ADMISSIONS AND EMPLOYMENT OF SCHEDULED CASTES AND SCHEDULED TRIBES CANDIDATES IN UNIVERSITIES AND COLLEGES DURING 1977-78

AN ANALYSIS

UNIVERSITY GRANTS COMMISSION NEW DELHI-110001 The SCT Cell of the University Grants Commission set up in January, 1979 is, interalia collecting regularly on an annual basis information regarding coursewise admissions, appointments to teaching and non-teaching posts, by reservation to candidates belonging to Scheduled Caste and Scheduled Tribe communities.

Such information of actual position has been collected from 1977-78 onwards and analysed. The present report analyses the actual position of admissions/appointments of Scheduled Caste and Scheduled Tribe candidates in the year 1977-78. Report for the year 1978-79 will also be on the lines of Report. Reports from 1979-80 onwards will further contain inforegarding reservation in hostels, utilization of fellowships and other programmes.

UNIVERSITY GRANTS COMMISSION

1. Analysis on the position of actual admissions and employment of scheduled castes and scheduled tribes in university and colleges in the year 1977-78.

The University Grants Commission has been bringing to the notice of the universities and colleges the guidelines of the Government of India regarding reservation for scheduled caste and scheduled tribe candidates in the matter of admissions to various courses of study and appointment to teaching and non-teaching posts in universities and colleges.

Provisions regarding admissions

The UGC has invited the attention of the universities and colleges to the guidelines issued by the Government of India from time to time and requested them that 20% of the seats (15% for scheduled castes and 5% for scheduled tribes—inter-changeable in case candidates are not available) be reserved for scheduled caste and scheduled tribe candidates in the matter of admissions. The UGC has further advised the universities and colleges that a concession of 5% marks be given to these candidates in respect of the minimum percentage of marks prescribed for admission to courses to ensure admissions up to the reserved percentages. It has also been suggested that a further relaxation in the marks in order of merit be also considered so that 20% of the reserved seats for scheduled caste and scheduled tribe candidates are filled (Annexure-1).

The University Grants Commission has discussed this question with the Government of India and the Commissioner of scheduled castes and scheduled tribes in the context of the unsatisfactory position regarding the actual admissions and appointments being made by universities and colleges from among the available scheduled caste and scheduled tribe candidates. Accordingly a special proforma has been designed to ascertain the actual position of enrolment to various courses of studies from among these communities on the initiative of the Commissioner for scheduled castes and scheduled tribes. In order to give pointed attention to this, the UGC has also set up a cell for effective implementation of reservation orders in favour of scheduled castes and scheduled tribes (Annexure-2). The universities have also been advised to set up similar cells (Annexure-3).

It is the responsibility of the UGC (SCT CELL) to circulate the decisions of the Government of India and the UGC among universities and colleges and to collect, regularly, on an annual basis the factual position regarding course-wise admissions by reservation to candidates belonging to scheduled caste and scheduled tribe, for different courses by a stipulated date and to take follow up action, wherever required.

The UGC has, accordingly, collected information regarding the actual admissions made by universities and colleges to various courses of studies from among these two communities for the year 1977-78. The courses have been divided as undergraduate, postgraduate and above. It has also been sub-divided as courses in Arts, Science, Commerce, Education, Engineering & Technology, Medicine, Agriculture, Veterinary Science, Law and others with the break up separately for scheduled caste and scheduled tribe communities giving the individual position in respect of these communities for undergraduate and postgraduate courses. Appendix-I gives the state-wise undergraduate enrolment position of scheduled caste and scheduled tribe students during 1977-78.

Scheduled Caste students' position: It is seen that the total admissions to undergraduate courses made from scheduled caste communities was only 7.5% as against the 15% reservation quota. In absolute numbers as against 22.25 lakhs of students enrolled at the undergraduate stage, nearly 1.70 lakhs could be admitted from scheduled caste communities.

Scheduled Tribe students' position: As regards scheduled tribe candidates the position is still worse. Only 1.6% of the total admissions had gone to these communities and in absolute numbers only 35,500 of scheduled tribe candidates had been admitted out of a total of 22.25 lakhs. In the admissions and equalization of opportunities, the all-India position for scheduled castes shows 0.5 as the co-efficient of equality which is 0.21 for scheduled tribes. The position in respect of each state/union territory is also given in Appendix-I.

Undergraduate enrolment position: The position of undergraduate enrolment for scheduled castes and scheduled tribes has also been analyzed in an integrated manner. It is seen that as against the provision of 20% reservation suggested, 9.07% is the actual coverage for scheduled castes and scheduled tribes put together. On the basis of scheduled caste and scheduled tribe population, most of the states have provided only that percentage for reservation which is comparable to the scheduled caste and scheduled tribe population in that state. However, in a few states like Kerala and Maharashtra, the reservation percentage for scheduled castes and scheduled tribes have been much more than the percentage of their population as the table at Appendix-3(a) would show. There are also States like Madhya Pradesh, Orissa, Rajasthan and West Bengal which have only provided 20% of the facilities for reservation even though the population of scheduled caste and scheduled tribe is higher than 20%.

The actual coverage of reservation at the undergraduate stage would show that the position is not satisfactory in Jammu & Kashmir, Kerala, Orissa, Rajasthan, Tamil Nadu, Uttar Pradesh and Delhi,

The position in the State of Maharashtra has been outstanding as against a population of 13.82% of scheduled castes and scheduled tribes, the actual coverage has come upto 11.38% with a co-efficient of equality of 0.82. There are certain individual differences in universities which have also been indicated in the remarks column of Appendix-3(a). It is also observed that 15 out of 115 universities have indicated that they have no statutory provisions for reservation for admission (Appendix-4).

