GENERAL' DEPARTMENT:

The sudden departure of any Civil Servant from his station on sick certificate having been found to be productive of great inconvenience to the Public Service, the Honorable the Governor in Council is pleased to establish it as a Rule, that in all cases the receipt of the sanction of Government should be awaited unless the Medical Attendant should certify his opinion that the delay would be prejudicial to the health of the party.
