## Proclamation.

**B**OMBAY TO WIT. By virtue of a precept to me directed, I hereby proclaim and give notice, that the Sessions of Oyer and Terminer and General Gaol delivery, will be holden before the Supreme Court of Judicature at Bombay, at the Court House, on Wednes-

day, the fifth day of July next, at eleven o'clock in the forenoon, for the trial of all Treasons, Murders and other Felonies, Perjuries, Trespasses and other Crimes, and Misdemeanors, had, done, or committed within the Town and Island of Bombay, and the limits thereof, and the Factories subordinate thereto, and also to enquire, hear and determine, in like manner, all Treasons, Murders, Felonies, Forgeries, Perjuries, Crimes, Extortions, Misdemeanors, Trespasses, Wrongs, Oppressions, had, done or committed, by any of Her Majesty's British Subjects, in any of the Territories which now are subject to, or dependent upon the said Government of Bombay, or within any of the Dominions of the Native Princes of India, in alliance with the said Government.

And also, that at the same time and place, will be holden a Session of Admiralty, for the trial of all Treasons, Murders, Piracies, Robberies, Trespasses, Misdemeanors, and other Crimes and Offences, had, done, perpetrated or committed on the High Seas.

And I hereby give notice to all persons bound to prosecute, and give evidence at the above Sessions, or in any way concerned therein, that they are to attend at the time and place above mentioned, and not to depart without leave of the Court.

And I hereby give notice, to all Justices of the Peace, Coroners, Escheators, and also all Chief Constables and Bailiffs of the Town and Island of Bombay, and the limits thereof, that they be then, and there, in their own persons, with their Rolls, Records, Indictments and other Remembrances, to do those things, which to their offices in that behalf appertain to be done.—Dated this nineteenth day of June, in the sixth year of the Reign of Her Majesty Queen Victoria.

1. The Resident at Hyderabad (on the part of the Nizam's Government) will, until the 31st July 1843, receive tenders for the supply of clothing to the Nizam's Regular Army.

2. The following is to be complete with Pads, Shoulder-straps, Cotton-wings for the Grenadier and Light Companies, Buttons with the number of the Regiments, and to be made up in every respect as worn in the Company's Army and according to a muster Jacket to be forwarded.

6. The person or persons to whom the contract is eventually given, will be expected to fur-

nish the security of a respectable House of Agency, for the due fulfillment of their contract, in the sum of Company's Rupees (20,000) twenty Thousand.

7. The mode of payment will be as under.

8. One third of the estimate of the contract being closed, and approved of, and the receipt of the Clothing Indents acknowledged.

9. One third, when the clothing is half furnished, and the other third when it is delivered, surveyed, and approved of at the several stations.

Is hereby given, that written Tenders will be received at this office until 2 o'clock on Tuesday the 4th proximo, for a contract for the supply of Native Boats and other Country Craft and Tonnage, for the conveyance of Troops, Stores &c. for Aden and the Persian Gulf to this Department, for the term of two years, from the 1st August next, a list of which with the rates affixed and every other information relating thereto, may be obtained at this office daily, Sundays excepted, from 10 till 5 o'clock.

The tenders must specify both in words and figures, the rates per-cent above or below the prices in the Lithographed List, at which the tenderers will undertake the contract.

Every person submitting a tender, will be required to lodge with it the sum of Rupees (500) five hundred, which will be forfeited in the event

of delay, evasion or refusal to execute the necessary deed of contract, and should his offer be accepted he must be prepared to add a further similar sum in cash, & (4000) four thousand Rupees in Bond, which together with the above amount will be held as security for due performance of the engagement.

It must be thoroughly understood, that the rates exhibited in the list abovementioned include charges and all other fees leviable on vessels at the different Ports, as also that demurrage shall not be paid for Sundays.

The contractor will have the exclusive supply of Native Crafts to the Ports in question, except when War or other Emergencies renders it necessary to dispatch Troops, Stores &c. by Steamers, Cruizers, or Transports.

The contractor will be required to comply immediately with all emergent demands, and others less urgent must be completed within the period stated in the supply notes, or in failing to do so, such Native Craft as may be required on his behalf will be hired at his risk, and in all such cases an advance of Rupees (30) thirty per-cent upon the amount of expences incurred, or a fine of Rupees (50) fifty, at the option of the Executive Officer, will be levied as liquidated damages for each and every such breach of contract as often as the same may occur.

The tenders will be opened at the time specified in presence of the parties concerned, or of such as may be in attendance. No reason will be assigned for the rejection of any tender, nor will any be recorded that are not accompanied with the abovementioned deposit.

The annual disbursements under the above contract amount to about (41,000) Forty one thousand Rupees.

## PROCLAMATION. GENERAL DEPARTMENT.

By the Overland Mail which arrived the day before yesterday, the following London Gazette has been received, announcing the death of His late Royal Highness Augustus Frederick Duke of Sussex.

“ LONDON GAZETTE,  
“ FRIDAY, APRIL 21ST 1843.  
“ Whitehall, April 21st 1843.

“ This day at a quarter past twelve o'clock, His Royal Highness Augustus Frederick Duke of Sussex, Uncle to Her Most Gracious Majesty, departed this life, at Kensington Palace, to the great grief of Her Majesty, and of all the Royal Family.”

In consequence of the deeply lamented event announced in the preceding Gazette, the Governor in Council directs, that the Flag at the Castle be hoisted Half Staff High, and continue so till Sunset on Friday the 9th Instant, and that Minute Guns to the number of 70, corresponding with the age of the deceased Prince, be fired from the Garrison on the Flag being hoisted; that the same Ceremony be observed by the Hon'ble company's Cruizers in the Harbour, the Minute Guns being taken up on the termination of those from the Garrison, and continued under such arrangements as the Superintendent of the Indian Navy may direct.

The Flag to be hoisted Half Staff High, and 70 Minute Guns to be fired at every Station Subordinate to this Government on the receipt of these orders.

The Governor in Council directs on this melancholy occasion, that Mourning be worn by the Officers of Her Majesty's and the Honorable Company's Civil, Military and Marine Services at this Presidency, for a period of Ten days from this date, an example which he confidently expects will be generally followed by all Classes of Her Majesty's Subjects residing under the Presidency of Bombay.

will be obliged to have recourse to some stringent measure, which shall compel those who are engaged in inducing Emigrants to embark, to prefer such as are prepared to take their Wives with them.

2d. Previously, however, to taking any decisive steps in this matter, the Honorable the Deputy Governor directs, that you will make the views and intentions of the Government on this point, known to the several Agents, and His Honor will in the meantime carefully observe the results from your monthly reports.