Position of admission district-wise at undergraduate level: The coverage of undergraduate enrolment, district-wise has been studied for the first time and it is seen that from one district in Jammu & Kashmir and another in Meghalaya, no enrolment is reported from scheduled castes at the undergraduate level. In the case of Meghalaya, the position is understandable as the bulk of the population belongs to scheduled tribe communities. As regards scheduled tribe candidates, no enrolment is reported at the undergraduate level from 71 out of the 375 districts from where colleges and universities had sent their information. 35 of the 71 districts which have not reported undergraduate enrolment are from Uttar Pradesh followed by Bihar, 11 districts and Madhya Pradesh and Tamil Nadu 6 each. The availability of colleges district-wise is given in Appendix-5(a), which shows that there is at least one college in every district and in 325 districts at least 2 or 3 colleges. A detailed study of the positions in these districts is called for particularly because of the fact that the total enrolment at the undergraduate level of scheduled castes which is reported from all States is 1.7 lakhs and scheduled tribes 35,500 approximately which is also reported from all States. The enrolment position at the PUC/Higher Secondary level which provides students for degree level courses needs to be studied alongwith this data to see to what extent eligible students are finding difficult to secure admissions in colleges and universities. This will be undertaken in the studies pertaining to the year 1978-79 and thereafter. The district-wise position of enrolment of scheduled caste and scheduled tribe candidates has been studied separately state-wise. The tables from Appendix-6 to Appendix-23 indicate the position of actual enrolment of scheduled caste at the undergraduate and postgraduate levels separately giving information as to district-wise population, percentage of enrolment, co-efficient of equality which will be very helpful to the authorities at the state level for planning measures to reduce imbalances and to bring about equality of opportunities so that significant improvement is brought about in the position of actual access to higher education facilities by these communities. The position where no enrolment has been reported requires to be studied in detail from the individual state-wise, district-wise tables indicated as above.

As regards district-wise position of enrolment of scheduled tribe communities the position has been given in Appendices 24 to 38.

Position of postgraduate enrolment: As regards postgraduate enrolment of scheduled caste candidates, the state-wise position has been indicated in Appendix-2. It is seen that 7.5% of the total enrolment of postgraduate education and research reported from universities and colleges has been from scheduled caste communities. In absolute numbers as against a total reported enrolment of 2.34 lakhs at the postgraduate level, only about 17,600 are from the scheduled caste communities. The position in some of the States like Bihar, Jammu & Kashmir and Orissa is unsatisfactory at this level whereas the position in States like Maharashtra could be considered satisfactory.

As regards actual enrolment of scheduled tribe students, 2,990 of the total 2.34 lakhs of students admitted were from these communities which comes to 1.3% and the co-efficient of equality is 0.16. The position of post-graduate enrolment of scheduled castes and scheduled tribes has further been studied in an integrated manner with details as to the reservation percentage allowed and the actual enrolment made. This shows that from the 115 universities and the colleges affiliated to the affiliating universities among them, that as against 20% of the facilities to be reserved, the actual admissions made were 8.82% for the country as a whole against a population percentage of 22.54 for scheduled castes and scheduled tribes put together. The coefficient of equality works out to 0.39. The position has, further been analysed university-wise and indicated in remarks column of Appendix-39. Many of the universities have different figures of reservation as has been indicated in Appendix-39. The universities which have no reservation have also been indicated.

Appendix-40 would show that 12 universities have no provision of reservation for scheduled caste and scheduled tribe students at the postgraduate level and the actual coverage in terms of percentage, university-wise has also been indicated in Appendix-40. The position of actual enrolment of scheduled castes and scheduled tribes at the postgraduate level has also been studied in detail, district-wise. At the postgraduate level, the position of actual admissions among scheduled caste communities shows that no enrolment has been reported from 25 districts in the country from among the scheduled caste candidates (Appendix-5) and the position is still worse in so far as scheduled tribes are concerned as no postgraduate enrolment has been reported from 95 districts in the country. Uttar Pradesh (29 districts) followed by Madhya Pradesh (15 districts) account for the bulk of the districts where postgraduate enrolment has not been reported. The detailed position. state-wise, district-wise for scheduled castes is available in Appendix 6 to 23 and for scheduled tribes in Appendix 24 to 38. This would be studied from all angles from 1978-79 onwards.

Professional Courses: As regards professional courses, the position has been ascertained from universities and colleges regarding actual admis-

sions of scheduled caste and scheduled tribe students to professional courses separately at the graduate and postgraduate levels. The position has been summarized giving state-wise details in Appendix-41. It is seen that in the case of scheduled caste candidates, the actual admission at the graduate level has been to the extent of 6.8% as against the required 15%. In absolute numbers as against a total enrolment of 4.37 lakhs about 30,000 students have been actually admitted to professional courses at the first degree level. The position is still worse as regards scheduled tribe communities which account for 1.6% of the total enrolment made and in absolute numbers this was 6,900 out of a total of 4.37 lakhs for the whole country. The professional courses at the postgraduate level present a pathetic picture for scheduled caste candidates, the enrolment is 3.5% of the total enrolment and in absolute figures 980 students have been enrolled at the postgraduate level as against 27,700 students admitted. The position for scheduled tribe candidates shows that 160 of them have been admitted and the percentage works to 0.6. As regards the co-efficient of equality worked out, the figure for scheduled castes is 0.23 and for scheduled tribes 0.08. Further details along with percentages for different states have been tabulated in Appendix-41.

Non-professional courses: The position of non-professional courses at the graduate and postgraduate levels separately for scheduled caste and scheduled tribe candidates have been studied and it is seen that at the graduate level the coverage for scheduled caste candidates is 7.7% and for scheduled tribes 1.6% of the total enrolment. As regards postgraduate enrolment; the position shows that 8.1% of the total enrolment has gone to scheduled caste candidates and 1.4% to scheduled tribe candidates. Further details have been given in Appendix-42. The state-wise position in absolute numbers with percentages in parenthesis have been given.

Region-wise position: A further analysis of both professional and non-professional courses, region-wise, has also been attempted in Appendix 43 and 44 which shows that the position of graduate level enrolment for professional courses is better in South and West. It is unsatisfactory both in the North and East. As regards postgraduate level, the same position continues. In respect of scheduled tribe candidates, the position at the graduate level is better in the North and South and at the postgraduate level the position is better in the North and West. The reasons for these imbalances need to be studied in greater detail and depth. Other details regarding co-efficient of equality and the like may be seen in Appendix 43-44.

