NOTIFICATION.

Bombay Castle, 4th August 1831.

The Right Hon'ble the Governor in Council having sanctioned the publication of a weekly paper to be styled the Bombay Government Gazette, "notice is hereby given, that after this day all advertisements and other public papers of the government, will be printed in the Bombay Government Gazette only; and all orders or other public neetices, appearing in that paper, under the signature of the secretaries, or other public officers of the government, arhereby ordered and directed to be conformed to and obeyed accordingly. It is not intended that public intelligence, or private advertisements, and notifications should be inserted in the government gazette.

When official notifications from the government are inserted in the Bombay Government officers are required to take notice of such official notifications in the same manner as if they had been directly communicated to them by letter from the secretary a bifice, and as heads of offices alone will be furnished by government with the Bombay Government concerned, they will be expected to communicate to their subordinate officers all orders which may in any manner concern them.

The Bombay Government Gazettes furnished by government to public offices are to be lodged with the records, and are not to be removed from the office.

FORT WILLIAM.

THE 4TH FEBRUARY 1839.

'The following Act is passed by the Hon'ble the President of the Council of India in Council on the 4th February 1839, with the assent of the Right Hon'ble the Governor General of

India, which has been read and recorded,
Ordered, that the Act be promulgated for general information.

Act No. I. of 1839.

I. It is hereby enacted, that from the first day of May next ensuing after the passing of this Act, all Regulations and parts of Regulations of the Bengal Code, which give to any persons or class of persons authority, by virtue of any office held by them, to sell property distrained for the recovery of arrears of rent, shall,

so far as they give such authority, be repealed, II. And it is hereby enacted, that from the date aforesaid it shall be lawful for the Collector or Officer duly exercising the powers of a Collector in each District subject to the Pre-sidency of Fort William in Bengal, to appoint, by a Sunnud under his signature and seal, in the terms of the Schedule appended to this Act, and conformably to such instructions as he may receive in that behalf, any person or persons to exercise the function of selling property discipled for the vacquery of greeness of renting trained for the recovery of arrears of rent in each Pergannah or Sub-division of his District, and to authorize such persons to remunerate themselves by deducting a per centage, not in any case exceeding ten per centum on the amount of the proceeds of the sale.

III. And it is hereby enacted, that all Regulations and parts of Regulations of the Bengal Code which give powers to, or prescribe rules for the guidance of persons appointed to conduct the sale of property distrained for the re-covery of arrears of rent, or which assign any penalty or other punishment for misfeasance in the discharge of such duty, shall be applicable

to all parties appointed for the sale of such property under this Act.

SCHEDULE.

I, A. B., Collector of (or exercising the powers of a Collector) in virtue of the powers vested in me by Act No. I. of 1839, appoint you C. D. Commissioner for the sale of property distrained for the recovery of arrears of rent, in the manner prescribed by the Regulations of Government. You are to reside at E., in Pergunnah F., and are to exercise the authority vested in you by these Regulations, or by any others which may be hereafter transmitted to you for your guidance, in strict conformity thereto; and are to keep a regular and complete record of your proceedings to be produced when called for by me, or by the Courts of Justice. You are hereby authorized to remunerate yourself for your trouble, by deducting and appropriating per centum on the amount of the proceeds of sale.

THE 4TH FEBRUARY 1839.

The following Act is passed by the Hon'ble the President of the Council of India in Council on the 4th February 1839, with the assent of the Right Hon'ble the Governor General of India, which has been read and recorded.

Ordered that the Act be promulgated for general information.

ACT No. II. of 1839.

I. It is hereby enacted, that in all cases of fines by which offenders are or may be punishable by any Magistrate, according to the Provisions of any Act heretofore passed or which shall hereafter be passed by the Governor Ge-neral of India in Council, it shall be lawful, in case of non-payment, if no other means for enforcing the payment are or shall be provided by such 'Act or otherwise, for the Magistrate, by

warrant under his hand, to levy the amount of such fine by distress and sale of any goods and chattels of the offender which may be found within the jurisdiction of such Magistrate, and if no such property shall be found within such jurisdiction, then it shall be lawful for every such Magistrate by warrant under his hand, to commit the offender to prison, there to be imprisoned only, or to be imprisoned and kept to hard labor, according to the discretion of such Magistrate, for any term not exceeding two calendar months, where the amount of the fine shall not exceed 50 Rupees, and for any term not exceeding four calendar months, where the amount shall not exceed 100 Rupees, and for any term not exceeding six calendar months in any other case, the commitment to be determinable in each of the cases aforesaid upon payment of the amount.

