Deputy Chief Executive Officer works as Secretary to Zilla Parishad. The Zilla Parishad functions through a Standing Committee presided over by the President and six Subject Committees for Finance, Works, Agriculture, Co-operation, Education and Health. At the block level the Panchayat Samiti have elected Chairmen and Deputy Chairmen. The Block Development Officers work as Secretaries of the Panchayat Samitiss which do not have Subject Committees.

1.4. Area

The area of the district is 5219.0 sq. miles (13,517.3 Sq.KMs.). Its maximum length from east to west is 192 Kms. while the maximum breadth from north to south is about 130 Kms.

1.5. Topography :

Most of the district is covered by the Balaghat i.e. Southern Plateau of Berar. On the north, it extends into Raxasbari Payanghat i.e. the Berar valley and includes a small part of it, which is a belt of plain along the north of Yeotmal and Darwin tahsils from five to fourteen miles in breadth. This narrow belt is continued in the Wardha valley across the north of

Kelapur tahsil and eastern sides of Wani tahsil. Similarly the Penganga river gives a strip of plain in many parts of its course on the southern border of the district.

1.8 Hills, river system, soil

The whole district is covered by small east west ranges of Balaghat mountains broken by broad river valleys. The central portion of the district is a plateau with steep ghats having an elevation of 305457 metre above mean sea level. The chief rivers of the district are the Wardha and the Painganga. The Wardha flows throughout eastern boundary while the Painganga flows throughout southern boundaries of the district. The Wardha has two important tributaries viz. the Bembla and the Nirguda. The Bembla flows across the northern boundary of the Yeotmal taluka below the ghats, while the entire course of the Nirguda is in Wani taluka. The Painganga has six tributaries viz. the Pus, The Arunavati, ~~The Adan,~~ the Waghadi, The Khuni and The Vaidarbhi. The Pus river flows through Pusad taluka while the Arunawati and the Adan flow through Darwaha taluka, the Waghadi through Yeotmal and Kelapur talukas, the Khuni through Kelapur taluka and the Vaidarbhi through Wani Taluka. All these rivers are flooded in rainy season with little water in the rest of the season particularly in summer, a typical characteristic of the rivers in Vidarbha Region.

The soil of the district is uniformly good in texture and vary in colour from black to dark-brown. The soil, however, is slightly inferior in productive capacity as compared to the soil of Amravati and Akola districts.

Three defects are common all over the soil of the district viz. 1. mixture of pieces of chunkhadi (limestone), 2.

sloaping surface, 3. excessive admixture of sand. In

Wani taluka the soil is uniform but coarse in texture with reddish colour. In Kelapur taluka and southern parts of Yeotmal taluka and hilly parts of Pusad taluka the soil is of coarse gravelly or loose friable texture and of a colour varying from light brown to grey. In western part of Yeotmal taluka and central portion of Darwaha and Pusad talukas rich fertile soil is found.

1.7 Climate, Temperature and Rainfall

The climate of the district is generally hot, dry and cold in winter. There are generally gentle cool breezes blowing in hot season making the hot season tolerable to some extent. The highest temperature recorded during 1955 in May, was 41.1 C° at Yeotmal, while at Pusad 41.9 C°. The lowest temperature during the corresponding year in December at Yeotmal was 15.5°, while at Pusad 13.7 C° in November. The rainfall is not uniform in all the parts of the district. It increases from west to east. It is heaviest at Wani in the eastern region, which gets an average about 1,125 m.m. and lowest in Darwaha in the west, which gets about 839 m.m. of rain. The central region of the district comprising Yeotmal taluka gets about 1,099.5 m.m. average rainfall. The rainy season starts about the beginning of June and last till the end of October. The intensity of rainfall is highest generally in August.

There is no tract in the district which can be regarded as chronic scarcity or precarious area in the districts according to the Fact Finding Committee appointed by the Government of Bombay on 1960,

C H A P T E R 3 IICLIMATE AND RAINFALL

The climate of the district is hot and dry. The temperature data are collected from Yeotmal and Pusad centres in the district. The highest temperature recorded during 1965 was in May which was 41.1 °C at Yeotmal and 41.9 °C at Pusad. Lowest temperature during 1965 was 15.5 °C in December of Yeotmal and 13.7 °C in November for Pusad. The rainfall during 1965 was less than the normal rainfall. The normal rainfall of the district varied from 918.6 M.M. at Darwha to 1122.2 M.M. at Pandharkawada. However the actual rainfall during 1965 was much less than the normal at all centres and it was lowest at Pusad (736.0 M.M.) and was highest at Yeotmal (953.0 M.M.).

2. AREA AND POPULATION

The total geographical area of the district is 13,517.2 sq.Kms. The district population has increased by 17.86 percent during 1961 as compared to 1951. The density of population is highest in Darwha taluka (91 per Sq.Km.) and lowest in Kelapur taluka (70 per sq.Kms) during 1961 Census. In terms of area and population according to 1961 Census the district ranks 8th and 25th respectively in Maharashtra. Out of the total 1924 villages in the district 295 are deserted. Out of 1629 populated villages in the district 56 percent have population below 500, 28 percent of them are in the population range of 500 to 999 while the remaining 16 % are have population above 1000. There are eight towns in the district. The urban population of the district is 13% of the district population.

2.2. Working population: As per 1961 Census there were 543 workers per-1000 persons in the district. The working population is classified into 9 major classes. In all 85 % working population of the district is engaged in Agricultural occupation. The percentage of agricultural population is as high as 90% in rural area. In urban area workers are mostly engaged in non-agricultural occupation such as Household Industry (13%), Trade and Commerce (17%) and Services (31%). Amongst the non-workers 63% were infants and children not attending school, 19% were students while 16% were engaged in domestic duties.

2.3 Backward Classes: The scheduled Caste accounted for 4% of the district population during 1961 Census as against 14% in 1951 Census. This sudden decrease can be attributed to the large scale conversion of Scheduled caste to Buddhist during the decade. Scheduled Tribes are found in Yeotmal, Kelapur and Wani Talukas of the district and formed 14% of the district population. The Scheduled Tribes population is highest in Kelapur Tahsil (40%) and lowest in Wani Tahsil (27%).

3. AGRICULTURE

3.1: Out of the total geographical area of the district 57% was cultivated, 22% was under forest, 9% was / not available for cultivation, and 7% was other uncultivated land and 7% accounted for fallow land during 1964-65. When compared with figures land utilisation during 1951-52 it is seen that there is a decrease in area under forest and fallow land by one percent and two percent respectively with an increase in the net area sown by 3 percent during 1964-65. Area sown more than once was 0.9% of the net area sown during 1964-65 while it was 0.8% during 1951-52.