Course-wise position of Admissions of SC and ST Students: An analysis of the position of actual admissions of scheduled caste and scheduled tribe candidates at the graduate and postgraduate levels has also been made by classifying the courses in 10 groups namely Arts, Science, Commerce,

Education, Engineering & Technology, Medicine, Agriculture, Vet. Science, Law and others. The position has been tabulated in *Appendices* 45 to 54. The position of admission in a summary form for various courses as indicated in these tables is given below.

A region-wise analysis for Arts courses shows that the scheduled caste enrolment has gone up to 10.4% with a co-efficient of equality of 0.69 but the position for the West shows a co-efficient of equality of 1.04 showing thereby that so far as admissions to Arts courses for scheduled caste candidates in the institutions located in the West, are concerned they have been able to take advantage of the facilities to the extent of their reservation percentages. At the postgraduate level, the position for scheduled caste candidates shows that the actual enrolments have come upto 10.5% with a co-efficient of equality of 0.7. It is seen that at the postgraduate level, too, the institutions located in the West have been able to more or less provide facilities upto the reservation percentage.

As regards scheduled tribe candidates, the coverage is 2% for Arts courses, with the position in the North region showing a co-efficient of equality 1.07 (Appendix-45). As regards postgraduate level the percentage of actual enrolment is 1.7 with North region indicating a co-efficient of equality of 1.43 (Appendix-45). It may be added here that the Northern region has a small percentage of ST population.

As regards Science courses, the position is unsatisfactory as only 4.4% of the total enrolment in Science courses are from scheduled caste

communities. In absolute numbers only a little above 18,000 have been enrolled in Science courses as against a total enrolment of 4.2 lakhs of all Science students. At the postgraduate level 3.6% of the enrolment are from scheduled caste candidates and in absolute numbers 1,606 students were enrolled for science courses at the postgraduate level as against nearly 45,000 students admitted at the postgraduate level, in Science courses. So for as scheduled tribe students are concerned, the coverage is 0.8% for Science courses and there were 3,436 students who had been enrolled at the first-degree level for science courses out of a total enrolment of 4.2 lakhs of students enrolled for these courses. At the postgraduate level 318 students belonging to scheduled tribe candidates have been admitted out of a total of nearly 45,000 students, the co-efficient of equality being 0.09. The imbalances are pronounced and would need further study for taking remedial measures for equalizing the opportunities for these communities (Appendix-46).

As regards Commerce courses, the enrolment of scheduled caste students is 4.7% and the actual enrolment in absolute figures was 20,361 as against the total enrolment reported as 4.3 lakhs. At the postgraduate level 1,524 (5.2%) out of a total 29,503 has been enrolled for Commerce courses. The position in respect of scheduled tribe students is 1.3% of the enrolment or 5,440 out of 4.3 lakhs at the undergraduate level and 307 students or one per cent out of a total enrolment of 29,503 for Commerce courses at the postgraduate level in the country. The co-efficient of equality is 0.13 for scheduled tribes at the postgraduate level and is very unsatisfactory in the institutions located in the East where the co-efficient of equality is just 0.01. Further details are in Appendix-47.

As regards coverage in *Education* courses the coverage of scheduled caste students is 6.1% and scheduled tribe candidates 2% at the graduate level. At the postgraduate level, the coverage of scheduled caste students is 3.6% as against 39 out of 3,793 enrolled from scheduled tribe candidates. It is seen that the co-efficient of equality is 0.08 for scheduled tribe students at the postgraduate level from the West, as against the all-India co-efficient of equality of 0.13 Appendix-48.

As regards Engineering & Techdology (Appendix-49) the actual enrolment of scheduled caste candidates at the graduate level is 6·1% which for scheduled tribe candidates is 0·9%. The position seems to be better in the institutions of the South at the undergraduate level but at the postgraduate level the position is that institutions located in the West have provided better facilities. While the scheduled caste coverage in the PG courses is 2·9% of the total enrolment, the unsatisfactory position is all the more revealing. It was noted that actual enrolment of scheduled caste students in Postgraduate courses in Engineering & Technology was 154 out of 5,270. As regards scheduled tribe students, 28 were admitted out of a total enrolment of 5,270 accounting for 0·5% the co-efficient of equality being 0·07. The position at the post-

graduate level seems to be better in the institutions in the West whereas, the position seems to be better in the institutions located in the South for the first degree courses, so far as scheduled caste candidates are concerned. As regards, scheduled tribe candidates, the position seems to be better in the North for first-degree courses and in the West for postgraduate degree courses.

As regards courses in Medicine, while the actual enrolment position is 8.4% for scheduled caste candidates, the position is better in the institutions located in the South and West and the position is satisfactory in the institutions located in the North and East. As regards postgraduate courses, 4.3% of the scheduled caste students are enrolled in postgraduate courses in Medicine with an actual enrolment of 470 out of 9,779 during the year under review (Appendix-50).

It may, further, be indicated that the position of providing facilities is satisfactory in the institutions located in the Western region so far as postgraduate courses in Medicines are concerned. For scheduled tribe candidates, the actual enrolment is 1.9% at the first-degree level and 0.7% at the postgraduate degree level. It is seen that the position is very satisfactory for scheduled tribe candidates in the institutions located in the South and West but the position is unsatisfactory in the North and the East. As regards postgraduate courses in Medicine, 70 persons belonging to scheduled tribes were admitted for postgraduate courses in medicine out of a total enrolment of 9,779 and the position is unsatisfactory throughout the country. A detailed analysis for this sector is necessary as the actual admissions from some of the individual medical colleges have indicated that all the students who had the minimum prescribed marks had not been able to secure admissions even though there were seats reserved for them in the medical colleges (Appendix-50).

As regards courses in Agriculture are concerned while the percentage of actual enrolment of scheduled castes is 6% at the undergraduate level and 2.8% at the postgraduate level, the position of distribution of students is more or less evenly balanced throughout the country without any significant imbalances, as could be seen from the region-wise study in Appendix-51. At the postgraduate level, the position is not so satisfactory as only the institutions located in the South & West have been able to provide more seats. As regards scheduled tribe candidates. 0.4% were actually enrolled at the undergraduate and postgraduate degree levels, the actual enrolment showing 121 out of 27,183 at the undergraduate level and 21 out of 5,776 at the postgraduate level. It is seen that at the undergraduate and postgraduate levels, the institutions in the North have provided more seats to scheduled tribe candidates (Appendix-51).

