ANNUAL REPORT ON EDUCATION IN THE BOMBAY STATE FOR THE YEAR 1954-55

GENERAL SUMMARY OF PRINCIPAL EVENTS AND STATISTICAL TABLES

Introduction

1. The Department of Education in the State of Bombay was created in 1855. During this Centenary year Government desired to bring out a broad history of the educational developments in the State during the preceding century and accordingly a review of the growth of education during the first hundred years of the life of the Bombay Education Department (1855-1955) has been separately published. In addition, the usual annual statistics on education which compare the results of the year 1953-54 and 1954-55 are being published here in the usual form for convenience of reference and continuity; and to make the picture complete, a brief summary of the main features of the year under report is given in the paragraphs that follow.

Institutions and Pupils

2. The total number of educational institutions increased by 2,075 to 55,876 of which only 247 were unrecognised. The recognised institutions included 78 Arts and Science Colleges, (including 23 Universities and Research Institutions) 65 Professional Colleges, 1,521 Secondary Schools, 33,213 Primary Schools, and 20,752 Special Schools (including 19,758 Social Education Classes). There has been an increase in the number of educational institutions at every level; except under Arts and Science Colleges, Special Schools* and unrecognised institutions which show a fall of 1,56 and 19 respectively.

The total number of pupils in all kinds of educational institutions increased by 3,37,555 or by 7.4 per cent. Of these 33,88,960 were boys and 14,98,354 were girls. The number of pupils shows increase at every level, except in unrecognised institutions which show a fall of 1,637 pupils from 13,491 in 1953-54 to 11,854 in 1954-55.

The largest increase of institutions as well as of pupils is seen at the primary level. The number of primary schools increased from 31,130 with 35,53,750 pupils in 1953-54 to 33,213 with 38,30,466 in 1954-55. This is due to the large programme of expansion undertaken by the State Government and to the intensive efforts made to provide the small villages with schools by organising a system of group-schools and peripatetic teachers.

^{*}The fall in special institutions is more apparent than real and is due to the exclusion of gymnasia under the orders of the Government of India.

3. The total expenditure on education increased by Rs. $252\cdot2$ lakhs to Rs. $2,802\cdot2$ lakhs and was met from the following sources:—

It will be seen that more than half the increase has taken place in the contribution of the State Government. This is in keeping with the modern trend whereby Government is assuming a greater initiative in and a larger financial responsibility for educational development.

Educational Personnel and Organisation

4. Shri D. C. Pavata relinquished the office of the Director of Education on 21st June 1954, and was succeeded by Shri S. S. Bhandarkar.

The total State expenditure on direction and inspection together amounted to Rs. 43,10,679 which formed 2.9 per cent of the total State expenditure on education. In 1953-54, the corresponding figures were Rs. 41,44,682 and 3.1 per cent respectively.

During the year under report, Government sanctioned a scheme for the inservice training of direct recruits to the Bombay Educational Service, Class I It is to be brought into force during the next year.

76 posts of Social Education Officers for the Community Projects and the National Extension Service Blocks were sanctioned during the year. They are to be regarded as a temporary addition to the carde of the Assistant Deputy Educational Inspectors.

The scheme of the departmental re-organisation introduced during the preceding year was further developed and consolidated. The experience of its practical working was encouraging and it has helped to add materially to the efficiency of the department and has led to great convenience to the public. A proposal to split up the two district units adopted in 1953-54 and to place an Educational Inspector in charges of each district was also sanctioned by Government and is to be introduced with effect from June 1955.

The intensity of the developmental drive organised during the year under report can be seen from the fact that the increase in the number of primary school pupils is the largest recorded since 1951-52. This is clearly shown in the following table:—

Of the 38,30,466 pupils attending primary schools, 25,51,291 were boys and 12,79,175 were girls. Nearly two-thirds of the total number of girls or 8,42,136 were reading in boys schools and the remaining were enrolled in the separate schools for girls.