3.2 : Cropping pattern: There is a decrease in the area under food crop during 1964-65. During 1961-62, 53% of the gross cropped area was under food crop which decreased to 52% during 1964-65, denoting that cultivators are slowly bringing more area under cash crop of Cotton, Cotton and Tur are the important crops of the district. During 1964-65 40% of the area was under Jowar, 43% under Cotton, 5% under Tur and 4% under Oil Seeds. There are very few irrigation facilities in the district. During 1964-65 only 0.61% of the gross cropped area was under irrigation. However, there is a slight increase in irrigated area and during 1961-62 0.40% of area was irrigated. Wells were the main source of irrigation and 95% of the irrigated area was irrigated by well while only 4% of area was irrigated by canal and tanks. Out of the total number of 9724 irrigated wells in the district, 67% were used for irrigation during 1964-65. It is significant to note that Wani Tahsil has the lowest percentage of wells (5%) as compared to Darwaha Tahsil (34%). In Darwaha tahsil 85% of the irrigation wells were actually used for irrigation during 1964-65. By the end of 1965-66 there were 50 Minor Irrigation works completed in the district creating a potential of 5364 hectares of irrigable area out of which 1491 hectares of area was actually irrigated during 1965-66. In addition to these there are two Medium Irrigation Projects under completion in the district. The Pus River Project when completed in 1971 will irrigate about 18,998 hectares while Khuni R River Project expected to be completed in 1969 will irrigate about 4,860 hectares. As per 1961 Census

(Table No.3.7) out of the total cultivating household in the district 45% were cultivating land below 15 acres, 33% were cultivating land between 15 to 30 acres while 21% were cultivating land & above 30 acres.

4. ANIMAL HUSBANDRY AND FOREST

4.1 : The 1966 Livestock population has decreased by 2.6 % during 1966 as compared to 1961 Livestock census. Similarly the Poultry population has come down to half in 1966 as compared to 1961 Poultry Population. Cattle found the highest percentage of the Livestock population during 1966 (59.13%) ; Then came in order Goats (20.72%), Buffaloes (8.41%) ,Sheeps (0.51%) and Others (1.23%). The Bovine population (Cattle and Buffaloes) per 10 hectare of cultivable land was 9.09 during 1961 which decreased to 8.54 during 1966. As per 1961 Livestock census the Poultry per 100 persons in the district was 41 which decreased to 21 during 1966 Livestock census.

4.2 Due to increase in Veterinary facilities the number of animals treated in 1965-66 increased by 10% over 1961-62. All the 14 Panchayat Samitis are having Veterinary dispensaries in the district. Each of the Veterinary dispensary is having three Veterinary Aid-Centres. In addition to these there are 14 Key-Village Centres, eight of which are of the old Madhya Pradesh Govt. pattern and six of the Govt. of India pattern. The progress in respect of Artificial Insemination is worth noting as there is an increase of 8 centres at the end of 1965-66 as compared to 1961. The number of artificial insemination have increased by 85% during 1965-66 over 1961-62. During 1965-66 there were 11 Slaughter Houses

for large Animals and 13 Slaughter houses for small animals in the district. On an average 454 and 2143 animals respectively were slaughtered in these Slaughter Houses during 1965-66. Sheeps and Goats formed 91% of the total animals slaughtered during 1965-66.

4.3 Forest : As stated earlier 22% of the district area is under forest. Out of the total forest area during 1965-66 75% was under reserved forest, 5% under protected forest and 20% was under Revenue Department which is unclassified. The forest area has decreased by 5,862 hectares at the end of 1965-66 as compared to 1961-62. The total value of the forest produce during 1965-66 was Rs.47 lakhs as compared to Rs. 41 lakhs during 1961-62. On an average the forests of the district produced Rs.12 per hectare during 1965-66. Out of the total forest produce 56% was Timber, 18% was fuel, 5% was Grass and grazing value, 20% was other minor produce.

5. EMPLOYMENT, INDUSTRIES AND ELECTRICITY

5.1 : Industries : Cotton ginning and pressing account for about 52% of the industries in the district employing about 85% of the total industrial workers in the district. Out of the total number of 71 factories during 1964 about 55% employed less than 50 workers, 18% of them employed workers between 50 to 99 while the remaining 27% employed workers between 100 to 499. However, no factory employed more than 500 workers.

As per the Annual Survey of Industries 1961 the total productive capital of 79 factories in the district amounted to Rs. 117 lakhs, out of which 42% was invested in ginning and pressing industry. During 1961

the gross out-put of these 79 industries was of the order of Rs. 351 lakhs and value added by these factories was Rs.54 lakhs.

5.2 : Employment Exchange: The registration of persons in the Employment Exchange has gone down during 1965-66 (4317) as compared to 1961-62(5558). The figures on the Live Register at end of 1965-66 has increased by 20% as compared to the corresponding figure on the live register at the end of 1961-62. Out of the total vacancies notified during 1965-66 69% were placed in employment. No candidate was placed in employment by private sector during the year. Out of the total registration during 1965-66 as high as 84% comprised "workers not elsewhere classified" as they had no special qualification. They were placed in employment as and when the vacancies arose under different occupations. Most of them were unskilled workers. It is seen from the return of the 210 reporting establishments, from which the data on volume of employment were collected, that during March, 1966 quarter 56% were employed in public sector. Out of the total number of persons employed at the end of March, 1966 quarter, 69 % were employed in service industry, 19% in manufacturing and 6% were in construction. The remaining 5% of them were employed in other industries.

5.3 : Electricity: Considerable progress in respect of rural electrification has been made during the Third Five Year Plan period. Out of the total number of inhabited villages in the district only 3% were electrified at the end of 1961-62 whereas by the end of 1965-66 12% of these villages were electrified.

All the eight towns were electrified at the end of 1961-62. The consumption of electricity has gone down during 1965-66 as compared to 1964-65. During 1965-66 45% of the consumption was on account of Industrial power, 20% on Agriculture, 15% on Domestic consumption and 13% was for Commercial lighting and Small Power and 7% for other purposes. The per capita consumption of electricity worked out to 11 units during 1965-66.

6.

CO - OPERATION

The Co-operative movement which started as a ~~an~~ credit movement for agriculturists has now blossomed into a diversified movement and covered other fields of economic activities such as marketing, housing, farming, industrial etc. The Primary Agricultural credit societies in the district have covered all villages in the district. The total number of societies in the district has increased by 7% at the end of 1965-66 as compared to 1961-62. The membership of these societies has increased by 68% while share capital and working capital has nearly trebled as compared to 1961-62.

