FORT WILLIAM,

THE 6TH FEBRUARY, 1837.

The following Act, passed by the Right Honorable the Governor General of India in Council, on the 6th February 1837, is hereby promulgated for general information:

ACT. NO. II OF 1837.

I. It is hereby enacted, that from the 1st day of March next, Regulation IX. of 1830, and Regulation XI. of 1831, of the Bombay Code, and Act No. XVIII. of 1836, of the Governor General of India in Council, be repealed.

II. And it is hereby enacted, that the following rates of Toll shall, from the said day, be levied in the Company's Currency at the Toll Gate of the Bore Ghaut on Vehicles and Animals both in going and returning:

On every four-wheeled Carriage on springs.....	1 Rupee.
On every two-wheeled Carriage on springs, except Native Hackeries.	½ Rupee.
On every Native Hackery on springs.	2 Annas.
On every labor Cart and labor Hackery not on springs, and having wheels of less diameter than three feet six inches, and tyers less in breadth than three inches, if drawn by two Bullocks.....	½ Rupee.
On every such labor Cart and labor Hackery drawn by 4 Bullocks	1 Rupee.
On every labor Cart and labor Hackery not on springs, and not having wheels of less diameter than three feet six inches and tyers less in breadth than three inches if drawn by two Bullocks,.....	1½ Anna.
On every such labor Cart and labor Hackery drawn by 4 Bullocks,....	3 Annas.
On every Elephant,.....	½ Rupee.
On every Camel,.....	½ Rupee.
On every Saddle Horse and Harness Horse,.....	1 Anna.

On every Tattoo,.....	6 Pie.
On every score of Sheopor Goats,...	2 Annas.
On horned Cattle per head,.....	2 Pie.
On every Beggary carrying a load for hire.....	2 Pie.
On every Mule not used for riding...	3 Pie.
On every Mule used for riding....	1 Anna.
On every Ass,.....	1 Pie.
On every Palna or small Native Palanquin,.....	¼ Rupee

III. And it is hereby enacted, that it shall be competent to the Governor in Council of Bombay to appoint persons for the collection of the Tolls aforesaid, which persons shall, in the execution of such their office, be liable to the same responsibility as would attach to them if they were employed in the collection of the Land Revenue.

IV. And it is hereby enacted, that it shall be lawful for the persons employed in the Collection of the Tolls aforesaid in case of non-payment of the Toll on any property, to stop such property or such part thereof as may be adequate to the discharge of the Toll due, and that every Police Officer when thereunto required shall be assisting to the persons employed in the collection of the Tolls aforesaid in the discharge of their duties.

V. And it is hereby enacted, that in case any Toll due shall remain unpaid for the space of 24 hours after such detention of property as is aforesaid, it shall be lawful for such person as the Governor in Council of Bombay shall appoint to act in that behalf to direct the sale of the property detained, and to reserve out of the proceeds of such sale a sum equivalent to the Toll due, and also in cases in which it shall appear to that person that the payment of the Toll has been contumaciously refused to reserve a fine not exceeding 5 Rupees; and that the surplus, if any, shall be repaid to the owners of the property on application.

VI. Provided always, that nothing herein contained shall be taken to deprive the owner of any property detained as aforesaid of his right of

action in the Civil Court of the Zillah for any injury which may have been done to him under color of carrying this Act into execution.

VII. Provided also, that nothing herein contained shall be held to prevent the Governor in Council of Bombay from granting any exemption from payment of the said Tolls, or from granting a farm of the said Tolls.

1. Notice is hereby given, that sealed Tenders will be received at the office of the Superintendent of the Indian Navy, on Monday the 20th instant, at 12 o'clock in the forenoon, from persons desirous of supplying Tonnage for the conveyance of 500 Tons of Coal, more or less, to Muscat.

2. The vessels must be ready to receive Coal by the 25th instant.

3. The owner of the vessels must engage that they sail within 48 hours after the Coal is embarked.

4. A Cabin will be required for the accommodation of the officer who may proceed in charge of the Coal to Muscat.

No. 18. of 1837. The Right Honorable the Governor in Council is pleased to publish the following Rules regarding the appointment of medical officers to the Indian Navy branch of the service of those established by G. O. dated the 13th May last, No. 235.

1st. All Assistant Surgeons who have served not less than one, nor more than four years, shall be eligible for duty in the Indian Navy.

Second. Such Assistant Surgeons shall be called on to serve in the Indian Navy, according to their standing, commencing with the Juniors.

Third. The period of service in the Navy is not to exceed two years, unless at the desire of the party, but an Assistant Surgeon completing four years' service while attached to the Indian Navy should be relieved as soon after as possible, provided he wishes it, and shall have served one year, on board a Cruiser.

2nd. In the event of the number of Assistant Surgeons of from one to four years service being insufficient to admit of the strict application of the above Regulation, the following deviations, in the order in which they are mentioned should be allowed, it being understood that recourse shall on no account be had to them, except when the exigencies of the service may render it necessary.

First. Assistant Surgeons who may be on duty in the Indian Navy, at the expiration of four years service shall be continued in that duty until the period of service on board Ship shall have amounted to two years.

Second. Assistant Surgeons of six months service, shall be eligible for duty in the Indian Navy, commencing with those who have most nearly completed a service of one year.

Third. Assistant Surgeons of more than four years service may be called upon in the order of their standing, commencing with the juniors; but to such Officers should be granted the option of resuming any permanent appointment which they may have held at the time of being required to serve in the Indian Navy.

3rd. The operation of the new rules is to extend to all medical officers now serving or warned for duty in the Indian Navy, that is, if any of these officers would not have been called on, had these rules been previously in operation, they will be relieved as soon as opportunity may offer, provided they desire it while those who would have been called on under these rules, will have the benefit of the third clause of the 1st para: in the same way with others who may be appointed hereafter.

No. 19 of 1837:—Assistant Surgeon Jephson, is permitted to proceed to the Mahableswhar Hills, with leave of absence for one month, for the benefit of his health.
