FORT WILLIAM.

16TH JANUARY 1837.

The following Draft of a Proposed Act was read in Council for the first time on the 16th January 1837:

ACT No. — OF 1837.

I. It is hereby enacted, that it shall be lawful for each of the Courts of Sudder Dewanny Adawlut, within the Territories subject to the Presidency of Fort William in Bengal, to direct by an order authenticated by the official signature of the Register of such Court of Sudder Dewanny Adawlut, that the Cognizance of any Original Suit or of any Appeal which may be brought before any Zillah or City Court subordinate to such Court of Sudder Dewanny Adawlut, shall be transferred to any other Zillah or City Court subordinate to the same Court of Sudder Dewanny Adawlut.

II. Provided always, that whenever either of the said Courts of Sudder Dewanny Adawlut shall, in the exercise of the power given by the preceding Clause, direct the transfer of the Cognizance of any Suit, such Court of Sudder Dewanny Adawlut shall cause the reasons for such transfer to be recorded on its proceedings.

Ordered, that the Draft now read be published for general information.

Ordered, that the said Draft be re-considered at the first Meeting of the Legislative Council of India after the 6th day of March next.

FORT WILLIAM.

THE 30TH JANUARY 1837.

Resolution—It has been brought to the notice of the Governor General in Council that, Landed Property of great value within the jurisdiction of the King's Courts, is now held by Parsees, to whom it has descended in conformity with Parsee usages, but not in conformity with the English Law of Inheritance.

2. The national usages of the Parsees are not like the Hindoo and Mahomedan rules of Inheritance, Marriage, and Succession recognized by Law. Nevertheless it appears to His Lordship in Council that Parsees who are in possession of Land which they have inherited according to their national usages and with the acquiescence of all interested parties, ought not to be disturbed in that possession. This appears to His Lordship in Council to be one of those cases in which the strict enforcement of the Law would defeat the end for which Laws are made, would render property insecure, and would shake the confidence of the people in the Institutions under which they live.

3. His Lordship in Council is disposed to enact that real property within the jurisdiction of the King's Courts shall, as regards its transmission by the Will of a Parsee Testator or on the death of a Parsee Intestate, be taken to be and to have always been of the nature of Chattels real.

4. This enactment will be restricted by two provisos. One of those provisos secures in their possessions all who hold such Property by what has hitherto been a strictly legal title. The other is intended to give legal validity to those family arrangements which Parsees have heretofore made according to their national customs, in cases in which no objection has been made to those arrangements.

5. In order that time may be given to Parsees who reside at a distance from Calcutta to express their wishes, His Lordship in Council has determined to leave a longer interval than ordinary, between the first publication and the final re-consideration of the Act which has been prepared on this subject.

The following Draft of that Act is herewith published for general information :

ACT No. — of 1837.

I. It is hereby enacted, that from the — day of — all immoveable Property situate within the jurisdiction of any of the Courts established by His Majesty's Charter shall, as far as regards the transmission of such Property on the death and intestacy of any Parsee having a beneficial interest in the same, or by the last Will of any such Parsee, be taken to be and to have been of the nature of Chattels real and not of Freehold.

II. Provided always, that in any suit at Law or in Equity which shall be brought for the recovery of such immoveable Property as is aforesaid, no advantage shall be taken of any defect of title arising out of the transmission of such Property upon the death and intestacy of any Parsee having a beneficial interest in the same, or by the last Will of any such Parsee if such transmission took place before the said — day of —, and if such transmission were either according to the rules which regulate the transmission of Freehold Property, or else took place with the acquiescence of all persons to whom any interest in that Property would, according to the rules which regulate the transmission of Chattels real, have accrued upon the death of such Parsee.

Ordered, that the said Draft be re-considered at the first Meeting of the Legislative Council of India, after the 9th day of May next.

THE 6TH FEBRUARY, 1837.

The following Act, passed by the Right Honorable the Governor General of India in Council, on the 6th February, 1837, is hereby promulgated for general information :

ACT No. I. of 1837.

It is hereby enacted, that from the 1st day of March next, it shall be lawful for any one Justice of the Peace for the Town of Calcutta, to issue a Warrant of Distress for the recovery of Arrears of Assessment occurring under the Act of Parliament 33, George III. Cap. 52, and every such Warrant shall have the same force as if it were under the hands and seals of two such Justices.

