## FORT WILLIAM.

The 28th January, 1839.
The following Draft of a proposed Aet was read in Council for the first time on the 28th January, 1839.

## Act No.

of 1839 A.
I. The existiug Charter of the Bank of Bengal having been found in many respects inconvenient and imperfect, the Members of the said Corporation have by their Directors applied to the Governor General of Endia in Council for the amendment thereof, by a new Charter or Act of Incorporation, tendering the surrender thereupon of the said Charter, and the Governor General in Council having assented to such surrender, and to the continuance of the said Corporation as hereinafter declared;-It is hereby enacted, that from the 1st day of May next after the passing of this Act the Charter of the said Bank of Bengal, bearing date the 29th May 1823, and the Acts No. X IX. of 1836 and No. XXIV. of 1838 relating thereto, shall respectively cease to have effect; and the same are hereby from that day cancelled, save as to such particulars as are herein mentioned or referred to.
II. And it is hereby enacted, that the persons who at the time of the determination of the said Charter and Act aforesaid shall, under the provisions of the said Charter and Acts, be the Proprietors of the Capital Stock of the said Bank oi Bengal, shall notwithstanding the determination of the said Charter and Acts continue to be a corporation, body corporate and politic by the name of the Bank of Bengal with perpetual suc, cession to them and their successive Proprietors for the time being of the said Bank as hereinatter mentioned, and to possess and enjoy all the rights, privileges and immunities incident by law to a corporation aggregate.
III. And it is hereby enacted, that all property and securities for property, claims and demands whatsoeven now vested in, or held by the said Bank of Bengal, under and by virtue of the said Charter and Acts, shall immediately on the determination of the said Charter, devolve
on and become rested and continued in the Bank of Bengal, so continued and incorporated by this Act as aforesaid, and that the said Bank of Bengal so continued and incorporated as aforesaid slall be subject to all debts, demands, claims and liabalities outstanding against the sad Bank at the time of stoch determination of its said Charter as aforesaid, and that no suit or proceeding at Law or in Equity then penting shall cease or abate in consequence of such determination of the said present Charter, and of such renewal and continuance of the said Bank by virtue of this Act.
IV. And it is herely enacted, that the said Bank so renewed and continu dhall, and may sue and be sued by its corporate name aforesaid, and shall and may have and use such common seal as the Directors of the said Bauk shall from time to time appoint, and shall be competent to acquire and hold either absolutely or conditionally, for a term or in perpetuity, any description of property whatever, and to transfer and convey the same.
V. And it is hereby enacted, that the Capital Stock of the said Bank as constituted under the said present Charter and Acts, shall on the determination of the same by virtue of this Act continue to be the Capital Stock of the said Bank so renewed and continued as aforesaid, provided however, that it shall be in the power of the Governor General of India in Conncil from time to time, by resolution notified in the Calcutta Gazette, to authorize the said Capital Stock to be inereased, and to make such order and direction for the opening of subseriptions towards such increase of capital as to him may seem fit, giving due notice thereof to the Proprietors of the said Bank for the time being, and allowing to them a period of not less than twelve months to fill up such subscription themselves, and likewise to prescribe in what manner and form the Proprietors shall subscribe and pay into the said Bank the proportions of new Stock to which they may, respectively bo entitled, and to make such orter and direction as to him, the said Governor General in Council may seem fit for the disposal of the amount of new Stock that

- may not be subscribed for and paid up in the manner and form so prescribed.
VI. And whereas the Capital Stock of the said Bank which by the said Act No. XIX. of 3836, was fixed at 75 lakhs of Rnpees, divided into 1,875 Shares of 4,000 Rupees each, has by the Resolution of the President of the Council of India in Council, issued and notified to the Proprietors on the 17th October 1838, in conformity with Act No. XX1V. of 1838, been ordered to be increased by one-half, and whereas a book is now open for subscriptions, and payment is now being made of such increased capital in the manner and under the terms and conditions anthorized in the said Act No. XXIV of 1838 , and prescribed in the said order and notice of the President in Council, it is therefore hereby cnacted, that the Capital Stock of the said Bank shall on the said 1st May next, when this Act shall take effect for the re-incorporation of the said l3ank, consist of the said sum of seventy fire lakhs of Company's Rupees, togethet with such further amount as shall on that date have been subseribed and paid into the Bank of Bengal under the order and notice referred to, and the further subscriptions and payments of Capital authorized and ordered as above mentioned shall continue to be received in the manner provided in the said order and notice of the President in Council, and shall be added to the Capital Stock of the Bank as received, accordingly as is prescribed in the said order passed under the authority of the said Act, and the Capital Stock held by the Bank of Bengal on the said 1st May next, together with the further Capital that may be subseribed and paid up as above after that date, slall be divided into shares of 4,000 Rupees each, or into quarter shares of 1,000 Rupees each in the manner declared and provided by Act No. XIX. of 1836 , and the shares of the said Capital that may be then registered in the hame of the Governor General of India in Conncil, shall be the property of the said Governor General of India in Council for the time being on behalf of the East India Company, together with any new shares or quarter shares for which subscription may be made on uccount thereof, under the option reserved to the said Guvernor General of India in Council to that effect in the said order and notice, and the shares and quarter shares registered as belonging to individual Proprietors shall continue to be the property of such Proprietors, and the said Proprietors shall respectively be in the proportion of their several interests Proprietors of the Bauk of Bengal as re-incorporated by this Act; and slall hold and enjoy in respect to their several shares and interests the same precise rights and privileges, as regards the subscription to fresh Stock under the order and notice referred to, as they would have done if the Bank of Bengal had continued under the Charter and Acts referred to, the re-incorporation of the said Bank by this Act notwithstanding.
VII. And it is hereby enacted, that no Proprietor shall be allowed to increase his share in the Capital Stock of the said Bank beyond the amount of one lakh and sixty thousand Rupees, excepting on occasion of any increase being made to the Capital Stock of the said Bank under the authority of the Governor General in Conncil, in the manner preseribed in Section V. in which case any Proprictor holding Stock to the full amount of one lakh and sixty thousand liupees, shall notwithstanding be entitled to subscribe to the increased Capital Stock in a rateable proportion; and excopting any addition to lis interest in the said Capital Stock arises from succession, bequest or marriage.

