FORT WILLIAM,

THE 6TH JULY, 1840.

The following Draft of a proposed Act was read in Council for the first time on the 6th July 1840.

ACT No.—OF 1840.

An Act for the punishment of vagrants within the Town of Calcutta extorting Alms by offensive and disgusting exhibitions and practices.

I. Whereas great inconvenience is experienced within the Town of Calcutta from Mendicants who endeavour to extort alms by offensive and disgusting exhibitions and practices.

II. It is hereby enacted, that persons within the Town of Calcutta who shall seek to extort alms by exhibiting any bodily ailment or deformity, or by any offensive or indecent practices, or by inflicting, or threatening to inflict, bodily injury on themselves, shall be liable, on conviction before any Justice of the Peace, to imprisonment with or without labor for a term not exceeding one calendar month.

III. And it is hereby enacted, that all persons guilty a second time of any of the above offences, shall be liable, on conviction before a Justice of the Peace, to imprisonment with hard labor for a term not exceeding twice the period assigned for the first offence, and the same period upon any subsequent conviction.

IV. And it is hereby enacted, that persons guilty of any of the offences above mentioned who shall violently resist any Peace Officer attempting to apprehend them, shall be liable, on conviction before a Justice of the Peace, to imprisonment with or without hard labor for a term not exceeding three calendar months.

Ordered, that the Draft now read be published for general information.

Ordered, that the said Draft be reconsidered at the first Meeting of the Legislative Council of India after the 6th day of September next.

The following Draft of a proposed Act was read in Council for the first time on the 13th July, 1840.

ACT No.—OF 1840.

Act for amending the procedure in cases of Appeals made in Formâ Pauperis, within the Presidency of Fort William in Bengal.

It is hereby enacted, that the proviso contained in Clause 1, Section V. Regulation XXVIII. 1814 of the Bengal Code in regard to females of rank, shall be applicable at the discretion of the Court of Sudder Dewanny Adawlut of the Presidency of Fort William in Bengal, to any party desirous of appealing in Formâ Pauperis to that Court.

Ordered, that the Draft now read be published for general information.

Ordered, that the said Draft be reconsidered at the first meeting of the Legislative Council of India after the 13th day of September next.

Section XXX.—On a question being referred how a Collector was to proceed against a Jageerdar withholding Sir Deshmookee, or other Umuls which belong to Government in any village held by him, it was declared that, if the Collector could not proceed against him under the ordinary Regulations, he should apply to Government to sequester that, or any other of his villages, but that this proceeding should be a last resort, and only adopted on failure of urgent remonstrance.

No. 509 of 1840.—In addition to the Regulations already in force under this Presidency relating to the Audit Department, the Honorable the Governor in Council is pleased to publish for guidance, the following Extracts from the Bengal Pay and Audit Regulations, page 633, paragraphs 68, 70, 71, and Page 616 paragraph 24, which are to be rigidly attended to by all Departments.

“Whenever an Officer has further grounds to produce in support of a retrenched charge, he shall state them on the extract of retrenchments which has been furnished to him, and return it to the Auditor General through his Paymaster, within one month, accompanied by copies of such orders, certificates, or other authorities as he may have to urge.”

“If the Auditor General, notwithstanding the fresh reason so offered, shall think himself obliged to confirm the retrenchments, he shall immediately communicate to the Paymaster, for information of the party affected, the grounds on which he adheres to his former opinion, in order that if an appeal to Government be demanded, the plea on which the charge is preferred, and the reasons for its rejection, may come at one view before Government.”

“When such appeals are demanded, they shall be made *through the Paymaster* and Auditor General, and the party concerned must state, clearly and fully, every additional argument he may have to offer, as the decision of Government will be final. Parties must not trouble Government with such appeals on insufficient grounds.

Page 616, Para. 24. “Appeals from the decision of the Auditor General to Government, must state the reasons and authorities the Parties have to offer in support of their claims. Officers are not to address the Commander in Chief, relative to matters of expense, except such contingent disbursements as he may find it necessary to authorize, and which must have the sanction of his signature for passing them.
