

## CHAPTER-I.

### 1.1 Introduction and location:

The district of Aurangabad occupying an area of 16,718.2 Kms. is situated in upper Godavari basin and in the extreme north-west of Marathwada with a population of 15,32,341 according to 1961 census. The district was known as Mulaka in different Vedic epic and Puranic ages. The Royal edicts of Ashoka also refer indirectly to a city in Marathwada petenikas i.e. the people of Paithan. The articulate history of the Deccan begins with Satavahana power which in 2nd Century B.C. saw the emergence of the Marathwada as a seat of mighty empire of the Satavahanas with their capital at Pratishthana (Paithan).

The district of Aurangabad has a long chequered and hoary past. In addition to its legendary background it was ruled by Kalarians, Satavahanas, the Parthians of Gujarat, the Chalukyas, the Rashtrakutas and the Yadavas. It was under the strain of Muslim invasion and between 1318 and 1347 it was a part and parcel of Delhi sultanate under Muhammed Tughlaq. Subsequently it formed parts of the Bahamani Kingdom and Nizam Shahi Kingdom of Ahmednagar. From 1724 to 1956 it formed part of Hyderabad State and since 1956 it is included in Maharashtra.

Amongst the notable Hindu writers of the District mentioned may be made of Salivahana, Mukund Raja, Dnanoba, Hemad Pant, Atmanayaka, Janardhan Pant, Sakanath, Kamadas Swami, Mukteshwar, Amritrao and Mahipati.

Aurangabad which was a great city in the past was founded on the site of village Khirki by Malik Ambar, the Prime Minister of Murtaza Nizam Shah who was an Abyssinian foreigner.

The first Mughal emperor lies buried in Kabul a foreign land, the second in Delhi, the third in Sikandra, the fourth in Lahore, the fifth in Taj at Agra and the last lies stratified in this soil. After paying a visit to Aurangabad in 1913, Forster entered the following remark in his diary.

"Here endeth India" as he found the journey between Samarkand to Aurangabad a long and trying one.

The district forms 5.5% of the total area of the state and 3.87% of the population of Marathwada. A small area in the north and north-west lying beyond the Satmala hills is actually situated in the Tapi basin. The northern portion lying between the Satmala hills and the central hill range known as Jalna hills is an upland plateau. The southern portion is comparatively low terminating at banks of the Godavari. In general the district slopes down towards the south and south-east. The district lies between the paralllers of  $19^{\circ} 17' 30''$  and  $20^{\circ} 40' 10''$  north latitude and between  $74^{\circ} 40'$  and  $76^{\circ} 40'$  east longitude.

#### 1.2 Boundaries:

It is bounded on the north by Jalgaon district on the east by Parbhani and Buldhana districts, on the south by Bhair district and a portion of Ahmednagar district and on the west by Nasik district and again by a portion of Ahmednagar district. The maximum length of the district from the north to the south is about 161 Kms. and from east to west is about 201 Kms.

#### 1.3 Administrative Set-up:

Aurangabad district is divided into three sub-division which are further sub divided into talukas and mahals as given in table No. 1.1

With a view to promote the development of democratic institutions and to secure greater participation of the people in development activities in local and government affairs one Zilla Parishad and 12 Panchayat Samities have been established in 1962. The areas under the jurisdiction of Zilla Parishad and Panchayat Samities correspond to the district and taluka boundaries respectively. The municipal towns are however not covered by them including the area of Aurangabad cantonment. The Zilla Parishad covers 98.7 percent of the area and 85.56 percent of the total population of the district.

The number of Villages and population included under the Zilla Parishad and each Panchayat Samiti along with the number of councillors and co-opted members are shown in table No. 1.2.

Two Subject Committees are presided over by the Vice President and four by two Chairman elected by the Zilla Parishad to preside over two specified Subject Committees each. The Deputy Chief Executive Officer works as Secretary of the Standing Committees while the District Heads of Departments work as Secretaries to the subject committees concerned. The co-ordination between the Sub-Committees is achieved through Standing Committee. The co-ordination between the subject committees is achieved through the Standing Committee which includes the Chairman of all the Subject Committees. The Panchayat Samities consist of all the councillors who are elected from the electoral divisions including the Block co-opted councillors and associate members. It is presided over by the Chairman who is elected by the Panchayat Samiti from amongst its members. The Block Development Officer works as Secretary to the Panchayat Samiti.

The Chief Executive Officer of Zilla Parishad and the Block Development Officer look after the development work in their jurisdictions.

#### 1.4 Area:

The district of Aurangabad covers an area of 16,353 Sq.Kms. according to the figures supplied by the Surveyor General of India and 16,718 Sq.Kms. according to figures supplied by State Land Records and Survey Department. Its area in Sq.Kms. is 16,718.2 Sq.Kilometres as per figures of State Land Records and Survey Departments. The rural area of district covers 16,479 Sq.Kms.

as per figures of State Land Records and Survey Departments.

The urban area of the District covers 104.4 sq.miles or 270.3 sq.kms. Rural area forms 98.4 % and urban area in the district accounts for 1.6% of its total area.

During the period 1901 to 1941 the district or its talukas underwent no major changes in boundaries. In 1950 twenty five enclave villages of Nasik, East Kandesh and Ahmednagar were transferred to Aurangabad district. Consequent upon the integration of Jagirs the taluka boundaries were reconstituted in April, 1950 and the new mahals of Khuldabad and Jafferabad were created. Soegaon mahal was carved out in 1953 by transferring 37 villages from Sillod taluka and 30 from Kannad taluka.

With the re-organisation of States on 1-11-56 the district was transferred from the erstwhile Hyderabad state alongwith the rest of Marathwada to Maharashtra.

#### 1.5 Topography.

In general the district slopes down towards south and south-east. The general elevation above sea level varies from 2000 to 2200 feet on the north and 1700 to 1900 feet towards the south.

#### 1.6 Hills & River System Soils:

Aurangabad district is divided into the Balaghat or uplands to the north and Ravanghat or lowlands to the south the latter terminating in the valey of the Godavari. The hills of Balaghat are a continuation of the hill range of the same name in Vidarbha. There are important and noted hills projections like Daulatabad, Ajantha, Chowka and Jyotsna. All these hills in the district have a terrace like appearance with flattened summits. The hills of the district comprise Satara, Mahadeo, Maholi, Kunkura, Sureanth, Satmala, Ajantha ghats and Aurangabad hills. Their average height is about 2,000 feet above the sea level but in places they also reach a height of about 3,000 feet. These hills consist mostly of trap rock with nodular limestone at some places.

The most important river of the district is the Godavari which runs along the southern boundary for about 127 miles separating Aurangabad, Ahmednagar and Bhir districts, its tributaries are Shivna rising in the Kannad hills, the Dhenda rising near Daulatabad, Ludhana flowing from the hills east of Aurangabad Kham which rises near Khuldabad and passess through the heart of Aurangabad town and Dheku which passess through Vaijapur taluka.

The Virbhadra flows through Paithan taluka and the Gahati passess through Ambad taluka. The river Purna which is the biggest tributary of the Godavari rises from the Kannad hills and flows through the northern talukas of the district. The J... .

passes through Bhokardan taluka. The other small streams and nallas are Yela, Sabhang, Virbudra, Kasner, Nanui, Dhori, Wagura, Sonuj, Bala, Dewra, Arnavati and Gulduth.

The prevailing soil of aurangabad district is black cotton soil of "Regur" formed by the weltering of the Trap rock. The geological formation of the district are 1. Middle traps of Deccan Teritary 2. The older Alluvial deposits of the Godavari and 3. The modern alluvial deposits of the Godavari & the other rivers forming the upper layer. The black cotton soil is rich in plant nutrients such as lime magnesia, iron and alkalies on which cotton and some of the dry crops flourish well. It swells and becomes sticky on weltering by water while on drying contracts and develops numerous cracks. The soil varies greatly both in its texture and depth. In the hilly tracks in the north it is deep and fairly rich. In the Godavari Valley, specially along the river banks it is very deep and fertile.

#### 1.7 (i) Climate.

The Climate of aurangabad is pleasant and agreeable during the greater part of the year. The climatic year may be divided into three short seasons, a moderately warm, wet season from June to September, a cool dry season from October to February and a dry season from March to May.