And it is hereby enacted, that in all cases in which offenders are or may be punishable by any Magistrate with fine or imprisonment, or both, according to the Provisions of any Act heretofore passed, or which shall hereafter be passed by the Governor General of India in Council, and where the extreme amount of the fine or imprisonment is not specified, it shall not be lawful for the Magistrate to impose any fine exceeding 200 Rupees, or to imprison the offen-

der for any term exceeding six months.

III. And it is hereby enacted, that in all eases in which offenders are or may be punishable by fine before a Magistrate, according to the Provisions of any Act heretofore passed, or which hereafter shall be passed by the Governor General of India in Council, it shall be lawful for the Magistrate, and he is hereby required to receive proof of the commission of the offence upon oath, or upon solemu affirmation in cases where a solemn affirmation is receivable by law instead of an oath.

IV. And it is hereby declared and enacted, that in this Act and in all Acts heretofore passed by the Governor General of India in Council, the terms "fine" and "fines" shall extend to all "penalties" and "forfeitures," and the term "Magistrate" shall extend to all "Joint Magistrates" 'Persons lawfully exercising the powers of a Magistrate," and "Justices of the 'Peace."

Ordered, that the Act be promulgated for ge-

neral information.

ACT No. III of 1839. .

I. It is hereby enacted and declared, that within the British Territories under the Government of the East India Company, no person whatever is, or shall be, by reason of place of birth, or by reason of descent, in any proceeding whatever connected with arrears or exactions of rent, excepted from the jurisdiction of the Revenue Courts, any thing in Act No. XI. of 1836 contained notwithstanding.

11. And it is hereby enacted, that no such proceeding which may have been instituted before the passing of this Act in any such Court, and no decree which may have been passed before the passing of this Act in any such proceeding by any such Court, shall be treated as invalid by reason of the place of birth, or by reason of the descent of any party to such proceeding, or to

And it is hereby enacted, that within the said Territories no person whatever shall, by reason of place of birth, or by reason of descent, be in any civil proceeding whatever connected with arrears or exactions of rent excepted from the jurisdiction of the Courts of the Moonsiffs. H. T. PRINSEP,

It is hereby enacted, in modification of Clause 5th, Section XIII. of Regulation XIII. of 1827, of the Bombay Code, that all sentences passed by an Assistant Session Judge whereby a convict is liable to imprisonment for a period exceeding two years shall, before they are carried into execution, be confirmed by the Session Judge, whose powers and proceedings in respect of any such case shall be the same as are laid down for the guidance of the Seuder Foujdaree Adawlut in Clause 2d of the Section and Regulation aforesaid, and it shall not be necessary to refer any such case to the Sudder Foujdaree Adawlut.

GENERAL ORDERS.

MILITARY DEPARTMENT.

BY THE HONORABLE THE GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL.

BOMBAY CASTLE, 5th MARCH 1839.

No. 148 of 1839.—The Honorable the Governor in Council is pleased to publish for information, the following Extract, paras. 4 & 5 of the Honorable Court's letter, No. 62, dated 5th December last.

Para. 4. We take this opportunity of calling your attention to the irregular manner in which the Quarterly Statements of Soldiers Family Remittances are made up at your Presidency, by including, Warrant Officers amongst the Non-Commissioned and Privates, and by converting the total amount of such Lists into Sterling money at the rate of 2s. 6d. the Company's Rupee, whereas Warrant Officers are only entitled to remit through us at the exchange annually fixed for making advances for Her Majesty's Service in India, and the amount remittable for the lowest grade of them, vizt, a Sub-Conductor is limited to £20 per annum under our orders to Bengal dated 11th May 1830, No. 31.

5. In granting the privilege to Non-Commissioned Officers and Privates, of remitting their savings to their Families in Europe at the Exchange of 2s. 6d. the Rupee, it was obviously contemplated, that the amount of such Remittances should be restricted to the saving from their "subsistence" and not from income derived in any other way; a departure from this principle, necessarily subjects the Company to positive loss, and it must therefore be prevented.

