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P R E F A C E

Reduction in regional imbalances of educational development is a major objective of the National Policy on Education. To promote this programme, it is necessary to collect statistics of educational development in the different regions of the country periodically and to publish them for information and use by all concerned.

The Ministry of Education publishes annually statistics of educational development in the different states of the Indian Union. But as imbalances of educational development between one district and another are far more pronounced than those between one State and another, it was decided to collect and publish statistics of educational development in the districts also every five years. Accordingly, such statistics were collected and published, for the first time, for the year 1960-61.

The study is now being repeated for the year 1965-66 and it is proposed to bring out a separate volume on the district educational statistics of every State. It will contain statistics for the year 1965-66 along with comparative data for the year 1960-61. To make inter district comparisons possible, some important indices such as enrolment ratio, percentage of trained teachers, per capita expenditure on education, etc., will also be included.

In this programme of bringing out 16 volumes for all the States of the Union (except Nagaland) this volume is the seventh and is devoted to the educational statistics of districts in Kerala State. It has been based on the data collected from the State Department of Education.

I take this opportunity to express my appreciation of the co-operation and help received from the Director of Public Instruction, Kerala, and other educational authorities in the State and the staff of the Statistics and Information Division which has prepared this Report.

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I - INTRODUCTORY

The Ministry of Education and Youth Services publishes the statistics of education in India annually in their publications 'Education in India, Vol.I and Vol.II'. These publications give the statistics at the national and State levels, but do not provide district-wise statistics.

2. To fill up this gap, the National Council of Educational Research and Training brought out a volume entitled 'Educational Statistics: District-wise' giving the bench mark of educational data of various kinds for all districts for the year 1960-61. To make inter-district comparison possible, some important indices such as enrolment ratios, percentages of trained teachers and per capita expenditure on education were also given. These comparative statements show a wide range of variation between the districts in every respect.

3. It has now been decided to have a similar review of educational development in the districts for the year 1965-66. Such periodic reviews are necessary for several reasons. For instance, they will help to judge the effectiveness of the measures taken to correct regional imbalances at the district level. Secondly, such collection and publication of data on different aspects of education at the district level will help the preparation of educational development plans for all districts so that they can be adopted, as recommended by the Education Commission as the principal unit for administration, planning and development of school education.

4. This review will be divided into sixteen volumes - one volume being devoted to the educational statistics of the districts in every State (except Nagaland). The present volume, which is the seventh in the series, gives the data for each of the districts of Kerala on number of educational institutions, population, teachers, expenditure, etc., at all levels of education. It also gives the rates of growth in different sectors from 1960-61 to 1965-66 and some important indices of educational development.

II - SUMMARY

5. The District Statistics of Kerala for 1960-61 and 1965-66, given in the following pages give an idea about disparities in educational development among the 9 districts of Kerala.

PRIMARY CLASSES:

6. A synoptic view of the relative position of the 9 districts, as far as the provision of schooling facilities at the primary stage, is given in Table I. This table gives enrolment ratio in Classes I-V for the years 1960-61 and 1965-66 and the ranking of the districts according to their position of enrolment ratio*

Between 1960-61 and 1965-66 i.e. within a period of 5 years, the enrolment ratio has risen from 108.1 to 115.6 in the State as a whole. But the growth in individual districts varies. In 1960-61, in 4 of the 9 districts, the enrolment ratio was less than the average ratio at the State level. By 1965-66, the number of such districts increased to 5. These districts are Cannanore, Kottayam, Kozhikode, Palghat and Trivandrum. However, in all these districts, the enrolment was more than 100. Primary education is the base upon which the super-structure of education is built and therefore the extent to which this is expanded will have its impact on the other forms of education like the middle, secondary and higher education also.

MIDDLE SCHOOL CLASSES:

7. Table 2 gives the enrolment ratios of various districts in Classes VI-VIII for the years 1960-61 and 1965-66 and also gives the ranking of the districts according to their enrolment ratios.

During the period 1960-61 to 1965-66 i.e. within a period of 5 years the enrolment ratio has increased from 58.3 to 64.6. But the district-wise growth has been somewhat uneven. However, the relative position of the different districts as regards enrolment ratio has not changed very much. In 1960-61, enrolment ratio in 4 districts was less than the overall State average; whereas in 1965-66 in three districts i.e. Cannanore, Kozhikode and Palghat, the enrolment ratio was less than that of the overall State average. The lowest enrolment ratio in 1965-66 was around 40.

HIGH SCHOOL EDUCATION.

8. Table 3 gives the enrolment ratio in Classes IX-X for the 9 districts of Kerala for the years 1960-61 and 1965-66 along with their ranking according to their enrolment ratio.

During the period from 1960-61 and 1965-66, the enrolment ratio increased from 24.2 to 44. As in the case of previous stages, the increase in the enrolment ratio varied from district to district. However, there is not much appreciable change in the ranking of the different districts in the two years. In 1960-61, four districts, Cannanore, Ernakulam, Kozhikode and Palghat had an enrolment ratio which was less than that of the overall State average. In 1965-66, however, the number of such districts decreased to 3. The districts with an enrolment ratio of less than the overall State average in 1965-66 are Cannanore, Kozhikode and Palghat.

SCHOOL CLASSES:

9. The composite enrolment ratio of Classes I-X has been worked out and is given in Table 4. This also gives the ranking of the districts according to their achievement as indicated by this composite index.

Taking school stage as a whole, the enrolment ratio for the state as a whole was 78.9 in 1960-61 and 88.3 in 1965-66. In 1960-61 in three districts, namely, Palghat, Kozhikode and Cannanore the enrolment ratio in classes I-X was less than the State average. Moreover, in none of the districts the enrolment ratio exceeded 100. The highest ratio achieved was in Alleppey (94.1). In 1965-66 again, the enrolment ratio in Palghat, Kozhikode and Cannanore was less than the State average. However, the enrolment ratio exceeded 100 in Quilon and was more than 90 in five districts, namely Kottayam, Trivandrum, Trichur, Ernakulam and Alleppey. One could see, that taking the school stage as a whole, the districts of Palghat, Kozhikode and Cannanore are backward as they have below the State average enrolment ratio.

HIGHER EDUCATION:

10. Table 5 gives the enrolment ratio in higher education classes in 9 districts of Kerala for the years 1960-61 and 1965-66, along with their ranking according to this enrolment ratio.

During this period, the enrolment ratio for the State as a whole^{more} then doubled from 1.9 to 5.0. However, the increase in the enrolment ratio varied from district to district. Ernakulam district which ranked 5th in 1960-61 rose to the third rank by 1965-66, and Alleppey and Cannanore districts rose from 7th to 6th and 9th to 8th ranks respectively during the period. In 1960-61, 4 districts had an enrolment ratio which was less than the State average. These districts were Alleppey, Cannanore, Kozhikode and Palghat. By 1965-66 the number of such districts decreased to 3, these were Cannanore, Kozhikode and Palghat. At the same time, the disparity between these three districts on the one hand and the other districts on the other increased with respect to enrolment ratio.

III-MALE POPULATION:

i. Kerala State consists of 9* districts. Kerala is one of the regions of the country of highest density. The total population of the State in 1961 was 169.04 lakhs, consisting of 83.62 lakh males and 85.42 lakh females. By 1966 the population of the State is estimated to increase to 191.37 lakhs, comprising of 94.65 lakh males and 96.72 lakh females. It is worth pointing out here that the total female population in the State is more than that of the males. Alleppey, Cannanore, Kozhikode, Palghat, Trichur, and Trivandrum are the districts of high sex ratio of more than 100 females per 100 males. During 1961-66 cumulative rate of growth of population in the State was 2.48% per annum.

* A new district of Malappuram has been formed recently. However, the districts referred to here are those before this reorganisation.

POPULATION DENSITY:

12. The overall density of population per square mile for the State as a whole was 1127 in 1961 and 1276 in 1966. The density was nearly 3000 per sq. mile in Alleppey, around 2300 in Trivandrum, and 1500-2000 in Ernakulam, Trichur and Kozhikode, and between 1000-1100 in Palghat and Nilgiri and between 700-1000 in Cannanore and Kottayam.

