The following Rules this day passed by the Honorable the Governor in Council, respecting the future preparation of the Annual Book of Civil Salaries and Establishments, are published for general information:

RULES:

The Honorable the Governor in Council is pleased to resolve, that the Civil Auditor of this Presidency be required to furnish to Government, in future, on or before the 1st of August of each year, for transmission to the Government of India, the Annual Statement of Allowances and Establishments as they stand on the 1st of May, together with the Appendix containing explanations of increases and decreases; and that he shall, within three months from that date, furnish the Schedules of Pensions and Charitable Allowances.

To enable the Civil Auditor to conform strictly to the above Rule, the Hon'ble the Governor in Council is pleased to direct, that the Abstract for Salary of each Disbursing Officer for the month of April shall, in future, undergo audit before payment, and that the admission of the same shall be dependent on the receipt by the Civil Auditor from such Officer, by the 15th of May, of the Detailed Statement of Salaries and Establishments correctly framed; and the Civil Auditor shall report for the orders of Government the name of any Officer whose Statement is not received by the 31st of that month.

BOMBAY TO WIT.—Victoria, by the grace of God of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, Queen Defender of the Faith and so forth.—To the Sheriff of Bombay, Greeting. We command that you Summon and cause to come before the Supreme Court of Judicature at Bombay, sitting as a Court of Oyer and Terminer and Gaol delivery, and being authorized to inquire, hear, and determine by the Oaths of good and sufficient Men, all Treasons, Murders, and other Felonies, Perjuries, Trespasses, and other Crimes and Misdemeanors had done or committed within the Town and Island of Bombay, and the Limits thereof, & the Factories subordinate thereto, and also to inquire hear and determine in like manner all Treasons, Murders, Felonies, Forgeries, Perjuries, Crimes, Extortions, Misdemeanors, Trespasses, Wrongs and Oppressions had done, or committed, by any of our Subjects in any of the Territories subject to, or dependant upon the Government of Bombay or within any of the Dominions of the Native Princes of India in alliance with the said Government, and also to inquire, hear, try, examine, and determine by the Oaths of honest and lawful Men being our Subjects, all Treasons, Murders, Piracies, Robberies, Felonies, Maimings, Forestallings, Extortions, Trespasses, Misdemeanors, Offences, Excesses, and Enormities and Maritime Crimes wheresoever done, or committed, upon the high Seas, thirty of the Principal Inhabitants resident in the Town, or Island, of Bombay, being our Subjects to attend at the Court House in Bombay on Saturday the eighteenth day of March instant, at eleven o'clock in the forenoon, to serve as a Grand Jury or Inquest, and then and there to present to our said Court all such Crimes and Offences as shall come to their knowledge, and further to do so, as shall then and there be enjoined them, and we also command you, that you do likewise Summon and cause to come before our said Supreme Court of Judicature at Bombay at the time and place aforesaid, forty eight other good and sufficient Men being our Subjects resident within the Town and Island of Bombay or the Factories subordinate thereto, and who by the rules and orders of our Supreme Court of Judicature are qualified and liable to serve on Juries, to attend and serve as Petit Jurors, and try the truth of all such Indictments or Inquests as shall then and there be brought before them, and further to do as shall then and there be enjoined them, and we further command you, that you cause to be brought before our said Court at the time and place aforesaid, all the Prisoners that shall be in your Custody, together with their Attachments, Indictments, and all other muniments any ways concerning such Prisoners, and we likewise command you, that you cause to be proclaimed throughout your district, that all who will prosecute against these Prisoners be then and there to prosecute against them as shall be just, and that you give Notice to all Justices of the Peace, Coroners, Es-cheators, and also all Chief Constables and Bailiffs of the Town and Island of Bombay and the Limits thereof, that they be then and there in their own persons with their Rolls, Records, Indictments and other Remembrances to do those things which to their Offices in that behalf appertain to be done, and that you yourself with your Bailiffs and other

your Ministers be then and there in your own persons to do those things which to your and their Offices appertain in that behalf to be done, and have you then and there the names of the Jurors, Justices of the Peace, Coroners Es-cheators, Bailiffs, Chief Constables and of all them whom you shall so cause to come, whom and by whom you shall so cause them to come and that you also then and there have this precept.—Witness Sir HENRY ROBER, Knight, Chief Justice of the Supreme Court of Judicature at Bombay, this 1st day of March, in the year of Christ One Thousand Eight Hundred and Forty-three.

We direct, that when an Officer holding the rank of Captain or Commander on the Effective List of the Indian Navy shall be employed in any Office, or Situation on Shore to which a Staff Salary or Allowance is attached, he be allowed to draw in addition to such Staff Salary or Allowance the reduced or Shore Pay only of his rank, vizt.

