THE 14TH SEPTEMBER 1840.

The following Act passed by the Right Hon'ble the Governor General of India in Council, on the 14th of September 1840, is hereby promulgated for general information.

ACT No XIX, of 1840.

Act for amending the procedure in cases of Appeals made in Formā Pauperis, within the Presidency of Fort William in Bengal.

It is hereby enacted, that the proviso contained in Clause I. Section V. Regulation XXVIII. 1814 of the Bengal Code in regard to females of rank, shall be applicable, at the discretion of the Courts of Sudder Dewanny Adawlut of the Presidency of Fort William in Bengal respectively, to any party desirous of appealing in formā pauperis to either of those Courts.

ACT No.—OF 1840.

An Act concerning the annexation of the Deyra Doon to the District of Sheharunpore.

It is hereby enacted, that the tract of Country called Deyra Doon is for all purposes to be deemed annexed to the District of Sheharunpore.

2nd. The estimates &c. being duly prepared and countersigned by the Civil Authority, requiring the work, will be forwarded by the Executive Engineer to the Superintending Engineer, who, after examination will transmit them to the Register of the Sudder Adawlut, or Revenue Commissioner, as the case may require, by whom they will be submitted for the sanction of Government through the Military Board, which sanction when accorded will be intimated to the Superintending Engineer of the province, for the information of the parties concerned, by the Military Board.

3rd. The modified rules laid down in the Military Board's circular of the 28th September 1839 for the guidance of Superintending Engineers, in the preparation of Survey Reports and Estimates of the prescribed Annual and Special Repairs to Public Buildings in the Military department, are to be observed as far as practicable in reference to similar repairs to Civil Buildings at the above stations. All Survey Reports will be countersigned by the head of the department in charge of the building, which reports and the accompanying estimates will be forwarded direct to the Military Board by the Provincial Superintendent, on his receiving them from the Executive Officer.

4. At the stations of Tannah and Rutnagherry, the Civil Authorities are directed to avail themselves of the aid of any of the Assistants of the Superintendent of Roads and Tanks, for new works, or the inspection of any buildings to be repaired or altered. Plans and Estimates thus prepared will be forwarded to the Superintendent of Roads for transmission, if for repairs only, to the Military Board direct, if for new works or additions or alterations to existing buildings, to the Sudder Adawlut or Revenue Commissioner, as the case may require.

5. But if the Civil Officer at such stations cannot procure professional assistance by any means, he will send in his own plan and estimate to the Superintending Engineer of the province, to be dealt with, as directed in the 2nd paragraph.

6. At the minor stations in the districts, where there may be no Engineer on or near the spot, the Assistant Magistrate, Mamlutdar or Local Officer will, as at present, prepare all estimates and superintend the repairs of all buildings or public works, under their charge; as also the estimates of new ones to be by them superintended, when not of a very extensive nature. The estimates &c. prepared under this arrangement, will be forwarded by the Local Officer to the Judge or Collector of the district, who will refer them to the Executive Engineer for approval and correction, or in cases where there is none, to the district Officer of public work, and then transmit them, direct to the Military Board, if for repairs to existing buildings, but if the estimate &c. is for a new work, or an alteration or addition to an old one, the Judge or Collector as the case may be, will forward these documents to the Sudder Adawlut, or Revenue Commissioner, by whom they will be handed to the Military Board, for submission to Government.