AGE DISTRIBUTION:

13. Of the total population in the State in 1966, that in the age-group 6-11 was 24.82 lakhs, consisting of 12.66 lakh males and 12.16 lakh females. The children in this age-group formed 13.0% of the total population of the State. In the case of boys the percentage in this age-group was 13.4 and in the case of girls 12.6. The population in the age-group 11-14 in 1966 was 13.38 lakhs (6.76 lakh boys and 6.62 lakh girls). This formed 7.0% of the total population of the State. In the case of males the population in this age-group was 7.1 and in the case of girls 6.8. Again the population in the age-group 14-17 was 12.37 lakhs, consisting of 6.16 lakh boys and 6.21 lakh girls, forming 6.5% of the total population of the State. The boys in this age-group formed 6.6% of the male population and girls formed 6.4% of the female population. In the age-group 17-23 the population in the State was 21.92 lakhs which formed 13.4% of the total population. Of this 10.72 lakhs were men and 11.20 lakhs were women. They formed 11.3% and 11.6% of the corresponding total population of the State. The percentage of male and female population in the age-group 6-11, 11-14, 14-17 and 17-23 in the different districts of the State in 1966 is given in the table on the next page:-

Population Density (per sq. Mile - 1966)

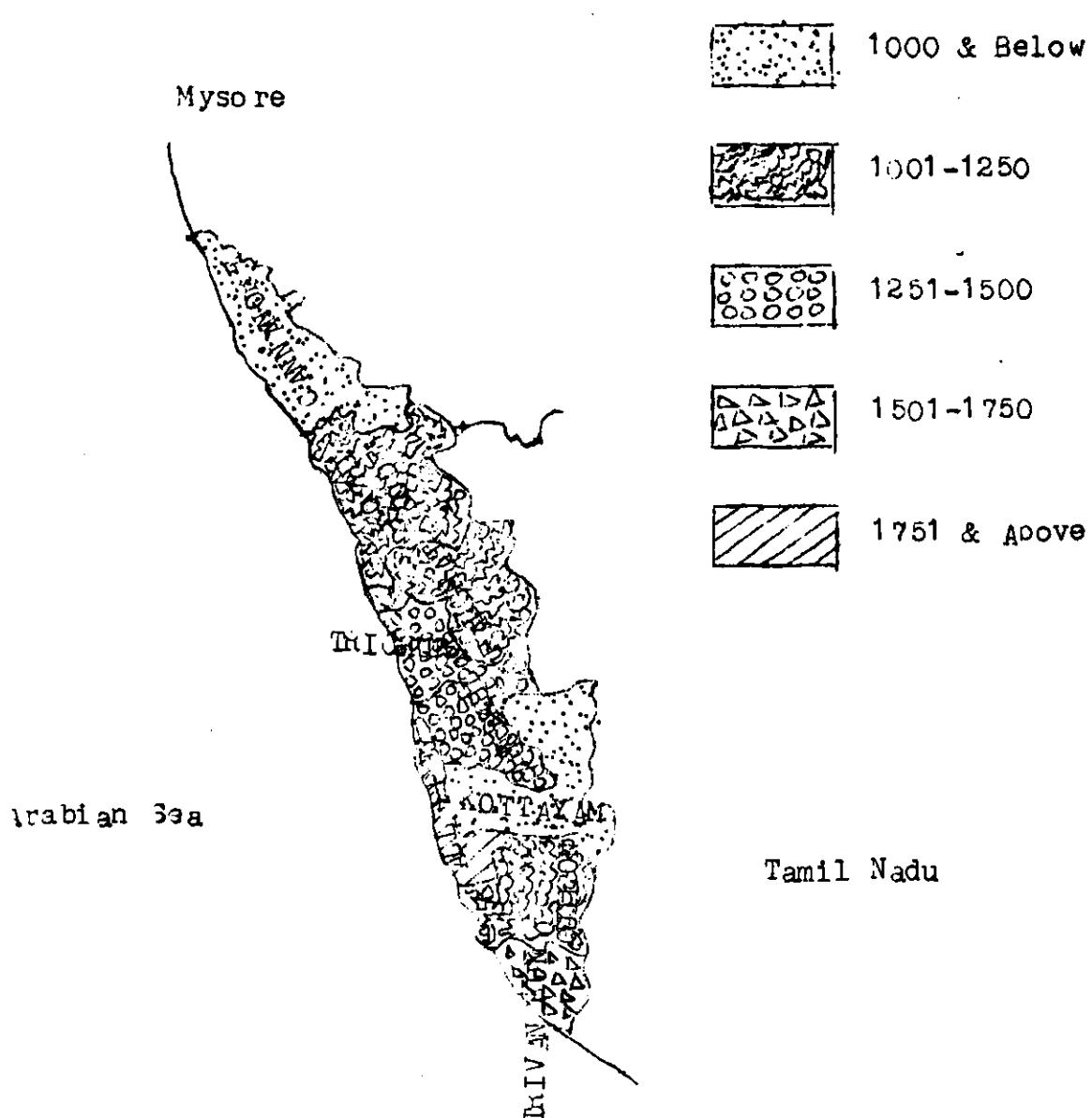

14. It is seen that in the age-group 14-17 and 17-23 the percentage of female population to the total population was more than that of the corresponding percentage of males. The total population in the school-going age-group 6-23 formed 37.9% of the total population of the State. Among the males they formed 38.4% and among the females they formed 37.4%.

IV-LITERACY:

15. According to 1961 Census the general literacy rate in Kerala is exceeded only by Delhi among the States and Union Territories. The general literacy rate in the State i.e. the number of literates per 1000 of corresponding population was 407 in 1951 and 468 in 1961. The literacy rate for males was 550 and females 389 in 1961. In 5 of the 9 districts the general literacy rate in 1961 was more than at the State level. Only in Cannanore, Kozhikode, Palghat and Trivandrum the general literacy rates were less than that at the State level. Among the males the literacy rate was the highest in Alleppey (638) and in the case of females the highest literacy rate was in Kottayam (505). In the case of boys also only in Kozhikode, Palghat and Trivandrum the literacy rates were less than that at the State level. In the case of girls in Cannanore also the literacy rate was less than that of State average. The following table gives the districts in the order of general literacy rates.

V - TOTAL NUMBER OF EDUCATIONAL INSTITUTIONS, ENROLMENT, TEACHERS AND EXPENDITURE:

NUMBER OF INSTITUTIONS:

16. The total number of educational institutions in Kerala in 1960-61 was 10126/increase which to 11080 by 1965-66. The total number of institutions have increased at an annual rate 1.8 per annum. The number of institutions have increased in all the districts. However, the highest percentage increase during the period was in Trivandrum and the lowest in Palghat district.

ENROLMENT:

17. The total enrolment in all educational institutions in 1960-61 was 33.29 lakhs and by 1965-66 this increased to 42.60 lakhs. Of this 18.32 lakhs were boys and 14.97 lakhs were girls in 1960-61 and 22.96 lakh boys and 19.63 lakh girls in 1965-66. The enrolment of boy and girls increased appreciably in all the districts and at the State level, the annual cumulative growth rate of enrolment works out to ~~be~~ 5.0%. In the different districts the percentage increase in enrolment varied for both boys and girls together from 4% in Trivandrum to ~~8~~ in Palghat. The table below gives the percentage increase in the enrolment of boys and girls in the different districts along with sex ratio of enrolment in 1965-66:-

18. The sex ratio, i.e., the number of girls enrolled for every 100 boys at the State level was 85. Among the districts it varied from 78 in Kozhikode to 92 in Kottayam, thereby showing that the sex ratio of enrolment in educational institutions was very high.

19. As a percentage of population, the total enrolment in educational institutions was 19.7 in 1960-61 and 22.3 in 1965-66 at the State level. The highest percentage of enrolment in 1965-66 was in Quilon district (26.0) followed by Alleppey (25.3), Ernakulam (24.4) and Trivandrum (24.0). In Palghat the percentage enrolment was only 16.1.

TEACHERS:

20. The total number of teachers in educational institutions in Kerala increased from 1.06 lakhs to 1.33 lakhs during the period. This shows a cumulative rate of growth of 4.4% per annum. The percentage of women teachers to the total number of teachers was 41.0% in 1960-61 and 44.1% in 1965-66. The number of teachers have increased during the period in almost all the districts. Among the districts the percentage of women teacher's was highest in Trichur and Ernakulam districts in 1965-66 and was lowest in Kozhikode.

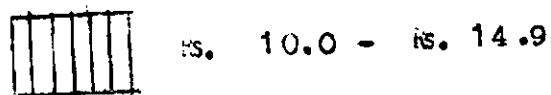
21. The number of teachers per thousand population increased from 6.3 to 7.0 during the period. Among the districts the number of teachers per thousand of population in 1960-61 varied from 5.8 in Palghat to 7.3 in Cannanore. In 5 districts out of 9 this was more than

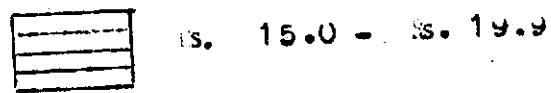

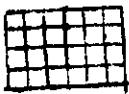

EXPENDITURE:

22. The total direct expenditure on educational institutions in Kerala increased from 18.89 crores to 28.69 crores during the period, at an annual cumulative rate of growth of 8.2%. The expenditure on education increased substantially in all the districts. The percentage increase was the highest in Trivandrum district and the lowest in Trichur.

23. The direct expenditure on education per capita which was Rs.11.2 in 1960-61 increased to Rs.15.0 by 1965-66 at the state level. This also increased substantially in all the districts. In 1965-66 the per capita direct expenditure was highest in Trivandrum district (Rs.23.0). In Palghat district the per capita expenditure was less than half of this amount (Rs.10.9). In other districts it varied between Rs.10 and Rs.20/-

24. Of the direct expenditure on education in 1965-66 at the state level 31.2% was from Government funds, 15.7% from fees and 3.1% from other sources. The percentage contribution from Government funds varied from 51.3% in Trivandrum to 92.2% in Cannanore. The contribution from fee income varied from 28.3% in Trivandrum to 6.9% in Cannanore. Statements IV-A and IV-B give the district-wise details.

