FORT WILLIAM,

THE 4TH MARCH, 1839.

The following Draft of a proposed Act was read in Council for the first time on the 4th March, 1839.

ACT No.—OF 1839.

I. It is hereby enacted, that all persons tried for any offence shall be admitted, after the close of the case for the prosecution, to make full answer and defence thereto by Counsel learned in the law, or by Attorney in Her Majesty's Courts of Justice where Attornies practise as Counsel.

II. And it is hereby enacted, that in all cases of conviction by a Magistrate or Justice of the Peace, persons accused shall be permitted to make their full answer and defence, and to have all witnesses examined and cross-examined by Counsel, Attorney, or Vakeel.

III. And it is hereby enacted, that all persons who after the passing of this Act shall be held to bail, or committed to prison, for any offence against the law for which they are to be tried before any of Her Majesty's Courts of Justice shall be entitled to require and have on demand (from the person who shall have the lawful custody thereof, and who is hereby required to deliver the same) copies of the examinations of the witnesses respectively upon whose depositions they have been so held to bail or committed to prison, on payment of a reasonable sum for the same not exceeding—. Provided always that if such demand shall not be made before the day appointed for the commencement of the Sessions at which the trial of the Person on whose behalf such demand shall be made is to take place, such person shall not be entitled to have any copy of such examination of witnesses unless the Judge at such trial shall be of opinion that such copy may be made and delivered without delay or inconvenience to such trial; but it shall nevertheless be competent to such Judge, if he shall think fit to postpone such trial on account of such copy of the examination of

witnesses not having been previously had by the party charged.

IV. And it is hereby enacted, that all persons under trial in any of Her Majesty's Courts of Justice, shall be entitled at the time of their trial, to inspect without fee or reward, all depositions or copies thereof, which have been taken against them, and returned into the Court before which such trial shall be had.

Ordered, that the Draft now read be published for general information.

Ordered, that the said Draft be re-considered at the first meeting of the Legislative Council of India, after the 4th day of June next.

THE 4TH MARCH, 1839.

The following Extract from the Proceedings of the Hon'ble the President in Council, in the Legislative Department, under date the 4th March, 1839, is published for general information.

Read a second time the Draft of proposed Act dated the 14th May 1838, and published in the Calcutta Gazette of the 16th of the same month, prohibiting the importation of foreign Sugar into the Madras Territories.

Resolution.—The Hon'ble the President of the Council of India in Council resolves, that the following Amended Draft on the subject, be published for general information.

ACT No.—OF 1839.

I. It is hereby enacted, that if any person on or after the day on which this Act will come into operation, as hereinafter provided, lands or attempts to land in any part of the Territories subject to the Government of the Presidency of Fort St. George, any Foreign Sugar, or any Sugar which is the growth of any British possession into which Foreign Sugar can be legally imported, such Sugar shall be seized and confiscated by the Collector of the Customs, or by

any other Officer thereunto authorized by the Governor of the said Presidency.

II. And it is hereby enacted, that if any person being in possession of Sugar, the produce of the said Territories, desires to obtain a certificate of origin from the Collector or Assistant Collector of the Land or Custom Revenue of any district within the said Territories, or from any other Officer appointed by the Governor in Council of Fort St. George, to give such certificates, such person shall, in the presence of the Officer from whom he desires to obtain such certificate, make and subscribe a Declaration in the form contained in the Schedule hereunto annexed, marked A.

III. And it is hereby enacted, that the Officer before whom such a Declaration as is aforesaid shall have been made, shall grant under his hand and seal to the Declarant a certificate in the form contained in the Schedule hereunto annexed, marked B.

IV. And it is hereby enacted, that every person who intends to ship Sugar from any place within the said Territories for any part of the United Kingdom shall be entitled to produce to the Collector of Customs at that place, or to any other Officer who may have been appointed by the Governor in Council of Fort St. George to act on such occasions in place of the Collector of Customs, a certificate such as is above described, and also in the presence of the Officer to whom he has so produced such certificate, to make and subscribe a Declaration in the form contained in the Schedule hereunto annexed, marked C.

V. And it is hereby enacted, that the Officer to whom such a certificate shall have been so produced, and before whom a Declaration in the last mentioned form shall have been so made and subscribed, shall grant to the person who has made the last mentioned Declaration, a certificate in the form contained in the Schedule hereunto annexed, marked D.