The co-operative movement still continues to be a predominantly a credit/movement as primary Agricultural societies accounted for 56% credit of the societies in the district. There has been an overall increase in membership, share capital, loan advanced during 1965-66 as compared to 1961-62 in respect of these societies. The average amount of advanced per member during 1961-62 worked out to Rs. 145/- which increased to Rs. 310/- during 1965-66. At the end of 1965-66 the overdues accounted for 40% of the loans outstanding as compared to 4% at the end of 1961-62.

The other types of co-operative societies which deserve mention so far as Yeotmal district is concerned are cooperative farming societies which accounted for 15% of the societies in the district during 1935-66. Industrial societies and housing societies formed 7% and 4% of the total number of societies in the district. Besides these there were 14 primary marketing societies known as Purchase and Sales Unions. These societies have undertaken purchase and sales of agricultural produce and distribution of agricultural requisites such as improved implements, fertilizers, and seeds. The total value of sale effected by these societies was to the tune of Rs. 544 lakhs of which 82% of which are agency basis of these societies. Out of the total sales effected by these societies 72% of the sales covered agricultural produce while 15% covered agricultural requisites.

7. MEDICAL AND PUBLIC HEALTH

As per 1931 Census, 1059 persons were engaged in Medical and Public Health profession in the district. Out of these 40% were Doctors. Out of the total male doctors in the district 56% were in rural area with only 4% female doctors were in rural area. At the end of 1935, there were 10 hospitals, 10 dispensaries, 27 Ayurvedic dispensaries, 14 Primary Health Centres and 17 Rural Medical Relief Centres in the district. On an average there were 1 Hospital, one allopathic dispensary and 2 Ayurvedic dispensaries per lakh of population in the district.

There was an increase of 100 beds at the end of 1935 as compared to 1931. On an average there were

35 beds per lakh of population during 1965 as compared to 26 beds during 1961. There were on an average 7 allopathic doctors, 3 vaidyas and 11 nurses per lakh of population during 1965. Due to increase in medical facilities more number of patients could be treated during 1965. There was an increase of 23% in indoor patients and 51% in outdoor patients treated during 1965 as compared to 1961. The birth rate per thousand of population during 1961 was 42.8 as against 47.3 during 1965 (Birth rate was calculated by using 1961 census population). The death rate per thousand of population was 24.7 during 1961 which decreased to 13.3 during 1965. There was also considerable decrease in infant mortality during past four years. The infant mortality per thousand live births worked out to 157 during 1961 which fell to 107 during 1965.

8. EDUCATION:

According to 1961 Census 23.48% of the population of the district was literate, though the literacy in rural area was only 20.30 percent. The literacy by educational standards was very poor. In rural area 58% of the literate were without any educational standard, 41% were having education upto primary level while only 1% of them attained the educational standard of "matriculation and above". In urban area 35% of literate were without any educational standard, 53% were of primary level while 9% had the educational standard of "matriculation and above". Considerable progress has been made in respect of primary education during the past five years as 84% of the

town and villages had primary schools during 1963 as compared to, 66% during 1961. Most of the villages without primary schools had population below 200. There was an increase of 29% in the number of primary schools, and 45% in the number of Secondary Schools during 1965-66 as compared to 1961-62. Similarly the number of students had increased by 38% in primary as well as secondary school in the district from 1961-62 to 1965-66. On an average there was one Secondary School for every 15 primary schools in the district during 1965-66 as compared to 17 during 1961-62. The Boy : Girl ratio was 2 : 1 in Primary and 3 : 1 in secondary schools. On an average, there was one teacher for every 29 primary students and 23 secondary students during 1965-66 as compared to 29 & 22 during 1961-62.

During 1961-62 there were 3 Arts and Commerce Colleges, which increased to 5 during 1965-66. In addition, to these there were 2 Basic Training Colleges, one Polytechnic, one Industrial Training Institution and one College of Diploma in Education in the district. There is also one Homeopathic and one Ayurvedic College in the district. During 1965-66 educational concessions to the tune of Rs. 19 lakhs were given to the 61 thousand Backward Classes students in the districts. There was an increase of 36% in the educational concession given during 1965-66 as compared to previous year. Out of the total concession granted to Backward class during 1965-66 4% of was granted to primary student, 64% to Secondary students and 32%

to Higher Institution students. During 1965-66 25 thousand students took advantage of Economically Backward Class concessions of free education and the total expenditure on these concessions was Rs. 16 lakhs. During 1965-66 number of students taking advantage of the above scheme was less by 14 thousand as compared to previous year. Out of the total number of students taking advantage of above concession 93% were from the secondary and the remaining 7% from Higher institutions. On an average Rs. 59 and Rs. 188 was spent on the above scheme on students in Secondary and Higher Institutions respectively during 1965-66. During 1965-66 Rs. 54 lakhs were given to local Bodies as grant-in-aid for primary education in the district. Out of the total amount of grant-in-aid 91% was given to Zilla Parishad and 9% to Municipal Councils. There was an increase of 10% in the amount of grant-in-aid during 1965-66 as compared to previous year.

9. TRANSPORT AND COMMUNICATIONS

There was no change in Railway mileage in the district during past decade. The total Railway mileage in the district is 17.71 Kilometres under broad gauge and 64.40 Kilometres under narrow guage. The broad guage line connects Wani Town with Majri Railway station on Madras-Delhi Grand Trunk route while the narrow guage connects Yeotmal town with Murtizapur Railway Station on Bombay-Nagpur Main line. The total road mileage in the district as at the end of 1965-66 was 1517 Kms. as compared to 1336 Kms. at

the end of 1960-61. The road mileage has increased by 13% as at the end of 1965-66 as compared to 31-3-1961. Road mileage per lakh population and per hundred sq. kilometre worked out to 138 Kms. and 11 Kms. respectively at the end of 1965-66 as compared to the corresponding figures ^{of} 121 Kms. and 10 Kms, respectively at the end of 1960-61. Out of the total road mileage at the end of 1965-66 4% was under National Highway, 30% was under State Highway, 45% under Major District Roads, 10% under Other District Roads and 11% was under Village Roads. According to surface classification of roads it was seen that black topped surface road length increased by 73% during 1965-66 as compared to 1960-61. At the end of 1965-66 35% of road length was under black topped surface, 54% under water bound macadam surface and 11% ^{was of} lower type. On an average the Municipalities in the district have 18 Kms. of roads under their jurisdiction. The total motor vehicles in operation in Yeotmal district has increased from 760 at the end of 1960-61 to 1043 as at the end of 1965-66. Out of the total number motor vehicles in operation in the district during 1965-66 35% were Motor Cars, 29% were Lorries and 13% were Motor Cycles. The postal facilities in the district have increased slightly during past four years. During 1961-62 there were 21 post offices and less than one Telegraph Offices and Telephone Exchanges in the district per lakh population, while during 1965-66 correspondingly there were 25 post offices, 1 Telegraph office and Telephone Exchanges per lakh of population in the