VI - PRE-PRIMARY EDUCATION:

INSTITUTIONS.

25. The number of pre-primary schools in Kerala which was 22 in 1960-61 increased to 160 by 1965-66. In 1960-61 there was no pre-primary school in Kottayam, Trichur and Trivandrum. Even in the other districts, the number of pre-primary schools did not exceed 5. By 1965-66 pre-primary schools were in existence in all the districts. In Alleppey, Kottayam, Quilon and Trivandrum the pre-primary schools varied between 20 and 30. Only in Kochi the number of pre-primary schools was less than 10.

ENROLMENT:

26. The total enrolment in pre-primary schools in the State has substantially increased during the period from 1969 to 1977. The enrolment in the pre-primary schools, including attached classes, was 1000-2000 in the 4 districts, namely, Trivandrum, Alleppey, Quilon and Kottayam, and less than 1000 in 5 districts, namely, Palghat, Cannanore, Kochi, Trichur and Ernakulam. The sex ratio and enrolment was more than 100 girls for every 100 boys at the State level. The enrolment of boys exceeded the enrolment of girls only in Palghat and Quilon.

ENROLMENT OF SCHEDULED CASTES & SCHEDULED TRIBES:

27. The Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes students form 7.1% of the total enrolment at the State level. The district-wise enrolment of Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes is given in Statement V.

TEACHERS

26. The number of Teachers in pre-primary schools which was only 39 in 1960-61 increased to 298 by 1955-66. Of the total number at the State level all excepting 10 were women. Only in Alleppey, Cannanore, Kottayam and Trivandrum a few teachers were men. At the State level even though there is a slight decrease in the percentage of trained teachers during the period, slightly more than 82 percent were trained. Only in Kottayam the percentage of trained teachers was less than 70. The pupil-teacher ratio in the pre-primary schools varied between 20 and 40 in the different districts, excepting Kozhikode where it was 60. The table below summarises the district-wise position of teachers in pre-primary schools.

EXPENDITURE:

29. The total direct expenditure on pre-primary schools has substantially increased during the period from less than a lakh to nearly 5 lakhs (Rs.4.84 lakh). The total direct expenditure was highest in Alleppey followed by Kottayam and Trivandrum and was lowest in Kozhikode. The direct expenditure was so low in Kozhikode, because even though the enrolment in such schools was about 600 the number of teachers employed was only 9. The cost per pupil in 1965-66 in pre-primary schools was the lowest in Kozhikode mainly because of the low teacher-pupil ratio obtaining there. In the other districts the cost per pupil varied from Rs.34/- in Quilon to Rs.74/- in Kottayam. This variation is mainly due to the corresponding variation in teacher-pupil ratio.

VII - PRE-PRIMARY EDUCATION

INSTITUTIONS:

30. The total number of primary schools in the State has slightly decreased from 6992 to 6953 during 1960-61 to 1965-66. This decrease is due to the upgrading of some primary schools to middle schools. This decrease in number is only in Kozhikode, Ernakulam and Palghat districts. In other districts the number of primary schools has increased slightly.

31. The area served by a primary school in square miles, has shown a slight increase from 2.1 to 2.2 at the State level. This increase is mainly due to the reduction in the primary schools in Ernakulam and Palghat, thereby slightly increasing the area served by a primary school in these two districts. Apart from this fact the area served by a primary school in the different districts remains more or less the same. In Alleppey there was a primary school on an average for every 1.1 sq.miles, whereas in Kottayam it was 3.8 sq. miles. This in fact is mainly due to the difference in the density of population among the districts.

32. The population served by a primary school in the State was 2,418 in 1960-61 which has increased to 2,752 by 1965-66. The population served by a primary school has increased during the period in all the districts. In Cannanore there was a primary school for every 1,837 population, whereas in Trivandrum there was one school only for every 3,784 population. In the other districts the population served by a primary school varies between these two limits. The district-wise details are given in Statement VI.

ENROLMENT:

33. Enrolment in Classes I-V at the State level which stood at 23.9 lakhs in 1960-61 increased to 28.7 lakhs by 1965-66. This shows a growth rate of 3.6% per annum. The growth rate of enrolment in these classes of boys during this period was 3.3% and that of girls was 7.2%. The sex ratio of enrolment i.e. number of girls for every 100 boys enrolled was 90 at the State level. In the different districts the sex ratio varied from 85 in

Kozhikode to 94 in Kottayam. Taking 1960-61 as 100, the percentage increase in the enrolment during the period in the different districts along with sex ratio is given in the following table. The percentage increase in enrolment varied between 26% in Cannanore to 12% in Alleppey.

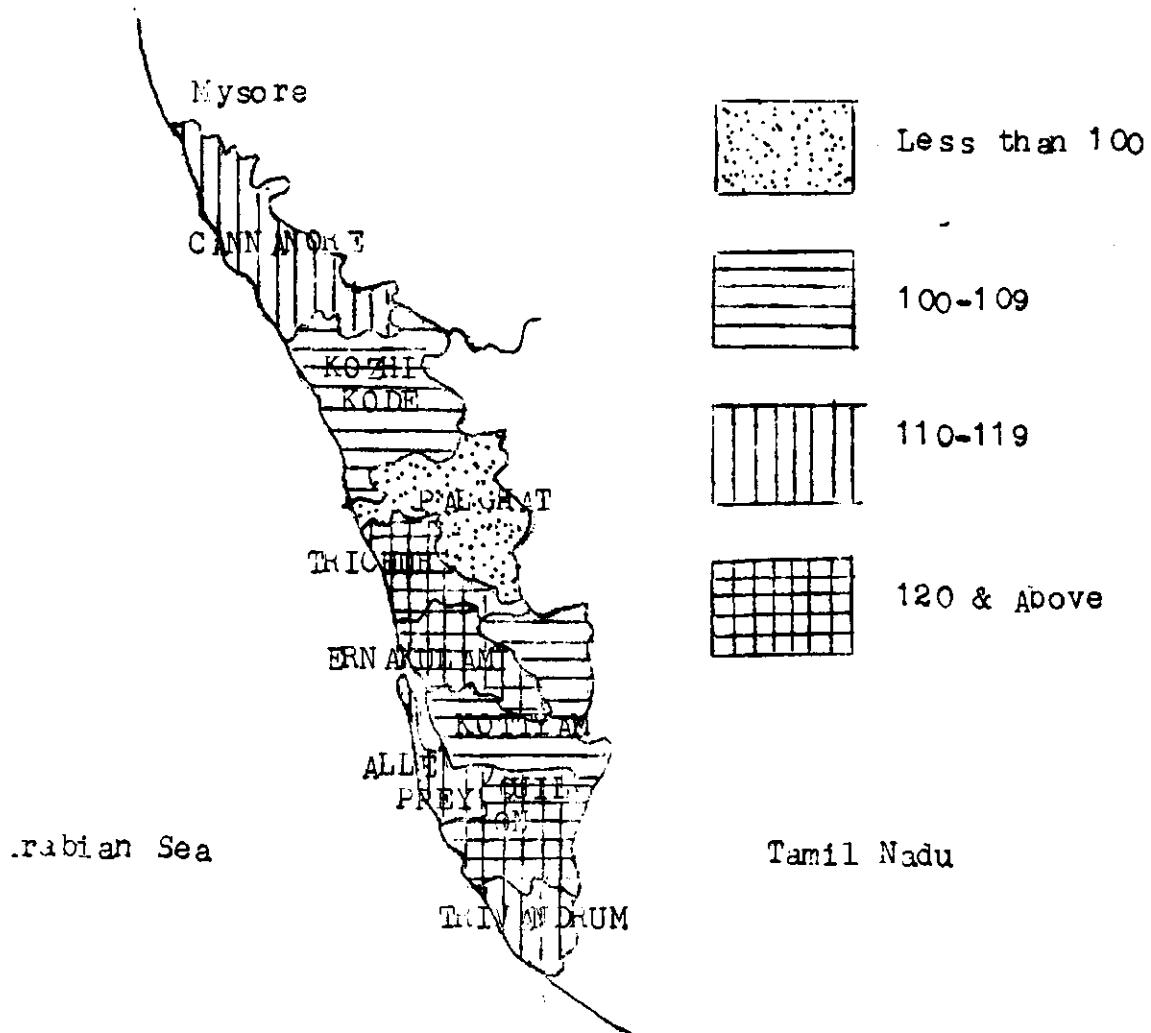

54. The percentage of enrolment in Classes I-V to the total population in the age-group 6-11 gives an index of the facilities created for primary stage of education. In Kerala the enrolment in Classes I-V as a percentage of the population in the age-group 6-11 was 108.1% taking both boys and girls together in 1960-61. By 1965-66 the corresponding percentage increased to 115.6 at the State level. In the case of boys the percentage which was 115.4 in 1960-61 increased to 119.4 by 1965-66 and in the case of girls it increased from 108% to 111.6%. Among the districts the percentage enrolment in 1965-66, taking all students, was highest in Trichur 130%, followed by Ernakulam 126% and Quilon 124%. In Palghat which was the lowest in the ladder, the percentage enrolment was 100. In the case of boys the percentage enrolment in this year was 134 in Trichur and 129 in Ernakulam, 127 in Quilon and 124 in Alleppey, whereas in Palghat it was 104. In the case of girls the percentage enrolment varied from 124 to 126 in Ernakulam and Trichur to 95.5 in Palghat. Thus in Ernakulam, Quilon and Trichur it can be assumed that all the students in the age-group 6-11 are attending primary classes, whereas in Palghat and Kozhikode, even though the percentage enrolment is more than 100, these districts may have to advance a bit further to enrol all the students in the age-group 6-11 in schools. The district-wise details are given in Statement VII-A.

