FORT WILLIAM.

LEGISLATIVE DEPARTMENT,

THE 21ST SEPTEMBER 1835. The following Extract from the Proceedings of Government in the Legislative Department, is published for general information :

Read a third time the dewing Draft of an Act for repealing the provisions against the use of a Chuprass or Badge by Peons, or other Servants in the employment of Private Individuals :

ACT NO. -or 1835.

Be it enacted, that Clause 8, Section 9, Regulation XI. 1806, and Clause 4, Section 30, Regulation XX. 1817, of the Bengal Code, which prohibit the use of a chuprass or Badge by Peons, or other Servants in the employment of Private Individuals, berescinded.

Resolution. The Hon'ble the Governor General of India in Council is pleased to resolve, that the said Draft be re-published for general information with the following additional provisions, and that the modified Draft be brought up for re-consideration at the first Meeting of the Legislative council of India, which may be held after the 3d day of November next ensuing

And be it enacted, that no person shall wear or be accessary to the wearing by any other person of any Chuprass or Badge intended to resemble any Chuprass or Badge worn by Servants of the Go-vernment; and every person violating this rule shall be punishable by fine and imprisonment on conviction before a Magistrate as for a misdemeanor.

And be it enacted, that every Chuprass or Badge worn by any person not being a Servant of the Government, shall bear the name of the Party by whom the wearer is employed, and whoever shall wear a Chuprass or Badge, or be accessary to the wearing such Chuprass or Badge, otherwise than in conformity to this rule, shall be punishable by fine and imprisonment on conviction before a Magistrate as for a misdemeanor.

ACT No. - or 1835.

Be it enacted, that it shall ... only stert to the Agent for Sirdars in the Deccau, to refer to his Assistant, original Suits against Sirdars for amounts not exceeding 5,000 Rupees, and in the trial of such Suits the Assistant shall follow the same rules which are now applicable to the Agent, and every decree of the Assistant shall be open to an Appeal to the Agent within days from the date of the decree, and every decision of the Agent on such Appeal shall be open to such Appeal as is now provided for the decisions of the Agent in original Suits, provided such last mentioned Appeal shall be brought within--days after the date of the decree of the Agent

Ordered, that the Draft now read, be published

for general information.

Ordered, that the said Draft be re-considered at the first Meeting of the Legislative Council of India after the 20th day of October next.

The Right Honorable the Governor in Council/having been pleased to sanction the following draft of a regulation proposed for ascertaining the expenditure of stores on work performed in the government dock yards on account of private indivi-duals, the superintendent desires to publish the same for general information.

Whenever it may be necessary to send into the dock yards at Bombay or Mazagon, timber, plank, spars, iron, copper or other materials for building the property of individuals who may have ships, boats, &c. under construction or repairs, on their private ac-count, a pass note duly signed by the parties and in accordance with the form annexed, specifying the particular quantity and des-cription of articles, shall be delivered to the controller of the yard, who will countersign the same and forward it to the master builder, by whom directions will be given for the articles being carefully weighed or measured and deposited in the most convenient spot in the yard; the said pass note shall, after registry in the master builder's office, be returned to the office of the controller and there filed.

No stores, the property of private indivi-duals, shall be taken out of the dock yards without a similar pass note, signed by the party and countersigned by the controller

and master builder. The master builder will cause to be kept in his office, a book, shewing the weekly expenditure of every description of private stores brought into the dock yard, noting therein the particular ship or vessel upon which such stores may have been expended.
