Notification.

GENERAL DEPARTMENT.

The Hon'ble the Governor in Council is pleased to substitute the following Rules, for those laid down in the Notification of the 8th October 1840, (Judicial Department) and 9th April 1842 (General Department) regarding the charge of Civil Buildings, the execution of Repairs, Additions, or Alterations which they may require, and the construction of New Works.

2nd. The usual Annual and Special Repairs to Civil Buildings at the principal Stations, whether in the Political, General, Territorial, or Judicial Departments, shall be made by the Executive Officer, as specified below, under the Control of the Superintending Engineer of the Province to whom, when that Officer may be at the Station, the Civil Authority is to make the necessary application for the performance of the Work. When the Superintending Engineer may not be at the Station, the Civil Authority may make his application to the Executive Officer direct, in order to avoid delay. The Executive Officers are as follows.

3rd. The Survey Reports and Estimates for the Annual and Special Repairs being duly prepared and countersigned by the Civil Authority, will be forwarded by the Executive Officer to the Superintending Engineer, who, after examination, will transmit them to the Military Board, by whom they will be submitted for the sanction of Government, which sanction, when accorded, will be intimated to the Military Board, for communication to the Superintending Engineer of the province, notice thereof being given by Government, at the same time, to the Civil Authority concerned.

4th. For the Annual and Special Repairs of any Buildings at the Stations of Tannah and Rutnageree, the Civil Authorities are directed to avail themselves of the aid of any of the Assistants of the Superintendent of Roads and Tanks, who may be on the spot in the preparation of the necessary Plans and Estimates, which when prepared, and countersigned by the Civil authority, will be forwarded to the Superintendent of Roads for transmission to the Military Board, by whom they will be submitted to Government, with such recommendation, as to the mode of executing the work as may seem desirable.

5th. But if the Civil Officer at those Stations cannot procure professional assistance by any means, he will send in his own Report and Estimate to the Superintending Engineer of the province for transmission to the Military Board, who will submit it to Government with such recommendation as to the mode of executing the work as may seem desirable.

6th. At the minor Stations in the Districts where there may be no Engineer on or near the spot, the Assistant Collector or Magistrate, Mamlutdar, or Local Officer will, as at present, prepare all Estimates and Superintend the Repairs of all Buildings or Public Works under his charge. The Estimates &ca.

prepared under this arrangement will be forwarded by the Local Officer to the Judge or Collector, or other Superior Officer, who will refer them for approval and correction to the Executive Engineer or District Officer of Public Works, by whom or by the Civil Officer, in cases where there may be no Executive Officer, they will be transmitted to the Superintending Engineer, who will send them to the Military Board, to be submitted for the sanction of Government, which, if accorded, will be communicated to the Military Board and the Civil Authority.—These Survey Reports and Estimates of the prescribed Annual and Special Repairs to the Public Buildings at the principal stations in each Collectorate, are on no account, to be so delayed, as to prevent their reaching the Military Board's Office by the 15th of January, and like Reports and Estimates of the Repairs required at all the minor Stations, within each Collectorate, should, if possible, be forwarded at the latest, by the 15th of January.

7th. The modified rules laid down in the Military Board's Circular of the 28th September 1839, for the guidance of Superintending Engineers, in the preparation of Survey Reports and Estimates, of the prescribed Annual and Special Repairs to Public Buildings, in the Military Department, are to be observed as far as practicable, in reference to similar Repairs to Civil Buildings.

8th. The foregoing Rules are also to be observed in cases where Repairs may be required to Public Buildings at any other period than when the usual Annual and Special Repairs are made.

9th. When any addition or alteration, not coming under the denomination of Special Repairs, is considered necessary to any Public Building, the Civil Authority is to apply direct to the Engineer Officer, or if there be none, to the Assistant Superintendent of Roads and Tanks in the District, to prepare a rough Plan and Estimate of the required work, or should no professional assistance be available, he will himself prepare them. These he will submit, with his reasons for considering such addition or alteration necessary, to the Sudder Adawlut, or the Revenue Commissioner, as the case may require, to be laid before Government, or he will submitted direct, if not under the control of those Authorities, and Government will then, after consulting the Military Board, if necessary, issue its final instructions.