ENROLMENT OF SCHEDULED CASTES AND SCHEDULED TRIBES:

35. Of the total enrolment in Classes I-V 3.07 lakhs belonged to Scheduled Caste and Scheduled Tribe communities. Of this number 1.68 lakh were boys and 1.39 lakh girls. The percentage of Scheduled Caste and Scheduled Tribe students to the total enrolment in Classes I-V was 10.7 at the State level. The percentage of Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes population to the total population in the State was only 9.6. The percentage of Scheduled Caste and Scheduled Tribe students to the total varied substantially among the districts. In Kozhikode only 5.7% of the total enrolment belonged to the Scheduled Castes and scheduled Tribes whereas in Cannanore this percentage was 15.1.

36. The following table gives the district-wise extent of coverage of Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes students in Classes I-V. The extent of coverage is defined as:

"Percentage of Enrolment of Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes to the total enrolment x 100
Percentage of population of Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes to the total population"

This shows that the enrolment of Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes in Classes I-V is similar to the enrolment of all students in comparison to the respective total population.

At the State level the extent of coverage was 111.5 thereby showing that the enrolment of Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes students in Classes I-V is more than the percentage of Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes population to the total population. Among the boys, the extent of coverage was 114.4 and among the girls 106.3. Among the districts, in Cannanore the extent of coverage was 245.5 whereas in Palghat it was only 64.9 and in Kozhikode 74.07. In Trichur also the extent of coverage was slightly less than 100. This shows that the enrolment of Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes in Kozhikode, Palghat and Trichur in comparison with the population in these districts requires improvement. District-wise details are given in Statement VII-B.

TEACHERS

37. The total number of teachers in the primary schools in Kerala increased from 46.6 thousands to 48.1 thousands during the period. In 1960-61 at the State level 43% of the teachers were women and in 1965-66 the percentage of women teachers increased to 47%. The annual growth rate in the number of teachers during the period was 0.6% per annum as compared to the rate of growth of enrolment of 3.6%. Taking 1960-61 position as 100, the number of teachers showed an increase varying from 1% to 9% in all the districts, excepting Palghat where the number of male teachers decreased. The percentage of women teachers in primary schools again, the districts varied from 65% in Ernakulam and Trichur to around 27% in Kozhikode.

38. The percentage of trained teachers among the teachers in primary schools is very high. In 1950-51 it was 90.8% which increased to 94.4% by 1965-66. Among males it was 95.6% and among women 93.0%. Among the districts, the variation in the percentage of trained teachers is not considerable. In all the districts, taking both males and female teachers, more than 90% were trained in 1965-66. This is true in the case of male teachers alone also. However, in the case of female teachers in Quilon and Trivandrum, only 88% and 89% teachers respectively were trained. See Statement VIII for district-wise details.

EXPENDITURE:

39. The total direct expenditure on primary schools in Kerala increased from 6.09 crores to 7.46 crores in 1960-61 to 1965-66. This shows a cumulative annual rate of growth of 4.0%. The direct expenditure in primary schools increased in all the districts of the State. However, the highest increase was in Cannanore, where it increased by 40% during the period taking 1960-61 as 100. On the other hand, in Trichur the percentage increase was only 11.

40. The per capita expenditure on primary schools in the State was Rs.3.6 in 1960-61 and has increased to Rs.3.9 by 1965-66. Among the districts the per capita expenditure in 1965-66 was highest in Trichur (Rs.4.8), Cannanore (4.6) and Kozhikode (Rs.4.5). In Alleppey, Kottayam and Trivandrum the per capita expenditure was Rs.3.3 only.

41. The total direct expenditure on primary schools formed 32.2% of the total direct expenditure on education in the State in 1960-61. By 1965-66 this percentage decreased to 26.0%. Among the districts, in 1965-66, this percentage expenditure varied from 14.2 in Trivandrum to 37 in Kozhikode. In all the districts the expenditure on primary education as a percentage of the total direct expenditure on education decreased in 1965-66 as compared to 1960-61.

42. The cost per student on the average in primary schools in 1965-66 was Rs.39.2 at the State level. This varied from Rs.50.9 in Palghat and Rs.50.6 in Cannanore to Rs.31.8 in Alleppey, Rs.31.5 in Trivandrum and Rs.30.9 in Quilon. The cost per student has a direct relation with the pupil-teacher ratio. The pupil-teacher ratio was highest in these districts where the cost per student was less. The pupil-teacher ratio was 49 to 50 in Alleppey, Quilon and Trivandrum. Whereas in Cannanore and Palghat where the cost per student was the highest, the pupil-teacher ratio was around 30 to 31. The table below summarises the position. District-wise details are given in Statement IX.

VIII: MIDDLE SCHOOL EDUCATION:

INSTITUTIONS:

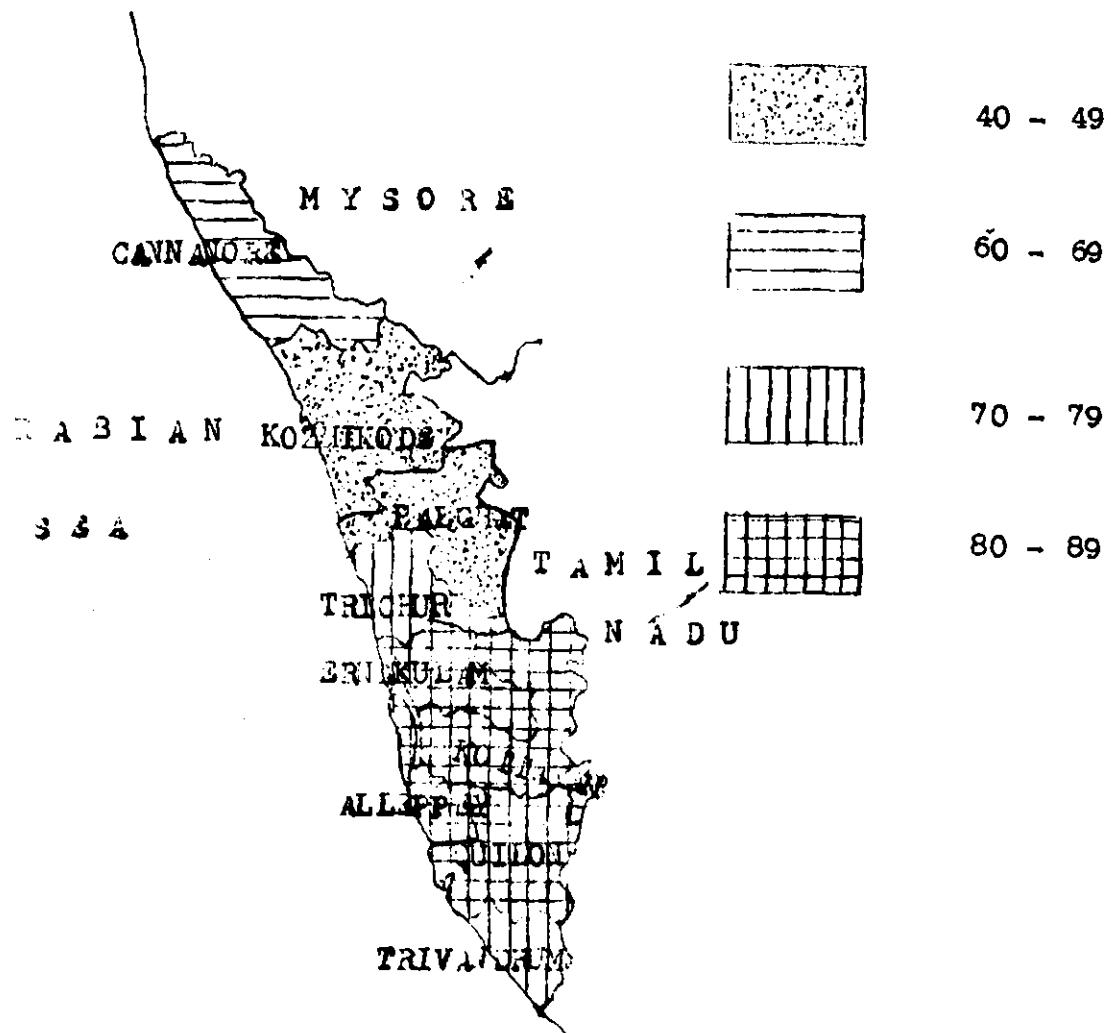
43. The number of middle schools generally consisting of classes V-VII increased from 1933 to 2446 during the period 1960-61 to 1965-66 in the State. This shows an increase of 27% over the 1960-61 position. Among the districts the percentages of increase in the middle schools during the period varied from 11% in Kozhikode to 73% in Trivandrum. In 1965-66 the number of middle schools was the lowest in Trivandrum district (187) and was the highest in Cannanore (432).