VlII. And it is hereby enacted, that a certificate signed by threc Directors of the said

Bank shall be delivered to the Proprietor or Proprietors of all the said shares of the Capital Stock of the said Bank, upon demand made by the holder of such share, and that any person who is a Proprictor of more than one such share, may at his option demand a certificate for each of his shares, or one certificate for all his shares, or several certificates, each of which may be for any number of his shares.
IX. And it is hereby enacted, that the said share or shares of the Capital Stock of the said Bank shall be of the nature of personal estate of the Proprictors thereof respectively, and that the same shall be transferable by endorsement to be made on such certilicates thereof respectively, under the hand of the Proprietor or Proprictors, or his, her, or their Attorniesduly authorized, which endorsement shall specify the name of the person or persons to whom the said transter shall be made, provided that no such endorsement shall be effectual to transfer any such share or shares until such endorsement shall have been registered at the Bank of Bengal, and such registration shall have been noted on such endorsement under the hand of an Dificer appointed for that purpose by the Directors of the said Rank.
X. And it is hereby enacted, that the said corporate body, so renewed and continued as aforesaid, shall consist and be composed of the registered Proprictors for the time being of the said shares of the Capital Stock of the said Bank, and of no other person or persons whatsoever.
XI. And it is hereby enacted, that the business of the said Bank shall be managed by nine Directors, of whom three shall be appointed and removeable by the Governor General of - India in Council, and the remaining six slall be olected by a General Meeting of the Proprietors of the said Bank, and removeable by vote of the majority of a General Mcetirfs of the said Proprietors.
XII. And it is hereby enacted, that the persons who, at the time of such determination of the said present Charter and Acts as aforesaid, shall be Directors of the said Bank, shall thereafter continue to be Directors of the said Bank so renewed and contiuued as aforesaid.
XIII. And it is hereby enacted, that two of the six Directors elected and to be elected by the said Proprietors, shall in rotation go out of officenon the second Monday in the month of December in every year, on which day in every year a General Meeting of Proprietors shall be held for the election of two Directors in their stead-provided always, that any Director going out by rotation as aforesaid may not be re-elected at the election which takes place thereupon -provided also, that the rotation existing at the time of such determination as aforesaid of the said present Charter and Acts, shall continue to be ubserved.
XIV. Andit is hereby enacted, that in case of the death, resignation, or absence from Calcutta for more than three months, or removal as aforesaid of any Directors elected or to be elected by the said Proprietors, the Directors shall call a General Meeting of the Proprietors to bo lield within fifteen days, for the purpose of chusing a successor, and such successor shall come into the same place in the rotation abovementioned in which the Director was.
XV. And it is hereby enacted, that no porson shall be capable of serving as a Director by election of the said Proprietors who shall not be Proprietor in his own right, and unincumbered of three shares or 12,000-Rupees of the Capital Stock of the Bank of Bengal, or who shall be a Director of any other Bank issuing Notes payable on demand within the Town or Suburbs of Calcutta.
XVI. And it is hereby enacted, that at Goneral Meetings of the Proprictors every elec.
tion and other matter in question shall be decided by a majority of votes, and that no person shall be allowed to vote at any such Meeting in respect of any share of the said Capital Stock acquired by transfer, or purchase or otherwise than by act of law, anless such transfer shall have been completed six months at the least before the time of tendering such vote.
XVII. And it is hernby enacted, that at all such General Meetings tho Proprietors shall vote according to the following scale.

Share of 4,000 Rs. shall entitle to 1 vote.

and no Proprietor shall be entitled to more than scren voles.
XVIII. And it is hereby enacted, that it shall be lawful for the Governor General of India in Council to give a proxy in writing, signed by one of the Secretaries to Government, to any person whom the Governor General may appoint to attend any General Meeting of the Proprictors, and that the holder of such proxy shall be entitled to give seven votes upon all matters or questions that may be submitted to such Meeting, excepting upon the election or removal of such Directors as are elected by the said Proprietors.
XIX. And it is hereby enacted, that any Proprictor or Proprictors entitled to vote at any General Meeting may give a proxy in writing, either General or Special, under his, her, or their hand, or the hand of his, her, or their attorney, duly authorized, to any other Proprietor, and that such proxy shall be produced at the time of voting, and that such proxy shall entithe the person to whom it is given, to vote on such matters as shall be authorized by the tenor of such proxy.
XX. And it is hereby enacted, that at the first Mecting of the Directors in every year, they shall choose a President from among themselves, and if the office of President shall become vacant, they shall at their next Meeting choose a successor for the remainder of the current year, and that during any vacancy or in the absence of the President, the senior Director shall be Vice-President for the time, and that such President or Vice-President shall have the casting vote in all cases of an equal division of votes at Meetings either of Directors or Proprictors.
XXI. And it is hereby enacted, that the presence of at least three Directors shall be necessary to form a board for the transaction of business, and the said Directors shall establish a weekly rotation among themselves, so that not less then three Directors may attend every Meeting of Directors, provided always, that nothing herein contained shall be held to prechude any Director from attending any Meeting of Directors.
XXII. And it is hereby enacted, that all accounts of the said Bank, and all instruments not under seal, whereby the said Bank can in any manner be bound, except the Cash Notes of the Bank, shall be signed by three Directors and shall be of no validity unless sosigned, and that the seal of the said Bank shall not be affixed to any instrument except ia the presence of three Directors who shall sign their names in the instrument in token of their presence, and that such signing shall be independent of the signing of any person who may sign the instrument as a witness, and that unless so signed by three Directors such instrument shall be of no validity.
XXIII. And it is hereby enacted, that the said Directors shall have power to appoint such Oflicers as may be necessary to conduct the bu?
siness of the said Bank, and to remove any OM. cer of the said Bank, and to fix the salaries of such Officers, provided that the whole expense of the establishment of the said Bank shall not in any one year exceed 60,000 Rupees, without previous authority from the Generat Meeting of the Proprietors.
XXIV. And it is hereby enacted, that no person who shall hold the office of Secretary, Treasurer, Head dccountant or Khazanchee of the Bank of Bengal, shall engage in any other commercial busiuess either on his own account, or as Agent for any other person or persons, or act as a Broker for the sale or purchase of Government Securities; and that every person appointed to any one or more of the said ofices shall give security to the Directors for the faithful discharge of his duty in the sum of 50,000 Rupees.
$X X V$. And it is hereby enacted, that the said Bank of Bengal shall not be engaged in any kind of business except the kinds of business hereinafter specilied, that is to say:

