These lists exhibit the present bazar prices &c. of each article, and tenderers are required to state in their proposals in both words and figures the rate per cent, in the Ankoosee currency above or below those prices, without any exceptions, at which the articles will be supplied, and on the understanding, that they are to be delivered free of all charges to the hospitals requiring them at Ahmednuggur: all payments will be made in the Bombay or any other rupee that may be issued from the public treasury, to this department, and at the Government rate of exchange between it and the Ankoosee rupee.

The contractors will be required to comply with demands without delay or demur, all articles tendered to be unexceptionable and of the quality and description generally used by the departments requiring them, or in failing to do so, they will be purchased where procurable at their risk and loss: any point in dispute to be decided by a committee of officers.

Every person submitting a tender, will be required to lodge, as follows, viz. with No. 1 hospital provisions rupees (150) one hundred and fifty, and with No. 2 hospital country medicines and stationery, rupees (100) one

hundred; to be forfeited in the event of delay, evasion, or refusal to execute the necessary deed of contract, without which the tender will not be opened, and the person whose tender may be approved of, must be prepared to give unexceptionable bonded security for the further sums, namely, No. 1 rupees (299) two hundred and ninety nine, and No. 2, rupees (199) one hundred and ninety nine, which sums, together with the abovementioned deposits, will be held as security, for the due fulfilment of every part of the engagements.

Is hereby given, that sealed tenders will be received at this office, until 3 o'clock P. M. on Monday the 20th proximo, for the supply of any quantity of good cleaned gram that may be required at Poona and Kirkee, for the period of one year, commencing from the 1st day of April next.

The tenders must specify in words as well as figures, the per-centage below (64) sixty four pounds (2) two ounces, avoirdupois per the Ankoossee rupee at which the gram will be supplied, free of all expence to Government on account of carriage &c. at the commissariat stores at Poona and Kirkee, but it is to be understood that all payments will be made in the Company's rupee, or any other coin that may be issued from the public treasuries to this department, and at the Government rate of exchange between it and the Ankoossee rupee.

The gram to be unexceptionable and of the quality and description generally used by the mounted corps at those stations, and in case of any dispute, the opinion of a committee to decide the point and to be final.

A supply of at least one month's consumption during the fair season and of three months, during the monsoon to be constantly kept up at the commissariat stores at the before mentioned stations.

To prevent disputes hereafter, it is to be distinctly borne in mind, that the provisions of this contract, are only intended to extend to the demands made at Poona and Kirkee, but in the event of any of the cavalry marching, it will be optional with the commissariat officer, to take one month's gram or not for their use while on march, and the contractor will not be liable for any greater demand.

The contractor, will personally be bound for the due fulfilment of his contract, in the penal sum of rupees (1000) one thousand, and must also furnish unexceptionable bonded security, to the amount of (10,000) ten thousand rupees, on the same account.

Payment for the supplies, according to the quantity issued in the preceding month, will be made in the course of the following month, on the requisite vouchers being produced.

Proposals to be endorsed "tenders for the supply of gram at Poona and Kirkee," and every person submitting a tender will be required to lodge with it the sum of rupees (500) five hundred, to be forfeited in the event of delay, evasion or refusal to adhere to the conditions of his tender if accepted.

The tenders will be opened at the time above specified, in the presence of the parties tendering, or such of them or their accredited agents as may be in attendance.

Tenders unaccompanied by the required sum of rupees (500) five hundred, will not be attended to, and no reason will be assigned for the rejection of any tender.

The Right Honorable the Governor in Council is pleased to publish for general information, the following extracts of letters from the Honorable the Court of Directors, Nos. 3 and 4 of the 31st August and 7th September 1836

Extract of a letter from the Honorable the Court of Directors in the Ecclesiastical Department, No. 3 of the 31st August 1836.

Para 1st. Our attention has lately been directed to the state of the Ecclesiastical establishment, and we have communicated to the Government of India, and also to that of Fort Saint George, our determination to make certain changes for the purpose of increasing its efficiency, with the view of extending the benefit of those changes to your presidency as far as circumstances will admit, we have resolved to appoint two additional Chaplains and to make the following distributions of Ecclesiastical salaries. The two Chaplains at the presidency will receive the same amount as at present. Five Chaplains will receive Company's Rupees 670 per mensem; and the remaining ten 500 Company's Rupees per mensem. These salaries are to constitute their entire emoluments from the Company, and we shall on no account sanction the payment of any extra allowances whatever may be the grounds upon which they may be claimed.

2nd. The Chaplains receiving the lower amount of 500 Rupees per mensem will be termed Assistant Chaplains, and in future all appointments will be made to this class. On each of the two vacancies next occurring, two Assistant Chaplains will be appointed in order to complete the allotted number. The Assistant Chaplains will succeed to the higher rank and the higher rate of salary according to seniority as vacancies occur in the superior class after it shall have been reduced by casualties to the prescribed number of five.

