THE 24th JUNE, 1839.

The following Draft of a proposed Act was read in Council for the first time on the 24th June, 1839 :
ACT No. — of 1839.

I. It is hereby enacted, that from the day of 1839, Act XXIII. of 1836 shall be

repealed, and that from and after Criminal Justice, as well as those for the collection of the Revenue, shall cease to have effect, except as hereinafter mentioned, within the undermentioned tracts of Country at present included in the districts of Ganjam and Vizagapatam :

cription within the tracts of Country specified in the foregoing Section, which are now included in the District of Ganjam, shall be vested in the Collector of Ganjam, and those which are now included in the District of Vizagapatam, in the Collector of Vizagapatam, and shall be exercised by them respectively as Agents to the Governor of Fort St. George.

IV. And it is hereby enacted, that it shall be competent to the Governor in Council of Fort St. George, by an Order in Council, to prescribe such rules as he may deem proper for the guidance of such Agents, and to their control and supervision of the Agents in Civil Suits shall be final, and in what Suits an appeal shall lie to the Sudder Adawlut, and to define the authority to be exercised by the Agents in Criminal Trials, and what cases he shall submit for the decision of the Foudjaree Adawlut.

V. And it is hereby enacted, that upon the receipt of any Criminal trials referred by either of the Agents under the Rules, which may be hereafter prescribed by the Governor in Council, the Foudjaree Adawlut shall, without submitting the proceedings for the Futwah of their Law Officers, proceed to pass a final judgment, or such other order, as may, after mature consideration, seem to the Court requisite and proper, in the same manner as if the trial had been sent up in ordinary course from a Judge on Circuit.

VI. And it is hereby enacted, that upon the receipt of any appeal from a decree of either of the Agents, under the rules to be prescribed as aforesaid, the Court of Sudder Adawlut, shall proceed to try and determine it in the same manner as appeals from the Provincial Courts.

VII. And it is hereby enacted, that each of such Agents as aforesaid shall have the power of making Commitments by warrant under their respective hands, which is possessed by the Governor of Fort St. George in Council by virtue of Regulation II. of 1819 of the Madras Code, provided that the third, fourth, fifth, sixth and seventh Sections of that Regulation shall remain in force and be applicable to Commitments under this Act. Provided also, that in every case in which either of such Agents shall make any such commitment, he shall transmit immediately a report to the Governor in Council of Fort St. George for his orders.

VIII. And it is hereby enacted, that it shall be competent to the Governor in Council of Fort St. George, by an Order in Council, to make, from time to time, with the previous sanction of the Governor

III. And it is hereby enacted, that the Administration of Civil and Criminal Justice, (including the superintendence of the Police,) and the collection and superintendence of the Revenues of every des-

THE 24TH JUNE, 1839.

The following Draft of a proposed Act was read in Council for the first time on the 24th June 1839—
ACT No.—of 1839.

I. It is hereby enacted, that from the 1839, the following rules shall be in force with respect to Vessels belonging to any of Her Majesty's subjects residing within the Presidency of Madras and employed on the Coasts of the Territories subject to the Government of Madras or in Trading Coast-wise.

II. And it is hereby enacted, that every such Vessel employed as aforesaid, shall be marked or branded with the name of the place to which she belongs, and also with the number assigned for the same, by the Officer authorized to make such registry as is hereinafter mentioned, and the Owner or Owners of such Vessel employed as aforesaid shall cause such name and number to be painted in black paint upon a white ground, on each quarter of such Vessel employed as aforesaid, in English figures and letters, each figure and letter being six inches in length.

III. And it is hereby enacted, that the name and number of every such Vessel employed as aforesaid, and her burthen, and also the name or names of the Owner or Owners thereof, shall be registered in a book, to be kept for that purpose by the person hereinafter directed to make such registry. At Madras such registry shall be made by the Master Attendant, and at other places within the said Territories, by such other person as shall be appointed by the Government of Madras to act at such places respectively in the execution of this Act: and whenever any change shall take place in the burthen of such Vessel employed as aforesaid, or in the name or names of the Owner or Owners thereof, the same shall be made again: provided, however, that it shall not be lawful to give any name to such Vessel employed as aforesaid, other than that by which she was first registered.

IV. And it is hereby enacted, that the Owner or Owners of every such vessel employed as aforesaid, shall apply to the person authorized to make such registry in respect of the same, in order to have such registry as aforesaid made, or in order to have such registry made again as aforesaid. And whenever such Vessel employed as aforesaid is registered at a subordinate Port, information thereof, and of the number there assigned to her, shall immediately be given by the registering Officer to the Master Attendant at Madras.