There is no significant departure in the pattern of enrolment in the Veterinary Sciences as different from the courses in Agriculture. In any case, the enrolment in Veterinary Science for the country has not expanded and

the total enrolment for the country at the undergraduate level was 5,526 at the first-degree level and 926 at the postgraduate level.

As regards courses in Law, the percentage of scheduled castes enrolment was 6.8 with 10,419 students having been enrolled against a total enrolment of 1.54 lakhs at the first-degree level. As regards postgraduate level 43 (1.8%) belonged to scheduled caste candidates who were doing LL.M. courses out of a total enrolment of 2,333. The position for scheduled tribes at the first degree level is 2,852 (1.9%) out of a total enrolment of 1.54 lakhs and just 4 students out of a total of 2,333 (0.2%) at postgraduate degree level. The coverage of enrolment is better in the South and the West at the first-degree level in respect of the scheduled castes. As for scheduled tribes, the coverage is better in the South and East. As regards postgraduate level the position is uniformally unsatisfactory (Appendix-53).

An analysis of faculty-wise SC enrolment has also been done on the basis of state-wise figures compiled both for undergraduate and postgraduate levels. The position for Arts courses shows that the States of Andhra, Maharashtra, U.P., & West Bengal have reached near the 15% provided, West Bengal having even crossed 15%. The position in the other States needs to be improved considerably as the analysis in earlier paragraphs has already shown.

At the postgraduate level also, the above States have more or less maintained the level of progress as at the undergraduate level. At the postgraduate level, West Bengal has an enrolment percentage of 10.9 as against 15.1% at the undergraduate level (Appendix-55).

Regarding the State-wise position of enrolment of scheduled tribe students, Bihar, Gujarat, Maharashtra have shown 5 or more per cent and Meghalaya which is pre-dominantly scheduled tribe population has accommodated 72% of their students from this community. As regards postgraduate enrolment of scheduled tribe candidates, the position is 8.5% in Assam, 7.9 in Rajasthan and 34.3% in Meghalaya.

These figures need to be analysed still further on the basis of the population coverage of scheduled castes and scheduled tribes in the respective States and districts.

Regarding Science Courses, (Appendix-56). it is seen that while the position at the first degree level is unsatisfactory for both scheduled caste and scheduled tribe communities, some improvement in the enrolment position is seen in Tamil Nadu, U.P. and West Bengal. As regards postgraduate enrolment is concerned, some improvement can be seen in Assam and Maharashtra. As regards scheduled tribe students are concerned, Himachal Pradesh shows an enrolment of 3% unlike all other States but this is also not significant as in absolute terms the actual enrolment is 56 students out of a total of 1,899. As regards Meghalaya which has dominant population of scheduled tribes, 128 out of 652 enrolled at the first-degree level for Science courses are from scheduled tribe communities. At the postgraduate level,

this number is 42 out of a total of 108 students admitted for postgraduate courses.

For Commerce courses while the general position has been analysed in the earlier paragraphs as indicated in Appendix-57, it will be seen that the position of coverage of scheduled castes continues to be unsatisfactory in almost all the States even though enrolment made has picked up considerably in West Bengal accounting for an enrolment of 8.5% out of the total students admitted. At the postgraduate level, the position is showing signs of improvement in coverage of scheduled caste students in Haryana and Tamil Nadu but otherwise the position is yet to make significant progress in all other states.

So far as scheduled tribe students are concerned, there is a marked preference for Commerce courses for students admitted in Assam (6.5% of the total enrolment) as against the overall position of 1.3%. At the post-graduate level no progress is discernable in any of the States. At the same time the general trend in the country is that students prefer *Commerce* courses on a larger scale almost throughout the country.

As regards courses in *Education* for scheduled caste candidates, the position of enrolment is satisfactory in Assam, Punjab, and U.P. At the postgraduate level, Kerala and Panjab have provided more facilities. In respect of scheduled tribe students at the undergraduate level, there is marked improvement in Assam with 19.2%. Meghalaya has admitted 88.3% of scheduled tribes candidates at the first-degree level and 52.6% at the postgraduate level (*Appendix*-58).

As regards Engineering & Technology courses, no state has reported enrolment exceeding 10%. In Tamil Nadu 9.5% of its total admissions are from scheduled caste communities. At the postgraduate level, the enrolment of scheduled castes is 16.9% of the total enrolment in Rajasthan. In the case of scheduled tribes, the position continues to be unsatisfactory in all the States both at the undergraduate and postgraduate levels. (Appendix-59).

As regards courses in *Medicine*, the position is generally satisfactory in Andhra Pradesh, Himachal Pradesh, Maharashtra, Punjab, Tamil Nadu and West Bengal even though the all-India percentage is 8.4%. It has to be found out why the position continues to be unsatisfactory in other States. As regards postgraduate courses in Medicine, enrolment facilities have been provided somewhat satisfactorily by the States of Kerala, and Maharashtra though the all-India position continues to be unsatisfactory with 4.3% coverage in actual enrolment.

As regards scheduled tribe students, the coverage of more than 3% of the enrolment has been reported from Andhra Pradesh, Himachal Pradesh, Madhya Pradesh, Maharashtra and Rajasthan. At the postgraduate level, the position is uniformaly unsatisfactory with some improvement which has been shown in the admissions made in Maharashtra. No significant

developments have been noticed in other subjects except the general conclusions already indicated earlier (Appendix-60).

Some conclusions

1. The analysis as indicated above shows that actual admissions made among scheduled caste and scheduled tribe students on the basis of reservation vary from faculty to faculty and even department to department in the same institution.

It has been noticed from the information supplied by universities like Banaras Hindu University, Bombay University, M.S. University of Baroda and to some extent by universities like Bidhan Chandra Krishi Vishwavidyalaya, Cochin University, Rajendra Agricultural University and Sardar Patel University that the above variation is very pronounced in these institutions.