10th. When a New Building or other New Works. Work may be deemed necessary by a Civil authority, a full explanation of the circumstances which appear to him to create a necessity for it, or of the advantages sought to be attained by it, with a general account of its nature and extent, and of what he may conceive the probable cost, must be submitted in the first instance to Government. If the Department be under the Control of the Sudder Adawlut, or Revenue Commissioner, the proposition will be transmitted through these Authorities, who will in laying it before Government, submit their opinion on the subject; should Government see fit to entertain the proposition, it will make such further enquiries as may be expedient, and if it authorize

the proposed new work, the Local Authority will be informed through the Controlling Department, and the Military Board will be requested to have the necessary Plans and Estimates prepared, and to submit them for the final sanction of Government.

11th. In none but emergent cases, in which delay would be attended with loss to Government, or injury to the public interests, is any work to which these Rules relate, to be commenced without the previous sanction of Government. In all such cases the particulars should be immediately reported to Government by the Local Officer, through the Sudder Adawlut or the Revenue Commissioner, if the Department be subject to the control of either of these Authorities.

FORT WILLIAM. LEGISLATIVE DEPARTMENT.

THE 21st APRIL, 1843.

The following Draft of a proposed Act was read in Council for the first time on the 21st of April 1843.
Act No. — OF 1843.

An Act for the more extensive employment of Uncovenanted Agency in the Judicial Department.

I. Whereas the exigencies of the public service require that the Police and Criminal Branch of the Judicial Department should be strengthened by the more extensive employment of Uncovenanted Agency.

It is hereby enacted, that it shall be competent to the Local Government of both Divisions of the Bengal Presidency to appoint in any Zillah or District one or more Uncovenanted Deputy Magistrates with the powers hereinafter specified.

II. And it is hereby enacted, that the Office of Deputy Magistrate shall be open to Natives of India of any Class or religious persuasion. The persons selected shall receive their Commissions from Government in the usual mode, under the signature of the Secretary in the Judicial Department.

III. And it is hereby enacted, that every person appointed to the Office of Deputy Magistrate under this Act, shall, previously to entering upon the execution of the duties of his Office, make and subscribe before the Magistrate of the District to which he may be appointed, a declaration according to Act XXI. 1837.

IV.—And it is hereby enacted, that the Deputy Magistrate appointed under this Act, shall be capable of being employed as a Judicial Officer or as an Officer of Police, or both at the discretion of the Local Government. As a Judicial Officer he shall exercise the powers of a Covenanted Assistant under Regulations XII. 1797, IX. 1807, or III. 1821, or the full powers of a Magistrate according to such Orders as may from time to time be issued in that respect by the Local Government, and in such cases he shall be subject to such authority in regard to Appeals from his decisions and Judicial Orders as is provided for the decisions and Orders of a Covenanted Assistant under the above Regulations, or of a Magistrate respectively. As an Officer of Police he shall be in all respects subordinate to the Magistrate under whom he may be placed; he shall exercise such powers as the Government, or the Magistrate with sanction of Government, may commit to him, and shall obey all Orders that may be issued, and perform all duties that may be assigned to him by that functionary, who shall be at all times competent, subject to such Orders as he may receive from the Local Government, to extend, limit or resume the powers committed to such Deputy.

V. And it is hereby enacted, that a Deputy appointed under this Act, shall not be dismissed from Office for misconduct, without the sanction of the Local Government. Whenever there may be reason to believe that a Deputy is disqualified by neglect, incapacity or corruption for continuance in Office, a report shall be submitted by the Local Magistrate for the consideration and Orders of the Local Government which shall be competent to suspend him, and order a further enquiry into his conduct, or to direct his immediate dismissal as may appear just and proper.

