CRITIQUE

During the year, 228 posts of the Block Education Officers which were hithertofore being manned by B. Ed. Masters were abolished and new posts of Block Primary Education Officers to be manned by Senior JBT Teachers were created which was a step towards fulfilment of the aspiration of the Primary School Teachers. Ten new single teacher Primary Schools were opened. 50 Primary Schools were upgraded to Middle standard and 100 Middle Schools were upgraded to High Standard. Six High Schools and One Middle privately managed school were taken over by the State Government. 2,940 posts of teaching personnel and ancilliary staff were created.

For the qualitative improvement, 12 posts of Deputy District Education Officers and 8 posts of Assistant Accounts Officers were created. There was a slight increase in enrolment at elementary stage but on the other hand, there was considerable increase in enrolment in the age group 14-17. Library facilities were provided to 50 Primary Schools at the cost of Rs. 1.55 lacs. Furniture items worth Rs. 10.00 lacs were supplied to 1,600 Government Primary Schools.

In order to provide facility of Education to the drop outs in the age-group 6-11, 250 part time Non-Formal Education Centres were started in seven districts of the State.

Inservice Training was imparted to 1,890 teachers of different categories for their professional growth and 480 students were admitted to Junior Basic Training Course. 33,300 students got admission in the vocational courses.

The overall work of the Education Department remained satisfactory during the year 1979-80.