During the year under report, compulsion was introduced with effect from 1st August, 1954 in 2,507 places with a population of 1,000 and over according to the census of 1951, including the merged areas, where there was no compulsion so far. Consequently compulsion, during the year was applied to all villages of the State with a population of 1,000 and over, except to those in one district, viz. Broach District, where compulsion was effective in all villages with a population of 500 and over. The details regarding the progress of compulsory primary education in the State will be found in Table No. IX of the Government of India Tables and also in Appendix IV published with this report.

In addition to the above another important measure relating to the development of primary education in rural areas during the year 1954-55 was to provide schools or schooling facilities to the smaller school-less villages with less than 500 souls. During this period, one of the schemes launched by Government of India in the field of education was the scheme for the relief of unemployment among the educated. Under this scheme, as many as 10,000 additional teachers were sanctioned to this State. The Government of Bombay took the advantage of this allotment to provide facilities of education to rural areas. With the help of 3,780 teachers out of the total strength of 6,000 teachers sanctioned therefor, the Government of Bombay covered with schools almost all the villages with a population of 500 and over and also with a population of less than 500 by opening either new independent schools or peripatetic and group schools serving a number of villages around a centrally situated village. Where the distance between villages was more than a mile, peripatetic teachers were appointed to serve pairs of villages on alternate days or in alternate session on the same day. This enabled smaller villages to have a one teacher school, although it was a part time school. As a result of these measures, it was possible to provide schools or schooling facilities in as many as 29 006 villages out of the total number of 34,726 villages in the State leaving 5,720 villages without any schooling facilities. It is expected that as a result of the schemes already launched with the help of Government of India, the number of schoolless villages in the State will decrease further during the next year.

The large increase in the contribution of the District Boards is due partly to the recovery of arrears. The increase in the receipts from fees is due to the introduction of fees in Standards V-VII of primary schools.

The total number of primary teachers in the State increased from 96,871 (77,742 men and 19,129 women) in 1953-54 to 1,00,704 (80,474 men and 20,230 women) in 1954-55. The percentage of trained teachers also increased from 54.7 (52.9 for men and 61.8 for women) in 1953-54 to 56.2 (54.1 for men and 64.8 for women) in 1954-55.

The curricula of primary schools were revised in toto with a view to simplification and are proposed to be introduced with effect from June, 1955. A prominent feature of the new curricula is that they prescribed a common course of study for basic and primary schools in so far as the academic subjects, cleanliness, civics, physiology and hygiene, community life etc. are concerned. Considerable progress was recorded in the construction of buildings for primary schools. During the year under report, a total provision of Rs. 50 lakhs was made for sanctioning loans for the construction of primary school buildings and for carrying out special repairs to the existing buildings and in addition, a total building grant of Rs. 8,22,143 was paid for the construction of primary school buildings in the ex-merged State areas. The total loan sanctioned for special repairs alone amounted to about Rs. 9,32,000 (for about 340 school buildings) and the remaining amount of loans and grants was utilised for construction of about 2,400 rooms.

Basic Education

6. The number of Basic Schools decreased by 1 and stood at 167 with an enrolment of 30,497 pupils at the end of the year under report. However, steps were being taken to convert 128 primary schools with 18,446 pupils to the basic pattern and the process is expected to be completed during the next year.

All Training Institutions were converted to the basic pattern during the year under report. As this bold reform has led to several difficulties for private training institutions, Government appointed a special Committee under the Chairmanship of Kumari S. Panandikar, Principal Secondary Training College, Bombay, to consider ways and means for the improvement of non-Government primary training colleges. The report of the Committee is awaited.

The curicula of basic schools were revised during the year with the object of eliminating, as far as possible, the difference between them and the curricula for ordinary primary schools. As stated already, the revised curricula are to be brought into force from June 1955.

The total expenditure on basic education during the year under report came to Rs. 13,45,817 on Basic and Craft education and Rs. 60,99,976 on buildings.

The Graduates' Basic Training Centres at Rajpipla, Dhulia and Dharwar continued to work satisfactorily and had on enrolment of 31, 56 and 41 respectively.