3rd. The principle which we have adopted throughout these arrangements requires that the furlough and retiring allowances should be modified so as to meet the intended changes. Those allowances will in future be on the following scale.

Furlough Allowances.

After 7 years residence £191 12 6 per annum, (full pay of Captain.)

If compelled by sickness to return to Europe before completing 7 years residence ... £ 127 15 0 ditto. (half pay of Captain.)

Retiring Allowances.

After 18 years service (including 3 years furlough)... £ 292 per annum. (full pay of Major,)

After 10 years actual service if compelled by ill health to quit the service..... £ 173 7 6 ditto. (half pay of Major.)

After 7 years actual service do.....do.....do... £127 15 0 ditto. (half pay of Captain.)

The present Chaplains will be entitled to the existing scale of allowances as well for service as on furlough and retirement, these regulations being wholly prospective and only affecting appointments made after the date of this dispatch.

4th. The location of the Chaplains under the new arrangements will be best regulated by reference to the opinion of the Lord Bishop.

Para. 1st We have appointed the Reverend Sholts Friell Pemberton, B. A. a Chaplain on your Establishment.

Is hereby given, that persons desirous of entering into a contract for supplying such Native Boats & other Country Craft and Tonnage for the conveyance of Timber, Planks, Coal, Goods, Stores &c. as may be required for the service of the Indian Naval Department at Bombay, for three years from the 8th of March next, on the conditions hereafter mentioned, may, on application to this office, obtain a statement of the rates &c. and such other information relating thereto as they may require.

2nd. Verbal offers for the contract will be received at this office from 12 till 1 o'clock on Wednesday the 22nd instant, when persons will be required to bid a per-centage *above or below* the rates specified in the statement.

3rd. No person will be entitled to bid for the contract, unless he previously deposits the sum of Rupees Two Hundred and Fifty in this office, to be forfeited in the event of delay, evasion or refusal to execute the Deed of Contract, should his offer be accepted, in which case he must be prepared to produce unexceptionable personal security to the extent of (5000) Five Thousand Rupees for the due performance of the engagement.

4th. All Boats and other Craft supplied, are to be surveyed by an Officer or Officers of the Indian Navy, appointed by the Superintendent, and the contractor will be held responsible for the safe delivery of Stores &c. in the condition they are made over to him, or his people, for transport, as well as for all deficiencies and damages they may sustain while in his charge, or during the passage, the *dangers of the seas and capture by enemies excepted.*

5th. The rates of Freight from and to the several Ports, shewn in the statement, include the anchorage and other fees leviable on the vessels at those Ports, also the charge for small Craft for embarking and disembarking Timber Stores &c. at Bombay and all other Ports, for which therefore no separate charge will be admitted.

6th. The contractor will have the sole and exclusive supply of Native Boats and other Country Craft and tonnage required for the service of the Indian Naval Department, but it must be understood that this cannot prevent the Superintendent of the Indian Navy or other officers from using the Boats of the Squadron, or Government Craft, for any duty whenever it may be deemed to the advantage of Government.

7th. When the contractor is called upon to supply Boats to bring Timber &c, from the Malabar or Canara Coasts, it will be optional

with him either to furnish them at the Port at which they are required, or to dispatch them from Bombay, and in the latter case he will be bound to convey all Goods, Stores &c that may have to be sent to those ports or places respectively, and he shall be paid for such portion of Tonnage so employed, a moiety of the rate fixed from those stations to Bombay.

The Right Hon'ble the Governor in Council is pleased to declare, that from the 1st of May 1837, the new copper coinage as announced in the Proclamation of the 29th November 1830, shall be the legal copper money throughout the Principal Collectorate of Surat, and the Collectorates of Ahmedabad and Kaira, and that no others will be received by the officers of Government.

2d. For the convenience of the public, the Principal Collector of Surat and the collectors of Ahmedabad and Kaira, have been authorized to establish stations in the different Talooks of their respective Collectorates, where the new half and quarter annas and pies will be exchanged till the 30th June 1837, for good pice of the old copper currency, at rates to be fixed by those officers according to the market value.

3rd. A premium of 5 per cent will be given for any sum not less than fifty (50) rupees, in good pice of the old currency, which may be brought to the Talook treasuries and any other place which may be appointed for the purpose, to be exchanged for half and quarter annas and pies of the new currency. The Principal Collector of Surat and Collectors of Ahmedabad and Kaira, are, however, empowered to grant this premium for any sum not less than Twenty (20) Rupees, which may be brought into villages ten miles distant from a large town.

4th. The premium of 5 per cent will be allowed until the 30th June 1837, unless previously ordered otherwise.