district. By the end of 1965-66 16% of the inhabited villages were having post offices within the village, 38% had them within 3 Kms. of radius while 46% of the villages had that facility of post office beyond the radius of 3 Kms. The number of Telegraph offices and Telephone Exchanges has increased from 8 during 1961-62 to 13 at the end of 1965-66. There were on an average 67 telephones per lakh of population in the district during 1965-66 as against 40 during 1961-62. At the end of 1965, 846 Radio Licences were issued in the district per lakh of population as against the corresponding number of 292 at the end of 1961. At the end of 1965-66 Radio receiving sets have been installed in 40% of the villages in the district by the Rural Broadcasting Department as against 24% at the end of previous year. By end of 1965-66, 59% of the rural population has been provided with the radio facility by the above Department. On an average there was one Radio Farm Forum for 13 villages in the district. While on an average there was one Radio Farm Forum for 5 Radio sets installed by the above department.

10. LOCAL BODIES.

10.1 Zilla Parishad:- The total revenue receipts of Zilla Parishada, Yeotmal increased by 37% during 1965-66 as compared to previous year. Out of the total Rs. 309 lakhs of revenue receipt during 1965-66, 93% were by way of Govt. grants while only 7% were on account of self raised resources. Out of the

revenue from self raised resources 62% was due to Local Fund cess, 1.5% due to Taxes and fees, 17% due to Education, 5% due to Agriculture and 3% due to Building and Communication while 8% was due to other heads. The total expenditure of the Z.P. was Rs. 527 lakhs during 1965-66. On an average the Z.P. has spent Rs. 48/- per head during 1965-66 as against Rs. 47/- during the previous year.

The percentage of expenditure increased during 1965-66 on (1) Agriculture (2) Building and Communication and Irrigation and decreased on (3) Education (2) Community Development (3) Social welfare as compared to 1964-65. During 1964-65 there were 1000 village panchayats in the district as compared to 925 during 1961-62. The income and expenditure per village panchayat during 1964-65

worked out to Rs. 4524/- and Rs. 4217/- respectively as against Rs. 1400/- and Rs. 1272/- during 1961-62. This shows that the financial position of V.P. has considerably improved during past three years.

The comparative figures given above shows that the V.P. had spent less on Public works, administration, while more amount had been spent on social and moral promotion and welfare during 1964-65.

PLAN AND COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT.11.1 Third Five Year Plan :-

The third five year plan was implemented in Yeotmal district through 65 District Level Schemes with a total financial out-lay of Rs. 4.78 crores of which Rs. 2.42 crores were allotted for the schemes in the State sector and the remaining amount of Rs. 2.36 crores was meant for Local sector schemes implemented through Zilla Parishad. Out of the total out-lay, 38.35% of the plan provision was made for schemes on the Agricultural programme which included schemes of Agricultural production, Minor Irrigation, Soil Conservation, Forests, Fisheries etc. Schemes under social services comprising programmes like general education, technical education, public health, housing, labour and social welfare accounted for 31% whereas schemes of co-operation and community development accounted for 19.34% of the plan out-lay. Transport and communication which included various schemes of road development shared 10.85% of the plan out-lay. The lowest plan provision of 0.45% was made for the schemes under Industries and mining.

The progress of the schemes made under various heads was as follows :-

Agricultural Programme:-

The expenditure of Rs. 243.91 lakhs incurred on the schemes under this major head was 34% more than

the actual plan provision. This was so due to more emphasis given to the programme of soil conservation and minor irrigation. Nearly 1.62 lakhs of acres have been bunded and 2332 new irrigation wells were made available for irrigation. In all 850 pumping sets were installed to facilitate irrigation. Hybrid cereal crops. An irrigation potential of 530 acres had been created by minor irrigation works. Three supplementary cattle breeding centres were opened and buildings of five veterinary dispensaries were completed. An area of 100 acres was brought under afforestation and 225 acres of land was developed for pastures, 9 miles of roads were made in the forest area.

2. Cooperation and Community Development :-

The total expenditure on this head amounting to Rs. 153.03 lakhs exceeded the plan provision of Rs. 100 lakhs. The expenditure on community development was more.

3. Transport and Communication :-

This head exceeded the expenditure of Rs. 69.96 lakhs by nearly 17% of the total plan provision. The emphasis was given on construction of district and rural roads. One bridge and 57 miles of new roads were constructed alongwith 11 miles of road having been black topped.

4. Social Services :-

The overall expenditure of Rs. 117.13 lakhs on the schemes under this major head formed 95 % of the total plan provision.

In all 104 class rooms were constructed, and 9 additional classes in Govt. secondary schools and one poly-technic were started during the plan. Additional provision for 60 students was made in the existing poly-technic.

Provision of additional beds was made in the T. B. Hospital, Yeotmal.

One Public Health centre was provided with building. Emphasis on B.C.G. vaccination and Family planning programme was given and Rs. 1.01 and Rs. 4.71 lakhs were spent respectively on them. Under extension to village-gathan scheme 121 villages were benefitted. For vocational and technical training purposes, the additional intake capacity was increased by 252. Under social welfare, Balwadis and literacy centres were started.

5. Industries and Mining :-

The expenditure of Rs. 0.93 lakhs on this head was less by 58 % to the total plan provision for ^{schemes} that head. Only 2 ~~schemes~~ were implemented under this head and the progress found to be very small.

11.2 Community Development :-

By the end of 1965-66 there were 5 stage-I, 8 Stage-II, 1 Post stage-II and one Tribal Development

block in the district. The average number of villages and population per block was 137 and 68,567 respectively. The following table shows on an average physical target achieved by each C.D. block in Yotmal district.

The above table shows that the physical achievements have gone down for improved implements supplied, artificial insemination, pedigree birds, and animals supplied, drinking water wells constructed & renovated, school building rooms constructed and Peoples' contribution; while in the case of fertilizers

and seeds distributed, family planning operations and houses built during 1965-66 there is a marked improvement compared to previous year.

12. Prices :-

Prices of almost all important commodities have increased during 1965 as compared to 1964. The following table shows the average prices of important commodities for the two years and the percentage increase.