The rainy season which lasts from June to September is warm and pleasant during rains as the temperature does not fall below  $17^{\circ}$  and normally ranges between  $21^{\circ}\text{C}$ . to  $36^{\circ}\text{C}$ .. The winter Season is comparatively dry and starts from November and ends in February. January is the coldest month of the year. The mean maximum temperature in the month of May rises even as high as  $41^{\circ}\text{C}$ . Occassionally hot dry winds prevail in April and May. During Summer, the days are hot but nights are fairly cool. Thus the climate of Aurangabad is pleasant, charming and healthy.

At Aurangabad Centre the mean maximum temperature was highest in May ( $39.4^{\circ}\text{C}$ ) in the year 1965. The same was highest in the month of April ( $38.9^{\circ}\text{C}$ ) in the year 1966. The Chikalthana Centre has indicated the highest temperature in the month May ( $39.1^{\circ}\text{C}$ ) for the year 1965 and in April ( $38.6^{\circ}\text{C}$ ) for the year 1966. As regards mean minimum temperature in the month of December was the coolest at Chikalthana centre in 1965 and at Aurangabad centre in 1966 whereas <sup>the mean</sup> minimum temperature in the month of January was the coolest at Chikalthana centre in 1966 and at Aurangabad centre in the year 1965. The range between mean maximum and mean minimum was highest in February, 1965 and 1966 at both the centres.

The table No. 1.3 indicates the average temperature in three seasons of the years 1965 and 1966 for both the centres of Chikalthana and Aurangabad.

It may be noted that due to difference in altitude and topography rainfall is unevenly distributed in different parts of district.

On the basis of the district normal rainfall according to variation in rainfall ,the district can be classified into three district tracts namely (1)where the rainfall exceeds 750 millimetres (2) rather in sufficient rainfall tract with rainfall ranges between 650 to 750 millimetres & (3)poor rainfall tract with rainfall below 650 millimetres.

The table No.1.4 gives the talukewise normal rainfall (average of last 34 years between 1922-23 to 1955-56)as compared to the rainfall during the year 1965 and 1960.

From the table above it is evident that during 1965 rainfall exceeded 750 millimetres in the talukas of Kannad,Ahuldabad and Ambad.It ranged between 650 to 750 millimetres in Soegaon & Jalna whereas it was below 650 millimetres in Sillod,Bhokardan,Jafferabad Vaijapur,Gangapur,Aurangabad and Paithan.In the year 1966 three talukas viz. Bhokardan Vaijapur and Ambad had rainfall below 650 millimetres/and Soegaon had a highest rainfall of 1103.7 millimetres in 1960 in the district.

/\* Among all talukas Bhokardan had the lowest rainfall of 556.7 millimetres

The fact Finding Committee appointed by the Government of Bombay in 1960 reported that the rainfall is not dependable in the following areas which likely to be affected by scarcity conditions as follows.

<u>Area</u>	<u>Estimated frequency</u>
1. Vaijapur taluka	Once in ten years.
2. Gangapur taluka	Once in ten years

Thus the south western region of the district generally recording poor rainfall is more susceptible to crop failures due to in-adequate, irregular and untimely rains. The rainfall is unevenly distributed in the district leading sometimes, to scarcity conditions.

Table No.1:- This table furnishes the number of rainy days & total rainfall at selected centres in the district during 1965 and 1966. Out of 10 centres in the district for which data for 1966 is available, the highest rainfall was in Soegaon centre amounting to 1103.7 mms. and least was found in Bhokardan centre amounting to only 556.7 mms. The total rainfall of 10 centres was 7319.5 mms. during 1966 as against 6721.5mms. during 1965.

Table No.2:- This table gives the temperature of selected centres in Aurangabad district during 1965 and 1966. The average temperature in Aurangabad centre for 1966 was 26.5° centigrade against the average temperature of 26.7° centigrade during 1965.

Table No.3:- This table presents talukewise rural and urban population in the district according to 1961 census and variations with 1951 census. The district forms 5.46% and 3.89% of the state's area and population respectively. The highest percentage decade variation in population during 1951-61 was observed in Soegaon mahal being 47.48% and lowest was found in Ambad taluka being 22.85%.

Table No.4 :- This table deals with talukewise classification of villages according to the population ranges in 1961. As many as 1512 villages out of 1871 inhabited villages in the district have population below 999, denoting that about 80% of the villages in the district are small villages. Only 4 villages in Aurangabad district have population ranging between 5,000 to 9999.

Table No.5:- This table indicates talukewise classification of towns according to population ranges of 1961 census. A "town" or urban area is a place which has a municipality a cantonment or civil line or a population of 5,000 and over and atleast  $\frac{3}{4}$ th of male population is dependent on non-agricultural pursuits. In all 85.86% of the population of the district lives in rural areas whereas 14.14% of the total population constitutes urban population.

Khuldabad is the only one town having a population below five thousand and conversely there are no villages in the district with a population of 5,000 and over. There are only two large towns namely Jalna and Aurangabad. The former is a commercial centre and the later is a regional headquarter in addition to being an educational centre.

Table No.6:- This table presents the number of workers in each taluka of this district as per 1961 Census. As is evident from this table the active labour force in the district constitute about 53% of total population and 82.63% of the working population is engaged in agriculture indicating that agriculture is the most important economic activity in the district. Only 2.8% of the population is engaged in manufacturing industries which reveals the backwardness of the district in the field of organised industries. The district ranks 5th among the 26 districts of Maharashtra in so far as the percentage of workers engaged in agriculture, industry including agricultural labourer to the total workers is concerned. The total population of non-workers constitutes 47.09% of the total population of the district.

Table No.7:- This table gives distribution of population according to age group, mother tongue and religion in the district as per 1961 Census. The population according to age group 5-9 constitutes 15.64% of the total population in the district as per 1961 Census.

Table No.8:- This table indicates the sexwise population of Scheduled castes and Scheduled tribes in the district according to 1961 census. The scheduled castes and scheduled tribes formed 6.05% and 1.60% respectively of the total district population according to 1961 Census.

Table No.9:- This table indicates Land Utilisation in the district during 1964-65 and 1965-66. The net area sown in the district during 1965-66 decreased by 1.35% as compared to that in 1964-65. The gross cropped area during 1965-66 also decreased by 2.26% as against the same in 1964-65. The decrease was due to famine and scarcity conditions during 1965-66.

Table No.10:- This table deals with area under different crops in each taluka of the district during 1964-65 and 1965-66.

.It is evident from the table that the food crops dominated the cropping pattern of the district as the food crops constituted 73.15% of the total gross cropped area during 1965-66 in the district.The area under non-food crops during 1965-66 formed only 26.85% of the gross cropped area.Of the total area under food crops, the area under Jowar during 1965-66 was 45.49% which was the highest among the food-crops.The highest area under the total non-food crops was covered by cotton followed by the area under total oil-seeds during 1965-66, the respective percentages being 58.71% and 38.12% against the area of total non-food crops.

Table No.11:- This table indicates yield per hectare and out-turn of principal crops in the district during 1964-65 & 1965-66.The yield per hectare in respect of total cereals in the district decreased from 466 Kgs.in 1964-65 to 293 Kgs. in 1965-66.Similarly the out-turn of total cereals in the district during 1965-66 decreased by 36.93% over that in 1964-65.

Table No.12:- This table gives the area irrigated by different sources in each taluka of the district during 1964-65 & 1965-66.The total net area irrigated in the district during 1965-66, increased by 3.12% over the area in 1964-65. The well irrigation constituted major source of irrigation in the district as it accounted for 89.52% of the total net irrigated area in the district during 1965-66.

Table No.13:- This table indicates the area irrigated under different crops in each taluka of the district during 1964-65 and 1965-66.Area irrigated under total food crops accounted for 93.90% of the total area irrigated in the district during 1965-66 and the area irrigated under non-food crops formed only 6.10% of the total irrigated area in the district during 1965-66.

Table No.14:- This table gives the number of irrigation wells in each taluka of the district during 1964-65 and 1965-66.The total number of wells in use in the district during 1965-66 increased by 5.13% over that in 1964-65.

Table No.15:- This table gives the information regarding minor irrigation works excluding wells in the district during 1965-66. The total number of minor irrigation works in use during 1965-66 in the district was 8, the net area irrigated in the district during 1965-66 being 1047 hectares.

Table No.16:- This table gives data regarding major and medium projects in Aurangabad district as on 30-6-67. No major project was undertaken in the district during the period 1961 to 1967. Out of the 8 medium projects, the Sukhana project was completed during 1967. The gross area commanded under Sukhana project was 4160 hectares.