V. And it is hereby enacted, that the duty of marking or branding, and of ascertaining the burthen of such Vessels employed as aforesaid, at Madras, shall be performed by the Master Attendant: and at all other places within the Territories subject to the Government of Madras, the duty of marking or branding, and of ascertaining the burthen of such Vessels employed as aforesaid, shall be performed by such other persons as shall be appointed by the Government of Madras to act at such places respectively in the execution of this Act. And the Master Attendant or other person duly appointed for the purpose of ascertaining the burthen of such Vessels shall observe the following Rule. Measure the deck, or over the beam between the after part of the stem and forepart of the stern posts. The inside breadths or the underside of the upper deck, or under the beam at the middle point of the length. The depth, from the underside of the upper deck or the upper surface of the beam to the bottom of the vessel. Multiply these three dimensions together, and divide the product by 130, and the quotient will be the amount of the registered burthen of the vessel.

VI. And it is hereby enacted, that the Owner or Owners of every such Vessel employed as aforesaid, shall apply for and obtain a certificate of Registry from the person authorized to make such Registry from the person authorized to make such Registry as aforesaid, and such certificate shall be in the form specified in the Schedule appended to this Act; and in the case of any certificate being lost or destroyed, a renewed certificate may be obtained in the same manner, and on payment of the fees hereinafter mentioned.

VII. And it is hereby enacted, that such certificate of Registry shall be sealed with the Seal of the East India Company, and shall be signed by the person authorized to make such Registry.

VIII. And it is hereby enacted, that such certificate shall be issued to every Vessel employed as aforesaid, from the date of the expiration of the pass she is now furnished with:—the Registrations with respect to Fishing Vessels and Harbour Craft, to take effect from the

IX. And it is hereby enacted, that the Owner or Owners of such Vessels, employed as aforesaid, on being registered as aforesaid, shall pay—

For each certificate of Registry for a Vessel not exceeding two garce of 9000 lb. burthen, the fee of 1 Rupee.

For each certificate for a Vessel exceeding 2 garce burthen, and not exceeding 6 garce burthen, 5 "

For each certificate for a Vessel exceeding 6 garce burthen, and not exceeding 25 garce burthen, 7 "

And for each certificate for a Vessel of 100 Tons, or greater burthen, per Ton 2 Annas.

X. And it is hereby enacted, that the person or persons so authorized to make such Registry as aforesaid, shall receive the fees payable for the same, and shall pay such fees to such Officer as the Governor in Council of Fort St. George shall appoint; the same to be carried to the credit of the Government of Madras.

XI. And it is hereby enacted, that the Owner or Owners or Commander of every such vessel employed as aforesaid, shall produce, on demand thereof by any officer of the Customs within the said Territories, or by the Master Attendant of any Port, the certificate so directed to be applied for and obtained, in respect of such Vessel employed as aforesaid.

XII. And it is hereby enacted, that in case any such Vessel employed as aforesaid, shall not be so directed; or in case the name and number of any such Vessel employed as aforesaid shall not be so painted, or shall not continue so painted; or such Vessel employed as aforesaid, in all respects as hereinbefore directed; or in case any such Vessel employed as aforesaid shall not be furnished with such certificate as hereinbefore specified, or in case the Owner or Owners or Commander of any such Vessel employed as aforesaid shall not produce such certificate on demand thereof as hereinbefore directed; the Owner or Owners of every such Vessel employed as aforesaid, shall be subject to a fine of ten times the amount of the fees payable in respect of the certificate of registry of such Vessel, which fine may be recovered on conviction before any Magistrate, or Justice of the Peace, having jurisdiction within the said territories by sale of such Vessel, her furniture, ammunition, tackle and apparel, and such fine shall be payable as often as the Owner or Owners or Commander of any such Vessel employed as aforesaid, shall make such default as aforesaid, provided every such subsequent default be made after the expiration of one month from the date of the last conviction.

XIII. And it is hereby enacted, that the Governor in Council of Fort St. George may direct compensation for trouble and diligence in seizing such Vessel employed as aforesaid, guns, furniture, tackle, ammunition and apparel as last mentioned, to be made out of the proceeds of such seizure, to the person or persons who shall have seized the same, to such amount, in such manner, and in such shares or proportions, as to the said Governor in Council shall seem meet.

XIV. And it is hereby enacted, that any Owner or Commander of any such Vessel employed as aforesaid, who shall counterfeit, erase, alter or falsify any such Certificate as aforesaid, or shall wilfully make use of any Certificate so counterfeited, erased, altered or fal-

sified, or upon such demand as aforesaid, shall wilfully produce as and for the Certificate belonging to any such Vessel as aforesaid, a Certificate belonging to any other Vessel, shall be liable, on conviction before any Magistrate or Justice of the Peace, to a fine of 1000 Rupees.

