Notice is hereby given, that the Hon'ble the Court of Directors having, in an Advertisement dated East India Jouse, the 17th of September, 1834, notified to Proprietors of Bengal Six per Cent. I. Be it enacted that, after the —day of——it shall be lawful for any person, of whatever nation, to acquire and hold in perpetuity, or for any term of years, property in land or in any emoluments issuing out of land, in any part of the territories of the

East India Company.

II. And be it enacted, that all rules which prescribe the manner in which such property as is aforesaid, may now be acquired, and held by Natives of the said territories, shall extend to all persons who shall, under the authority of this Act, acquire or hold such property.

To give full effect to the system which the adoption of this table will introduce the European regiment is placed on the same footing with respect to the allowance for artificers as the native infantry corps, and the allowance of three rupees per company for repairs of small arms and accourrements hitherto drawn by the former is discontinued.

An Addenda is to be annexed to the quarterly returns of arms and accoutrements of regiments and detachments having spare stores in charge, in which such articles shall be accounted for distinctly from those forming the established proportion for regimental use, and the quarter mas-ter or officer commanding detachment will be held responsible for their preservation, and their issue is prohibited excepting on emergency

Spare steres and such articles of barrack furniture as ale not likely to be required on the line of march, tre to be delivered over to the regiment or detachment relieving by that which may be quitting a station, on such occasions the stores svill be inspected by a committee whose proceedings will accompany the next following quarterly return of the corps receiving them.

All articles at present in charge in excess to the new proportion, are to be forthwith returned into

As the wants of every corps have been carefully provided for in the table of proportions, any articles of store not therein laid down or not shewn in the established proportion column in indents, will be issued from departments only on payment or under special sanction.

Tools and such articles as are calculated per company, are to be indented for according to the established proportion, but musketry, belts, and barrack furniture, which are calculated per man, are to be drawn for with reference to the strength of the corps at the time, which must be shewn on the back of the indent thus:

Present strength, N. officers, Staff serjeant. N. C. rank and file.

With respect to the proportion of barrack articles left blank in the table, it is left to the quarter master general's department to regulate the numbers required at the time the indent may be pre-

ferred.