It is seen from the above table that there was a steep rise in prices of food grains during 1965 as compared to 1964.

13. Miscellaneous :-

On an average there is one police station for 71 inhabited villages in the district. During 1965

391 more civil and criminal cases were disposed of in Civil and Criminal Courts of Yeotmal district as compared to 1961. Out of the total cases disposed of during 1965, 31 % were civil cases while 69 % were criminal cases. There were 13 permanent and 8 touring talkies in the district during 1965-66. The seating capacity per show per talkie for permanent and touring talkies was 852 and 1194 respectively. On an average there was one permanent talkie for 84 thousand persons in the district. By the end of 1965-66 there were 30 Banks located in 8 towns and 9 villages in the district. All the 14 Block head quarters have banking offices. On an average there were 3 Banking offices per lakh of population in the district. The net collection under Small Savings during 1965-66 was Rs. 41.57 lakhs. This compares favourably with 1964-65. During 1964-65 the gross collection was Rs. 60.44 lakhs while the withdrawals were Rs. 53.92 lakhs with the result that the net collection was minus Rs. 3.48 lacs. Out of the total net collection in Small Savings during 1965-66, 95 % was in post office Saving Bank. Out of the total demand of Land revenue during 1965-66, 93% was actually collected as compared to 30% collection during 1961-62. The arrears of land revenue were highest in Darwaha (.11 %) and least in Kelapur Tahsil (3 %).

General Elections :-

During 1962 General Election there were 8 Assembly and one Parliamentary Constituency in the district. The Wani and Kolabara Assembly constituency

were under Wardha Parliamentary Constituency, while rest of the six Assembly constituencies were under Yeotmal Parliamentary Constituency. The percentage of voting was highest in Pusad Assembly constituency (87 percent); while it was lowest in Yelabara Assembly Constituency. The percentage of votes rejected was 4 in Yeotmal Parliamentary Constituency. Percentage of votes rejected was lowest in Pusad Assembly constituency being only 3, while it was highest in Wani Assembly constituency being 9.

CHAPTER - III

In this Chapter, the progress of development covering the period of Third Five Year Plan has been reviewed by presenting talukawise sectorial trends based on certain important indicators of development. Comparative tahsilwise figures for 1961-62 and 1964-65 or 1965-66, as the case may be have been given to bring out the pace of development.

INDICATOR NO. 1

Percentage of gross sown area :

During 1961-62, the district ranked fourth in Vidarbha and seventh in Maharashtra as far as the percentage of area sown more than once to net area sown is concerned. In 1964-65, however, the district ranked seventh in Vidarbha in this respect.

The following table shows the percentage of gross sown area to net area sown from 1960-61 to 1964-65.

It is seen from the above table that area sown more than once was quite negligible during 1964-65. The area sown more than once was only 0.90 percent of the net area sown in the district during that year. However, the double cropped area is gradually increasing every year. It had increased from 0.72 percent during 1960-61 to 0.90 percent during 1964-65. Except during 1960-61, Kelapur tahsil had a maximum of double cropped area for all the years as compared to other tahsils and W Darwha tahsil had the least percentage of area under double crop except in 1961-62 and 1963-64.

Irrigation facilities in the district are very meagre and wells are by far the only source of irrigation.

INDICATORS NO. 2

Productivity of important crops :

Productivity of crops depends on equitable distribution of rain where there is absence of

adequate irrigational facilities. During the year 1960-61 agricultural production was at its peak in respect of a majority of commodities that being a fat year. The following table shows the production of different crops in 1960-61 to 1964-65:--

The production of a majority of crops during 1961-62 was lowest during the period 1960-61 to 1964-65 as a result of large scale damage to crops. Thereafter it improved during 1962-63, except for the out-turn of tur, groundnut and linseed. During 1963-64, the production had again gone down except Bajara, Tur, Cotton and Linseed. During 1964-65, the position slightly improved and production of majority of crops improved. However, the production in general was lower during all the four years as compared to 1960-61.

INDICATOR NO. 3

Gross value of agricultural production 60-61 to 1964-65.

As the harvest prices of various commodities are not available, this indicator has not been worked out.

Percentage of irrigated area.

The district ranked 8th in Vidarbha in 1964-65 so far as irrigation is concerned. The following table shows the percentage of net irrigated area to net sown area:--

It will be seen that irrigated area was very small in the district. The total irrigated area in the district was only 0.54% of the net area sown during 1964-65, due to very meagre irrigation facilities in the district. However, there is very slight improvement in and it the irrigated area in the district as a whole has increased from 0.40% during 1960-61 to 0.54% during 1964-65. During 1964-65, Pusad tahsil had maximum irrigated area while Wani tahsil had the least irrigated area. Darwaha tahsil which occupied fourth place in this respect amongst the five tahsils during 1960-61 now occupies second place in respect of irrigated area in the district during 1964-65.

The following table shows the percentage of gross irrigated area to the net area irrigated under all crops:--

It will be seen that the area irrigated more than once had sharply increased from 1.83 percent during 1960-61 to 13.83 percent during 1964-65. The increase in the area irrigated more than once was particularly notable from the year 1963-64 onwards. It is significant to note that there was sharp increase in gross irrigated area in Darwaha, Pusad and Yeotmal tahsil, during 1963-64 and 1964-65. During 1960-61 and 1961-62 net and gross irrigated area remained one and the same in Yeotmal, Kelapur, and Wani tahsils. Wani tahsil continued to have least gross irrigated area even during 1964-65 as in the past four years. During 64-65 Pusad tahsil had maximum gross irrigated area.

The area under food crops had also decreased from 51.77% during 1960-61 to 51.63% during 1964-65. This indicates that general preference for cash crops like cotton, groundnut, etc. increasing every year amongst the

cultivators of the district. Pusad tahsil had maximum area under food crops while Darwha tahsil has least area under food crops during 1960-61 to 1964-65. It is interesting to note that decrease in food crops is sharp in Wani tahsil as the area under food crops has decreased by 4.75% from 1960-61 to 1964-65. This decrease is least in Yeotmal tahsil (1.22%). In general, the decrease is worth-noting in Wani (4.75%), Kelapur (4.31%), and Darwha (3.53%) during 1964-65 over the corresponding area in 1960-61.

As stated earlier the tendency for non-food crops, such as Cotton, Groundnut, etc. is increasing during the past years. The area under non-food crops had increased from 45.23% during 1960-61 to 48.34% during 1964-65. The increase in area under non-food crops during 1960-61 to 1964-65 is pronounced in all the Tahsils of the district except in Yeotmal tahsil.

