Notification.

GENERAL DEPARTMENT.

The following Notification issued by the Government of India under date the 2d Instant, consequent on the passing of Act No. XV. of 1842, regarding the emigration of the Native Inhabitants of the Territories under the Government of the East India Company to the Mauritius, is republished for general information and guidance.

The fees imposed by the above Act will be exigible from this date.

Captain D. Ross, Master Attendant, has been nominated by the Government of Mauritius, Emigration Agent at the Port of Bombay, and is hereby authorized to exercise the powers conferred on Emigration Agents by Act XV. of 1842.

NOTIFICATION.

The President of the Council of India in Council having received from the Government of Mauritius the annexed public Ordinance passed by that Government, and having had it duly certified to him, that Regulations and measures have been provided and taken for the protection of Emigrant Labourers from India on their passage to that Colony, and during their residence there, and for their safe return at the expiration of five years, or at any subsequent period when they may desire to return, such as are deemed by him sufficient; it is hereby notified, that in conformity with the provision to that effect contained in Sec. I, of Act No. XV. of this year, the provisions of that Act in respect to the exportation of Emigrants from the Ports of India therein mentioned will take effect from this day.

ORDINANCE.

No. II of 1842.

Mauritius and Dependencies.

Enacted by the Hon'ble the Officer administering the Government of Mauritius with the advice and consent of the Council of Government thereof,

Title. For the purpose of securing in favor of Indian Emigrant Labourers, the execution of the formalities relative to their future Emigration to the Island of Mauritius,

Preamble, Whereas by Her Majesty's Order in Council under date 15th January of the present year it is among other provisions enacted "that in the event of any Law being made in British India authorizing the emigration to Mauritius of the Natives of India, and repealing the restrictions now in force there in regard to such Emigration, the various Rules and Regulations comprised and set forth in the Schedule to this present order, subjoined shall within the Island of Mauritius have the force and effect of Law, and shall be observed and carried into effect by all Her Majesty's Officers, Civil, and Military in Mauritius, and by all Her Majesty's Subjects, within the said Island, as to them may respectively appertain,

And whereas the Government of India has communicated to the Governor of Mauritius the draft of a Legislative Act made by that Government for the purpose of repealing in so far as concerns the Island of Mauritius only, the Act No. 14 of 1839 establishing general restrictions against the Emigration of Natives of India, and also for regulating in future such Emigration to the Island of Mauritius subject to certain measures to be adopted by the Government of this Colony, for the protection of the Emigrant Labourers from India, during their passage to, and residence in the said Island of Mauritius, and also for ensuring the return of the said Emigrant Labourers at the expiration of five year residence in the Colony, or at any other subse

quent period when they may be desirous of going back to their country.

The Honorable the Officer administering the Government in Council has ordered and does hereby order.

ART. I.

Her Majesty's order in Council, under date 15th January of the present year, as also the Regulations, conditions, penalties and all the provisions contained & set forth in the Schedule annexed to such order shall have force of Law, and be put into execution in the Island of Mauritius from the day on which the Hon'ble the Officer administering the Government of the Colony shall have made known by a Proclamation that the Government of India by a definitive Act has removed the restrictions with respect to the Emigration of Natives of India to the Island of Mauritius, and has regulated the conditions of their future Emigration to this Colony.

Date of the putting in force in the Colony of the order in Council dated 15th January of the present year.

Penal obligation subscribed in India by the Masters or Captains of Ships conveying Emigrants cognizable at the Mauritius.

All penal obligations which shall have been established in India with a view to secure on the part of the Master or Captain of any Ship or Vessel conveying Emigrants to Mauritius, the execution of the conditions and formalities prescribed for the conveyance of such Emigrants, either by Her Majesty's order in Council of the 15th of January last, or by any other law which may be passed in India for the same object shall in case of infringement of any of the conditions of the said obligations be cognizable in the Island of Mauritius, and the proceedings for the recovery of the Penalties shall be carried on before the Ordinary Courts of the Colony.

ART. 2.

Every vessel on which Emigrants may be conveyed to Mauritius, there to be hired and employed as Labourers, and which shall not be furnished with the License or document without which according to any law which may be passed in India no

ART. 3.

Penalty against any Captain, who shall not be furnished with the License or document prescribed by any Law which shall have been passed in India. Confiscation of the ship.

Vessel can be permitted to convey Emigrants shall be liable to be confiscated and the Master of such Vessel to be prosecuted before the Court of Correctional Police and condemned in a fine of one hundred pounds for each Emigrant thus illegally conveyed.

ART. 4.