- 2. It has also been noticed in some of the information supplied that where reservation is made for some courses of studies, reservation does not exist for other courses in the same institution.
- 3. Considerable time is taken by the universities and colleges in supplying the information sought in the UGC proforma regarding admissions and appointments mainly for the reason that the authorities do not appear to have a machinery to collect and consolidate the actual admissions that have been made in terms of the Government of India reservation policy for these communities.
- 4. It is seen from almost all the institutions that the actual enrolment made is always lower than the percentage set apart whether it is on the basis of department-wise figures or course-wise figures or whether it is professional or non-professional. The leeway to be made up has been indicated on the basis of separate analysis of university-wise position, the State-wise position, classified special group-wise position and also district-wise position.
- 5. From the district-wise studies, it has also been seen that no enrolment is reported either from scheduled caste or scheduled tribe communities for courses in Engineering & Technology in Assam. It may be noted here that there are no engineering colleges either in Himachal Pradesh or in Meghalaya. It is possible students belonging to these communities in these states, may have joined universities/colleges in other states but their number is likely to be very small.
- 6. It is also seen that no enrolment has been reported in courses in Medicine from among scheduled caste and scheduled tribe communities in Assam, and Orissa.
- 7. Uttar Pradesh which represents nearly 1/3rd of the total scheduled caste population of the country has reported enrolment in courses in Medicine from one district only. The remaining 55 districts have not reported any enrolment in courses in *Medicine*. Similarly Madhya Pradesh which has a sizeable scheduled tribe population has reported enrolment in courses in

Medicine only in one district. Immediate steps have to be taken to see how imbalances in disbursal of enrolment are rectified.

- 8. The analysis of actual admissions made to various courses in 1977-78 shows that the reservation of 15% for scheduled caste candidates and 5% for scheduled tribe candidates as fixed by the Government of India may have to be changed as most of the States have fixed reservation percentage according to the population in their respective states and in some cases it is seen that the reservation percentage is less than the population percentage. The whole matter needs to be reviewed so that the reservation for scheduled castes and scheduled tribes in each district is as per population of these communities in the respective districts.
- 9. One of the factors that has not received adequate attention is the need to give weightage to these communities for social deprivations, economic deprivation and educational deprivation. This can be decided on the basis of district-wise indicators as applicable and a uniform policy for the country as a whole may not be feasible because of the varied conditions and attitudes prevalent in different districts. There is also need for evolving indicators so that facilities reserved for these communities are not utilized by a particular stratum among these very communities denying benefits to several others who are not so articulate and knowledgeable but they belong to these very communities.
- 10. There is a felt need to identify these neglected groups among these communities.
- 11. It has also been suggested in this connection that highest weightage has to be provided for the neglected sections having the lowest level of educational attainments, as also to first generation learners.
- 12. Such of the universities which have not provided facilities by reservation need to be requested again so that they make the necessary statutory provisions for reservations as per Government policy.
- 13. The co-efficient of equality which is a better index to judge the state of development of higher education among these communities has also been worked out and an analysis based on that has been attempted in the tables. It is noted from the co-efficient of equality that special efforts are required to be made in almost all States to make progress in the actual enrolment position.

A course-wise analysis by dividing the courses of study into 10 groups as suggested by the Commissioner for Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes has also been made and conclusions given in the earlier paragraphs.

15. Statistics regarding non-utilisation of seats reserved has not been collected in the proforma designed for 1977-78. The statistics regarding urban-rural imbalances has also not been collected. Similarly the progress regarding admissions to joint entrance examination and drop-outs of those admitted have also not been collected.

Policy changes required in the admission policy may be considered in the light of the actual position of admissions, as indicated and as summarised above.

Appointment to teaching and non-teaching posts

On the basis of information collected in terms of the special proforma designed, the position of teaching staff with the percentage of total faculty strength has been collected and analysed state-wise, region-wise and categorywise. The coverage of teachers belonging to SC & ST has also been ascertained. The position has further been indicated university-wise (Appendices 65 to 76).

- 16. It is seen that out of a total of 1.83 lakes of teachers in position in universities and colleges, there were 2,621 teachers belonging to scheduled caste community. This works out to 1.54%.
- 17. In the case of scheduled tribe communities, the total number of teachers appointed by the universities and colleges from among them was 889 or 0.52%. The co-efficient of equality comes to 0.1% in the case of scheduled caste candidates and 0.07 in the case of scheduled tribe communities.
- 18. From the State-wise position, it cannot be stated that there is improvement in any of the States both in the matter of appointment of teachers belonging to scheduled caste and scheduled tribe communities.
- 19. The position category-wise of all Principals of colleges shows that there were only 23 Principals out of 4,348 belonging to scheduled castes and 4 to scheduled tribe communities. No improvement can be identified in any of the regions in the country in this respect (Appendix 66).
- 20. As regards Professors and Readers in the case of scheduled caste communities, there were only 108 belonging to these two communities who were in position in universities and colleges as against a total of 22,149 in the country. The number of Professors/Readers belonging to scheduled tribes was 26 in the country. The co-efficient of equality being 0.03 for scheduled caste and 0.02 for scheduled tribe communities. No improvement can be identified in any of the regions of the country in this respect also (Appendix 67).
- 21. As regards Lecturers/Assistant Professors, 2,018 out of a total of 1,27,725 belonged to scheduled caste communities and 755 from scheduled tribe communities. This figure does not show any impact on the decision taken by the UGC and specific advice given by it to universities and colleges to the effect that the Commission agreed for reservation to teachers at Lecturers level. Copies of the circulars issued to the universities and colleges as also to State Governments are given in *Annexures* 5 to 10.
- 22. The UGC has not taken any specific decision regarding reservation to the teaching posts at the level of Professors or Readers. The Commission at the same time has intimated the Government (Annexure 12) that the reservation suggested by it is for lecturers only.

The State-wise distribution of scheuled caste and scheduled tribe teachers category-wise has been tabulated in *Appendix* 71 to 73. Similarly, the position state-wise and university-wise has been given in *Appendix* 74.