FORT WILLIAM,

THE 6TH FEBRUARY, 1837.

The following Act, passed by the Right Honorable the Governor General of India in Coun-

cil, on the 6th February 1837, is hereby promulgated for general information :

ACT. No. II of 1837.

I. It is hereby enacted, that from the 1st day of March next, Regulation IX. of 1830, and Regulation XI. of 1831, of the Bombay Code, and Act No. XVIII. of 1836, of the Governor General of India in Council, be repealed.

II. And it is hereby enacted, that the following rates of Toll shall, from the said day, be levied in the Company's Currency at the Toll Gate of the Bhoré Ghaut on Vehicles and Animals both in going and returning :

On every four-wheeled Carriage on springs.....	1 Rupee.
On every two-wheeled Carriage on springs, except Native Hackeries.	$\frac{1}{2}$ Rupee.
On every Native Hackery on springs.	2 Annas.
On every labor Cart and labor Hackery not on springs, and having wheels of less diameter than three feet six inches, and tyers less in breadth than three inches, if drawn by two Bullocks.....	$\frac{1}{2}$ Rupee.
On every such labor Cart and labor Hackery drawn by 4 Bullocks....	1 Rupee.
On every labor Cart and labor Hackery not on springs, and not having wheels of less diameter than three feet six inches and tyers less in breadth than three inches if drawn by two Bullocks.....	$1\frac{1}{2}$ Anna.
On every such labor Cart and labor Hackery drawn by 4 Bullocks....	3 Annas.
On every Elephant.....	$\frac{1}{2}$ Rupee.
On every Camel.....	$\frac{1}{4}$ Rupee.
On every Saddle Horse and Harness Horse.....	1 Anna.
On every Tattoo.....	6 Pie.
On every score of Sheep or Goats, ..	2 Annas.
On horned Cattle per head.....	2 Pie.
On every Beggary carrying a load for hire.....	2 Pie.
On every Mule not used for riding... ..	3 Pie.
On every Mule used for riding.....	1 Anna.
On every Ass.....	1 Pie.
On every Palna or small Native Palanquin.....	$\frac{1}{2}$ Rupee.

III. And it is hereby enacted, that it shall be competent to the Governor in Council of Bombay to appoint persons for the collection of the Tolls aforesaid, which persons shall, in the execution of such their office, be liable to the same responsibility as would attach to them if they were employed in the collection of the Land Revenue.

IV. And it is hereby enacted, that it shall be lawful for the persons employed in the Collection of the Tolls aforesaid in case of non-payment of the Toll on any property, to stop such property or such part thereof as may be adequate to the discharge of the Toll due, and that every Police Officer when thereunto required shall be assisting to the persons employed in the Collection of the Tolls aforesaid in the discharge of their duties.

V. And it is hereby enacted, that in case any Toll due shall remain unpaid for the space of 24 hours after such detention of property as is aforesaid, it shall be lawful for such person as the Governor in Council of Bombay shall appoint to act in that behalf to direct the sale of the property detained, and to reserve out of the proceeds of such sale a sum equivalent to the Toll due, and

also in cases in which it shall appear to that person that the payment of the Toll has been contumaciously refused to reserve a fine not exceeding 5 Rupees; and that the surplus, if any, shall be repaid to the owners of the property on application.

VI. Provided always, that nothing herein contained shall be taken to deprive the owner of any property detained as aforesaid of his right of action in the Civil Court of the Zillah for any injury which may have been done to him under color of carrying this Act into execution.

VII. Provided also, that nothing herein contained shall be held to prevent the Governor in Council of Bombay from granting any exemption from payment of the said Tolls, or from granting a farm of the said Tolls.

The Right Hon'ble the Governor in Council is pleased to republish for general information the following Notification issued by the Government of India under date the 25th ultimo.

FORT WILLIAM.

FINANCIAL DEPARTMENT, 25TH JAN. 1837.

Notice is hereby given, that under the Conditions of the Advertisement of this Department, dated 5th October 1836, and in conformity with further Orders recently received from the Hon'ble Court of Directors, adjustments of Interest will be made upon all Stock Certificates of the Book Debt Loan, bearing date 31st December 1834, by allowing Interest at the rate of 6 per Cent. on the amount of the cancelled Promissory Note of the Remittable Loan represented by such Stock to the date of its advertised discharge, and from that date at 5 per cent. on the augmented principal of the transferred Stock.