44. On the average there was a middle school for every 7.8 sq. miles in the State in 1960-61. By 1965-66 the position improved and there was a middle school for every 6.1 sq. miles at the State level. In all the districts also the area served by a middle school decreased during 1965-66 as compared to 1960-61. In Alleppey, which is a coastal district, there was a middle school for every 3.1 sq. miles in 1965-66, whereas on the other hand in Kottayam which consists of hilly areas there was a middle school for every of 10.2 sq. miles. In the other districts the area served by a middle school varied between these two limits.

45. On the average, at the State level, there was a middle school for every 3745 population in 1960-61 and by 1965-66 there was a middle school for every 7824 population. The improvement in the population-served by a middle school is observed in all the districts. However in 1965-66 there was a middle school in Cannanore for every 4664 population, whereas in Trivandrum there was one middle school only for every 10561 population. This wide variation in the

ulation served by a middle school may be due to the existence of large number of high schools in districts like Trivandrum as compared to the other districts like Cannanore statement-X gives the detailed data.

STATEMENT-X

46. The total enrolment in middle schools in 1965-66 was 11.47 lakhs in Kerala. Enrolment was highest in Cozhikode district (1.79 lakh) and was lowest in Trichur district (1.02 lakh).

The enrolment in classes VI-VIII in 1960-61 in the State was 6.95 lakhs. This increased to 8.65 lakhs by 1965-66. This shows a growth rate of 4.3% per annum. The growth rate of enrolment in these classes, of boys during the period was 3.8% and that of girls 5.1%. The sex ratio of enrolment, that is number of girls for every 100 boys enrolled was 80 at the State level. In the different districts the sex ratio varied from 63 in Palghat to 88 in Kottayam and Alleppey in 1965-66.

47. Taking 1960-61 as 100, the percentage enrolment in 1965-66 in the different districts, along with sex ratio, is given in the table below. The percentage increase varied between 10% in Palghat to 46% in Ernakulam.

population in the age-group 11-14 (1965-66)

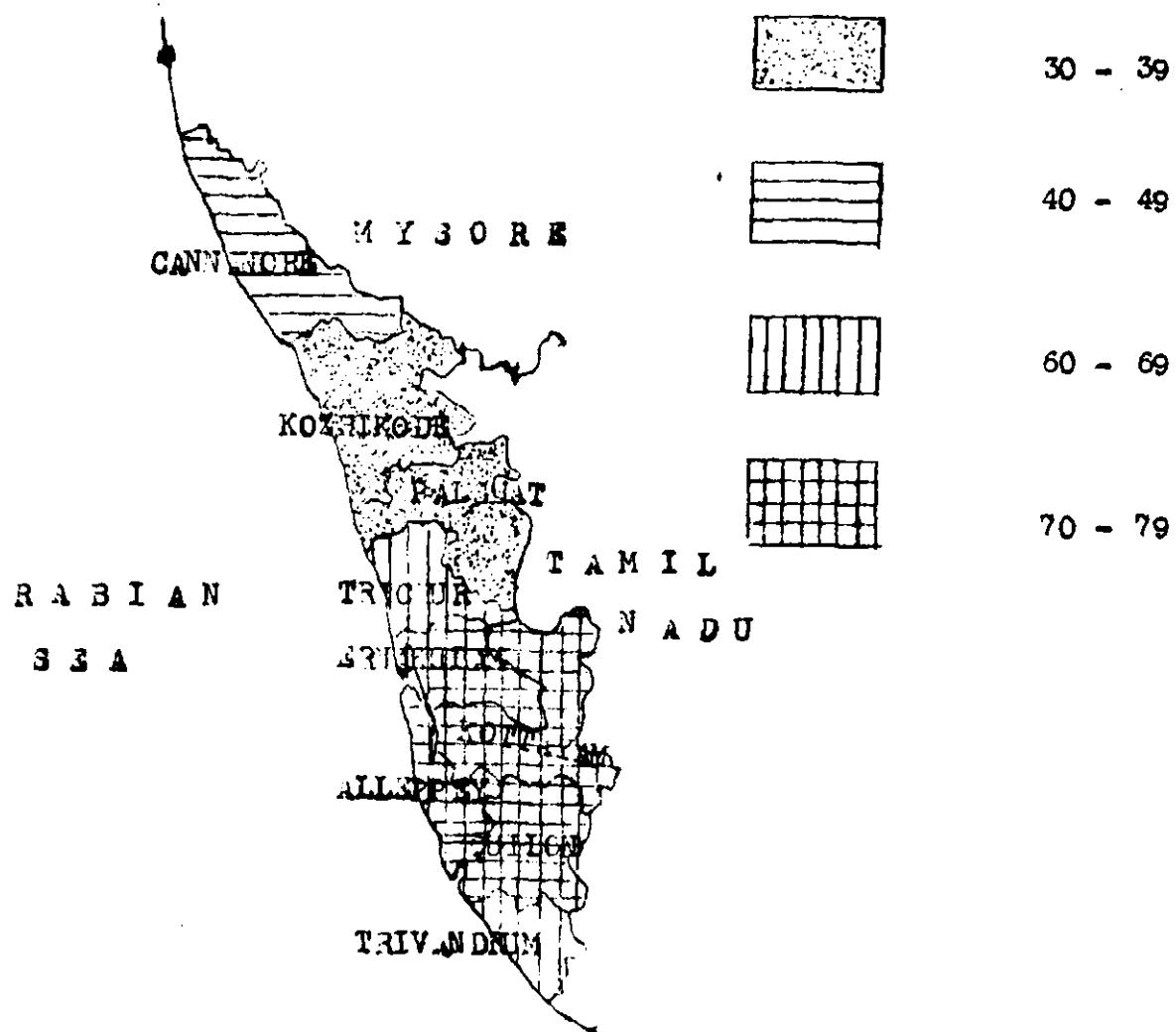

48. The percentage enrolment in Classes VI-VIII to the population in the age-group 11-14 (enrolment ratio) gives an index of the facilities created for middle stage of education. In Kerala the percentage enrolment in Classes VI-VIII to the population in the age-group 11-14 increased from 58.3% to 64.6% during the period at the State level. In the case of boys the increase during the period was from 67.8% to 71.2% and in the case of girls from 49.1 to 57.9%. There is large variation in the percentage enrolment of boys and girls in the different districts of the State. Taking both boys and girls together, the percentage enrolment in Classes VI-VIII in 1965-66 was highest (84.1%) in Alleppey, followed by 80.1% in Quilon. In Ernakulam Kottayam, Trivandrum and Trichur this percentage enrolment was between 70 to 30; in Cannanore it was 51.5% and in Kozhikode about 40%. In the case of boys the percentage enrolment was 80.3% in Alleppey, Kozhikode, Quilon, Trivandrum and Ernakulam; 75% in Trichur, 53% in Cannanore and around 48% in Kozhikode and Palghat. In the case of girls the percentage enrolment was 70-80% in Quilon, Kottayam, Ernakulam and Alleppey; 65-66% in Trichur and Trivandrum; 42% in Cannanore and 30-35% in Kozhikode and Palghat.

49. Thus it is seen that the percentage enrolment in Classes VI-VIII is very much below the other districts in Cannanore, Kozhikode and Palghat.

ENROLMENT OF SCHEDULED CASTES AND SCHEDULED TRIBES:

50. Of the total enrolment in Classes VI-VIII in 1965-66 nearly 82500 students belonged to the Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes communities. Of this number 43742 were boys and 35729 were girls. The total enrolment of Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes students in these classes varied from 3906 in Palghat to 12823 in Quilon. Of course this variation in the total enrolment of Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes will depend on the total population of these communities in the different districts. The percentage of Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes students to total enrolment in Classes VI-VIII was 9.5% at the State level. In the case of boys this percentage was 9.7 and in the case of girls 9.3. Among the districts the percentage enrolment was 12.4 in Trivandrum, whereas it was only 6.0 in Koznikode. There is not much difference between the percentage of boys and girls of these communities enrolled to the corresponding total enrolment in the different districts excepting in Cannanore and Trivandrum. In Trivandrum the percentage of boys enrolled was 11.2, whereas 13.8 of the girls were enrolled. On the other hand, in the case of Cannanore the boys formed 14.0% and the girls only 7.4% to the corresponding total enrolment.

51. The extent of coverage of Scheduled Caste and Scheduled Tribe students was nearly 100 (98.9) at the State level. In the case of boys the extent of coverage was 100% and in the case of girls 96.9%. The extent of coverage varied between 53.7 in Palghat to 183.9 in Cannanore. Taking both boys and girls together, the extent of coverage was more than 100 in Alleppey, Cannanore, Kottayam and Trivandrum. In other districts exceptin; in Palghat where it was only 54%, the extent of coverage was around 80 to 90. This clearly shows that special steps are necessary to enrol Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes students in Palghat district. Statement XII gives district-wise details.