Table No.17:- This table gives the information regarding Agricultural Wage Rates of 3 selected centres namely Bidkin, Ajantha and Mahalgaon villages in the district during the years 1965- and 1966. The average wage rate of carpenters at Bidkin and Ajantha centres shown an increase, while the same has decreased in Mahalgaon centre in 1966 as against, 1965. The average wage rate of blacksmith remained constant at Rs. 3-50 at Bidkin centre during the year 1965 and 1966. The wage rates of the field labourers shown an increase at Bidkin centre during 1966 as against 1965.

Table No.18:- This table indicates the agricultural implements in each taluka of the district in 1966. Iron ploughs formed 83.45% of the total ploughs in the district in 1966. Electric pumps formed 4.22% of the total number of pumps used for irrigation. The total number of tractor in the district was 131 in 1966 of which the highest number of 26 was in Gangapur taluka.

Table No.19:- This table deals with data regarding Famine, scarcity and akin to scarcity conditions in Aurangabad district for 1966-67. There has been no famine or scarcity conditions in the district during 1966-67.

Table No.20:- This table indicates the talukewise figures of livestock in the district as per 1966 census. It is observed that the cultivable area per pair of bullock works out to 7.16 hectares. The poultry per 1000 population as per 1966 Census comes to 131.

Table No.21:- This table deals with Veterinary statistics in each taluka of the district during the year 1965-66 and 1966-67. One dispensary and 7 aid-centres were duly established in between the period 1965-66 to 1966-67. The number of animals treated between the period 1965-66 to 1966-67 has decreased by 4.79%.

Table No.22:- This table gives disease-wise livestock mortality in the district in 1965-66 and 1966-67. The attacks of diseases in the district in 1966-67 increased by 9.19% over that in 1965-66. The number of deaths in 1966-67 has increased by 16.83% over that in 1965-66.

Table No.23:- This table furnishes the total number of recognised slaughter houses and animals slaughtered in these slaughter houses in the district during the years 1965-66 and 1966-67. The number of animals slaughtered in recognised slaughter houses in the district increased by 18.54% in 1966-67 as against that in 1965-66.

Table No.24(A):- This table gives rangewise forest area in the district during 1965-66 and 1966-67. The total forest area in the district during 1966-67 increased by 13.02% over the area in 1965-66.

Table No.24(B):- This table gives major and minor forest products in the district during 1965-66 and 1966-67. The total value of forest products in the district decreased by 9.64% during 1966-67 as against 1965-66.

Table No.25:- This table is not applicable for this district.

Table No.26:- This table furnishes information about average daily employment of workers in factories in the district during the year 1966. Out of 86 working factories submitting returns, the highest number of workers was employed by ginning and Pressing factories, constituting  $27.73\%$  of the total workers.

Table No.27:- This table gives industry-wise distribution of working factories according to working strength in the district for the year 1965-66. The highest number of workers under the group 100 to 499 is found under the industries allied to agriculture, followed by industries under food except beverages.

Table No.28:- This table presents distribution of factories according to number of days worked in the district during the year 1966. The total number of factories which worked for more than 300 days in the year 1966 was 41 employing 2,645 workers.

Table No.29:- This table gives the employment exchange statistics in the district during the years 1965-66 and 1966-67. The number of registrations during 1966-67 recorded an increase of 34.59% over that of 1965-66. The number of candidates placed in employment decreased by 27.24% in 1966-67 as against that in 1965-66.

Table No.30:- This table deals with the occupational distribution of total registration and placement in Employment Exchange in the district during 1965-66 and 1966-67. The registration and placement under the group of clerical and related workers formed 35.18% and 63.22% of the total registration and placement respectively in the district in 1966-67 as compared to 31.60% & 53.89% in 1965-66.

Table No.31:- This table indicates the changes in the volume of employment in different industries as on 31-3-1966 & 31-3-1967. The number of reported employees under the group "services" as on 31-3-1967 formed 67.35% of the total number of reported employees under different industries as compared to 61.77% as on 31-3-1966.

Table No.32(A):- This table gives the Census of Government employees, 1966 in the district and number of persons employed as on 1st July, 66. The number of persons in the basic pay range Rs. 100 to Rs. 150 was found to be 2,723, which is the highest among all the pay ranges.

Table No.32(B):- This table gives the census of Government employees in the district during 1966. The number of employees in Revenue and Forest department was found to be highest, constituting 34.26% of the total employees.

Table No.33:- This table gives the statistics relating to Annual Survey of Industries in the district during 1961. The sugar factories and refineries and the spinning and weaving factories constituted 20.49% and 9.02% respectively of the total number of industries in the district, the value of their respective gross output being 20.97% and 20.57% of the total value of goods produced in all the industries in the district according to 1961 Census.

Table No.34:- This table gives the information about generation and consumption of electricity in the district during 1965-66 and 1966-67. The total electricity consumption in the district in 1966-67 increased by 22.01% over that in 1965-66.

Table No.35:- This table gives the number of towns and villages electrified and population covered in the district. The number of towns and villages electrified by 31-3-1967 was 10 and 280 respectively as against 10 and 159 by 31-3-1966. Total population covered by the towns and villages by 31-3-1967 also showed an increase of 24.90% over that by 31-3-1966.

Table No.36:- This table deals with the number of different types of co-operative societies working in the district during 1966-67. Out of 1649 co-operative societies, 1285 were credit societies and 364 were non-credit societies during 1966-67. Out of 1285 credit societies 1254 were Agricultural Credit Societies and 31 were Non-agricultural Credit Societies. Out of 364 Non-credit societies, 74 were Agricultural Non-credit societies and 290 were Non-agricultural Non-credit societies.

Table No.37:- This table gives statistics relating to Co-operative banks in the district during 1965-66 and 1966-67. The share capital of the District Central Co-operative Bank during 1966-67 increased by 41.72% over that during 1965-66. The short term loans advanced during 1966-67 by the Central Co-operative Bank increased by 41.00% over that during 1965-66.

Table No. 38:- This table deals with Primary Agricultural Credit Societies in each taluka of the district during 1965-66 and 1966-67. The total number of societies increased from 1,173 in 1965-66 to 1,175 in 1966-67. The membership increased by 7.04% in 1966-67 over that in 1965-66. The share capital of the societies also increased by 15.56% in 1966-67 as against 1965-66.

Table No. 39:- This table deals with other Co-operative Societies of different types in the district during 1965-66 and 1966-67. Among the Agricultural Non-Credit Societies the number of Agricultural Marketing societies rose from 14 in 1965-66 to 15 in 1966-67. The increase in the share capital of these societies being 11.17% over that the previous year.

Among Non-Agricultural Credit Societies, the number of salary earners societies in the district increased from 25 in 1965-66 to 26 in 1966-67 with the percentage increase of 12.49% in their share capital.

Table No. 40:- This table indicates operations of primary co-operative marketing societies in each taluka of the district during 1965-66 and 1966-67. There was one co-operative marketing society at district level and 15 societies at primary level in the talukas during 1966-67. The total value of sale of agricultural produce of primary societies during 1966-67 increased by 34.69% over that in 1965-66.

Table No. 41:- This table indicates the operations of other Co-operative societies of different types in the district during 1965-66 and 1966-67. The value of agricultural produce marketed by Agricultural Marketing societies during 1966-67 decreased by 18.68% over that in 1965-66. The value of milk and milk products purchased and sold by societies during 1966-67 showed an increased of 3.02% and 10.33% respectively.

Table No. 42:- This table deals with operations of regulated marketing in each taluka of the district during 1965-66 and 1966-67. The annual arrivals of all the commodities in all the regulated markets in the district increased by 647.91% in 1966-67 over that in 1965-66. The value of these arrivals also increased by 65.75% in 1966-67 over that in 1965-66.

TABLE NO.43.:- This table gives the number of registered money lenders and loans advanced by them in the district during 1965-66 and 1966-67. The number of money lenders decreased from 173 in 1965-66 to 167 in 1966-67. However, the total loans advanced by the money lenders increased by 37.98% in 1966-67 over that in 1965-66. The highest number of money lenders were found in Jalna for the years under review.

Table No.44.:- This table indicates medical facilities available through public and public aided bodies in each taluka of the district during 1965 and 1966. The number of hospitals, dispensaries, maternity homes, health centres, doctors, nurses and beds remained constant during 1965 and 1966. The total number of out-door patients in the district increased by 210.42% in 1966 over that in 1965.

