#### POLITICAL DEPARTMENT.

The following engagement for the suppression of the Slave Trade in the Persian Gulf. entered into with the British Government, by each of the four following Maritime Arabian Chiefs, in the month of July last, is published for general information, namely:-

Shark Khulcefa of Aboothabee. Shaik Mukhtoom of Debay. Shaik Abdoolla of Amul-gaveen, and Shaik Sultan bin Suggur of Raselkhymah.

"I do hereby declared, that I bind and " pleged myself to the British Government in

" the following engagement :

"First.—That the Government Cruizers, "whenever they may meet any Vessel be-longing to myself or my Subjects, beyond a " direct line drawn from Cape Delgado, pass-"ing two degrees Seaward of the Island of "Socotra, and ending at Cape Guadel, and "shall suspect that such Vessel is engaged

"in the Slave Trade, the said Cruizers are permitted to detain and search it.

" Second .. - Should it on exmamination be " proved that any Vessel belonging to myself "or my Subjects is carrying Slaves, whether "Men, Women or Children, for sale, beyond "the aforesaid line, then the Government " Cruizers shall seize and confiscate such Ves-" sel and her Cargo. But if the aforesaid "Vessel shall pass beyond the aforesaid line, " owing to stress of weather or other case of " necessity, not under control, then she shall " not be seized.

"Third .- As the selling of Males and Females, whether grown up or young, who are 'Hoor' or Free, is contrary to the Mahome-"dan Religion, and whereas the Soomalee

"Tribe is included in the 'Ahrar' or Free, "I do hereby agree that the sale of Males "and Females, whether young or old, of the "Soomalce Tribe, shall be considered as Pi-"racy, and that after four months from this "date all those of my People convicted of "being concerned in such an act, shall be " punished the same as Pirates". .

BOMBAY CASTLE, 5th DECEMBER 1839.

No. 645 of 1839.—An Order by Major Sandwith, dated the 24th ultimo, appointing Lieutenant T. R. Stewart, to act as Adjutant to the 8th Regiment Native Infantry, during the absence of Lieutenant Cristall on special duty, is confirmed.

No. 646 of 1839.—The Governor in Council is pleased to publish for information the following Extract, para, 6th of the Hon'ble Court's Letter, dated 28th August last, in the Political Department.

6th. We feel satisfied that Major Paul was wholly unconscious of having treated this unfortunate Native, in any way calculated to cause his death, or to inflict upon him any serious bodily harm. But in the dispute which gave rise to the assault, he was clearly in the wrong, since the deceased being a Chokeydar, was under no obligation to act as a Guide, and even if the case had been different, we cannot Chokeyear, was under no obligation to act as a Guide, and even it the case had been different, we cannot too strongly discountenance the practice of compelling the Natives by personal violence to render Services (whether Obligatory on them or not) to Buropeans; we have repeatedly expressed and enforced our intention of dismessing from the Company's Service "every Officer who shall be proved to have been guilty of cruelty to any Native either by violently and illegally beating, or otherwise maltreating him" and we have desired the Local Governments to be very particular in bringing to our notific every instance of that kind that may occur. Under the circumstances above explained, and in consideration of the long period which have allowed these orders in the present case. which has clapsed since the date of the occurrence, we shall not enforce those orders in the present case, but we desire that Major Paul be informed, that he has incurred our very severe displeasure, and that any recurrence of similar misconduct on his part, would infallibly entail Dismissal from our Service.