- 23. An analysis of the university position shows that in 1977-78 teachers belonging to scheduled castes, as reported were not in position in Hyderabad University, Rajendra Agricultural University, Indian School of Mines, Haryana Agricultural University, Himachal Pradesh Agricultural University, Cochin University, S.N.D.T. Women's University, Tata Institute of Social Sciences, Udaipur University, Allahabad University, Avadh University, G.B. Pant University of Agriculture & Technology, Kanpur University, Lucknow University, Rohilkhand University, and Indian Agricultural Research Institute.
- 24. As regards teachers belonging to scheduled tribes communities, a few teachers were in position in universities of Kakatiya, Sri Venkateswara, Dibrugarh, Assam, Magadh, Rajendra Agricultural, Ranchi, all universities in Gujarat except Gujarat Ayurveda and Saurashtra, all universities in Haryana except Kurukshetra, Himachal Pradesh, all universities in Karantaka Universities of Calicut, Kerala, Saugar and Vikram, all universities in Maharashtra except Bombay University, Mahatama Phule Krishi Vishwidyalaya, S.N.D.T. Women's University and Tata Institute of Social Sciences and Universities of Guru Nanak Dev, Rajasthan, Madras, Kumaon, Bundelkhand, Calcutta and North Bengal.
- 25. The proforma had also envisaged collection of statistics regarding non-teaching staff. However, the response from the colleges is not based on a uniform pattern and the designations vary in nomenclature and in order to make a category-wise study a different approach for collecting information has been found necessary and the proforma for collection is proposed to be modified. A percentage-wise position, however, has been compiled giving a reliable index of the position from the responses received (Appendix 75). For this reason a detailed study of the distribution of non-teaching staff in universities and colleges either on state-wise basis or university-wise has not been possible. The Commission has, no doubt, issued the guidelines regarding recruitment to non-academic posts for scheduled castes and scheduled tribes which prescribed reservation of 15% for scheduled castes and 5% for scheduled tribes. It has not been possible to enforce this in all the Central Universities which are maintained by the UGC.

The UGC has always been trying to pursuade, the universities to follow the Government guidelines in the matter of reservation in services as in the matter of admissions.

Sir,

The University Grants Commission has under consideration the question of observance by the universities and colleges of the guidelines issued by the Government of India with regard to the reservation of seats for scheduled caste and scheduled tribe students. In this connection your attention is invited to the Government of India, Ministry of Education letter No. F. 4-65/71-U-2 dated 11th October, 1971. An extract from the letter is reproduced below:

"According to the present arrangements, 20% of the seats are reserved for scheduled caste/tribe candidates and they are also given a concession of 5% marks in the minimum percentage of marks required for admission to any course. This Ministry has received representations from various quarters that even with these concessions some of the seats in the reserved quota remain unfilled as scheduled caste/tribe candidates with requisite marks are not available. It has, therefore, been suggested that in case the 20% seats earmarked for them remain unfilled, a further relaxation in the marks may be given to them, in order of meritintersee amongst themselves so that all the reserved seats are filled by candidates belonging to these categories.

This Ministry feel that in order to ameliorate the conditions of scheduled caste and scheduled tribe candidates and to bring them to the level of the more advanced sections of the community, it is essential to give them all possible concessions in the matter of admissions without seriously affecting the standards of education. It is, therefore, requested that the proposal for giving further relaxation be considered favourably by the University authorities."

It is requested that the Commission may please be informed whether the university is observing the guidelines issued by the Ministry of Education with regard to reservation of seats for scheduled caste and scheduled tribe students. The number of seats reserved for various courses for students belonging to scheduled caste and scheduled tribe communities and those actually admitted against the reserved seats in different courses may also please be intimated. This information may please be supplied for the last five years.

The University Grants Commission has, in response to the recommendation made by the Parliamentary Committee on the Welfare of Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes has established a Cell (SCT Cell) for effective implementation of reservation orders in favour of scheduled castes and scheduled tribes. The SCT Cell which was set up in January 1979 and has been augmented recently with a view to vigorously watch the effective implementation of various orders for employment and programmes etc. relating to access of higher education to students belonging to scheduled caste and scheduled tribe communities.

The following functions are inter-alia to be performed by the SCT Cell for the present:

- (1) To circulate Government of India and Commission's decisions and to collect regularly, on an annual basis information regarding course-wise admissions by reservation to candidates belonging to schedule castes and scheduled tribes in universities and colleges for different courses, by a stipulated date, in suitable forms prescribed and to take follow up action where required.
- (2) To circulate Government of India orders and Commission's decisions and to collect information in respect of appointments and training by reservation to these communities to teaching and non-teaching posts in universities and colleges by a stipulated date, in suitable forms and take follow up action where required.
- (3) To handle policy matters including Reports and Parliament Questions and collect, co-ordinate and circulate relevant information regarding scheduled castes and scheduled tribe candidates from different divisions and sections in the UGC, relating to (1) and (2) above.
- (4) To collect reports and information regarding Government of India orders on various aspects of education, training and employment of scheduled caste and scheduled tribe candidates, for evolving new policy or modifying existing policy by the Commission.

- (5) To analyse information so collected under (1) to (4) above and prepare reports and digests for onward transmission to the Ministry of Education & Culture and such other authorities as may be required.
- (6) To deal with representations received from scheduled caste and scheduled tribe candidates regarding their admission, recruitment, promotion and other similar matters in Universities/Colleges.
- (7) Any other work assigned from time to time to promote higher education among these two communities suffering economic, social and educational deprivations.

The SCT Cell in UGC is at present engaged in pursuing the progress regarding admission, employment, utilization of fellowships, reservation in hostels, introduction of remedial courses and other measures with a view to bring about improvement in the educational levels of scheduled castes and scheduled tribes. Any information regarding programmes or studies available under your auspices may be sent to the SCT Cell of the UGC for this purpose.

I am sure, with your co-operation, it will be possible for the SCT Cell to bring about significant improvement in education, training and employment of scheduled caste and scheduled tribe candidates at the higher education level.

Copy of UGC letter No. F. 1-26/76 (CP) dated 4th May, 1976 addressed to Registrars of Universities/Institutions deemed to be universities.

Subject: Forty-second report of the Committee on Welfare of Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes—instructions issued by the Government of India from time to time.

I am directed to say that the Government of India Ministry of Education has communicated the following recommendations of the Committee on the Welfare of Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes:—

"The Committee would like all the Universities in the country to set up within the universities special cells to ensure implementation of the orders regarding reservation for Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes issued by the Govt. of India from time to time. The UGC should keep a watch that all the Universities set up such cells without any loss of time."