Table No.45.:- This table indicates the births and deaths registered in the district during the years 1965 and 1966. There has been increase in the number of births, deaths and infant deaths in the district during 1966 as against 1965, the respective percentages of increase being 10.69, 25.12 and 22.85.

Table No.46.:- This table gives the information regarding number of deaths in the district due to important causes for the years 1965 and 1966. The number of deaths due to Malaria in the district during 1966 has decreased by 33.33% as compared to 1965. The number of deaths due to Small Pox considerably increased by 350.59%.

Table No.47.:- This table gives vaccination cholera inoculation statistics in the district during the years 1965 and 1966. The number of Primary vaccination above one year in the district during 1966 increased by 100.72% over that during 1965. The number of Cholera inoculation decreased by 37.12% during 1966 over that in 1965.

Table No.48.:- This table gives information about hygienic drinking water supply sources available in the rural areas in the district. The total number of villages with inadequate water supply was 511 in the district as on 15-6-1964. The number of villages without any drinking water source was 335.

Table No. 49.:- This table denotes the number of illiterates and percentage of literacy in each taluka of the district according to 1961 Census. The percentage of literacy was 17.88, which ranked the district as 21st among the 26 districts of Maharashtra. The percentage of literacy in rural and urban areas of the district was 14.27 and 39.76 respectively.

Table No.50.:- This table indicates the position of education in rural areas in each taluka of the district according to 1961 Census. In all, 85.72% of the rural population of the district was illiterate. Among the literates in rural areas 12.03% were literates without any educational standard. The percentage of rural population having education upto matriculation and above was 0.28. This indicates that the rural population in the district is backward in education.

Table No.51.:- This table presents the distribution of urban population according to educational standard in 1961 Census. It is observed that 60.24% of the urban population was illiterate. The percentage of literates without any educational standard was 16.91. Persons having educational standard upto Primary and Matriculation formed 17.36% and 4.34% respectively of the total urban population. The technical and non-technical diploma holders formed 00.17% whereas graduates and post graduates other than technical formed 00.63% of the total urban population. Technical graduates and post-graduates formed 0.35% of the urban population.

Table No.52.:- This table gives the number of institutions, pupils and teachers in the district during 1965-66 & 1966-67. The number of primary schools in the district rose from 1878 in 1965-66 to 1928 in 1966-67. The total number of pupils in primary schools increased by 4.16% in 1966-67 as against 1965-66.

The number of institutions under Secondary Education increased from 128 in 1965-66 to 138 in 1966-67. The total number of pupils also increased by 11.93% in 1966-67 over that 1965-66.

Table No.53.:- This table gives the statistics relating to benefits and concessions given to students of backward classes in the district during 1965-66 and 1966-67. The enrolment of total backward classes in the district during 1966-67 increased by 10.33% over that in 1965-66. However the concessions to total backward classes in the district during 1966-67 showed a decrease of 19.40% over that in 1965-66.

Table No.54.:- This table gives the information regarding the concession of free-education to economically backward classes in the district during the years 1961-62, 1964-65, 1965-66 & 1966-67. The total number of beneficiaries in 1966-67 increased by 6.05% over that in 1965-66. The total concessions granted during 1966-67 also increased by 10.08% over that in 1965-66.

Table No.55.:- This table denotes the expenditure on primary education in the district during 1965-66 and 1966-67. The total expenditure on primary education in the district during 1966-67 increased by 19.69% over the expenditure during 1965-66.

Table No.56.:- This table gives the classification of towns and villages without primary schools or schooling facilities by population ranges in 1961 census in the district during 1966 and 1967. The total number of villages without schools in the district decreased from 192 in 1966 to 178 in 1967.

Table No.57.:- This table indicates the length of railway routes in the district as on 31-3-1966 and 31-3-1967. The approximate average railway length per 100 Sq. Kms. works out to 6.2 Kms.

Table No.58.:- This table gives the road length according to category and surface in the district as on 31st March, 1961, 1966 and 1967. The total road length in the district excluding municipal roads increased by 6.81% as on 31-3-1967 as against 31-3-1966. The average road length as on 31-3-1967 works out to 7.79 Kms. per 100 Sq.Kms.. The surface under black-topped as on 31-3-1967 increased by 4.02% over that on 31-3-1966.

Table No.59.:- This table deals with the information regarding motor vehicles in operation in Aurangabad Region as on 31-3-1966 and 31-3-67. The total number of vehicles under different categories in operation as on 31-3-1967 increased by 29.00% over that in 31-3-1966.

Table No.60.:- This table gives the operational statistics of Nationalised Road Transport in Aurangabad division as on 31-3-66 and 31-3-1967. As the jurisdiction of the Aurangabad Division as on 31-3-1967 has changed as compared to that on 31-3-1966, data given in the table as on 31st March, 67 could not be compared with that on 31-3-1966.

Table No.61.:- This table deals with the Traffic Census on important roads in the district as on 7th November, 65. The Traffic Census was conducted on 21 countposts on State Highways in the district. The total traffic intensity per 24 hours of motor vehicles on state highway No.6-A was found to be highest at Deogaon count-post.

Table No.62.:- This table deals with postal, telegraph and telephone statistics in the district during 1961-62, 1964-65 1965-66 and 1966-67. The number of telephones and number of Radio Licenses issued and renewed in the district during 1966-67 considerably increased by 77.95% and 69.82% respectively as compared to that during 1965-66.

Table No.63.:- This table denotes the rural broadcasting statistics in the district as on 31-3-1966 and 31-3-1967. The number of villages in the district in which a receiving set was installed by the rural broadcasting department rose from 405 as on 31-3-1966 to 466 as on 31-3-1967. The rural population of villages having receiving sets as on 31-3-1967 increased by 15.48% over that on 31-3-1966.

Table No.64.:- This table deals with the income and expenditure of local bodies in the district during 1965-66 and 1966-67. The total income of the Village Panchayats in the district during 1966-67 decreased by 33.93% over the income in 1965-66. The total income of the Zilla Parishad in 1966-67 also decreased by 3.54% over that in 1965-66.

Table No.65.:- This table indicates the Panchayat Samiti-wise income and expenditure for the Village Panchayats in the district during 1965-66 and 1966-67. The total income and expenditure of the Panchayat Samities in the district during 1966-67 decreased by 33.93% and 9.62% respectively over that in 1965-66.

Table No.66-(A):- This table gives the headwise receipts of the Zilla Parishad of this district during the years 1964-65, 1965-66 and 1966-67. The total self-raised resources of the Zilla Parishad increased by 50.42% in 1966-67 over the same in 1965-66. However, the total revenue receipts including Government grants during 1966-67, decreased by 2.34% over that in 1965-66.

Table No.66(B):- This table presents the head-wise expenditure of the Zilla Parishad during 1964-65, 1965-66 and 1966-67. The total revenue expenditure of the Zilla Parishad during 1966-67 decreased by 8.45% over that in 1965-66.

Table No.67.:- This table deals with the Income and expenditure of Municipalities in the district during 1965-66 & 1966-67. The total income of all the municipalities in the district during 1966-67 increased by 26.73% over the same in 1965-66. The total expenditure of all the municipalities in the district during 1966-67 also increased by 9.97% over that in 1965-66.

Table No.68.:- This table indicates the plan expenditure in 1966-67 under different development sub-heads in the district. The expenditure under agricultural programme in the district during 1966-67 constituted 56.34% which is the highest percentage of total expenditure incurred on all heads of development. Under the head agricultural programme the expenditure on minor irrigation formed the highest percentage of expenditure, being 61.09%.

Table No.69.:- This table deals with important physical achievements under plan in the district during Third Five year plan and for 1966-67. Under the programme of agricultural development, no improved seeds were distributed during 1966-67. However, 547 quintals improved seeds of cotton were distributed during the same period.

2299 tonnes of Ammonium Sulphate were distributed during 1966-67. The additional irrigation potential in the district during 1966-67 was created to the extent of 15081 hectares as against 21248 hectares during the Third Plan Period. Two more agricultural credit societies were formed during 1966-67 with a membership of 6,700 as against 88 societies formed during Third Five Year Plan period with membership of 33,328. The new roads in the district during 1966-67 were constructed to the extent of 125.94 Kms. as compared to 136.77 Kms. during the Third Five Year Plan period.