TEACHERS:

52. The total number of teachers in middle schools in Kerala in 1960-61 was 28699. This consisted of 16398 men and 12301 women. The percentage of women teachers was 42.9 in 1960-61 at the State level. By 1965-66 the total number of teachers in the midile schools increased to 37903 of which 45.8% were women. The increase in the number of teachers during the period was observed in all the districts and also both in men and women teachers. However, in all the districts the increase in the number of women teachers during the period was more than that of men. Taking 1960-61 as the base, the increase in the number of teachers during the period was 32% at the State level. However, the increase was 8% in Trivandrum and 73% in Ernakulam, whereas in Cannanore it was only 18% and in Alleppey, Palghat and Quilon it was around 20-21%.

53. The percentage of women teachers in 1965-66 was very high in Trichur (62.6) and in Ernakulam (59.6). On the other hand the percentage of women teachers in Kozhikode was only 33.8 and in Cannanore 34.2.

54. The percentage of trained teachers both among men and women was very high in all the districts in 1960-61 and 1965-66. In 1960-61, 77.9% of the teachers were trained at the state level. In the case of men 78.8% were trained and in the case of women 76.7% were trained. By 1965-66 the percentage of trained teachers increased to 86.1, whereas the percentage of trained teachers among men was 87.3 and among women 84.6. In 1965-66, in all the districts the percentage of trained teachers separately among men, women and total was around 85 or more. In Palghat which had the highest percentage of trained teachers, 90.5% of all teachers were trained. Statement XIII gives district-wise details.

EXPENDITURE

55. The total direct expenditure on middle schools in Kerala increased from ..3.70 crores to ..3.49 crores during the period 1960-61 to 1965-66. This shows a cumulative annual rate of growth of 10.9%. The direct expenditure on middle schools increased in each of the districts of the State. Taking the position in 1960-61 as base, the increase in the direct expenditure was the highest in Trivandrum followed by Ernakulam. The increase was the lowest in Cannanore district. However, in all the districts the increase in the expenditure during the period was more than 50%.

-: :-

56. The per capita expenditure on middle schools which was Rs.2.2 in 1960-61 increased to Rs.3.4 by 1965-66. The per capita expenditure on middle schools in 1965-66 was the highest in Cannanore (Rs.4.4) followed by Kottayam (Rs.3.6). In Trivandrum district the per capita expenditure on middle schools was the lowest (Rs.2.9).

57. The total direct expenditure on middle schools formed 19.6% of the total direct expenditure on education in the State in 1960-61. By 1965-66 this percentage increased to 22.6. Among the districts, in 1965-66 this percentage expenditure varied from 12.5 in Trivandrum to 34.9 in Cannanore. In all the districts the expenditure on middle schools as a percentage of the total direct expenditure increased in 1965-66, as compared to 1960-61.

58. The average cost per student in middle schools in 1965-66 was Rs.56.6 at the State level. Among the districts, the cost per student varied from Rs.47.5 in Ernakulam and Rs.34.4 in Trichur. In the other districts, the cost per student varied from Rs.51.0 to Rs.60.8. As in the case of primary schools the cost per student has a direct relation with the pupil-teacher ratio. The pupil-teacher ratio was higher in those districts where the cost per student was less. In Trivandrum where the cost per student was the lowest, teacher-pupil ratio was 35; whereas in Trichur, Cannanore and Palghat where the cost per student was more than Rs.60, the pupil-teacher ratio varied from 26 to 28. The Table below summarises the position. The details are given in Statement XIV.

TRANSFER RATE FROM PRIMARY STAGE TO MIDDLE STAGE:

59. Generally the transfer rate from primary stage to middle stage is calculated as the enrolment in Class VI in a year as a percentage of enrolment in Class V in the previous year. However, since the class-wise enrolment is not available district-wise, the transfer rate here has been calculated with the enrolment in Classes VI-VIII as a percentage of enrolment in Classes I-V in the same year. In Kerala the primary stage is from I-IV and middle stage from Classes V-VII. However, here the primary stage has been taken as Classes I-V and middle stage as Classes VI-VIII. The transfer rate calculated as stated above is given below, districtwise:-

50. At the State level the transfer rate as defined above increased from 29.1% to 30.1 during the period under consideration for both boys and girls taken together. In the case of boys the transfer rate increased from 31.1% to 31.8% and in the case of girls from 26.8% to 28.3%.

51. Among boys in 1965-66 the lowest transfer rate from primary stage to middle stage was in Kozhikode (22.3%) followed by Palghat (26.1%) and Cannanore (28.0%). The highest transfer rate was observed in Alleppey (39.6%). Among the girls again, the lowest transfer rate was in Kozhikode (17.3%) followed by Palghat (18.7%). The highest transfer rate among girls was in Alleppey (40.1%). Taking both boys and girls together, the transfer rate was again highest in Alleppey (39.8%) and the lowest transfer rate was observed in Kozhikode (20.1%). At the all-India level the transfer rate was 22.1% for boys 14.8% for girls and 19.8% for both sexes together in 1962-63. This increased to 23.8%, 15.6% and 20.8% respectively in 1965-66.

IX - HIGH SCHOOL EDUCATION:

INSTITUTIONS:

62. The number of high schools in Kerala increased from 582 to 1155 during the period under review. This shows an increase of 31% over the 1960-61 position. Among the districts the percentage of increase in high schools during the period was highest in Trivandrum (61%) followed by Kozhikode (45%) and Cannanore (42%). On the other hand the percentage increase in the number of high schools was only 18.

50. At the State level the transfer rate as defined above increased from 29.1% to 30.1% during the period under consideration for both boys and girls taken together. In the case of boys the transfer rate increased from 31.1% to 31.8% and in the case of girls from 26.3% to 26.3%.

51. Among boys in 1965-66 the lowest transfer rate from primary stage to middle stage was in Kozhikode (22.3%) followed by Palghat (26.1%) and Cannanore (28.0%). The highest transfer rate was observed in Alleppey (39.6%). Among the girls again, the lowest transfer rate was in Kozhikode (17.6%) followed by Palghat (18.7%). The highest transfer rate among girls was in Alleppey (40.1%). Taking both boys and girls together, the transfer rate was again highest in Alleppey (39.8%) and the lowest transfer rate was observed in Kozhikode 20.1%. At the All-India level the transfer rate was 22.1% for boys 14.8% for girls and 19.6% for both sexes together in 1962-63. This increased to 23.8%, 15.6% and 20.8% respectively by 1965-66.

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INSTITUTIONS:

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63. On the average there was a high school for every 17.0 sq. miles in 1960-61 in the State. By 1965-66 the position improved and there was a high school for every 13.0 sq. mil at the State level. In all the districts also the area served by a high school decreased substantially by 1965-66 as compared to 1960-61. In Alleppey, a high school on the average served an area of 4.6 sq. miles in 1965-66. On the other hand in Cannanore a high school served an area of 29.8 sq. miles and in Palghat 21.1 sq. miles. In the other districts the area served by a high school varied from 7.5 sq. miles to 18.1 sq. miles.

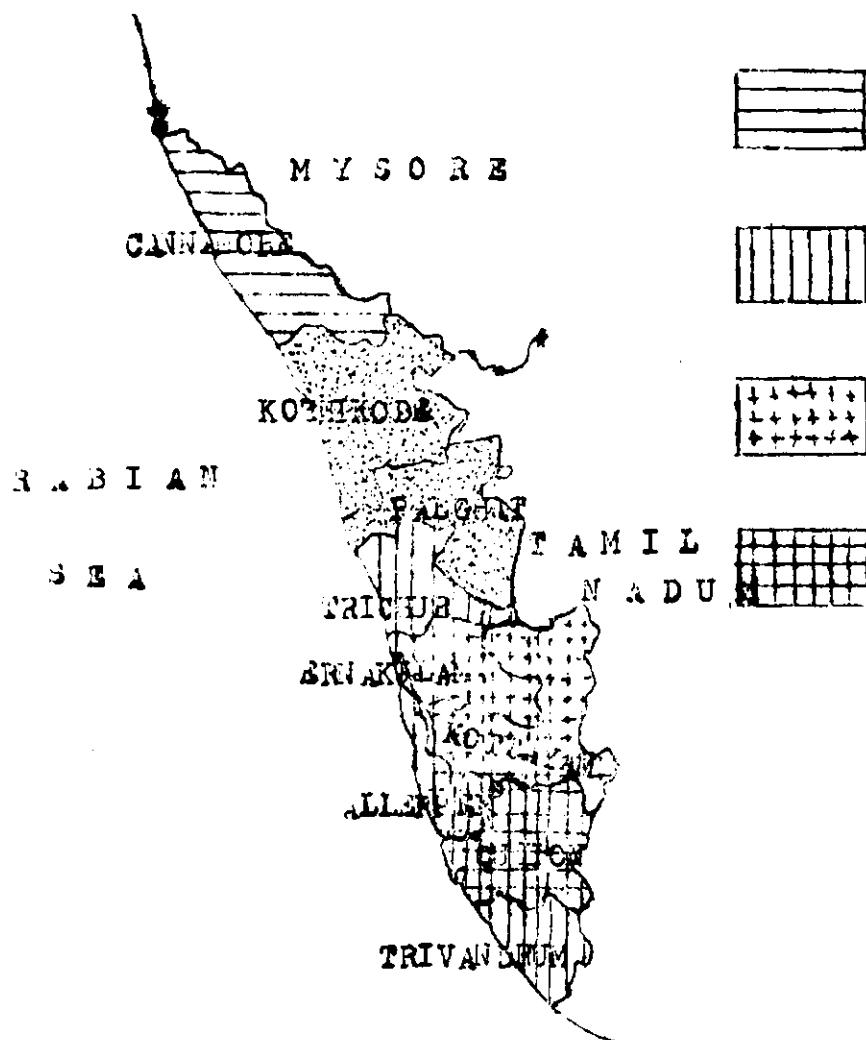
64. On the average at the State level, there was a high school for every 19000 population in 1960-61. By 1965-66 there was a high school for every 16570 of the population. On the population basis the position also improved in all the districts during the period. In 1965-66, while in Ernakulam a high school served a population of 12600, in Kozhikode a high school served a population of 25200. In the other districts the population served by a high school varied between these two limits. Statement XV gives the details.