1. The Discounting of Negotiable Securities.
2. The keeping of Gash Accounts.
3. Buying and Selling of Bills of Exchange payable in India.
4. The leading of Money on short loans.
5. The Buying and Selling of Bullion.
6. The receiving of Deposits.
7. The issurng and circulating of Cash Notes and Bank lost Bills.
8. The selling of Property or Securities deposited in the Bank as security for loans and not redeemed, or of Property or Securities recovered by the Bank, in satisfaction of debts and claims.
XXVI. And it is hereby enacted, that the Directors of the said Bank shall discount no Negotiable Security, and make no loan unless the amount of cash in possession of the said Bank and immediately available, shall be equal to at least one-fourth of all the claims against the said Bank, outstanding for the time being, and payable on demand.
XXVII. And it is hereby enacted, that the Directors of the said Bank of Bengal shall not discount any Negotiable Securities which shall have a longer period to run than three months, or lend any money for a longer period than three months, and that they shall make no loan or advance on any Bank Share or Cortificate of Shares, nor on mortgage, or in any other manne: on the security of any Lands, Houses, or inmoveable property, nor on any Negotiable Security of any individual or partnership firm, which shall not carry on it the several responsibilities of at least two persons or firms unconnected with each other in general partuership, nor be in advance at one and the same time to any individual or partnership firm, either by way of discount, loan, orin any other manner (saving by loans upon the deposit of Government Securities) or Guods not perishable as hereinafter mentioned) beyond the amount of three Lakhs of Company's Rupees. Provided always, that advances upon Bills of Exchange accepted by the Government, or upon other Government Obligations shall not be considered as an advance within the meaning of this restriction.
XXVIII. And it is hereby enacted, that the Directors of the said Bank shall make no loan other than such loans as are described in the clause next preceding, except on deposit of Public Securities to the full amount of the loan, and which Public Securities shall be so endorsed as to put them at the absolute disposal of tho said Bank of Bengal, or on deposit of Coods, not of a perishable nature, and of estimated value exceeding the amount of the loan by at least one-fourth.
XXIX. And it is hereby enacted, that the said Bank shall not be at any time in advance to the Ciovernment more than seven Laklis and a half of Company's Rupees, provided always that the holding of Government Securities or of Bills of Exchange drawn upon the Government, or of other Government Acceptances or obligations derived to the said Bank from individuals and not overdue, shall not be construed as being in advance to the Government within the meaning of this clause.
XXX. And it is hereby enacted, that the Directors of the said Bank of Bengal shall not sufferany person or persons, or body corporate, keeping cash with the said Bank of Bengal to overdraw his, her, or their account.
XXXI. And it is hereby enacted, that the said Bank of Bengal may issue Promissory Notos, payable cither on demand or at a date not exceeding thirty days after sight, which Notes shall, and may be signed on behalf of the said Bank by such persons as the Directors of the said Bank may appoint or authorize in that behalf, provided always, that the total amount of such Notes in circulation at any one time shall not exceed two Crores of Rupees, and provided also that no such Note shall be for a smaller amount than ten Rupees.
XXXII. And it is hereby enacted, that it shall not be lawful for the said Bank to make, issue or hegotiate any Note, Bill or other instrument containing any promise, undertaking or order for the payment of money elsewhere than within the limits of India.
XXXIII. And it is hereby enacted, that it shall be lawful for the Directors of the said Bank of Bengal to receive in deposit Goods not of a perishable kind, and to contract for the safe keeping of the same.
XXXIV. And it is hereby enacted, that the Directors of the said Bank shall cause the books of the said Bank to be balanted on the 30th day of June, and the 31st of December in every year, and that a settlement of the balance on every such day, signed by a majority of the said Directors, shall be forthwith transmitted to one of the Secretaries to the Governor General of India in Council, and that the Governor General of India in Council shall at all times be entitled to require of the said Directors any information touching the affairs of the Bank, and the production of any documents of the said Bank, and that the said Directors shall comply with every such requisitions.
XXXV. And it is hereby enacted, that an account of the profits of the said Bank shall be taken half yearly on the 1st day of January and the 1st day of July in every year, an. I that a dividend thercof shail be made so soon thereafter as onveniently may be, and that the amount of such dividend shall be determined by the Directors of the said Bank, on the ground of the actual profits made by the said Bank during the six calendar months preceding the day up to which such half yearly account shall be taken, provided that tho said Directors, subject to the control and sanction of the Proprietors at their General Meetings, shall have power when they see fit to set apart from such profits a sum not exceeding five per cent on the Capital stock of the Bank as a reserve against contingencies.
XXXVI. And it is hereby enacted, that on the first Monday of the month of August in every year, a General Meeting of the Proprietors of the Capital Stock of the said Bank shall be held,
at which the Directors of the said Bank shall submit to the said Proprictors a statement of affairs of the said Bank, made up to the preceding 30th of Jume, and such General Meeting slaill be competent to pass resolutions, and frame rulos and directions relative to the affairs and conduct of the said Bank, which shall be binding on the Directors and Officers of the Bank, and on the Proprietors thereof, until rescinded or modified respectively by any subsequent General Meeto ing.
XXXVII. And it is hereby enacted, that any three Directors of the said Directers of the said Bank, or any ten Proprictors of the Capital Stock of the said Bank, may at any time convene a General Meeting of the Proprietors upon giving fifteen days previous notice of such Meeting, and of the purpose or purposes for which the same shall be conrened, as well to the Directors of the said Bank for the time being, as also by public advertisement in the Calcutta Gazette.
XXXVIII. And it is hereby cnacted, that it shall be lawful for the Bank of Bengal, with the sanction of the Governor General of India in Council, to establish Branch Banks at such places and under such rules and restrictious as shall be determined by the Proprietors at their General Meetings, provided however, that such Branch Banks when so established, besides being subject to the rules and restrictions that may be imposed by the Proprietors, and to the control and orders of the Directors of the Bank at Calcuta, shall be bound by the same rules as to the description of business in which they are to engage, and the manner of conducting such business, and likewise in respect to the issue of notes payable on demand and the retention of cash to meet the same, and in all transactions and matters herein above referred to, as are prescribed for the Bank of Bengal by this.Act.
XXXIX. And it is further enacted, that if any of the said Proprietors shall become indebted to the said Bank, it shall be lawful for the said Bank to withhold pajment of the dividends on the share or shares of such Proprietor registered as his or her own property, and not as held in trust. or as exccuior, or administrator, until payment of such debt, and to apply such dividends towards payment thereof, and that after demand and default of payment and uotice in that behalf given either to such Proprietor or his or her constituted Agent, or by public advertisement in the Calcutta Gazette, it shall be lawful for the said Bank to refuse registration of the transfer of any such share or shares of such Proprietor, until payment of such debt, and if the stme shall remain unpaid for the space of six months after such notice, to advertise for public sale, and to sell such share or shares or so many as may be necessary, and to apply the proceeds thereof towards payment of such debt with interest, at the rate of six per cent per annum, paying over the surplus, if any, to such Proprietors or to his or her lawful representative.
X L. And it is further enacted, that the said Fank shall contiune as hereby constituted until the lst day of May, which will be in the Year of Our Lord 1846, and shall thereafter continue in like manner until duly dissolved or modified, provided however, that after the said 1st day of May 1846, the said Bank shall yot, except upon the application or by the consent of the said bank bo dissolved, or anywisemodified without provious notice of twelve months at the least being given
to the Directors of the said Bank for the time
being of such intended dissolution or modification, provided also, that in the event of the said Bank at any time suspending any cash payments, the benefits granted to the said Bank by the present Act of incorporation shall be thenceforth forfeited.