If a Captain..... Rs 400 a Month.
If a Commander .. Rs 300 ditto.

unless the Staff Salary or Allowance may have been fixed under special and peculiar circumstances on the principle of consolidation, as in the instances of the present Political Agent at Aden and the Timber Agent at Calicut, in such cases the Pay of the Officer will merge for the time being in the consolidated Salary of the situation.

We further direct, that if a Captain or a Commander on the Effective List and not drawing either of the established command allowances shall be employed temporarily under orders of Government doing duty on Shore, for the performance of which no Staff Salary is allotted, he shall during such temporary employment be paid at the following rate, vizt:—

If a Commander at Rs 422 ditto.

The following Act is passed by the Hon'ble the President of the Council of India in Council, on the 1st of February 1843, with the assent of the Right Hon'ble the Governor General of India, which has been read and recorded.

Ordered, that the Act be promulgated for general information.

ACT No. II. OF 1843.

An Act to regulate the Sittings of the Courts of Sudder Dewanny Adawlut.

I. It is hereby enacted, in modification of Section 16, Regulation XXV. 1814, that when a single Judge of the Sudder Dewanny Adawlut, trying a case in Appeal, regular or special, from any Subordinate Court, shall be of opinion that the decision appealed from ought to be reversed or altered, he shall always call in two other Judges of the Court to sit with him; and that the Appeal shall be then heard by the three Judges sitting together, and be decided by them without any additional voices. In such cases the decree of final order shall be signed by the three Judges, if they agree together; but, if one of them dissent from the view taken by the Majority by the two Judges who agree together, and the signature of the third Judge shall not be considered requisite, but his opinion shall be recited in the decree or final order.

II. Provided, that the above rule shall not be applicable to summary appeals, or to appeals in miscellaneous cases, nor shall it be held to interfere with the powers of a single Judge of the Sudder Dewanny Adawlut, under Clause 2, Section 2, Regulation IX. 1831.

Ordered, that the Act be promulgated for general information.

ACT No. III. OF 1843.

An Act for amending the Rules of Special Appeals.

I. It is hereby enacted, that from and after the 1st day of May next, a Special Appeal shall lie to the Courts of Sudder Dewanny Adawlut at Calcutta and Allahabad respectively, to the Court of Sudder Adawlut at Madras, and to the Court of Sudder Dewanny Adawlut at Bombay, from all decisions passed on regular Appeals in the Civil Courts subordinate to them respectively, which shall appear to be inconsistent with some law, or usage having the force of law, or some practice of the Courts, or shall involve some question of law, usage, or practice, upon which there may be reasonable doubts.

II. And it is hereby enacted, that applications for Special Appeals shall not be admitted unless they are presented to the proper Court as aforesaid within the period limited for the presentation of regular Appeals.

III. And it is hereby enacted, that every application for a Special Appeal shall be accompanied by copies of the several decrees previously passed on the case.

IV. And it is hereby enacted, that every application for a Special Appeal duly presented to the proper Court as aforesaid shall be heard by a single Judge of the Court in the presence of the Special Appellant, or his Vakeel, or Agent, and it shall be competent to the Judge at his discretion, to call for and peruse any document forming a part of the record of the cause, and to summon the opposite party to answer the application.

V. And it is hereby enacted, that if it shall appear to the Judge that a Special Appeal is admissible under this Act he shall pass an order accordingly, and shall at the same time reduce the point or points to be determined to writing in English in the form of a Certificate which shall be translated into the vernacular language in use in the Court and the Special Appeal shall then be brought on the file of the Court to be heard and determined in due course. Provided that it shall not be necessary to call for or refer to any part of the proceedings the reading of which is not required for deciding the point or points of law stated in the Certificate.

VI. And it is hereby enacted, that if it shall appear to the Judge that a Special Appeal is not admissible under this Act he shall reject the petition, and his order so rejecting a petition for a Special Appeal shall be final.

VII. And it is hereby enacted, that in every case of Special Appeal admitted as aforesaid the Court of Sudder Dewanny Adawlut shall determine the point or points, certified as above enacted, and no other point or part of the case whatever.

VIII. Provided that when the special ground of Appeal may have been incorrectly or incompletely certified, it shall be competent to the Court to amend the Certificate. Provided that such amendment shall relate only to the point or points originally stated in the Certificate, and it shall not be lawful for the Court to receive or add any new point or points.

IX. And it is hereby declared, that the existing Laws and Regulations of the Presidencies of Bengal, Madras and Bombay relating to Special Appeals, shall continue in force so far as they are not inconsistent with the provisions of this Act.

X. And it is hereby enacted, that nothing contained in this Act shall affect the hearing of second or Special Appeals which shall have been admitted and be pending in Appeal before the said 1st day of May next, and that all such second or Special Appeals shall be heard and decided in the same manner as if this Act had not passed.