It will be seen that during 1964-65, out of the total irrigated area as high as 81.45 % is under food crops while only 18.55% is under non-food crops. This is due to the fact that vegetables and fruits classified under food-crops need irrigation. The irrigated area under food crops is however, decreasing every year which means that there is tendency to bring more non-food area under irrigation every year. Wani tahsil which was having all the irrigated area under food crops during 1960-61 still had maximum irrigated area under food crops even in 1964-65 as compared to other tahsils in the district. Darwha tahsil which occupies 4th place in respect of irrigated area under food crops occupied last place during 1964-65.

It is also seen that during the year 1960-61, only 10.88% of irrigated area was under non-food crops, whereas during the year 1964-65 the corresponding percentage increased to 18.55%. The tahsilwise comparative position is given in the following table.

Agricultural credit which plays an important part in development of agriculture, increased considerably from Rs. 96 lakhs during 1961-62, to 305 lakhs during 1965-66. The increase was nearly three times during past four years. Amongst tahsils maximum credit was given to Darwaha tahsil while it was least in Wani tahsil throughout the period from 1961-62 to 1965-66. The percentage of credits received by Darwaha, Pusad, and Yatmal tahsils had increased year after year while it was found to have gone down in Kalapur and Wani tahsils during 1965-66 as compared to the corresponding position in 1961-62. Maximum credit was made available to Darwaha and Pusad tahsil

during 1965-66 when the amount of credit received by each of these tahsils was nearly three and half times the amounts received during 1961-62. Dharwaha, Yeotmal and Pusad tahsils likewise received maximum credit during 1965-66 when it was 3.5, 3.5 and 3.7 times the credit received during 1961-62 by these three tahsils respectively.

It is seen that overdues have increased year after year. The overdues increased from Rs. 6.66 lakhs during 1961-62 to Rs. 147.01 lakhs at the end of 1965-66. Amongst the tahsils during 1965-66 maximum overdues were recorded in Darwaha tahsil while they were least in Wani tahsil which had received maximum and minimum credits respectively during 1965-66. Overdues in the district as a whole had increased by more than two times the overdues in 1961-62.

The percentage of overdues to the outstanding loan had increased from 4 during 1961-62 to 40 during 1965-66. The overdues sharply increased by 46% during 1962-63. This was due to the fact that the year 1962-63 was a lean year for agriculture and hence recoveries were lesser. However the position of overdues improved during 1963-64 and thereafter the percentage of overdues slowly increased. Amongst tahsils the percentage of overdue was least in Yeotmal tahsil during 1963-64 and it was highest in Kelapur and Darwha tahsil. During 1964-65 least overdues were found in Yeotmal tahsil and they were maximum in Kelapur and Darwha tahsils. Overdues in Yeotmal tahsil sharply increased during 1965-66. Overdues were highest in Kelapur tahsil and lowest in Pusad tahsil in 1965-66.

The agricultural wages have increased from Rs. 1.71 during 1953-54 to Rs. 2.06 during 1955-56 for male and from Rs. 0.79 to Rs. 0.88 for female. This increase worked out to be 20% for male and 24% for female over 1953-54. Amongst the three centres Kalamb centre had maximum wage rates for male and female while wage rates at Nar. centre for male as well as female were lowest during 1955-56.

Bovine (cattle and buffaloes) population per hectare of cultivable land has decreased from 0.91 in 1961 to 0.85 in 1966. Bovine population per hectare of cultivable land was highest in Pusad tahsil, while it is lowest in Kelapur tahsil during 1961 and 1966. The decrease in Bovine population per hectare of cultivable land is highest in Kelapur tahsil (16 %); while it is least in Pusad tahsil (2 %). However, Yeotmal tahsil had shown an increase of 1 % in bovine population per hectare of cultivable land.

As per 1961 Livestock Census the poultry per 100 persons in the district was 41, which sharply decreased to 21 during 1966 being slightly more than 50% decrease in five years.

Amongst talukas, poultry per 100 persons is highest in Wani taluk, while it is lowest in Pusad taluk both in 1961 and 1966. The decrease in poultry was highest in Kelapur taluk (58 percent); while it is least in Darwad and Yeotmal talukas (48 percent).

According to 1961 census, it is estimated that the district on an average had for 129.64 poultry birds (118.90 fowls and 10.74 ducks) as against 129.01 in Vidarbha and 137.40 in Maharashtra. Similarly, the district had 1.75% of improved fowls to total number of fowls as against 1.07 percent in Vidarbha and 1.69 percent in Maharashtra. It is also estimated that the number of eggs produced in the district is 47 as against 61 in Vidarbha and 84 in Maharashtra.

At the end of Second plan, the per capita consumption of electricity was 5.68 KWH. There was rapid development in rural Electrification during Third Plan period and the per capita consumption slowly increased to 12.65 KWH. during 1964-65. However the per capita

consumption slightly decreased during the last year of the plan period. The per capita consumption, it will thus be seen from the above table, had nearly doubled during the Third Plan period as compared to Second Plan period.

As stated earlier the progress of rural electrification was slow in the district. At the end of Second Plan, 9.82% of villages were electrified in the district whereas 9.82% of them were electrified at the end of Third Plan. Amongst the tahsils, Darwha tahsil had maximum number of villages (19.02%) electrified by the end of 1965-66 while Wani tahsil had the lowest percentage (2.30%) of villages electrified. The rate of progress of electrification is very rapid in Pusad tahsil as there is an increase of 14.16% electrified villages during Third Plan while the progress was lowest in Wani tahsil as the increase was only of 0.77% during the same period.

It will be seen that Registration of
candidates had increased by 13 Percent during 1962-63 but
thereafter it steadily decreased to 22 percent during
1965-66. The vacancies notified increased to 23 percent
during 1962-63 and reached its peak during 1963-64 when
the increase was of 146 percent. However the vacancies
notified suddenly fell and were 10 percent less than
in 1961-62 but the position improved slowly during

The percentage of vacancies notified to the registration during 1961-62 was 15 which increased during 1962-63 and it was maximum of 48 percent during 1963-64. However it suddenly decreased to 18 percent during next year and was lowest during 1965-66. Percentage of placements of candidates in Employment to the total registration was 11 percent during 1961-62 as against 15 percent of the vacancies notified. It increased to 12 percent during 1962-63 but suddenly decreased to 9 percent during 1963-64 though the percentage of vacancies notified showed a sharp increase during the same year. This indicates that though more vacancies were notified during 1963-64 the actual number of candidates placed in Employment was much less. The percentage of placements increased during 1964-65 but again decreased to 69 percent

during 1965-66. It was 73 percent during 1961-62 which slightly decreased to 72 percent during 1962-63. The decrease was very sharp during 1963-64, as only 18 percent of the vacancies notified could be filled in. However, the position considerably improved during 1964-65 and a maximum number of candidates (78 percent) were placed in Employment as compared to any all the five years. The percentage of placements to vacancies notified fall to 59 percent in 1965-66.