Whereas it has been ordered by the Hou'ble Nourt of Directors of the East India Company, That an Actshall be prepared for incorporating a Bank at Bombay, on the same principles, and in the same form and manner as have been apgroved and sanctioned by the said Court, for the re-incorporation of the Bank already established at Calcutta, and called the Bank of Bengal, with a difference only in the amount of Capital Slook to be subscribed for and paid up by the Government and by the Proprietors respectively; and whereas it is further ordered and declared by the said Court of Directors, that when the provisions of the said Act shall have been adopted by the Proprietors to be incorporated thereby, and on condition that the amount of Capital be duly paid up, the Government of India is empowered and required without further reference to the said Court to carry the said Act into effect for incorporation of the said Bank at Bombay.

Resolved, that the following Draft of a proposed Act bo published for general information.
Acr vo-or 1839. B.
I. It is horeby enacted, that from the 1st May next ensuing, in the year of our Lord 1839, provided that before that date a sufficient namber of persons shall have subscribed and signed their acceptance of the terms of incorporation specified and declared by this Act, and provided that the amount of Capital Slock'subscribed by them respectirely, and to be subscribed by the Government of Bombay, on behali of the East India Company, shall have been paid up, or such proportion thereof shall have been realized as is hereinafter prescribed-the persons so subscribing, accepting and paying up their subseriptions shall, together with the Governor in Council, for the time being of the Island and Presidency of Bombay, be a corporation, body corporate and politic, by name of the Bank, of Bombay, with perpetral succession to them and their successors as Proprictors, for the time being of the said Bank as hereaftermentioned and provided, and shall possess and enjoy all the rights, prisileges, and immunities incident by Law to a corporation ag-gregate-and if the conditions above stated bo not fulfilled and completed on the said 1st May next ensuing, after the date of the passing of this Act, then it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council, of the Presidency of Bombay, so soon as it shall be certified to him that a sufficient number of persons have subscribed and signed their acceptance of the terms and conditions hereinunder prescribed, and that the proportion of the Capital Stock required is paid up and realized, to notify the same by public notice in
the Bombay Gazette, and the said persons so subscribing and paying as above, together with the Governor in Council shall, from the date of such notification be incorporated, and be a body corporate as ahove described, and the several provisions of this det shall from the said 1st May or from such date of incorporation as may be so notified, take full effect and he in force for the establishment of the said Bank of Bombay. :

1I. And it is herehy enaoted, that the Capital Stock of the said Bank of Bombay shall be Fifty Lakhs of Rupees, whereof the Governor in Council of Bombay for the time being shall on behalf of the East India Company be Proprietor of three lakhs of Rupees, provided however, that it shall be in the power of the Governor General of India in council from time to time, by an order duly published in the Gazettes of Calcutta and of Bombay, to authorize the said Capital Stock to be increased, and to make such order and direction for the opening of subseriptions towards such increase of Capital as to him may seem fit, giving due notice therefof to the Proprietors of the said Bank for the time being, and allowing to them a period of not less than twelve months to fill up such subscriotion themselves, and likewise to preseribe in what manner and form the Proprietors shall subscribe and pay into the said Bank the proportion of new Stock to which they may respectively be ontitled, and also to make such order and direction as to him the said Governor General in Council may seem fit for the disposal of the amount of new Stock that may not be subscribed for and paid up by the Proprietors in the manner and form that may be so prescribed.

IIL. And it is hereby enacted, that the Capital Stock of the Bank of Bqubay shall so long as it stall consist of fifty laklis of liupees be divided into 1250 shares of 4000 Kupees each, which shall be numbered from 1 to 1250 , and seventy tive of the said shares numbered from No. 1 to 75 shall be the property of the Governor in Council of Bombay, and the remainder numbered from No. 76 to 1250 shall be the property of the Proprietors who may subscribe and pay the same, and each of the said shares may be divided into quarter shares of 1000 Rupees each, but no separate interest or share in the Stock of the said Bank of less amount than 1000 Rupees shall be created or held by any Proprietor, and if at any time the Capital of the siad liank shall be increased, the new Stock added thereto shall in like manner be divided into shares of 4000 Rupees each, divisible into quartershares of 1000 Rupees, and no Proprictor shall be entitled to claim a share of such new Stock of less amount than one thousand Rupees.
IV. And it is hereby enacted, that for taking the subseriptions of intending Proprietors of the said Bank of Bombay a day shall be fised and notified to the public by the Governorin Council of Bombay, being not less than 20 days before the 1st of May 1839, whereon the privilege of subseribing for the Stock of the said Bank shall be publicly sold by an Officer of the Government of Bombay in the manner following.

