Bonus Scheme was introduced with effect from the 1st January, 1948, bonus being allowed at the rate of eight annas per maund for all foodgrains procured in a State and another eight annas per maund on exports made to other States under the Basic Plan. A revised Bonus Scheme was introduced from the 1st January, 1951, the main points of which were—

(a) No bonus was payable on grains procured by a State for its internal consumption, and

(b) Net export and import quotas were fixed for each State for the year and bonus was paid to the net importing and exporting States on a graded scale for exports and imports beyond a prescribed minimum.

The Bonus Scheme was, however, abolished with effect from 1st January 1952.