Table No.70.:- This table indicates the C.D. Programme in the district as on 31-3-1967. In all, there were 20.5 number of blocks of C.P.A. pattern covering an area of 16447.8 sq.Kms. with population of 13.15 lakhs spread over 1879 inhabited villages in the district.

Table No.71.:- This table furnishes the expenditure incurred in different stages of blocks in the district upto the end of 1966-67. The total expenditure of stage-I, Stage-II and post stage-II blocks in the district as on 31.3.1967 increased by 9.05% over the expenditure as on 31.3.1966.

Table No.72.:- This table gives the physical achievements on selected items in all the blocks of the district during 1965-66 and 1966-67. The distribution of fertilizers in 1966-67 increased by 51.07% over 1965-66. The quantity of improved seeds distributed showed a decrease by 63.57% in 1966-67 over 1965-66. The area bunded in the district during 1966-67 increased by 125.86% over the area banded in 1965-66.

Table No.73.:- This table indicates the average retail prices of important commodities at District head-quarter during 1965 and 1966. The average retail price of wheat (Medium) for the year 1966 was Rs. 1=20 per Kg. as compared to Rs. 1=32 per Kg. during 1965. The average retail price of Wheat (Coarse) Potia decreased per Kg. to Rs. 1=14 in 1966, as compared to <sup>Rs</sup> 1=22 per Kg. in 1965. There has been no substantial change in the average retail price of Bajra (Local) during the years 1965 & 1966. The average retail price of Gram (whole) Gaoran increased to Rs. 1=43 per Kg. in 1966 as against Rs. 1=36 per Kg. in 1965.

The average retail price of Gram dal increased to Rs. 1=83 per Kg. in 1966 as against Rs. 1=69 per Kg. in 1965. The average retail price of Groundnut Oil was Rs. 4=46 per Kg. in 1966 as against Rs. 2=90 per Kg./<sup>in</sup> 1965. The average retail price of Vanaspati was Rs. 5=66/<sup>per Kg.</sup> in 1966/as against Rs. 4=20 per Kg. in 1965. The average retail prices under clothing and miscellaneous items of consumption also recorded an increase in 1966 as compared to 1965.

Table No.74.:- This table presents the consumer price index number for working class in the district for the year 1960-67 with the base year 1961. The general price index rose from 142 in January, 1966 to 146 in April, 1966 and continuously rose to 157 in August, 66 which remained constant in September, 1966, and declined to 156 in October, 66. It again increased to 159 in November, 66 and jumped upto 164 in January, 67 and 165 in February, 1967. However it declined to 159 in March, 1967.

Table No.75.:- This table gives the strength of police force & crime statistics in the district during 1965 and 1966. There has been no change in the total strength of police force during the years under review.

Table No.76.:- This table gives the information regarding crime statistics in the district during 1965 and 1966. The number of offences in the district during 1966 increased by 21.72% as compared to the offences during 1965.

Table No.77.:- This table gives the work disposed of in Civil and Criminal courts in the district during 1965 and 1966. While the original cases under Civil courts have increased, the original cases (regular) under criminal courts have decreased during 1966 over that in 1965.

Table No.78.:- This table gives the Cinema statistics in the district during 1965 and 1966. There has been an increase of one Cinema theatre during 1966. The seating capacity per show also increased during 1966 as against, 1965.

Table No.79.:- This table gives the number of Banking offices in the district as on 31-3-1967. The Bank offices were located in 38 towns and villages in the district covering a population of 2.85 Lakhs.

Table No.80.:- This table indicates the number of Joint Stock Companies in the district during 1965-66 and 1966-67. The total number of Joint Stock Companies in the district increased from 13 in 1965-66 to 15 in 1966-67.

Table No.81.:- This table furnishes the information on number of insurance policies issued and amount insured in the district during 1965-66 and 1966-67. The table shows a decrease of 20.23% and 15.17% in the number of insurance policies issued and amount insured during 1966-67 as against the same during 1965-66 respectively.

Table No.82.:- This table gives an account of the collection of Small saving in the district during 1965-66 and 1966-67. The gross collection during 1966-67 decreased by 36.59% over that in 1965-66.

Table No.83.:- This table furnishes the information regarding Land Revenue collection in each taluka of the district during 1965-66 and 1966-67. The land revenue collection in the district for the year 1966-67 was 82.44% of the total demand as against collection being 76.23% of the total demand in 1965-66.

Table No.84.:- This table gives the number of presses, Newspapers and periodicals printed in the district as on 31-3-1967. The highest number of printing presses are found in Aurangabad taluka followed by Jalna.

Table No.85.:- This table furnishes the statistics relating to General Election held in 1967 in the district. The percentage of votes polled to total electorates for Aurangabad and Jalna parliamentary constituencies was 57.82 and 49.78 respectively.

Table No. 86 :- This table gives the trends in selected indicators of development in the district during 1950-51, 1950-56, 1960-61, 1965-66 and 1966-67. The total gross cropped area in the district increased by 3.11% during 1965-66 as against the gross cropped area during 1960-61. The net area sown per agricultural worker for the year 1965-66 was 1.90 hectares as against 1.87 for 1960-61. The percentage of area sown more than once to net area sown in 1965-66 was 5.89 as against 4.12 in 1960-61. The percentage of net irrigated area to net area sown in 1965-66 was 5.32 as against 3.60 in 1960-61. The percentage of gross irrigated area to gross cropped area in 1965-66 was 5.71 as against 4.35 in 1960-61. The number of workers employed in registered factories per lakh of population was 369 during 1966-67 as against 386 in 1965-66. The percentage of school going boys and girls to the total population in the age group of 6-11 years increased from 54.1 and 18.6 in 1960-61 to 68.5 and 28.4 in 1966-67 respectively. The percentage of primary school going children to total population increased from 9.97 in 1965-66 to 10.39 in 1966-67.

This Chapter deals with important selected indicators furnishing comparative study of the achievements in important selected sectors of economy.

Indicator No.1 :- Percentage of Gross sown area to net sown area for the year 1961-62, 1964-65 and 1965-66.

The percentage of gross cropped area over net cropped area mainly indicates the extent of double cropped area in a particular year. The possibility of double cropped area is highly co-related with the availability of water. Due to scanty and insufficient rains in Aurangabad district double crops can be grown mainly on irrigated lands. No special efforts were made to bring additional area under irrigation prior to the implementation of First Five Year Plan and even during the year 1965-66 only 5.71% of gross cropped area was brought under irrigation. The percentage of gross cropped area to the net cropped area in Aurangabad district decreased from 106.87 in 1964-65 to 105.89 in 1965-66. However, the percentage of gross cropped area to the net cropped area in the district during 1965-66 has slightly increased as compared to the same during 1961-62.

It may be seen that during the year 1965-66 maximum percentage of gross cropped area to the net cropped area was observed in Jalna taluka, it being 110.97 while the minimum was found in Soegaon taluka. Thus the range of variation comes to 100.39% to 110.97%.

The comparison of figures in 1965-66 with those in 1961-62 indicates that there is decrease in percentage of gross cropped area over net cropped area in the case of Soegaon, Bhokardan, Jafferabad and Gangapur talukas while for Khuldabad percentage is unchanged and in the case of remaining talukas it is increased.

The comparison of figures of 1965-66 with those of 1964-65 shows that there is a decrease in case of Ambad, Jalna, Aurangabad, Gangapur and Bhokardan talukas while in case of all other talukas it is increased. Except in case of talukas of Sillod, Soegaon, Vaijapur and Paithan there is also a decrease in gross cropped area during 1965-66 as compared to same in the year 1964-65.

Indicator No.2:- Productivity of important crops.

This indicator denotes the productivity of important crops in Aurangabad district during 1965-66 as compared to the same in 1961-62, 1964-65. The table No.11 of the District Statistical Abstract indicates the yield rate of important crops in the district during the year 1964-65 and 1965-66. The following table gives the yield rate per hectare in Kg. of important crops in the district during 1961-62, 1964-65 and 1965-66.

It is observed from above table that the yield rate per hectare decreased considerably in the year 1965-66 as compared to that in 1961-62 and 1964-65. This was due to the famine and scarcity conditions in the district during 1965-66.