The difference of Interest that may be claimable under this notice will, in case the Stock has been held consecutively by the same party or parties, be paid to the holder of the Certificate on application and production thereof in the Office of the Accountant General of the Presidency, in which the Stock may be registered for payment of Interest, but in case of transfer intermediate between the 31st December 1834 and that of application for adjustment of Interest under this notice, the circumstances of each case and all particulars of the transfers must be submitted to the Governor General of India in Council, in order that His Lordship in Council may decide to whom the difference of Interest thus granted is payable.

Whenever Interest shall have been adjusted on any Stock Certificates the same shall be delivered up to be exchanged for other Certificates of the date of advertised discharge of the Original 6 per Cent. Stock thereof, viz. 10th August 1835 or 15th January 1836 respectively, according to the number of the Promissory Notes as the case may be: and the holders of the resigned Certificates shall further receive broken Interest to the new date of half yearly payment to which the Stock will thus be changed—the payment in both cases to be received

on the back of the exchanged Certificate in the usual manner.

The holders of *Promissory Notes* of the Government *Transfer Loan*, bearing date 31st December 1834, shall be entitled, until further orders, to transfer the same to the Book Debt Registers of date 10th August 1835 or 15th January 1836, according to the date of discharge of the Original 6 per Cent. Stock of such Notes respectively, and to receive on the occasion of every such transfer the difference of Interest and the broken Interest that may be payable on a similar adjustment, and renewal to be made thereon with that above prescribed for Stock Certificates of the same date.

The Accountant Generals of Calcutta, Madras and Bombay will make the adjustments of Interest and Transfers above authorized in respect to the Notes and Certificates registered for payment of Interest at those Presidencies respectively, without demanding any fee for the same, and it will be necessary that the fact of adjustment having been made be noted on the new Certificates to be granted. The holders of Notes and Certificates transferred to the London Registers, will, on application to the Honorable Court of Directors, learn the determination of the Hon'ble Court as to the manner in which these adjustments and transfers will be made in respect to their Stock.

Notification.

MARINE DEPARTMENT.

It is hereby notified for general information that a Beacon, as shown in the subjoined sketch has been erected at the entrance of the Hujamree branch of the Indus, as a mark for vessels entering that river—it is composed of rough Spars, is forty five feet high and can be seen distinctly with the naked eye, at a distance of five Miles: the lower part is eight feet square and twenty five feet high and supports a slender pyramid, surmounted by a large cone.