The following Act is passed by the Hon'ble the President of the Council of India in Council on the 1st July 1839, with the assent of the Right Hon'ble the Governor General of India, which has been read and recorded.

Ordered, that the Act be promulgated for general information.

ACT No. XVII. OF 1839,

I. It is hereby enacted, in modification of so much of Sections VI and XIV of Act No. XVII of 1837, as provides that Postage duties shall be levied at the rates set forth in Schedules A and B appended to the said Act, that it shall be competent to the Governor General of India in Council, by an order and notice to be published in the Government Gazettes of the several Presidencies of India, to authorize the levy of Postage duties at rates different from those severally specified in the Schedules A and B annexed to Act XVII. 1837, and to publish revised Schedules from time to time to give effect to such modifications; provided always there be no increase made thereby in any particular of the rates prescribed in the said Schedules A and B; and likewise to fix the time when the levy shall commence to be made at such modified rates, and to cancel or modify any order and notice so issued by further similar order and notice, and the said revised Schedules of rates shall, for so long as may be so ordered and notified, be of the same effect and validity as the Schedules annexed to the said Act.

No. 401 of 1839.—The Honorable the Governor in Council has perused with great satisfaction, reports of the proceedings of a Field Detachment under the Command of Captain Apthorp, K. I. C., of the 20th Regiment Native Infantry, and composed of the details noted in the margin, * in quelling disturbances which have recently occurred in the Mahee Caunta.

On one occasion, a detachment of the 14th Regiment Native Infantry, commanded by Captain Hutt, attacked and dispersed with considerable loss, a body of Insurgents strongly posted in the Damode Hills, and on another occasion Captain Apthorp, after a forced march of 35 miles, succeeded in apprehending some of the principal persons concerned in these disturbances.

The Governor in Council requests that Captain Apthorp will accept himself, and communicate to the Officers and Men under his command, the thanks of Government for their conduct whilst engaged on his service.

No. 402 of 1839.—Lieutenant C. W. Prother of the 4th Regiment Native Infantry, Acting Adjutant to the Native Veteran Battalion, is directed to re-join his Regiment.

No. 403 of 1839.—The Hon'ble the Governor in Council is pleased to direct, that the following General Order by the Right Hon'ble the Governor in Council at Fort St. George, dated the 5th instant, be read on Parade to every Regiment under this Presidency.

Fort St. George, 5th July 1839.

No. 102 of 1839.—The Hon'ble the Governor in Council at Bombay having communicated to this Government the high sense entertained by His Honor in Council of the gallant conduct displayed by a Havildar's Guard of the 18th Regiment of Native Infantry, in defence of the Treasury at Malwan, when attacked by a large party of Armed Marauders on the 23rd of March last, and having recommended that the Havildar, Naik and Sepoys who composed the Guard, shall receive some suitable marks of approbation for the persevering bravery with which they defended their Post; the Right Hon'ble the Governor in Council has much pleasure in directing the publication in General Orders of the circumstances which led to this result. It appears that a body of about 150 Men, of whom 40 were Armed with Matchlocks, the remainder with Swords and other Weapons, advanced stealthily upon the Post at Malwan, at 3 A. M. on the 23rd March last. Having first entered the Sepoy Lines, they there found Havildar Venkataputty and Sepoy Venketaswamy, the former received a mortal wound, the Sepoy having refused to point out the situation of the Collector's house and Treasury, was tied to a tree, very severely wounded and there left. The attack upon the Treasury was then commenced, and continued till after day light. Mr. W. Courtney, the Assistant Magistrate, was present at the station, and in addition to the Havildar's Guard, a Naik and 6 Sebundies assisted in the defence, while their ammunition (10 rounds) lasted. No impression was made upon the Post and three distinct and determined charges having been repelled by the heavy fire, from the small Guard, the assailants fled. Their loss was ascertained in the course of the day to amount to 16 killed, 20 wounded, and 107 Prisoners. That of the brave defenders of the Post was two killed, and two wounded including the casualties in the lines.

The Right Hon'ble the Governor in Council is pleased, in consideration of the gallant service performed on the above occasion, to promote Havildar Mahomed Esoph, General Number 142, to be a Jemedar, to take rank from the 23rd of March last, and to be borne Supernumerary until absorbed by a Vacancy in the 18th Regiment Native Infantry. His Lordship in Council is gratified to learn that Naik Mahomed Sahib and Sepoy Venketaswamy have since been advanced regimentally to the rank respectively of Havildar and Naik. The Governor in Council is further pleased to direct, that in whatever way they may become Casualties, except by discharge or dismissal from the Service, the regulated Pension of the rank to which they may have severally attained, shall be granted to the nearest heirs of the above named Jemedar, Havildar and Naik,

as well as to those of the whole of the Sepoys present on that occasion, whose names are contained in the sub-joined list.