1337 villages were affected by famine and chronic scarcity in the district during 1965-66. However, yield rate of sugarcane increased during the year 1965-66 over the years 1961-62 and 1964-65. Although the yield rate of chillies in 1965-66 has decreased as compared to 1964-65, yet it shows an increase as compared to that in 1961-62.

Indicator No.3:-Gross value of agricultural Production.

This indicator furnishes the gross value of the agricultural production in Aurangabad district during the year 1965-66.

The gross value of important crops of the district during 1961-62, 1964-65 and 1965-66 is given in the following table.

The value of agricultural produce has been arrived at by multiplying the total produce by harvest price.

It is evident from the above table that except in the case of sugarcane, the value of all other commodities has decreased in 1965-66 as against 1964-65. The decrease in the value of production inspite of increased prices is due to lesser production in 1965-66 owing to famine and scarcity conditions in the district.

However as compared to 1961-62 increase is observed in case of Wheat, bajra, other cereals, gram, tur and sugarcane in terms of gur mainly due to considerable increase in the prices during 1965-66 as compared to prices in 1964-62.

Indicator No.4:-Percentage of Irrigated Area.

This indicator deals with the percentage of net irrigated area with the net cropped area. The availability of water is important not only because it increases the yield rate but also because it brings area under double crops.

It is observed that the percentage of net irrigated area to net cropped area increased in case of all talukas except Aurangabad during 1965-66 as compared to the same in the year 1961-62.

however, as compared to the year 1964-65 it is noticed that in case of talukas Soegaon, Bhokardan, Jafferabad, Jalna, Paithan and Ambad percentage of net irrigated area to net cropped area decreased while in case of other talukas it is increased. The decrease is mainly due to scanty rainfall during 1965-66.

Indicator No.5: Change in the crop pattern.

This indicator denotes the changes in the crop pattern in Aurangabad district during 1965-66 as compared to the same in 1961-62 and 1964-65.

It is evident from the above table that in 1965-66 area under food crops in the district was less than the previous year but it is greater as compared to that in 1961-62. The percentage of total food crops to gross cropped area slightly increased in the year 1965-66 over the years 1961-62 and 1964-65 from 71.80% and 72.47% to 73.15% and percentage of total non-food crops declined in the same period from 28.20 and 27.53% to 26.85% respectively.

It is observed that area under cereals during the year 1965-66 increased over 1964-65 whereas the same declined under pulses during the same period. Percentage of cereals to gross cropped area in 1964-65 and 1965-66 were 51.65 and 53.28 respectively.

Indicator No.6: Increase in agricultural credit, outstanding dues and Gross value of agricultural production.

This indicator points out the increase in agricultural credit, outstanding dues & gross value of agricultural production in Aurangabad district.

Due to the recent expansion in the Seva societies almost all villages in the district have got the facilities of getting agricultural credit at village level. During the year 1961-62 in Aurangabad district there were only 1,108 agricultural credit societies with membership of 61,945. During 1966-67 the number of societies increased to 1,175 having membership of 1,13,073. The membership is followed by similar trends in advances and increase in number of societies and outstanding dues.

It may be observed from the table that as compared to advances in 1961-62 the amount of advances during the year 1966-67 have increased considerably in the district. The minimum percentage increase of 62.21 is observed in Soegaon taluka while maximum percentage increase of 1,276.27 is observed in Khuldabad taluka. Corresponding increase is also observed in amount of outstanding dues the highest percentage increase of 3,243.85 is observed in Vaijapur taluka while lowest percentage increase of 171.33 is observed in Ambad taluka.

The amount of credit per acre of cultivated land during the year 1966-67 comes to Rs. 16 only.

Indicator No.7 : Agricultural Wage rates:

This indicator gives the agricultural wage rates in the three selected centres in Aurangabad district during the years 1965 and 1966.

The table No.17 of the abstract deals with the agricultural wage rates of the selected centres of the district in the year 1965 and 1966. From the table it is evident that average wage rates of carpenters of Ajantha centre in Sillod taluka were the highest i.e. Rs.4.86 and Rs.5.00 as compared to the average rate of carpenters of Bidkin in Paithan taluka and Mahalgaon in Vaijapur taluka in the year 1965 as well as in 1966 respectively. The wage rates of blacksmiths at Ajantha centre were also higher than other two centres of the district i.e. Rs. 4.88 and Rs.4.00 for the years 1965 and 1966 respectively.

The average rates/ unskilled field labourer (males) in Ajantha, Bidkin and Mahalgaon centres in the district during the year 1965 were Rs..1.21, Rs.1.81 and Rs.2.14 respectively. The average wage rates in the same centres during the year 1966 were Rs.0.88, Rs.2.15 and Rs.2.25 respectively.

Indicator No.8. Livestock per hectare of land.

This indicator gives the position of livestock per hectare of land in Aurangabad district as per 1961 and 1966 Census.

In an agricultural country like India the importance of working cattle can scarcely be exaggerated. The livestock have an important bearing on the total output of agricultural production, as agriculture is a non-mechanised industry in India the cattle supply is the most important motive power for almost all agricultural operations, such as ploughing, lifting of water and transport of produce to the market.

The number of working bullocks in the district rose from 3.80 lakhs in 1961 to 3.85 lakhs in 1966 Census. The cultivable area of the district as a whole as per 1966 Census comes to 7.16 hectares per pair of working bullocks as per 1966 Census is found in Ambad taluka whereas the lowest area per pair of bullocks is in Paithan taluka. The cultivable area per pair of bullocks is varying between 5.40 and 9.61 hectares. As against total cultivable area 13.80 lakhs hectares the total bovine and ovine population in 1960 was 12.77 lakhs. The bovine and ovine population per 100 hectares land works out to 92.

Indicator No.9:-Poultry as compared to population.

This indicator denotes the position of poultry as compared to population in Aurangabad district.

During Third Plan period special programme for poultry development consisting of training for poultry breeding and supply of improved poultry and loans for poultry keeping was chalked out and implemented. As per the Census of 1966 total number of poultry in Aurangabad district was 2.01 lakhs as against 2.23 lakhs during year 1961. This indicates a decrease of 0.22 lakhs over the period 1961.

It may be observed from the above that the ratio of poultry to the population as per 1966 Census was highest in Soegaon taluka while the same was lowest in Ambad taluka. The range of variation was considerably wide as the maximum ratio was 218 while the minimum was 95 only.

Indicator No. 10: Per Capita consumption of electricity:

This indicator denotes the per capita consumption of electricity in Aurangabad district during the years 1964-65, 1965-66 and 1966-67.

The total electricity consumed during the years 1964-65, 1965-66 and 1966-67 was 79.26, 111.88 and 136.51 lakhs of K.W.H. respectively. The percentage increase in the consumption of electricity during 1966-67 over the same in 1964-65 comes to 72.23. The per capita consumption of total electricity in the district during the years 1964-65, 1965-66 and 1966-67 works out to 5.17 Kwh, 7.3 Kwh and 8.90 Kwh respectively.

Indicator No.11:-Increase in number of candidates enrolled in Employment Exchange & vacancies notified.

This indicator denotes the increase in number of candidates enrolled in Employment Exchange and vacancies notified in Aurangabad district during the years 1961-62, 1965-66 and 1966-67.

Continuous increase in un-employment despite various efforts made for creation of employment opportunities is still a problem to be solved. Un-employment is observed not only in skilled and un-skilled workers but also in educated classes having degrees and diplomas in various university courses.

From the statistics maintained in Employment Exchange it is observed that there is a continuous rise in the registrations and also in the vacancies notified. The table below indicates the number of registrations and vacancies notified during the years 1961-62, 1965-66 and 1966-67.

It is seen that number of out-door patients treated increased tremendously in all the talukas except Vaijapur and Jalna where the same has decreased.

Indicator No.13:-Increase in number of students in different categories of schools

This indicator denotes the increase in number of students in different categories of schools in Aurangabad district during the years 1960-61, 1965-66 and 1966-67.

The number of primary schools in Aurangabad district rose from 1,308 in 1960-61 to 1,878 in 1965-66 and 1,928 in 1966-67. The number of pupils also increased by 69.97% in 1966-67 as compared to that in 1960-61.

The number of institutions in secondary education also increased. The number of secondary schools rose from 71 in 1960-61 to 128 in 1965-66 and 138 in 1966-67. The number of students attending secondary education also increased tremendously by 143.92% in 1966-67 as compared to that in 1960-61.