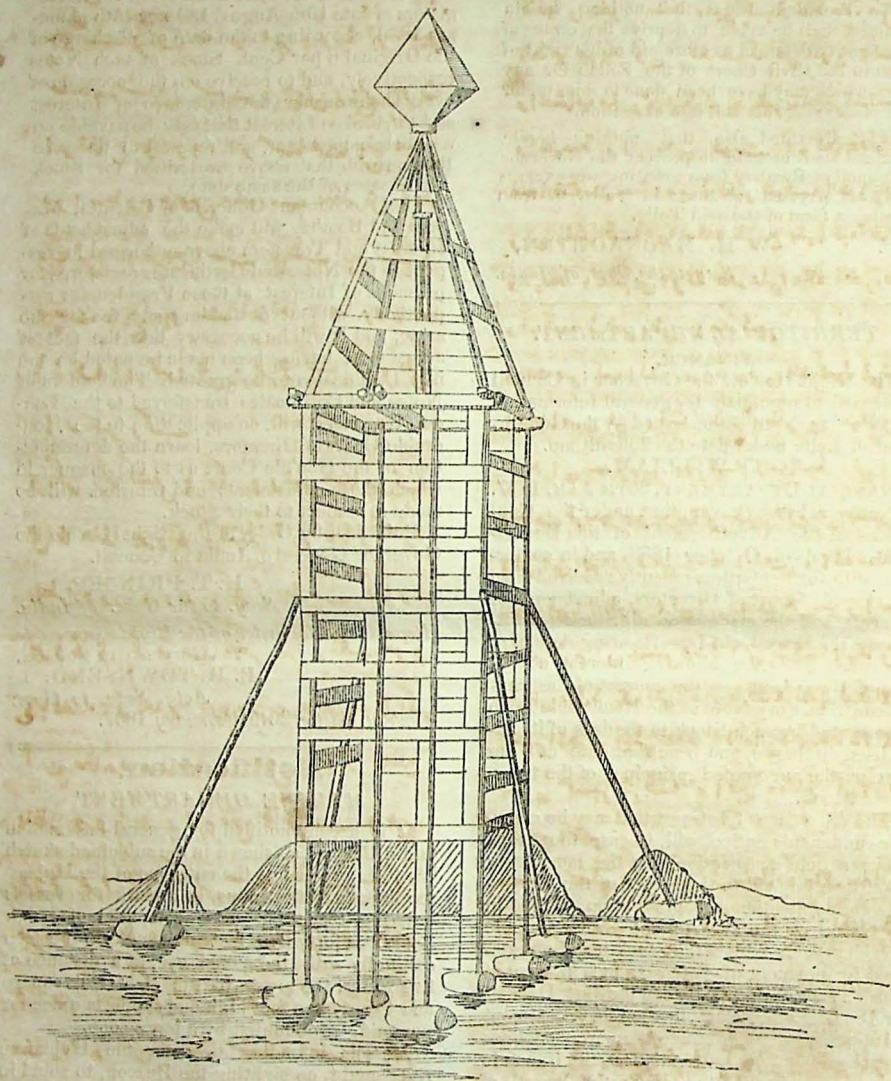
Vessels intending to enter the Hujamree river ought, on sighting the Beacon, to stand in towards the land until they are close to the shoals, and then steer along them until the Beacon bears N. N. E. $\frac{1}{2}$ E: they will then be at the entrance of the channel and may steer direct for it, until near the shoal water off the north point of the river, on which the Beacon is situated, when they must keep away N. E. by E. up the first reach.

Proclamation.
TERRITORIAL DEPARTMENT,
FINANCE.

The Right Hon'ble the Governor in Council is pleased to declare, that from the 1st of May 1837, the new copper coinage as announced in the Proclamation of the 29th November 1830, shall be the legal copper money throughout the Principal Collectorate of Surat, and the Collectorates of Ahmedabad and Kaira, and that no others will be received by the officers of Government.

2nd. For the convenience of the public, the Principal Collector of Surat and the Collectors of Ahmedabad and Kaira, have been authorized to establish stations in the different Talooks of their respective Collectorates, where the new half and quarter annas and pies will be exchanged till the 30th June 1837, for good pice of the old copper currency, at rates to be fixed by those officers according to the market value.

3rd. A premium of 5 per cent will be given for any sum not less than fifty (50) rupees, in good pice of the old currency, which may be brought to the Talook treasuries and any other place which may be appointed for the purpose to be exchanged for half and quarter annas and pies of the new currency. The Principal Collector of Surat and Collectors of Ahmedabad and Kaira, are, however, empowered to grant this premium for any sum not less than Twenty (20) Rupees which may be brought into villages ten miles distant from a large town.

4th. The premium of 5 per cent will be allowed until the 30th June 1837, unless previously ordered otherwise.

mitted, within the Town and Island of Bom-
bay, and the limits thereof, and the Factories
subordinate thereto, and also to enquire, hear,
and determine in like manner, all Treasons,
Murders, Felonies, Forgeries, Perjuries,
Crimes, Extortions, Misdemeanors, Trespass-
es, Wrongs, Oppressions, had done and
committed by any of His Majesty's British
subjects, in any of the Territories which now
are subject to, or dependent upon, the said
Government of Bombay, or within any of the
dominions of the Native Princes of India, in
alliance with the said Government.

And also, that at the same time and place
will be holden a Session of Admiralty, for the
Trial of all Treasons, Murders, Piracies,
Robberies, Trespasses, Misdemeanors, and
other crimes and offences, had done, perpetra-
ted or committed, on the High Seas.

And I hereby require and enjoin all persons
bound to prosecute and give evidence at the
above Sessions, or in any way concerned there-
in, to attend at the time and place above
mentioned, and not to depart without leave of
the Court. Dated this 22nd day of February