🍇 Secondary Education

7. During the year under report, the number of High Schools increased from 1,097 in 1953-54 to 1,165 in 1954-55. Of the total increase of 68 High Schools, 66 were meant for boys and 2 for girls. The number of Middle Schools, however, decreased by 3 from 353 in 1953-54 to 356 in 1954-55, due mainly to conversion of some of the Middle Schools into High Schools.

The number of boys attending Secondary Schools increased by 19,439 to 3,61,078 in 1954-55, and the number of girls by 11,566 to 1,14,124 in 1954-55.

During the year under report, the Ismail Gafurbhai Kapurwala High School of Commerce, Anand, was closed and 2 new Agricultural High Schools were started at Jamgaon (District Ahmednagar) and Murud-Janjira (District Kolaba). Therefore, the total number of Vocational Secondary Schools in the State increased to 29 with an enrolment of 6,310 in 1954-55. The corresponding figures for 1953-54 were 28 and 6,222 respectively. Of the 29 Vocational Schools, 8 were Technical, 9 were Agricultural and 12 were Commercial. 12 of these were managed by Government and 17 by private agencies.

The total number of teachers in Secondary Schools increased from 20,401 (16,539 men and 3,862 women) in 1953-54 to 21,391 (17,044 men and 4,347 women) in 1954-55. Of these 13,639 or 63.8 per cent were trained.

Three Seminars for Headmasters of Secondary Schools were organised at Mahabaleshwar during the year under report. One of these was organised on behalf of the Government of India and the other two on behalf of the State Government. The total expenditure on these seminars came to Rs. 35,075 and they were attended by 199 Headmasters.

In 1954-55 building grants amounting to Rs. 2,10,000 were made to ten secondary schools. A further sum of Rs. 4,680 was sanctioned as grant-in-aid for acquisition of play-grounds.

University-Education

8. During the year under report, Shri D. C. Pavate was elected Vice-Chancellor of the Karnatak University. In the other Universities there was no change in this respect. The number of universities in the State remained unchanged at six. The number of colleges and institutions functioning at the university level increased from 141 in 1953-54 to 143 in 1954-55 and their enrolment from 73, 637 to 80, 121. The following table shows the grantin-aid paid to the universities by the Government of Bombay during the year under review:—

For the training of secondary teachers, there were 7 Secondary Teachers' Colleges with an enrolment of 956 students. Besides there were 18 S. T. C. Classes with an enrolment of 234 men and 379 women. The latter were given a grant-in-aid of Rs. 2,006 during the year under report. Moreover, the T. D. Classes conducted by the different colleges numbered 8 and had an enrolment of 282 (149 men and 133 women).

The number of special training institutions for teachers increased from 3 in 1953-54 to 36 in 1954-55 and their enrolment increased from 113 to 1,084.* Of these, 2 were for teachers of English-teaching schools and the rest for teachers of Hindi.

At the P. T. C. Examination held during the year, 8,939 teachers appeared, out of whom, 5,533 or 59.7 per cent passed.

Physical Education

12. The Training Institute for Physical Education, Kandivali, had a total enrolment of 93 students during the year under report as against that of 85 in 1953-54. Besides, 197 teachers were trained in Certificate Courses in Physical Education in 1954-55 as against 217 in 1953-54. Moreover, 524 primary teachers were trained in Physical Education at a total cost of Rs. 29,294. For the preceding year, the corresponding figures were 475 and Rs. 26,260 respectively.

An important event of the year was the holding of the first State Sports Festival with the object of arousing enthusiasm for sports among the youth of the country. For this purpose a special committee has been set up under the Chairmanship of the Chief Minister and it has agencies in each District and Taluka of the State. The State Festival itself is held in three stages. At the first stage, inter-village competitions are held in each Taluka; at the second stage, the winners of the Taluka sports compete at the District level; and at the third and the final stage, the winners of the District meets compete in the State meet. In the first State Sports Festival which was held in January 1955, more than 1,000 persons coming from all the Districts of the State participated.

