THE 23D DECEMBER, 1839.

The following Act is passed by the Hon'ble the President of the Council of India in Council on the 23d December 1839, with the assent of the Right Hon'ble the Governor General of India which has been read and recorded.

Ordered that the Act be promulgated for general information.

ACT No. XXXI of 1839.

An Act for remedying certain defects in the Statute 9th, George IV, Ch. 74, relating to the Coin.

I. Whereas it is expedient to remedy certain defects in the Statute 9th, George IV, Ch. 74, of which the inconvenience is particularly experienced relating to injuries to the Coin:

It is hereby enacted, that if any person shall fraudulently clip, file, drill, deface, or debase any current gold or silver Coin issued from any Mint of the East India Company, or usually received as money in any part of the territories under the Government of the East India Company, with intent to make the Coin so clipped, filed, drilled, defaced, or debased pass for the current gold or silver Coin so issued, or usually received as money as foresaid, every such offender shall be guilty of felony, and shall be liable, on conviction, at the discretion of the Court, to be transported to such place as the Court shall direct for life or any term of years, or to be imprisoned for any term not exceeding four years.

II. And it is hereby provided, that it shall not be lawful for any Court, under the authority of this Act, to order the transportation of any person being a native of the East Indies, and not born of European parents to the Eastern Coast of New South Wales, or any of the Islands adjacent thereto.

III. And it is hereby enacted, that this Act shall extend to all persons and over all places

over whom on which the criminal jurisdiction of any of Her Majesty's Courts of Justice within the territories under the Government of the East India Company extends, but not further, or otherwise.

The following Draft of a proposed Act was read in Council for the first time on the 23d December 1839.

ACT No. — of 1839.

An Act for regulating the execution of Sentences of imprisonment passed by Courts Martial.

I. Whereas doubts have arisen whether by the regulations of all the Presidencies sufficient provision is made for all the cases in which sentences of imprisonment by Courts Martial are to be executed:—

It is hereby declared and enacted, that whenever any sentence of a Court Martial shall adjudge imprisonment, or imprisonment with labor for any offence, it is and shall be the duty of every Judge, Magistrate, or other Officer in charge of any Gaol to give effect to such sentence on the offender being delivered into his custody, and on being furnished with a copy of the sentence by the Officer Commanding the Division, Garrison, Regiment or Detachment by whose orders the offender is tried.

Ordered, that the Draft now read be published for general information.

Ordered, that the said Draft be re-considered at the first Meeting of the Legislative Council of India after the 4th day of February next.

The following Act is passed by the Hon'ble the President of the Council of India in Council on the 30th December, 1839, with the assent of the Right Hon'ble the Governor General of India, which has been read and recorded.

Ordered, that the Act be promulgated for general information.

ACT No. XXXII. of 1839.

An Act concerning the allowance of Interest in certain cases,

I. Whereas it is expedient to extend to the territories under the Government of the East India Company, as well within the Jurisdiction of Her Majesty's Courts as elsewhere, the provisions of the Statute 3d and 4th William IV, Chapter 42, Section 28, concerning the allowance of interest in certain cases :

It is, therefore, hereby enacted, that upon all debts or sums certain payable at a certain time or otherwise, the Court before which such debts or sums may be recovered, may, if it shall think fit, allow interest to the creditor at a rate not exceeding the current rate of interest from the time when such debts or sums certain were payable, if such debts or sums be payable by virtue of some written Instrument at a certain time, or if payable otherwise, then from the time when demand of payment shall have been made in writing, so as such demand shall give notice to the debtor that interest will be claimed from the date of such demand until the term of payment ; provided that interest shall be payable in all cases in which it is now payable by law.

Act No. — of 1840.

An Act concerning the signing of Awards by Panchayets.

It is hereby enacted, that in cases where the minority of the Members of a Panchayet, held under the Provisions of the Madras Code, may decline to sign the award of the Panchayet, the signature or mark of the majority shall be sufficient to give legal validity to the award. Provided always, that in such cases, it shall be incumbent on such majority to admit the minority to record and attest by their mark or signature their reasons for declining to sign or mark the award passed by the majority.

Ordered that the Draft now read be published for general information.

Ordered that the said Draft be reconsidered at the first meeting of the Legislative Council of India after the 6th day of April 1840.

Referring to Notification No. 1298 of 1839; dated 19th of December 1839, published in the Bombay Government Gazette of the 26th of that month, Page 863, declaring that fractional parts of *Pies* are not admissible into the public accounts, and to communications that have since been made to this Department connected with supposed difficulties in the conversion of local currencies into Company's Currency, where the former are still in circulation, and in the adjustments consequent thereon, if fractional parts of *Pies* are not admitted into those accounts, it is hereby further notified for the information of Disbursing Officers and all other Officers of Account under this presidency, that in every case, whether of receipt, payment or conversion, where the fractional part of a *Pie* may be less than one half of that Coin, such fractional part is to be altogether disregarded, and where the fraction may be above half a *Pie*, a whole *Pie* is to be allowed.
