NOTICE TO MARINERS.

(Received from the French Government.)

Alterations in the Lights of Cape Grinez and of Point d'Alpreck, on the South Side of the Strait of Dover.

CAPE GRINEZ LIGHT.

The fixed Light established on Cape Grinez in November 1837, in lat, $50^{\circ} 52' 10''$ N. and longitude $1^{\circ} 35' 9''$ E. of Greenwich, will on the 1st of July next be converted into a Revolving Light, which will re-appear every half minute.

The additional Flashing Light established in 1838, near the above Fixed Light will then be discontinued.

The new Revolving Light will be visible 8 leagues, and will be distinguished from that of Calais by the difference of their respective intervals, that of Calais being 90 seconds, and that of Grinez only 30 seconds; and further, the bright glares of Calais Light are separated by perfect darkness, while in the intervals between those of Grinez a faint light will be visible to vessels within the distance of four leagues.

Light of Point d'Alpreck.

On the same day the Fixed Light on Point Alpreck, in latitude $50^{\circ} 41' 37''$ N. and lon-

gitude $1^{\circ} 33' 54''$ E. will every two minutes change into flashes of Red Light, which are to continue for three seconds.

This light will not be visible more than four leagues.

TO TRAVELLERS PROCEEDING FROM BOMBAY TO MADRAS AND BANGALORE, VIA CANNANORE.

Several parties having lately arrived at this station from Bombay expecting to get Dawks laid in 2 or 3 days, either to Bangalore or Madras, travellers are hereby recommended (in order to prevent disappointment) to give the Superintendent of Police at least 7 days notice of their wants by letter, which application must be accompanied by a remittance on account of deposit, according to the annexed extract from the Bearers Regulations.

This notice is required from the circumstance of there being no Bearers between Cannanore and Mysore, a distance of 119 miles, and the consequent necessity of their being sent out from both stations to the intermediate stages, as well as to prevent travellers being delayed on the road, besides which it is not prudent to leave Cannanore without knowing that Bearers are ready posted from Mysore, in order that there may be no chance of detention in the Wynaad Jungle.

Extract from Bearers Regulations, dated Fort Saint George, 7th June 1842.

Para. 8th. The application for a dawk should be accompanied by a sum, as a deposit, equal to 12 annas per Mile for each Palankeen, for the whole distance the dawk is to be laid, otherwise it will not be attended to, and the public authorities are prohibited from issuing in-

tructions to Post Bearers until the deposit has been made. The balance, after defraying the expences incurred for Bearers, Oil, &c. will be returned to the applicant by the Post Master General. When the traveller proceeds by dawk beyond the frontier, he will be required to pay, as a deposit to cover expences, 50 Rupees for every hundred miles, in addition to the sum of 12 annas per mile.

OUR GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL.

Your Letter of the 30th September last, No. 83, brings to our notice fresh instances of the highly discreditable conduct of Mr. Midshipman Thomas of the Indian Navy, whom you have very properly suspended from the Service until our pleasure respecting him shall be made known. We were under the necessity some time ago of directing, that this person's name should be placed at the bottom of the list of the Midshipmen in consequence of his disgraceful behaviour, and were then only prevented by his apparent contrition, from marking our sense of his proceedings still more severely. His subsequent conduct having shewn him to be quite incapable of profiting by the opportunity offered to him of retrieving his character, and to be quite unfit for the Service to which he belongs; We now direct that the name of Mr. James Thomas be forthwith struck out of the List of the Indian Navy.

Bombay Castle, 5th April 1843.

1. The Honorable the Governor in Council feels the highest gratification in announcing for general information that official intelligence has this day been received, that, it hath pleased Almighty God again to bless our Arm with Victory.
2. On the 24th ultimo, the British Force in Scinde, consisting of about 5,000 Men under the command of His Excellency Major General Sir Charles Napier, K. C. B., attacked and signally defeated an Army of 20,000 Beloochees posted in a very strong and difficult position, four miles from Hyderabad, and commanded in person by Ameer Shere Mahomed, the Chief of Meerpoor.
3. The battle lasted for more than three hours, the resistance of the Enemy was brave and determined, but in the end, unable to cope against British prowess, they were defeated with great slaughter, and with the loss of all their Artillery and Standards.
4. The Governor in Council has the highest satisfaction in now stating, that in this decisive Combat, the Troops of all Arms highly distinguished themselves and nobly maintained the honor of their Country, under the guidance of their distinguished and intrepid Commander.
5. The Hon'ble the Governor in Council directs, that a Royal Salute be fired this day from the Garrison of Bombay, in honor of this Victory. and that on receipt of this Order a similar Salute be fired at all the Principal Military Stations under this Presidency.
6. Annexed are Returns of the killed and wounded, and of the Ordnance and Standards captured from the Enemy, during this action, as furnished to this Government by His Excellency Major General Sir C. J. Napier, K. C. B.