During the year under report, there were 154 Gymnasia in the State asagainst 151 in 1953-54. A total grant-in-aid of Rs. 32,000 was paid to them.

The total expenditure on Physical Education during 1954-55 was Rs. 6,01,500 as against Rs. 5,99,150 in 1953-54.

Education of girls

The number of hostels for Backward Class students increased to 234 during the year under report. The total amount of grant-in-aid paid to these hostels was Rs. 12,25,956 for recurring expenditure and Rs. 94,989 for the construction of buildings. In 1953-54, the corresponding figures were 217, Rs. 10,54,097 and Rs. 53,849 respectively.

The special facilities given to Backward Class pupils in different types of educational institutions were continued during the year. The total expenditure incurred on them came to Rs. 27,95,717.

The scheme of Ashram Schools and Sanskar Kendras was further developed during the year under report. By the end of 1954-55, 18 Ashram Schools for the Scheduled Tribes had been sanctioned out of which 15 had started functioning and a total grant of Rs. 5,12,881 had been paid to the voluntary agencies conducting them. 569 pupils of both sexes were enrolled in these Ashram Schools. Moreover, 7 Ashram Schools-cum-Sanskar Kendras for Vimochit Jat's had been sanctioned out of which five had started to function with 210 pupils on rolls. A grant of Rs. 61,768 was paid to such institutions. Lastly, 25 Sanskar Kendras which were availed of by more than 2,000 adults were functioning by the end of the year and a grant of Rs. 81,450 was paid to them.

Education of Handicapped Children

15. During the year under report, the grants-in-aid payable to institutions for handicapped children were revised and increased. This led to a considerable

expansion in the number of institutions, their enrolment and the expenditure, as may be seen from the following table:—

Pre-Primary Education

16. During the year under report, the 'number of pre-primary institutions increased by 23 to 219 (161 for boys and 58 for girls) with a total enrolment of 17,168 (9,626 boys and 7,542 girls) as against 196 institutions (148 for boys and 45 for girls) with, an enrolment of 15,164 pupils (8,547 boys and 6,617 girls) in 1953-54. The total expenditure of these institutions also increased by Rs. 35,434 from Rs. 7,83,799 in 1953-54 to Rs. 8,19,233 in 1954-55. But owing to finarcial stringency, the total grant-in-aid paid to these institutions fell from Rs. 20,200 in 1953-54 to Rs. 13,766 in 1954-55. For the Pre-Primary Teachers Certificate Examination held during the year, 291 candidates appeared of whom 246 passed. During the previous year, the corresponding figures were 245 and 200.

Art Education '

17. In 1964-55, the Sir J. J. School of Art, Bombay had a total student population of 1,267 of whom 1,034 were boys and 233 were girls. 159 students (154 boys and 5 girls) read in the degree classes and the rest for the Diploma and Certificate courses. The total direct expenditure on the School came to Rs. 3,98,528 of which Rs. 2,43,256 came from State funds and Rs. 1,52,940 from fees. Besides this, there were four other regional institutions of Art in the State, viz. the Faculty of fine Arts of the M. S. University of Baroda, the Institute of Modern Art, Poona, the School of Art, Dharwar, and the School of Art of the C. N. Vidyavihar, Ahmedabad. All these institutions continued to function satisfactorily during the year under report.

On 31st March, 1955, there were in all 17 schools of fine arts (other than those for mus c and dancing) with an enrolment of 981 pupils (815 boys and 166 girls). Their total expenditure came to Rs. 1,17,407 of which Rs. 33,741 was met from State funds, Rs. 61,934 from fees and Rs. 21,732 from other sources.

During the year under report, the result grants paid at the Drawing Grade Examinations were discontinued under Government Letter, Education Department, No. SSN 1053-E 10927 of 22nd March, 1954.

Music Education

18. During the year under report, the total enrolment in the College of Music at Baroda increased to 298 (194 men and 104 women) as against 269 in 1953-54. The total expenditure of the College came to Rs. 72,292 which was met entirely from fees and university funds.