The said amount of Stock must be paid to the person who may be appointed Secretary and Treasorer of the said Bank on the following dates: 1000 Rupees on or before the 1st May 1839-1000 Rupees on or before the 1st June 1839-1000 Rupees on or before the 1st July 1839, and the last 1000 Rupees on or before the 1st August 18:30-aud each payment as made shall be certified and inscribed on this certilicate with the receipt of the said Secretary of the lsank of Bombay; provided however, that in the event of non-payment of auy one of the said amounts on or before the date stated tho right to subscribe for the share No. of the Stock of the said Bank represented by this certificate shall be forfeited, together with any preminm or purchase money paid for the same, and the privilege shatl be resold in such manuer, and on such date as may be ordered by the Governor in Council of Bombay. The purchaser at such resalu after making good the amount of any Capital that may have been paid into the Secretary of the Bank of Bombay up to the date of resale, for refund to the original holder shall be entitled to subscribe and to become Proprietor in his room of the Capital Stock represented by this certiticate.

Third. V. And it is hereby enacted, that upon the said ist May 1839, if one-fourth of the Capital Stock of fitiy Lakhs be then paid up, or so soon thereafter as it shall be notified as above provid-
ed that the sum of twelro Lakhs and fifty thousand Rupees, being one-fourth of the Capital Stock of the Bank has been realized, the Bank. of Bombay being incorporeted as above provided shall be opened for the cransaction of all manner. of business authorized by this Act, and the said Bank shall and may sue and be sued by its corporate name, and shall and may use such common seal as the Directors of the said Bank shall froms time to time appoint, and shall be competent to acquirs and hold either absolutely or conditionally, for a term, or in perpetuity, any description of property whatever, and to transfer and convey the same.
VI. And it is hereby enacted, that after payment shall have been made of the entire sum of 4,000 Rupees on account of any share, the certificate of the Ollicer of the Goverament of Bombey, given to the purchaser of the right to subscribo for such share in the mamer provided in Section IV. of this Act shall be cancelled, and a certificate signed by three Directors of the Bank of Bombay shall be delivered to the Proprietor of such share, and the same shall be dirisible as alove provided into four quarter shares, and any person who is a Proprite of more than one such share of the Capital stock upon which the whole amount has been paid up, may at his option demand a cortificate for each of his shares or quarter shares, or one certificate for all his shares, or several certificates, each of which may be for any number of his shares or quarter shares.
VII. And it is hereby enacted, that the said share or shares of the Capital Stock of the said Bank shall be of the nature of personal estate of the Proprietors thereof respectively and that the same shall be transferable by endorsoment to bo made on the certiticates thereof respectively under the hand of the Proprictor, or Proprietors, or his, her, or theirAttornoy duly authorized, which endorsement shall specify the name of the person or persons to whom the said transfor shall be made, provided that no such endorsement shall bo effectual to transier any such share or shares until sueth endorsement shall have been registered at the Bank of Bombin, fund such registration shall have been noted on such endorsement under the hand of an Ollicer appointed for that purpose by the Directors of the said Bank.
VIII. And it is hereby enacted, that the said corporate body of the Bank of Bombay, shall consist and be composed of the registered Proprietors for the time being of the satid stares of the Capital Stock of the said Bank, and of no other person or persons whatsoever.
IX. Aud it is hereby euacted, that the busi. ness of the said Bank shall be managed by nine Directors, of whom three shall be appointed and removeable by the Governor in Conncil of Bombay, and the remaining six shall be elected by a General Meeting of the Proprietors of the said Bank and removeable by vote of the majority of a General Meoting of the said Proprietors.
X. And it is hereby enacted, that the first Directors of the said Bank of Bombay shall be Governor in Council of be appointed by the Governor in Council of Bombay to be Direcing purce Bank, together with six persons befor sharchasers of the privilege of subscribing for shares in the Bank of Bombay who shall be quent to the dayrchasers on some date subseIV. of this Act, and prior ordered in Section and the election shall be the Ist May 1839, purchasers as if they were made by the said intents and parposes of the Proprictors to all
they are entitled to subscribe, and they shall vote accordiny to the nu nber of shares to which they are entitled in like manner as if they were Proprietors of the said shares. And the Directors so appointed shall appoint Oflicers and take all neeessary steps for opening the Bank when this dot shall take effect for its incorporation, and the rotation amongst the six Di rectors first appointed under the next preceding Seetion, shall be established according to the number of votes; the two Directors elected by the fowest sotes lirst vacating, and the next two in the year following, and so in succession in the third year.
XI . And it is hereby enacted, that two of the six Directors elected by the said purchasers. and to be elected by the Proprietors, shall in rotation go out of olfice on the second Monday in the month of December in every yeir, on which day in every year a General Meeting of Proprietors shall be held for the election of two Directors in their stead, provided always that any Director going out by rotation as afocesaid may not be re-elected at the election which takes placo. the reupon.
XII., And it is hereby enacted, that in case of the death, resignation or absence from Bombay for more than three noriths, or removal as aforesaid of auy Directors elected by the s:iid purchasers, or to bo elected by the Proprietors after the incorporation of the Bank of Bombay, the Directors shall call a General Meeting of the Proprietors to be held within fifteen days, for the purpose of choosing a successor, and such successor shall come into the same place in rotation abovementioned in which the Director was.
XIII. And it is horeby enacted, that roo person shall be capable of serving as a Director by election of the said purchasers, or of the Proprictors who shall not be Proprietor in his own right, and unincumbered of three shares or 12,000 kupees of the Capital Stock of the Bank of Bombay, or who shall be a Director of any other Bank issuing Notes payable on demand within the Town or Suburbs of Bombay.
XIV. And it is hereby enacted, that at General Meetings of the Proprietors every clection and other matuer in question shall be decided by a majority of votes, and that no person shall be allowed to vote at any such Meeting in respect of any share of the said Capital stock, acquired by transfer or purchase, or otherwise than by act of law, unless such transfer shall have been completed six months at the least beforo the time of tendering such vote.
XV . And it is hereby enacted, that at all such General Meetings the Proprietors shall vote according to the following scale :

