LEAGUE OF NATIONS.

INTERNATIONAL LABOUR CONFERENCE.

There were presented to Parliament in Cmd. 2051 the French and English texts of the Recommendation, adopted by the International Labour Conference at its Fifth Session in October 1923, "concerning the general principles for the organisation of systems of inspection to secure the enforcement of the laws and regulations for the protection of the workers."

At the expiration of a period of twenty-one days from the date on which the present paper is laid on the table of both Houses of Parliament, His Majesty's Government propose, in accordance with the provisions of Article 405 of the Treaty of Versailles, to inform the Secretary-General of the League of Nations that they are prepared to accept the Recommendation in respect of Great Britain and Northern Ireland.

The principles laid down in the Recommendation are in accordance generally with the principles on which factory inspection is organised in the United Kingdom and no new legislation will be entailed by its acceptance.
