PART—I

(FORM ES-I) Numerical Data

| 1. Academic Year | For the sake of uniformity, the academic year is taken to coincide with the financial year i.e. from April 1st of one year to March 31st of the next year. The Numerical Data in this Form Pertains to 30th September of the Academic Year. |
| 2. Recognised Institutions | Are those in which the course of study followed is that which is prescribed or recognised by the Department of Public Instruction or by University or by a Board of Secondary and/or Intermediate Education constituted by law and which satisfy one or more of these authorities as the case may be, that they attain to a reasonable standard of efficiency. They are open to inspection and their students are ordinarily eligible for admission to public examinations and tests held by the Department or the University or the Board. |
| 3. Government | Includes both Central and State Governments, unless otherwise provided for. |
| 4. Local Bodies. | Include District School Boards, Municipal School Boards, Cantonments Boards, Town Area Committees, Panchayat Samitis, Zila Parishads, etc. |
| 5. Pre-primary School/Classes | Include all Nursery, Infants, Kindergarten and other such school classes. |
| 6. Higher Secondary Schools (10+2) Pattern | Are those schools after passing out from which the students can be admitted in degree classes of Universities. |
| 7. Under Graduate Engineering Colleges | Include Survey Schools. |
| 8. Schools for Oriental Studies | Include Toles, Madrasses, Arabic, Sanskrit and Vedic Schools, Sanskrit Pathshalas and other such Schools. |
| 9. School for Physical Education | Exclude Gymnasia. |
| 10. The Statistics given in these tables include statistics of centrally administered Educational and/or Research Institutions. | |

PART—II

(FORM ES-II) Financial Data

1. Date of reference Financial data has been reported for the year ending 31st March of the year under report.
2. Income and expenditure Have been reported for the period from 1st April 1983 to 31st March, 1984.
3. Income means the receipts of the institutions.
4. Expenditure means payments. Expenditure has been shown to the amount actually spent during the year under report.
5. Income and expenditure In respect of the following items have been excluded as these are neither income to the institution nor the amount incurred out of these constitute expenditure on the institutions.
 - (a) Refundable security deposits such as Library deposits, Laboratory, Caution Money, Hostel Caution Money etc.
 - (b) Money collected on behalf of other authorities such as State Government, Boards, etc. which is ultimately to be passed on to these authorities, such as Boards Registration fee, Boards examination fee etc.
 - (c) Fee collected from some the students for providing specific services to them such as bus fee etc.
 - (d) Repayment of loans (interest on loans paid by the institutions has been considered as an expenditure)
 - (e) Nursing or other educational classes which are conducted in hospitals, the expenditure on these classes only has been shown against the relevant side heads.
 - (f) The Hostel fee excluded the 'Messing fee'. However, if the institution contributes anything towards 'Mess' from its own funds that amount has been shown under other items.
 - (g) Fee forgone by the institutions on account of free studentships have not been included in income from tuition fee, but in the case of reimbursement of fees by Government or any agency does receive that amount and it has been shown as income from tuition fees. Again this reimbursement is received by the student as financial assistance and is given by the agency who pays towards this reimbursement and as such has been

included in income from that source and expenditure for Scholarships, stipends and other financial assistance.

(h) The deficit during the year has not been included under "other sources" on income side, but if the deficit is met by the management from their own funds, this amount has been shown as non-recurring income from the management and institutions not considered in deficit, in case the deficit is met by raising loans, the amount does receive has not been treated as income of the Institution but has been shown in foot-note only. Similarly, the payment of such loans has not been considered as expenditure only the amount paid as interest on account of such loans, if any, has been shown on expenditure side. Surplus has not been shown against, "other items" on the expenditure side.

6. Expenditure In calculating the expenditure from Govt. and Local Body funds entered in table-II, all payments of contributions from fees, endowments etc. and other sources, which are credited to such funds are deducted.
7. Endowments etc. Include subscription, contribution and income from endowments.
8. The Statistics given in this form relate to all those institutions whose numerical statistics have been furnished in form ES-I.

(PART—III)

(FORM ES—III) Examination Results

1. Examination Results refer to those students who are educated during the year under report for which the statistics have been furnished in form ES-I Numerical Data besides, these include the Results of Private Candidates.

2. The number of boys and girls appeared in and passed the various examinations have been given both for annual as well as supplementary examinations.

3. For each course, the results have been given only of the final Class and not of lower classes even if these are conducted by a public authority like University, Board or State Government etc.

PART—IV

(FORM ES—IV) Statistics of Education of Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes

1. Academic Year For the sake of uniformity, the academic year in these tables is taken to coincide with the financial year i.e. from April 1st of one year to March 31st of the next year. The Data in this form pertains to 30th September of the academic year.

2. **Recognised Institutions** Are those in which the course of study followed is that which is prescribed or recognised by the Department of Public Instruction/or University or by a Board of Secondary and or Intermediate Education constituted by law and which satisfy one or more of these authorities as the case may be, that they attain to a reasonable standard of efficiency. They are open to inspection and their students are ordinarily eligible for admission to public examinations and tests held by the Department or the University or the Board.
3. **Enrolment** For definiteness, students on rolls in the institutions as on 30th September of the academic year in question are taken.
4. **Pre-Primary School Classes** Include all Nursery, infants, Kindergarden and other such school classes.
5. **School for Oriental Studies** Includes Toles, Madrasses, Arab, Sanskrits and Vedic Schools, Sanskrit Pathshalas and other such schools.
6. **The statistics given in these tables** relates to all those institutions whose statistics are furnished in Form ES-I the statistics of centrally administered educational or research institutions are included.