It is therefore, requested that the University may take necessary action in the matter. The action taken by the University may be intimated to the Commission in due course.

Dear Vice-Chancellor,

As you are aware, the Commission while framing the guidelines for the preparation of development proposals by colleges for the fifth plan made a specific reference that the universities/colleges may consider organising special supplementary, remedial programmes to make up for the deficiency of the earlier school education of the students from weaker sections of the society like scheduled castes and scheduled tribes.

- 2. The University Grants Commission at its meeting held on 21st March, 1977 while receiving a note regarding the reservation of seats for various courses in universities/colleges for students belonging to scheduled castes/scheduled tribes *inter-alia* agreed that a Committee may be appointed to elaborate the concept and modalities of implementation of remedial courses to be provided by the universities/colleges. Accordingly, a committee was appointed in this respect.
- 3. Subsequently, the UGC at its meeting on 29th May 1978 considered the recommendation of this committee appointed to elaborate the concept and modality of implementation of remedial courses in universities and colleges. The recommendations/observations made by the committee for introduction of remedial courses and accepted by the Commission are enclosed for guidance.
- 4. The Central Institute of English & Foreign Languages, Hyderabad is being requested to devise programmes for improvement of standards of students in English and also to suggest tests for identifying the weaker students. The material received from the Institute would be sent to the universities in due course.
- 5. The university may consider the guidelines and in the light of these, identify nature of remedial courses required to be organised, identify institutions where they are most needed and send proposals for this purpose for 1978-79, as early as possible for consideration by UGC.

- 1. Remedial courses are necessary for the students coming from the weaker sections of the Society, poor peasants and working classes, from rural and city areas. Such students would receive special assistance and be provided necessary guidance and training to come up to the level necessary for pursuing higher studies efficiently.
- 2. Diagnotic tests could be used to identify such groups of students that required additional guidance/coaching.
- 3. It would be necessary to divide the students requirements for special help into two classes:—
 - (a) those needing intensive help; and
 - (b) those needing marginal help

For those requiring intensive help, it would be necessary if they were to complete the courses in time, to utilise the long vacation during summer and during October-December.

- 4. A lump sum amount may be provided to a college which should be utilised for the appointment of supplementary staff or for payment of honorarium to the existing staff and also for meeting contingency expenditure, if any. In case of those States where Scholarships are provided to the students belonging to the weaker sections of the Society/backward areas, the State Governments may be requested to continue to provide such scholarships during the period of coaching provided under the programme. The necessary support for the text-books (including dictionary for language students) may be covered under the scheme already implemented by the Commission i.e., 'Book Bank' under which text-books are provided to students for a full academic session. If necessary, supplementary grants may be provided on receipt of specific proposals.
- 5. It would be desirable to have only one teacher for each subject in each class which may consist of not more than 20 students so that responsibility could be fixed and the teachers themselves could get the know their students better. It should be for the universities and colleges to engage the services of motivated teachers for the purpose.
- 6. During the working days when universities were open perhaps not more than three periods a week could be fitted in the time table for this purpose and this would be planned for those students who needed marginal help to come up to the standard of achievement equal to the rest of the students.

- 7. The summer courses should have approximately five classes per day of which only three should be lecture periods, the others should be tutorial and practical.
- 8. The Committee recognised the fact that in the case of a large number of academically backward students the reason was to be found in language deficiency and science teaching (particularly Mathematics). In providing remedial training, primary emphasis should, therefore, be placed on overcoming these deficiencies.
- 9. Central Institute of English and Foreign Language might be asked to devise programmes for improvement of standards of students in English. They might also suggest tests for identifying the weaker students.
- 10. The University should organise such remedial courses on the university campus or some selected colleges in the area. The proposals for organising such courses should be sent to the Commission by January each year (i.e., six months before the commencement of the academic year) for the approval of the Commission.
- 11. The implementation of the programme would be reviewed after a period of two years.

The University Grants Commission at its meeting held on July 14-15, 1975 considered again the question of reservation for Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes in the matter of appointments to teaching posts in the universities. The Commission has now agreed in principle that reservations may be provided for Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes for recruitment to the posts of Lecturers in the universities and colleges and the mechanics for such reservations may be worked out. The Commission is further of the view that in order that the teaching posts may not remain vacant for long periods, such reservations may not be operated on a roaster system nor should the reserved posts be carried forward from year to year. The above decisions of the Commission are brought to the notice of the University for guidance. The same may also be brought to the notice of the Colleges affiliated to your University.

Kindly refer to the correspondence resting with my letter of even number dated 29th August, 1975 regarding the reservation for Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes in the matter of appointments to Teaching Posts in the Universities.

The University Grants Commission at its meeting held on 3-4th June, 1976 considered the recommendation of the Committee of Vice-Chancellors of Central Universities regarding Mechanics for reservation of posts for members of Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes for recruitment to the posts of Lecturers in the Universities and Colleges. The Commission agreed that the Central Universities be requested to observe the following mechanics to ensure reservation for Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes as originally envisaged by the Commission.

- "(1) Before the beginning of each academic year, the University should determine the likely vacancies that may occur during the year of recruitment to the posts of Lecturers.
 - (2) The Number of posts to be filled under the reserve category may be determined faculty-wise, although no individual post may be designated as "reserved Posts". The advertisement for these posts should indicate that preference would be given to Scheduled Cates/Scheduled Tribes candidates who are considered fit. On receipt of applications, the university may invite for interview all Scheduled Castes/Scheduled Tribes candidates who fulfil the minimum qualifications prescribed for recruitment for the post of lecturer.
 - (3) The candidates belonging to the Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes may be interviewed separately in the first instance. The candidates belonging to the general category may then be interviewed separately keeping in view the recommendations made by the Selection Committee in respect of Scheduled Tribes/Scheduled Castes candidates.
 - (4) In the case of scheduled castes/scheduled tribes candidates interviewed by the committee, if suitable candidates are not available for appointment to the post of lecturers, the selection committee

may recommend appointment of suitable candidates as research associates in the scale of Rs. 700-1300 for a period upto three years and these persons could later compete for the post of lecturers as and when vacancies occur. The recommendations made by the Selection Committee in this regard for appointment as research associates may be sent to the Commission for consideration".