Besides this, there were 36 Music Schools with an enrolment of 792 pupils (370 boys and 422 girls). Of these 13, schools were meant mainly for boys and the remaining mainly for girls. Their total expenditure came to Rs. 1,17,233 out of which municipal funds, fees and other sources contributed Rs. 350, Rs. 85,605 and Rs. 31,278 respectively.

There was only one school for training in dancing which enrolled 19 girls and 3 boys during the year under report.

Dramatic Art

19. During the year under report, Government has approved of a new scheme under which a portion of the proceeds from the entertainment tax is to be utilised towards the encouragement of dramatic art. A comprehensive programme has been drawn up for the purpose and a good portion of it is being executed through the Education Department.

In 1954-55, prizes of the value of Rs. :4,000 (Rs. 2,500 for the first prize Rs. 1,000 for the second prize, Rs. 500 for the third prize) were awarded to the best published play in each of the three regional languages of the State. Also three prizes of the value of Rs. 1,000 (I prize), Rs. 500 (II prize), Rs. 250 (III prize) were awarded to the best childrens' plays written in each of these

languages. The total expenditure on this account was Rs. 13,750. Grants for the construction of open-air theatres were paid as follows.—

Dramatic competitions were organised on district basis in secondary and primary schools. The organisation of these competitions was entrusted to the Educational Inspectors and Administrative Officers of the Districts concerned. One rotating shield was awarded to the team staging the best performance from amongst the secondary and primary schools of every District. Similarly three medals for the best individual performance for each section (secondary and primary) were also awarded. The total expenditure on account of the shields and medals was Rs. 18,000. In addition to this, an amount of Rs. 20,075 was spent on the incidental expenses of the competitions.

In addition to these competitions for educational institutions which are organised through the Department, dramatic competitions by the members of the public were also organised. Preliminary competitions were held on a zonal basis and the final contest was held on the regional basis. Prizes of substantial value were awarded to the three best performances every year in each regional language.

Visual Education

20. The work of the Visual Education Department was hampered to some extent during the year under report owing partly to the absence of the Inspector of Visual Education who was deputed to Delhi for two and a half months and partly to the delay in obtaining exemption from the licensing system for showing educational films in schools.

Oriental Studies.

21. During the year under report, the various institutions which carried on research, teaching or publication work in oriental studies were organised by the Department, and most of them were also given grant-in-aid. Prominent among these were the Deccan College Postgraduate and Research Institute, Poona, Bhandarkar Oriental Research Institute, Poona, The Bharitiya Vidya-Bhavan, Bombay, and The Oriental Institute, Baroda.

Government conducted three Pathashalas during the year, and the total expenditure incurred on them was Rs. 10,465. In addition, 32 Pathashalas with an enrolment 778 students were also recognised and aided during the year under report. Their total expenditure came to Rs. 1,54,066 out of which Rs. 12,250 was met from Government grants. Similarly, 19 Arabic schools having 768 pupils were also aided by Government. The expenditure incurred on them was bs. 24,074.

Facilities for the Education of Displaced Persons

22. As in the past, facilities continued to be given to displaced students during the year under report. The following table compares the work done in this field during the current and the preceding year:—

Libraries

23. During the year under report, the number of of village libraries and reasing rooms increased from 4,537 in 1953-54 to 5,978 in 1954-55. The total grant-in-aid paid to them was Rs. 1,55,494 against Rs. 64,399 during the preceding year.

The libraries and reading rooms in ex-Baroda State area were being aided under special rules as a transitional measure. From 1954-55, however, common rules of grant-in-aid were made applicable to all the village libraries in the State.

64 librarians were trained during the year under report against 56 in 1953-54. Of these, 16 were trained by the Bombay Library Association, 31 by the Maharashtra Association and 17 by the Gujarat Association.

The total expenditure incurred on it was Rs. 12,86,475 in 1954-55 as against Rs. 12,18,075 during the preceding year.

Thirteen sub-troops of the Girls Division were raised during the year and about 300 girls were enrolled in them.

On 31st March, 1955, there were 941 trained teachers in the A C. C. and the number of cadets was 38,000.