ENROLMENT:

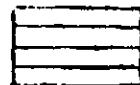
65. The enrolment in Classes IX-X at the State level which stood at 1.79 lakhs in 1960-61 more than doubled by 1965-66 and increased to 3.69 lakhs. This shows a growth rate of 14.0% per annum. The growth rate of enrolment in these classes during this period for boys was 13.6% and for girls was 16.0%. The sex ratio of enrolment i.e. number of girls for every 100 boys enrolled was 81 at the State level. In the different districts the

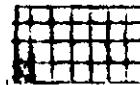

sex ratio varied from 52 in Kozhikode to 99 in Kottayam. Taking 1960-61 as 100, the percentage increase in the enrolment during the period in the different districts along with the sex ratio is given in the following table. The percentage increase varied from 69% in Kottayam to 145% in Cannanore. The details are given in Table XVI:-

66. The percentage enrolment in Classes IX-X to the population in the age-group 14-16 increased from 24.2% in 1960-61 to 44.7% in 1965-66 at the State level taking both boys and girls together. In the case of boys this percentage increased from 29.8% to 49.7% and in the case of girls from 18.9 to 39.7. Among the districts, in 1965-66, this percentage enrolment, for boys and girls together, was highest in Alleppey (69), followed by Quilon (52.7). In Ernakulam, Kozhikode, Trichur and Trivandrum this varied between 48% to 54%. However, in Cannanore the corresponding percentage was only 31 and in Palghat and Kozhikode it was 24 and 22 respectively. In the case of boys this percentage enrolment was 70% or more, in Quilon and Alleppey; 50-60 in Ernakulam and Kozhikode, Trichur and Trivandrum; 79 in Cannanore; 31 in Palghat and 29 in Kozhikode. In the case of girls in Alleppey the percentage enrolment was 64 and in Ernakulam, Kozhikode, Quilon and Trichur and Trivandrum it varied from 44 to 56. In Cannanore, Kozhikode and Palghat it was only between 15% to 25%.

67. Thus it is clear that the enrolment in high school classes in Kozhikode, Palghat and Cannanore is very much behind the other districts of the State.

ENROLMENT OF SCHEDULED CASTES & SCHEDULED TRIBES:

...-68. The details of enrolment of Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes in Classes IX-X in 1965-66 are given in Statement XVII. Of the total enrolment in Classes IX-X in 1965-66, nearly 30,000 belonged to the Scheduled Caste and Scheduled Tribe communities. Of this number, about 17,000 were boys and 13,000 girls. The percentage of Scheduled Caste and Scheduled Tribe students to the total enrolment in Classes IX-X was 8.1 at the State level. The percentage of Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes population to the total population in the State was only 9.6. The percentage of Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes students to the total enrolment in these classes varied from district to district. Taking both boys and girls together, this percentage was 4.5 in Palghat and 11.5 in Trivandrum. In the other districts this varied between these two limits. The extent of coverage of Scheduled Caste and Scheduled Tribe students was 84.4 at the State level. Among boys this was 85.6 and among girls 82.3. There was wide variation in the extent of coverage among the different districts. The extent of coverage of these students was only 33.6 in Palghat, even though 13.4% of the population in Palghat consisted of Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes. On the other hand, in Trivandrum the extent of coverage was 116.2. In the other districts the extent of coverage varied between 65 and 92. Districtwise position of the extent of coverage of Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes is given on the next page.

TEACHERS:

69. The total number of teachers in the High Schools in Kerala was 26854 in 1960-61 which increased to 39156 by 1965-66. This shows an annual growth rate of 7.4% per annum. The number of teachers in high schools increased in all the districts. The highest increase was in Quilon and the lowest in Palghat and Trichur.

70. Women teachers formed 38.3% of the total number of teachers in high schools in 1960-61 which increased to 42.3% by 1965-66. In the different districts, the percentage of women teachers varied between 30% and 50% in 1965-66.

71. The percentage of trained teachers among the teachers in high schools is very high. In 1960-61, 75.2% of these teachers were trained. There was no appreciable difference in the percentage of trained teachers among men and women teachers. By 1965-66 the percentage of trained teachers increased to 85.8 at the State level. Among men teachers 87.5% were trained and among women teachers 83.4% were trained. Variation among the districts in the percentage of trained teachers was negligible. It varied only between 83.8% in Quilon to 88.7% in Palghat. Statement VIII gives district-wise details.

EXPENDITURE:

72. The total direct expenditure on high schools in Kerala increased from Rs.4.74 crores in 1960-61 to Rs.8.57 crores in 1965-66. This shows an increase of 81% during the period of the 1960-61 expenditure. There has been appreciable increase in the expenditure on high schools in the different districts also. The percentage increase during the period, taking 1960-61 as base, varied from 56% in Palghat to 110% in Trivandrum.

73. The per capita expenditure on the high schools was only Rs.2.8 in 1960-61. This increased to Rs.4.5 by 1965-66. The per capita expenditure increased substantially in all the districts. This varied from Rs.2.2 in Kozhikode to Rs.6.7 in Alleppey. The per capita expenditure was between Rs.2 and Rs.3 in three districts, namely, Cannanore, Kozhikode and Palghat; between Rs.5 and Rs.6 in five districts, namely, Trivandrum, Ernakulam, Quilon, Trichur and Kottayam; and was more than Rs.6 in Alleppey.

74. The direct expenditure on high schools formed 25.1% of the total direct expenditure on education in the State in 1960-61. By 1965-66 this percentage increased to 29.9. Among the districts, in 1965-66 this percentage expenditure varied from 18.4 in Kozhikode to 43.1 in Alleppey. In all the districts the expenditure on high school education as the percent of the total direct expenditure increased in 1965-66 as compared to 1960-61.

75. The average cost per student in high schools in 1965-66 was Rs.81.5 at the State level. Among the districts it varied from Rs.75.0 in Cannanore to Rs.89.1 in Kottayam.

76. The pupil-teacher ratio in high schools at the State level was 27. The variation among the districts in the pupil-teacher ratio was only from 25 in Palghat to 28 in Quilon. The table below summarises the position of direct expenditure on high schools and related variables. Statement XIX gives the district-wise data.

TRANSFER RATE FROM MIDDLE STAGE TO HIGH SCHOOL STAGE:

77. In Kerala the middle school stage consists of classes V-VII and the High school stage consists of classes VIII-X. However, to keep a uniform pattern, the middle school stage is taken as classes VI-VIII and high school stage as classes IX-X. Since the classwise enrolment at the middle stage as well as at the high school stage is not available district-wise, the transfer rate here has been calculated with the enrolment in classes IX and X as a percentage of enrolment in classes VI-VIII of the same year. At the State level the transfer rate, as defined above, has increased from 25.7% in 1960-61 to 42.7% in 1965-66 taking both boys and girls. In the case of boys the transfer rate has increased from 27.0% to 42.5%. At the same time, the transfer rate of girls has increased from 24.0% to 42.9%. The district-wise position in 1965-66 is given below:-

78. Among the boys the lowest transfer rate from middle stage to high school stage was in Cannanore (36.8%) followed by Kozhikode (37.7%) and Kottayam (39.2%). The transfer rate was highest in Alleppey (48.5%). Among the girls the transfer rate was lowest in Kozhikode (29.1%). However taking both the boys and girls together the lowest transfer rate was in Kozhikode and highest in Alleppey.

X - TEACHER TRAINING INSTITUTIONS:

79. In 1960-61 there were 80 teacher training schools and 18 colleges in Kerala. In every district there was a school of teacher training. The lowest being in Cannanore (5) and the highest in Alleppey (17). There was at least one College of Education in every district in the same year. In 1965-66 the total number of institutions for teacher training increased to 127. Of this 108 were under-graduate colleges. Because of the reclassification of educational institutions in 1964-65 all institutions which were called schools in 1960-61 have been classified as under-graduate colleges in 1965-66. The number of graduate and post-graduate colleges in 1965-66 was 19.