1 Share of 4000 Rs. shall entitle to 1 Vote.
 and no Proprietors shall be entilled to more than seven voles.
XV1. And it is hereby enacted, that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council of Bombay to give a proxy in writing, signed by one of the secretaries to Government, to any person whon the Governor of Bombay may appoint to attend any General Meeting of the Proprietors, and that the holder of such proxy shall be entithed to give seven votes upon all matters or
questions that may be submitted to such Meoting, excepting upon the election or removal of such Directors, as are elected by the said Proprietors.
XVII. And it is hereby enacted, that any Proprictor or Proprictors entitled to vote at any General Meeting may give a proxy in writing either general or special, under his, her or their hand, or the hand of his, her or their Attorney, duly authorized, to any other Proprietor, and that such proxy shall be produced at the time of voting, and that such proxy shall entitle the person to whom it is given to vote on such matter only as shall be authorized by the tenor of such proxy.
XVIII.. And it is hereby enacted, that at the first Heeting of the Directors in every year they shall choose a President from among thomselves, and if the olfice of President shall become vacant, they shall at their next Meeting choose a successor for the remainder of the curront year, and that during any vacancy, or in the absence of the President, the Senior Director shall be Vice President for the time, and that such President or Vice President shall have the casting vote in all cases of an equal divisiou of votes at Meetings either of Directors or Proprietors.
XIX. And it is hereby enacted, that the * presence of at least three Directors shall be necessary to form a board, for the transaction of business, and the said Directors shall establish a weekly rotation amony themselves so that not less than three Directors may attend every Meeting of Directors, provided always that nothing therein contained shall be held to prectude any Director from attending any Noeting of Directors.
XX. And it is hereby enacted, that all accounts of the said Bank, and all instruments, not under seal, whereby the said Bank can in any manner be bound, except the Cash Notes of the Bauk, shall be signed by three Directors and shall be of no validity unless so signed, and that the seal of the said Baak shall not bo allixed to any instrument except in the preserice of three Directors, whe shall sign their names on the instrument in token of their presence, and that such signing shall be independent of the signing of every person who may sign the instrument as a witness, and that unless so signed by three Directors such instruments shall be of no validity.
XXI. And it is hereby enacted, that the said Directors shall havo power to appoint such Ollicers as may be nuscessary to conduct the business of the said Bank, and to remove any Otlicer of the said Bank, and to fis the salaries of such Ollicers, provided that the whole expense of the establishment of the said Bank shall not in any one year exceed 60,000 Rupees, without previons authority from the General Meeting of the Proprietors.
XXII. And it is hereby enacted, that no person who shall hold the Olfice of Secretary, Treasurer, Head Accountant or Khazanchee of the Bank of Bombay, shall engage in any other commercial business either on his own account, or as agent for any other person or persons, or act as a Broker for the sale or purchase of Government Securitios, and that every person appointed to any one or more of the said Ulfices shall give security to the Directors for the faithful discharge of his duty in the sum of 50,000 Rupees.

XXIIL. And it is hereby onacted, that the
said Bank of Bombay shall not bo engaged in any kind of business except the kind of business hereinafter specified, that is to say-

1. The discounting of Negotiablo Sccurities.
2. The keeping of Cash Accounts.
3. Buying and Selling of Bills of Exchange payable in India.
4. The lending of Money on short loans.
5. The buying and selling of Bullion.
6. The receiving of Deposits.
7. The issuing and circulating of Cash Notes and Bank Post Bills.
8. The selling of Property or Securities deposited in the lank as security for loans and not redeemed, or of Property or securities recovered by the Bank in satisfaction of debts and claims.
XXIV. And it is hereby cuacted, that the Directors of the said Bank shall discount no Negotiable security and make no loan unless the amount of cash in possession of the said Bank, and immediately arailable, shall be equal to at least one fourth of all the claims against the said Bank outstanding for the time being and payable on demand.
XXV. And it is hereby enacted, that the Directors of the said Bank of Bombay shall not discount any Negotiable Securities which shall have a longer period to run than three months, or lend any money for a longer period than three months, and that they shall make no loan or advance on any Bank share or certificate of shares, nor on mortgage, or in any other manner on the security of any Lands, Houses, or immoveable property, nor on any Negotiable Security, of any individual or partnership firm, which shall not carry on it the several responsibilities of at least two persons or firms unconnected with each other in general partnership, nor be in advance at one and the same time to any individual or partnership firm, either by way of discount, loan, or in any other manner (saving by loans upon the deposit of Government Securities or Goods not perishable as hereinafter mentioned) beyond the amount of three lakhis of Co's. Kupees. Provided always, that the advances upon Bills of Exchange accepted by the Government, or upon other Government Obligations, shall not be considered as an advance within tho meaning of this restriction.
XXVI. And it is hereby enacterl, that the Directors of the said Bank shall make no loan other than such loans as are described in the clause next preceding, except on deposit of Pubdic Sccurities to the full amount of the loan, and which Public Securities shall be so endorsed as to put them at the absolute disposal of the said Bank of Bombay, or on deposit of Goods not of a perishable nature, and of estimated value exceeding the amount of the loan by at least onofourth.
XXVII. And it is hereby enacted, that the said Bank shall not be at any time in adrance to the Government moro than seven laklis and a half of Company's Rupees, provided always that the holding of Goveriment Securities or of Bills of Exchange drawn apon the Government, or of other Government Acceptances or Obligations derived to the said Bank from individuals and not overdue, shall not be construed as being in . adrance to the Gorernment within the meaning of this Clause.
XXVIII. And it is hereby onacted, that the Directors of the saiu Bank of Bombay shall not sulfer any person or persons, or body corporate keeping cash with the said Bank of Bombay, to overdraw his, her or their account.
XXIX. And it is horeby enacted, that the said Bank of Bombay may issue promissory notes payable either on demand or at a date not exceeding thirty days after sight, which notes shall and may be signed on behalf of the said Bank by such person as the Directors of the
said Bank may appoint or authorize in that behalf, provided always, that the total amount of such notes in circulation at any one time shal! not exceed two crores of Rupees, and provided also that no such note shall be for a smaller. amount than ten Rupees.
XXX. And it is hereby enacted, that it shall not be lawfulfor the said Bank to make, issue or negociate any note, bill or other instrument containing any promise, undertakins, or order for the payment of money elsewhere than within the limits of Bombay.
XXXI. And it is hereby enacted, that it shall be lawful for the Directors of the said Bank of Bombay to receive in deposit goods not of a perishable kind and to contract for the safe keeping of the same.
XXXII. And it is hereby enacted, that the Directors of the said Bank shall cause the books of the said Bank to be balanced on the 30th day of June and the 31 st of December in every year, and that a setllement of the balance on every such day, signed by a majority of the said Directors, shall be forthwith transmitted to one of the Sccretaries to the Governor in Conncil of Bombay, and that the Governor in Counci! of Bombay shall at all times be entitled to require of the said Directors any information tonching the affiars of the said Bank and the production of any documents of the said Bank, and that the said Directors shall comply with every such requisition.

