Every person submitting a tender, will be required to lodge with it the sum of Rupees (500) five hundred, which will be forfeited in the event of delay, evasion or refusal to execute the necessary deed of contract, and should his offer be accepted he must be prepared to add a further simi-

lar sum in cash, & (4000) four thousand Rupees in Bond, which together with the above amount will be held as security for due performance of the engagement.

It must be thoroughly understood, that the rates exhibited in the list abovementioned include charges and all other fees leviable on vessels at the different Ports, as also that demurrage shall not be paid for Sundays.

The contractor will have the exclusive supply of Native Crafts to the Ports in question, except when Waror other Emergencies renders it necessary to dispatch Troops, Stores &c. by Steamers, Cruizers, or Transports.

The contractor will be required to comply immediately with all emergent demands, and others less urgent must be completed within the period stated in the supply notes, or in failing to do so, such Native Craft as may be required on his behalf will be hired at his risk, and in all such cases an advance of Rupees (30) thirty per-cent upon the amount of expences incurred, or a fine of Rupees (50) fifty, at the option of the Executive Officer, will be levied as liquidated damages for each and every such breach of contract as often as the same may occur.

The tenders will be opened at the time specified in presence of the parties concerned, or of such as may be in attendance. No reason will be assigned for the rejection of any tender, nor will any be recorded that are not accompanied with the abovementioned deposit.

BOMBAY CASTLE, 9th JUNE 1843,

No. 344 of 1843.—The Regulation (Separate General Order No. 26, Para. 267) sanctioning the issue of Tents to Warrant Officers from the Public Stores not according with the practice obtaining under the Bengal Presidency is cancelled, and the existing rates of Tent Allowance are hereafter to be considered as including both the Provision and Carriage of Tents.

The Officers claim will not be paid until the expiration of the period for which the Transports are engaged, and the accounts of the receipt and expenditure of the Provisions shall be adjusted.

Any wastage of Provisions which may occur on board of Transports is to be ascertained by a Committee of Survey, whose Proceedings will be the Vouchers to the Officer in charge for writing the deficiency off his Books.