It is seen from the above table that at the end of 1961, 53416 out-door and 1084 indoor patients were treated per lakh population in District Hospitals of Yeotmal. The patients treated increased slowly in each year due to increase in hospital facilities in the district and by the end of 1965, 80,915 out-door and 1335 indoor patients per lakh of population were treated in the district. The increase in patients treated over 1961 was 51 percent for out-door and 23 percent for indoor patients. Among the tahsils maximum number of out-door patients treated per lakh of population were in Kelapur tahsil and they were least in Darwaha tahsil during 1965. The increase over 1961 is maximum in Kelapur tahsil, while it was least in Wani tahsil being only 26 percent. In respect of indoor patients, treated Yeotmal tahsil led by a big margin due to District Hospital located at Yeotmal town and in all accounted for 4968 indoor patients treated per lakh of population. The least number of indoor patients treated was in Kelapur tahsil with 25 indoor patients treated per lakh of population during 1965.

There were 15 beds per lakh ^{of} population in the district at the end of 1960 i.e. at the end of Second Five Year Plan. Considerable progress had been made during Third Plan period and there were 35 beds per lakh ^{of} population in the district at the end of 1965. This increase was due to increase in beds in District hospital and the establishment of Primary Health Centres in the district. Among the tahsils, Yeotmal tahsil had the maximum number of 114 beds per lakh ^{of} population during 1965. This was due to the fact that the District hospital and Women hospital are located at Yeotmal town. ^{Darwha,} Wani and Kelapur tahsils had 13 ¹³ and 17 beds per lakh of population. The growth of primary education during Third plan period was quite noteworthy. There was 5713 boys who attended primary school per lakh of population during 1961-62 which increased to 7540 during 1965-66. At the end of 1965-66 there was thus an increase of 32 percent over 1961-62. During 1965-66 Darwaha tahsil had the maximum number of boys attending primary school per lakh of population while Kolapur tahsil had accounted for the least number of boys. Though Kolapur tahsil had the least number of boys the growth of primary education was more as the increase in students during 1965-66 was of 42 percent over 1961-62. The growth was slow in Wani tahsil wherein the increase was only of 20 percent. The growth of primary education of girls was more rapid. There were 2749 girls students per lakh population in the district during 1961-62 and 4170 during

secondary schools was in the number of boys was 53 percent during 1965-66 over 1961-62 as compared to the increase of 32 percent in respect of boys in primary schools over the same period. Yeotmal tahsil with 2636 boys in secondary schools per lakh of population led other tahsils in the district while Pusad tahsil occupied for the least number of boys in secondary schools. There were only 737 girls attending secondary school per lakh of population in the district in 1965-66 as compared to 2368 boys. However, the increase in the number of girls in secondary schools during 1965-66 over 1961-62 was of 80 percent. Yeotmal tahsil had the maximum number of secondary girls students per lakh of population in 1964-65 while Pusad tahsil occupied for

1965-66. The increase during 1965-66 was of 52 percent over 1961-62, as compared to an increase of 32 percent for boys over the same period. As in the case of boys, Wani tahsil occupied first place amongst the tahsils in respect of attendance of girl students per lakh of population while Pusad tahsil which occupied third position in respect of boys was the last amongst all the tahsils in respect of girls students. The number of boys in secondary schools per lakh of population had increased from 1437 during 1961-62 to 2363 during 1965-66. The increase in

the least number of girls students per lakh of population in that year. Among the tahsils the percentage increase in girls students during 1964-65 over 1961-62 was maximum in Wani tahsil being 93. On 31-3-1962 the district ranked 11th in Maharashtra and 3rd in Vidarbha in so far as road

There were 2.2 banking offices in the district per lakh of population during 1961 which increased to 2.7 at the end of 1962 and remained constant thereafter. Thus increase in banking offices was of 23 percent in 1965 over 1961. No progress was, however, made in opening new banking offices in the district since 1962. Amongst the tahsils Yotnal tahsil had 3.9 banking offices per lakh of population being at the top in banking in this regards, while Kelapur tahsil with 2.0 banking offices per lakh of population was lowest. Gur prices have increased during 1964 but decreased during 1965. Steep ~~xxxx~~ rise in prices have been observed in case of wheat (113 %), Bajara, (110%), Gram dal(137%), Rice was not available in open market during 1965. However there is an increase of 58 percent in Rice prices during 1964. The commodities which have shown above 50 % but less than 75 % increase during 1965 comprise plaintains (72%), ground-nut oil(53 %) and tur dal(51%). Jowar and Meat prices have shown an increase of 40 % and 25 % respectively, in 1965 over their prices in 1963.

CHAPTER IV

THIRD FIVE YEAR PLAN

The Third Five Year Plan was the first Plan for the composite State and offered greater opportunities for refashioning the State's economy and reorienting it into all-sided growth. This Plan represented a phase in a programme of long term development for transferring radically the economy of the State during the subsequent three or four Plan periods. It also contemplated to rectify the various imbalances and even out the existing disparities.

During the first two Plan periods, comparatively smaller amounts were spent for the development of Vidarbha, as compared to the western areas of the State and as such additional allocations were made for the Third Plan Programme for Vidarbha, so as to make good the shortfalls. The additional allotments, thus, made were used for mainly accelerating the programmes for irrigation facilities, primary education and roads.

The total Third Plan outlay for Vidarbha was fixed originally at Rs. 88.18 crores and was subsequently revised to Rs. 98.42 crores. This amount of additional outlay was meant for augmenting agricultural production during Emergency. The allocation for the district level programme of Yeotmal district was fixed at Rs. 4.76 crores. The major portion of 38% of the total outlay was earmarked for Agricultural Programmes; whereas the programmes under Social Services, such as General Education, Public Health, Housing, Water Supply etc. were provided with an outlay equivalent to one fourth of the total outlay. Road Development programmes

were also undertaken on priority basis, and about 12 % of the provision was preserved for this programme.

All the programmes were implemented within the financial provisions made for them. The total expenditure on Plan schemes in the district was Rs. 5.84 crores, accounting for 23 % over and above the original outlay of Rs. 4.76 crores. Remarkable achievements were made in agricultural sector. Road Development programme and the Community Development programme also fulfilled the targets fixed.