No. 153 of 1839.—The Hon'ble the Governor in Council having had under consideration the expediency of continuing the Military Saving's Bank established by the Government General Order of the 13th July 1829, as a separate institution, and being satisfied that all the objects for which it was intended are equally secured with additional advantages by the Government Savings Bank instituted on the 1st May 1835, the revised rules for which were published in the Government Gazette under date the 19th November of the same year, is pleased to declare, that the provisions of the Government General Order of the 13th July 1829, shall cease and determine on the 30th April next, on which date the several Divisional and Regimental Paymasters will adopt the necessary measures for bringing the transactions to a close, the amount due to each Depositor including both Capital and Interest being intimated to him; with an option either of transforring it to the Government Savings Bank, or of withdrawing it; all interest, whether on sums deposited with the Regimental or Divisional Paymasters, forwarded to the Sub-Treasurer, or for which a Government acknowledgment has been granted, as derived from the Military Savings Bank, will accordingly be discontinued from the 1st May next.

The Hon'ble the Governor in Council is pleased to republish for the information of the Army the Rules of the Bombay Government Savings Bank as published in the Government Gazette on the 26th November

RULES OF THE BOMBAY GOVERNMENT SAVINGS BANK. TERRITORIAL DEPARTMENT,-FINANCE.

Bombay Saving's Bank.

The Right Hon'ble the Governor in Council directs that, the following Rules of a Savings Bank, established in Bombay, under the guarantee and responsibility of Government, be published for general information.

The Bank to be denominated "the Government Savings Bank." 1st.

2nd. All Classes, British and Native, may invest their Savings in the Government of the undermention-3rd. The return of the exact sum deposited, together with the interest due thereon at the undermention-ed rate, is secured to the Depositor under guarantee of the Government.

4th. The general direction and control of the Bank shall be vested in a Committee of Management, to be nominated by the Governor in Council. The Committee shall meet at such stated periods as may be neces-

sary for the due and efficient control of the proceedings of the Bank.

5th. The Government Agents (the Accountant General and Sub-Treasurer, for the time being) are charged with the immediate Superintendence and execution of all details connected with the Bank. They will also be Ex-officio Members of the Committee of Management. The Sub-Treasurer, as one of the Government Agents, will be Ex-officio Secretary to the Bank.

6th. A Register of deposits will be kept, and generally such other accounts as may be determined on, and approved of, by the Managing Committee.

Any sum not less than one Rupee, will be received in deposit.

Whenever any sum deposited by one individual shall amount to Company's Rupees 500, the same will be transferred from the Bank Deposit in the General Freasury, and subscribed on account of the Depositor, to the 4 per Cent Bengal Government Loan, until further notice, unless an intimation of its withdrawal, or the withdrawal of a portion of it, be given by the Depositor within one month after it has reached the amount; and all Government Securities shall be handed over to the Government Agency at the application of the contract of the securities of the contract of the contract of the securities of the contract of the contra at the expiration of three months, (subject to all the Rules which obtain in that department), unless counter-instructions be immediately received from the Proprietors.

9th. Interest at four per Cent per Annum will be allowed on deposits until further notice.

10th. The interest will be calculated on a deposit from the first day of the month succeeding that in which it shall be received, and up to the last day of the month preceding that in which it shall be withdrawn. No interest will be allowed for the broken periods of a month, nor calculated on fractional parts of a Rupee.

11th. The Government reserves to itself the power of lowering or raising the rate of interest, such alteration not to affect deposits previously invested in Public Securities; and due notice to be given in the Bombay Government Gazette of the intention of Government six months before the alteration shall

take effect.

All deposits will be regularly entered in a Book at the time they are made, and the Depositor of the deposit made at the presidency will be furnished with a small Book, having a duplicate of the entry. This Book is to be brought to the Bank whenever any sum is deposited or withdrawn. The account thus kept will be closed on the 30th April of every year, and the balance of interest due at that period will be paid to the Depositor, or carried to account, thenceforward to accountate at compound yearly interest, until it shall amount to 500 Company's Rupees, when the same will be transferred from the account of the Bunk, and subscribed on account of the Depositor, to the Bengal Government 4 per cent Loan, as per Rule 8th, unless notice of withdrawal be given within one month, as above, or unless the rate of interest be altered as provided for in rule 11th.

No person or persons to deposit money in trust for any other person or persons, provided however, that this rule shall not be construed to prohibit individuals resident out of Bombay, who cannot attend personally, from making their deposits by any other responsible person; or parents from making deposits on behalf, and on account of their Children; or Females, who according to the manners and customs of the country, do not usually make their appearance in public, from making such deposits by the hands of other

14th. No sum deposited to be transferable, excepting on the personal application of the Depositor, supported by written sanction; when peculiar circumstances render a deviation from this rule necessary, the case shall be submitted to the Committee of Management for their sanction.

15th. No person will be allowed to deposit any money without making known his or her name, together with his or her profession, business, occupation, calling, and residence.—A duplicate of this description will be entered in each Depositor's Book, to be produced whenever any sum is afterwards deposited or withdrawn.

