BY THE HON'BLE THE GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL.

BOMBAY CASTLE, 24th FEBRUARY, 1842.

No. 137 of 1842.—The following order is confirmed :—

An order by Major J. Lloyd dated the 2nd instant, appointing Lieutenant Giberne to act as Adjutant and Quarter Master to the Artillery in Scinde, from the date of that Office being vacated by Brevet Captain Hutt, till Lieutenant Erskine may join, or until further orders.

No. 138 of 1842.—The following appointments are made.

Lieutenant W. Kenyon of the 2nd Regiment Light Cavalry, to be Brigade Major at Deesa, on the arrival of that Corps at that Station, under the Provisions of the Government General Order 8th August 1834, Page 199, of the 3rd Supplement to the Code of Military Regulations.

No. 141 of 1842.—By a resolution passed in the Political Department under date the 21st instant, Serjeant Hexton, of the Corps of Sappers and Miners, has been placed at the disposal of the Military Board, for employment under Captain Malet, in Superintending the operations of boring for water in the vicinity of Balmeer

No. 142 of 1842.—Major E. Hallum of the 10th Regiment Native Infantry, is at his own request, transferred to the Invalid Establishment.

No. 143 of 1842.—Lieutenant S. Turnbull of the Regiment of Artillery, is appointed Acting Assistant Secretary to the Military Board, vice Cruickshank resigned.

No. 144 of 1842.—The following Brigade Orders issued under dates the 30th October, 31st December and 6th January last, by the Brigadier Commanding in Lower Sinde, are confirmed.

Order dated 30th October 1841, appointing Ensign J. Madden of Her Majesty's 41th Regiment to act, as Commissariat Agent, and Serjeant John Kilworth as Acting Sub-Conductor, with the Detachment of Her Majesty's 41th Regiment, ordered to proceed to Sukkur,

Order dated 31st December 1841, appointing Ensign J. Thompson, 8th Regiment Native Infantry, and Serjeant Richardson, Her Majesty's 41th Regiment, the former as Commissariat Agent, and the latter as Acting Sub-Conductor to the Detachment of Her Majesty's 41st Regiment, and left Wing 12th Regiment Native Infantry ordered to embark for Sukkur.

Order dated 6th January last, appointing Ensign C. T. Tuckey and Serjeant Newton of Her Majesty's 41st Regiment, the former as Commissariat Agent, and the latter as Acting Sub Conductor with the Head Quarter Wing of Her Majesty's 41st Regiment ordered to proceed to Sukkur.

No. 145 of 1842.—By a Notification issued in the General Department dated 22nd Instant, the following Promotions have been made to fill vacancies in the Subordinate Medical Department, and the parties transferred to the Military Department.

Second Hospital Assistant Anoopsing of the Civil Establishment at Sattara, to be first Hospital Assistant. First Grade Apparentice John Lobo of the Oculist Department, to be second Hospital Assistant.

No. 146 of 1842.—The Honorable the Governor in Council is pleased to direct, that the Extra Staff Allowance granted to Officers for the charge of Military Treasure Chests, under the Provisions of Articles 79 and 80 of Section XLIX. of the Military Code, be reduced to Rupees sixty (60) per mensem, inclusive of Shroff and stationery allowance, when such Officer is in the receipt of other Staff Pay; and to Rupees ninety (90) per mensem, when the Officer holds no other Staff situation.

The Honorable the Governor in Council, further directs, that the charge of the Treasure Chest at Dapoolce, be transferred to the Paymaster of Pensioners at that Station, and that the Treasure Chest at Maligaum be abolished.

The above arrangements to have effect from the 1st April next.

No. 147 of 1842.—The following orders are confirmed.

An order by Major General Willis, dated Ahmedabad the 5th instant, directing Captain Davies of the 11th Regiment Native Infantry, to take charge of the Pay Office from Captain Jackson, until an Officer is appointed by Government,

An order by Captain Hart, dated the 8th instant, appointing Ensign Jermyn to act as Quarter Master to the 2nd Grenadier Regiment Native Infantry, during the time Captain Hart may be in charge of the Regiment.

No. 148 of 1842.—The Hon'ble the Governor in Council is pleased, at the recommendation of His Excellency the Commander in Chief, to direct that Captain A. P. Hockin, of the invalids, be removed from the appointment of Pay-master of Pensioners.

Lieutenant C. H. Boye, of the Invalids, is appointed to succeed Captain Hockin in the Southern Konkan; and the Situation of Pay-master of Pensioners in the Northern Konkan is abolished.

The Pensioners residing at Tannah, Bhowdy, Panwell and Caranjah, are placed under the charge of the Fort Adjutant of Bombay, who will receive on their account, the authorized Head money.

The above arrangements are to take effect from the 1st April next.