XXXIll. And it is hereby enacted, that an account of the profits of the said Bank shall be taken half yearly on the 1st day of January and the 1st day of July in every year, and that a dividend thereof shall be made so soon thereafter as conveniently may be, and that the amount of such dividend shall be determined by the Directors of the said Bank on the ground of the actual profits made by the said Bauk during the six calendar montis preceding the day up to which such half yearly acconnt shall be taken, provided that tho said Directors, subject to the control and sanction of the Proprietors at their General Meetings, shall have power when they see fit to set apart from such profits a sum not exceeding five per cent, on the Capital Stock of the Bank as a reserve againat contingencies.
XXXIV. And it is hereby enacted, that on the 1st Monday of the month of August in every year, a General Meeting of the Proprietors of the Capital Stock of the said Bauk shall be held at which the Directors of the said Bank shall submit to the said Proprietors a statement of the aflairs of the said Bank, made up to the preceding 30th of June, and such General Meeting shall be competent to pass resolutions, and frame rules and directions relative to the affiars and conduct of the said Bank which shall be binding on the Direstors and Ollicers of the Bank, and on the Proprietors thereoi, until rescinded or modifed respectively by any subsequent General Meeting.
XXXV. And it is hereby enacted, that any three Directors of the said Directors of the said Bank, or any ten Proprietors of the Capital Stock of the said Bank, may at any time convene a General Meeting of the Proprietors upon giving fifteen days previous notice of such Meeting, and of the purpose or purposes for which the same shall be convened, as well to the Direc. tors of the said Bank for the time being, as also by public advertisement in the Government Gazette.
XXXVI. And it is hereby evacted, that it shall be lawful for the Bank of Bombay, with the sanution of the Governor in Council of Bombbay, to establish Branch Banks at such places, and under such rules and restrictions as shall bo determined by the Proprietors at their General Meetings ; provided however, that such Branch

Banks when so established, besides being subject to the rules and restrictions that may be imposed by the Proprietors, and ta the control and orders of the Directors of the Bank at Bombay, shall he bound by the same rules as to the description of business in which they are to engage, and the manner of conducting such business. and likewise in respect to the issue of notes payable on demand, and the retention of the cash to meet the same, and in all transuctions and matters herein abore referred to, as are prescribed for the Bauk of Bombay by this Act.
XXXVII. And it is further enacted, that if any of the said Proprietors shall become indebted to the said Bank, it shall be lawful for the said Bark to withhold payment of this disidends, or the share or shares of such Proprietor registered as his, or her own property, and not as held in trust, or as executor or adiministrator, until payment of such debt, and to apply such dividends towards payment. thereof, and thatater demand and defante of payment ;and notice in that behalf given, either to such Proprictor, or his, or her constituted agent, or by public alsertisement is the Government Gazetie, it shall be lavtel for the said Bank to refuse registration of the transfer of any such share or shares of such Proprictor until pay: ment of such deht, and if the same shall remain unpaid for the space of six months after such notice, to advertise for public sale and to sell such share or shares for so many as may be necessary, and io apply the proceals thereof tovards payment of such debt without interest at the rate of six per cent per annum, paying orer the surplus, if any, to such Proprietor, or his or her lawful representative.
XXXVIII. Andit is further enacted, that the said satak shall continue as hereby constituted until the lst day of May, which will be inthe year of our Lord 1846, and shall thereafter continue in like manner until duly dissolved or moditied, provided hoverer that atier the said 1st day of May 18th, the said Rank shali not esoept uron the application, or by the consent of the said Bank be dissolved or anywise modified without previous notice of twelve months at the least being given to the Directors of the said Bank for the time being of such intended dissofuion or modification. Provided also, that in the event of the said Bank at any time suspendins any cash payments, the benefits granted to the said Bank by the present Act of incorporation shall be thenceforth forfeited.

Ordered, that the said Draft he re-considered at the first Meeting of the Legishative Counci! of India after the 12th day of Mareh next.

The following Draft of a proposed Actwas read in Conncil for the first time on the $28 t h$ January 1839.

Act No. - of 1839. C.
I. It is hereby enacted, that it shall be lawful for any Magistrate, or Justice of the Peace of the Setulement of Prince of Wales Island, Singapore and Malacea, to grant a Warrant or Warrants to any Peace or Revenue Ollicer or Officers of the said setlement, empowering him or them by day or by night (but if between the hoirs of eleven o'clock at night and five in the morning, then the Warrant to be executed by or in the presence of a Peace Officer) to enter and search any Dwelling House, Shop or other building in any case in which there shall appear to such Magistrate or Justice of the Peace, upon the oath of any party, good and sufficient cause to believe that in any such Dwelling Houso,

Shop or other building there is deposited or concealed any article or articles, the exclusive privilege of preparing or selling which has been f.rmed out to any party or parties whosoever by the East India Company under Regulations No. II. III. IV. and V. of 1830, passed by the late Governor in Council of the said Settlement of Prince of Wales Island, Singapore and Malacea, and also under Regulation IV. of 1831, passed by the Vice President in Council on the 18th of October 1831, and also under Regulations X. and XI. of 1833, respectively passed by the Governor Goneral in Council on the 9th of September 1833, and to seize and take possession of any such article or articles as may be found so deposited or concealed therein, and it shall be lawful for any Officer to whom any such Warrant shall be granted, and he is hereby authorized in case of resistance, to break open any door and to force and remove any other impediment or obstruction to such entry, scarch or seizure and removal as aforesaid.