The total enrolment in teacher training institutions was 8408 in 1960-61 and this increased to 16371 by 1965-66. In 1960-61 of the total enrolment 6399 were in institutions classified as of school standard and 2009 were in colleges. In 1965-66 all the districts were classified as colleges. Among the districts, the maximum enrolment in these institutions and classes of teacher training attached to other institutions in 1965-66 was in Alleppey followed by Kottayam and the lowest enrolment was in Palghat. The details are given in Statement Xv.

I - VOCATIONAL AND TECHNICAL SCHOOLS:

INSTITUTIONS:

80. The number of vocational and technical schools excluding teacher training schools remained more or less the same in 1960-61 and 1965-66. This type of schools existed in all the districts in both the years. In 1960-61 there were 34 such schools in Trivandrum District but in 1965-66 only 26 remained. In Alleppey also the number of such schools increased from 12 to 9 during the period. In other districts the number of such schools increased or remained the same during the period.

ENROLMENT:

81. The total enrolment in these schools including in classes attached to other institutions increased from 10347 to 15342 during the period. This shows a cumulative growth rate of 7.8% per annum. The sex ratio of enrolment at the State level was 25 girls for every 100 boys in 1960-61 and 15 girls for every 100 boys in 1965-66. In the districts also there has been corresponding increase in enrolment in these institutions excepting in Trichur where the total enrolment in these institutions decreased from 2782 to 2578 during the period. In 1965-66 the enrolment in these institutions was the highest in Trivandrum 2837 followed by Trichur 2578 and Ernakulam 2262 and lowest in Palakkad 849 and Kottayam 830.

EXPENDITURE:

82. The total expenditure in these institutions increased from Rs. 62.67 lakhs to Rs. 90.02 lakhs during the period. The corresponding increase was observed in all the districts. In 1965-66 the expenditure on these institutions was highest in Trichur and lowest in Alleppey. District-wise details are given in Statement XVI.

XII - HIGHER EDUCATION:

INSTITUTIONS:

83. The total number of institutions of higher education including Universities increased from 87 in 1960-61 to 141 in 1965-66. This number of higher institutions in 1965-66 consisted of 100 Arts and Science Colleges, 5 Medical Colleges, 6 Engineering Colleges, 19 Teacher Training Colleges, 10 colleges for other professional and Special Education and one University. Arts and Science Colleges existed in both the years in all the districts. In 1965-66 Kottayam had the maximum number of these colleges (17), Ernakulam and Trivandrum had (15) each, Quilon (13), Alleppey (11) and Kozhikode (10). In Trichur, Cannanore and Palghat the number of colleges were (8), (6) and (5) respectively. The total number of Arts and Science colleges in the State more than doubled during the period from 46 to 100. In 1965-66 there were 2 Medical colleges (one of Ayurveda) in Trivandrum and one each in Alleppey, Kottayam and Kozhikode. Similarly, there was one Engineering college each in Ernakulam, Kozhikode, Palghat, Quilon, Trichur and Trivandrum. Teacher Training colleges existed in all the districts. So also colleges for other professional and Special Education, excepting in Alleppey, Palghat and

Quilon. The number of institutions of higher education was highest in Trivandrum followed by Kottayam and Ernakulam and was least in Palghat. Statement XII gives the details.

ENROLMENT:

64. The total enrolment in institutions of higher education in 1965-66 was 1.16 lakhs. Of this 1.03 lakhs were in arts and Science colleges alone. The enrolment in engineering colleges was about 5,000, medical colleges about 3600, teacher training colleges about 2700, and colleges for other professional and special education 1300. The University Teaching Departments had an enrolment of about 700. Among the districts the highest enrolment in higher educational institutions was in Trivandrum followed by Kottayam and Quilon and the lowest in Palghat. In Alleppey, Ernakulam, Kottayam, Kozhikode, Quilon, Trichur and Thrissur the enrolment in these institutions was more than 10,000 each. In Palghat and Cannanore the enrolment was around 6000 only.

65. The total enrolment in institutions of higher education including those in attached classes was 44747 in 1960-61 in the State. This more than tripled to 129379 by 1965-66. The sex ratio of enrolment was 41 girls for every 100 boys in 1960-61 which increased to 64 girls for every 100 boys by 1965-66. The increase in enrolment at the higher education level has taken place in all the districts. The increase in enrolment was more in the case of girl students than of boys during the period. The increase in enrolment taking 1960-61 as base was 130% in the case of boys and 285% in the case of girls and 189% taking both sexes together.

at the State level. The increase was the maximum in Alleppey for both boys and girls separately and was minimum in Trivandrum for both sexes separately. The following table gives the index of growth and sex ratio in 1965-66:-

86. Statement XXIV also gives the enrolment in higher education state in 1960-61 and 1965-66 as the percentage of the population in the age-group 16-23. At the State level this percentage increased from 1.9 to 5.0 during the period. In the case of boys it increased from 2.8 to 6.2 and in the case of girls from 1.0 to 3.8. In 1965-66, this percentage enrolment varied very much among the districts. In Cannanore, Kozhikode and Palghat the percentage enrolment, taking both boys and girls together, was only between 2 and 3%; whereas in all the other districts it was more than 5%. In the case of boys alone also in these three districts the percentage enrolment was between 3 and 4%; whereas in the other districts it was between 5 and 9%. In the case of girls in these three districts the percentage enrolment was only between 1 and 2%; whereas in the others it was more than 4%.

87. Thus it is clear that the facilities for higher education in these three districts in relation to ^{that} the population is very much below than in the other districts of the State.

88. Of the total enrolment in higher education state in 1965-66, 64208 was in pre-university/intermediate level, 11072 in B.A.(Pass and Honours courses), 21017 in B.Sc.(Pass and Honours courses), 2887 in Post-graduate courses including Research, 16371 in Teachers Training and 13824 in other courses of Professional and Special Education.

ENROLMENT OF SCHEDULED CASTES AND SCHEDULED TRIBES:

89. There were 6291 students of Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes studying in higher education classes at the State level. Of this 4256 were boys and 2025 were girls. The Scheduled Caste and Scheduled Tribe students formed 4.9% of the total enrolment in these classes. In the case of boys this percentage was 5.4 and in the case of girls 4.0. Among the districts the percentage of Scheduled Caste and Scheduled Tribe students to the total enrolment, taking both boys and girls together, varied from 6.2 in Trivandrum to 3.7 in Trichur. In the case of boys this varied from 6.7 in Trivandrum district to 3.9 in Trichur, and in the case of girls from 7.1 in Palghat to 3.4 in Cannanore, Kottayam and Trichur and 2.8 in Ernakulam.

90. The extent of coverage of Scheduled Caste and Scheduled Tribe students in higher education was 51 at the state level taking both boys and girls together. In the case of boys the extent of coverage was 55.7 and in the case of girls 41.7. In the districts the extent of coverage varied from 35.6 in Trichur to 64.5 in Cannanore. Statement XV gives the district-wise details.

TEACHERS:

91. The district-wise statistics of teachers in institutions of higher education is given in Statement XVI. The total number of teachers in these institutions was 5859 in 1965-66 consisting of 4277 men and 1582 women. The corresponding numbers in 1950-51 were 2861, 2219 and 642 respectively. The number of teachers in these institutions have increased substantially in all the districts and at the State level. The maximum increase was in

Alleppey district and the minimum in Palghat and Trivandrum. However, the highest number of teachers in 1965-66 was in Trivandrum district. Of the total number of teachers (4553) 77.81% were in colleges for general education; 1187 (20.2%) in colleges of professional and other education and 119 (2.0%) were in Universities and Research Institutions. The pupil-teacher ratio in Arts and Science colleges was 23. This ratio varied from 21 in Ernakulam and Palghat to 38 in Trivandrum.

EXPENDITURE:

92. The total expenditure on higher education increased from Rs. 353.08 lakhs to 518.25 lakhs during the period. Of the total direct expenditure in 1965-66, 49.9% was on Arts and Science colleges; 10.3% on Medical colleges; 7.6% on Engineering colleges; 6.2% on Teacher Training colleges (Post-graduate and Under-graduate level); 26.0% on other colleges of Professional and Special education and the university. The total expenditure on higher education has increased substantially in all the districts except in Trichur, where it has remained more or less the same as the 1960-61 level. The expenditure on higher education increased at a cumulative growth rate of 7.6% per annum.

93. In 1965-66 the total direct expenditure on higher education formed 18.1% of the total direct expenditure on education in the State. In 1960-61, this percentage of expenditure was 18.7%. The percentage expenditure on higher education to total direct expenditure on education varied from 6.3% in Cannanore to 46.3% in Trivandrum where the University is situated.

94. The average direct expenditure per student per annum in 1965-66 was Rs.252 in Arts and Science colleges; Rs.470 in Teacher Training colleges; Rs.1465 in Medical colleges and Rs.776 in Engineering colleges. The cost per student in Arts and Science colleges varied from Rs.206 in Alleppey district to Rs.314 in Palghat district. The district-wise details are given in Statement XVII.
