Y virtue of a Precept to me and give notice, that the Sessions of Over and Terminer, and General Gaol Delivery, will be holden before the Supreme Court of Judicature at Bombay, at the Court House, on Thursday the third day of December next, at eleven o'clock in the forencon, for the trial of all Treasons, Murders, and other Felonies, Perjuries, Trespasses, and other Crimes and Misdemeanors, had done, or committed, within the Town and Island of Bombay, and the limits thereof, and the Factories subordinate thereto, and also to enquire, hear, and determine, in like man-ner, all Treasons, Murders, Felonies, Forgeries, Perjuries, Crimes, Extortions, Mis-demeanors, Trespasses, Wrongs, Oppressi-ons, had done, and committed, by any of his Majesty's British Subjects, in any of

the Territories which now are subject to, or dependent upon, the said Government of Bombay, or within any of the Dominions of the Native Princes of India, in alliance with the said Government.

And also that, at the same time and place will be holden a Session of Admiralty, for the Trial of all Treasons, Murders, Piracies, Robberies, Sec. 18, 28, Misdemeanors, and other cranes and offences, had done, perpetrated, or committed, on the High Seas.

And I hereby require and enjoin all persons bound to prosecute and give evidence at the above Sessions, or in any way concerned therein, to attend at the time and place abovementioned, and not to depart without leave of the Court. Dated this Seventeenth day of November, in the sixth year of the reign of His Majesty King William IV.

# REWARD

OF 1,000 RUPEES.

Whereas, on the 4th day of November instant, the body of a Mussulman, named

Bisharut Khan, was found at Worlee, which exhibited marks of violence; and whereas, on the 7th day of November instant, the coroner's inquest having closed, the jury returned the following verdict:-

"Wilful murder against a certain Bhya, name unknown,"
A reward of 1,000 rupees will be paid to any person or persons, who shall give information which may lead to the apprehension and conviction of the murderer of the said Bisharut Khan.

The following is a description of the Bhya.

Height .- 5 feet 5 inches.

Colour .- copper Age,-25 to 30.

Dress-White jacket and dhoter, white cloth round his head, as worn by men of Hindoostan.

Cast .- Bhya, or Purdesee.

Marks.—Curly hair on his temples, large black whiskers and short hair on his chin.

Trade.-Blacksmith.

The following Draft of a proposed Act was read in Council for the first time on the 26th Oct. 1835.

ACT No. of 1835.

Be it enacted that Regulation III. A. D. 1834, of the Bombay Code, be rescinded, with the exception of such part of that Regulation as rescinds preceding Regulations.

And be it enacted that a Duty at the

rate of (14) one and a half per cent, shall be levied on Import into. the Island of Bombay, of the Articles enumerated in Appendix A, in addition to the established Sea Customs, and under the same rules and Regulations as are or may be made applicable to the collection of the latter,

And be it enacted that no Drawback of the Duty imposed in the preceding Section be allowed, except on Exportation to the United Kingdom in British Bottoms, of any of the Articles subject thereto, in which case such an amount of Drawback will, if applied for, at the period of Exportation, but not otherwise, be allowed, as will reduce the total duty receivable by Government to (21) two and a half per cent.

APPENDIX A.

Goods imported from the other Presidencies under Certificates of Exemption from Customs at Bombay, excepting those Articles of a like description (such as Ghee, Oil, &c. &c) not liable to a Duty when imported from other places unaccompanied by Exempting Certificates.