16th. Depositors will be at liberty, at any time, to withdraw any sums, or portions of sums deposited by them, receiving interest culculated up to the end of the month preceding that in which the withdrawal is made.

17th. As a general rule, deposits, with the interest due thereon, will be repaid to the Depositors, personally, in all practicable cases; in the case of individuals unable to attend in person, the Secretary will exercise his discretion in regard to repayment of deposits to responsible persons duly authorized by such

absentees to receive the same.

18th. Military Officers and Soldiers, European and Native, will be allowed to invest their savings in the Government Savings Bank, through the Pay Masters of Corps or Divisions; and Officers and Servants of the Civil Establishments, European and Native, through the Residents, Collectors, and other Officers in charge of Public Treasuries, or who are competent to sign Pay Abstracts of Civil Establishments; and Residents, Collectors, Pay Masters and other Officers in charge of Public Treasuries are hereby authorized to receive subscriptions to the Bank, or to deduct monthly from their Abstracts, such sums as the parties within their circle of payment may be desirous of depositing, not being less than one Rupee, nor more than 500 Company's Rupees.

The deposits referred to in the preceding rule, are to be brought to the credit of subscribers on the last day of the month in which the payment or deduction is made, and rules 16th and 17th respecting the withdrawal of deposits by parties subscribing through Residents, Collectors, Pay-masters, and other Officers in charge of Public Treasuries, will be carred into effect under instructions which will be furnished to them

by the Accountant General.

20th. In case of the death of a Depositor, the sum at his credit will be paid to his or her Executors, or Assigns; or in case of no Will, according to the Law on this head, or the Regulation of the Service, if the deceased be a Military Man.

In case of any difference between the Secretary of the Bank and any Depositor, it shall be refer-21st.

22nd. A general Statement of the Funds of the Bank shall be annually made out to the 30th April, after the 1st May; the same to be submitted for the information of Government and published in the Bombay Go-

vernment Gazette.

23rd. The Bank to be open daily, (Sundays and Holiday's excepted) and all Balances above 500 Rupees to be paid over, at the close of each day's proceedings, by the Secretary, into the General Treasury, where an account with the Bank will be opened and kept.

The Government Savings Bank will commence business on the 1st May 1835.

PUBLIC ORDER.

To regulate the religious procession of the Mohurrum, and for the preservation of the public peace during that festival, sanctioned by the Honorahle the Governor in Council, as provided for by rule, ordinance, and regulation 11, A. D. 1827.

1st. Every person wishing to have a Taboot at the ensuing Mohurrum, must obtain the permission of one of the Magistrates of Police, and register his name and place of residence at the Police Office, on or before Monday the 18th instant.

2nd. Any person-who may be seen carrying a Sword, Dirk, Bludgeon, or other offensive weapon, will be taken into custody.

3rd. Taboots meeting on the public road, are to give way to one another, in the same manner that carriages do, each Taboot keeping to the left.

4th. Each Taboot is to have but one set of "Tassa," one set of "Dholee," one "Kurnah,"

and fifteen " Hillal."

5th. Tuboots are not permitted to go abreast on the public road, but they are to follow each other in a peaceable manner.

6th. Any person found drunk, or throwing stones, mud &c, at the Taboots, will be taken

into custody and punished.

7th. No Taboots are allowed to go in procession on the last night of the Mohurrum before 12 o'clock, or to continue so after 3 o'clock in the following morning. These processions are limited (on the last night and day of the Mohurrum) to the Bheady Bazar road, Duncan road, Chinch bunder, and Market streets; and Taboots are not to be taken out on the last day before 12 o'clock, and on meeting carriages and horsemen, are strictly enjoined to eease playing country music, until they shall have passed the Taboots, keeping the left side of the road; and it is directed, that they be thrown into the sea, and the ceremony concluded by 5 o'clock P. M.

8th. All persons licensed to sell Spirituous Liquors, and all venders of Opium and Bhang, are conjoined to keep their shops closed; and persons found selling any thing of an intoxicating nature, during the aforesaid period, will be taken into custody and punished.

9th. The inhabitants of Bombay are en-

9th. The inhabitants of Bombay are enjoined, not to assault or insult the Moguls, during the celebration of the Mohurrum.

10th. The Honorable the Governor in Council is pleased to direct, that the procession of the "Zool Junnah," or Horse, through the public streets or roads, shall be discontinued, and it is hereby notified accordingly, but it is not intended to prevent any person having the procession within his own compound.
