FORT WILLIAM,

THE 28TH October, 1839.

The following Draft of a proposed Act was read in Council for the first time on the 28th October . 1839.

ACT No .--of 1839.

An Act concerning the allowance of Interest in certain cases.

Whereas it is expedient to extend to the territories under the Government of the East India Company, as well within the Jurisdiction of Her Majesty's Courts as elsewhere, the provisi-ons of the Statute 3d and 4th William IV Chapter 42, Section 28, concerning the allowance of interest in certain cases:

It is, therefore, hereby enacted, that upon all debts or sums certain payable a? a certain time or otherwise, the Court before which such debts or sums may be recovered, may, if it shall think fit, allow interest to the creditor at a rate not exceeding the current rate of interest from the time when such debts or sums certain were payble, if such debts or sums be payble by virtue of some written Instrument at a certain time, or if payable etherwise, then from the time when demand of payment shall have been made in writing, so as such demand shall give notice to the debtor that interest'will be claimed from the date of such demand until the term of payment; provided that interest shall be payble in all cases in which it is new payble by law.

Ordered that the Dratt now read be published for general information.

Ordered that the said Draft be reconsidered at the first Meeting of the Legislative Conned of India after the 28th day of December next.

3rd. The Gram to be unexceptionable and of the quality and description usually for-

nished to the Monated Corps at Poona and Kirkee, and to be delivered free of all expense to Government on account of Carriage &ca. at the Commissariat Stores at those stations; in case of any dispute, the opinion of a Committee to decide the point and to be final.

4th. A supply of not less than one month's consumption during the fair season and of three months during the monsoon, to be constantly kept up at the Commissariat Stores above men-

tioned.

5th. To prevent disputes hereafter, it is to be distinctly understood, that the provisions of the contract are only intended to extend to the demands made at Poona and Kirkee, but in the event of any of the Cavalry marching, it will be optional with the Commissariat Officer to take one month's Gram, or not, for their use while on march, and the contractor

will not be liable for any greater demand.
6th. The contractor will be required to
make a Cash deposit of Rupees (1,000) One thousand, and to furnish unexceptionable Security in the further sum of Rupees (10,000) Ten thousand, for the due and punctual per-

formance of his engagement.

7th. Payment for Supplies according to the quantity issued in the preceding month, will be made in the following month, on the requisite Vouchers being produced.

8th No reason will be assigned for the

rejection of any offer.
