JULY, 1954

The Oversea Migration Board was appointed in the Spring of 1953, "to consider and advise the Secretary of State upon specific proposals for schemes of emigration from the United Kingdom to other Commonwealth countries and upon any matter relating thereto which may be referred to it by him."