Agricultural Programmes :

The various schemes under Agricultural Programmes, specially aimed at improvement in the agricultural productivity. Schemes for Soil Conservation, Minor Irrigation, propagation of improved agricultural practices, development of crops etc. showed a remarkable progress making substantial achievements. Other agricultural programmes comprised pertinent schemes for development of forests, fisheries and animal husbandry.

Agricultural Production :

Nearly half a crore of rupees were spent on schemes relating to Agricultural Production. An agriculture school was established at a total cost of Rs. 3.77 lakhs. The schemes relating to Agricultural Production received full response and more so during Emergency, when the production programmes were of vital importance. Under intensive cultivation programme, special campaigns were organised to propagate use of improved agricultural practices. The use of improved seeds was made quite common. The table below give the account of actual achievements in the district under different programmes:-

Soil Conservation :

Owing to the fact that this region has limited sources of irrigation, the programme of Soil Conservation by way of construction of bunds for preservation of soil moisture was quite important. This programme covered an area of 2.19 lakhs acre in the district and the total expenditure on this programme amounted to about a crore of rupees.

Minor Irrigation :-

Due to absence of large sources for water supply for irrigation purposes, minor irrigation works programmes in this district had to be necessarily implemented. A large amount was, therefore, provided for this purpose and the actual expenditure was of Rs. 87.02 lakhs being much more than the provision of Rs. 57.69 lakhs.

Animal Husbandry :-

The veterinary services were already established adequately during the first two Plan periods. During the Third Plan therefore, main emphasis was laid on the improvement and development of cattle breeds; 3 cattle breeding centres were started newly; while 3 bulls were located in various places in the district for the breeding purpose. Construction work of veterinary dispensaries was also undertaken and the targetted works were completed. The total expenditure on the programme was Rs. 2.67 lakhs, against the outlay of Rs. 2.08 lakhs.

Forests :-

The area under forests in the district was 2,99,458 hectares, forming 23.6 % of the total area of the district. The development plan for forests laid emphasis on new plantations of economic nature viz. plantation of teak wood and other timber etc. An outlay of Rs. 2.35 lakhs was proposed for the programme in this district. The actual expenditure booked was, however, double the provision of Rs. 5.81 lakhs. The plantation programme was vigorously completed covering an area of 1,450 acres against the target of 350 acres.

Fisheries :-

Fishery development programme in this division is limited to inland fisheries only. The programme included supply of prerequisites to fishermen

for netting purposes on subsidy basis and organisation of co-operatives of fishermen for their economic betterment. A total amount of Rs. 0.40 lakhs was spent on the programme.

II - Co-operation and Community Development :-

Co-operation :

Co-operative movement has taken tremendous strides in the State. The State Five Year Plans have sought the promotion of co-operative organisations through financial support for undertaking different economic activities in the form of subsidies, share capital investment and loan according to needs. The programme during the Third Plan was concentrated mainly on development of co-operative marketing and co-operative processing. Credit facilities to agriculturists through Credit Co-operatives and Co-operative farming were also envisaged in the programme.

An outlay of Rs. 34.77 lakhs was fixed for the entire programme under 'Co-operation' and a total expenditure of Rs. 32.90 lakhs forming 94 % of the corresponding Plan provision was booked. The expenditure on co-operatives for agriculture credit was Rs. 6.48 lakhs. Short term credits of nearly 4 crores of rupees and long term credits of nearly one crore of rupees were advanced during the course of plan period. The expenditure on co-operative marketing was of Rs. 18.63 lakhs; while on the programme of Co-operative farming, Rs. 7.79 lakhs were expended. A total number of 77 farming societies were organised for farming on co-operative basis. In view of Emergency, Consumers' Co-operatives became essential and hence 11 such co-operatives were organised in the district.

Community Development :

Community Development Programmes were continued during the Third Plan period under the new fold of Panchayat Samiti. The activities under this programme were undertaken very intensively resulting in a total expenditure of Rs. 120.13 lakhs, against the total provision originally made for Rs. 74.20 lakhs. There were five blocks of Stage I, eight of Stage II, one of post-Stage II and one of T.D. category in the district. The total expenditure on these C.D. Projects was Rs. 104.04 lakhs. Financial assistance of Rs. 12.86 lakhs was given to rural local bodies for local development works, while assistance to Village Panchayats amounted to Rs. 3.23 lakhs.

Small Scale and Cottage Industries :

For rural industrialisation, there was a programme of financial assistance to the artisans and craftsmen for forming their co-operatives. The total assistance to industrial co-operatives amounted to Rs. 0.27 lakhs; while the assistance to handloom weavers' co-operatives was to the tune of Rs. 0.16 lakh. The total expenditure on industrial development amounted to Rs. 0.43 lakhs.

Transport and Communications :

Transport by road has much more significance in the district, as it is ill-equipped with railway facilities. At the end of Second Plan period, the total road length was of 1,271 kms. which worked ^{out} ~~at~~ to more than 9 kms. of roads per 100 sq. kms. of area. A programme for expansion of road works was taken up during this Plan, which resulted in a total road length of 1,467 kms. by the end of this Plan, which in other words meant 11 kms. of roads per 100 sq. kms. The total expenditure on Road programme was Rs. 69.96 lakhs against the total provisions ^{of} Rs. 59.61 lakhs.

Social Services :

The expansion of Social Services was also given due importance in the Plan Programme. Under educational services, certain schemes aiming at providing schooling facilities to each of the villages were implemented. It was also envisaged to enforce compulsory education, which was actually taken up in the division during the latter part of Plan period. On the various programmes for the educational facilities, a total amount of Rs. 56.42 lakhs was spent, of which Rs. 52.54 lakhs were spent on the programmes relating to primary education. There were 284 villages in the district left without schooling facilities. During the Plan period, as many as 319 schools were newly opened, taking up the total strength in the district to over 1,500 schools. Another 50 secondary schools were newly started during the Plan period. For training facilities of teachers, a technical school was opened.

For engineering courses, a Polytechnic was newly started with diploma courses in Civil, Mechanical and Electrical Engineering.

The programmes for Public Health included mainly measures for control and eradication of epidemics and communicable diseases. It may be mentioned that these measures adopted for the control of diseases have shown tangible results. The total expenditure on the health service programmes amounted to Rs. 26.20 lakhs and twelve lakhs B.C.G. vaccinations were performed. On the Family Planning Programme, which was important one, the expenditure incurred was about Rs. 5 lakhs. Under medical services expansion programme, 50 beds were added to the civil hospitals. For labour welfare activities, Rs. 13.48 lakhs were expended during the Plan period.