As regards higher education the number of institution decreased from 17 in 1965-66 to 16 in 1966-67; but the number of students increased by 22.47% during the year under report. The number of special institutions has increased from 20 in 1965-66 to 29 in 1966-67. But the number of boys attending special schools during the period under review decreased from 1,638 in 1965-66 to 1,507 in the subsequent year. However, the number of girls increased from 278 to 335 during the year under reference.

#### Indicator No. 14:- Increase in road length per 100 Sq.Kilometres

This indicator denotes the increase in road length per 100 sq.kilometres in Aurangabad district from March, 1961 to March, 1967. The length of road per 100 sq.kilometres in the district <sup>rose</sup> from 5.79 kilometres in 1961 to 7.79 kilometres in 1967.

The total length of the roads in the district under all categories as on March, 67 increased by 34.23% as compared to total length as on March, 1961. This increase was more prominent in case of major district roads it being 43.41%. The increase in State highways and other district roads being 15.10% and 16.10% respectively.

Indicator No.15: Increase in banking facilities in proportion to population

This indicator denotes the increase in banking facilities in proportion to population in Aurangabad district, as at the end of March, 1967.

The banking activities play important role in mobilisation of idle resources and provision of capital to different economic sectors. Prior to the organisation of District Co-operative Bank the banking activities were mainly concentrated in urban areas.

In the year 1960-61 there were only 8 schedule banks in the district while at the end of Third Plan there were 11 scheduled banks. At the end of March, 1967 the number of Scheduled banks was 16. This means during the year 1966-67 as many as 5 new offices of Scheduled banks were opened. The average population served by one branch comes to 25,972.

The District Central Co-operative banks which caters mainly in the needs of cultivators was having 43 branches in the district at the end of March, 67. During the year 1960-61 there were only 20 branches of District Central Co-operative Bank while at the end of Third Plan there were 32 branches of the same. This indicates that 11 new branches of District Central Co-operative Banks were newly started.

Indicator No.16.: Prices

This indicator denotes the trends in prices of important commodities in Aurangabad district from first week of November, 1962 to the first week of November, 1966. Increasing trends in prices were also observed during the year 1966-67.

The rice was not available in the open market during both the year 1965 and 1966. Though the prices of wheat during 1966 decreased as compared to prices in 1965 the percentage increase of prices during 1966 over 1961 was as high as 101.75. The supply of jowar was made on Fair price shops only and here too an increasing trend in prices was observed. The prices of bajra as in the case of wheat decreased during 1966 as compared to 1965 though the percentage increased over 1962 was as high as 81.25.

The prices of pulses continued to show increasing trends during 1966 over the prices during 1965. The highest percentage increase of 226.15 over prices during 1962 was observed in case of gramdal, while lowest percentage increase over 1962 prices was observed in case of masur dal.

Though increasing trends were observed in the case of remaining items of food except milk the increase in the prices of sweet oil and vanaspati ghee was more steep.

March, 66 earmarked the end of Third Plan. As the finalisation of Fourth Plan was delayed due to preoccupation of Central Govt. on border troubles it was decided to formulate and implement Annual Plans as interim Plan.

The schemes included in the Annual Plan 1966-67 have also/distributed in three categories on the basis of their field of operation i.e. State level schemes, Divisional level schemes and District level schemes. Review of District level Plan schemes implemented in Aurangabad district is taken in following paragraphs.

The main head-wise expenditure during 1966-67 is indicated in the table given below

The above table indicates that major part of the expenditure during the period of Annual Plan 1966-67 was rightly booked on Agricultural Programmes. Investment and expenditure in agrarian sector is essential as the economy of the District is predominantly an agrarian economy, cultivation of land being still a main occupation of 82.62% of population in the district.

Discussion regarding the sub-head-wise expenditure booked under the respective main heads is made in following paragraphs.

AGRICULTURAL PROGRAMME.

Agricultural Production

Under the sub head "Agricultural Production" schemes directly relating to the cultivation of high yielding varieties have been included and the expenditure to the extent of Rs. 7.04 Lakhs was booked on these schemes. The scheme "Development of Cotton" was implemented for procurement and distribution of pure and improved seed. The expenditure of Rs. 0.13 lakh was incurred on this account and 547 Quintals of cotton seed was distributed during the period of Annual Plan 1966-67. Under the scheme "Development of Horticulture" loans to the extent of Rs. 1.00 lakhs were distributed to the cultivator for new plantation or renovation of trees. Under the scheme local manurial resources, by booking expenditure of Rs. 0.88 Lakhs town compost and rural compost to the extent of 16,454 tonnes was applied to the land.

The scheme "Plant Protection Services" was implemented to supply the implements for crop protection. Rs. 0.70 Lakh were spent for supply of 455 implements like dusters and sprayers. Land to the extent of 1,34,055 acres was covered under the programme of intensive cultivation and expenditure of Rs. 0.30 Lakhs was incurred for the same. Scheme for special Kharif, Rabi and Summer campaign mainly for propagation of hybrid seeds was implemented and amount of Rs. 1.76 Lakhs was utilised for the same. The acreage covered under this campaign was 8,918 for Kharif, 4,124 for Rabi and 639 for summer. The provision made for taluka seed farms was utilised for construction of buildings on taluka seed farms. The amount of Rs. 2.27 lakhs was spent on different construction works.

Land Development

During the Annual Plan 1966-67 one more division of consolidation office was opened and for primary establishment of office amount of Rs. 0.84 lakhs was utilised.

Minor Irrigation

In addition to the major and medium irrigation works, programme of minor irrigation works was included in the main head of Development "Agricultural Programmes". Loans to the extent of Rs. 13.08 lakhs were advanced for construction of irrigation wells, and 2,680 new wells were constructed during 1966-67. Similarly loans of Rs. 31.18 lakhs were advanced for installation of 4,345 pump sets under the scheme "Minor Irrigation Works". Work of 6 tanks i.e. Soegaon, Banoti, Amthana, Yelganga, Deogaon and Nirgudi tanks was completed. The proposed irrigation potential of these tanks comes to 7,705 acres. In local sector work of 19 Bandharas, 6 percolation tanks and 23 lift irrigation/taken in hand. During the year 1966-67 no work was completed.

Soil

Conservation

The programme of only contour bunding was continued under the sub-head "Soil Conservation" as against the expenditure of Rs. 36.87 lakhs 54,993 <sup>hectares</sup> of land was banded.

Animal Husbandry

Programme of animals husbandry consisted of only four schemes. Construction of two building for veterinary aid centres was completed at the cost of Rs. 0.48 lakhs under the scheme "Construction of building for establishment of veterinary Dispensaries and Aid Centres". One cattle breeding centre was established in Gangapur taluka, by way of spending Rs. 0.11 lakh under the scheme "Supplementary Cattle Breeding Centres and Organisation of Breeders Societies."

The scheme "District Premium Bull" was continued during Annual Plan 1966-67 and 36 bulls were located at the cost of Rs. 0.24 Lakh .Loans of Rs. 0.21 Lakh were advanced to 23 persons for poultry breeding under the scheme "Grant of Loans for Poultry Development".

#### Dairy Development

Town Milk Supply scheme and assistance to Milk societies and Federations were the only two schemes implemented under the sub-head "Dairy Development".The expenditure of Rs. 0.79 Lakh was booked on Town milk supply scheme while expenditure of 0.07 lakh ruppes was booked on assistance to milk societies and Federations. This amount was given to eight societies supplying milk to the Govt. Milk scheme.

#### FORESTS

The total expenditure of Rs. 2.88 lakhs was made on six different schemes relating to forests. For maintenance of one central nursery amount of Rs. 0.23 lakh was spent. As against the expenditure of Rs. 1.12 lakhs pre-monsoon work for plantation over 100 acres under the scheme "Development of Pastures and Fodder Resources" was done.Pre-monsoon work over 200 acres for plantation of fuel wood and bamboo each was completed at the cost of Rs. 0.32 lakhs and 0.15 lakh respectively under the schemes "Fuel plantation" and "Bamboo Plantation". As much Rs. 1.06 lakhs were spent for undertaking the programme of "Afforestation for Soil Conservation".Area of 55 acres was covered under this programme.

#### FISHERIES

As there is no scope for marine Fisheries the programme of only inland fisheries could be undertaken in this district. During Annual Plan, 1966-67 expenditure of Rs. 0.20 was booked on only three schemes under this sub-head of Development. The expenditure of Rs. 0.09 lakhs was booked on the scheme "Fish Farming in Impounded Water" and carp fry/<sup>to the</sup> extent of 48,47,500 were stocked in different reservoirs and as its return 22,607 Kg.of fish was netted.