Ordered, that the Draft now read be published for general information.

Ordered, that the said Draft be reconsidered at the first Meeting of the Legislative Council of India after the 21st day of June next.

FORT WILLIAM. LEGISLATIVE DEPARTMENT.

THE 21st APRIL, 1843.

The following Act is passed by the Hon'ble the President of the Council of India in Council, on the 21st of April 1843, with the assent of the Right

Hon'ble the Governor General of India, which has been read and recorded.

Ordered, that the Act be promulgated for general information.

ACT No. VI. of 1843.

An Act for amending the Law concerning the jurisdiction and procedure of the Courts of Ameens and Moonsiffs.

I.—In modification of Clause 4, Section 18, Regulation V. of 1831, Bengal Code, it is hereby enacted, that in the trial and decision of all original Suits referred to them by the Judge, the Principal Sudder Ameens shall be guided by the rules established for the conduct of business in the Courts of the Zillah and City Judges.

II.—And it is hereby enacted, that the provisions of Section 4, Act No. XXV. of 1837, in respect to appeals from decisions passed by Principal Sudder Ameens, in Suits of the nature specified therein, be extended to all interlocutory orders passed by those Officers in such Suits.

III.—And it is hereby enacted, that such parts of Regulations XXII. 1814, as prohibit the Sudder Ameens and Moonsiffs from requiring security from defendants; or from attaching their property in cases pending before them; or from realizing fines imposed by them without first obtaining the sanction of the Zillah Judge, be repealed.

IV.—And it is hereby enacted, that it shall be competent to the Sudder Ameens and Moonsiffs to demand security from the defendant, under the provisions of Sections 4 and 5, Regulation II. 1806, in cases pending before them; and also to proceed, without reference to the Zillah Judge, to the realization of fines imposed by them, provided that all orders passed by the Sudder Ameens and Moonsiffs under this Section, be subject to an appeal to the Zillah Judge.

V.—And it is hereby enacted, in modification of Section 22, Regulation V. of 1831, that decrees passed in the Courts of the Judges or Principal Sudder Ameens, in cases of appeal from the decisions of the Sudder Ameens or Moonsiffs, shall be executed by the Courts in which the original decisions were passed, under the general rules prescribed for the execution of decrees passed by those Courts—application for the execution of such decrees shall be presented, together with a certified copy of the decree of the Judge or Principal Sudder Ameen to the Court of original jurisdiction. In appeals from the orders of the Moonsiff or Sudder Ameen in such cases, the decision of the Zillah or City Judge shall be final.

VI.—And it is hereby enacted, that Clause 2, Section 13, Regulation XXIII. 1814, and Clause 4, Section 5, Regulation V. 1831, be repealed.

VII.—And it is hereby enacted, that no person whatever shall, by reason of place of birth, or by reason of descent, be in any Civil proceeding whatever, exempted from the jurisdiction of the Courts of the Moonsiffs, in the Territories subject to the Presidency of Fort William in Bengal.

VIII.—And it is hereby enacted, that persons invested with the powers of Moonsiff shall be competent to receive, try, and determine suits of every description under the restrictions as to local jurisdiction and value of property mentioned in Clauses 1, 2 and 3, Section 5, Regulation V. 1831. Provided, however,

that no Moonsiff shall try any suit, in which he himself, or any of his relatives, or dependants, or any of the Vakeels or Officers of his Court shall be a party.

IX.—And it is hereby enacted, that in cases, where by reason of the above Section, a Moonsiff cannot try a suit because he himself, or any of his relatives, or dependants, or any of the Vakeels or Officers of his Court is a party to the suit, it shall nevertheless be competent to the Moonsiff to receive the suit, and forward it to the Judge of the Zillah to which he is subordinate, who may thereupon refer the same for trial and decision to any other Moonsiff of the District.