Penalty against any Captain who shall introduce into the Colony Emigrants not borne on the List or Duplicate of the Act prescribed.

Every Master or Captain of a Vessel cleared at one of the Ports designated for Emigration and on board of which any Emigrant or Emigrants may or shall be conveyed from India and introduced into Mauritius there to be hired and employed as a Labourer or Labourers, who shall not be borne on the List or Duplicate of the List prescribed by the Art. II. of the aforesaid order in Council shall be liable on conviction before the Court of Correctional Police to a fine of fifty pounds for each Emigrant not borne on the said list.

ART. 5.

Penalty against any Captain who shall change or alter the certificates required for the conveyance of Emigrants.

Every Master or Captain of a Vessel cleared from any such Port as aforesaid for Mauritius with Emigrants who after having obtained the prescribed Certificate shall during the course of the voyage fraudulently make, or suffer to be made any change or other alteration in the said certificates, so far as concerns the state of the ship the passengers, provisions, or any other purpose, for which the said certificates were granted, shall be punishable by a fine of five hundred pounds, independently of any penal clause to which he may be subject under any obligations entered into in India on account of the License obtained for the vessel.

ART. 6.

Penalty against any person who shall counterfeit or falsify any paper or document relative to the conveyance of Emigrants and against any person who shall make use of the same.

Every person who shall have forged, counterfeited or falsified any of the Papers, Certificates, or Documents of whatever description required as well by the above mentioned order in Council as by the Act which to the same effect shall have been passed by the Government of India concerning the Emigration of Natives of India to Mauritius, and every person who shall have made use of any document thus forged, counterfeited or falsified, shall be punished by the Court of Correctional Police with an imprisonment which shall not exceed two years, subject should need require to the application of more severe penalties conformably to articles 108 and 109 of the Penal Code in cases of forgery in what places soever the forgery may have been committed.

ART. 7.

Penalty against any person who shall aid or favor the illegal importation into the Colony of Emigrants from India.

Every person who shall have wilfully aided, or favored in any manner whatsoever the importation into the Colony of Emigrant Labourers from India by non observance or infraction of any of the formalities prescribed, as well by the above mentioned order in Council, as by the Act, which shall have been passed to the same effect by the Government of India, shall be liable to a fine of not less than Fifty pounds, nor more than three hundred pounds with or without an imprisonment not exceeding one year, which penalty shall be pronounced by the Court of Correctional Police.

ART. 8.

Every Indian Emigrant Labourer is entitled to a return passage after five years residence in the Colony, duty of Protector.

The return passage of all & every Emigrant Labourer and Labourers Natives of India who after five years residence in the Colony shall desire to return to their country shall be paid out of the Emigration Fund, and for that purpose advanced by the Colonial Treasurer upon an order on him to be given by the Governor.

For this purpose the Protector to be named for the said Emigrants in the Island of Mauritius shall inform and assure himself by a personal communication with each & every such Emigrant who shall have been hired, and employed as la-

bourer in this Colony for five years, whether it be his or her wish and entention to return to their own Country, and if any such Emigrant shall express such to be his or her wish or intention, then it shall be the duty of such Protector to take all necessary measures for procuring and providing every such Emigrant a return passage as before mentioned, but nevertheless without prejudice to the right of every such Emigrant to leave the Colony and return to his own Country at his own expense before the expiration of the said five years.

ART. 9.

Certificate of the protector necessary for the validity of any contract of service with any Indian Emigrant Labourer having resided five years in the colony. Conformably to the preceding Article it shall not be lawful for the Stipendiary Magistrate or any other competent authority to sanction, authorize or allow any Contract of service with any Indian Emigrant Labourer who shall have resided five years and more in the Colony otherwise than upon a certificate granted by the Protector certifying, that such Emigrant Labourer is no longer desirous of returning to his Country.

Every contract of Hiring without this previous formality shall be null and void.

ART. 10.

Date of the putting in force of the present ordinance. The present Ordinance shall have force and shall be carried into effect from the day which shall for that purpose be fixed by a Proclamation of the Governor.

Easterly, so as to pass about 1/4 of a mile to the Eastward of the other Light Vessel, which is moored about a quarter of a mile to the Southward of the Sunken Rock. After rounding the Rock Light Vessel, you may steer more Northerly, and if it be at night, should anchor about 1 mile to the N. E. by N. from it where the water will be smooth. The South point of the Middle Ground Shoal, bears N. N. E. distant 2 miles from the Rock Light Vessel.

Both Light Vessels are painted Red, each carrying a Ball on the Light Mast, and during day light they hoist a Red Flag when a sail is in sight.

