GENERAL DEPARTMENT:

The sudden departure of any Civil Servant from his station on sick certificate having been found to be productive of great inconvenience to the Public Service, the Honorable the Governor in Council is pleased to establish it as a Rule, that in all cases the receipt of the sanction of Government should be awaited unless the Medical Attendant should certify his opinion that the delay would be prejudicial to the health of the party. It is often necessary that measures should be adopted for supplying the place of the Absentee, and unless the disease be of an alarming and urgent nature but little inconvenience can arise to the party being obliged to wait the orders of Government.

BOMBAY CASTLE, 17th FEBRUARY, 1842.