1I. And it is hereby enacted, that any person or persons found committing any act is contravention of any of the provisions of the said Regulations may be immediately searched without a Warrant by any Peace or Hevenue Officer, provided always, that the person to be searched may demand to be taken before some neirhbouring Magistrate or Jutice of the Peace, who shall determine, if there be reasonable grounds of suspicion, and every such Officer or Oificers as aforesaid is hereby authonized and required to take such person upon demand before a neighbouring Magistrate or Justice of the Peace, detaining such person in the meantime. And if any person shall obstruct any such Officer or Olifeers in making any such search as aforesaid, every such parson shall he subject, on conviction before a Magistrate or Justice of the Peace, to a fine not exceeding 100 rupees, such fine to be commuted, in case of non-payment, to imprisonment for any period not exceeding three calendar months.
III. And it is hereby enacted. that if any Peace or Revenue Ollicer shall malicionsly and without reasonable grounds apprehend or detain any person or persons on the plea that such person or persons liave infringed any of the provisions of any of the said Regulations, it shall be competent for any Mayistrate or Justice of the Peace to hear the complaint, and if necessary to adjudge the uffending Officer or Officers to pay a hine not exceeding 100 Rupees, such finc to be commuted, in case of non-payment, to inprisanment for any period not exceeding thres calendar months.
IV. And it is hereby enacted, that in case any Officer committed under the preceding Soction, shall have paid the sym adjudged to bo paid by him, or shall have suffered the imprisonment awarded for non-payment thereof, every such Officer shall be roleased from all further or other proccedings from the same cause.
V. And it is hereby enacted, that no Peace or Revenue Olficer of the said Setllement shall he comprtent to act under the provisions of this Act, unless appointed specially so to do in writing by the Resident Conncellor of the station where such Peace or Revenue Otficers may reside, which authority shall be duly registered at the Police Oince of the said station, and liable to be annulled at the pleasure of the said Kesident Councillor.
Ordered, that the Draft now read be published for general information.

Ordered, that the said Draft be re-considered at the first Meeting of the Legislative Counci! of India after the 12 th day of March next.

## FORT WILLIAM.

The 4 th February, 1839.
The fullowing Draft of a proposed Act was read in Council for the first time on the th February, 1839.

## Act No.- of 1839.

I. Ithereby enacted, that the several charges of the Portand Roadstead of Aladras, levied under the heads of Anchorage duty, Light House duty, Regular Boat hire and Report Catamaran hire, shall from and after the
next bo consolidated and commuted into a Port duty to be levied at the rate of three smas per Ton upon every Vessel, not being a vessel sailing under the colours of a Foreign European or A merican mation of which the Tonnage shall ant exceed 700 tons hy measurement made in the manner prescribed by Acts 5 and 6 of William IV. Cap. L.VI. and if the vessel creced 700 tons by measureqent so made, the Port duty shall be levied as upon that tonnage.
II. And it is hereby enacted, that upon every vessel sailing under the colours of a Foreign European or American nation, that may anchor in the Port of Madras, there shall be levied a consolidated Port duty at the rate of three Aunas six Pie per ton, according to measurement made in the manner above prescribed.
III. And it is hereby enacted, that if any vessels, British, Native or Foreign, anchoring in the Port of Madras, shall not break Fulk therein, and shall not remain four complete days from the time of dropping anchor, tifere shall be levied upon such ressels rednced duties as tollows; that is to say, two-fifths of the tennage duty preseribed above shall be levied upon every ressel which without breaking bulk shall atter anchoring. therein, sail again ont of the Port within forty-eight hours, and seven-tenths upon every vessel which without breaking bulk shall stay more than forty-cight hours and less than four complete days.
IV. And it is hereby enacted, that all the powers and anthorities, penalties and other means whereby the payment of any of the charges of the Port and Roadstead of Madras may havo been legally enforced before the passing of this $\lambda \mathrm{ct}$, shall bo applicable to the enforcing of the consolidated and commuted Port duties imposed by virtue of this Act.
V. And it is hereby enacted, that it shall be lawful for the Government of India to order the consolidation and commutation of any Port or Harbour duties, as levied in any subordinate Port of any Presidency into a Tonnage duty, which shall be leviable at the rate and in the manner specified in the next following Section of this Act, upon the vessels anchoring in and trading with such port.
VI. And it is hereby enacted, that when the Governor General of India in Council shall direct the Port duties to be commuted and consolidated at any Port of the Madras Presidency other than that of Madras, or at any subordinato Port of any other Presidency, the total amount levied at such Port shall not exceed Ono ama per ton for British and Native vessels not exceeding 700 tons, and upon vessels exceeding that measurement at the rate 700 tons, and upon Foreign, European, and American vessels, at tho
rate of One Anna Foir lie per ton ; end all vessels anchoring in any such outports shall becharged with reduced duty, in the proportions above provided for the Port of Mailras, if they leave such port without breaking bulk before completing four entire days from the time of anchoring therein.
VII. And it is hereby enacted; that the consolidated and commuted Port duties above prescribed, when ordered to be levied in any Port by the forernment of Intia, shall be letied by the Oflicer appointed by the Government of the Presidency to give Port Clearainces or other customary documents to vessels sailing from such Port, that is to say, by the Master Altendant, or by the Colliector of Customs at such Port, as may be ordered by stich Govermment, and if such duties be not paid upon demand, it shall be competent to such Ollicer to withhold from the vessel on account of which payment may be refused, any Por' Clearance of other customary document required to be possessed by ships learing such Pore until the game shall be p-id.
VIII. And it is hereby enacted, that all the powers and authorities, penalties and other means by which any Port or Harbour duty of any subordinate Port of any Presidency which shall be consolidated, and commated by virtue of this Act may have been legally euforeed before the consolidation and commutation thereof as hereinbefore provided, shall be applicaile to the enforcing of the consolidated and commated duties at such Port imposed by virtue of this Act.

Ordered, that the Draft now read be published for seneral information.

Ordered, that the said Draft be re-considered at the first Meeting of the Legislative Council of India after the 4 th day of May next.