The Outer Floating Light, burns a Blue Light at the end of each hour during the night, and displays a torch at the half hours.

The Flood Tide comes in from S. W. and ebb from the N. E. It is High Water at 12 hours on full and change of the moon.

GENERAL ORDER.

BY THE HON'BLE THE GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL.

MILITARY DEPARTMENT.

BOMBAY CASTLE, 31st DECEMBER 1842.

No. 791 of 1842.—With the sanction of the Government of India, the Honorable the Governor in Council is pleased to cancel so much of the G. O. dated 15th March 1838, (separate G. O. No. 2, Para. 285) as applies to Military Pensioners proceeding to Hindoostan, and to announce, that in future they will be allowed to proceed to their destination without awaiting the sanction of the Bengal Government. Staff Officers will be careful to furnish each Pensioner with the necessary Descriptive Roll, a copy of the Roll so furnished together with a report of the departure of the Pensioners to be immediately transmitted to the Superintendent of Pensioners and Family Payments for Registry in his office.

No. 792 of 1842.—Lieutenant C. C. Bolton, of the 21st Regiment Madras Native Infantry, is allowed a furlough to Europe for three years, for the benefit of his health.

No. 793 of 1842.—With reference to the General Order published by His Excellency the Commander in Chief under date the 12th November last, the Honorable the Governor in Council is pleased to direct, that Lieutenant and Brevet Captain D. E. Mills, of the 19th Regiment Native Infantry, be suspended from the Service, pending the receipt of instructions regarding him from the Honorable the Court of Directors.

Bombay Castle, 2nd January 1843.

No. 1 of 1843.—The Hon'ble the Governor in Council is pleased to re-publish the following Extract from the Honorable Court's Letter, in the Military Department, dated the 16th December 1807.

4. The frequent applications that have been made to us by Officers of our several Military Establishments in India, when in Europe, for advances of money on loan, under the plea of their being otherwise unable to return to their duty have not only caused much trouble and inconvenience, but in some instances the Company have sustained loss by the death of the parties to whom such advances have occasionally been made, and this practice has of late years increased.

5. As under the Regulations of 1796, the Military Officers are allowed to come home on furlough, and to receive their pay, and in regard to Subalterns, are further indulged with passage money home, their situations have been considerably improved, and they cannot reasonably expect any additional indulgence of the nature abovementioned, to prevent therefore all expectation of the like in future, we direct that you publish in General Orders to the Army, that we have been under the necessity of coming to the resolution of declaring, that Officers at home are not hereafter to expect, that applications for advances of money beyond what they are allowed by the existing Regulations of the service, will be attended to.

6. This Regulation is to be considered as extending to the Marine Officers of your Establishment.

NOTIFICATION.

BY THE RIGHT HONORABLE THE GOVERNOR GENERAL OF INDIA.

Camp Ferozepore, 17th December 1842.

This day Major General Sir Robert Sale, G. C. B., passed the Sutlej at the head of all the Troops which composed the garrison of Jellalabad.

The Major General was received at the foot of the bridge by the Governor General and His Excellency the Commander in Chief.

The army of reserve, formed in one line extending two miles and a half, received the Major General and the garrison of Jellalabad in review order, with presented arms.

A salute of nineteen guns was fired as the Major General passed the centre of the line.

Captain Somerset, Military Secretary, and Captain Colville, A. D. C. to the Governor General, had, on the 14th instant, conveyed the Medals granted to the garrison of Jellalabad, under an escort of the body guard, to the camp of the Major General, and all the Officers and Soldiers of the garrison passed the bridge of the Sutlej, wearing the honor they have so justly won.

The 26th regiment of native infantry attached to the 2d Brigade, was, at the desire of the Governor General, formed into a hollow square, and the Governor General entering the square with Major General Pollock, informed Major Huish, commanding the regiment, that Major General Pollock having, in an especial manner, expressed his obligations to the 26th regiment, and represented their exemplary conduct on all occasions as meriting a particular mark of the approbation of the Government, he had great gratification in bestowing upon them, on their return to India, the honor of being henceforward a regiment of light infantry.

I find that in my despatch of the 31st of August last, detailing the battle of Ghoin, I unfortunately omitted the name of Captain Ripley of the 1st European Regiment, late Fort Adjutant at Caudahar. Although his name was inserted in the duplicate of that despatch, I fear this omission cannot now be rectified, which I am sorry for, as Captain Ripley is a very zealous Officer, and I have frequently derived benefit from his public services. In the battle now referred to, he attended me in the field, and received my thanks for his conduct.