VI. And it is hereby enacted, that any person who shall in making any Declaration under the authority of this Act, knowingly affirm an untruth, shall, on conviction thereof, be punished by fine to an amount not exceeding Five Thousand Rupees, and imprisonment for a term not exceeding two years.

VII. And it is hereby enacted, that this Act shall come into operation at the expiration of one year after the date of its enactment; that is to say, on the _____ day of _____ in the year of our Lord One Thousand Eight Hundred and Forty.

Advertisement.

1. Tenders for the conveyance of the Public Mails in wheeled conveyances between Panwell and Poona, (between the entrance of Panwell river and Poona, as soon as a road may be completed) to and from, will be received at this office till 12 o'clock on Wednesday the 1st of May next, when all tenders which may have been received, will be opened by the Post Master General. Parties interested are invited to attend in person, or by Deputy, to witness the opening of the tenders; and the party whose tender may be accepted, must be prepared to commence operations on the 1st June following, when the present contract expires.

2. The average daily weight of the Mail, Outwards and Inwards, is 80 pounds, but the contractor must be prepared to carry five times that weight at least twice every Lunar month, or oftener, should the Post Master General have occasion to call for it, without receiving any Extra remuneration. Due notice will be given as to the particular periods when extra carriage is required.

The average daily weight of the public Bhangies, outwards and Inwards, is 40 pounds. It will be left optional with contractors to carry them either in the same conveyance with the Letter Mails, or in a separate one. No part of the proceeds of Bhangies will be granted to contractors, nor will they be allowed to have any thing to do with them, further than their mere conveyance. They will be at liberty to carry passengers on their own account, and at their own rates of charge; and, as this is disconnected with the duties of the Post Office Department, the Post Master General cannot interfere in any disputes which may arise.

4. The Mails must be conveyed from Panwell to Poona, and vice versa, in 12 hours during the fair season, i. e. from the 1st of October till the 1st of June in each year, and in 13 hours during the remaining months. One hour more, respectively, will be allowed when the entrance of Panwell river becomes the extreme of the line.

5. No reward will be given for conveying the Mail in less time than is agreed on; and for any excess, contractors will subject themselves to penalties as follows, vizt.

and if more, the contract will be liable to forfeiture, at the discretion of the Post Master General.

6. Contractors must be prepared to convey expresses, Outwards or Inwards, whenever called upon by the Post Master General, or the Post Master at Poona; and for every express so conveyed, provided it is done in the same time as is allowed for regular Mails, a sum of Rupees 25 will be granted, but it is expressly to be understood, that any excess of time will forfeit all claim to such sum.

7. The tenders received will be submitted for the final orders of Government, and will be liable to rejection without reasons being assigned.

8. Contractors will be required to deposit cash or Company's Paper to such amount as

may be deemed requisite by the Post Master General, and a portion, or the whole of such deposit will be liable to forfeiture at the discretion of Government in case of non-fulfilment of contract.

9. Contractors wishing to resign their contract, must give 3 months previous notice to the Post Master General. In like manner Government shall have the power of dissolving the contract by giving the contractor 3 months previous notice. The period of contract is to extend for 3 years.

10. Contractors must further take into account the following points, and be prepared to conform to circumstances should any alteration be made in the line of road.

1st. The possibility of a road being opened from Dongery Bunder or Caranjah to near Chowke.

2nd. The same contingency with regard to Trombay.

11. Any further information on the subject may be obtained on application to the Post Master General.

Tenders for the same period for the conveyance of the Public Mails and Bhangies between the General Post Office in the Fort, and Panwell (entrance of Panwell river so soon as a road is completed) to and from, are also invited. They must specify the time in the fair and monsoon seasons, and be subject to all the conditions of the above advertisement. Separate offers will be received, or for both water and land conveyance conjointly.

May 1822. } provisions of the orders quoted in the margin.

2. To Horse Artillery and Cavalry Officers, for the loss of a Charger selected from the Ranks or Remounts of their respective Corps, a compensation equal to the price they would have been entitled to receive on returning such a Charger to the ranks, vizt. the residue of the original price, after a deduction of 10 per cent per annum, for the period that may have elapsed since the date of selection.

3. To all Mounted Officers, for the loss of a Charger, under the provisions of the orders before quoted, not selected from the ranks, and purchased at a price not exceeding 800 Surat Rupees, a compensation equal to the residue of the price actually paid, after a similar deduction of 10 per cent per annum, for the period elapsed since the date of purchase.