#### WARE HOUSING AND MARKETING

Only one scheme i.e. "Agricultural Marketing" was implemented under the sub-head "Ware-housing and marketing" and expenditure of Rs. 0.41 lakhs was booked by advancing loan to one market Committee for regulation of market.

#### CO-OPERATION & COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT

Another important Head of Development is "Co-operation and Community Development". The total expenditure on sub-head co-operation was 0.37 lakh Rs, while the same on community Development was Rs. 21.41 lakhs. Scheme-wise progress is dealt with with in following lines.

#### CO-OPERATION

The scheme "Strengthening of co-operative structure at all level" was continued and the expenditure to the extent of Rs. 1.15 lakhs was booked on the same. This expenditure comprises the expenditure on scheme capital contribution, managerial subsidy to the newly organised societies and loans and subsidy to the central Financing Agency for opening of new branches. The programme of Development of co-operative marketing was rightly followed to link up the credit with marketing. As much as 5.06 lakhs of Rs. were spent under this scheme. Most of this expenditure was done on construction of medium and small size Godowns. The scheme of "Co-operative Farming inside and outside "Pilot Areas" was also continued but as <sup>only one</sup> new society could be organised expenditure of only 0.06 lakhs could be made towards advancing loans to the <sup>and during 1960-67</sup> societies organised during Third Plan period. The scheme of organisation of consumers stores was implemented to make available the articles of day to day consumption at less cost. Expenditure of Rs. 0.10 lakh was booked on this scheme.

#### COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT

The expenditure on Community Development blocks and allied programmes to be undertaken at taluka and village level have been included under the sub-head of development "Community Development". The expenditure on C.D. blocks was debited to the scheme "Community Development Projects".

The programme of Applied Nutrition was taken up in Jalna block and expenditure of Rs. 0.17 lakhs was booked on this scheme. The scheme of Rural works programme was implemented in blocks Kannad, Vaijapur, Ambad, Sillod and Jafferabad. Expenditure incurred on this scheme in all these blocks was Rs. 0.44 lakhs. Expenditure made on construction of drinking water wells was made under the scheme "Financial assistance to Rural local bodies for local works programme". As much as Rs. 2.09 lakhs were spent on the works of drinking water wells taken up in different villages.

#### INDUSTRY AND MINING SMALL SCALE INDUSTRIES

Very negligible amount i.e. Rs. 0.58 lakh was booked on the head Industry and Mining. Except sub-head small scale Industries expenditure was not booked on any other sub-heads. As there was no scope for organisation of new handloom weavers societies and also the existing societies were not entitled for additional loans amount of Rs. 0.42 was spent on spinning rebate on hand-loom., cloth under the scheme Development of hand-loom. Loans to the extent of Rs. 0.16 lakh were advanced under the scheme "Industrial Co-operatives including co-operatives of handicraft workers."

#### ROAD DEVELOPMENT

The programme of "Road Development" during the period of Annual Plan, 1966-67 consisted of only two schemes. As against the expenditure of Rs. 22.78 lakhs 75 C.D. works were completed and progress of road construction was as below. Earth work 16.26 miles, metal collection 68.27 miles, consolidation 71.31 miles. The expenditure of Rs. 10.15 lakhs was booked on the scheme "Road under Public Participation". Under this scheme the programme of construction of village roads was undertaken.

#### SOCIAL SERVICES

As much as 16.80% of total expenditure was booked on main head "Social Services". The programmes of social, cultural and economic up-lift have been undertaken under this head of development. The sub-head wise progress of schemes is described below.

Different schemes for promotion of educational facilities specially at Primary and Secondary Education level have been included in the programme of "General Education". The amount of Rs. 3.39 lakhs was spent on the scheme "Expansion of primary education". Appointment of as many as 273 teachers was/either in newly established schools or in the schools for which it was essential to provide additional teachers. The scheme "Basic Training of Primary Teachers" was implemented by way deputing 553 teachers for primary basic training. Amount of Rs. 2.28 lakhs was utilised for this purpose. Grants of Rs. 1.15 lakhs were given to local bodies for construction of primary school buildings. Under the scheme "Improvement of science Education at elementary stage" amount of Rs. 0.04 lakh was spent for purchase of science equipments. "Development of Non Govt. Secondary Schools" scheme was implemented by sanctioning grants of Rs. 0.11 lakh to 7 schools. Five class rooms costing Rs. 0.33 lakh were constructed under the scheme "Construction of Buildings and Class-rooms in Govt. Secondary Schools in Marathwada." Five additional classes were opened in Govt. Secondary schools and expenditure of Rs. 0.10 lakh was made on it. Scholarships were awarded to seven students under the scheme "Scholarships in Secondary schools." Amount of Rs. 0.04 lakh was required for the same. Expenditure of Rs. 0.05 lakh was incurred for appointment of 3 A.D.I.s. under the scheme "Strengthening of Inspection Staff for Inspection of Secondary Schools." Amount of Rs. 0.09 lakhs was required for giving "Educational Concessions to economically backward Classes". Total number of students benirited under the scheme comes to 396.

TECHNICAL EDUCATION

Both the schemes i.e. "Development of existing Polytechnics and taking over of private Politechnics" and "Provision of Hostel Facilities/<sup>at</sup> Engineering College and Polytechnic" implemented during Third Plan period, were continued. Expenditure of Rs. 1.09 lakhs was booked on the former while expenditure of Rs. 0.01 lakh was booked on the later.

PUBLIC HEALTH

Most of the schemes implemented in Third Plan have been continued under this sub-head. Expenaiture of 0.37 lakh was booked on Minor construction works under the scheme "Primary health Centres". Expenditure of Rs. 4.76 lakhs was required for the "National Malaria Eradication Programme". For "Strengthening of establishment against small pox" amount of Rs. 1.05 lakhs was required. For launching of Family Planning Programme amount of Rs. 4.79 lakhs was utilised. As much as 1,187 vasectomy operations were performed under Family Planning Programme and 6,510 cases of loop were done.

WATER SUPPLY AND DRAINAGE

Expenditure to the extent of Rs. 10.32 lakhs was booked on the scheme "Municipal water supply scheme". The work of Remodelling of Jalna water supply Scheme, Vaijapur Water Supply Scheme, and Aurangabad Drainage schemes were in progress. Four works of piped water supply taken under the scheme "Village Panchayat Water Supply and Drainage" were in progress and amount of Rs. 4.08 lakhs was spent on the same,

HOUSING

Amount of Rs. 0.10 lakhs was given to the workers of Jaihind Press under the scheme "Subsidised Industrial housing". Amount of Rs. 1.69 lakhs was required for giving second and third instalments to whom loans were sanctioned under the scheme "Low income Group housing". The work in 15 villages taken up under Third Plan period was continued during "Village housing Project scheme", during the year 1960-67. The scheme "Extension of Village Gaonthans and provision of house sites" was also continued and amount of Rs. 0.59 lakh, was spent on it.

URBAN DEVELOPMENT

Expenditure of Rs. 0.38 lakh was booked on the scheme "Financial assistance to local Bodies for provision of basic amenities". Kannad municipal council availed of this facility. Due to non-receipt of applications from Municipalities no expenditure could be booked on the scheme "Financial assistance to local Bodies for implementation of Development Programmes."

BACKWARD CLASS WELFARE

As the implementation of different schemes under this sub-head was withheld upto end of February, 67 and as the grants were released in the month of March expenditure could not be booked on any scheme.

SOCIAL WELFARE

The only scheme "Extension of Welfare Projects" implemented under this sub-head during Third Plan period was continued during Annual Plan 1966-67, amount of Rs. 0.20 lakhs was spent on continuation of 18 Balwadies, 13 Literacy classes, 8 Maternity centres and 11 arts and craft classes.

LABOUR AND LABOUR WELFARE

Under this sub-head only one scheme i.e. "Technical and Vocational Training" was continued and amount of Rs. 0.41 lakhs was spent on the purchase of equipments.

MISCELLANEOUS

Only one scheme under the sub-head "Information and Publicity" was implemented during Annual Plan under review. The expenditure of Rs. 0.15 lakhs was booked on the scheme "Rural Broad Casting". Total number of radio sets supplied under this scheme were 69.