The above decision of the Commission is brought to the notice of the Iniversity for favour of consideration.

Kindly refer to the correspondence resting with my letter of even number dated 8th/10th September, 1976 regarding reservation for Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes in the matter of appointments to teaching posts in Universities.

The University Grants Commission has again considered the matter and decided that the Commission would sanction posts of Research Associates for persons belonging to Scheduled Castes/Scheduled Tribes on the recommendation of the Selection Committee for a period of three years, extendable upto five years under this scheme. The post of a Research Associate filled by the University when a qualified lecturer is not available will be in addition to the post of a lecturer sanctioned as part of the Fifth Plan development schemes. For such posts of Research Associates 100% grant would be paid by the Commission for a period of three years. The University would, therefore, have to approach the Commission for all such specific cases, with complete details of the candidates appointed as lecturers and Research Associates and their qualification etc. In case of such posts of Research Associates created against the Non-Plan posts of lecturers, the Universities will have to provide funds for these from their own resources.

Kindly refer to my D.O. letter No. F. 1-46/75 (CP) dated 8/10 September 1976 regarding the reservation for Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes in the matter of appointment to teaching posts in the universities (copy enclosed).

The UGC at its meeting held on 29th December, 1977 considered the question further and decided that in such cases where a suitable candidate belonging to Scheduled Castes/Scheduled Tribes was not found suitable for the post of lecturer and the selection committee recommended him/her for appointment as a Research Associate, such a person should possess the following minimum qualifications prescribed for recruitment to the post viz:

- (a) A Doctor's degree or research work of an equally high standard;
 and
- (b) consistently good academic record with 1st or high 2nd class (B in the seven point scale) Master's degree in a relevant subject or an equivalent degree of a foreign university.

Having regard to the need for developing inter-disciplinary programmes, the degrees in (a) and (b) above may be in relevant subjects.

Provided that if the Selection Committee is of the view that the research work of a candidate as evident either from his thesis or from his published work is of very high standard, it may relax any of qualifications prescribed in (b) above.

The Commission also decided that the qualifications prescribed for recruitment to the post of lecturers by the UGC may apply equally to all categories of applicants and no relaxation be made for Scheduled Castes/Scheduled Tribes candidates etc.

The above decision of the Commission is brought to the notice of the university for information and guidance.

The Commission's decision communicated to the university vide referred above may kindly be read as under:—

"The Commission reiterated its decision that for recruitment to the posts of lecturers, candidates belonging to scheduled castes and scheduled tribes should be interviewed separately by the Selection Committee. In such cases, where a suitable candidate belonging to scheduled caste and scheduled tribe was not found suitable for the post of Lecturer and the Selection Committee recommended him/her for appointment as a Research Associate, such a person should possess the minimum qualifications prescribed for recruitment to the post viz.

- (a) A Doctor's degree or research work of an equally high standard;
 and
- (b) consistently good academic record with 1st or high 2nd class (B in the seven point scale) Master's degree in a relevant subject or an equivalent degree of a foreign university.

Having regard to the need for developing interdisciplinary programmes, the degrees in (a) and (b) above may be relevant subjects.

Provided that if the Selection Committee is of the view that the research work of a candidate as evident either from his thesis or from his published work is of very high standard, it may relax any of qualifications prescribed in (b) above.

The Commission also decided that the qualifications prescribed for recruitment to the post of lecturers by the UGC may apply equally to all categories of the applicants and no relaxation be made for Scheduled Castes/Scheduled Tribes candidates etc.

Kindly refer to my letters of even number dated September 8/10th, 1976, 18/20th August, 1977, 14th February, 1978 and 27th February, 1978 regarding reservation for Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes in the matter of appointments to teaching posts in the universities.

The UGC at its meeting held in June, 1977 considered the question of rationalisation of the scheme of research associateships in the universities. The relevant extract from the resolution adopted by the Commission is reproduced below:

- (1) "There may be three categories of Research Associate-ships to be designated as Research Associateships 'A' Research Associateship 'B' and Research Associateship 'C'.
- (2) These Research Associateships may carry the following fixed consolidated emoluments with no other allowance:

Research Associateship
-do-do'B'
Rs. 1 000/- p.m.
'B'
Rs. 1 200/- p.m.
'C'
Rs. 1 400/- p.m.

(3) A candidate may be awarded one of the categories of these Research Associateships depending upon the merit of the candidate initially for a period of three years.

Research Associates who have already been appointed in the scale of Rs. 700-1300 plus usual allowances may continue on their existing terms till the period of three years is over".

In the light of the decision taken by the Commission in the case of Research Associateships it has been decided that the same terms and conditions may be made applicable to the candidate(s) appointed as Research Associate(s) belonging to the SC/ST in addition to the post of Lecturer.

It is accordingly requested that henceforth the appointment to the post of Research Associates may be made in accordance with the terms and conditions indicated above with the concurrence of the Commission. The existing incumbent(s) may be paid salary in the scale of Rs. 700-1300 plus usual allowances as applicable to the corresponding staff in the University till their tenure is over.

Kindly refer to correspondence resting with letters of even number dated 21st/23rd March, 1979 regarding reservation for Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes in the matter of appointment to teaching posts in the Universities.

The U.G.C. at its meeting held on 11th December, 1978 considered further the question of appointment as Research Associates of SC/ST persons who are applicants for the post of Lecturers in the Universities. The Commission, keeping in view the experience with regard to the appointment as Research Associate from among the Scheduled Castes/Scheduled Tribes candidates who apply for posts of Lecturers, felt that it may not be necessary to extend this provision to non-plan posts of the universities. On the other hand, in order to see that such scheduled caste/scheduled tribe candidates who possess required qualifications are generally appointed to the posts, it may not be necessary to continue this provision in respect of plan posts also beyond 31st March, 1979

The Universities are therefore, requested to see that SC/ST candidates who fulfil the prescribed educational qualifications are appointed against the reserved posts. However, as a supplementary measure, to enable the SC/ST candidates to obtain necessary teaching/research experience in the university departments, the UGC would award every year w.e.f. 1979-80, twenty research associateships directly and applications for this purpose would be invited through the universities in due course.
